#### ORDINANCE #2015-2

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$33,064.43 FROM THE RESERVE FOR STATE AID INTEREST ACCOUNT FOR THE COST OF THE RECONSTRUCTION AND RESURFACING OF VARIOUS ROADS, ALL LOCATED IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY.

WHEREAS, the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean recognizes the need for the reconstruction and resurfacing of various roads, all in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the County that funds be available for this purpose. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS of the COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING), as follows:

SECTION 1: \$33,064.43 is hereby appropriated from the Reserve for State Aid Interest Account for the cost of the reconstruction and resurfacing of various roads, all in the County of Ocean, which sum shall also cover fees and contingencies.

SECTION 2: The capital budget of the County of Ocean is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of Local Government Services is on file with the Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

SECTION 3: After passage upon first reading of this Ordinance, the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders is hereby directed to publish the full text of the Ordinance, together with the notice set forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF PENDING ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-19, at least seven days prior to the date set for public hearing and further consideration for final passage (which date shall be at least ten days after introduction and first reading). The Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders is further directed to comply with all provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-17(b) regarding postings, publications, and the provision of copies of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4: After final adoption of this Ordinance by the Board of Chosen Freeholders, the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders is hereby directed to publish the full text of this Ordinance, as finally adopted, together with the notice set forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-19.

SECTION 5: This Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

#### ORDINANCE #2015-3

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ACQUISITION OF TITLE, RIGHTS-OF-WAY AND/OR EASEMENTS OF CERTAIN PARCELS OF LAND (OR PARTS THEREOF) FOR ROAD, BRIDGE AND/OR DRAINAGE SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS ALONG COUNTY ROADS, ALL IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND APPROPRIATING \$2,000,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,900,000 IN BONDS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN TO FINANCE THE SAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING) AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. There is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the County of Ocean as general improvements, the acquisition of title, rights-of-way and/or easements of certain parcels of land (or parts thereof) for road, bridge and/or drainage system improvements along County roads, all in the County of Ocean,

State of New Jersey, in accordance with plans and specifications on file in the Ocean County Engineering

Department, including all else necessary therefor and incidental thereto.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared that the improvements or purposes, the

estimated cost of the improvements and appropriation therefor, down payment and estimated maximum amount

of bonds or notes authorized are as follows:

IMPROVEMENT OR PU<u>RPOSE</u> ESTIMATED COST AND APPROPRIATION

Acquisition of title, rights-of-way and/or easements of certain parcels of land (or parts thereof) for road, bridge and/or drainage system improvements along County roads

TOTALS \$2,000,000 \$100,000

\$1,900,000

SECTION 3. There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$2,000,000, including the sum of \$100,000 as the down payment, for the improvements or purposes described in Section 1 hereof as required by the Local Bond Law. The down payment has been made available by virtue of provision in the Capital Improvement Fund of the County of Ocean in one or more previously adopted budgets.

SECTION 4. There is hereby authorized the issuance of negotiable bonds in an aggregate principal amount of \$1,900,000 to finance part of the cost of the purposes stated in Section 1 hereof. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding the limit authorized by law, and the maturities, method of sale and other details thereof shall be determined by subsequent resolutions to be adopted in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 5. In order to temporarily finance the purposes provided for in Section 1 hereof, there is hereby authorized the issuance of bond anticipation notes of said County in an aggregate principal amount of \$1,900,000. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the County Comptroller; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and shall be in such form as may be determined by the County Comptroller. The County Comptroller shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this Ordinance, and the County Comptroller's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8.1. The County Comptroller is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The County Comptroller is directed to report in writing to the Board of Chosen Freeholders at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this Ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 6. SECTION 3. There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$2,100,000, including the sum of \$130,000 as the down payment, for the improvements or purposes described in Section 1 hereof as required by the Local Bond Law. The down payment has been made available by virtue of provision in the Capital Improvement

SECTION 4. There is hereby authorized the issuance of negotiable bonds in an aggregate principal amount of \$1,970,000 to finance part of the cost of the purposes stated in Section 1 hereof. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding the limit authorized by law, and the maturities, method of sale and other details thereof shall be determined by subsequent resolutions to be adopted in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 5. In order to temporarily finance the purposes provided for in Section 1 hereof, there is hereby authorized the issuance of bond anticipation notes of said County in an aggregate principal amount of \$1,970,000. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the County Comptroller; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and shall be in such form as may be determined by the County Comptroller. The County Comptroller shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this Ordinance, and the County Comptroller's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8.1. The County Comptroller is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The County Comptroller is directed to report in writing to the Board of Chosen Freeholders at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this Ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 6. The County reasonably expects to commence acquisition and/or construction of the improvements described in Section 1 hereof, and to advance all or a portion of the costs in respect thereof, prior to the issuance of bonds or notes hereunder. To the extent such costs are advanced, the County further reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance, in an aggregate amount not to exceed the amount of bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof. This bond ordinance is intended to be a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 7. Any grant monies received for the purposes described in Section 1 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

SECTION 8. The amount of the proceeds of the obligations authorized by this Ordinance which may be used for the payment of interest on such obligations, architects' fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses, and other items as provided in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 shall not exceed the sum of \$500,000.

