# Three Arrested After Six-Week Narcotics Investigation; LSD, Marijuana and Weapons Recovered

Manchester Township NJ – A six-week investigation by members of the Manchester Township Police Department's Narcotics Enforcement Team (N.E.T.) culminated in the search of a Summit Park home and the arrests of three individuals on drug and weapons charges on Wednesday.

During the early morning hours of July 13, 2016, members of the department's Narcotics Enforcement Team and Detective Section, along with members of the Ocean County Regional SWAT Team, executed a Court authorized search warrant at a Neal Place residence in the Summit Park section of the Township. The six-week investigation began after the Narcotics Enforcement Team received complaints about possible drug distribution on that block. Police obtained a search warrant for the residence after a subsequent investigation. During the search of the home, evidence of LSD and marijuana distribution, along with a quarter pound of marijuana and 165 doses of LSD were recovered. In addition, multiple prohibited weapons and more than \$1,000.00 in cash, believed to be proceeds of drug sales, were seized. Furthermore, paraphernalia associated with the distribution of marijuana and LSD was also seized.

Arrested were the following:

- Shawn Moll, 27, of Neal Place, Manchester
- Kwasi Mayweather, 30, of River Avenue, Lakewood
- Victoria Espinal, 19, of Housen Street, Manchester

All three individuals were charged with possession of and possession with intent to distribute LSD, possession of and possession with intent to distribute over 50 grams of marijuana, possession of K2 (synthetic marijuana), possession of drug paraphernalia, and possession of prohibited weapons. Additionally, Mayweather was processed on two outstanding arrest warrants; one out of the Ocean County Sheriff's Department and one out of Millstone Municipal Court.

Moll's bail was set at \$165,000, with no 10 percent option, while bail for both Mayweather and Espinal was set at \$100,000, also with no 10 percent option. All three subjects were unable to post bail and were subsequently transported to the Ocean County Jail.

The investigation was led by the Manchester Police Department's N.E.T. Assisting with this investigation were the officers from both the Manchester Police Department Investigations and Patrol Bureaus. Additionally, the Ocean County Sheriff's Office K-9 unit assisted at the scene.

# Audit Finds Toms River Township in Good Financial Shape

(Toms River, NJ) For the fourth year in a row, an independent audit shows the town's finances are in good shape.

According to a report compiled by Holman, Frenia & Allison, the certified public accounting firm hired to audit the town's financial records, Toms River is in an overall strong financial position, with more than \$17.23 million in the unassigned fund balance as of 12/31/15.

For the past four audits, encompassing the years of 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2015, the auditors issued no findings, comments, or recommendations.

The town also paid off approximately \$8.7 million in long-term debt.

Mayor Thomas F. Kelaher said the audit reflects prudent management and strong policies.

"The Town remains in a solid financial position. We are very pleased with the findings in this report. Being wise stewards of the Town's financial resources is one of our top priorities and responsibilities."

Toms River has an annual budget of roughly \$125 million, with tax

# **SCHOOL BOARD CANDIDATES FILING DEADLINE IS JULY 25**

CANDIDATES seeking school board seats have until 4 p.m., Monday, July 25 to file their nominating petitions at the Ocean County Clerk's Office in order to have their name placed on the Nov. 8 General Election Ballot, according to Ocean County Clerk Scott M. Colabella. Nominating petitions for School Board can be obtained in person at either the Ocean County Clerk's Main Office, at the Ocean County Courthouse, Election Services, Room 107 at 118 Washington St., Toms River, or at the Ocean County Southern Service Center, 179 South Main St., Manahawkin. The offices are staffed from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.

"The Ocean County Clerk's Office makes every effort to inform potential candidates of approaching filing deadlines," said Ocean County Freeholder Director John P. Kelly, who serves as liaison to the County Clerk. "Through the office's website, social media, and other avenues, County Clerk Colabella provides the information needed by both candidates and voters."

Colabella noted that all Ocean County school districts now hold their Board of Education elections in November.

"A law signed by the Governor in 2014 moved the petition filing deadline for school board candidates from June to the last Monday in July to provide candidates with more time to submit their petitions," Colabella said.

A total of 70 school board seats will appear on the November ballot in various school districts throughout Ocean County. A complete listing of all candidates who file petitions for school board will be available shortly after the July 25 deadline at www.oceancountyclerk. com or www.facebook.com/oceancountyclerk.

School board candidates seeking additional information on the petition filing process can contact the Ocean County Clerk's Election Office at (732) 929-

2153.

