The Regular Meeting of the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean was called to order on May 7, 2014 at 4:01 PM, Room 119, County Administration Building, 101 Hooper Avenue, Toms River, Ocean County, New Jersey, with Director Vicari presiding. Members Bartlett, Kelly and Little were present at the call of the roll. Freeholder Lacey was not in attendance.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. Please be seated."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Mr. Director, before we start the meeting today can I just say thank you to the Supreme Court for ruling that we are in fact allowed to say a prayer before our public meeting?"

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Here! Here!"

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Mr. Director, I'd like to add just a comment to that. I am very happy with that too. I read it yesterday in the paper. But, unfortunately, it was only a 5 to 4 decision and the current President's appointees to the Court voted against it. Too bad they don't know anything about American history because from the founding of the country, from Washington's farewell address, from the Declaration of Independence, the term 'divine providence' is used over and over and over again. And some of the Court, four members of it, obviously know little about American history or could care less.....and I won't say anymore, but that's....."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "I'll just say to that 'amen'!"

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "God bless you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "And I would also like tothere's another request from Freeholder Gerry Little who would also like to make a comment on the same topic."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "And the United States Congress, the House of Representatives and the United States Senate say a prayer at the beginning of each of their sessions and as some of you know, I was Chief of Staff for Senator Connors and our former Assemblyman, now Surrogate, Jeff Moran and Chris Connors at the time and every single session of the New Jersey Senate and the New Jersey Assembly begins with a prayer. So we certainly do concur and support the Supreme Court. They don't always make the right decisions, but in this case they certainly did. Thank you Mr. Director."

But then it goes to show how the Federal government operates, waiting to get money that we're entitled. And, as a matter of fact, in my opinion, because of the storm and what we went through, you know the loss of ratables, we should get substantially more Federal dollars, not less. And, we should get some kind of an answer so we can continue to serve the people of Ocean County.

What I would like to do, Mrs. Vasil, with the presentations, Freeholder Jack Kelly, Director of Law and Public Safety, would like to go to Item number 1, C-1, the poster contest. We have many students that are here today that will get a certificate.....they're from different parts of Ocean County, so Freeholder I am leaving it up to you."

CLERK VASIL: "Finally, Freeholder, the last proclamation is proclaiming May 6, 2014 as the "77th Anniversary of the Hindenburg Disaster" and that was presented by yourself at an event last night."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I presented that last night at Navy Lakehurst and going back some time ago, 27 years ago, Freeholder John Bartlett and I were on the Board and the late H. George Buckwald said, "you know there's nothing there to show where the Hindenburg tragedy took place". So George was very involved, of course, in the military, so he went there and we got an appropriation from the Board of Freeholders. I don't know if we had permission from Navy Lakehurst to put it on their property, but we did it anyway. And yesterday was the date, they did it over again. The Historical Society decided to pay for it and it was really a great thing to do because that really put Ocean County not on the map, but Navy Lakehurst and the importance of it and it was the first transcontinental airfield in the world. It went from western Europe, from Europe to the United States. It was a great ceremony and I said that in 27 years when it's 100 years old, that I have a chair for Freeholder Bartlett that will be in front of the monument. Freeholder Gerry Little will present the proclamation at that particular time. I don't think I'll be around so I'm planning ahead so it's part of the official minutes. But, you know, we have a vested interest in Navy Lakehurst and what they do and of course they're now called the Joint Base. We're totally supportive of the BRAC in 2017. Freeholder Jack Kelly led the campaign the last time it was on the BRAC committee. We're supporting the air show which is this weekend where we'll have over 250,000 people there. And we have a volunteer. What they wanted was a Freeholder who wanted to parachute from the Army Golden Knights, one of their planes."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Are you going to do that?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "No. We have someone here that will do it for Ocean County and for America and in one of my departments. Dana Lancellotti. Stand up. When you jump remember that our prayers....."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "You are a mean Freeholder Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Well they came and they wanted a volunteer and Dana, didn't you do that willingly? Is that the right answer Freeholder Kelly that we want?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "This resolution is going to have a Public Hearing on it. Before we begin with this, Freeholder Gerry Little is the liaison who deals with not only this particular department, but he's very proficient and involved as far as doing the research and giving the presentations as far as what this program actually entails. So I turn the meeting now over to Freeholder Gerry Little to give an overview."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. This the annual Public Hearing that we are required to hold by the Federal government. It is our Ocean County Consortium 2014 Action Plan and it's kind of the management tool and the application process for Federal funding on behalf of Ocean County and separately, but the application is all in one but it's a separate application, for Brick and Jackson and Toms River and Lakewood. It is more commonly known as Community Development Block Grant or CDBG funding.

This year, our 2014 CDBG funding is \$1,043,916.00 and includes projects for handicapped accessibility, street and sidewalk improvements, public facility improvements, housing rehabilitation and public services. This represents, again, a 2% decrease in our Federal funding. The decrease is about \$25,000.00 less than last year.

Brick is scheduled to receive \$258,958.00, Toms River - \$349,349.00, Lakewood - \$1,127,822.00, Jackson - \$182,583.00 and they are receiving their own separate allocations. The HOME funding this year is \$989,514.00 and that encompasses our First-Time Homebuyers Program, our Housing Rehabilitation Program, Tenant-Based Rental Assistance, Rental Housing Production through Community Housing Development Organizations better known as CHODOS.

And, actually we did receive a little increase in the HOME funding this year of \$38,252.00 so at least that wasn't decreased. Some of the past and proposed uses of this funding - under the Housing Rehabilitation Program we have actually rehabilitated 902 houses in Ocean County and 25 families are expected to receive this assistance this year. For our First-Time Homebuyers Program, something that was started by this County and the first of its kind in the State and we are very proud of this program, 456 families have received the down payment for their first home here in Ocean County and this year we expect to earmark, to be able to assist 22 additional families with a down payment for their first home to care for their kids and give them a good community and a good school to attend.

