WHEREAS, the voters of Ocean County authorized the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund to provide funds for the acquisition and preservation of natural lands, open spaces and farmland; and

WHEREAS, the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee was established by the Board of Chosen Freeholders to review nominations to the program and forward recommendations for acquisition to the Board of Chosen Freeholders; and

WHEREAS, the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee has received a nomination for the property identified as Block 8, Lot 4 totaling approximately 7 acres located on Mill Street in South Toms River Borough; and

WHEREAS, the property contains a portion of the Jakes Branch, a tributary of the Toms River, which has a significant water resource and environmental value; and

WHEREAS, a professional appraisal has been completed to establish the fair market value of the property; and

WHEREAS, the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee has determined the property's attributes are consistent with the Ocean County Open Space Plan and Recreation Inventory; and

WHEREAS, the County of Ocean would acquire the property for an amount not to exceed \$35,000; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing on the proposed acquisition was conducted by the Board of Chosen Freeholders on February 5, 2014 as required by PL 1997, c24.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY as follows:

1. It accepts the recommendation of the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee to participate in the acquisition of 8, Lot 4 totaling approximately 7 acres located on Mill Street in South Toms River Borough.
2. It authorizes the expenditure not to exceed \$35,000 in acquisition funds from the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund, Account Number 225-155-0151.
3. It authorizes the Freeholder Director to execute any and all agreements made available to provide additional funding for the acquisition of this property.

RESOLUTION

FEBRUARY 5, 2014

WHEREAS, pursuant to the sunset provision contained in P.L. 2010, c. 105 the 2% cap on interest arbitration awards is set to expire on April 1, 2014; and

WHEREAS, this law empowers county governments throughout the State to effectively control public safety employment salaries and personnel costs by capping interest arbitration awards at 2% for base salaries, which includes step increments and longevity pay; and

WHEREAS, county governments dedicate a substantial portion of their overall annual operating budgets for employee salaries, wages, health benefits and other personnel costs; and

WHEREAS, county governments face a restrictive 2% property tax cap levy where counties must prepare two comprehensive cap calculations and use the more restrictive one; and

WHEREAS, failure to extend the 2% cap on interest arbitration awards will force county governments to further reduce or even eliminate essential services, critical personnel and long-overdue infrastructure improvements projects; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of county governments and property taxpayers throughout the State struggling to make ends meet to permanently extend the 2% cap on interest arbitration awards.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the **BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS** of the **COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY** hereby strongly urges Governor Chris Christie and the New Jersey State Legislature to enact legislation that will permanently extend the 2% cap on interest arbitration awards before April 1, 2014.

Freeholder Director John P. Kelly opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Mr. Scarantino reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda. There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the agenda for the December 18, 2013 Board meeting.

Ms. Vasil reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of December 18, 2013. There were no questions or comments.

Director Kelly noted that at the last Board meeting, a group was in attendance providing comments about Common Core State Standards. The Freeholder noted that there are three Freeholders that were former educators. The Director asked Freeholder Vicari to review the information submitted by the group and make a recommendation on whether this Board should consider adopting a resolution.

Director Kelly reviewed the population at the Juvenile Detention Center noting that the State of New Jersey has changed their philosophy from detention to rehabilitation focusing on drug addiction. The County is looking into this. The Director noted that in the past the population at the facility had been between 35 and 40 juveniles and the County is licensed for 30. The County put an addition on the Center to accommodate this which included classrooms and a library space to meet, at that time, the County's responsibilities to the Courts. Freeholder Kelly stated that at times, the County has had as few as four juveniles at a time, but averages about 15 juveniles, much under what the County can handle at the facility. Director Kelly stated that juveniles are placed in one of three categories (detention, shelter or RAISE Program) assigned by the Judges.

Director Kelly stated that he has put together a committee which includes Judges, the County Prosecutor, the County Administrator and others including members of the public to look at the facility to use existing dollars to refocus what we are doing. The Director noted that juveniles at the shelter are now going to be contracted out for services with Middlesex County for under \$300,000 a year. This will save the County about a half a million dollars. Director Kelly stated that the County is going to use this money at the detention center. The Director stated that the Committee has been told not to go over the budget the County already has. Programs would include expanding the drug court to expand rehabilitation programs and assistance on release with jobs, services and housing, and working with nonprofits to help with drug addiction for both the Juvenile Detention and the jail to help make them more productive members of society.

Freeholder Bartlett congratulated Director Kelly for trying to move this into a positive direction and complemented him on trying to do this within the existing funds the County currently expends. Freeholder Vicari stated that good kids make mistakes and the expanded programs will help rehabilitate them. The Freeholder noted that the Ocean County VoTech is part of those programs, to help the juveniles get out and be able to get a job; the County wants to be as proactive as possible. Freeholder Lacey stated that these programs give kids a second chance.

There were no additional comments.

Ms. Vasil read the resolution to move to closed session.






