# G. RESOLUTIONS

CLERK VASIL: "Consent Resolutions, Items G-1 through G-13."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I will make a comment at the end (of voting) on number four."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "My comment on number four is on the Census. Every ten years in the United States, per the Constitution, they do a Census. Why is it so important? It determines the amount of Federal and State Aid we get into Ocean County. The number of Congressmen that we have in the State of New Jersey, the reapportionment of our Senators and Congressmen and Assembly, so it is very, very important.

And again, this puts in operation today the process that when we begin in the year 2019 to 2020. What we want to do is make sure that every person is counted because it means a very substantial amount of money coming to our County. So again, I will be the liaison next year, the end of next year, to get the process rolling. We have the most sufficient process because again, every time you count a person it means Federal and State dollars coming to Ocean County and it is extremely important to us. Any other questions from members of the Board of Freeholders? Freeholder John Bartlett."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Yes, Mr. Director, with your permission I would like to comment and explain the number three resolution.

The number three resolution urging the Government and State Legislature to approve legislation to permanently extend the 2% Cap on Interest Arbitration Awards. Now, most people wouldn't know, I didn't know years ago, what interest arbitration means. Well, what that really means is binding arbitration. Before the change in the law five or six years ago, the law enforcement unions in the County had what was known as interest arbitration, which means that if the Board of Freeholders and the union could not come to an agreement, then the pay dispute, if you will, would go to arbitration. But it was binding arbitration, meaning that the arbitrator could say this is the settlement you will accept.

Well, the law was changed to then limit the arbitrator to a 2% cap. The County must operate and should operate and does and can and is happy to operate under a 2% cap. However, it is impossible operate under a 2% cap if binding arbitrator awards a union award of 3%. You can't fit 3% percent into a 2% overall total cap. Now, that's just common sense. It doesn't take a mathematician to figure that out.

Unfortunately, when the Legislature passed the interest arbitration change, the binding arbitration changed to limit the arbitrator to 2%, it had a sunset date which means it would go out of existence at a certain period of time. And, I believe, that's at the end of this year. And so unless the Governor and Legislature move to extend the law, the law will revert to what it was before and that will put counties and municipalities in an untenable situation. You can't have your cake and eat it too. If you want an overall 2% cap on governmental expenditures, and this Board supports that, then cannot have an arbitrator giving a binding arbitration salary award to one of your unions in excess of that.

And further, I would like to point out that the argument in favor of binding arbitration for police unions has been, 'well, they don't have the right to strike' and therefore binding arbitration makes sense in those cases. That may sound good, except it's phony, because no public employee has the right to strike. Buildings and Grounds employees don't have the right to strike. Parks employees don't have the right to strike. Any employee of the County does not have the legal right to strike. They don't have binding arbitration, or interest arbitration as its formally known. And no one else, in my opinion, should have it either. But as long as it's limited to the 2% cap, then it makes sense.

Obviously, these are difficult issues. There are difficulties all along the line, but again, if this Board, if the public agencies are going to live and have to live by law under a 2% cap, then you can't have awards to salary increases that are above that because you can't repeal a law that says one and one is two. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Freeholder Bartlett. Freeholder Bartlett is in charge of our Finance (Department) and putting the Budget together. And again, our main goal is to continue to control not only your taxes, but if you realize in the State of New Jersey that between the taxes and the great fees and the insurance that you pay it is unaffordable for many people to live here and we have people leaving. We have tried to turn around, at least in Ocean County, trying to make it not only affordable, but giving quality services, and one way you do this is by working with the 2% cap which is very important to us. Thank you and I appreciate your comments. And again, it's been our policy for a long time. Okay, continue please."

## T. FREEHOLDER COMMENTS

At 4:10 PM, Freeholder Director Vicari received the following comments from members of the Board:

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I will open up to the members of the Board of Freeholders and then I will open up to the members of the public that are here today.

My only comments are going to be is that there are a number of storms off the coast of Ocean County. Whatever happens, we are totally prepared as usual. The County never closes down, 24/7. We had a (news) release last month, but just so the residents know, the caution in what we do. Property and life are very important to us, especially in our coastal areas. We realize that and we continue to have a good working condition with not only our County Sheriff, but also with State agencies and the leadership of Freeholder Jack Kelly.

Moving to my right, Freeholder John Bartlett?"

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "No comments Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Freeholder Jack Kelly?"

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "No further comments."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Freeholder Ginny Haines?"