We have 119 units that have been rehabilitated and developed under the CHODO program and that's to increase the supply of affordable rental housing to low-income families and this year we expect to assist an undetermined number, but it will be substantial. And, 718 families have been provided assistance under the Tenant-Based Rental Assistance Program and we expect to help 42 families this year in our 2014 funding.

We have had six public hearings on this project and our County Housing Advisory Committee consists of 33 members, representatives, one from each of the municipalities. So we thank those Committee representatives for their efforts in participating in this program each year and they devote a lot of time and effort in coming up with these projects and approving them and actually dividing up the money among all of the municipalities. Each year it's, for the most part, we've received diminished funding year after year and so it becomes even more difficult, but we thank them. And this plan starts as of July 1st so this will be for funding from July 1st this year until next year.

So that's an overview of the entire project Mr. Director and members of the Board and again, we thank our Committee and our Planning Department, Tony and Dave, for all their work in putting this together. Thank you. Tony directly, I think, deals with this project. Okay Mr. Director those are my introductory comments and thank you very much."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay thank you Freeholder Little. Any comments from members of the Board before I open it up to members of the public?"

CLERK VASIL: "Freeholder, before you open it up to the public, I do need to read the summary into the record."

Clerk Vasil read the Resolution Public Hearing by title, which was scheduled for a Public Hearing at this time.

Freeholder Director Vicari opened the Public Hearing on FY2014 Ocean County Consortium Action Plan to receive the following comments from the public.

CONNIE PASCALE, SOLUTIONS TO END POVERTY SOON (STEPS), LAKEWOOD: "I'm going to comment on the Plan. I have submitted written comments during the comment period. I don't know if they were distributed to you, but I brought extra copies which I'll give to the Clerk.

Thank you for the opportunity Mr. Director and members of the Board to comment on this plan. I've done it many times before and I'll do it again today. I start out.....I preface it by saying this is a source of funding that we get from the Federal government that's primarily supposed to benefit low and moderate income people. The primary benefit of the money is for low and moderate income people and that's because the programs that it funds are supposed to serve those who are most in need, particularly in the housing area. So, I'm going to divide my comments in two. My first ones will be just specifically on this set of comments and my objections to the plan and why I think parts of it are excellent and why parts of it should be redone and why it's actually necessary to go through that process again to make sure that the money is primarily beneficial to low and moderate income people. The second part will just be an extension of that last comment because I think the money can be put to better use given the problems that exist here in Ocean County.

Briefly, you have a copy of my comments. The first one I'll mention is there are a number of certifications that have to be signed. Certifications require strict compliance with various elements of the program. One is strict compliance with the citizen participation plan and the outline that the Clerk read actually proves that there was non-compliance with the citizen participation which required a 30-day period before the first public hearing after the publication of the plan. Before the first public hearing to give people a chance to obtain it and read it and make a comment on it. And, it's clear the plan was available April 1st and the hearing was held on April 7th. So in that context that particular element of the plan wasn't complied with.

There are elements too. For instance, I believe there is a plan based on your outline to submit this plan to HUD within a week or two weeks, but your citizen participation plan requires a 30-day notice of the final plan after you approve it and then a 30-day period where people can submit written comments before it goes to HUD. Those are

just two elements of the citizen participation plan that have not been complied with. So I believe it is incumbent upon you not to sign that certification. If you can't sign that certification you have to take the plan back and comply which would mean you would open it up for more public comment to see what people think might be a better use for this valuable money.

Brick and Lakewood, this hearing covers them as well, are in worse compliance. They didn't even put specific projects out for comment so no one even knows how they're using the money other than to say that we're going to use it in a general way to help people. So those are completely non-compliant with the citizen participation plan.

The third comment I make here which is on page three of my submission, that's where I mention Lakewood's plan. On page four, which you have, I think the problem is that many of the programs that you are funding don't principally benefit low and moderate income people. For instance, Jackson, and you're administering the grant for Jackson, so in a sense you have some control over what Jackson does, Jackson is going to build a fitness trail and a spray park. How that benefits low and moderate income people, unless it will be a place where homeless people can come to take a shower using the spray park. I don't know. The principle benefit of that part of the plan does not benefit low and moderate income people. It should be withdrawn and I'll speak later about how that money should be better spent.

Several of the other projects involving fixing bulkheads on Long Beach Island or beach access in places like Harvey Cedars that aren't even accessible easily by bus are not going to principally benefit low and moderate income people who would rarely get there. Again, you can read the comments I've written, but that use of that money and it's almost \$300,000.000 of the CDBG funds, isn't really an appropriate use. There are better uses. Better uses for that money that really will benefit the people that need the most help.

I'll just mention a couple of additional comments I have then I'll talk in general terms. The plan doesn't really have any analysis of how it's going to overcome the barriers to affordable housing in our community, particularly in the many zoning barriers that prevent groups of people from building the kind of rental housing that's needed to shelter people. And, we all know about the fire in Point Pleasant which unfortunately took the lives of four people because they were living and that was their home in an unsprinklered motel. But, that points out that when you have people and families living in motels, there's not enough housing to go around and many of those people were working just as many of the people that were living in the tent city. You shouldn't have people living in motels. This money could be better spent to see that we have housing for people that need it.

I've made some specific proposals about how the money should be used and I'll go to the second part of my presentation now which is, if you reopen this process as I think you have to because of non-compliance with certain certifications including the one that says it's primarily benefitting low and moderate income people, there will be a chance for other people to come forward like Tom O'Malley came to you. I saw the article in the paper in which Freeholder Director mentioned that more needed to be done for homeless people. Well this is money that we have that we don't have to obtain, we already have it, that could be redirected to do just what he was suggesting, help improve a site for those small houses for homeless people. Or improve a site for a shelter which we desperately need here. Reopening the process will give people a chance to comment on that and make that proposal and for you to rethink it because you really have control of how that money is spent. I mean these are a couple of million dollars.

