E. PRESENTATION

DIRECTOR KELLY: "This one of our favorite annual events. This is the Ocean County Fire Prevention & Protection Association Poster Contest. We are going to make these presentations together, so if you'll give a little outline of exactly what we do every year."

ROBERT YAISER, TOMS RIVER FIRE PREVENTION BUREAU: "Each year, the New Jersey Division of Fire Safety, in an effort to promote fire safety throughout the State of New Jersey, develops and adopts a program for schools and they adopt a theme. This year's theme was 'Hear the Beep Where You Sleep'. And as a result of that, all the letters went out to every school in New Jersey - there are thousands of students involved in this - and they perform the artwork that relates to that message - 'Hear the Beep Where You Sleep'.

So the winners of the contest in Ocean County are here today - seven different divisions. And I'm happy to report that out of those seven different divisions, an hour ago I got a call that one of our seven people won the State Poster Contest!

So this is the third year in a row that Ocean County has taken a slot in the State Poster Contest. Bergen County, Essex County, Monmouth County - all 21 counties participate, but we grabbed the title three years in a row. And we wouldn't be able to do that if it wasn't for the support of the art teachers, the students, The Artists' Guild of Ocean County and the Freeholders. They support every one of our fire safety programs and that's why we're here today, because of their efforts. And that's why three years in a row we were able to take the 'brass ring', if you will.

I'm very proud of Julia winning that. And in addition to that, and I won't prolong it, ironically Julia's family was displaced from their home in April from a fire. Julia's awareness and having a working smoke detector in the home, prevented anyone from getting hurt. And they're not back in their home yet, but for Julia's efforts she is going to get awarded. The objective of this poster contest is to educate the public and that's exactly what transpired in this particular case. So we're happy to report that. We're going to bring them up one by one."

U. FREEHOLDER COMMENTS

At 4:21 PM, Freeholder Director Kelly received the following comments from members of the Board:

DIRECTOR KELLY: "We'll move on to Freeholder Comments starting with the Deputy Director, Freeholder Little."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. And for anyone who may be new today, including a lot of our great staff, one of the traditions that we do here is, as liaison to the Veterans Affairs Department, I receive a report on a constant basis on the successes of our National POW/MIA Accounting Agency. That agency is an arm of the United States Defense Department and their sole mission is to travel around the world and identify and bring home the remains of any of our Soldiers or Sailors or Airmen or Marine or Coast Guardsmen who have been killed or lost in combat and have never returned home. So we do that on a ongoing basis almost every meeting.

This week we have received notification of four American servicemen who had been lost since World War II and Korea and they have been brought home and buried with full military honors. Our tradition is we simply read their names and where they came from and their age and so forth.

US Navy Fireman 2nd Class James B. Boring who was 21. He was from Ohio. And I'll tell you how they were lost in a second. Navy Fireman 3rd Class Edwin C. Hopkins who was from Swanzey, New Hampshire. And Ensign, which is the first level of officer in the Navy for those who may not know, Ensign Lewis B. Pride, Jr. who was 23 at the time. He was from Kentucky. They were killed in action on December 7, 1941 and they went down in the USS Oklahoma at Pearl Harbor and their remains have now been recovered. The Oklahoma was hit with multiple torpedoes. It capsized and it has been buried in the sand and so forth at Pearl Harbor since December 7th (1941).

And also brought home is Army Sgt. 1st Class James P. Shunney of Providence Rhode Island who was killed in North Korea on November 2, 1950 and he was with Company 1, 3rd Battalion, 8th Cavalry Regiment of the United States, 1st Cavalry Division.

That is my report and we honor those soldiers who were lost decades ago and we thank them and their families for their service to our nation. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. Freeholder Haines?"

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "No comments."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Freeholder Vicari."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "Yes, Mr. Director, a couple of really great things happened last weekend. One was the Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst had an open house for two days. Last year they had 325,000 people that attended. I attended it also. It was unbelievable. This year we had 375,000 people there attending in those two days.

What it was is an Expo of the Air Force/Army/Navy/Marines as far as not only their aircraft, but their military vehicles and also some of the events they had. The military was very, very welcoming and they wanted to show us where our taxpayer dollars were spent. And to show our support and their support for an awareness to the Joint Base. So again, we commend the Joint Base. There are over 43,000 people that are employed at the Joint Base. It's very important to us.

