FREEHOLDER VICARI: "Mr. Director, if I may, there are several residents that have businesses on (Routes) 166, 37 and Main Street that would like to speak at the end during the public session. U. FREEHOLDER COMMENTS

At 4:11 PM, Freeholder Director Little received the following comments from members of the Board:

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Today, I would like to start with Freeholder Kelly."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Thank you. I appreciate, Mr. Director, the Moment of Silence for Barbara Bush. Like many of you, I heard about her death last night while watching some news channels and it struck me while reviewing her life the difference in the civility of the 1980s when George Bush was President compared to the last couple of administrations and the lack of political civility.

Barbara Bush was a genteel lady and her husband was a gentleman President. And there were many political disputes at the time, but they were done so in such a more professional way and without animosity. And to watch last night the life Barbara Bush and how the Bush's lived their life, raised their children and served their country was just a real reminder of where we should try to get back to today.

And we will all miss Barbara Bush. We certainly wish President Bush and President Bush, both her husband and her son, and her whole family the very best and certainly pray for the repose of Barbara Bush for her long-term health in heaven. Thank you again for the Moment of Silence at the beginning of this meeting and thank you for allowing me to talk."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Thank you, Freeholder Kelly, and for your very poignant comments about Barbara Bush. Freeholder Vicari?"

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "No comments at this time."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Freeholder Haines?"

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "Thank you Mr. Director. I just also want to talk about Barbara Bush. I remember the first time I met Barbara Bush when her husband and Ronald Reagan were running in 1980. I remember meeting her

at Woodlake Country Club. And she had her fake pearls on and she was a dynamic, down-to-earth individual. You would think she was, as everyone looked at her as, your grandmother, because she was just that kind of person.

That was 1980 the first time I ever met her and she went from table to table introducing herself and she was really, really a true, true inspiration to how people should really be - as a woman should be - because she really set a very good impression with me.

And, of course, they had their trials and tribulations in their family losing their daughter to Leukemia at a young age and things like that. I mean, the two of them had a very, very long life together, President H.W. Bush and Barbara. And they are the epitome of how really a family should be because they were true Americans that really put America first in all the things they did in life. My deepest sympathy goes out to the Bush family and give them hope and strength in getting through these next few days. I'm sure it's going to be very rough. And as time goes on it will still be rough, but they have their memories of their mother and their wife. It's very tough to lose a loved one. And I know America itself is definitely right now missing Barbara Bush and all that she did for us and have the same sympathy that we all here have in Ocean County. Thank you."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Thank you Freeholder Haines. Freeholder Deputy Director John Bartlett."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "Freeholder Haines, I think your comments were most appropriate and well-put as well as Freeholder Kelly because I think we all feel the same way and we express those deepest expressions with great sincerity and great depth.

I would like to talk about something a little different that has me somewhat disturbed. I think this is probably an appropriate time to publicly address it from this podium. This is the Ocean County Board of Chosen Freeholders. It has been since 1850. I remember celebrating our sesquicentennial 18 years ago in the year 2000 and the thousand-page book that Polly Miller put together for the Board of Freeholders and the people of Ocean County.

It pains me to think that the State Senate has before it a bill which would change the name of all Boards of Chosen Freeholders in New Jersey to the Board of Commissioners. Now I can't think of and I don't know a nice way to say this, so I'm not going to try, I can't think of a more stupid idea. I looked through in Ocean County how many Commissions we have and in the county, itself, has created about 12 Commissions, all of which have Commissioners. There have to be in County government alone, right now, well over 100 Commissioners. So the term is one of the most overused terms in American governance today.

If we talk about the municipalities, there are municipalities that have a commission-form of government. Gerry was a Commissioner in Long Beach Township which has a commission-form of government. Beach Haven is a commission-form of government. So that the people in that municipal government are Commissioners. The gentle lady to my left, okay, was the Commissioner of the Lottery Commission. The term is used for the Governor's cabinet and they are all Commissioners. The Commissioner of DEP and on and on and on. The Pinelands Commission...I mean, the State is rife with commissions and commissioners. At least if you're going to come up with a new name, come up with something that makes some sense.

But what is wrong with the term Freeholder? Again, it's been used in New Jersey since colonial times. I think New Jersey, as one of the 13 original states, ought to be proud of its colonial history. And what the State Legislature is saying is, 'Well there are parts we don't like and therefore we want to wipe out that history. It seems to me that we are in a frenzy in this country right now to tear down statues, to tear down monuments, to tear down things that perhaps had pieces of them that might not be appropriate today, but were appropriate in their time. But to suggest that the office of Freeholder, that the term Freeholder, one that I have proudly held for 38 years – longer than any other person in New Jersey at this point in time – is in some way sexist or is in some way racist is downright insulting. It makes no sense and it certainly makes no sense to the public to change the name of the Ocean County Board, or every other County Board of Chosen Freeholders, to repaint all trucks, to change all signs, to change all stationery, to change everything to do with County government, just because someone thinks 'well that name is archaic and old-fashioned'.

I suppose most of the English language is. That's why we speak it. And someone said to me, and this is hard to believe, but that in Monmouth County some people believe that they can't vote for Freeholder because it has something to do with Freehold! And I suggested, 'Well, everyone gets a sample ballot and in every year on that sample ballot – every year – there is a Freeholder elected and it says vote for one or vote for two – and that comes to you personally'. So an argument like that is just insane. It is looking for reasons to be politically correct. It is looking for reasons to tear down the past, to make it almost sound like the past doesn't count.