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "Just one comment, Mr. Director, thank you. It's just, again, to thank the County employees. The HOPE Sheds Light Walk was a week and a half ago and I would just like to thank them because we raised for that walk, which is for individuals that have addictions, and the County employees raised \$2,700.00 for that walk. As I said before, it wasn't the two-mile walk that it was for, but it was for the reason for the walk and it went very well. I think there were over 4,000 people that attended that walk in Seaside and I'm sure next year will be even greater. And I just want to, again, thank the employees. Freeholder Vicari and myself were the Chairpersons for the County employees and thank them very much for a job well done."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Freeholder Haines. Freeholder Gerry Little?"

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Nothing at this time, Mr. Director."

U. **PUBLIC COMMENTS** - Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of **five (5)** minutes per speaker.

At 4:12 PM, Freeholder Director Vicari opened the meeting to receive comments from members of the public, as follows:

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I would like to invite members of the public to come to the microphone. State your full name and mailing address so we can get back to you and it's part of the public record and each one will have five minutes to speak. The first gentleman, I spoke to before and he was here before is first."

STEPHEN BRILL, 806 JENNY COURT, BRICK: "I have appeared before this Board several times before regarding the Garden State Parkway shoulder widening and Interchange 91 projects and their environmental degradation upon Evergreen Woods and the other communities that border them.

The objective of modernizing the Garden State Parkway was initiated by Governor McGreevy and has been completed.

Public Law of 2003 chapter 79 that enabled the merger of the Highway Authority and the Turnpike Authority has not been complied with.

Section C.27:23-12 paragraph entitled Exemption from taxation states 'The exercise of the powers granted by this act will be in all respects for the benefit of the people of the State, for the increase of their commerce and prosperity, and for the improvement of their health and living conditions'.

A new objective must be initiated, to correct and mitigate the negative consequences that this obsession with road building at all costs has created.

The engineers within the NJDOT, NJTA and Ocean County must now turn their attention to the Health, environmental and social equity issues.

When the Garden State Parkway reconstruction project was proposed its environmental impact was studied.

I will not go into a detailed discussion at this time about the intentional misrepresentation of the shoulder widening and Interchange 91 projects projected impact upon the homeowners who live in communities that border these projects.

How can the NJTA and it's partner Ocean County determine if a project in whole or in part has achieved its goals? It is not just by the completion of construction but by examining all aspects that were forecasted initially, for example

the resultant noise level and comparing that to the actual conditions experienced by your constituents health and living conditions.

That is your new objective! That is where your attention must now be directed!

On a community level I can help you with effective alternative solutions to the antiquated methods of the past for highway noise mitigation. For example, the constructing of a concrete edifice called a sound barrier. Newer, cheaper materials that enable faster installation have been developed since the original concrete sound barriers were selected. Vinyl sound barriers are a proven replacement.

Another method that improves driver safety and mitigates noise at the source is the replacement of the Jersey highway dividers with a divider that is 8 feet in height. This type of barrier could have been swapped for the temporary barrier that was installed during the Interchange 91 construction. That barrier paralleled the border with Evergreen Woods. That barrier was installed in less than one day!

lmagine a solution to a persistent problem that you could point to. Collectively the Ocean County Freeholders, their partner the NJTA, Assembly and Senate, can promote how you worked cooperatively and effectively with Brick Township and their homeowners.

Thank you. And I have exhibits showing what I am talking about – concrete barriers, walls and whatever else you need for your perusal."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Mr. Brill. Now, to give a little history, going back approximately a year ago, I wrote a letter to the State of New Jersey, the Board passed a resolution, and not only did I try to get a barrier in your area, but also on Todd Road in Toms River. The issue is, unfortunately, there is no representation in Ocean County on the Turnpike Authority which is part of the New Jersey Garden State Parkway.

Traditionally, we had members on there. Most of the Parkway is in the County of Ocean, as we spoke about before. At one time we had Dick Sambol, then we had Joe Buckelew who was the Chairman. Many improvements that you see are because of him. And then, of course, there was George Buckwald. So we had three people.

Unfortunately, we have been campaigning for this continuously. Tomorrow morning I will send a letter again to the State of New Jersey asking for representation. I was told before, in Monmouth County they have three or four. I know it's definitely three. I'm not sure, but there is one opening there. And unfortunately, we are suffering continuously because most of the people that use the Parkway are from Ocean County. Most of the commuters. The fees went up as far as the tolls and the gas as you probably know. So the biggest hardship right now is in Ocean County. So I not only support you, I will do anything possible. A letter will go out tomorrow and you will get a copy of that."