You could, as I've suggested in the past, there are many people on waiting lists for rental assistance. Working people. Families. Many living in churches because they're homeless. You could create more vouchers using this money. You could take your HOME funds, convert all of them to vouchers which would produce not just an additional 40 vouchers, but probably an additional 100 vouchers. And, take the CDBG funds that you have and use that money for what you're funding the HOME programs with. That would provide a lot more help for people who are struggling. And we all know that there's a major problem with homelessness here. People in Lakewood's tent city are only going to be housed for a year. Many of them have serious difficulties. After that year that Lakewood is paying the money, they're going to be back looking for housing that doesn't exist and maybe there will be another tent city like a couple of tent cities that had been started in Toms River recently. This is where we need more affordable housing in general for the people that work here, for the people that work at the minimum wage jobs that are out there which predominate in our County for the low wage workers. The people that care for people in our nursing homes.

So I urge you again, not to submit the plan today. Take it back and reopen the hearing process so that more people can participate. They can look at your final plan and then participate in it. And maybe you can decide to redirect the money to the places where the people that need it the most can benefit. I thank you for the opportunity to make that presentation. If you have any questions, I'd be glad to answer them. Again, I urge you not to approve it today, but to reopen the public hearing process. and move it forward that way."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much Mr. Pascale. We will note all of the comments that you made. It will be part of the public record. Any other questions or comments on this particular comment? Seeing no other questions or comments related to this public hearing, if we have a motion and a second. Freeholder Little do you want to do it now? Freeholder Little would like to respond to you."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "I'll just comment briefly."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay. Officially the Public Hearing is closed."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Just on those comments. First of all, there were six public hearings held with this action plan. Two were held in each municipality and four by the County including one pre-development hearing and HUD

will make the determination. It is the position of our Planning staff that administers this program that it is in compliance with the Federal regulations and again, HUD as always, as we always respond to you Connie, Mr. Pascale, is that HUD will make the final determination whether the plan is in compliance. We expect that it will be.

The zoning barriers...you know that this steering committee has no control over that whatsoever nor do we plan to. New Jersey as you know is a home-rule state and those issues are to be decided by your local governing body and Mayor. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Freeholder Little."

CONNIE PASCALE: "Can I please respond to that?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "No. Not at this time. Public comments at the end of the meeting. I think all comments were made by members of the public and by Freeholder Little. What's the pleasure of the Board?"

On motion duly made by Freeholder Little, seconded by Freeholder Kelly, the FY2014 Ocean County Consortium Action Plan was adopted on final reading.

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "I'm somewhat troubled by what Mr. Pascale has said. I've often thought that some of our CDBG money was used by municipalities in ways that I certainly wouldn't have used it. However, we as a Board have....we are really able to participate in the program because those municipalities have joined in a consortium overseen by the County and we have left it up to that municipal group, representative of each town whose in it, to determine how exactly the money would be parceled out if.....am I correct on that? So, given that it is not exactly our program and that we only have a program because the municipalities have joined it and we have allowed them to determine the disposition of the funds, I will vote yes. But, I am troubled by the procedures that we've used, but I understand them and that's the ones we've used. But, sometimes I think curb-cuts are more problems than they're worth. Thank you."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Yes and I will comment again in a minute. Thank you."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "Yes. Passage unanimously. Freeholder Little will make a comment."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Regarding low income and moderate income, I would like to remind that 902 housing units have been rehabilitated, all for low income and moderate income families. 456 families have received their down payment. They were all low income families for their first home. 119 units have been rehabilitated under the CHODO program. All of those were for affordable rental housing, all low income families. And, 718 families have been provided rental assistance under this program so those are all low and obviously low income families. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "If there are no other additional comments from members of the Board, I move on Mrs. Vasil to the next item please."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I would just like to make a brief comment on H-32 which is legislation that was will be presented tomorrow by our Assemblyman in Ocean County, Ron Dancer. We've been going and talking about different fees in State banks. The fees are not publicly disclosed on many areas. What started the conversation was several months ago we said that many people do not know what they pay in fees, hidden fees, with Deferred Compensation and 401K's and has led to Assemblyman Dancer saying well you can only do it with the State. But we're still highly motivated to find out the hidden fees. The reason they don't do it is because they say the average person cannot understand what is done with hidden fees. It averages from 1 -1/2% to 2% and they said if you want to find out read the prospectus. So I did. I read a number of them. They are sometimes between two and six different fees that are included in it and it's intentionally hidden in there and they say 'well you don't pay for it'. But it's part of the end of the year (statement). If you call up and ask them and if they get to it, it's hard to get the answer. You do pay a fee. It should be publicly disclosed. I'm not questioning the fee, but at the end of the year you ought to be able to find out what you are paying for any fee. It's truth in lending, it's truth financing and it should be truth in how you invest your money and deal with a bank whether it's Federal or public.

Steve Scaturro is in the process now of doing some research and we will write a letter asking for full disclosure of all fees whether on a Federal or a State level. Doing some research in the 1970's, '77 I believe it was, the lobbyists in Washington, D.C. that have so much power pushed this bill through because of their power in making campaign contributions to PACs, which is widely known, and there's virtually trillions of dollars in the United States that each year money is being taken out and the person who worked hard to put the money in will never know about it. And, that will change eventually and the start is tomorrow with Assemblyman Ron Dancer. Thank you."

