A. **STATEMENT** Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act.

Joseph H. Vicari, Freeholder Director, read the following statement of compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act:

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean was called to order on June 18, 2014 at 4:00 PM, Room 119, County Administration Building, 101 Hooper Avenue, Toms River, Ocean County, New Jersey, with Director Vicari presiding. Members Bartlett, Kelly, Lacey and Little were present at the call of the roll.

3. The Pledge of Allegiance and Prayer.

## **B. RESOLUTION - INTRODUCTION**

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. Please be seated. Resolution for Introduction: Authorization of an Amendment to the 2014 Ocean County Budget. I'll now turn this over to Mrs. Vasil. This is the long awaited Budget Amendment and we waited a long time for the Budget. This is the first process and we'll have the final adoption next meeting. Mrs. Vasil please."

CLERK VASIL: "That's correct Freeholder and this is just the Introduction to this Budget Amendment. Next Wednesday there will be a Special Board Meeting held at 3:15 PM in this room and at that time there will be a Public Hearing on the Budget Amendment, a Public Hearing on the CAP Banking Resolution, the adoption of the County Budget Amendment, the adoption of the CAP Banking Resolution and the adoption of the County Budget as amended and Capital Plan. So at this time we just need a motion to accept the Introduction of this Budget."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Freeholder Bartlett."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "The reason we have not been able to adopt the 2014 County Budget yet was because we were awaiting approval from the Federal government and the State of New Jersey to approve the Budget itself, of a \$9.2 million Community Development Block Grant that's from the Federal government for an Essential Services Grant. That sum had been told to us by the State to include in our Budget as an item of revenue to offset certain expenditures in the Budget itself. But until we had the certification from the Federal government we couldn't adopt our own Budget. We now have that certification.

Now in addition, okay, since the Introduction of our Budget and today, the County has been the recipient of a major Sandy-related grant from the Federal government called the Homeowners' Rental Assistant Program, SHRAP for short, of \$33.8 million plus additional programs from the Federal government which total....I'll just give you that....\$35.6 million. So this Amendment that we are voting on today will amend the County Budget and increase it by \$35.6 million. Now that sum of money is totally from Federal sources which come into the County Budget on the revenue side and then go out on the expenditure side for special purposes, that is for this Homeowners' Rental Assistance Program by and large and some other programs. So it's money that comes in from the Federal government, it must run through our Budget that's why we have to amend the Budget, and so therefore this Budget is going to look bigger than it normally would have and then it goes through the Budget and expended on the expenditure side.

It has no effect whatsoever at all on the County Tax Rate as we introduced it back when we introduced the Budget at first. It will still remain at 34.1 cents which is about a 1.6 cent increase over last year, much of that contributable to the fact that the County continued to lose ratables related to the Sandy Storm and the catch-up if you will, by various tax collecting agencies throughout the County on those losses. So it's a very small, it will be a very small increase in the County Tax Rate. I think I also want to point out at this time that we are going to use a bit less in surplus than we used last year, again, to enhance our position to the rating agencies so that we are coming closer to the 10% level that they look for in what is often times called 'a fund balance' which I think is properly pointed out, Mr. Director, would be a better name for it than surplus. But, in our Budget documents it's called surplus. So we can call it one or the other.

In any event, this amendment today has no effect on the County Tax Rate or on what we raise in taxation or on future County Budgets. It is merely money in and money out and we are very happy to get it. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Freeholder Bartlett. And again, it's extremely important because if someone did not have knowledge of what was taking place with the Budget and you compared this year, 2014, for example with 2010, you would say it gives us a substantial increase. But again, it's a formality that's mandated by the State and Federal government. It's a way and as another way of explaining it, it's a way to manage or to administrate money that comes in the form of grants which is a good thing. We hope we can do more of it because it means it's money that's not going from the taxpayers to Ocean County, but something I believe we're entitled to because of the fact that we have suffered a devastating storm.....Hurricane Sandy....and it's the right thing to do as far as the Federal government as far as giving us money. So it was well worth the wait. We know our department heads have been very patient really waiting to have the finalization of the Budget. And again, eventually also, it's to give this information to the local towns to mail the tax bills which I believe are for August 1st. So the timing probably will be just in time so they don't have to mail a temporary budget tax bill. If there are no other questions or concerns?"