STEPHEN BRILL: "Thank you very much."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "You will get a copy and I appreciate your patience. There are many residents from Todd Road that still complain about the barrier, which I think is a reasonable request. So you have my support. Anyone else before I open up to Ortley Beach? Okay, next person, yes, and then I will open up to Ortley Beach and I'll give you the rest of the meeting."

MICHELE SPECTOR, 808 JENNY COURT, BRICK: "We've been fighting this disaster for nearly 5 years. In that time we've been ignored, put off, and put down. Officials at every level have been passing the buck, wringing their hands, and giving up in hopes we'll go away. We don't have that luxury. Every day we have to endure the ruckus of the Garden State Parkway – all 75+ decibels of it.

In its efforts to finish us off for good, the Turnpike Authority has minimalized our plight. This isn't surprising if you look at how all the players are connected in power to each other. Being challenged to do the right thing is not what they're used to or paid to do. They only care about making money for themselves and their good buddies.

What do we want? We want true mitigation, no 8 x 10 glossy pictures--a wall. Trees won't cut it and they've all been cut, razed to the ground. Due to the extreme destruction of the center median and the intense clearing of the shoulders, only a wall will lessen the noise of the parkway. Paul Carpenter Associates Vice President, Sharon Carpenter, who conducted the sound study for the Turnpike Authority said that the overpass project and the Parkway widening overlapped, but they were considered separately. Zero consideration was given to cumulative effects, which is what NEPA states should be done, but it wasn't.

We were denied our wall for arbitrary and capricious reasons: 1) The tributary mentioned turned out to be a dried up runoff area; 2) Not all the residences that would be affected were counted, so we missed qualification in the Turnpike Authority formula for mitigation by a mere \$5,900 per residence. And according to now retired OC engineer, Frank Scarantino, who we met with to discuss our issue, he said the Turnpike Authority used very narrow policy to avoid setting a precedence. If we would get a wall then everyone else would scream for one. But that was already set as Cherrywood Farms got a wall and they were the only ones who did.

Now we don't want to go on living this horrible diminished life for another five years. So we are asking for your office to please work with a New Jersey Assembly Representative and also New Jersey Senator to solve this as kind of a united front. There are different kinds of walls and other options besides a great big stone wall. The Turnpike Authority is too full of their own power which is why we need all three of you to team up for this effort. There's only a political solution now. It's gone on way too long. If they want to save face, fine, but as long as we get our wall.

Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Again, as I mentioned before, you have my support. I'll send a letter out tomorrow. If you want us to make copies we can do that. And again, your mailing address will be confidential. But as far as mailing to the State of New Jersey and again, you're actually not only correct, but it should have been done in the first place. I thought when they cut the trees down, especially in Brick Township, they cut too many trees. I remember the first time that Freeholder Bartlett saw it he said he couldn't believe it because there was no reason to cut that many trees on the Garden State Parkway at that particular time. But the key to the whole thing is getting representation from Ocean County. Not two counties! We want our own representation for the County of Ocean. And you will get that letter in a couple of days.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "If there are no other questions or comments, I'm going to turn this meeting back over to the Ortley Beach Voters and Taxpayers Association. Anyone else? Okay, just a spokesperson. I appreciate the Ortley Beach people coming. I know some traveled some distance. Just give your full name and mailing address. And again, even if you do not live in the County of Ocean, we respect your opinion.

And just so that you know, we appreciate your contributions. Going back, I just want to do some history; we went through a great deal with Hurricane Sandy. I know some people had a very difficult time recovering. Some are still in the process. We were not satisfied with the support of FEMA. I just want to briefly give some background from Sam Cammarato of the Berkeley Taxpayers Association who told me that a lot of the money that was given, 30% never was used for its intent. It went up to different areas for building housing in different parts of New Jersey, so 70% was divided. It came too slow. And we had to wait too long. So we did our best.

But again, we want to hear what you have to say, so if you could just give us your full name and mailing address and you have five minutes."

ANTHONY COLUCCI, 249 COOLIDGE AVENUE, ORTLEY BEACH: "I'm the President of the Ortley Beach Voters and Taxpayers Association. We represent over 600 families and many grandchildren.