T. FREEHOLDER COMMENTS

At 5:12 PM, Director Vicari received the following comments from members of the Board.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I'd like to make a few announcements. The first one is of course that the next meeting on May 21st, I have a commitment to speak at the MODC representing the Freeholders of Ocean County, so I will only make part of the meeting. I have to be at that meeting at 5:00 PM so I probably will leave after a half hour. So again, if there's any questions about that please let me know before the meeting so I can put it on before time, if there's any vote.

The first item I want to talk about is something very, very important and I think it's something that....when you talk

about CDBG it's extremely important to us because when we had this great tragedy with the Superstorm, that the eye of the storm went through the heart of Ocean County eighteen months ago. What happened was the Federal government and the Legislators in Congress made a commitment that the money was going to be dedicated to the storm residents basically for housing. And, basically it was for the middle income and some people that were poor people and still not in their homes. There was \$3.6 billion dedicated, dedicated funds, eighteen months ago. Now what they want to do......48 states are saying well 'the \$2 billion left, \$2 billion, should be done on a competitive basis' because now they had a mudslide, tornadoes and different storms throughout the United States. They want to take money that was dedicated to New Jersey and to New York State, take the money that we were entitled to now, that was coming here, and we still have homeless people in Ocean County and the rest of the State of New Jersey and of course, New York and a little bit outside the area, that should have their homes rebuilt. People that worked hard, have a house, and all they want to do is sleep in their own house. Have dinner in their own house every single night. And, this is being jeopardized. So I sent a letter out supporting two US Senators that took a lead in that. One is from New Jersey, Senator Menendez and the other one is Senator Schuman from New York. And again, to have competition, New Jersey with 48 other states because of their disaster is just not fair. It never happened before. And then we found out the way the legislation was written, there was a loophole in it. What happened was, the other, those in Congress made the loophole intentionally thinking well we know New Jersey is going to get their fair share and New York and the Sandy victims. Well we'll do this in case we ever need the money. No. That's not the way it works. The CDBG money is first dedicated to those that want to get back in their homes and that's how it should be. So again, we're going to work with them. Take a strong stand and get the money not only for New Jersey and to our residents, but as soon as possible. Every time you hear a story they say 'well it's in the pipleline, it's in the pipeline'. Well, people are tired of hearing that. If you're not in your house for 18 months and you do everything the right way, the American Dream, you work hard, well those people are entitled to be back in their homes. And it never happened before in recent years or in the history of the United States. It never happened with Katrina. They gave them the money. They took the money and what happened was they didn't put the money back in their homes and we should not suffer because of what happened in Katrina.

I was on the radio and I just want to give you some of the ideas of things that are taking place throughout Ocean County, some are related, on Saturday, on "Senior Services and Senior Comments". Most had to do with different areas. Most are to do with the people who want to get back in their homes. Most have to do with the damage that was devastated and you know we couldn't prevent the storm, it was an act of nature, but there are certain things that we can. For an example, the first house that the Governor of the State of New Jersey went to in the State in Toms River and we walked around. I spoke to the people. They just got the approval. You know how long it takes to build a house totally, foundation and all? Four full weeks. On 7th Avenue. And the residents said the reason why it took them four full weeks, four weeks, top to bottom two-story house, was because they said it was in the pipeline and because of government regulations. That's totally uncalled for. Those things could be prevented. There's no question about it. There was a new house that was built. I spoke to the senior citizens. It's a brand new house and because of the regulations and the insurance company, now, this is the insurance company, he was in it for three months. The insurance company after going back and forth and haggling with him, depreciated his house. They said it lost value in three months. It was not a car. It doesn't lose value. But it goes to show the hassles and what the people are going through with their frustrations, going back and forth. And, this one I even shared with the Administrator, that there was a new business. He was ready to get into it. Got his life savings. Builds his business. Its a month before he gets into it. Spends every penny he has. The business is totally destroyed. Six feet of water. So he rebuilds the business, again, and what happened is now the State of New Jersey.....all he wants is two things for his business. It's a hamburger/hot dog/food place. He wants to put a sign 3 (foot) by 3 (foot) so people know his business is open. The State of New Jersey on Route 35 said you can't put the sign up. He says 'wait a minute, this is storm area'. He said 'I'm living from day to day. I am not taking a salary.' And I spoke with the Administrator of his town and I said 'look, you can't do that'. All he wants to do is one thing. Opportunity. Put a sign. And they said no. The street's all ripped up. And the second thing he wants....the State and utilities (companies) ripped up the sidewalk on both sides of him. The people can't get into his business because four feet of the sidewalk they removed. They said 'we'll fix the sidewalk. No questions. We'll put a new one in, but it's going to take two years'. Well, the guy, next month, he's not going to be in business. Those are the things that government regulations have to stop. And it goes on and on.

Another fellow put a foundation in. Just the footings. And they said 'we can't inspect it for ten full days'. He can't put his up. And again, he didn't have the money. He borrowed it from his relatives and his friends and he went back and forth. Those are the things that have to stop. Another one had an ice cream store, opened it up, and the contractor put a generator in front of the driveway so you can't get into the business. And what we're saying is and what I want to work with the next couple of weeks is to say 'look you have to be reasonable. You have to waive certain regulations.' They want (Route) 35. We're not complaining about it. Okay. But there are certain regulations, they have to be reasonable. You can't put people out of business. Only in the storm area, they should be able to give waivers for people to stay in business. Whether it's a business and again, they all live in Toms River. All small businesses. They employ three or four people and some of the housing, again, they cannot get the permits because of the regulations. A lot have to do with, of course, the insurance company. A lot have to do with FEMA. But enough is enough with this. It's just arguing continuously. And even CDBG. I mean people applied for it, they qualified for it, and as far as I know in the recent emergencies and whatever they have never had to wait 18 months. And now what's happening is people are getting frustrated because they're saying 'will it ever happen'. Well, there's not even a timeline. The County, they still owe us the \$9 million. We can't do the Budget, but that's one thing. But you have to make sure that people can get back in their homes. These obstacles are being created and there's no reason for it. The obstacles can be solved. They can be taken care of. We are reasonable people still meeting the criteria of all regulations.