SECTION 9. The Capital Budget of the County of Ocean is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. In the event of any such inconsistency and amendment, the resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended Capital Budget and Capital Program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local

Government Services is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders and is available there for public inspection.

SECTION 10. It is hereby found, determined and declared as follows:

A. The improvements or purposes described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses. They are improvements or purposes the County may lawfully undertake as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property benefited thereby.

B. The average period of usefulness of the improvements for which the obligations authorized by this Ordinance are to be issued is thirty (30) years.

C. The supplemental debt statement provided for in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-10 was duly filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders prior to the passage of this Ordinance on first reading, and a complete executed duplicate of such supplemental debt statement has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey, and such supplemental debt statement shows that the gross debt of the County as defined in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-43 is increased by this Ordinance by \$1,970,000 and the obligations authorized by this Ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

SECTION 11. In the event the monies set forth above for any purpose is not necessary for said purposes, then such monies shall be for the completion of any of the other purposes provided for in this Ordinance.

SECTION 12. The full faith and credit of the County of Ocean shall be pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds and notes authorized by this Ordinance, and as long as any of said bonds or notes are outstanding, an appropriation shall be included in each annual budget of the County hereafter adopted in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds or notes maturing in each year. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the County, and the County shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the County for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

SECTION 13. After passage upon first reading of this Ordinance, the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders is hereby directed to publish the full text of the Ordinance, together with the notice set forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF PENDING ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-19, at least seven days prior to the date set for public hearing and further consideration for final passage (which date shall be at least ten days after introduction and first reading). The Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders is further directed to comply with all provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-17(b) regarding postings, publications, and the provision of copies of this Ordinance.

SECTION 14. After final adoption of this Ordinance by the Board of Chosen Freeholders, the

Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders is hereby directed to publish the full text of this Ordinance, as finally adopted, together with the notice set forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-19.

SECTION 15. The Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County hereby covenant on behalf of the County to take any action necessary or refrain from taking such action in order to preserve the tax-exempt status of the bonds and notes authorized hereunder as is or may be required under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and the regulations promulgated thereunder (the "Code"), including compliance with the Code with regard to the use, expenditure, investment, timely reporting and rebate of investment earnings as may be required thereunder.

SECTION 16. This Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

WHEREAS, S-2775 and A-4215 would increase the amount annually credited to the Shore Protection Fund to \$50,000,000. This increase in funding would go a long way in ensuring a healthy coastline and protecting homes and businesses from future devastation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS of the COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY hereby strongly supports the passage of S-2775 and A-4215 and urges all shore communities and counties to adopt a resolution in support of this legislation.

Freeholder Director John C. Bartiett opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Block, County Administrator Mary Ann Cilento, Recording Secretary Betty Vasil, Clerk of the Board Keith J. Goetting, Director of Human Resources Michael J. Fiure, Director of Management & Budget Frank Scarantino, County Engineer Julie N. Tarrant, Comptroller/CFO Christine Wioland, Deputy Clerk of the Board Donna Flynn, Director, Public Information John C. Sahradnik, Jr., County Counsel

Freeholder Vicari stated that one of the most important things we do in Ocean County each year is to make sure we have the best senior services in New Jersey. Resolutions are on the agenda awarding contracts for community service providers. The Freeholder noted that many seniors in Ocean County were not born here but relocated here and make use of the County's services. Freeholder Vicari stated that the County tries to get as much information as possible to our seniors and we make sure that a resident reaches a person when they call, not a recording. The Freeholder requested Jackie Rohan, Director of Senior Services, to provide an update to the Board on the community service provider contracts.