The reason we are here is to request use of a portion of the former OCUA sewage plant site in Ortley Beach for passive recreation. Nearly five years after Ortley Beach was devastated in Superstorm Sandy, the beach community is almost restored.

One vital ingredient remains missing from the rejuvenated shore town: land that can be enjoyed by the community for passive recreational activities. This need deepens as more residents and families call Ortley Beach their full-time home.

Yet the presence of a vacant 5-acre tract, in the heart of the residential community has been unused for decades, continues to remain inaccessible to residents.

Ortley Beach is growing. After rebuilding from Sandy many families have moved here full time, including myself. The need for recreational space is pressing. We have few options and the OCUA property represents the best opportunity to rectify this imbalance.

Approximately 20% of the acreage is used currently as a pumping station. While we agree that this pumping station serves a critical purpose, the remaining 80% of the property remains fenced and largely vacant. The OCUA has leased out this 80% on occasion to Toms River and others.

The Taxpayer Association made many appeals over the years to implore the OCUA to allow the eastern portion of this property to be converted to a desperately needed passive recreation area. Unlike surrounding towns to the north and south, Ortley Beach has no space to kick a soccer ball, throw a baseball or football or run with a dog.

Our children are playing on the streets. They should be playing on grass. This property will fulfill a critical need for our community. While the Freeholders do not have direct control over the OCUA, you do appoint the members and you can provide guidance.

We are asking you to use your influence in this matter for the sake of our community and our children. Thank You for your consideration."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Mr. Colucci. Again, as Freeholder John Bartlett is liaison, after all the comments and we hear what you have to say, then we will make a comment through Freeholder Bartlett for the rest of the Board. Next gentleman please who would like to speak. Just give your full name and mailing address please."

PAUL JEFFREY, 1661 BAY BLVD., ORTLEY BEACH: "So, Freeholder Bartlett, we met on this many times before. We're back because of inaction on the part of the OCUA. We understand that you do not have direct authority over that authority, the OCUA. But, you do appoint the commissioners and, frankly, they do not seem to be fulfilling the mission.

And if you read the mission off the Website: 'OCUA's philosophy is to never lose sight of those to whom we are committed to serve; the residents, businesses, public institutions and the millions of seasonal visitors to the many attractions located throughout our service region.'

They always complain 'We own this. Why should we give it to the people of Ortley Beach?' It's not the people of Ortley Beach who want passive recreation; it's the people of Ortley Beach and everyone who comes to enjoy our

beautiful coastal area in the summer. Many of the, in fact 70% of the residents of Ortley Beach, are not permanent. So it's not like we're saying we want this just for us. We want this to be available for the public to be able to use it. We're only asking to take what is now a big area of gravel that's already fenced and just convert it to grass so you can kick a soccer ball and have a good time and the other things Anthony has said.

So I'd like you to ask when some of the commissioners of OCUA are up for reappointment in February, please think about putting someone on there that will fulfill the OCUA mission and does meet the needs of the public and those of Ortley Beach.

Now, we are interested in knowing what it took to be a commissioner and how do you perhaps get someone onto the board at OCUA? So we wrote to (Chairman) Parker and we asked him, 'Mr. Parker, we ask if we could see the bios and what was available with regard to information with regard to the current commissioners.'

This is his response. 'Thank you for your email regarding the transparency of the Commissioners' bios not being on the OCUA Website. The Commissioners are not elected. They are appointed and further information should be on file and available from the Ocean County Board of Chosen Freeholders.' So here we are. We know little about these people. We would like to get someone on there that does represent Ortley Beach and does represent the needs of the community. We respect the people that are there now, but they do not seem to be responsive to our needs. We've been there many, many times and we are simply getting the same answer – this is our land and not your land, we're going to control what we want to do with it. It isn't their land. It was paid for by the ratepayers.

So we went to see them, as you may remember, back in July of 2016. We were told at the time that there were ongoing projects that would require the property for staging or storage and so forth. We pressed about that issue. Do you really need the whole property? We're only asking for the eastern little portion which is largely empty and sometimes leased to Toms River. 'Oh no, we need the whole thing and we need it the whole year.' So guess what? I've gone there every month for the past year and I've taken pictures of the property and I'd like to show you that. We can start going back in September of 2016 and look at every month. And with the exception of one picture on here which is February of this year, it is entirely vacant. Entirely vacant, with the exception of the dumpster and the street sweepers which are used by Toms River.