There was a number of fires that were started intentionally. And again, they put in jeopardy of course, the volunteer firemen, people in their homes, and it is a terrible, terrible thing. And again, we ask the residents if they see something, say something. We put out a press release. Someone started it by eigarettes out the window. Sometimes by a mini trailer, bicycle, a minibike, a catalytic converter, they can all start it. But again, one thing that helped the fire, put it out, the County Airport. The first time we used the New Jersey Forest Service did not come to our airport for many years because we didn't have a crosswind (runway). They used it for the first time. They flew 23 missions out of Miller Airport, the County airport. They dropped over 19,000 gallons of water to help put the fire out. And again, potentially, I think it's fair to say that we saved a lot of lives and homes because the crosswinds was put in as fast as we could. We waited many years and we went back and forth. But again, the forest fires set intentionally are a major problem. They should be tried to the maximum amount of the law. There's no question about it and they have to become an example. I mean you just can't go set fires all over not only in Ocean County, but several counties. But from what I understand there were a number of fires that are under investigation at the present time that it's felt, it's felt that it was started intentionally. That concludes my report. Again, I'll turn it over now to Freeholder Little who wanted to make a report...to make comments on Senior Services a few minutes ago."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. Jane, when we were doing the proclamation, Joe somehow missed me here. I wanted to tell you, I wanted to thank you for all your service to Senior Services and to the County. A long time ago, about 35 years ago, I was a young guy out campaigning for my first office in Long Beach Township and I did it the old-fashioned way, went door to door. Every house in Long Beach Township. And Jim Mancini, our beloved friend and late beloved friend and dear, dear man, told me 'you've got to go see Jane Maloney. Go see Jane.' And Jane was then with St. Francis and I knocked on the door and Jane answered the door on a beautiful day and I'll never forget that she was one of the first people, one of the first people of Long Beach Township that I went to see and she said, 'are you running with Jim Mancini?' I said yes. She said Okay, you're alright. And she was very cordial and very, very warm and I appreciated it from that time and she's been a great friend ever since. I thank you for your long service to Ocean County and all you've done. And Jackie, we look forward to you, Jackie. Whenever Jane's not around, Carol always calls Jackie and we get things worked out. So we know it's going to be a great transition. And, I think as Freeholder Bartlett said, Freeholder Vicari could not have made a better selection for the new Director. So good luck and Jane, thank you as always. Thank you Mr. Director that's all."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Anything else?"

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "No."

U. **PUBLIC COMMENTS** - Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of **five (5)** minutes per speaker.

At 5:23 PM, Director Vicari opened the meeting to receive the following comments from the public.

CONNIE PASCALE, MEMBER OF STEPS: "I'd just like to respond briefly to some of the things that were said earlier and frankly I completely agree that the delay in getting people back to their primary residences using the Federal funds is an awful, awful situation. And what's it's done is made it even worse for the lowest income people because the people that were living in those homes are occupying rental units that might have been available for other people. And those people are occupying lower cost rental units and that's why we have even more people struggling with affordable housing than we had before. So the whole process needs to be improved.

And, it's worth noting that, for the lowest income people displaced by Katrina, approximately 40% to 50% of them still have not returned to New Orleans. Primarily African American people who are still living in trailers or struggling far away from their homes. So Katrina's not a good example for what happens for some of the lowest income people. Those neighborhoods still remain in great difficulty. We need to make sure everybody here is brought back including the low income people who were displaced out of state. And there have been a lot of articles about that.

I just want to go back to the Public Hearing, I think the Public Hearings that the Clerk read are accurate and I think that while they often times use CDBG hearings, they're obscure at best. The hearings are supposed to be on the Action Plan itself and the other hearings that might have been mentioned on the CDBG process don't focus on the Action Plan. And clearly, the post- and pre- submission hearings were not adequately timed to allow more people to participate. I mentioned the rental market. As far as zoning goes, I understand that that's a municipal issue, but it's an obligation of the Consortium to have a discussion of how they're going to overcome it in the Plan. What are the ways to overcome those barriers? For instance, you could establish a County Housing Authority, which I've suggested in the past. Monmouth County has one. Many other counties have them. They end up helping to produce the housing that's needed. You could exercise the leadership that you often exercise. Call everyone together and say we're going to solve this problem, both of homelessness and affordable housing in a joint way. Comprehensively, everybody will share a little and then we'll get a lot done.

If every community in Ocean County built ten units that would be 330 additional supportive housing units that would take everyone out of the woods that has no place to go. A ten unit building is not big. I appreciate the litany of units that you read in terms of people helped. That's over 20 plus years. That's not a lot given the number of people that need help over 20 plus years. We can certainly do more is all I'm arguing. That's a good start. We can do more. As far as the operation of the Consortium and I appreciate Freeholder Bartlett's comments about that, there's another place where you can call the Consortium members together because frankly, based on the difficulties they have for instance with homeless people, placing someone they find is homeless, you could probably convince them that we should pool our money and use it as a way to provide a place where you can take the homeless people that have no

place to take them now. Many of the police departments took people to tent city. They brought them there because there was no other place to go. People were urged to go to tent city. And again, I think by bringing the people together, you have money coming, you can urge them to use it together that benefits all of them including providing the kind of benefits that everybody will get help from and not just curb cuts or a fitness park which really doesn't benefit any of the low income people. Thank you for the opportunity. I appreciate the time."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Mr. Pascale, we appreciate your comments and it is so noted. Next speaker please."

