# Pffice of the Freeholder Director poclamation April 5, 2017

WHEREAS, PARKINSON'S DISEASE is a chronic, progressive, neurological disease and is the second most common neurodegenerative disease in the United States; and

WHEREAS, there is inadequate data on the incidence and prevalence of Parkinson's disease, but it is estimated to affect 500,000 to 1,500,000 people in the United States and the prevalence will more than double by 2040; and

WHEREAS, PARKINSON'S DISEASE is the 14<sup>th</sup> leading cause of death in the United States according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and it is estimated that the economic burden of Parkinson's disease is at least \$14.4 billion annually, including indirect costs to patients and family members of \$6.3 billion; and

WHEREAS, research suggests the cause of Parkinson's disease is a combination of genetic and environmental factors, but the exact cause and progression of the disease is still unknown; and

WHEREAS, there is no objective test or biomarker for Parkinson's disease nor cure or drug to slow or halt the progression of the disease; and

WHEREAS, the symptoms of Parkinson's disease vary from person to person and can include tremors; slowness of movement and rigidity; difficulty with balance, swallowing, chewing, and speaking; cognitive impairment and dementia; mood disorders; and a variety of other nonmotor symptoms; and

WHEREAS, increased research, education, and community support services are needed to find more effective treatments and to provide access to quality care to those living with the disease today; which includes the 2017 web-based, user friendly program for police officers, fire fighters, and emergency medical service providers to help them recognize the unique symptoms and needs of those with Parkinson's disease and enable them to provide the best and most appropriate care.

WHEREAS, since 1977, the Ocean County Board of Chosen Freeholders has provided steadfast guidance, support and funding to the provision of County transportation service focused for the benefit of senior citizens and persons with disabilities; and

WHEREAS, the County transportation service, known as Ocean County Handicapped and Elderly Transportation Service (OCHETS), first began on April 17, 1977 with a total of 4 drivers and 4 vehicles. A second service known as Ocean County Area Transportation (OCAT) was launched in 1980 which inaugurated the start of bus route service throughout the rural portions of the County; and

WHEREAS, for many Ocean County residents, the availability of County transportation means an opportunity to remain independent, self-sufficient and to participate fully in activities of daily life; and

WHEREAS, the County transportation system provides a wide variety of trip purposes including access to medical, shopping, governmental and related social service agencies, employment, education, social and recreational opportunities and facilities; and

WHEREAS, the County transportation system has benefited greatly by the availability of grant programs provided by Federal and State government and successfully leveraged County funding to support the expansion and modernization of this vital service; and

WHEREAS, the system has been greatly modernized with the implementation of a state-of-the-art, cloud-based software system and on-board tablets in the fleet to enhance the daily reservations, scheduling, routing and GIS activities. The program name Ocean Ride was formally adopted in 2000 and features a cobalt blue logo with a wave motif which is prominently displayed on the vehicle fleet and marketing materials; and

WHEREAS, Ocean Ride was recognized as the "Outstanding New Jersey COST System of the Year for 2016" by the New Jersey Council on Specialized Transportation; and

WHEREAS, today, the Ocean Ride system includes 74 vehicles and 82 full- and part-time drivers along with a full support staff and operates a variety of transportation services including 11 bus routes, local flex routes, veterans trips, a wide array of medical trips, service for disabled adults to access competitive employment, Reserve-A-Ride and the transportation mini-grant program; and

WHEREAS, the County transportation system has expanded greatly to provide transportation service and access for senior citizens, persons with disabilities and the general public and, as a result, the total ridership since system inception now exceeds over 8 million passenger trips.

WHEREAS, on February 15, 2017, the Ocean County Board of Chosen Freeholders adopted a resolution opposing the Atlantic State Marine Fisheries Commission (ASMFC) quota reductions on summer fluke/flounder; and

WHEREAS, on Thursday, February 2, 2017 the ASMFC voted 7-3 to significantly reduce New Jersey's recreational fishing quota for summer fluke/flounder beginning in 2017; and

WHEREAS, this 34% quota reduction will have a dramatic and disastrous effect on the residents of Ocean County, especially those that rely upon the summer flounder fishery for their livelihood; and

WHEREAS, in an area of New Jersey that was heavily hit by Superstorm Sandy in 2012 and is finally regaining some of its economic losses, this rule will hurt tourism which is a key factor of Ocean County's economic engine; and

