ORDINANCE #2014-3

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A PROJECT CONSISTING OF THE RECONSTRUCTION AND RESURFACING OF VARIOUS ROADS, ALL LOCATED IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND APPROPRIATING \$5,000,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$4,750,000 IN BONDS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN TO FINANCE THE SAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING) AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. There is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the County of Ocean as general improvements, a project consisting of the reconstruction and resurfacing of various roads, all in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, in accordance with plans and specifications on file in the Ocean County Engineering Department, including all else necessary therefor and incidental thereto.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared that the improvements or purposes, the estimated cost of the improvements and appropriation therefor, down payment and estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes authorized are as follows:

A project consisting of the reconstruction and resurfacing of various roads, all in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey

TOTALS \$5,000,000 \$250,000 \$4,750,000

SECTION 3. There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$5,000,000, including the sum of \$250,000 as the down payment, for the improvements or purposes described in Section 1 hereof as required by the Local Bond Law. The down payment has been made available by virtue of provision in the Capital Improvement Fund of the County of Ocean in one or more previously adopted budgets.

SECTION 4. There is hereby authorized the issuance of negotiable bonds in an aggregate principal amount of \$4,750,000 to finance part of the cost of the purposes stated in Section 1 hereof. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding the limit authorized by law, and the maturities, method of sale and other details thereof shall be determined by subsequent resolutions to be adopted in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 5. In order to temporarily finance the purposes provided for in Section 1 hereof, there is hereby authorized the issuance of bond anticipation notes of said County in an aggregate principal amount of \$4,750,000. Freeholder Director Joseph H. Vicari opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Freeholder Lacey reviewed with the Board the Recycling Revenue Sharing Program for the period of July through December 31, 2013. The Freeholder advised that approximately 41,000 tons was recycled during this period; municipalities will receive a total of about a half a million dollars and save approximately \$2.9 million in tipping fees. Freeholder Lacey stated that corrugated material was up at \$29.00 a ton for this period while newspaper and aluminum was down. Freeholder Vicari noted that this program works, the County has never missed paying a dividend to its municipalities. Ocean County was the first to have this program and has won awards for our program. The Freeholder also noted that the biggest savings is that the

material is not going into the landfill with a cost avoidance of almost \$3 million in tipping fees. This is a very successful program.

Director Vicari stated that the Department of Consumer Affairs serves the entire County, noting that over the past two years the Department has expanded what they do. The Director stated that with Superstorm Sandy, the Department is working with contractors to make sure they do not take advantage of our residents. Last year, the Department helped return \$1 million for consumers in Ocean County. Director Vicari introduced Ed McBride, Consumer Affairs Department, who lost his home during the storm and knows the problems consumers are facing while they are trying to get back home.

Mr. McBride noted that the Department of Consumer Affairs is very busy with less employees than the in the past, stating that employees attended weights and measures training with the Attorney General's Office. Mr. McBride stated that staff checks gas tanks at gas stations, scales, and many things that affect consumers; noting that the biggest item has been Superstorm Sandy recently, stating that residents are suffering. Mr. McBride noted that the Department is not trying to hurt businesses, but it has to make sure that consumers are getting what they pay for; many contractors that have come from out-of-state to do storm repairs have made a lot of money but have left the State without completing the work. Mr. McBride advised that a scam taking place now is the one ring phone scam. Customers who call the number back are directed to an adult entertainment site where you are charged \$19.95.

Director Vicari stated that when you call Consumer Affairs you reach a person; the staff helps our residents and a good effort is put forth.

Mr. Scarantino reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda. There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the agenda for the March 5, 2014 Board meeting.

Ms. Wioland reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of March 5, 2014. Freeholder Bartlett questioned if Item 4 on the agenda was going to be pulled from the meeting? Administrator Block stated that this is the resolution establishing the amount to be raised by taxation for the Ocean County Library and that this item will be removed from this Board agenda.

Administrator Block reviewed with the Board County's losses from Superstorm Sandy. Great American Insurance is working with Risk Management. The total is just under \$1.6 million. The Administrator advised that the statement of loss with Great American will give the County the ability to file for FEMA dollars after insurance is settled. Freeholder Vicari questioned the status of Cattus Island Park. Mr. Goetting advised that there was no flood insurance in place at Cattus Island Park.

There were no questions or comments.

Director Vicari asked the Board members for comments.