CLERK VASIL: "Thank you Freeholder. We'll take the roll call vote and again, this is the Introduction on the Amendment to the Budget."

## C. RESOLUTION - PUBLIC HEARING

CLERK VASIL: "Next Freeholder, we have a Public Hearing Resolution."

Clerk Vasil read the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee recommendation resolution by title, which was scheduled for Public Hearing at this time.

Director Vicari opened the Public Hearing on the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee recommendation resolution to the public for comments.

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Mr. Director, again, as liaison to the County's Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee, the committee has recommended to the Board of Freeholders that we accept this arrangement. This is spending from that fund, \$1,250,000.00. It is a 272 acre tract in the Wading River estuary, I suppose is the right word. Watershed is a better one. In the watershed of the Wading River. It adjoins public lands that are part of Bass River State Forest and other lands owned by the New Jersey Natural Lands Trust. This will also enhance the gunnery range at.....Freeholder Kelly at....the name escapes me.

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "I can't remember the name."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Warren Grove."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Warren Grove. Thank you. It is in the vicinity of Warren Grove and again, it's most appropriate to keep housing from that area to the extent possible. So again, this is 272 acres which is a large parcel that we're able to acquire and negotiate the price of \$1,250,000.00."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Freeholder Bartlett for making it very clear. Again, this was discussed last week at the Workshop Meeting. If there are no other questions or comments on this resolution for Public Hearing, I will move to close the Public Hearing. Mr. Black. You put your hand up. I'm sorry."

GARY BLACK, JACKSON: "That's okay. I'm running a little slow today anyway."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Take your time."

GARY BLACK: "I will say as I say on almost all of these and I'm trying not to sound like a broken record, but oh well, what the hell, I am. Again, aside from the environmental benefits of this program, the financial benefits of this program make it pay for itself even if we were paying triple the amount of money. A lot of this land is buildable. With buildable property you have housing. With housing comes expenditures. The ratables for housing does not meet the expenditures and always costs towns money. So this is land that .....this is a program that pays for itself multifold in the long run. And again, I stress because there's a lot of misunderstanding going around about this program compared to what some other states are doing. This is a voluntary program. People offer their properties up and if there's an agreement to purchase then there's a purchase. If there isn't an agreement then fine and dandy, then they go their way, the County goes theirs.

This is also land that people can walk on. It's not wild lands. It's not like fenced off. Where people won't go to jail walking on it. So it is for use of County residents. So all in all it's a good program. It's not forced. It's not Agenda 21. It even predates Agenda 21 by a good ten years at least. And, I guess that's it. I'm running out stuff."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Mr. Black. Anyone else? Gerry do you want to say something? I believe that last time you keep records of the accurate numbers of the number of acreage that we have and the percentage. Or do you want to wait til the next meeting?"

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "We are always up to date Mr. Director. The Board is always up to date. This brings us in total County land including County parks, our Natural Lands Trust, our farms as far as farm easements to 23,115 acres. And, in total for those who may be new, we often talk about the total acres of the County, 408,000 acres is the entire scope of the County and with this project 228,538 acres are permanently preserved at 55.96% or almost 56%. And that does not count schools or municipal parks. We're over 60% when you count the municipal parks and schools. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Freeholder Little."

CLERK VASIL: "You need to close the Public Hearing and ask for a vote."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "This is extremely important to us. Fortunately for us, we have Mayor Carmen Amato here. He worked very closely with this Board of Freeholders and this not only serves Berkeley Township, but a large section of Ocean County. There were many concerns and especially when we did the radio interviews. The people would always call up and it's really given people access that are middle class, hard working person to come to use the water over there. The waterways, the bathing, fishing and crabbing. So Mayor Amato."