"It's important for candidates to get their paperwork in on time," Colabella said. "That is what quarantees their place on the ballot."

# **Mayor and Council** Support School Funding Fairness Formula

Both Mayor Kenneth Palmer and members of the Township Council have put their support behind Gov. Chris Christie's proposed school funding fairness formula, a plan that promises significant property tax relief for Manchester Township.

Manchester officials have contended for years that the current funding formula is inequitable, leaving our property owners to pay comparatively more than other municipalities to support the school district. The proposed changes to the funding formula would set a flat amount of aid for each student, regardless of district, saving property owners in Manchester an estimated average of \$600 based on the average home value of \$157,700.

"This would make a huge difference to Manchester in property tax relief. Passage of this single measure would provide the largest decrease in property taxes for every Manchester resident," said Mayor Palmer, who recently signed a pledge from the Governor's Office to support the Fairness Formula. He encourages all residents to reach out to lawmakers to advocate for its adoption.

In a further show of support, the Township Council at its July 11 meeting passed a resolution in favor of the proposed funding formula. "The new funding formula would provide substantial tax relief to Manchester's residents, including our senior citizens who survive on fixed incomes. A lower tax rate would also attract new homeowners, businesses and developers to our town, improving the economic environment for everyone," said Council President James A. Vaccaro Sr.

Currently, of the \$9.1 billion in aid to school districts throughout New Jersey, about \$5.1 billion goes to 31 districts, while the \$4 billion goes to the remaining 546 districts. Gov. Christie's proposal would reallocate funding so that each student, everywhere, will receive \$6,499. This would result in a 247 percent increase in school aid to Manchester Township.

# **Hit and Run Crash - Motorcycle Collides** with Vehicle, Rider Transported to **Trauma Center**

Manchester Twp NJ - Police are requesting the public's assistance in locating a vehicle that fled the scene of a serious hit and run crash that occurred on Monday, July 11, 2016.

At approximately 9:57 pm, on Monday, July 11th, officers from the Manchester Township Police responded to Commonwealth Boulevard at the intersection of Pemberton Street in the Pine Lake Park section of town to investigate a hit and run crash involving a motorcycle and an unknown vehicle. Upon arrival, officers observed a black, 2005 Honda Shadow motorcycle on its side in the west bound lane of Commonwealth Boulevard. The rider of the motorcycle, later identified as 20 year old, Noel M. LLera 3rd, of Manchester, was lying on the road in the intersection. The rider was reported to have initially lost consciousness but was awake and complaining of difficulty breathing and chest pain when officers arrived. The rider was transported to Community Medical Center in Toms River, evaluated and then transferred to Jersey Shore University Medical Center in Neptune. His current condition is not known. The other vehicle involved in the crash left the scene prior to police arrival according

The initial investigation revealed that the LLera was traveling west on Commonwealth Boulevard approaching the intersection of Pemberton Street when he broke aggressively to avoid a collision. This caused his motorcycle to fall over and strike the roadway. After striking the roadway, the motorcycle then slid on its side and impacted the unknown vehicle in the intersection, possibly striking it on the driver's side rear lower portion or on the undercarriage. The rider of the motorcycle was wearing a DOT approved helmet, gloves, and a padded riding jacket at the time of the crash.

Assisting at the scene were members of the Manchester Township Volunteer First Aid Squad, The Ridgeway

Fire Department, Ocean and the County Sheriff's Department Crime Scene Investigation (CSI) Unit. The investigation into the crash is still ongoing and anyone with information asked contact Patrolman Antonio Ellis of the Manchester **Police** Township Department's Traffic Safety Unit, at 732-657-2009 ext. 4401.

According to the Governor's Office, the Fairness Formula is "an equal per-pupil funding plan that would provide tax fairness for all residents

and better public education for every New Jersey student." The plan would not impact special education funding.

Currently, 14 percent of Manchester's school district funding comes from state aid, while some urban districts receive close to full funding. School taxes make up 54 percent of a homeowner's property tax bill, with 27 percent allotted to the municipality and 19 percent to the county.

into the Toms River by jumping over a cement bulkhead at the dead end of the street. A search was conducted with the assistance of the NJ State Police Aviation Unit as well as The Ocean County Sheriff's Department and the Ocean County

Prosecutors Office. The suspect was located an hour later by Tactical Response Officers and medical assistance was immediately administered. He was transported to a nearby medical facility for treatment by the Toms River EMS Service. No officers were injured in the incident.