I want to thank Dana Lancellotti and all the volunteers that put a tremendous amount of time and hours over there making sure it was a success. The 'Power in the Pines' Air Show was unbelievable. It's something you only see sometimes on TV, but it was something that they put on for the residents, especially some of the younger people of Ocean County, to encourage people to get involved in joining the Air Force and the Navy and some of the other areas. As we know, Freeholder Gerry Little's son is a pilot in the United States Navy.

Also, we prepare this weekend for the big weekend coming up in two weeks. Memorial Day Weekend is the beginning of our holiday. From Memorial Day Weekend until Labor Day, we had over \$4.6 billion that was made last year. So it's the backbone and the engine that drives the economy. 70,000 people are employed. 95% of all the businesses in Ocean County in the tourist industry are small businesses of three and four people - mom and dad businesses. So we encourage people not only to buy locally, but to use the businesses that we do have. Our County supports small businesses throughout Ocean County.

Today we had a major meeting with a member of the Barnegat Bay Partnership Estuary Program. It was with Dave McKeon. We reviewed what we were going to do as far as next year as far as our blueprints for protecting Barnegat Bay which is one of the 28 national estuaries in the United States of America. And as we reviewed all of that, I mentioned and they accepted that I'm going to focus in this year on one very important thing - Island Beach State Park. I'm glad the Mayor is here from Berkeley Township, Mr. Amato.

Tice's Shoal, even though it's a State responsibility and it's going to be a State responsibility, the debris that's in there is terrible. They cannot use Barnegat Bay as a landfill. There are thousands of bottles that are over there from visitors that come on boats. They can use the boats. So what we're going to do is to have a part of, and it was their (Barnegat Estuary Program) suggestion, of the Barnegat Bay Blitz (program) that takes place in June and do whatever is necessary to clean up the Barnegat Bay.

And something else, it's going to be basically the same program that we use in the Pinelands, and that is if you are in a boat and you throw debris, you break the law, not only will you get a ticket, but they're going to look at confiscating some of the boats that are out there to make an example because there is over, sometimes, 1000 boats at Tice's Shoal. It's very difficult to maintain. But, to make an example, it's the only way it's going to stop.

The County of Ocean spends of millions of dollars a year to keep clean our waterways. We purchased another pumpout boat. Now we have six, plus one in reserve. So they will all be operational. The meeting today with Dr. Stan Hales involved the EPA the Environmental Protection Agency, the DEP, the Barnegat Bay Citizens Advisory Board, Municipal and County agencies all working together. It's very detailed and what I'm going to do is sometime in the next week or so is to do a Press Release with Dave McKeon so that the residents of Ocean County know our support not only for Barnegat Bay, but to make sure our environment is clean and to make sure that the word goes out that it's not going to be tolerated as far as polluting our waterways throughout Ocean County.

The last item, for the last several days I received calls from a number of people where Route 35 is. When they say cost of \$368 million they were outraged. I was very upset. As you know, I made a number of comments in 2013 and 2014.

One suggestion they had is that when we do something in the County, we have a contingency plan, or I should say a program where we include things that could happen - to anticipate it. What I found out today and I'm going to do and I did some research before the meeting, is that if we do a County road, if we replace, and Mr. Ernst can correct me if I'm wrong, the utility company pays for the water lines, the electric lines, the gas lines. When they do a State road in the State of New Jersey, the State of New Jersey pays for it with taxpayers' money. So if they're going to do a road, why should we - the taxpayers of the State of New Jersey - pay for the utility lines to be replaced 100%, the water lines that are replaced and all the lines underground. So we're looking at that. And again, in my opinion, the utility companies that are profit-making organizations and their shareholders should pay their fair share of all improvements to the infrastructure in the utilities where they're going to make a profit for the next 75 years on what's done. Again, I supported the project (Route 35) and when it was done it was a good program, no question about it, but when you're talking about \$27 million per mile, they should be held accountable for it. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. That concludes the Freeholder comments."

V. **PUBLIC COMMENTS** - Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of **five (5)** minutes per speaker.

At 4:31 PM, Freeholder Director Kelly opened the meeting to receive the following comments from the public:

DIRECTOR KELLY: "We will now open to public comment. We ask that you limit your comments to five minutes and identify yourself by name and address - just your town is fine. So anyone who would like to address the Board at this time please raise your hand."

VINCENT CARABIN, CHESTERFIELD (BURLINGTON COUNTY): "I'm from Burlington County so I guess I'm a carpetbagger by coming here. The timing is good considering what Mr. Vicari just said about the pipelines. I attended a meeting and I don't know if any of you people were there in Freehold on April 25th or 27th. I'm not sure of the exact date. New Jersey Natural Gas was there for a hearing for the BPU. It was one of the saddest things you're ever going to see. There were people there that are looking at natural gas increases for their gas bill of \$20.00 to \$30.00 a month.