DEBRA JONES, JACKSON: "First of all I would like to tell you guys that when I was walking into this meeting today I kind of viewed you all as a little bit of an enemy. After watching what you did with the public and with the kids and talking about homeless people and trying to get them in their homes, I have changed my opinion towards a lot of you. But I'm not standing here as just a taxpayer or someone who lives in the township, I'm standing here as an employee's wife. And I'm really upset at the way it just seems to be some of the employees are disregarded and that they are treated in ways that I don't think any of you would want to be treated or would want anyone in your family to be treated. And I think that you just need to be reminded that behind every employee there's a family. There's a wife. There's a husband. There's children. And whether you want to take your job home or not, you do. And I would think that if every one of you looked at it, every one of you do. None of us are above it and none of us can avoid it. And I just want each one of you to look at me because when you're looking at all your employees, I don't care what department they're in, they're not just representing Ocean County, they're representing the families that they are supporting.

I just....I would love to get into it personally because I don't think it's something that needs to be spoken out here, but I just really urge you that no matter who your employee is or what you think they've done, until you know it, you need to really, really think about it. Because there are men and women in this County that this County would never function if it wasn't for them. There's a lot of people leaving their homes and their families in the middle of the night to go do what needs to be done. They're giving 110% and they're working with honesty and integrity and it may not be liked by all people because honesty is hard to take, but it still needs to be done and I'm grateful that I can look at the person walking out of my house and know that he's standing for the taxpayers. And when he's going to work he's giving 110% no matter how he's being treated and I just feel that needs to be said. I think the humanity needs to be brought back. But I do thank you for everything I saw here today because it changed my mind about a lot of things. I appreciate all that you've done."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. I just want to share my feelings. You can sit down if you want to. As far as I know and you know I've been an educator for 40 years, I treat all people especially those who work for the County and I value each and every one. I treat them with respect. I treat them with dignity. Mrs. Jones, I don't know if that's related to the person or to you or what happened. We have Keith Goetting here from our Personnel Department if you have any issues you want to talk to him about. Again, this is the first time I heard it. If you wish to call me, we have an open door policy. I am not only shocked, but I'm extremely surprised because as long as I have been serving on the Board of Freeholders I've never heard that before unless it was a grievance or unless it had to do with salary contracts. Right now when we talk about salary contracts, we have certain limitations. We do the best we can. But I think if you look at our benefit package as far as the hospitalization and as far as what we offer people, as far as the working environment, we do the best that we can. And, as a matter of fact, we get criticized many times because they say we give them too much. I don't think that's the case and I know that certain departments that I have, for an example, you see the guys working outside. They're raking the leaves. They're sweeping the floor. Cleaning the offices. And they should get more money, but we can't afford to do so. We do the best we can under the conditions that we do have.

I'm glad you're impressed at what you've seen today, but that's also how we treat employees. If you have an isolated situation, if you'd like to discuss it with our Personnel Department or the Administrator, you are more than welcome to do so.

I move to close the public portion and Mrs. Vasil, the resolution please."

At 5:35 PM, the Board of Chosen Freeholders paused the meeting to go into Executive Session.



WHEREAS, on Tuesday, May 6, 2014, the Navy Lakehurst Historical Society is commemorating the 77th Anniversary of the Hindenburg Crash at the Hindenburg Memorial Site at Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst, New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, The Hindenburg, the longest class of flying machine and the largest airship by envelope volume designed and built by the Zeppelin Company, made its maiden test flight on March 4, 1936 with 87 passengers and crew aboard; and

WHEREAS, after opening its 1937 season by completing a single round trip passage to Rio de Janeiro in late March, The Hindenburg departed from Frankfurt, Germany on the evening of May 3, bound for Naval Air Station Lakehurst, on the first of its 10 round trips between Europe and the United States scheduled for its second year of commercial service; and

WHEREAS, except for strong headwinds which slowed its passage, The Hindenburg's crossing was otherwise unremarkable until the airship's attempted early evening landing at Lakehurst three days later on May 6, 1937; and

WHEREAS, The Hindenburg's arrival was delayed for several hours to avoid a line of thunderstorms passing over Lakehurst, but around 7:00 pm the airship was cleared for its final approach to the Naval Air Station when it suddenly burst into flames while attempting to dock with its mooring mast; and

WHEREAS, of the 97 people on board there were 36 fatalities, including one death among the ground crew. The actual cause of the fire remains unknown, although a variety of hypotheses have been put forward. Regardless, the disaster shattered public confidence in the giant, passenger-carrying rigid airship and marked the end of the airship era.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE RECONSTRUCTION AND WIDENING OF INDIAN HEAD ROAD, COUNTY ROAD 571, FROM ROUTE 9 TO THE GARDEN STATE PARKWAY, TOMS RIVER TOWNSHIP, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND APPROPRIATING \$1,500,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,425,000 IN BONDS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN TO FINANCE THE SAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING) AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. There is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the County of Ocean as general improvements, a project consisting of the reconstruction and widening of Indian Head Road, County Road 571, from Route 9 to the Garden State Parkway, located in Toms River Township, in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, in accordance with plans and specifications on file in the Ocean County Engineering Department, including all else necessary therefor and incidental thereto.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared that the improvements or purposes, the estimated cost of the improvements and appropriation therefor, down payment and estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes authorized are as follows:

There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$1,500,000, including the sum of \$75,000 as the down payment, for the improvements or purposes described in Section 1 hereof as required by the Local Bond Law. BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR IMPROVEMENTS OF THE OCEAN COUNTY COLLEGE FACILITIES IN AND BY THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING \$2,950,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$2,950,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN FOR FINANCING SUCH APPROPRIATION.