So either they dramatically changed their plans or they just outright lie to us and make excuses because what they told us is simply not true. And it's not acceptable to not be transparent to the public when you're a public authority. I don't know what we can do to make them accountable to the ratepayers, but we're asking you to help us with that.

The last thing I'll say is that when we were there, they said no we can't use it. And one of our residents who spent a lot of money rebuilding his home adjacent and across the street from the property said, 'Can you at least clean it up? How about replacing the trees you cut down?' Well, they cleaned up a little portion of it. With regard to the rest of it, they cut down more trees that were diseased. They've done nothing to put any trees back. Nothing to make that area look any better. And they've thrown down a few wood chips and they spray the weeds and that's it.

We do not want this industrial site in the middle of Ortley Beach any longer. Please do whatever you can to put pressure on that authority to make them be responsive to the citizens. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Mr. Jeffrey. Anyone else?"

PAUL JEFFREY: "Can I leave this with you?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Yes, if you'd like to leave it. Yes we will take that. Mrs. Vasil will be more than happy to accept it. Next speaker please."

MICHAEL WYMBS, 1720 WASHINGTON AVENUE, ORTLEY BEACH: "I've had property there and been living there for 32 years. And when I initially got there to purchase this property I was very concerned about the sewage plant that was still there, but they just turned around and took it offline and there was only a pumping station so I purchased the property.

But this here story of what Paul and Anthony have talked about has been going on over 30-something years which is totally ridiculous. Maybe the problem is Mr. Parker who is the Chairman of the (OCUA) Board and approaching his fortieth year. Maybe he needs a little wake up call that he didn't take the mortgage personally on it. And I believe the County government, the State and the Federal government contributes money to have this plant exist. I think he needs a wake up call.

As far as telephone poles and children on bikes, that doesn't mix. He turned around and has an agreement with the utility company, the electrical company, to store 40-foot poles on that property and then turn around and then they disperse it to various areas of Ocean County. This is not an industrial piece of property. There was a purpose to it being industrial when it was a sewage plant. Now it should be a part of the residential community.

Also, about four years ago, a rock concert was coming into Seaside Heights. A group by the name of Mumford and Sons – a national group. There was an agreement to open that lot for five days for the overflow of parking if it was necessary. And yet when the residents ask to use the property they're denied. There's something wrong here, drastically wrong.

Land use conversions is a common thing. The Henry Hudson Parkway, which we've all probably traveled in Manhattan, the lower section, was converted to an elevated park. Governor's Island off of Manhattan, which is part of New York, used to be the Coast Guard National Headquarters. It's now being opened for park land. In England,

they took a power plant and converted it to a museum. This Board here, which had foresight to turn around and create a path of 12 miles of old railroad track into a walking path, bike path and so forth, but yet us in Ortley Beach, which are denied.

There was no foresight years ago, and I'm not pointing to the Board or the town or anything, that if you go to the north of us Lavallette has continuous Bayfront – just about 100%. We've got a fraction of bay front, actually a peeka-boo section we have. If you go to Seaside Heights, they have bay front. We have a small park. That's all we have. And we definitely need additional park land. And I'd appreciate it if you get to the OCUA and get this to become a reality as you have purchased many properties on joint ventures with the Toms River Mayor and Council and you people. Bricktown, where you put up that nice park up there before you go over the Mantoloking Bridge. We lack everything and we need action now. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you. If there anyone else who would like to ask a question or make a statement, you may come and do so. If not, we will go to...okay, anyone else who would like to speak about any other topic? Okay, seeing no one else, I will close the public portion of this meeting and I'll turn the meeting over now to Freeholder John Bartlett who would like to answer your question.

I would like to thank the people of Ortley Beach for coming today to express your viewpoint, but most of all when you turn on the TV tonight and you see people protesting, rioting, jumping up and down and making all kinds of noise, it goes to show the difference in the people in Ortley Beach and Ocean County. And I want you to know that I think you set the example for others to follow. You are very businesslike. You had some class and it was orderly. And this is what democracy is all about. And we will answer your questions to the best of our ability. But again, I know it was difficult to come today. The meeting is usually on a Wednesday, but because of the holiday we are meeting on a Tuesday. And because of the inclement weather, we want you to know that I appreciate hearing firsthand of how you feel. I'll now turn the meeting over to Freeholder John Bartlett who is the liaison to the Ocean County Utilities Authority. Freeholder John Bartlett."