When you have a senior citizen that doesn't even pay taxes, can't even afford to pay taxes, get up there and say, 'I can't afford it.' A 24% increase is unconscionable. And I think I mentioned it somewhere, Mr. Vicari, about you're paying your Commissioners or your Executives over a million dollars. For what?! People are going to be hurting.

You talked about the small businesses here for the shore. That's going to be affected. There's a ripple effect because when utilities go up, those businesses get hurt too. They're going to have to pass on those costs. It's going to hurt you. And this area has had enough of a disaster over the years between (Superstorm) Sandy and everything else. So you don't really need this.

The 24% increase, I will tell you now, they're going to get it because it's a fixed game. You had Pinelands, there was a pipeline that the Commissioner was against. The Governor fired the Commissioner. So that pipeline is going through. You will never see a 4-1 vote or a 3-2 vote with the BPU. Never. It's going to be 5-0. It's a rigged game guys. They're going to get their 24% increase and you people have to fight it.

Let me take it a little further, I passed this out. I won't read it to you, but I will give you each a copy. We have Congressman - he's been pushing pipelines. Congressman MacArthur. He's been pushing to make it easier for pipelines to be built. The reason being, it will lower gas prices? I don't think so. But you have to understand, he is, out of 435 Congressmen, he is number one in investment in energy companies. He owns over million dollars in stock. He will profit from these pipelines. That's a reality. Nobody wants to talk about these things. You get these fancy brochures in the mail about how they're going to lower prices. No you're not! You're going to increase them 24%.

The people in Ocean County are going to pay for our nightmare in Chesterfield. They're putting a 30,000 horsepower compressor a mile from where I live. If that ever goes, it's over. Okay? They're going to pump natural gas at a rate of 700 pounds per square inch through a 30-in pipeline. That's insanity. Schools, homes, are a hundred feet away. FERC, which is the Federal Energy Resource Commission, has nothing to do with the Federal government. It's 100% financed by the energy companies. It's a fixed game, guys, you've got to fight because you guys are going to be effective. You're going to be paying for our nightmare.

So what I'm saying here today is please help us. You'll be helping yourselves. This is a problem we're having. And I passed out this flyer – it's not very nice, but it is only the beginning. I'll make sure you all get a copy. But, thank you for allowing me to speak."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Would you just do me one favor? Would you spell your last name?"

VINCENT CARABIN: "Carabin. First name, Vincent."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. Freeholder, do you want to comment?"

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "Listen, just so you know, we passed a strongly worded resolution opposing the 24%. It's totally outrageous, which we said. I sent a letter to the public hearing that was hand-delivered, I believe, or sent through the Administrator's Office to the Board of Public Utilities to oppose it. I have continuously asked for a representative on the Board of Public Utilities to be from this area – Ocean and Monmouth County. I spoke to the Freeholders in Monmouth County to join in one voice so we do have representation. But in my opinion, 24% - they're not going to get 24%. They're going to get 12% - 15%.

So you know what they're doing. I know what they're doing. It's very transparent, but it's up to the Board of Public Utilities and that is a process. So I believe that we did our part as much as necessary. We also worked with the Mayor of Berkeley Township, who is here today, as far as getting public awareness. People should be outraged.

In Ocean County a large percentage of our people are senior citizens and 24% is just unbearable. They're lucky to get their food on the table and pay their gas bill, never mind have a 24% increase in their rates."

VINCENT CARABIN: "Please let me be clear, this wasn't a criticism of anyone. However, I am criticizing the Congressman."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "I know. I have no problems with him."

VINCENT CARABIN: "Number one, he is making money from this. He's got a vested interest. He's never, ever come to Chesterfield or North Hanover to plead his case. He's never done that. Do you know why? He's afraid."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "I have to ask you to wrap up. Your five minutes are up."

VINCENT CARABIN: "Okay. Thank you. Again, no disrespect."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "We understand. You did a very good job. I want you to know one other thing because you might want to see the Clerk of the Board after the meeting. We did receive a response from the State Board of Public Utilities to the resolution of this Board concerning the NJNG proposed rate increase. And the Clerk of the Board, if you want that, you can see her after the meeting. She can get you a copy of their response."

VINCENT CARABIN: "Alright. Thank you very much."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Okay. Thank you. Anyone else like to address the Board at this time? Yes sir."