MAYOR CARMEN AMATO, BERKELEY TOWNSHIP: "I just want to take this opportunity to thank the Freeholder Board for their proactive efforts to get Berkeley Island County Park back on the County rolls. My opinion is it's the "jewel of the County" park system. Obviously, it's in Berkeley Township and as you mentioned we do get a lot of calls in my office that people enjoy Berkeley Island Park. We did do a walk-through with, then, Mike Fiure and his department was devastated by Superstorm Sandy as much of the infrastructure in our community and around the County during Superstorm Sandy.

On behalf of the Town Council, we just want to thank the Freeholders for their proactive effort in getting this park back together because it really is a place for all ages to go and visit and it's a park that's really used by our community a lot. We sincerely appreciate your efforts. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you. And again, this is the time we are getting on line with a lot of damage that was caused by the Superstorm. Any other questions or comments in reference to this Ordinance? Mr. Black please."

GARY BLACK, JACKSON: "Just one brief. As you know it's been a while since Superstorm Sandy to now and in fact, the majority of delay in rebuilding this park has had to do with environmental regulations, laws and engineering and things like that to comply with regulations for a park?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "It was very difficult and Freeholder Bartlett spent a lot of time as far as down getting the permits, but we need to make sure it's done the correct way. And bringing it up to modern standards as far as the sanitary facilities that are there, the roadways and it's a park that's been out of operation for a long time. So not only is it up to standards as far as environmentally, but it meets easy access and ADA. So it's going to be really, as the Mayor mentioned before, the 'crown jewel of the parks' throughout Ocean County."

GARY BLACK: "I have no doubt it will be a beautiful park. It's always been. I remember going there when fireworks were going off back when it was Berkeley Township Park, being born and raised. It's just a shame it took so long just to comply with all of the regulatory garbage and it's just for a park. Imagine if we were building something. Wow. This is the point of why industry has died. It takes two years to get together permits for a park? My God. What if we were manufacturing something? Wow."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "It's better a park to serve the County than a condominium complex in the area. Let's face it, when land is that valuable, Mr. Black, what would have to happen is that they would not put single family homes because of the economic value of the land. It would probably be condominiums, about 200 of them probably on that particular property. So again, at that time, even before I became a Freeholder, the County had the foresight to make sure that it was in the public domain."

GARY BLACK: "Oh yea. And I'm glad of that. I was just commenting about the rules and regulations about how, frankly, insane it was to what we had to go through and the money that had to be expensed just to get this up and going again."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "We are willing to meet all environmental regulations, but the expense of doing that are very, very expensive. If there are no other questions or comments from members of the public or the Board?"

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Mr. Director before we go further I think maybe I made a mistake in not talking about this much earlier because there have been many questions and most of them to, unfortunately, to the Mayor and Council in Berkeley Township and many of them forwarded to us. But, when we lost significant....we lost all the infrastructure, I must say, with the exception of the armor mat material on the front of the park on the bay itself and some of those have to be reset. But, much of the parking area on both sides of the neck of land going out to it was washed away by the storm. And so when the State was dredging, re-dregding the channel in Barnegat Bay and clearing the bay, we took a lot of those dredge spoils at the park so that we could use them free of charge to actually expand the parking back to where it had been. So were looking at every dime, if you will, of 'freebies' that could come our way before we started construction. We've had a group that came in and are rebuilding the living shorelines. It's going to be an experimental effort to see, again, a living shoreline we will fill into.

In talking with the Mayor and members of the Governing Body in Berkeley, they asked us, 'Is there any way you can get anything going there this summer?' And the Parks Department went back and said, 'Yes we could.' So the fishing area along the bulkhead along, I'll call it, the north side of the park is open to the public now. It was open on Memorial Day. It is fenced off with some ugly fencing, but at least it keeps people out of the rest of the park where it is not safe. And, we've used portable toilets which again, are not very attractive, but again, it provides a temporary fix to at least get some use out of a very, very popular spot. I'm sure construction will not begin until the fall. So I don't believe anything will interfere with the limited operations we'll have this summer. But, at least we have it partially back on track for this summer.