At 4:34 PM, the Public Comment portion of the meeting was closed.

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Sometimes I wish I wasn't the liaison. (Laughter) I understand your frustration, but some of the facts that have been presented are not exactly facts. Although you live there, and I've seen your letter that says this should not be an industrial site, the simple fact of the matter is that it is an industrial site. It is the site of the pumping station for almost the entire barrier strip, the northern barrier strip, where all the sewage flows to, and from that site is pumped across the bay to the central treatment plant in Bayville and then after its secondary treatment is pumped back across the bay into an ocean outfall.

Now perhaps before many of you moved to Ortley Beach, you should know the history of that site. That site was the site of a sewage treatment plant from the Dover Township Municipal Utilities Authority. And I say sewage plant tongue-in-cheek because all they did was collect the sewage that one flushed down the toilet and treated it with something like Clorox or some kind of disinfectant like that and pumped it into the ocean at night and that's what you swam in the next day. The OCUA changed that whole process, okay, and now takes all the sewage that we all produce on the barrier island that is pumped from that site across, as I said before, across the bay to the central sewage plant in Berkeley Township where the solids are removed, where the effluent is then treated – it's called a secondary treatment - and then pumps back across the bay into the ocean. But the solids are removed, which they weren't before. And the OCUA has won awards year after year after year for meeting the goals that it is supposed to meet.

Now when you talked about, or some people have talked about, the mission of the OCUA, it's quite simple. It's not to build parks. They're not in the parks business. Their mission is clean water. And if you look on their logo, and I just happened to look at it right here before the meeting, it says 'clean water'. That's their job. Their job is not to build parks.

Now why would they maintain a 5-acre site there? Well, because they bought it. And when you buy a piece of property, you own it. And that means you use it the way you want to. Now, I'm not trying to be mean and vindictive to the people who live in the area, but what they have maintained there is a staging area that is vitally important to the whole barrier strip. During Hurricane Sandy, and I don't have to remind you guys of this, you had a disaster on your hands. And that site was used as a staging area for the dumping of debris, for the parking of trucks, for any number of things that were necessary for the recovery of the entire oceanfront area. For the recovery of it after Superstorm Sandy. And I have a letter from your Mayor, at the time, and still your Mayor and let me read it:

'Thanking the OCUA for the use of that site.' This was to John Parker on December 27, 2012 and a copy to me. 'I appreciate your personal intervention into this matter, and I realize you were instrumental in making certain that this property would be available to not only Toms River Township, but to other municipalities in the area to assist all of us in the large job of removing and sorting the debris following Superstorm Sandy. To me this is a great example of intergovernmental cooperation and the way things should work.' It was the site used for staging, for debris removal, etc., etc.

Now, the OCUA right now, because I have seen the agreements, has a lease agreement with Jersey Central Power and Light who will be engaged...and I believe this lease agreement exists for another year... for the storage of telephone poles, electric poles, or whatever, the storage of trucks for reconstruction purposes that JCP&L will be doing in the area. What exactly that is, I don't know. But the fact of the matter is the OCUA has allowed their staging area to be used for that purpose. For a public purpose. Furthermore, it also has a lease agreement with Toms River Township for also, township uses that property, again, for staging purposes and I think for as an adjunct for its beach operations

which are expansive in Ortley Beach both on the oceanfront and perhaps for the bay front.

I've read the comments from when members of your group appeared last year before the OCUA. And John Parker, the Chairman, gave his opinion, but said 'I am only one member of the authority and each of the members, after this, at our next meeting, will respond to what you have put before us.' I've read those comments then and I just read them before this meeting because I thought I would be called upon to respond, thank you Mr. Director.

Many of the members of the OCUA visited the site for themselves to see what was what. And all of them came to the conclusion that the OCUA was not in a position to create a park or a park area at the site. Now, some of you said, 'We don't have any place to go.' Well, that's not the problem, respectfully from me, of the OCUA. You knew that when you moved there. I'm not trying to be argumentative and I wish there was a simple solution. But, they spent \$5.8 million of ratepayers' money to buy it. They have a public purpose that they have put into. That's the equivalent today of \$17 million, by the way.

They should keep the area in good repair. And to the extent that it's not from what I have heard today, I will be in touch with the OCUA forthwith to say there have been concerns raised at our meeting about the condition of the site and they ought to be addressed if they haven't been. But as far as the OCUA not being responsive to the community – it is fulfilling its mission. It is providing us with clean water. This is the only county-wide sewage system in the State of New Jersey. The only one!