WHEREAS, The Board of Trustees (the "Board of Trustees") of the Ocean County College (the "College") has determined by resolution duly adopted on March 8, 2013 to apply to the State of New Jersey (the "State") for a grant from the State's Building Our Future Bond Act Program for the financing of a project consisting of improvements to and the renovation of the existing College Instructional Building as described in Section 3 hereof (the "Project") at an estimated cost of \$11,400,000, and has delivered a statement to that effect to each member of the Board of School Estimate; and

WHEREAS, on April 29, 2013, the Secretary of Higher Education advised the Board of Trustees that it would be awarded a grant of \$8,550,000 from the Building Our Future Bond Act Program to apply toward financing the costs of the Project, subject to the Board of Trustees providing a matching amount of not less than 25% of the costs of the Project; and

WHEREAS, The Board of School Estimate has determined by resolution duly adopted on March 26, 2014 that no less than \$2,850,000 is necessary for the matching amount for the Project which is to be raised by the County of Ocean and a certificate to that effect has been delivered to the Board of Trustees and the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance (the "Improvements") are hereby authorized to be undertaken by the County of Ocean, New Jersey (the "County") as general improvements. For the said Improvements there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$2,950,000. No down payment is required pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-19(2)(b).

Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the Improvements, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$2,950,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law and Title 18A, Education, of the New Jersey Statutes (the "Bonds"). In anticipation of the issuance of the Bonds and to temporarily finance said Improvements, negotiable bond

Section 3. The Improvements hereby authorized and the purpose for which (a) the Bonds are to be issued are improvements of Ocean County College, consisting of the renovation of the Instructional Building (the "Building") including, but not limited to (i) ADA compliance throughout the Building including lavatories; (ii) complete renovation of the existing academic space with minimal CMU wall demolition work; (iii) complete renovation of the existing Building laboratories, classrooms and office space; (iv) creation of a new main mall area entrance; (v) creation of wet laboratory space from existing classroom space; (vi) replacement of fan coil/unit ventilators; (vii) replacement of HVAC piping throughout the Building; (viii) removal of unused piping, conduits, wiring; (ix) possible replacement of electrical service; (x) study of the Building envelope, façade, roof, masonry, windows, caulking; (xi) replacement of hot water boilers, hot and chilled water pumps; and (xii) upgrades to HVAC, electrical, audio, video, voice and data, windows, glass storefronts, carpeting, painting, ceilings, and including all work and materials necessary therefor or incidental thereto. The additional funding for these Improvements will be received from the State of New Jersey pursuant to the Building Our Future Bond Act.

- (b) The estimated maximum amount of Bonds or Notes to be issued for the purpose of financing a portion of the cost of the Improvements is \$2,950,000.
- (c) The estimated cost of the Improvements is not less than \$11,400,000 and the County's share of the Improvements is \$2,950,000, which amount represents the appropriation made by the County.

Section 4. All Bond Anticipation Notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the County Comptroller; provided that no Note shall mature later than one year from its date. The Notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the County Comptroller. The County Comptroller shall determine all matters in connection with Notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the County Comptroller's signature upon the Notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All Notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8.1. The County Comptroller is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the Notes from time to time, at not less than par and accrued interest, at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price

plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The County Comptroller is

directed to report in writing to the Board of Chosen Freeholders at the meeting next succeeding

the date when any sale or delivery of the Notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such

report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the

Notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The capital budget (or temporary capital budget as applicable) of the

County is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of

any inconsistency herewith. In the event of any such inconsistency and amendment, the

resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the

amended capital budget (or amended temporary capital budget as applicable) and capital

program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file

with the Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

Section 6. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited

and stated:

The Improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not current (a)

expenses. They are improvements or purposes the County may lawfully undertake as general

improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property

specially benefitted thereby.

The period of usefulness of the improvements or purposes within the limitations (b)

of the Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the

bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 15 years.

The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly (c)

prepared and filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders, and a complete

executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local

Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such

statement shows that the gross debt of the County as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased







Freeholder Lacey stated that the County will be running double programs – the Residential Document Shredding Program and the Household Hazardous Waste Program (HHW). The Freeholder noted that the shredding program will run from April to October in many locations for residents to bring all their personal papers for shredding. Residents do not have to register for this program. Freeholder Lacey advised that the shredding Program is free to residents and residents can bring six boxes for shredding each day.

Freeholder Lacey advised that the HHW Program is going out to bid for March to October, 2014. The County has scheduled three locations, Manchester, Toms River and Stafford so far; however, once the bids come back, the County may be able to hold other locations as well. The Freeholder stated that residents do have to register for the HHW program and can drop off a maximum of 200 pounds of dry material and 20 gallons of liquid.

Director Vicari stated that these are ongoing programs that provide a savings to our municipalities in landfill fees and taking recyclables out of the waste stream.

Director Vicari noted that each year the most important document this Board works on is the budget and he commended Freeholder Bartlett for making sure even during difficult times when we lost, because of Superstorm Sandy, \$10 billion in the ratable base, we still have a budget to deal with what the County needs to do. Director Vicari stated that the County will always maintain core services for Ocean County residents, even through the difficult budget times. The Director noted that this County maintains a responsible budget and that Ocean County is one of the few states / counties that gained population and provides more and more services to our senior population of over 160,000. Director Vicari again thanked Freeholder Bartlett for making sure Ocean County keeps its Triple A bond rating.

Freeholder Bartlett stated that the budget is put together by the five Freeholders, noting that before budget discussions take place, the County figures out where it needs to be and then fills in the details. The Freeholder noted that the budget is complicated because of Superstorm Sandy and the 2014 net equalized tax values are down again this year by \$300 million from last year. Freeholder Bartlett expressed that he felt that the reason for this is that some towns were slow last year to put storm ratable damages on the tax roles. Homes were also demolished; 4,000 homes had catastrophic damages from Superstorm Sandy. Freeholder Bartlett stated that the budget will increase by 1.6 cents of equalized value which equals a 34.1 cent per \$100 to homeowners. The Freeholder noted that traditionally over the last 35 years the rate has been in the 45

cent range and that the County will still be below the historic range at 34.1 cents, the overall budget is \$400.8 million which is up \$14 million from last year.

