PUBLIC QUESTIONS TO BE VOTED UPON

STATE QUESTION NO. 1 NEW JERSEY LIBRARY CONSTRUCTION BOND ACT

Do you approve the "New Jersey Library Construction Bond Act"? This bond act authorizes the State to issue bonds in the aggregate principal amount of \$125 million. The proceeds of the bonds will be used to provide grants to public libraries. The grants will be used to build, equip, and expand public libraries to increase capacity and serve the public.

INTERPRETIVE STATEMENT

Approval of this bond act will allow the State to sell \$125 million in State general obligation bonds. Proceeds from the bonds will be used to provide grants to construct, expand, and equip public libraries. Municipalities or counties that fund public libraries will match the grant amount. The municipality or county may solicit private funding to support its match. The State Librarian, in consultation with the President of Thomas Edison State University, will set eligibility criteria for the grants.

STATE QUESTION NO. 2 CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT DEDICATING MONEYS FROM STATE ENVIRONMENTAL CONTAMINATION CASES

Do you approve amending the Constitution to dedicate all moneys collected by the State relating to natural resource damages in cases of contamination of the environment? The moneys would have to be used to repair, restore, replace, or preserve the State's natural resources. The moneys may also be used to pay legal or other costs incurred by the State in pursuing its claims.

INTERPRETIVE STATEMENT

This amendment would dedicate moneys collected by the State relating to natural resource damages through settlements or awards for legal claims based on environmental contamination. These moneys would be dedicated to repair, replace, or restore damaged natural resources, or to preserve the State's natural resources. The moneys would be spent in an area as close as possible to the geographical area in which the damage occurred. The moneys could also be used to pay for the State's legal or other costs in pursuing the claims. Currently, these moneys may be used for any State purpose.

LOCAL QUESTION NO. 1 REFERENDUM QUESTION ORDINANCE 16-13: TROLLEYS

Shall the Township of Long Beach be permitted to engage in the business of transportation, and, therefore, be authorized to charge fares to persons to use the existing municipal transportation system, as described in an ordinance of the Board of Commissioners of the Township of Long Beach entitled "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED. "CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF LONG BEACH, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, 1997" AS THE SAME IN CHAPTER 195 PERTAINS TO THE MUNICIPAL TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM.", which was passed on April 4, 2016?

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

Currently, the Long Beach Township Municipal Transportation System is funded by Township Property Owner tax dollars, contributions from Island Municipalities (constituting additional tax dollars), advertising revenues and grants. The Township seeks authorization to fund the Transportation System in a more equitable manner through fares paid by actual riders of the Trolley. By voting in favor of the question, the Township shall be authorized to charge a fare to those who actually ride and use the Trolley. The fares collected shall provide funding necessary to maintain and improve fleet vehicles, as well as ensure the quality, response and efficiency of the System.

"Yes" vote will permit the Governing Body the ability to charge a minimal fare, if necessary.

ORDINANCE 17-30: OPEN SPACE TAX

Shall the Township of Long Beach establish the "Township of Long Beach Open Space, Recreation, Floodplain Protection, and Farmland and Historic Preservation Trust Fund" to be used for the purposes of acquiring, developing, and maintaining recreational and conservation properties, acquiring or preserving historic properties, and/or for the payment of debt service incurred by the Township for these purposes to be funded at a rate not to exceed one cent (\$0.01) per one hundred dollars of total Township equalized real property valuation?

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

The Long Beach Township Board of Commissioners has revitalized various land parcels by and through the creation of new public parks and trails. In an effort to further obtain land dedicated to the establishment of additional open public areas, an Open Space Tax assessment is contemplated. The Open Space fund shall be dedicated to the purchase of land parcels located in Long Beach Township and reserved for use as parks and recreational areas, or for the preservation of historic structures. The proposed tax shall be \$0.01 per \$100.00 of assessed property value.

"Yes" vote approves a tax dedicated to Open Space purchase(s).

"No" vote would not permit a tax dedicated to Open Space purchase(s).