In north Jersey where some of you may have come from, we are blessed with the interconnected stormwater systems and sewage systems. So when it rains in Hoboken and the water on the street goes into the sewer system, which can't handle it and it flushes all directly into the Hudson River. Really nice! That doesn't happen here because of the OCUA. They're doing the job and I can't help but defend the OCUA in the job it's doing because I think they do one heckuva job. And we wouldn't have the...I grew up in the Toms River and I remember when, at that time Dover Township Municipal Utilities Authority, didn't have that pump station and put their stuff right in the Toms River and I used to swim in it. So I am very happy with what the OCUA has accomplished. I wish it could accommodate what you would like to see, but it can't or it doesn't believe it can.

And I respect the OCUA, the members, all of whom represent many different followings in life, most of whom have had experience on a municipal level or a municipal governing level. They've dealt with the public in a different capacity in their towns year after year. They understand the political process, which is important. There are engineers who are members of the Authority, in Mr. Sadeghi. There are people who are real estate agents who understand real estate on the Authority. It is a great cross-section of people that this Board appointed and are happy to appoint. But what I'm telling you we will not do is try to tell the OCUA or any appointed agency what they should build. That's not the function of the job of the Board of Freeholders. We believe that we've appointed good people and it's their job to oversee the investment of all the ratepayers of Ocean County and some in Monmouth County, to oversee the property that they bought and paid for with that for the purposes of sewage treatment and sewage handling. That's their job. That's what they do. And I believe and I know they do it successfully.

It is a staging area. It has been used as a staging area. You would like to see used differently, but that's not their job. And again, you've had the opportunity to put that before the Authority and they. Each one of them I believe, addressed that in their own way, which they should have before you. And so there is not much more I can add to that. So I thank you Mr. Director for the opportunity to respond."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Freeholder. I would just like brief comments from members of the Board. Freeholder Kelly."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Freeholder Bartlett just said it's not the job of the Freeholders to tell another agency and we don't. However, it should be pointed out that the Board, through Freeholder Bartlett, did put forth the request from Ortley Beach some years back and did say we want this considered. And OCUA considered that. They told the Board that after reviewing it and after looking at everything, they did not believe it to be in the best interest of the Ocean County Utilities Authority to turn that into a recreational site for a number of reasons. One, it's a staging area. They do put different things there and they just thought it wasn't the proper use to make it a recreation area.

But the Board did request and I want you to know that. While we didn't order, we didn't order OCUA to make it a recreation site, we did request through our liaison to please look at this and carefully consider the request. And I believe they did that to the best of my knowledge. Freeholder Bartlett brought a report back to the Board. And certainly has brought back that response to the taxpayer association. So I think that we did what we should. We asked that it be considered. But we don't tell members to vote the way I tell you or you won't be a member anymore or there is no reason to put representatives on an independent authority.

So I just want to note that we didn't just say don't think about it. It's not our job. We did go. We did talk to them. And we did represent to them the view of the taxpayers' association after the taxpayers' association was already there and were denied. They came to Freeholder Bartlett at that time or the Board; it's been a few years back now so I don't exactly remember the chronological part of that. But we did ask for their careful consideration. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Freeholder Kelly. Freeholder Haines, any additional comments?"

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "Director, just one comment. I'm sorry that we're not able to accommodate you as to why you came here today. We're glad that you came, as Freeholder Vicari had mentioned. That's what America is all about - free speech and coming here expressing your opinion whether it's in favor of something that we do or

against something other people do or whatever.

Unfortunately, we can't do it, as you've heard from Freeholder Bartlett, Freeholder Kelly and, of course, our Chairman why we are not able to. It is an autonomous body. We cannot direct them in what to do. I know in past instances when we've had people come before us tell us that we need to tell people and we appointed people to certain boards and we have to tell them what to do. And we've been told by our legal counsel that is illegal. You cannot appoint someone to a board and then go and tell them how to vote. That is not allowed. That is something that we are not allowed to do. I'm sorry we are not able to accommodate you to go and be able to say to the OCUA what they can do.

But, as explained to you, exactly what the OCUA does and what it stands for, they are meeting their obligation and unfortunately, our hands are tied in that respect. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Freeholder Haines. Freeholder Gerry Little."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. I appreciate very much Freeholder Bartlett's very detailed explanation and point of view and support that. I also think and I haven't heard anybody say, we have a fiduciary responsibility with public land. That land, in part, was paid by all of you who pay rates for your water/sewer. It was also, in part, paid by me who lives in Surf City.