Freeholder Bartlett stated that some expenditures are noteworthy; first, the Board of Social Services (BOSS); Obamacare has expanded the eligibility for Medicaid and the number of people eligible for Medicaid and the County must provide the BOSS \$1.678 million to handle the expanded programs. Second, the Freeholder noted that the County is still feeling the effects of Superstorm Sandy; Road Department trucks need to be replaced, advising that the County has not replaced many of these vehicles for five years due to the economic downturn. Freeholder Bartlett stated that this has also been a difficult winter on County vehicles and heavy equipment and the County can not do the job without equipment; the County needs to start replacing the County's fleet, a total of \$5.6 million will be allocated for new heavy equipment. Freeholder Bartlett stated that the County takes pride in its Triple A bond rating and that means having approximately 10 percent in surplus. The Freeholder noted that 2013 ended with a surplus balance of \$34 million, the County used \$16.5 million, the County replaced what it spent and added some. This year the budget will use \$16 million in surplus, noting that it is down from the \$16.5 million used last year.

Freeholder Bartlett advised that a 10 percent surplus is the standard and stated that the County has enhanced its surplus position and is building towards the 10 percent figure to maintain its Triple A bond rating. The Freeholder noted that the County borrows \$30 million a year about the same it repays, and has good access to the bond market because we have the best bond rating in the world.

Freeholder Bartlett noted that FEMA is slow to reimburse the County, stating that this was a concern of the rating agencies. The Freeholder also noted that the County did not borrow any money for Superstorm Sandy, the County self-financed over \$100 million during the Superstorm.

Freeholder Bartlett stated that Ocean County will not put the future in debt; it provides the services that are expected without saddling future generations. The County paid off as much as it has been borrowing each year. The Freeholder noted that he was happy to represent there are no surprises in the 2014 Budget and the County does not expect any in the future; he stated that he expects the real estate market will build this year. Freeholder Bartlett advised that some of the FEMA dollars that were received in the form of loans may end up being forgivable loans over five years. Lastly, the Freeholder stated that the County was able to help the Ocean County Vocational School for the first time in four years with an additional \$300,000 in funding, which was difficult but important. The Freeholder also noted that the Ocean County College funding remained flat this year and advised that the College stated that it would continue to work with the County. Freeholder Bartlett advised that labor contracts that were settled last year were at the 1½ percent level; the budget is within the State mandated 2 percent cap.

Freeholder Bartlett reviewed the two caps that the County has to deal with; the 1977 cap and a 2010 cap, stating that the legislature should have one cap. Both caps are based on different criteria and the County has to work with the smaller of the two; however, he advised that the County will live within the law and do the best it can to provide services. Freeholder Bartlett noted that he was happy with the budget, stating that it was the best the County could do under the circumstances.

Director Vicari thanked Freeholder Bartlett for his presentation and noted that the Introduction of the Budget will be listed for the Board meeting next week with the final vote on April 16, 2014. The Director highlighted that the County has maintained its Triple A bond rating; that services have increased year after year but the County gets the job done. The Director also thanked the professional staff for holding the line and maintaining our debt service; noting that the County will not borrow from our children; the County pays its bills.

Director Vicari opened the meeting up for comments from the Board members.

Freeholder Lacey thanked Freeholder Bartlett for a great job on the budget as well as the staff for their hard work. Freeholder Lacey also advised that Road Department equipment is needed to get the job done, pointing out that this equipment is starting to get very expensive to replace and repair; if the County ordered new heavy equipment today, the County wouldn't get it for up to a year.

Freeholder Little also thanked Freeholder Bartlett, Administrator Block and Julie Tarrant noting that they have worked very hard on this year's budget. The Freeholder advised that last year this Board provided about \$21 million to the BOSS and this year it will provide about \$23 million. These are matching funds to provide essential services to residents of Ocean County. The Freeholder noted that the BOSS is overwhelmed with applicants for welfare and Medicaid and once the federal government puts new programs in place, they will have to administer those as well. Freeholder Little stated that over 50,000 people are on food stamps since the increased eligibility guidelines and 12,000 to 13,000 walk through the doors. All of this is putting an amazing demand on the BOSS.

Mr. Scarantino reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the advertisement for the reconstruction of traffic signals in the Borough of Seaside Heights. There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the agenda for the March 19, 2014 Board meeting.

Ms. Vasil reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of March 19, 2014. Freeholder Little asked Ms. Vasil to add a proclamation for Alcoholism Awareness Month to the Board agenda. There were no other questions or comments.

Director Vicari stated that he is taking an aggressive role with the utility companies. The Freeholder advised that he is meeting with JCP&L on Friday and he Introduced pass ask #1741, 2014 ounty Engineer if there are any problems with the electric company as Official Resolution#: 2014000513

far as County projects. Director Vicari stated that he will discuss with JCP&L street lights to be sure that they are replaced as needed. Consumer Affairs has requested a hotline for immediate attention. The Freeholder stated that he is looking forward to a positive meeting.

Director Vicari noted that he will work with the State once again for the upcoming Memorial Day Weekend. The Freeholder stated that he is optimistic all will go well. People need to be held accountable and the State needs to be understanding of the traffic during the upcoming holiday weekend during the Route 35 construction work. The Freeholder again noted that the tourism industry is a \$4.3 billion business and Route 35 has to accommodate that traffic.

Director Vicari asked the Board members for comments.

There were comments.

Ms. Vasil read the resolution to move to closed session.

On a motion by Freeholder Little, seconded by Freeholder Lacey, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 4:45 PM for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was unanimously carried.