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# RECEIVED

Ms. Rohan noted that there were 33 nutrition contracts being awarded to community service providers. The Department will oversee 42 contracts with 22 governmental and nonprofit agencies in 2015 totaling over \$5.2 million. Over 228,000 meals went out in 2014; the Department of Senior Services gave 102 presentations to the public in 2014; the staff responded to over 8,000 callers and walk-ins to the office; and there were over 18,000 hits to the Department's website. Ms. Rohan also noted that over 7,000 clients contacted Senior Services regarding the Sandy Assistance Relief Program for Senior and Disabled. There are over 18,000 people over the age of 85 and 83 percent live at home; which Ms. Rohan stated was due in part to the services provided by the nutrition contracts, these allow more seniors to remain in their homes. Freeholder Vicari thanked Ms. Rohan for her update and for the work she does everyday on behalf of Ocean County seniors. The Freeholder noted that contracts will be on the Board agenda and stated that these are being put on the agenda before the budget is adopted because they are important and have a positive impact on Director Bartlett stated that Ms. Rohan seamlessly has taken over the residents. Department of Senior Services and thanked her for the good work she is doing. Freeholder Little noted that the casino revenue dollars have been declining but this Board continues to fund its programs.

Director Bartlett reviewed with the Board Item 6 on the Board agenda which authorizes the Notice of Intent to file a grant application for Community Development Block Grant Essential Services. This will be the final year the County will be eligible for the funding due to Superstorm Sandy. The Freeholder Director stated that the County received \$12 million in 2013; \$5 million was a loan, some of which may be forgivable. In 2014, the County was eligible for 75 percent of the previous year's funding and received approximately \$9 million. The Freeholder Director noted that this year the County will be applying for \$4,608,000 which is half of last year. Director Bartlett stated that the County is going forward and will introduce the budget in the coming months but it does not anticipate adoption of the budget until we see what funding the County will be eligible for and received from the Essential Services Grant which may be as late as June. Director Bartlett stated that the County was one of the few counties in the State that received significant funding from this program.

Director Bartiett stated that Item 3 on the PreBoard Meeting agenda is an update on the Mathis Bridge between Toms River and Seaside and the Route 72 Bridge. Freeholder Kelly stated we had some residents at the last Board meeting requesting information about the Route 72 bridge project by the State as well as the upcoming Mathis Bridge project. The County has also had some requests from residents about the Route 35 schedule. Freeholder Kelly stated that the County has had a great relationship with the NJDOT and requested that they come to this meeting to update the Board on these concerns from residents. The Route 72 bridge has taken longer than expected, but the Freeholder noted that the County will have a great bridge when it is done.

George Kuhn from the NJDOT was in attendance and advised that the Route 37 east bound bridge project contract will start in September, 2015, and noted that once the project is started there will be one lane in (east) and two lanes off (west) the island through April.

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Work on the project will begin in October, 2015. In April of 2016 the process will begin to change the bridges back to normal operation for the summer months. Mr. Kuhn noted that the project is scheduled to take three years due to maintaining summer season access and emphasized that traffic will not be disrupted during the summer months. Mr. Kuhn stated that sidewalks on the Mathis side will be removed, no pedestrians will be permitted on the Mathis Bridge; only the Tunney Bridge. The project will include reconstruction from Fischer Boulevard in Toms River and from the end of the bridge to Catalina Avenue in Seaside Heights. Mr. Kuhn advised that the total project cost is estimated at \$70 million with the low bid received at \$56 million. The project is only for the Mathis Bridge and will include 3, 10' lanes with the removal of the sidewalk on the east bound bridge and new gates on the bridge which will improve the time for the opening process. Mr. Kuhn noted that the Mathis Bridge is the third most active bridge in the State and it is 66 years old. Freeholder Vicari asked that Mr. Kuhn speak with the leaders of the communities involved. Mr. Kuhn advised Freeholder Vicari that sometime in February they will be holding a meeting with neighborhoods about the staging of the project to make them aware of what the NJDOT is doing and he has already met with Toms River, Seaside Heights and Seaside Borough about the work that will be done and the timing of the project. Freeholder Kelly stated that this project will have no impact on this summer at all.

Mr. Kuhn stated that the construction work on the Route 72 Bridge began in 2013, noting that this project is being done under six different contracts and the anticipated completion date is 2020. Freeholder Little stated that the NJDOT has done pretty well in keeping the traffic going which has been reasonably acceptable to most. Mr. Kuhn stated that part of the Route 72 improvements include road operational improvement contracts to Marsha Drive in Stafford Township and drainage and operational intersection improvements in Ship Bottom. Freeholder Kelly discussed the first traffic light off the island and Mr. Kuhn advised that the NJDOT will hold a meeting with towns to see if there are any modifications that will need to be taken into account. Work on this is expected the start in 2018.

