

What is Compost?

Compost looks like soil. If you let vegetables, fruits, leaves, and grass rot in a pile, they will turn into compost.

You can fill outdoor bins with yard debris like leaves, grass, and dead plants and don't forget your household organic waste. (see back page to see what organic things you can and can't compost)