The investigation will be led by the Ocean County Prosecutors Office and, as such, all media inquiries can be directed to their Public Information Division. More information will be released by them as it becomes available.

#### Stockton University Marine Field Station Starts Grant Work to Build Experimental Oyster Reef in Little Egg Harbor Bay

#### Stockton to Work with American Littoral Society and Parsons Mariculture to Measure the Restoration Potential of Wild-set Oysters Vs. a Cultured Disease-Resistant Strain

Galloway, N.J. – Stockton University's Marine Field Station in Port Republic, N.J. will establish an experimental oyster reef in Little Egg Harbor (LEH) Bay this summer and also continue the American Littoral Society's efforts on the Good Luck Point reef near Toms River. The overarching goal of the project is to measure the success of oyster restoration methods using both wild oysters and an aquaculture-spawned, disease-resistant strain.

New Jersey's oyster population has plummeted over the years due to pollution, disease and overharvest. A resurgence in oysters would provide ecosystem services such as improved water quality and fish habitat, as well as potential economic opportunities for the shellfish and aquaculture industries.

The Barnegat Bay Partnership, one of 28 congressionally designated estuary programs in the U.S., awarded Stockton \$52,000 in grant funding, which was then matched by Stockton and its project partners, fifth-generation oysterman Dale Parsons, of Parsons Seafood in Tuckerton, N.J., and the American Littoral Society (ALS). The majority of the grant is going toward the LEH Bay project with the rest supporting similar efforts at the Good Luck Point reef.

Steve Evert, manager of Stockton's Field Station, is the project leader. "There is a limited oyster population in the Little Egg Harbor Bay and not nearly enough oysters anywhere in Barnegat Bay to support a

July 15th, 2016 The Ocean County Gazette - www.ocgazette.news 17 self-recruiting effort. Without enough wild oysters, shelling alone will not work [to restore the oysters in Barnegat Bay]," Evert explained.

Oysters are filter-feeding invertebrates that colonize reefs. Larvae float in the water column until they adhere to a hard substrate, often other oyster shells, at which point they become spat (young, settled oysters). Adding shell to an ecosystem provides new oyster habitat, but only if there is a reasonably established population and larvae available during the summer spawn.

Parsons, an oyster and clam farmer, will use Rutgers Aquaculture Innovation Center-spawned oyster larvae to set spat on clean whelk shell in large tanks, a process known as remote setting. The oyster larvae were purchased from Rutgers University's AIC with a matched donation and logistical support. A similar effort was already made by the American Littoral Society in Ocean Gate for use on the Good Luck Point reef.

"Four million oyster larvae can fit into the palms of two hands," Evert said

"The funding provided by the Barnegat Bay Partnership is supporting not only the research and outreach efforts, but also helping to increase aquaculture opportunities for farmers like Parsons and restoration groups like ALS," explained Evert.

Once the oyster larvae set onto the whelk shells, which provide more surface area than oyster shells, the whelk shells will be transported to the reef site on Stockton's newest research vessel, the R/V Petrel.

The second half of the on-the-ground efforts entails transplanting wild oyster seed from the Mullica River oyster beds to the research reefs in LEH Bay and Toms River. Evert will work with Maxwell Shellfish, of Port Republic, to harvest wild oysters from their leases in the fall to transplant to the reef sites. Maxwell Shellfish also provided a match toward the project.

"The Mullica River-Great Bay (MRGB) oyster population is the only self-recruiting, fishable stock of oysters in any of New Jersey's coastal bays. It is a natural choice for possible restoration efforts, especially those within reasonable distances of the MRGB system," Evert said.

The biological and cost analysis data collected from these experimental reefs will help to inform larger restoration projects in the future.

"There is so much regional interest in oyster restoration, and we know that shelling will not jump-start restoration in Barnegat or Little Egg Harbor bays," Evert said.

"This leaves us with two options: remote-set aquaculture efforts or Mullica River transplants. The goal of this project is to assess the biological and cost metrics of each approach. The project itself will not restore oysters to self-recruiting levels in these areas, but it will answer some important questions needed to justify larger (more expensive) efforts," said Evert.



## Manfred Bockelmann's Portraits of Children Killed in Holocaust to be **Exhibited at Stockton University** International Artist's 'Drawing Against Oblivion' to be Shown Sept. 6-Nov. 13



Galloway, N.J. - "Drawing Against Oblivion," an exhibition of internationally r Manfred Bockelmann's large-scale charcoal portraits of children killed in the Holocaust, will be exhibited for the first time in the United States at \$tockton University's Art Gallery from Sept. 6-Nov. 13.