And I want to end with this, this County and me personally are very proud right now to be commemorating the 100th Anniversary of the Great War which did in fact shape the rest of time for there and after. Our troubles in the Middle East today stem out of the First World War. And this County did its best to commemorate that, when war was declared, by decorating the front of our Courthouse. We will do so in May by planting a tulip tree because that used to grow in front of the Courthouse. And why do we do these things? We do these things because we honor history, because we honor the past. The way we live today wasn't invented yesterday. It was invented many, many years ago. And through time and through thousands of years, we have hopefully improved upon that. Sometimes the changes have not been improvements, but things do change and move. But that does not mean you throw away the past. And that to me is what bothers me the most about what is before the State Senate and has passed in an amended form and will be up for a final vote later on. And I would like the Board to consider, not today, but would like the Board to consider joining some of our fellow counties in passing a formal resolution objecting to the change in our names. I want to tell you, I've been a Freeholder for a long time and I intend to stay one for a long time. I don't care

what someone else wants to call me. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Well said Freeholder. And well said as a history professor. And I don't want to jump into this in great detail, but New Jersey has a lot of problems. We have a pension system that they say is bankrupt. Our State has had what 11 or 12 bond rating declines? Education funding is a mess. None of the schools are getting education funds. Our higher education, they're under-funding that by tremendous amounts. They don't fund Vocational Schools. Our roads and bridges around the state are falling apart, except here in our County system and other county systems. And so the State is wasting time on doing something which is totally superfluous, will not address the real issues. It refocuses attention from the real issues to something that's irrelevant.

So, in any event, thank you very much Freeholder for your thoughts and I'm sure the Board will consider this in the weeks ahead. Thank you.

And I would just like to add to everyone's, all four Freeholders, comments about (Barbara Bush), and especially of course Freeholder Haines that actually met...I don't know if anyone else did. Did you meet her when she was here? I did not at the time. She certainly had a lot of grace and a lot of dignity. That's the way I would like to remember her. She was a lady of grace and always well-spoken. She could give very strong words and tough words, but she was never sarcastic or name-calling. So we will miss her as a very distinguished and graceful First Lady as we have some others that are that way too.

So with that, I would like to add very quickly and it's sort of off-topic. But we talk a lot about the flu problem that we had here in Ocean County this year and I wanted to report that we recently, beginning in April, the State dropped us to instead of high intensity flu activity, we are now moderate. And we have actually had 1,903 confirmed flu cases and probably hundreds of thousands that were never officially diagnosed. But the State has 25,000 confirmed cases so far. But we're at 1,903 confirmed. And we had, believe it or not, our Health Department – one of our health officers is in the back – we held 185 flu clinics and we administered almost 2,900 flu vaccines this year. So it was a very active year and we're planning and already in the works for next year so that we can be prepared for whatever comes our way next winter. It still seems like it's winter outside anyway, but let's hope we get a little mild weather here pretty soon. It is the middle of April. Actually it is April 18th and we are now in the open public meeting portion of this meeting."

V. PUBLIC COMMENTS - Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of five (5) minutes per speaker.

At 4:25 PM, Freeholder Director Little opened the meeting to receive comments from members of the public:

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Anyone who wishes to speak on any topic is certainly welcome and we ask that you come to the microphone and give us your name and address in the event that we might need to contact you and please follow our policy, our long-standing policy, of limiting your comment to about five minutes. We're pretty liberal with that, but if you get a little bit over...most people can say what they have to say in five minutes except some of us who go on and on and on."

ANNIE GAUTHIER, SHUT UP AND EAT RESTAURANT, 804 MAIN STREET, TOMS RIVER: "Thank you Freeholders. I am the owner of Shut Up and Eat. I'm here because of the road work that has been done in front of my restaurant. On Monday, I closed my business for the first time in 13 years. I'm closed four days a year — Christmas, Easter and Thanksgiving only. The road department has put me out of business on Monday. Tuesday I closed early. Today I closed early.

On Monday I called the Governor's Office, I called the DOT, I called the Toms River Police Department and I called the Mayor's Office and the Asbury Park Press. Toms River Police sent a wonderful gentleman down to take care of it, which did not do anything because it is a State problem and not a Toms River problem. Asbury Park Press came down. I sent them pictures and they wrote a wonderful article. I still have this much of a driveway (gestures). I am across from a school whose buses come in and out. Now, they have to go on the other side. There is no one there directing traffic. The people go to the right, you could get hurt if you go to the left. Thank God no one has gotten hurt. I don't know how long this going to be.

A year ago today, I was down 20% due to the same work in front of my restaurant. Now I'm down further. Last year they took down two trees in front of the restaurant that the road company or whoever was doing it destroyed them. Then someone had to come and rip out the trees that had been there for many years. I'm getting more and more aggravated. I'm aggravated that the Mayor's Office didn't call me back. Not that he has anything to do with it, but he could have come down and shook my hand like this gentleman did today (gestures to Freeholder Vicari). No one from the Township has come to say I'm sorry, I can't do anything, or just say nothing, but show up! Nothing from the DOT. The Governor's office was very nice to me. It was like free therapy. They told me nothing. I just babbled like I'm doing now.

