

Freeholder Bartlett stated that to-date, FEMA has reimbursed the County \$52 million and within the next couple of weeks an additional \$8 million is expected to be received bringing the total received from FEMA to \$60 million, still owing Ocean County Freeholder Bartlett advised that the 17 participating municipalities share is \$36 million. The Freeholder stated that the County notified the 17 municipalities in \$9,300,000. November 2013 what their portion of the bill was so that the municipalities had plenty of time to work this into their budgets, and noted that the amount due the County would be due July 2, 2014. The Freeholder was pleased to announce that Long Beach Island has already submitted their share to the County. Freeholder Bartlett stated that the County was able to put the money together by scraping every fund the County had; the County has been slowing replacing that money as the reimbursements come in from FEMA without borrowing any money. Freeholder Director Joseph H. Vicari opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Director Vicari stated that this is the last workshop meeting before the Memorial Day weekend, noting that a lot of things are happening. The Director stated he discussed with the Administrator the SHRAP program (Sandy Renter and Homeowner Assistance Program), noting that this program helps families who are experiencing difficulties because of Superstorm Sandy. The State allocated \$57 million to the counties affected by Sandy and Ocean County received approximately 51 percent of the funding. Ocean County has received a total SHRAP allocation of \$28,967,400. Director Vicari noted that OCEAN Inc. has three SHRAP locations in Ocean County: Route 9 and 72 in Stafford Township,

Beaverson Boulevard in Brick, and Route 37 East in Toms River. OCEAN, Inc. has contracted with Children's Home Services to provide SHRAP services. Director Vicari noted that the location in Brick is open Monday through Friday, 12 hours a day. Director Vicari stated that a total of 45,000 persons have been served and the total households served is over 3,700 through the SHRAP Program.

Director Vicari stated he met with the New Jersey Film and Television Commission who attended the Tourism Advisory Commission meeting last night. The Tourism Advisory Commission is encouraging the film industry to do business in New Jersey. The Director stated that the Robert J. Miller Airpark provides businesses with access to Ocean County. The Director stated that the Board of Chosen Freeholders supported the recent air show at the Airpark and the event was very successful. Director Vicari stated that he is looking forward to the continued support by this Board for our military services. Director Vicari updated the Board on several items discussed at the Tourism Advisory Commission meeting last night including a sculpture by a private donation to be placed on Route 37 in Toms River. The Freeholder noted that the beaches and Barnegat Bay are clean; the boardwalk that was destroyed by fire is being rebuilt.

Director Vicari noted that many people are realizing that the elevations are making it difficult for seniors when they raise their homes. The Director stated that he spoke with Ortiey Beach residents this past weekend and they advise that they can not build or work on construction from Memorial Day until after Labor Day due to their homeowner association rules. The Director felt that this is unreasonable and should not happen and is looking into the matter, noting that some consideration is needed to be fair to all. Residents are becoming very frustrated; stating that they want to get back in their homes. Freeholder Vicari stated that Ocean County's situation is unique and he will try to do everything possible to try to get residents back in their homes as soon as possible.

Director Vicari introduced Pete Johner from JCP&L. Mr. Johner distributed an overview and provided an update of what the electric company is working on. Mr. Johner stated that JCP&L has made a lot of improved communications since Superstorm Sandy noting that when there is a power outage affecting 100 customers or more, a message is sent out to many people informing them of what is going on. Messages continue to go out until all customers are restored power. Mr. Johner stated that JCP&L can not stop outages, weather, trees, car accidents, animals, etc. all are causes of power outages and disruptions in electric service and JCP&L is making every effort to communicate information better. JCP&L is making enhancements to its website as well.

Mr. Johner reviewed with the Board capital projects that are planned for 2014 that will reinforce the transmission system for future growth. This included the Oyster Creek Substation, Manitou Substation and the construction of a new line for a solar generation facility in Brick; ongoing tree trimming on a four year cycle; circuit and wood pole inspections; infrared scanning, circuit are inspected on a four year cycle to detect hotspots. Mr. Johner stated that some of the major highway road projects include the realignments of Ridgeway Boulevard and Hyson Road; JCP&L is continually monitoring the load growth in the region and enhance service reliability.

Mr. Johner discussed concerns on the barrier islands where people are rebuilding and raising their homes, noting that JCP&L is watching this very closely. Concerns with height of meters have been raised, 5' is the standard to maintain and read the meters. Discussions were held with the DCA to raise the meters to 7 1/2 '; however, JCP&L is going back to 5' in order for them to maintain and read the meters properly. Mr. Johner also expressed the concerns of JCP&L at Camp Osborn with decking around raised homes near electric poles, the decks are too close to the poles; JCP&L might consider underground, however, this is very expensive. JCP&L will continue to watch this closely. Mr. Johner stated that JCP&L wants people to get back in their homes; however, they want to do it right.