The powerful, moving show has received international attention, including its inaugural exhibit at the Leopold Museum in Vienna in 2013 and at the Bundestag, the German parliament in Berlin, to

commemorate the 70th anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz in 2015.

Bockelmann, who lives in Austria, has said: "I don't show martyrs, heaps of dead bodies or ill-treated faces deprived of their individuality and marked by hunger, disease and exhaustion. Rather, I show individuals who have to face their ordeals."

Over 50 portraits memorialize children and youths who were between the ages of 2 and 18 when they fell victim to Nazi terror.

Diethard Leopold, who curated the Viennese exhibit, said: "The portraits are based  $\phi$ n police shots taken by the authorities at the time - the Gestapo, the SS and the medical profession - after the children's deportation to hospitals and camps. They were already wearing the infamous broad-striped convicts' suits and had their heads shaven. Others, mainly Roma and Sinti [Gypsies], were asked to report to the authorities for a photo call. Eager to make a good impression, they were wearing their best clothes. While they didn't know what awaited them, their faces are all clearly marked by fear and uncertainty."

Leopold added, "Certainly the portraits are heartbreaking to behold, they leave one speechless and make one inclined to look away. And yet, when looking at them, these young people whose lives were taken, seem to come back to life through our remembrances. ... Bockelmann transforms inhuman distance into closeness."

The university will host two special events related to the exhibition on Wednesday, Oct. 26:

An exhibition panel discussion will be held at 2:30 p.m. in the lower art gallery,

with Bockelmann, Andrea Heyman, a Holocaust and Genocide Studies graduate student, Carol Rittner, Distinguished Professor Emerita of Holocaust and Genocide Studies, Elisa von Joeden-Forgey, assistant professor in Holocaust and Genocide Studies, and Marion Hussong, professor of Literature and The Carol Rittner Professor of Holocaust and Genocide Studies at Stockton, who is Bockelmann's niece. Kate Ogden, professor of Art History, will serve as moderator.

The award-winning film, "Drawing Against Oblivion," will be screened at 7-9:30 p.m. in the Campus Center Theatre. The event is free, but tickets are required. Call 609-652-9000 to reserve tickets.

The film, which documents Bockelmann's creation of the series of works by the same name, was made by Final Frame, an international film crew based in Munich, Germany. They shadowed Bockelmann for 18 months, capturing his visits to archives in the United States and at the Auschwitz concentration camp, where he came face-to-face with the children through photographs and records. The film also includes his 2014 visit at Stockton with Murray Kohn, a Holocaust survivor and retired faculty member who received a special portrait of his little sister from Bockelmann.

The film won "Best International Documentary" at the Garden State Film Festival, three gold medals at the 2015 New York Film Festivals and has received numerous international awards.

The free public screening will be followed by panel discussion with Bockelmann, Executive Producer David Kunac of Final Frame Productions, Director Bärbel Jacks, Hussong, and Adrienne Parvin, a Stockton alumna currently enrolled in the master's in Holocaust & Genocide Studies program. Christine Farina, professor of Communications and an award-winning filmmaker, will serve as moderator.

# AAUW's Tech Trek Offers Girls Immersion in Science, Technology, Engineering and Math in Camp at Stockton July 17-23

Galloway, N.J. - Sixty girls from throughout New Jersey will learn about Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) fields and meet female career role models in a hands-on residential camp here sponsored by the American Association of University Women (AAUW) and Stockton University from July 17-23.

"As AAUW New Jersey president, I believe in the power of projects like Tech Trek because they inspire our girls to dare to dream about the future and make it happen," said Carol Cohen. "I'm proud that Tech Trek continues our AAUW NJ tradition of encouraging girls' involvement in STEM through our programs such as Teentech and Tween Tech. New Jersey is the only state that hosts all three of these programs, and we keep the costs down to \$50 per camper for the entire week, based on generous contributions. The more girls we can prepare for higher paying STEM jobs, the closer we will come to ending the pay equity gap."

Studies have shown that girls initially interested in STEM fields tend not to pursue them after early adolescence. Yet there is a growing demand for jobs in those male-dominated fields, and the United States has a shortfall of qualified graduates to fill them.

The students, who will be entering eighth grade in the fall, will live on campus and participate in activities such as programming apps for tablets and smart phones, conducting chemistry and biology lab experiments, exploring cybersecurity online, building circuits, maneuvering a robot over an obstacle course, and collecting samples from Lake Fred to examine under a microscope.