I don't know if any of you can help me. I open every day for business. I sell eggs. I'm not a million dollar company. I'm not looking to be a millionaire. But I would like to stay in business. Good night Freeholders."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Thank you. We want you to stay in business too. Freeholder Vicari wants to say something."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "If I just may say one thing before you leave. I know you have to get back to your business and it's very difficult for you."

ANNIE GAUTHIER: "No, I want to go home."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "I know you want to go home. You're tired. But it's not just your problem, it's all our problem. I went there today and I was very sympathetic. My dad had a small business. I know what you do. You work every single day."

ANNIE GAUTHIER: "And I am not giving up. I will continue to make phone calls. I will continue to keep my mouth open. If I have to be out there in my pajamas directing traffic, I will be out there. I am not going to let this beat me! And I wish whoever is out here with the same problem, I wish you all a lot of luck because I don't see this going anywhere soon."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "I am trying my best with the Board of Freeholders. We passed a resolution today. I've been in touch with Senator Holzapfel, Brian Kubiel from the (Toms River) Council and we spent a long time. As you know, I called the Governor's Office again before the meeting because I anticipated that some people would come today because of the numerous calls.

Going back to the last meeting, there were a number of people that came. We've had a number of people calling the Governor's Office. There were letters from the Business Advisory Board and Downtown has complained about it. The Tourism Advisory Board also met last week and is very concerned because it has an impact on 8 different towns. Tourism is very important to us. It's \$4.7 billion. But just as important is the safety of the residents and commuters every day, they go through the same thing. It's the tourism, the traffic safety, all the small businesses.

Last week we counted 85 different small businesses. Now it is over 100. Even the car industry is complaining — Lester Glenn. People don't want to go and test drive the cars. They patch the holes on 37 and when they come out they hit the cars and cracks the windshields. They're having major problems. But we want you to know that we're going to do everything possible."

ANNIE GAUTHIER: "If you came in this morning for two eggs because you couldn't get in there yesterday because of the parking lot, you're not going to have four eggs this morning. I am not going to regroup what has been lost. I am not going to be able to regroup. So again, I thank all of you Freeholders. Thank you for listening."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "We will do more than listen because we were told last week by the Administrator that it is not going to increase the capacity of the cars making the turn so, therefore, it's going to be \$12 million..."

ANNIE GAUTHIER: "To make it look pretty."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "If we knew that, we would have closed the road over a weekend and resurfaced it for \$800,000.00 and you would have never lost business for three years. It's putting a lot of people out of business."

ANNIE GAUTHIER: "Not me. I'm not going anywhere! Oh, hell no, I'm not going anywhere. Again, Joe, thanks a lot."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Before you go, I just have to say this. We just talked about Barbara Bush and how blunt and straight she was, but she had nothing over you. (laughter)

Number two, I always wondered..."

ANNIE GAUTHIER: "Sir, I'm being polite."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "I always wondered where the name came from for your restaurant, 'Shut Up and Eat', now I see. (laughter) Some people call that 'mom's'. You just changed that a little bit.

But I want you to know one thing, seriously now, besides the resolutions that we're sending and the phone calls, our County Engineer has met face to face with the project engineer at that project to let him know."

ANNIE GAUTHIER: "The guy with the green shirt that says 'I'm sorry it's not my job'."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "He didn't tell us it wasn't his job, but we did let him know just how dissatisfied this County is with what's going on and we did get him to at least give us a timeline of what would be done and when. And if you want to, tomorrow call the County Engineer's office and ask for John Ernst."

ANNIE GAUTHIER: "I don't want to bother him."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "You're not bothering him. He's right here. He is a great guy and he could go over at least with you what their timeline is. But we are working very hard on this in a number of different ways including face to face meetings with the people who are in charge right here on-site. So it's important to go through the Governor's Office, we're doing that also."

ANNIE GAUTHIER: "I have him on speed dial. I can call him on the way home."

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "Before you leave, I just want to say one thing. You mentioned about the Mayor and the reason why he didn't come and see you, I think he's home now recuperating. He had hip surgery at the beginning of

the week. But I will make sure, I'm going to call him to let him know."

ANNIE GAUTHIER: "It's not just today. It's been since this has started. I have nothing against the Mayor. I have nothing against anybody in this room or the Town Council. I've been back and forth through the Town Council for years. I'm sure they all know who I am."

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "I've been to your place to eat, so yes, I know where you are."

ANNIE GAUTHIER: "Thank you. But just a little bit from the gentleman who runs our town would be like a pat on the back."

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "I agree. I will call him and let him know."

ANNIE GAUTHIER: "If he's going to come tomorrow, bring coffee."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Okay, who would like to be next? Yes sir."

RYAN BLUMENTHAL, CORRINE JEWELERS, 917 NORTH MAIN STREET, TOMS RIVER: "I share the frustration of that lady there, along with all of my friends that own businesses up and down that road. Some of them couldn't be here today and I said I would take a drive over and express that to you all.

About two years ago our sidewalks were ripped up in front of the jewelry store. And if you were to tell me that today that I would be standing here with the road project not even close to being done, that we're possibly another year out, another 18 months out, I just wouldn't believe you.