WHEREAS, the new rule applies a near coastwide 1-inch size limit increase and bag limit reduction to four fish or less along the Atlantic Coast in 2017, with North Carolina exempt from the measures, and the tri-state region of New York, Connecticut and New Jersey getting a three-fish bag limit; and

WHEREAS, in New Jersey, the recreational and commercial fishing industries generate about \$2.5 billion annually and represent more than 20,000 jobs, according to State DEP Commissioner Bob Martin. Recreational fishermen landed more than 650,000 summer flounder and commercial fishermen caught more than 1.2 million pounds last year; and

WHEREAS, in a letter to U.S. Department of Commerce Secretary Penny Pritzker opposing the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration Fisheries Freeholder Director Joseph H. Vicari opposed the reduction in the commercial quotas and recreational harvest limits for summer flounder in 2017 and 2018; and

WHEREAS, Fishing advocacy groups that have been actively opposing the measure include the New Jersey Outdoor Alliance, the Recreational Fishing Alliance, the New Jersey Coast Anglers Association, the New Jersey Federation of

Sportsmen's Clubs, United Boatmen and the Save the Summer Flounder Fishery Fund; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey representatives of the ASMFC have filed an appeal requesting the Commission to reconsider its vote.



Freeholder Director Joseph H. Vicari opened the meeting at 4:05 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

#### Present:

Goetting, Director of Human Resources Julie N. Tarrant, Comptroller/CFO John N. Ernst, County Engineer Christine Wioland, Deputy Clerk of the Board Donna Flynn, Director, Public Information John C. Sahradnik, Jr., County Counsel

Director Vicari congratulated Freeholder Bartlett for an outstanding job on the 2017 Budget and for the cooperation from all of the County's departments. Freeholder Bartlett started his comments by giving a brief explanation of the budget process, noting that all of the Freeholders are involved in the process. The Freeholder stated that this is the 38<sup>th</sup> budget that he is presenting to this Board, noting that the County builds the budget by determining what resources are available and what the County has to spend. Freeholder Bartlett noted that he meets with each of the Freeholders to discuss the budget. The Freeholder noted that after the County determines what its resources are, the County has the perimeters that the budget must fit into. Freeholder Bartlett stated that once the County has Members of the Board of Chosen Freeholders February 23, 2017 Summary of the Pre-Board meeting of February 22, 2017 Page 2

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the perimeters, those perimeters are given to the department heads to submit a budget for consideration that fits within the County's ability.

Freeholder Bartlett stated that the 2017 Budget is \$407.9 million which is up 2 percent from last year's \$400 million, noting that inflation is running at 2 ½ percent. The Freeholder noted that the tax base total valuation of the County has grown by 2.78 percent from last year from increased values, replacement construction from Superstorm Sandy and new construction. Freeholder Bartlett advised that the total tax base is still down \$12 billion or 11 percent from nine years ago. The increase from last year to this year in County revenues is 2.5 percent. The Freeholder noted that a welcome surprise is that the County is able this year to reduce the tax rate by a very modest one tenth of one cent from last year, 35.3 percent to 35.2 percent per \$100 of equalized values. Freeholder Bartlett stated that this is not a big amount, however, it is moving in the right direction. The Freeholder stated that this is good news as this is the start of the reduction as the tax rate begins to recover.

Freeholder Bartlett stated that at the start of 2016 the surplus was at \$43.5 million. The surplus used in 2016 was \$16.5 million, leaving \$27 million. The Freeholder noted that at the start of 2017 the surplus will be \$51.7 million and the County will be using in 2017 \$20.2 million which is a \$3.7 million increase from last year and leaving a balance of \$31.5 million. Freeholder Bartlett stated in his opinion that this guarantees the County's Triple A bonding rating. The Freeholder stated that the budget supports \$2 million to be earmarked as cash capital for heavy equipment. Freeholder Bartlett noted that County deferred replacing equipment when the budget was stressed. The process to replace some vehicles began last year again and the County expects to replace some more this year.

Freeholder Bartlett noted the challenge this year is in the Prosecutor's Office, stating that bail reform and the drug epidemic has necessitated a 3.2 percent increase which is more than the 2 percent CAP level. The Prosecutor's budget requires \$500,000 in additional funding. Freeholder Bartlett stated that despite this, the County budget is under the 2 percent CAP level, which is a model budget providing for services the residents of Ocean County expect while preserving the County's Triple A bond rating. Freeholder Bartlett commended the rest of the Freeholders for their stable management and the County to live within its means. Freeholder Bartlett advised the Board that is a great budget and thanked the Director for the opportunity to present the budget.