Mr. Johner asked Mayor Nebel from Mantoloking Borough, who was in attendance at the meeting, about trees that are being put in on the west side of Route 35 in Mantoloking Borough, stating that JCP&L needs to know where they are being placed. Mayor Nebel advised that he would reach out to the NJDOT and ask that they contact Mr. Johner regarding the trees and their placement along Route 35.

Mr. Johner advised that when a street light outage is reported, JCP&L responds within three days. Director Vicari noted that LED lights do not produce heat and snow does not melt on the lights, you have to physically go out and scrape the snow and ice off the lights. The Director noted that there is some good and some bad when using LED lights. Mr. Johner reported that more improvements are coming. Mr. Johner provided the website for JCP&L firstenergycorp.com to report a street light outage.

Director Vicari reported that Atlantic City Electric was recently sold and a representative could not attend today's meeting. Atlantic City Electric was bought by Excelon.

Freeholder Lacey stated that when Phase 6 of the Barnegat Branch Trail is complete this summer the trail will be almost 10 miles. Phase 6 will connect to the existing trail completed under Phase III which is two miles from Dudley Park. The Freeholder noted that while he was out on vacation a contract was awarded on May 7 to Earle Asphalt for this phase of the trail. Freeholder Lacey stated that Phase 6 is a \$290,000 project and the NJDOT is providing a \$231,000 grant for this phase. The Freeholder noted that a lot of the work for the Barnegat Branch Trail is done in-house. David McKeon, Planning Director, was in attendance and noted that the longest and most complicated phase of the trail has been in Lacey Township. Freeholder Lacey stated that the Barnegat Branch Trail is for everyone not just for bikes. The Trail is heavily used and well-liked.

Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda. There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the agenda for the May 21, 2014 Board meeting.

Ms. Vasil reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of May 21, 2014. There were no questions or comments.

Director Vicari noted that at the last public meeting a woman who spoke was very upset about issues with her husband's employment. The Freeholder noted that this had nothing to do with the Board of Chosen Freeholders. The Director noted that he spoke with the woman by phone after the meeting and he hopes that her problems were solved.

Director Vicari asked the Board members for comments.

Freeholder Bartlett stated that the County has good news, since the last PreBoard meeting, the County received from \$17 million from FEMA and it is in the bank. The Freeholder noted that the County has received a total of \$70 million in reimbursements from FEMA for debris removal for Superstorm Sandy. The balance outstanding is \$17 million. Freeholder Bartlett stated that the County sent out preliminary bills to participating municipalities for reimbursement to the County (the County funded their debris bills) at the beginning of the year advising that payment would be due on July 1, 2014. The total due from municipalities to the County is approximately \$9 million. Freeholder Bartlett was pleased to note that Long Beach Township was the first municipality to reimburse the County; the township sent an \$809,000 check to settle their debt early.

Freeholder Bartlett noted that Moody's has down graded the State from Double A to one notch below citing the structural in- balance in the State's budget. The Freeholder stated that Ocean County will not be in that position; this Board has done everything to maintain its bond rating. Freeholder Bartlett stated that the County was able to have the \$100 million for Superstorm Sandy by using every trust fund it had because it was the right thing to do. Director Vicari noted that this shows the strength of Ocean County. The Director stated that the County lost ratables; however, a building plan is in place and it is coming back now. The County continues to have a growing population with our seniors. Director Vicari noted that the County still maintains its bond rating and has a stable tax rate.

Freeholder Kelly noted that Ocean County will be receiving \$1,935,000 for property damages to its facilities from our commercial insurance for Superstorm Sandy. This does not, however, include damages to Berkeley Island Park. Freeholder Kelly stated that money is starting to come back in since the storm one and a half years ago.

Freeholder Little thanked both Director Vicari, Freeholder Bartlett, the Administrator and Julie Tarrant for staying on top of the reimbursements from FEMA, noting that it is good that the County is almost going to be whole by the end of the summer which will help our bond rating. Freeholder Little stated that the County has not overspent revenues. The Freeholder noted that on Long Beach Island rebuilding is taking place as well as raising homes and he expects to see an incredible amount of growth within the next year. Freeholder Little stated where would the County have been without our surplus; the County would not have been able to help our municipalities.

Freeholder Bartlett discussed the 2014 Budget, noting that the County is waiting on the State to certify the budget. The Freeholder noted that Ms. Tarrant has a conference call scheduled for tomorrow with the State.

There were no additional comments.

Ms. Vasil read the resolution to move to closed session.

On a motion by Freeholder Lacey, seconded by Freeholder Bartlett, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 5:05 PM for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was unanimously carried.
