## RESOLUTION June 18, 2014

- WHEREAS, the voters of Ocean County authorized the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund to provide funds for the acquisition and preservation of natural lands, open spaces and farmland; and
- WHEREAS, the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee was established by the Board of Chosen Freeholders to review nominations to the program and forward recommendations for acquisition to the Board of Chosen Freeholders; and
- WHEREAS, the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee has received a nomination for the property identified as Block 50, Lots 5 & 9 and Block 51, Lot 10 in Barnegat Township and Block 2, Lot 6 in Stafford Township totaling approximately 272 acres; and
- **WHEREAS**, the property is adjacent to and surrounded by Bass River State Forest and NJ Natural Lands Trust property and it is also within close proximity of the County-owned Cedar Bridge Tavern property; and
- WHEREAS, the property contains environmentally sensitive lands and portions of the Wading River; and
- WHEREAS, a portion of the property in Barnegat Township may satisfy the mitigation requirement of the preservation of approximately 17 acres imposed by the Pinelands Commission for projects at the County's Cedar Bridge Tavern; and
- WHEREAS, two professional appraisals have been completed to establish the fair market value of the property; and
- WHEREAS, the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee has determined the property's attributes are consistent with the Ocean County Open Space Plan and Recreation Inventory; and
- WHEREAS, the property lies within close proximity to an area of wildfire concern and near the Warren Grove Gunnery Range; and
- WHEREAS, this property may be eligible for Department of Defense partnership funding through the Readiness and Environmental Protection Integration Program; and
- WHEREAS, all of this acquisition is adjacent to State-owned forest lands, the County reserves the right to sell or dedicate a portion or all of the purchase to the NJDEP for inclusion in the State lands systems in return for just compensation or lands of equal value consistent with the Natural Lands Trust Fund Program and for practical land management and stewardship of these lands; and
- **WHEREAS**, the County of Ocean would acquire the property for an amount not to exceed \$1,250,000; and
- WHEREAS, a public hearing on the proposed acquisition was conducted by the Board of Chosen Freeholders on June 18, 2014 as required by PL 1997, c24.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY as follows:
- 1. It accepts the recommendation of the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee to participate in the acquisition property identified as Block 50, Lots 5 & 9 and Block 51, Lot 10 in Barnegat Township and Block 2, Lot 6 in Stafford Township totaling approximately 272 acres.

## RESOLUTION: June 18, 2014

- 2. It authorizes the expenditure not to exceed \$1,250,000 in acquisition funds from the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund, Account Number 225-155-0151.
- 3. It authorizes the Freeholder Director to execute any and all agreements made available to provide additional funding for the acquisition of this property.
- 4. It authorizes the potential future sale or exchange of the property with the State of New Jersey provided that the property is managed consistent with the Natural Lands Trust Fund Program.

## BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT

- 1. The proper officers of the Board are authorized and directed to sign all necessary documents in order to effectuate these purchases.
- 2. The purchase of the property is to be contingent upon the County's acquisition by purchase, deed or gift of the necessary rights-of-way along the County roads bordering the property as determined by the County Engineer.
- 3. The offices of Ocean County Counsel and County Administrative staff are hereby authorized to take all actions necessary to consummate this transaction and have the fully executed Deeds or Easements recorded in the County Clerk's Office.
- 4. The Townships of Barnegat and Stafford will be asked to support the acquisition of the property prior to closing.

### **ORDINANCE #2014-16**

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$150,000 FROM THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND FOR THE COST OF PURCHASING A LOW GROUND PRESSURE EXCAVATOR FOR THE COUNTY MOSQUITO COMMISSION, LOCATED IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY.

WHEREAS, the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean recognizes the need to purchase a low ground pressure excavator for the Mosquito Commission, located in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the County that funds be available for this purpose.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS of the COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING), as follows:

SECTION 1: \$150,000 is hereby appropriated from the Capital Improvement Fund for the cost of purchasing a low ground pressure excavator for the County Mosquito Commission, located in the County of Ocean, including all else necessary therefor and incidental thereto, which sum shall also cover fees and contingencies.

SECTION 2: The capital budget of the County of Ocean is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of Local Government Services is on file with the Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

SECTION 3: After passage upon first reading of this Ordinance, the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders is hereby directed to publish the full text of the Ordinance, together with the notice set forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF PENDING ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-19, at least seven days prior to the date set for public hearing and further consideration for final passage (which date shall be at least ten days after introduction and first reading). The Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders is further directed to comply with all provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-17(b) regarding postings, publications, and the provision of copies of this Ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$350,000 FROM THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND FOR THE COST OF DESIGN, PERMITTING AND CONSTRUCTION OF A REGIONAL BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN TRAIL KNOWN AS THE BARNEGAT BRANCH TRAIL, PHASE VI, IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY.

WHEREAS, the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean recognizes the need for a regional bicycle and pedestrian trail, in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the County that funds be available for this purpose.

The County reasonably expects to commence acquisition and/or construction of the improvements described in Section 1 hereof, and to advance all or a portion of the costs in respect thereof, prior to the issuance of bonds or notes hereunder. To the extent such costs are advanced, the County further reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance, in an aggregate amount not to exceed the amount of bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof. SECTION 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared that the improvements or purposes, the estimated cost of the improvements and appropriation therefor, down payment and estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes authorized are as follows:

The County Comptroller shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this Ordinance, and the County Comptroller's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8.1. The County Comptroller is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The County Comptroller is directed to report in writing to the Board of Chosen Freeholders at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this Ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 6. The County reasonably expects to commence acquisition and/or construction of the improvements described in Section 1 hereof, and to advance all or a portion of the costs in respect thereof, prior to the issuance of bonds or notes hereunder. To the extent such costs are advanced, the County further reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance, in an aggregate amount not to exceed the amount of bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof. This bond ordinance is intended to be a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 7. Any grant monies received for the purposes described in Section 1 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. - It supports NJ Senate Bill 2096 and NJ Assembly Bill 3253 to fund efforts needed to retain our military installations and highlight the superior capability of our military assets for future missions.
- It supports a more immediate allocation of economic development funding for military installation support, consistent with the ongoing efforts to retain major employers and attract new businesses to New Jersey.
- 5. Certified copies of this resolution shall be made available to Governor Chris Christie, the NJ State Legislature, Ocean County Mayors, Burlington County Board of Chosen Freeholders, Monmouth County Board of Chosen Freeholders, NJ Military Installation Growth & Development Task Force and the NJ Defense Enhancement Coalition.

### **JUNE 18, 2014**

WHEREAS, Senate Bill No. 2171 would authorize any county of the fifth or sixth class (Atlantic, Cape May, Monmouth and Ocean Counties) to assume complete responsibility for the operation and control of the beaches that border the Atlantic Ocean within the county by ordinance or resolution; and

WHEREAS, Ocean County believes municipal control for the operation and maintenance of Ocean County beaches best serves the public in general and the citizens of the affected towns; and

WHEREAS, both the Ocean County municipalities with beaches bordering the Atlantic Ocean and Ocean County oppose legislation authorizing a county to assume responsibility and control for operation and maintenance of Ocean County beaches.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS of the COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY hereby opposes S-2171 which would permit the governing body of a fifth or sixth class county to assume control and responsibility for the operation and maintenance of all beaches on the Atlantic Ocean within the county.