And also, the we have OCUA facilities all over the County and we all pay for those. So we have a fiduciary responsibility for that land. Over the years, 15 years, I've been here and some of the folks here have been here longer. We've had people come in here time and time again requesting us to give them public land for some very, very positive (things), including homeless shelters, begging us to give them land. And to let them use land. There are liability issues. There are all kinds of issues associated when public land is involved. But mainly, it's paid for by everyone. It's paid by all of us who are ratepayers in our own homes, by everyone in the audience, and everyone in the County.

So yes, it is located in Ortley Beach, but it is owned by everyone in the County and they serve everyone. It is also owned, in part, by people in Monmouth County because Monmouth County is part of the OCUA. And anything like that would also be an issue involved in Monmouth County because they, in part, even though it's a different County. It's like living in a regional school district. When you're an owner you are a ratepayer and you're part of that. And so these are very complex issues.

I also appreciate, I live in the same kind of a community as Ortley Beach. We have limited space, believe me, in Surf City. You've all probably been there at one point in time. Just like all the other towns on Long Beach Island. So it is a very difficult issue.

As all of you did, when we purchased our home in Surf City we knew what was there. We knew the school district, how many parks there were, how many parks there weren't. We knew what public facilities were there. So it is unfortunate, but that land is, again, the fiduciary responsibility of the entire County. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Freeholder Little. Before I conclude, I just want everyone to know in conclusion what is going to happen with the comments that were made by everyone.

The two people that spoke in reference to the Garden State Parkway, tomorrow morning I will send a letter to the Governor of the State of New Jersey and our Representatives in our Congressional – the three State Senators and Assembly people asking that they immediately appoint someone from Ocean County to be a member of the Turnpike Authority. We will get your comments if you can give me a copy of it, we will send it to the Chair, Richard Hammer of the Turnpike Authority. That will be done tomorrow.

The people of Ortley Beach, I want you to know that as soon as we have a transcript of what you said, your comments, to the Board of Freeholders, that we will give a hard copy to the Chairman, John Parker, to share will all members of the Ocean County Utilities Authority. Their next meeting is on Tuesday of next week. I will also call up John Parker when the minutes are completed and ask him to give every possible consideration, but you have to be very careful of the comments that were made by Freeholder John Bartlett, in that it is an autonomous body. We will not use our influence in any way. Not because of any other reason, but one big reason, it's illegal for us to do that or threaten anyone that if they don't vote a certain way they will not get reappointed.

So again, we thank you. The weather inclement outside, so please drive safely. Is there a motion to adjourn?"

There being no additional comments received, Freeholder Director Vicari called for a motion to adjourn the meeting at 4:53 PM.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the sunset provision contained in P.L. 2014, c. 11 the 2% cap on interest arbitration awards is set to expire on December 31, 2017; and

WHEREAS, this law empowers county governments throughout the State to effectively control public safety employment salaries and personnel costs by capping interest arbitration awards at 2% for base salaries, which includes step increments and longevity pay; and

WHEREAS, county governments dedicate a substantial portion of their overall annual operating expenses for employee salaries, wages, health benefits and other personnel costs; and

WHEREAS, county governments face a restrictive 2% property tax cap levy where counties must prepare two comprehensive cap calculations and use the more restrictive one; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of county governments and property taxpayers throughout the State struggling to make ends meet to permanently extend the 2% cap on interest arbitration awards; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature has stated that no action will be taken on the "interest arbitration cap" prior gubernatorial election on November 7; and

WHEREAS, the failure of the Legislature to act on "interest arbitration cap" may create undue burdens upon county and local governments such as the elimination of essential services and personnel and drastic reductions to improvements to facilities, roads and bridges.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY hereby urges Governor Chris Christie and the New Jersey State Legislature to immediately enact and not delay action for political purposes legislation that will permanently extend the 2% cap on interest arbitration awards before December 31, 2017.

AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER VII OF THE BOROUGH

STREETS"

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Point Pleasant, County of Ocean,

State of New Jersey (the "Borough") has been in the process of reviewing Ordinances in the

Borough in an effort to revise same; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Code Chapter VII entitled "Traffic" provides for "Schedule II

No Parking" which sets forth a number of streets in the Borough where the parking is restricted at