I hope in the final analysis we have provided more money than we will actually need, but it's better to have it available than have to come back to the Board and ask for more later. So I don't think we'll be spending that much. We don't have the engineering done. So we don't know exactly what....but I would expect the park, when we finish, will look much like it looked beforehand, only better. The bathroom facilities were worn. Quite frankly, they were shot. The gazebo was rusted. The place, it sticks way out in the bay and it takes a beating so it needed some tender loving care long before Sandy. Now, it needs a complete redo and we'll have that. It will be, again, back to the gem that it was. But I want to thank you Mr. Director for your patience on this and the rest of the Board and after we explained to Berkeley Township, I think they have been very helpful in explaining to the public that comes to their meetings the

problems that we have faced. But we didn't ignore it. We didn't forget about it. It just took longer than we would like."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I think it's important to note as what was said before by Mayor Amato and it's important to the people, we explain exactly what we're going to do. It was explained to them in great detail at many public meetings and also with Freeholder Bartlett exactly what the costs are going to be. We explained the transparence and that's how we do business in Ocean County so there are no surprises. We try to let the people know exactly what we're doing in great detail so we don't have to come back in six months or a year and say, 'You know something? We have to increase the appropriations.' So we know exactly what the budget is and we try to, of course, do everything within that particular number. I would like to close the public portion if there are no other questions or comments and we thank those who made those comments today at this meeting. Thank you."

No additional comments were received, therefore, the Public Hearing was declared closed.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I would just like to make a comment opposing S-2171. This is the one that would take away local control in Atlantic, Cape May, Ocean, Monmouth Counties. And Cape May. What this would do, of course, it's basically what we have totally opposed for many, many years. Again, I met yesterday with Seaside Heights and Seaside Park and the northern beach. They totally oppose this legislation. They want home rule. Same as on Long Beach Island. The Mayor and different governing bodies and elected officials are totally opposed to this. What basically it means that in Ocean County where we have 44 miles of the 127 miles in the State of New Jersey, it would be taken out of local control. No one knows how to maintain the beaches better than the local public officials. This is what they want. It's supported unanimously by those townships in Ocean County that border the Atlantic Ocean. They wish it to stay the same. They do not only a good job maintaining it, but I believe it's one of the best made oceanfront beaches you can find any place in the country.

So again, we're going to just resupport our concerns for that and look to see if New Jersey, again, would have to pass the State Legislature, the Assembly and Senate, that we oppose it. We received many letters asking for us to oppose this and we will do so. And also, different agencies that we will use this resolution to reaffirm our opposition to this legislation."

## Q. FREEHOLDER COMMENTS

At 4:32 PM, Freeholder Director Vicari received the following comments from members of the Board:

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I just have a few items I just want to mention probably for just information. We have the Director of Senior Services here. We have a lot of concerns and right now we're just getting information on Verizon's land lines that will be discontinued in different parts of Ocean County, State of New Jersey. According to articles in AARP and several doctors that called, the land lines are encouraged because cell phones cannot transmit certain things such as EKG's, heart monitors, and what they're saying is a lot of our seniors do not have the wi-fi or the cable or the cell phones. So we're looking at it. We will probably send a letter for clarification. This came out in the last several days, but basically, the doctors that deal with our senior citizens feel it's very important. I will also have Steve Scaturro from Consumer Affairs look at what's taking place before we get too far into it.

So again, it is basically just getting information. We are going to survey our seniors and see the type of an impact that it does have. But we want you to know that we are totally aware of what's taking place as far as the landlines throughout areas, especially where there is a high concentration of senior citizens.

The storm update: We always talk about this and why it's so important. Unfortunately, you know, Ocean County has 44 miles of coastline. In my opinion, the best in the country. Unfortunately, it's not just the Superstorm, there was an article, a headline that is hurting the tourist industry. Seaside Park and Seaside Heights. I was there yesterday. I had a number of meetings with our Sheriff who's here today, getting some input and we're back online as far as what's taking place on the boardwalks. Ocean County has seven miles of boardwalk. Seven. We lost a small part of that. It's being rebuilt within ten days, so therefore it's unfair to really sterotype 'well don't come to the Jersey Shore and especially Ocean County because of the fire'. It's absolutely not true. We went to Long Beach Island today, okay, Long Beach Township is twelve and a half miles, the island is eighteen miles. No boardwalk. Eighteen miles of oceanfront, no boardwalk, so therefore, no one is saying anything about the boardwalk. So it's unfair for us as far as the tourist industry and we've been meeting with the New York media trying to get some positive input and they said 'Wait a minute. You had the fire.' Well unfortunately, that's going to be the biggest problem that we have this year and the business people need positive, positive publicity as far as what's taking place.