What we continue to be told is that, 'Well this is DOT. This is State of New Jersey.' But certainly the community that this is happening in should have some sort of influence on the way it's executed because we're the ones that get affected – the businesses and the people that drive up and down the road. So I refuse to believe that there isn't some sort of pragmatic approach to what we can do as a community to get this moving along a little faster.

So I'm here today to say that I will do whatever it is within my power to do that, along with the other business owners along that street. And I would ask all of you to look out for our business community on that road. There isn't a month that goes by, and I know that it's not just my business, but the car wash next door, Mr. D'Onofrio across the street, that we are involved in some sort of community activity. We donate our time, our money, our jewelry in my case, to everything we could do to help make our community better. And what we would ask of you is to fight on our behalf.

One of the biggest frustrations I can share with you in this massive project is that, and I have a front window that I look out of every day, and I can see nobody working. And it goes a week or two and no one is there! And for the life of me, I can't understand how that is possible.

Businesses can take only so much as you all know. And I consider myself a reasonable person. I know if there is a road project in front of your place, and you're in business long enough, you know something like that may happen. What isn't reasonable is the length of time. Businesses can only take so much. They can only withstand so much before there are dire consequences to it.

So thank you for asking us to speak today. But I would thank you even more if we stay on top of this and we actually do something together. So please hold their feet to the fire, so to speak. Thank you."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Thank you very much."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Yes, Freeholder."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "You know your family has been in business since before I even moved to Ocean County and they go way back as far as not only being very generous, but they put a lot into Toms River and Ocean County. I know some of the problems you've been having and it's not only you, it's more than 85 people right now, not only the car wash, Mrs. Schuster and a few of the others. And we have decided to be more vocal about this particular situation. We're not going to fight Democrats or Republicans, we want the job done.

If this was a private contract it would have been done in 6 months or less time. You know that and I know that. Part of what I've been told by Mr. D'Onofrio is that they do one section at a time – one piece. They put the curb in, a couple weeks later they put the wall in, whatever, he knew the details. In fact when I spoke to him last month, the way they're doing this is what is creating a problem for us. And what we want you to know is that we're going to work as far as we can with what Freeholder Kelly said as far as the Governor's Office, but enough hasn't been done. And I'll be honest with you, I should have probably been doing this maybe more months ago. But it kept on escalating and escalating.

The system in the State of New Jersey is broken. We are going to get it fixed. It takes a long time. And sometimes people are afraid to speak out. I'll be honest with you, I'm not, because of retaliation from different people in State government. It flows down. You mentioned before the meeting, I spoke to several people. We want something done. And a lot of the business people mentioned something that I'm thinking about and I don't know if it can be done as far as you've been losing business for over one year. What's the State going to do to compensate? They're not going to

give you money, but perhaps talking to maybe Senator Holzapfel or some of the other people, they could make that an urban enterprise zone, so to speak. Because to make up for the damages you would need, as you mentioned when I spoke to you before, 50% of the sales tax. Maybe that would be an incentive. I know people are losing up to 50%-60% of their business over there. I bet it's about 100 people now and it's not getting better. It's not just (Route) 166 and Route 9. It goes from (Exit) 82, as you spoke at the Tourism Advisory Board, to the bridge! And over the bridge! So it's really almost 2 miles of mismanagement by the State of New Jersey and something has to be done. The people are on the verge of going out, as you probably know, like the lady that just left, she may lose her business. But she's going to hang in there. You're hanging in there because of the fact that you're proud, that's a family named business.

There are a lot of people that didn't come today and they don't have to come because we will, but I think it's more important that you put on public record. Yesterday several people said basically the same thing. It's a horror story. It's a nightmare for many of them. We couldn't do anything to stop the Superstorm, but we dealt with it. In your situation, it's manageable and it should have changed it and it's because people have to get into one room.

When this first happened, I'll be honest with you, I did what many of us do, so I called the gas company in. I spoke to them. And they said, no it's not our problem. And I said, well, they did it many months ago. I called JCP&L. I said, are you crazy? So I called all the utilities and all of them said, well let's not point the finger. And it all comes down to one issue. It's the State of New Jersey has to do their job. And they have to do a better job.

Now, not only do we want to see a noticeable difference by Memorial Day, we want to see the place cleaned up. We want people to take pride in what they're doing just like yourselves and the people in their business. I heard horror stories over the last several weeks as far as people not being able to pay their mortgage because of the money they're losing. And they told me what they're making a day versus what it was. It's embarrassing. They can no longer hold on to their businesses. It's a hardship created by bad government of the State of New Jersey that has to change. So again, I am not blaming the Governor, Phil Murphy. I told him that about an hour ago. But what we want to do is we want to see some change. You can point fingers at TTF and everything else like that, but it's a problem for you. We want to fix that problem as soon as we can. I thank you for coming and the contributions your family has made over the years to Toms River."

RYAN BLUMENTHAL: "Thank you all."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Blumenthal."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "And you know what's interesting? They all have to get back to work."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Anyone else on this subject? Route 166 and 37? Ok, now we'll move to other subjects. Who else would like to speak? Mr. Black."

GARY BLACK, JACKSON: "One brief thing about what's going on with (Route) 37 there, it's almost getting to the point of taking longer to do that little bit than they did to do the original dualization. I lived here then. I saw it. It was started in '67 and by '69 it was done. That whole bit. And they're still here. Maybe they ought to shut up and fix the road.

Also, with now they want to change the name of Freeholders. I would like to thank the State of New Jersey for reminding us why they print directions on the back of shampoo, for being that dumb.