SAM FOSTER, BRICK: "I just have three quick comments on military issues. First of all, I want to thank Freeholder Vicari. I haven't been here for a while because I've been at work, but I did want to thank you for the letter that you wrote regarding the USS Pueblo because it informs a lot people about that issue. It happened in the '60s. I was a kid, I'm 55 years old so I remember when it happened. I remember people talking about it in school, but I was too young to really understand about it. But, it did bring of attention to an important issue which you are very right about. So I want to thank you about that.

The other thing is, I want to remind people, which I really don't have to, but we have Memorial Day coming up and D-Day coming up also. I don't know think we going to have another public Freeholder meeting before those two dates. I might be wrong about that, but I just want to say that I hope everybody gets out there and support our troops on those two dates....well, Memorial Day. D-Day, you know me, I call up vets, you know I like contact like that, but maybe not everybody does it that extreme.

I do want to thank Freeholder Vicari because a lot of people, especially younger people, they don't know about the USS Pueblo - the details of it. I remember watching the news with my grandfather. He was very patriotic. He was very.....my mother called him stubborn, and he was horrified by it and it's very sad what happened to our troops when they were captured. It's kind of like a parallel to what happened when Iran captured the Marines off the coast of Iran. Although they weren't tortured the way they were by the North Koreans. And now, with North Korea talking about miniaturizing nuclear weapons, it is a very dangerous part of the world and we should really pay very close attention to these upcoming holidays regarding our military and pay tribute to them. They've kept us safe all these years and they are very dedicated and I just wanted to say that."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "Sam, I appreciate that, I'll tell you why. Our family is a little bit more sensitive and I spoke to the Board of Freeholders about the Korean War. We have a member of our family, it's actually my wife's godfather, served in World War II. He wanted to do the right thing and joined the Marines again, served in the Korean War, and as he was leaving Korea coming home, the family had a party for him and everything else, and he was killed as he was getting on a plane. So instead of having the reception and party, (inaudible) and his body came home instead. So our family is a little more sensitive than most people when it comes to those missing in action and killed. He tried to do a good job serving in World War II and served in Korea and the last five minutes, I would say, if he was just five feet ahead, he would have been alive today."

SAM FOSTER: "I'm very sorry to hear that. But like I said, the Freeholders have always been very good with keeping us up-to-date with the military and keeping them in our thoughts because it is very important. I remember during Vietnam and I've said this at prior Freeholder meetings, I remember when I was in middle school kids would get into fist fights because some of their parents were opposed to the war. Some were in favor. I'm sure everybody has stories like that. But, it was terrible and at the time I was too young to understand the complexities of it. Even adults have trouble to be honest with you, now years later with General Wes Moreland and his autobiography admitting that he didn't think the war was winnable. But, I really shouldn't criticize like that. I don't want to get controversial here, but I do want to thank all of you for keeping us up-to-date with veterans affairs, especially Freeholder Vicari. Like I said, a lot of young people don't know the names USS Pueblo. So by bringing it to their attention, you bring an important part of our history and keep it in people's lives. So thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you Sam. Anyone else like to address the Board at this time?"

JOHN GEROW, PRINICPLE OFFICER, TEAMSTERS LOCAL 97, BELMAR: "The group behind, as you can see in the room, are representative of the 911 workforce and they are disenchanted with our progress as a union, on their behalf, to obtain a sizable raise that is consistent with what's being paid other 911 people throughout the State. The County, incidentally, in this location, I represented this group about 20-22 years ago. I know some of you, obviously, certainly I am familiar with Ms. Haines.

We are not looking to break the bank, but we are concerned about the thought process that you train these people, you hire them, you train them, they go to work and then they sit there and watch other communities pay more money to dispatchers that do less work than they do and we're wondering why we can catch up go beyond that. I'd like to ask you - I'm going to enter the negotiations on their behalf - so I'll do that at the proper time place, but we wanted to show our unification because of the issue. And I just want to say thank you for allowing us to do this today and you'll hear further from us in the future. Thank you very much."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "John, I do not interfere in, as you know, with the direct negotiations. But, I'd be happy to sit down with you and talk just philosophically about where we need to get to without talking direct numbers. I can't, as you understand because you are in the business, I can't do that. I can't interfere. I'm not allowed to. And I won't interfere with negotiations, but I think a legitimate discussion of where the County is, what some County's concerns are, and how it impacts everything and what we're going to get to.

I want you to know that I met today with both Keith Goetting and the County Administrator saying that while we can't do everything that they want, but we've got to do something a little bit better. We have to look at how to do that.