They did a tremendous job. We walked the entire boardwalk yesterday and I know that one of the business's said 'Look. If you look to the left, we've got almost fourteen blocks of boardwalk that's not only repaired, every business is open.' They're trying to do very, very well. They have high inventories. Now if you look the opposite side where one business, of course, the Sawmill is open and they're working on it. But there's no degree of urgency because the schools aren't out until next week. So it will be done on time. There were a number of difficult decisions they had to make because there were a number of different owners, but in my opinion, if you look at it, it's better than it was several years ago. But we have to get positive comments from people that go there. The most important is the media as far as saying, 'Well come on down to the Jersey Shore.'

People do not realize that tourism is not just for the tourist industry. Everyone that lives in Ocean County, it will pick up the property values by at least 5%. It will put 70,000 people to work. We'll take people off unemployment. We will take people off going to the food pantry. We will take people out of the area looking for a job because some of the jobs here are well-paying jobs if you stay for the entire season, if you work and you do what you have to do. And again, it's a lot of money we make with the tourism. \$4.3 billion a year and we just can't forget that. So again, we're very optimistic. Two things have to happen - good weather and positive news media, saying nice things about Ocean County. It's family-oriented. They can come with their families. And I was very, very happy yesterday to see what was taking place with the tourism.

And again, we have 127 miles of oceanfront. Ocean County has been blessed with 44 miles of the greatest they can find any place in the country and it's cleaner today. In my opinion, even better and in my opinion than five years ago. So it came a long way and we're very optimistic that we're going to have a great season.

The next thing is that....it's hard to believe, in two weeks it is 4th of July weekend. We are all geared up for it. We have a nice website by Dana Lancellotti, 'The Ocean View' about what's happening in Ocean County and we're going to focus on, of course, on fireworks and positive things where families can go. Most of it is totally free. It's family-oriented and there's no such thing as legal fireworks in Ocean County or the State. We leave it to professionals. And, there are many different activities that will be taking place. And one area that we're going to work on which is very sensitive, but we're not going to do it right now, we don't know how to handle it, is unfortunately, when any child dies in a swimming pool in an area with the parents close by, it's a very hurtful thing. So we want to do something very discreet really. Every year, unfortunately, little kids with moms and dads, eighteen months old, 3-4 years old, they die in family swimming pools or close to the moms and dads. So we will do something with public information just to let the parents know that you can't blink your eye while watching a child and of course, put away your cell phones, don't type the messages, don't talk to anyone and a child is a very, very important thing because they do things that you just can't predict sometimes. They do things very impulsively. So we're aware of it and it's a very hurtful thing to families as we know with what took place and we will be doing something about that probably in the next week of so.

Okay, thank you very much. That concludes my report."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. I have a couple of comments. As we traditionally do here often as liaison to Veterans Services, we from time to time receive notices from the Federal Department of Defense and the POW/MIA Office about POW's and MIA's who have been lost in Korea, Vietnam and World War II and who have been recovered and as part of that tradition we honor our Veterans. Our latest notification a Staff Airforce Sgt. Robert E. Howard, 450th Bomber Squadron was lost, shot down over Germany on April 16, 1945. His body was accounted for and identified on May 28th of this year and he will be buried with full military honors in Iowa on June 19th.

Army Pfc. Lawrence Gordon, Reconnaissance Company, 32nd Armored Regiment, 3rd Armored Division was lost in France on August 13, 1944. His body was identified on May 27th and he will be buried with full military honors later this summer in Canada.

We have Army Pfc. Cecil E. Harris who was lost in France on January 2, 1945 which sounds like the Battle of the Bulge. He was accounted for on May 29th and he will be buried with full military honors on a date to be determined by his survivors.

And lastly, on June 5th, the remains of Army Sgt. Delbert Kovalcheck of Millsboro, PA. He was lost in 1950 at the Chosin Reservoir in North Korea and he will be returned and he will be buried with full military honors later this summer.