Also this is beginning of the 'Violence Against Women Month'. As you know since I have talked about it a lot over the years. You know my position that I would like to see life-imprisonment for violent rape and rape of children. Instead of 'Megan's Law' or notifying people of when they get out is not letting them out. It's a better idea. They can't do it any more if they are not out except in Club Avenel where they have 'family day' and there have been attacks there. What a shock. Again, that direction on shampoo thing.

The other part that's getting to me recently, and rape cases and things like that over the years, there have also been over the past couple of decades, in eroding a woman's rights is the rape shield law is pretty much gone. You're seeing next to nothing as far as sentences handed out and when they do, they get reduced to next to nothing. But recently, I don't know what's going on with these feminist groups. They're embracing Sharia. Are they nuts? Has anybody bothered to read the Quran? Something I've been doing while I've been away.

A woman is considered half that of a man. If a woman is not wearing a burqa, in fact I believe it's written that reason they came out with a burqa was for a woman to wear so she could be known and not abused, that's actually a direct quote from the Quran. They believe that it's okay to rape women if they are not dressed in a burqa and towels and all that crap.

I don't know if you've been following what's been going on in Europe. In England you have the 'rape gangs'. It's actually called the 'rape game'. If you go ever want to go online google Anni Cyrus. She's a survivor from Iran, the Islamic Republic of Iran. She grew up and was able to escape. She grew up in the system.

They can marry young girls as young as 9! At 9 you're considered an adult. This is in the Quran. Get a copy and read it. Not the one that begins with 'K', the one that begins with 'Qu'. The 'K' one is a piece of garbage. It's all in there. This is not Islamophobia, which I think everybody should have, but this is what's in there. I know you're big on history. I know you've read 'Mein Kampf'. You know how 'Mein Kampf' was Hitler's plan to take over the world? Well, the Quran is their version of 'Mein Kampf'."

"No." (anonymous from the audience)

GARY BLACK: "Yes it is. Read it."

"I do not..." (anonymous from the audience)

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Sir, you may speak if you wish, but let Mr. Black continue and then, if you want, you can comment. But we don't do that back and forth from the audience. Thank you."

GARY BLACK: "Yes, it actually shows that a mosque is a sign of a conquering an area. All of it. You just have to read it. Maybe I'll start bringing copies in if I can get small, inexpensive copies so you can all read it. But if this continues and we let these so-called refugees come over and take over our country like what's happening in Europe, it's not going to be safe to be a woman here at all. And the feminist groups are the ones who ought to start waking up and changing their minds and not hang around with (inaudible). Look what's going on. You think it's bad now? It's nothing compared to what it's going to be. Thank you."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Black. Would anyone else like to speak? Seeing no one wishing to speak, we'll close the public portion and ask for a motion to close the meeting."

ORDINANCE #2018-4

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A PROJECT CONSISTING OF THE RECONSTRUCTION AND RESURFACING OF CERTAIN COUNTY ROADS, ALL LOCATED IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND APPROPRIATING \$3,000,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$2,850,000 IN BONDS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN TO FINANCE THE SAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING) AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The following is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the County of Ocean as general improvements, a project consisting of the reconstruction and resurfacing of certain county roads, all in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, in accordance with plans and specifications on file in the Ocean County Engineering Department, including all else necessary therefor and incidental thereto.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared that the improvements or purposes, the estimated cost of the improvements and appropriation therefor, down payment and estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes authorized are as follows:

\$2,850,000

SECTION 3. There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$3,000,000, including the sum of \$150,000 as the down payment, for the improvements or purposes described in Section 1 hereof as required by the Local Bond Law. The down payment has been made available by virtue of provision in the Capital Improvement Fund of the County of Ocean in one or more previously adopted budgets.

SECTION 4. There is hereby authorized the issuance of negotiable bonds in an aggregate principal amount of \$2,850,000 to finance part of the cost of the purposes stated in Section 1 hereof. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding the limit authorized by law, and the maturities, method of sale and other details thereof shall be determined by subsequent resolutions to be adopted in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 5. In order to temporarily finance the purposes provided for in Section 1 hereof, there is hereby authorized the issuance of bond anticipation notes of said County in an aggregate principal amount of \$2,850,000. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the County Comptroller; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond

anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and shall be in such form as may be determined by the

County Comptroller. The County Comptroller shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued

pursuant to this Ordinance, and the County Comptroller's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence

as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the

provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8.1. The County Comptroller is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes

from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of

payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The County

Comptroller is directed to report in writing to the Board of Chosen Freeholders at the meeting next succeeding

the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this Ordinance is made. Such report must include

the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and

the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 6. The County reasonably expects to commence acquisition and/or construction of the

improvements described in Section 1 hereof, and to advance all or a portion of the costs in respect thereof,

prior to the issuance of bonds or notes hereunder. To the extent such costs are advanced, the County further

reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this

bond ordinance, in an aggregate amount not to exceed the amount of bonds or notes authorized in Section 2

hereof. This bond ordinance is intended to be a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation

Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 7. Any grant monies received for the purposes described in Section 1 hereof, shall be

applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the obligations issued

pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be

reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

SECTION 8. The amount of the proceeds of the obligations authorized by this Ordinance which

may be used for the payment of interest on such obligations, architects' fees, accounting, engineering and

inspection costs, legal expenses, and other items as provided in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 shall not exceed the sum of

\$600,000.