Director Vicari stated that he received calls from the barrier island towns regarding their concerns about traffic this past Saturday for the Polar Plunge. This was featured on news channels. The Director noted that the weather was great and many, many people came out for the plunge, traffic was 14 miles long and the roads were a mess. Director Vicari stated that the State is working on 12 ½ miles of road that he felt that should have been done in stages. The Director noted that there are pot holes, resulting is damages to vehicles; gas line issues; and difficulties for fire services and EMS. Emergency vehicles could not get through for emergencies. Director Vicari stated that this can not happen for the St. Patrick's Day Parade, there must be someone onsite to make decisions during the day. Director Vicari stated that the State needs to be more sensitive to the residents. The Director stated that a plan needs to be in place before the St. Patrick's Day Parade. The Director noted that the County is not directly involved in the parade; however, if no decision is made by Tuesday, next week, the Director felt that a resolution from this Board would be appropriate expressing that a plan of action needs to be in place before the St. Patrick's Day Parade takes place.

Freeholder Kelly stated that Route 35 is a large scale project and that traffic and traveling the barrier island may get worse before it gets better. The Freeholder advised that the County does not have jurisdiction for this project, noting that the County has, however, been working with the engineer and the NJDOT. The County has not seen this scale of a project. Work includes replacing everything and building a new road surface with a 50 year life span. Freeholder Kelly stated that this project is going to take a long, long time. People want the work to stop at Memorial Day for the summer. Freeholder Kelly noted that during this winter not a lot of work could done due to snow storms. The County is doing its best to work with the NJDOT and the mayors of the towns involved. This is a lot of road that has to be replaced and the only road on the island. Freeholder Kelly stated that a lot of money is being spent on the road and in the end the County will have a road designed for today and for decades to come. The Freeholder also noted that it is appropriate that the Director is on top of this issue. This Board may consider a resolution at a future date. Director Vicari stated that there was a breakdown in communications and that did not have to happen.

Director Vicari stated that there will be a networking program tomorrow at the Bishop Library regarding the Joint Base. Major departments from the Base will be in attendance as well as business leaders. The next networking program will be held at the Blue Claws Stadium in Lakewood. The Director noted that more programs will be held.

Director Vicari stated that the library will be redoing their website to include more app's. The Director noted that those 55 and older use the printed page for

information; however, we need to reach out to the 26-40 year olds through computer app's. Students from the VoTech will be designing some programs relating to tourism and the Barnegat Bay. This should be completed sometime in May.

Freeholder Bartlett reviewed with the Board members some problems at Cattus Island Park and the devastation faced from Superstorm Sandy. The Cooper Environmental Center was built with the outside deck and a portion of the building built on pilings. The floor of the building is a poured concrete floor and the Freeholder stated questions have been raised on whether the building can be raised. Freeholder Bartlett stated that at this time there is no public access to the building. Sheetrock and insulation has been removed. Freeholder Bartlett noted that the building does not meet current ADA standards as well as the bathrooms and if the building were to be rebuilt, ADA requirements have to be addressed and a wetlands permit would be needed to accomplish this. The Freeholder noted that it is not as if the County is not fixing the building since the storm, the building can't be done to meet current building codes and FEMA requirements. This site is in the wetlands and this is just one of the items being investigated. Freeholder Bartlett advised that the County has recently issued a contract for an architectural review and the County will continue to formulate a plan to address these problems.

Freeholder Bartlett advised that a group has been formed, Friends of Cattus Island Park, and they are soliciting donations to help the Park. The Freeholder noted that this group is not sanctioned by the Board of Chosen Freeholders or the Ocean County Parks Department. Freeholder Bartlett stated that they are good hearted people but they have been to-date counterproductive to the task at hand. The group has not called to speak to the County about the Park. Freeholder Bartlett stated that there are ongoing issues as to what the eventual result will be to restore the Park.

Freeholder Bartlett advised that he has discussed with County Counsel Sahradnik the possibility of the County registering the name of Cattus Island Park so that other people can not use it. Mr. Sahradnik has advised that there are some difficulties because it is a geographic location as opposed to a legal name or trademark. Freeholder Bartlett advised that County Counsel is looking into seeing what can be done to make sure that there is no unauthorized use of the County name, pictures or logos.

There were no additional comments.

Ms. Vasil read the resolution to move to closed session.

On a motion by Freeholder Kelly, seconded by Freeholder Lacey, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 4:55 PM for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was unanimously carried.