And I also feel, Mr. Director, kind of compelled to address an issue. We know that President Obama and his administration has recently reversed our long-standing policy not to negotiate with terrorists. They have negotiated with terrorists and released five high-ranking, Al Qaeda-associated terrorists in return for an Army Sergeant who is now under review to determine the basis of his leaving his post.

In any event, at the same time, on March 31st, almost three months ago, US Marine Sgt. Andrew Tahmooressi was arrested by the Mexican Police because he accidentally crossed the US/Mexican border with three firearms that were legally owned and registered to him in the United States. Sgt. Tahmooressi immediately disclosed to the Mexican Police that he had the weapons in his truck and that he had accidentally made the wrong turn and crossed the Mexican border. Despite that explanation, he was immediately jailed and he has been languishing in the Mexican jail for almost three months. He's been threatened by drug lords and others in the Mexican prison. He has been shackled until his wrists and ankles have bled and his family says he is suffering from post-traumatic stress disorder. He served two combat tours in Afghanistan.

In any event, so, on behalf of the VFW and many other Veterans' organizations have been urging the administration to take action to try to negotiate for our Marine's return to the United States in his custody and so far that has, at least that we're aware of, no actions have been undertaken. So, on behalf of the Board and the Veterans of Ocean County and many other Marines, I have issued my own letter to the President this week and asked him to consider all of those factors and that his administration should show the same kind of concern for this Marine who has made an accidental crossing of the border and immediately identified that he had weapons. You know, we talk about what we heard a couple of weeks ago when the administration was negotiating with the terrorists to turn them over that we leave no

one behind. We should not be leaving this Marine in a Mexican jail to rot and Mexico is supposed to be our ally and yet we negotiated with terrorists. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Freeholder Little. It's a point well made. I think if you look at the people in this room you can realize they're very sensitive to that. It's a very unfortunate situation when something like that happens in the United States and we thank you for bringing it to our attention."

R. PUBLIC COMMENTS - Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of five (5) minutes per speaker.

At 4:44 PM, Freeholder Director Vicari opened the meeting to receive the following comments from members of the public.

DEBRA VERSHECK, LITTLE EGG HARBOR: "Good afternoon Freeholders. I would like to get the correct spelling for the Marine that was arrested after the meeting and also if I can help with the tourism. I would have to do it from home, but when I worked for (inaudible) Mission Association I designed the calendar on my vacation that they used for four years that increased their donations by about 50%. So I would be more than happy to give some time."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "We have a website now, an App site, so you can take a look at that."

DEBRA VERSHECK: "So I would be more than happy to work with that to build up tourism."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you."

DEBRA VERSHECK: "And I definitely want the Marine's (address) because what Obama did with the negotiation I don't understand why he's not impeached. He didn't even go through Congress and it's a disgrace.

Now I'm going to start with my letter that I brought forth today. I would like to thank you for your help, along with Mike Fromonsky, Steven Scaturro, Catherine Graham, Josh Howell and Anthony Agliata. Without your help and diligence I feel as if I would have not gotten anywhere with the grant process.

There are a few problems with the program which I have discovered. I would like to share with you my observations, hoping it will work its way up to the Governor's Office and perhaps help the program and the homeowners of our great State.

On two different occasions I was told the problems were with the program, glitches if you will. Computers do not make mistakes, however, if they are programmed correctly or if information is not input correctly then the glitches will appear. The case managers say they have no way of knowing what the problem is from the computer, it just states "error", which gives them no clue what the actual problem is. If this is the case, which I know is possible due to the fact I had worked with the pilot program for child support before my injuries, there is a solution. The programmer can add codes into the program so that the case manager knows what probem they are looking for and how to correct it in a timely fashion. Examples for this would be:

A1=Missing income taxes A2=Missing pay stubs B1=Incorrect amendment papers filed B2=Paperwork lost, etc.