SECTION 9. The Capital Budget of the County of Ocean is hereby amended to conform with the

provisions of this Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. In the event of any such

inconsistency and amendment, the resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full

detail of the amended Capital Budget and Capital Program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local

Government Services is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders and is available there for

public inspection.

SECTION 10. It is hereby found, determined and declared as follows:

A. The improvements or purposes described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance are not current

expenses. They are improvements or purposes the County may lawfully undertake as general improvements,

and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property benefitted thereby.

B. The average period of usefulness of the improvements for which the obligations authorized by

this Ordinance are to be issued is ten (10) years.

C. The supplemental debt statement provided for in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-10 was duly filed in the

Office of the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders prior to the passage of this Ordinance on first reading,

and a complete executed duplicate of such supplemental debt statement has been filed in the office of the

Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of

New Jersey, and such supplemental debt statement shows that the gross debt of the County as defined in

N.J.S.A. 40A:2-43 is increased by this Ordinance by \$2,850,000 and the obligations authorized by this

Ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

SECTION 11. In the event the monies set forth above for any purpose is not necessary for said

purposes, then such monies shall be for the completion of any of the other purposes provided for in this

Ordinance.

SECTION 12. The full faith and credit of the County of Ocean shall be pledged to the payment of

the principal of and interest on the bonds and notes authorized by this Ordinance, and as long as any of said

bonds or notes are outstanding, an appropriation shall be included in each annual budget of the County

hereafter adopted in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds or notes maturing

in each year. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the County, and the County shall be

obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the County for the payment of the

obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

SECTION 13. After passage upon first reading of this Ordinance, the Clerk of the Board of

Chosen Freeholders is hereby directed to publish the full text of the Ordinance, together with the notice set

forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF PENDING ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and

corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-19, at least seven days prior to the

date set for public hearing and further consideration for final passage (which date shall be at least ten days after

introduction and first reading). The Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders is further directed to comply

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING) AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The following is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the County of Ocean as general improvements, a project consisting of the design, permitting, development and construction of the Western County Facility located in Manchester Township, in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, including all else necessary therefor or incidental thereto.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared that the improvements or purposes, the estimated cost of the improvements and appropriation therefor, down payment and estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes authorized are as follows:

SECTION 3. There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$6,000,000, including the sum of \$300,000 as the down payment, for the improvements or purposes described in Section 1 hereof as required by the Local Bond Law. The down payment has been made available by virtue of provision in the Capital Improvement Fund of the County of Ocean in one or more previously adopted budgets.

SECTION 4. There is hereby authorized the issuance of negotiable bonds in an aggregate principal amount of \$5,700,000 to finance part of the cost of the purposes stated in Section 1 hereof. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding the limit authorized by law, and the maturities, method of sale and other details thereof shall be determined by subsequent resolutions to be adopted in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 5. In order to temporarily finance the purposes provided for in Section 1 hereof, there is hereby authorized the issuance of bond anticipation notes of said County in an aggregate principal amount of \$5,700,000. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by April 18, 2018

the County Comptroller; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond

anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and shall be in such form as may be determined by the

County Comptroller. The County Comptroller shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued

pursuant to this Ordinance, and the County Comptroller's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence

as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the

provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8.1. The County Comptroller is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes

from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of

payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The County

Comptroller is directed to report in writing to the Board of Chosen Freeholders at the meeting next succeeding

the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this Ordinance is made. Such report must include

the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and

the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 6. The County reasonably expects to commence acquisition and/or construction of the

improvements described in Section 1 hereof, and to advance all or a portion of the costs in respect thereof,

prior to the issuance of bonds or notes hereunder. To the extent such costs are advanced, the County further

reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this

bond ordinance, in an aggregate amount not to exceed the amount of bonds or notes authorized in Section 2

hereof. This bond ordinance is intended to be a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation

Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 7. Any grant monies received for the purposes described in Section 1 hereof, shall be

applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the obligations issued

pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be

reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

SECTION 8. The amount of the proceeds of the obligations authorized by this Ordinance which

may be used for the payment of interest on such obligations, architects' fees, accounting, engineering and

inspection costs, legal expenses, and other items as provided in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 shall not exceed the sum of

\$2,000,000.

SECTION 9. The Capital Budget of the County of Ocean is hereby amended to conform with the

provisions of this Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. In the event of any such

inconsistency and amendment, the resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full

detail of the amended Capital Budget and Capital Program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local

Government Services is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders and is available there for

public inspection.

SECTION 10. It is hereby found, determined and declared as follows:

A. The improvements or purposes described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance are not current

expenses. They are improvements or purposes the County may lawfully undertake as general improvements,

and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property benefitted thereby.

B. The average period of usefulness of the improvements for which the obligations authorized by

this Ordinance are to be issued is twenty (20) years.

C. The supplemental debt statement provided for in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-10 was duly filed in the

Office of the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders prior to the passage of this Ordinance on first reading,

and a complete executed duplicate of such supplemental debt statement has been filed in the office of the

Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of

New Jersey, and such supplemental debt statement shows that the gross debt of the County as defined in

N.J.S.A. 40A:2-43 is increased by this Ordinance by \$5,700,000 and the obligations authorized by this

Ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

SECTION 11. In the event the monies set forth above for any purpose is not necessary for said

purposes, then such monies shall be for the completion of any of the other purposes provided for in this

Ordinance.