I will tell you that this dispatching service was one of the first obligations I had as a new Freeholder back in January of 1993 when we first bringing in the 911 service. And there was a discussion amongst the Board at that time whether we should support all 33 individual municipalities and having them do their own 911 or would we do individual contracts with each municipality for the County to do it and have them pay the County to do 911. It was my response to the Board and it's what we ended up doing that no that wouldn't be a good way to do it. That 911 ought to be county-wide. There's already a formula for paying that, it's called the County tax rate and the County ought to take over doing 911.

I think there are two towns in the County right now that didn't take part in that, although they do use us as a backup. Tuckerton and Little Egg have their own dispatch at this point. But almost every municipality uses 911 for fire and first aid and those types of things. Different towns participate at different levels. We've had a new town just recently contract with the County to do full dispatch. Now that's available to all 33 municipalities and it's a separate contract where they pay for that service. So there are some things that we've done.

I will tell you my own son is a dispatcher. So I kind of understand where these guys are saying we don't get paid as much as other towns. I'm not going to dispute that. There are other towns that are higher and we've lost a number of dispatchers because other towns pay higher. We train them, they leave and they go somewhere else. And we need to see what we can do short-term and long-term to do a better job of retaining very qualified, very professional dispatchers. That's important to the Sheriff. It's important to me. And I know it's important to them.

So I think that we can at least sit down and be reasonable with each other about where we are trying to get to and how are we going to get there because we are at odds right no. The offer that the County made has not been accepted by the 911 dispatchers and I don't want it to end there. I want further discussion, further negotiations and then we'll see where that goes. I can't promise anything today. I'm just saying that I am sensitive to what is being said."

JOHN GEROW: "What you are saying is very important us, quite frankly. I'd be happy to meet with you any time."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "So I would like to have that kind of a discussion with you, without getting into the details. You will go through our professionals and you're a professional representing them, and the details of the contract will be worked out and somewhere down the line we're going to come to some accommodation with each other. I don't know what that's going to be, but I'm certainly happy to sit down and talk to you."

JOHN GEROW: "Thank you. I appreciate the offer and you will be hearing from me. Thank you all."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. John, when the meeting is over I'll get you my card and you can call my secretary and she'll work out that."

JOHN GEROW: "Thank you very much."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Would anyone else like to address the Board at this time? Mr. Black."

GARY BLACK, JACKSON: "Boy am I getting old, it seems like we just had this discussion. I had no idea that that happens to be my union too. I had no clue and actually I was surprised when they came here. I remember actually coming up to this Board once quite a few years ago, actually discussing a little about the 911 operators.

As you know, I've come up here and actually even attacked a couple of unions that have come up. Usually (inaudible) and I have to give Local 97 credit, they came up today and in a reasonable way of doing it. You see too many times some unions play cheap politics right at election some song and dance on and I remember how much fun I was having when they were talking about, 'Oh, we're only talking about \$20.00 a month.' And I just told them, 'Okay, lower your dues \$20.00 a month and cut out your political advertising and balance your budget and help the workers.' They weren't too happy with me and I'm kind of glad of that.

But, I've got to give these guys credit. This was very more professional and add to the fact they're backing (inaudible). Yes, I work. I drive a garbage truck. You can't compare that in any way, shape or form to what these guys do. I couldn't imagine being on the phone and having somebody calling up that the person they spent their lives with is not breathing. Or how do you talk to a child who's mommy isn't waking up? Or you could be the direct eyes and ears to a phone caller of an officer coming on to a situation and may help save life. This is a far different thing than.....again, I can't compare what I do to what they do and I couldn't do their job.

But, one point that had been made is the taxpayers here and I am also a taxpayer. I don't want to pay to pay everybody else's town. We throw enough money into north Jersey and I'm damn sick and tired of our dollars going to north Jersey. Let's keep it here. Let's train our people. Let's make it so they can stay here. It's common sense.

This has been the only meeting that I've actually come up and spoke for, again, you remember when I was with the

other ones when I played politics. And guys like myself don't deserve that. But today these guys deserve what I said here today. I'd like to thank the 911 operators. I know they've helped me out a couple of times personally. So I honor them and I'm honored to speak for them. And may this is one time, well not really, nobody's ego needs to be stroked. There's no adversity here. It's just something that has to get worked out. That's all. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you Gary. Anyone else like to address the Board at this time? Okay. Seeing no further public comment, I'll close the public session and ask for a motion to adjourn."
