Know your updated flood risk

- □ Enter your property's address to determine your property's advisory flood zone and elevation for rebuilding.

Take action

- Contact your local floodplain manager or building official for information about local building code and permit requirements, and to find out what permits will be required.
- □ Discuss with your builder or contractor the options for elevating your home.
- Discuss with your insurance agent the options for flood insurance coverage and ways to maximize the discounts on your flood insurance premium.

Before constructing, property owners should consult their local government officials for elevation requirements determined by local ordinance.