SECTION 12. The full faith and credit of the County of Ocean shall be pledged to the payment of

the principal of and interest on the bonds and notes authorized by this Ordinance, and as long as any of said

bonds or notes are outstanding, an appropriation shall be included in each annual budget of the County

hereafter adopted in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds or notes maturing

in each year. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the County, and the County shall be

obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the County for the payment of the

obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

SECTION 13. After passage upon first reading of this Ordinance, the Clerk of the Board of

Chosen Freeholders is hereby directed to publish the full text of the Ordinance, together with the notice set

forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF PENDING ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and

corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-19, at least seven days prior to the

date set for public hearing and further consideration for final passage (which date shall be at least ten days after

introduction and first reading). The Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders is further directed to comply

with all provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-17(b) regarding postings, publications, and the provision of copies of this

Ordinance.

SECTION 14. After final adoption of this Ordinance by the Board of Chosen Freeholders, the

Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders is hereby directed to publish the full text of this Ordinance, as finally

SECTION 15. The Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County hereby covenants on behalf of the County to take any action necessary or refrain from taking such action in order to preserve the tax-exempt status of the bonds and notes authorized hereunder as is or may be required under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and the regulations promulgated thereunder (the "Code"), including compliance with the Code with regard to the use, expenditure, investment, timely reporting and rebate of investment earnings as may be required thereunder.

SECTION 16. This Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

Freeholder Director Gerry P. Little opened the meeting at 4:04 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Tarrant, Comptroller/CFO John N. Ernst, County Engineer Donna Flynn, Director, Public Information John C. Sahradnik, Jr., County Counsel

Director Little stated that the most important PreBoard we have each year and the first priority role of this Board is to manage the people's budget responsibly and to maintain the fiscal integrity of the County and the County's bond rating. The Director thanked Freeholder Bartlett and the entire Board for their efforts this year. Freeholder Little noted that each Freeholder plays a role in the budget working with their departments. Director Little advised that the budget is under the two percent cap, while funding our programs and services, noting there will be no layoffs or cuts. The Director introduced the "fiscal guru," Freeholder Bartlett to provide an overview of the 2018 Budget.

Freeholder Bartlett reviewed the spending plan for 2018, noting that as public officials, the Board needs to be respectful of the peoples' money. All of the Freeholders review the budget with their departments. Freeholder Bartlett stated that the first goal is to maintain the County's Triple A bond rating, which took 30 years to obtain, and it is because of the way this Board handles finances that the County received the Triple A bond rating. The Freeholder stated that the County maintains its surplus and limits its expenditures. Freeholder Bartlett stated that it is up to the CFO, Administrator, and Director of Management and Budget to build the budget within the framework of the tax rate, maintaining the surplus and limiting expenditures.

Freeholder Bartlett noted that each Freeholder has many departments and their department heads bring their budget requests to them for review and discussion. The budget is then given to the CFO, Julie Tarrant. The Freeholder noted that the current year budget as it is put together, looks to future years and what will be needed down the road. Freeholder Bartlett stated that the County's budget is one of cooperation with a focus on the tax rate. In 2018, the tax evaluation of the County is up by 2.74 percent or \$2.6 billion from last year. The Freeholder, however, noted that the County has still not recovered from the "Great Recession" and Superstorm Sandy, stating that the ratables are still \$9 billion less than in 2009, noting that it will take another few years to reach 2009 levels.

Freeholder Bartlett stated that the good news is the County is continuing to follow through with its commitment (the tax rate reduced last year by 1/10 of 1 percent) and is pleased to announce that this year the County tax rate will see a half cent reduction. The Freeholder stated that the tax rate last year was 35.2 cents and the rate this year, with the half-cent reduction, will be 34.7 per \$100 of equalized value. Freeholder Bartlett advised that a home valued at \$300,000 will see a savings of about \$15.00, which is a small decrease, but noted that it continues to move in the right direction. He further noted that the tax rate of 34.7 cents is lower than it ever was in the 1970's and 20 percent lower than his first County budget 30 years ago.

Freeholder Bartlett noted that the budget is just under the 2 percent cap at \$416 million this year, it was \$408 million last year. The budget is under the 2 percent cap by \$16 million. The Freeholder stated that the surplus this year will be up \$3.7 million. The surplus in 2017 was \$51.7 million and the surplus this year is \$55.4 million. The Freeholder stated that he believed this budget will guarantee the County's Triple A bond rating and that he was confident that the County could do the same thing next year. Freeholder Bartlett pointed out that it is the Board intention in this year's budget to return to cash capital, pay cash for capital projects and equipment, which the County would have bonded. The Freeholder stated that this means the County will pay cash for heavy equipment, trucks and for major repairs.

Freeholder Bartlett advised that the County's tax base is coming back slower than we would like but it is moving back. The Freeholder stated that the County would maintain all of its services in a fiscally responsible manner this year while returning a small amount to our taxpayers. He further advised that just because the money is in

the budget, does not mean it has to be spent, noting most of our departments underspend their budget and that money reverts back to surplus.

