ORDINANCE #2020-27

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$300,000 FROM THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND FOR THE COST OF VARIOUS CAPITAL REPLACEMENTS, RENOVATIONS AND UPGRADES AT VARIOUS BRANCHES OF THE COUNTY LIBRARY SYSTEM, ALL IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY.

WHEREAS, the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean recognizes the need for various capital replacements, renovations and upgrades at various branches of the County Library system, all in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the County that funds be available for this purpose.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS of the COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING), as follows:

SECTION 1: \$300,000 is hereby appropriated from the Capital Improvement Fund for the cost of various capital replacements, renovations and upgrades at various branches of the County Library system, all in the County of Ocean, including all else necessary therefor and incidental thereto, which sum shall also cover fees and contingencies.

SECTION 2: The capital budget of the County of Ocean is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of Local Government Services is on file with the Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

SECTION 3: After passage upon first reading of this Ordinance, the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders is hereby directed to publish the full text of the Ordinance, together with the notice set forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF PENDING ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-19, at least seven days prior to the date set for public hearing and further consideration for final passage (which date shall be at least ten days after introduction and first reading). The Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders is further directed to comply with all provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-17(b) regarding postings, publications, and the provision of copies of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4: After final adoption of this Ordinance by the Board of Chosen Freeholders, the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders is hereby directed to publish the full text of this Ordinance, as finally adopted, together with the notice set forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-19.

RESOLUTION *July 15, 2020*

- **WHEREAS**, the voters of Ocean County authorized the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund to provide funds for the acquisition and preservation of natural lands, open spaces and farmland; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee was established by the Board of Chosen Freeholders to review nominations to the program and forward recommendations for acquisition to the Board of Chosen Freeholders; and
- WHEREAS, the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee has received a nomination for the property identified as Block 1409, Lot 5 in Berkeley Township totaling approximately 5.59 acres located on Butler Boulevard; and
- **WHEREAS**, two professional appraisals were authorized to determine the fair market value; and
- WHEREAS, the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee has determined the property's attributes are consistent with the Ocean County Open Space Plan and Recreation Inventory; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Township of Berkeley has stated an interest in partnering with an in-kind contribution in the form of demolition services; and
- **WHEREAS**, the County of Ocean would acquire the property for a purchase price not to exceed \$350,000.00 of equivalent land value; and
- WHEREAS, a public hearing on the proposed acquisition was conducted by the Board of Chosen Freeholders on July 15, 2020 as required by PL 1997, c24.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY as follows:
- 1. It accepts the recommendation of the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee acquire property identified as Block 1409, Lot 5 in Berkeley Township totaling approximately 5.59 acres located on Butler Boulevard.
- 2. It authorizes the expenditure for an acquisition price not to exceed \$350,000.00 plus up to \$1,700.00 for property tax adjustments as necessary from the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund, Account Number 225-155-0151.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT

- 1. The proper officers of the Board are authorized and directed to sign all necessary documents in order to effectuate these purchases.
- 2. The purchase of the property is to be contingent upon the County's acquisition by purchase, deed or gift of the necessary rights-of-way along any County roads bordering the property as determined by the County Engineer.

Freeholder Director Joseph Vicari opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

This Pre-Board Meeting was held in Room 119 in an effort to abide by social distancing guidelines set forth by Governor Murphy. There were 10 participants in the room at a time. A nurse interviewed and took temperatures of all in attendance, and a phone number for the public to call in on was listed on the Ocean County website, and advertised in the newspaper as well.

Freeholder Director Vicari introduced Freeholder Little to discuss the Coronavirus update. The total number of positive cases in Ocean County is 7,688, with 571 deaths. Of the 571 deaths, 343 of them or 60% are in long term care facilities. The County Health Department along with the State Health Department are responsible for tracking the disease. Contact tracing is a large part of the research. It consists of an hour long Members of the Board of Chosen Freeholders May 20, 2020 Pre-Board meeting of May 13, 2020 Page 2

interview with the affected patient to determine the possible point where contraction of the disease occurred. The Health Department has been training individuals to conduct the interviews. The Health Department and Ocean County College have partnered to use the college's computer labs to train these employees. The CARES Act will cover the costs. Freeholder Little thanked Dan Regenye, and the Health Department for their efforts during the pandemic.