Director Vicari thanked Freeholder Bartlett and County staff for the budget noting that they have been working on the budget for the last 4 to 5 months which preserves core services and continues to give our students in our County opportunities by providing \$18 million this year to the County's VOTECH school and \$15 million to Ocean County College. The Director stated that this budget provides core services including an additional \$250,000 to Senior Services. The Director stated that the County's Triple A bond rating is important to our seniors and residents and that the County budget has no surprises and maintains services to our residents. The Director again thanked Freeholder Bartlett for preserving the core services in Ocean County through this budget. Director Vicari noted that the good news this year is that small businesses are doing well and they are off to an excellent start for Members of the Board of Chosen Freeholders February 23, 2017 Summary of the Pre-Board meeting of February 22, 2017 Page 3

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tourism. The population expands to 1.3 million people in the summer and Ocean County continues to provide services during the summer months.

Freeholder Haines congratulated Freeholder Bartlett and Julie Tarrant for putting this budget together and for going one tenth of one cent down while maintaining our surplus and bond rating. The Freeholder stated that there is no other County in New Jersey like Ocean County, reducing the budget while providing all its services.

Freeholder Little advised that this budget demonstrates that this Board maintains its fiscal responsibility, stating that this Board knows how much it can spend and coordinates this with our departments. Freeholder Little noted that Ocean County does not spend more than it takes in; it does not over spend its surplus; maintains it Triple A bond rating; and has no surprises. The Freeholder stated this is a team effort that reflects on this Board and its staff.

Freeholder Kelly noted that this Board made a commitment to downsize after Superstorm Sandy and has cut the size of County government and has seen the results of that some years later. The Freeholder also noted that the County has still been able to do this and have a budget that allows us to provide services to our residents. The Freeholder discussed the new bail reform law passed by the State that requires much more time and effort by the Sheriff and Prosecutor's Office. The Prosecutor when he started this process needed \$700,000 which is not available under the new CAP law. This law requires the Sheriff, Clerk and Prosecutor each to be under the 2 percent CAP law. Freeholder Kelly stated that the County works with the New Jersey Association of Counties for State mandate Freeholder Kelly stated that the Prosecutor worked with his / State pay for bail reform. Department and the Administrator and has found \$400,000 in reductions in this year's budget to use towards the new bail reform required by the State. The Freeholder noted that the County will provide \$200,000 and advised that the County and the Prosecutor are working together on this. The Freeholder stated that he was proud of what the Prosecutor was able to do and stated that the County is going to provide the services to the residents of the County. The Freeholder also commended Freeholder Bartlett for coming up with the budget and the small reduction, noting that it is not just this Board, it is also the people that Freeholder Kelly advised that Engineering gave up 17 work for us that make this happen. people and the Department is now looking at major projects in the northern section of the County and will need to fill some of those positions. Freeholder Kelly stated that the County was able to meet the needs of the residents of Ocean County with this budget, stating that the County is going in the right direction.

Director Vicari stated that in 2009 the County did not lay off employees, the Board asked for cutbacks and didn't replace employees when they retired. The Director noted that the State of New Jersey lost its rating 10 times over the last several years and advised that Ocean County has maintained its rating. Homes and building is back since Superstorm Sandy, but the Director reminded everyone that it will take another 3 to 4 years for a full recovery.

Administrator Block advised that the Ocean County Library tax rate is flat as well as the Board of Health.

Director Vicari stated that the 2017 Budget will be introduced next Wednesday at the March 1, 2017 Board meeting with final adoption of the 2017 Budget on April 5, 2017.

Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the advertisement for the construction of traffic signal upgrades, Phase B, Group 1 on Long Beach Boulevard in Long Beach Township and the recommended award of Phase A, Group 3 on Long Beach Boulevard to Edward H. Cray in the amount of \$438,778.40. There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the agenda for the March 1, 2017 Board meeting.

Ms. Vasil reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of March 1, 2017. There were no questions or comments.

Director Vicari asked the Board members for comments.

There were no comments.

Director Vicari asked the Administrator for comments during Open Session. The Administrator had no comments for Open Session.

Ms. Vasil read the resolution to move to closed session.

Director Vicari stated at the conclusion of the Closed Session, the Board will return to Open Session to close the meeting and noted that no action will be taken when the meeting returns to Open Session.