On the Route 35 project, Freeholder Kelly stated that an issue before this Board has been from local businessmen asking about a new schedule, noting that they have not been advised of any revised schedule for the work on Route 35 on the northern island. Freeholder Kelly stated that work will not be done this summer. Scott Stevens, NJDOT, also in attendance, clarified that there is not a new schedule officially at this moment; the NJDOT is not sure of what the date will be. Mr. Stevens stated that last winter was horrendous and it pushed back the schedule. Mr. Stevens stated that it has been a great winter so far this year and the project is moving forward and they are working as hard as possible and as quickly as possible. The NJDOT is opening a new line of communication between the NJDOT and the County Engineer to alleviate concerns and that they would get regular updates to the County Engineer. Freeholder Kelly stated that the County has had a very good working relationship with the NJDOT during this project and thanked Mr. Stevens. The Freeholder stated that regular updates give the County the ability to react when residents have concerns; the more the County knows about issues the better it is for all, good communication is necessary because this is a massive project. Mr. Stevens stated that the Route 35 project has a direct impact on several communities.

Director Bartlett stated that this is a massive project; the old concrete roadway was built 88 years ago, there is no alternative to the amount of work that needs to get done; however, if you are a business and people can not get into your store, it is very frustrating. Director Bartlett stated that the County recognizes the undertaking of this project to put the roadway back together and the County is happy the NJDOT listens to our concerns, noting that this is not going to be a quick project but we are getting there. The Freeholders questioned the cost of the Route 35 project and Mr. Stevens advised that this is a \$300 million investment and when all is said and done a full road has been reconstructed the length of the island. Route 35 was a slab of concrete on sand and the new road is all new material. Freeholder Lacey stated that this does not include the pumping of sand onto the beaches for dunes. The Freeholder stated that he preferred that the NJDOT started the project when originally planned; 10 months was lost and we are paying for it now; however, the NJDOT is doing a good job with difficult circumstances. Freeholder Kelly stated that problems with the infrastructure have arisen during the project causing additional difficulties. The Freeholder thanked the NJDOT for attending the meeting and updating the Board.

Mr. Scarantino reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda. There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the agenda for the January 21, 2015 Board meeting.

Ms. Vasil reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of January 21, 2015. Ms. Vasil advised that the Local Government Energy Audit application will be added to the Board agenda. There were no questions or comments.

Director Bartlett asked the Board members for comments.

Freeholder Lacey noted that the County receives approximately \$350,000 back from the recycling tax collected on every ton of material that is going into the landfill. This money funds the Household Hazardous Waste Program, composting activities and buys some equipment. The Freeholder noted that for 2014, because of Superstorm Sandy, there was an additional 35 tons collected. Ocean County received \$462,000 which was the second highest return, only Bergen County received more.

Freeholder Vicari reviewed with the Board several letters he has sent out regarding the infrastructure for electric within the County and that he agreed with Assemblyman McGuckin that JCPL should return \$1 million in excessive profits and that rate increases should be adjusted. The Freeholder noted his letter of March 4, 2013 where he made a request that there should be a three year freeze on increases for water, electric and cable. The Freeholder stated that this Board has been in the forefront in asking for improvements.

There were no additional comments.

Ms. Vasil read the resolution to move to closed session.

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On a motion by Freeholder Lacey, seconded by Freeholder Vicari, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 5:00 PM for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was unanimously carried.

Freeholder Director John C. Bartlett opened the meeting at 4:30 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Fiure, Director of Management & Budget Frank Scarantino, County Engineer Julie N. Tarrant, Comptroller/CFO Donna Flynn, Director, Public Information John C. Sahradnik, Jr., County Counsel

Director Bartlett stated that notification was made to move today's meeting time to 4:30 PM due to the swearing in of the new Judge at the Courthouse where Governor Christie was in attendance.

Freeholder Lacey stated that Jim Pine and Tom Curcio are the ones that make everything work during storm events noting that the taxpayers expect it from the County. Freeholder Lacey stated that it is a small army of men and women that get the job done. The Freeholder noted that two days before the storm, salt was mixed with water in house and put down on County's roadways; the brine mixture has to go down on the road prior to

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the event to help with safety on County roadways. The Freeholder stated that weather reports stated that a couple of feet were possible, but that did not materialize. The cost, however, is there whether it is 3 feet or 3 inches and the same actions need to be taken noted the Freeholder and the County does a great job with over 1,600 miles of roads. Wear and tear on equipment is great.