Sandra Mueller notified the Board that they are attempting to keep COVID-19 entirely out of the jail. The Warden said there are no prisoners infected, and only two officers tested positive. Congregate areas are being disinfected constantly. The Sheriff said they are prepared for a second wave. They have a multitude of PPE supplies that they can share with towns and long term care facilities. The Sheriff's Department is working with Ocean Ride, the Election Board, and the Corrections Department. UV lights, as well as a disinfectant spray are being utilized in a decontamination tent for officers to enter upon leaving work. Keith Klements has returned from retirement to help out at the Office of Emergency Management.

Employee Relations received a plan from Sheriff Mastronardy that would bring employees back to work while socially distancing and following guidelines. The Sheriff sales have taken place at Toms River South High School due to distancing guidelines and will remain there for the time being. Suicides have increased during the pandemic. There are 10 Sheriff's Department employees that have tested positive for the virus thus far.

Mr. Agliata told the Board that the Pump Out Boat Program will be up and running by Memorial Day Weekend. Barnegat Bay is a National Estuary and a no discharge area as well. The boat captains do an outstanding job, and are educated on new social distancing guidelines while boating.

Freeholder Haines spoke about a Natural Lands Trust Fund Acquisition of 0.13 acres on Berkeley Avenue and the Barnegat Branch Trail near the Cedar Creek in Berkeley Township. An additional 2.27 acre property on Cleveland Street near 111 acres of Open Space property in Toms River was discussed. It had an asking price of \$250,000, and a negotiated price of \$215,000. Freeholder Haines expressed the importance of continuing to acquire Open Space property for the residents of Ocean County.

Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the recommendation to advertise for the reconstruction and resurfacing of 6 miles of county roads in Lakewood, Jackson, and Plumsted Townships Contract 2020A. Mr. Ernst also mentioned that the Morris Blvd. Bridge project which is located in Beach Haven West in Stafford Township, will be completed on schedule. Long Beach Boulevard is currently being resurfaced from 58th Street to 67th Street, which is the first phase of a larger project. The second phase will mill 2" from the road surface, level, and resurface 67th to 86th Street, raising the road to the acceptable flood elevation. The third phase, which will occur after the summer, will consist of milling, leveling, and

resurfacing 25th through 13th Streets. There were no questions or comments and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the May 20, 2020 Board meeting.

Ms. Cilento reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of May 20, 2020. There were no questions or comments.

Freeholder Director Vicari asked the Board members for comments.

There were no additional comments.

Mr. Block gave an update on the CARES Act funding. Julie Tarrant had a conference call with the State and obtained pertinent information in which she will be passing on to the towns. A countywide email chain was set up and a fillable form was sent out to each municipality which they will use to request reimbursements for COVID-19 expenses through the CARES Act. \$106 million dollars may seem like a lot of money, but it may disperse quickly, so the County will prioritize the municipalities' requests. Only nine Counties in New Jersey received the CARES Act funding directly. Mr. Block said he is very appreciative of the grant, and wants to be sure that the funds that are dispensed are approved by the guidelines set forth by the Federal government and the State as well.

Freeholder Kelly said the County will use diligence while following the guidelines, and will be conservative with administering the funds.

Ms. Cilento read the resolution to move to closed session.

On a motion by Freeholder Haines, seconded by Freeholder Kelly, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 4:43pm for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was unanimously carried.

The meeting returned to Open Session at 5:07pm. There being no further business, on a motion by Freeholder Haines, seconded by Freeholder Quinn, the meeting adjourned at 5:08pm.