On Wednesday, July 20, two field trips will focus on aviation. Twenty girls will be going to Philadelphia International Airport's air traffic control tower, and two other groups of 20 each will rotate through a day of drone flights and building and launching rockets on the Galloway campus.

"Stockton deeply values the action that AAUW has been taking to close the gender pay equity gap," said Dean Claudine Keenan of the School of Education, an AAUW member and one of the event's organizers. "Decades of research point to the reasons that adolescent girls turn away from pursuing STEM fields, where higher paying careers show the starkest gender imbalances."

"The Tech Trek camp model puts that research into action, providing girls with hands-on STEM experiences, led by women in these fields, at our state-of-the-art facilities, in our naturally beautiful, residential campus environment," Keenan said.

All campers will attend core classes during the week including:

Symantec Cyber Security: Learn how a computer works, how to code and finally how to hack like a hero - with LOTS of hands-on activities.

It's Electric! Learn how circuits work and creating your own with light-up name tags, flashlights and a circuit thank you card for the sponsors. Learn about women such as Edith Clarke, who made their mark in electrical engineering before anyone believed we could.

MIT Inventor Apps on Verizon Tablets: Use existing phone app templates to add one's own spin on coding apps. Learn the basics of app invention in an environment that MIT developed, and discover how apps are used on mobile phones and tablets.

1-2-3 Blast off to STEM: During this interactive and hands-on learning approach, actively participate in several different laboratory experiments understanding the how and why things work in various branches of science while integrating technology seamlessly within each step of our learning. Students will build rocket racers, create an apparatus to have the highest explosion with Coke and Mentos, walk across eggs, and much more.

#### Dynamic show by local photographer showcases New Jersey's red fox

TOMS RIVER – Vulpes Vulpes (Red Fox), a photography exhibit by Eric Sager, will be on exhibit in McConnell Gallery at the Toms River Branch of the Ocean County Library throughout the month of July.

Sager is a central New Jersey-based freelance photographer and artist. He studied Fine Arts and Film Photography at the University of the Arts in Philadelphia, PA. He primarily shoots weddings and other events, but in his free time he focuses on photographing wildlife in any New Jersey's many nature preserves.

This exhibit is a multi-year long journey in finding and photographing New Jersey's red fox. The portraits are printed on fine artist's watercolor paper, hand-mounted, matted and framed with reclaimed wood by Sager.

Sager says, "I wanted to give my audience the feeling of really being there with the foxes; to see the small, serene moments, to be down on the ground alongside them, to share a view of them otherwise unattainable."

November 2016: Lizzi Schippert - Focusing on classical techniques in printmaking (lithography and intaglio), figure and portrait drawing, collage, pochoir (a stencil technique), and painting, along with Japanese and Chinese calligraphy, Schippert has exhibited nationwide, from Manhattan to Hawaii, and in Sweden, Japan, and the Caribbean.

December 5 to December 22, 2016: Ann Hayes "Scene at the Shore" - A group show focusing on the landscape, landmarks, and features of the Jersey Shore featuring 11 artists exhibiting in diverse media. Hayes often works in watercolor, oil, and Giclée.

February 2017: Frank McGinley, Painter/Art Historian Painting most of his life, McGinley received his first award at the age of 13 in a contest held by New York City for students preparing to enter high school. McGinley's painting depicted the Battle of Wake Island where U.S. Marines were defeated in 1942. The painting is in the archives of the New York Metropolitan Museum of History.

McGinley's illustrated covers for a set of books covering the Holocaust (CIS Publishing Co., Lakewood) are in the Holocaust Museum in Washington, D.C.

Although Sheldon Nadelman's subjects were often overlooked, as well as, stepped over, his photographs often got much attention. An acclaimed book, Terminal Bar – A Photographic Record of New York's Most Notorious Watering Hole and a Sundance award winning short film documentary award, The Terminal Bar, have both resulted from his works. Even Martin Scorcese used the Terminal Bar in his film, Taxi Driver.

From Nadelman's vantage point as a bartender at the Terminal Bar at the corner of Eighth Avenue and West 41st. Street, he shot 2600 photographs with his \$85 Pentax. His works have been the subject of a New York Times article, whose headquarters, ironically, now stands on the former site of the bar. Taken from 1962 until 1981, his photographs have long been recognized as historically significant.

Along with the "sooty, sticky-floored life" images taken off the streets in front of the Terminal Bar, Nadelman is also displaying sensitive images of the World Trade Center, pre-9/11.