Tom Curcio was in attendance at the meeting and updated the Board on the Road Department activities, noting that the past week was a mix of a couple of storm events, starting on Friday where crews worked hard during the day which was a slushy mess and throughout the night into Saturday. Mechanics were also on hand during this time. Mr. Curcio stated that on Saturday the melted snow refroze and there was a lot of black ice; and by Sunday, crews were brining and dry salting roadways to be prepared for the Monday storm that fortunately was not as bad. Mr. Curcio advised that the County used more than 4,654 tons of salt, 2,093 gallons of calcium and 37,000 gallons of brine with a total cost of materials at approximately \$321,000.

Mr. Curcio thanked the Freeholders for purchasing some additional plow vehicles this year which led to fewer breakdowns during the snow events. This allowed the Department to take some much older vehicles off the road. Director Bartlett advised that when he was a Mayor, he would ride along with some of the plows and people do not realize the wear and tear on trucks during snow events. The Director noted that having the Vehicle Services Department there to make repairs and keep the trucks on the road is essential and the Director thanked Jim Pine, Director of Vehicle Services for his Department's hard work as well.

Mr. Pine was in attendance and advised that his Department starts in April and works all year long to always be prepared. Mr. Pine also noted that we did not receive the amount of snow that was predicted, but this was a 5 day storm event and staff was available throughout the storm. He also stated that preparation is key and having new trucks on the road helped as well as the truck washes which help maintain equipment and remove the salt and brine residue on the vehicles. Mr. Pine stated that the truck wash has paid real dividends. Mr. Pine thanked the Board for the investment in the vehicles as well as the truck washes. Mr. Curcio stated that the brine trucks are repurposed vehicles and all of the work is done in-house with very innovative welding. Freeholder Lacey advised that it was still a five day event using 12,000 gallons of fuel with parts and repairs estimated at \$30,000. Director Bartlett stated that the job had to get done and the County did get it done. The Director noted that repurposing vehicles says that the County is not just going to buy new equipment just to buy it, this is expensive equipment but if we don't have the equipment, the job doesn't get done which is the County's first responsibility.

Freeholder Vicari stated that there are 135 buildings. The County never closes. Buildings such as the jail, Sheriff, and law enforcement are open 24 / 7 and have to be kept open. The Freeholder commended Joe Meyers, Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds, for doing a great job in getting the buildings shoveled, making sure the buildings are heated and open for business. Freeholder Vicari stated that 17 tons of materials had to be spread by hand on sidewalks, parking lots, the parking garage and 28 men and women do this in-

house. They were grateful for the overtime and no one refused to work during the 5 day event. The Freeholder noted that the Superior Courts are State offices; however, they are County buildings and the County has to clear the sidewalks and make the buildings accessible. Freeholder Kelly stated that lawsuits happen, but the County does its best to get all the sidewalks and parking lots clear, and spending the money to clear these areas reduces the lawsuits. The Freeholder noted that these are B&G employees that come in during storm emergencies who put forth every effort to get the job done and the Freeholder thanked Joe Meyers and his staff for a job well done.

Administrator Block stated that the County was prepared for a large storm event as predicted, noting that it doesn't matter if it is a couple of inches predicted or 2 to 3 feet, the County is prepared and the job done. Mr. Curcio noted that the County stations equipment throughout the County in preparation for storm events. Director Bartlett thanked Tom Curcio, Jim Pine, Joe Meyers and all the County staff for their work during storm emergencies.

Mr. Scarantino reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda. There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the agenda for the February 4, 2015 Board meeting.

Freeholder Kelly stated that every County engineering project contains a safety component to it; shoulder widening, adjustment of curbs and modifying dangerous curbs, etc. The Freeholder noted that the County provides safer roads but can not make them safe when it comes to an unsafe driver. Freeholder Kelly stated that the Engineering Department is putting together a report for the Lakewood / Jackson area of the County where some of the worst accidents have occurred. The Freeholder noted that there are over 100 miles of County roads in Jackson Township, the most in one town in Ocean County. Freeholder Kelly stated that the report will be listed on the agenda for an upcoming meeting. Director Bartlett stated that the County has been ahead of the curve in investing in County roads in Jackson Township, which has had significant growth and handles a large amount of traffic. Freeholder Kelly stated that everything the County does is to maintain a safe road system for a continually growing County; the County's makes investments for that growth year in and The Freeholder also stated that all County projects have an environmental vear out. component to them as well. Environmental impacts cost dollars but the County does what it Freeholder Kelly noted that the Parkway project to put an additional lane has to do. southbound, took two years to get the permits. This is part of what makes it so expensive; there is a cost to make things safer as well as time to get a project done.