Freeholder Bartlett noted that the State Pension System is in trouble and he was tired of hearing that; he stated that the County pays every time - all of its pension liability, the State pays zero. The County has paid \$19.4 million its pension payments. Freeholder Bartlett emphatically stated that this County pays every cent on its pension payments, the County has no pension liability and this is reflected by the rating agencies. Ms. Tarrant advised that the budget is scheduled for introduction at the March 7, 2018 Board meeting and the adoption of the budget is scheduled for April 4, 2018.

Director Little stated that Ocean County funds all of its pension payments. The Director also stated that several years ago when the economy was bad this Board froze everything for four to five years, no new employees and no employees were replaced. The County staff was down approximately 200 fulltime employees from 2009 with no furloughs. The Freeholder advised that he is pleased that County ratables are now going in the right direction and that the County does not spend the entire budget every year. The Director thanked the Freeholders and department heads for doing a great job.

Freeholder Kelly noted that the budget process in not a six week process, it is a 52 week process every year. He advised that he is already meeting with the Prosecutor on 2019 budget projections while we are making the presentation on the 2018 budget today; budget conversations are held all year long. The process works because we are all of like minds. Freeholder Kelly stated that our staff and department heads work with the Freeholders along the way and our budgets are not overspent. Freeholder Kelly thanked Freeholder Bartlett for all his efforts as well as the staff.

Freeholder Haines also thanked Freeholder Bartlett, Julie Tarrant and the staff for the job they do, not just 6 weeks of the year but 52 weeks. The Freeholder thanked the department heads stating that they know what increases they need and they do not go overboard, advising that when there is an emergency, they can come to this Board. Staff works very well together with the Board and the Administrative staff. Freeholder Haines stated that the County continues to provide services as necessary, and if we lose funding from the State, it has promised to continue to fund our seniors. The Freeholder stated that the County continually anticipates what will be needed which includes equipment that may need to be replaced five or ten years down the road. Freeholder Bartlett stated that it is a cooperative effort from everyone.

Freeholder Vicari stated that our seniors know the importance of home delivered meals and the Freeholder noted that several years back, State money was reduced for this program. The Freeholder stated that Ocean County would not have seniors go hungry and the County put an additional \$250,000 in the budget at that time to help fund the home delivered meals. Freeholder Vicari noted that at the VoTech we have a

waiting list for the MATES Academy. The Freeholder stated that all students get jobs and many stay in Ocean County after they graduate.

Freeholder Vicari stated the County has 135 buildings and we have stabilized energy costs, noting that the costs have gone down by replacing equipment that is The Freeholder stated that tourism is a \$4.7 billion industry. He also paving for itself. noted that the Airport pays for itself; a new hangar is scheduled for 2019, which will pay for itself in twenty years. The Freeholder stated that the County controls spending, pays the bills and meets our obligations to maintain our Triple A bond rating and provides services to 580,000 people in Ocean County. Many people locate to Ocean The Freeholder noted that Ocean County is the third County for its quality of life. largest county in the State and over 60 percent of the County is open space, which is good for the environment. The Freeholder advised that he felt that people trust and He stated that staff does a good job and this budget is a respect Ocean County. blueprint for 2018. Freeholder Vicari also noted that this is his 37th budget in Ocean County.

Freeholder Bartlett noted that department heads and all County employees made do when the County needed it and do a great job. Freeholder Kelly added that the County's constitutional officers also work with the County during tough times, noting that they do not work for this Board, they are elected, and they are part of our team.

Director Little thanked Freeholder Bartlett, the Board members and the professional staff for their work on the budget process, stating that the County works as a team.

Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda, which included Traffic Signal Upgrades, Phase C, Long Beach Boulevard. Freeholder Kelly advised that Long Beach is contributing 50 percent to this project. The Freeholder also noted that is another safety project for pedestrians to cross roadways safely. There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the agenda for the March 7, 2018 Board meeting.

Ms. Wioland reviewed the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of March 7, 2018. Assistant County Administrator requested that a resolution be added to the agenda, which concurs with the recommendations from DCO Energy, LLC to award a contract to PJM Mechanical Contractors. This is for the plaza at the Justice Complex recommended by the County Energy Program. Mr. Fiure noted that the County's energy consultant, DCO Energy, LLC reviewed and recommended this award. He advised the review is complete and requested that this award be added to the Board agenda. Freeholder Vicari noted this is a very complicated program, which will save a substantial amount of money, and was recommended through the County's Clean Energy Program. There were no objections and this will be added to the agenda. There were no other questions or comments.

Director Little asked the Board members for comments.

There were no comments.

Director Little asked the Administrator for comments during Open Session. The Administrator advised that he anticipates the award for the Manchester Garage to be ready for the April 4, 2018 Board meeting. The Administrator had no other comments for Open Session.

Administrator Block advised that the Closed Session discussion on the Fire Marshal analysis will not be discussed, stating that changes need to be made to the report.

Ms. Wioland read the resolution to move to closed session.

Director Little stated at the conclusion of the Closed Session, the Board will return to Open Session to close the meeting and noted that no action will be taken when the meeting returns to Open Session.

On a motion by Freeholder Kelly, seconded by Freeholder Vicari, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 5:08 PM for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was unanimously carried.

The meeting returned to Open Session at 5:41 PM. There being no further business, on a motion by Freeholder Kelly, seconded by Freeholder Haines, the meeting adjourned at 5:42 PM.