My second concern is an assumption, but please hear me out. Look at the papers I have handed you to understand the assumption. The case workers are temporary workers who realize that once the grant programs are done that they no longer have employment. Therefore, if mistakes are constant and take that much longer for homeowners to receive their grants it keeps the case workers employed that much longer. In my case, as you can see, we were handed the wrong papers to sign on May 4th because the word "amended" was not on the calculation sheet. This is a human error not a computer error as we were told. If I am correct in this assumption then it is necessary to look into this matter since it may be costing the State unnecessary revenue and unnecessary stress to homeowners as it has for my husband and I.

An audit would not help with this if I am correct because the files are picked randomly and the files that are missed may be the files where the inconsistencies would reveal themselves. Perhaps however, the programmer can add a search engine for the State to oversee which case workers are having the most problems with inconsistencies. It is an idea which I feel should be looked into to review the work of the case workers and see who are actually doing their job properly.

I have had many phone calls from people with the same problems as my husband and I. The most frustrating part is when no one wants to give the answers why the grant is on hold, delayed, homeowners have to go back to sign papers several times, put back on the waiting list and not receiving a telephone call back. Understanding is the key to keeping people calm in a situation such as this. We have lost everything, we feel lost, and we feel like we have nowhere to turn and when we get no answers it is devastating, heartbreaking to the homeowners.

Last but not least, I would like homeowners to know that they are their biggest advocates that they cannot give up. Go to whatever level of government you must go to, keep fighting for the help you need, but be kind and firm while

doing so. If homeowners give up I am afraid that it is going to cause a traumatic effect on them which later on can cause them harm. Homeowners have lost so much already that can never be replaced. I know, all my children's pictures are gone with so much more.

And, I would like to thank you for this time you allotted me and for you to take my comments under consideration. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. And, just to let you know, I'm always sensitive to what you've said and yesterday when we were talking to the residents of Seaside Heights and Seaside Park, it was so cumbersome for some people to even get the grants, they just gave up and they said, 'You know something? It's making us sick. It's getting us depressed." So they just went out and they borrow the money, whatever is necessary. The most important thing is to anyone is to get back in their homes with their families. And, unfortunately, we don't like the process. We don't like what's taking place. We work very closely as you know with Dave McKeon and Tony Agliata and Steve Scaturro to do everything possible. We wish we could do more. And sometimes it's frustrating for me and the rest of the Board of Freeholders when people like you come up here and say things like that, we say look, we wish we could solve your problem. But it's not because of the bureaucracy, proof of point, is the Budget. We still do not have a Budget. Okay. It went a long way, eventually, we're going to get the \$9 million, but it's months and months. Now if we have a difficult time, I can imagine what you are going through trying to get your answers as far as getting the funding that's so necessary to get back into your home.

Just briefly, and when I was talking today with Mayor Joe Mancini he was telling me the same thing in Long Beach Island, how difficult it is, really, to deal with some of the problems there. The key issue is after you get in your houses, several years later, watch your insurance go astronomical throughout Ocean County. So a lot of things are taking place. And again, we hear it, we're sensitive to it. And again, I wish I could do more, but we understand your concerns."

DEBRA VERSHECK: "I appreciate everything you did for me. I will be forwarding a copy of this letter to Cindy Randazzo as she had asked me too. Because I believe these concerns are real and if it's looked into and if the computers are fixed correctly with the proper codes and if they could put in a search engine to see who is doing their job right, I believe it will help a lot more people."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Good point. We appreciate that and you made a good point. Thank you very much."

DEBRA VERSHECK: "Okay. Thank you very much."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Anyone else who would like to come to the microphone? Yes sir and then Mr. Black at the end, if you don't mind."

CRAIG VERSHECK, LITTLE EGG HARBOR: "Good afternoon everybody. Freeholder Little you touched my heart being in Vietnam. I'm a Veteran. I urge you to put those comments into print if you could in the newspaper or whatever and God bless you for bringing that up. It is amazing what's going on.

I also wanted to say thanks to some of the people in this room and some people behind me that made some phone calls and tried to help us with our situation. It's greatly appreciated. We did make progress on our house, but not with any grants or any help or assistance from the Federal government or the State or anything. We maxed out our credit cards which scares me to death. I don't think that my house is fourteen feet up in the air and hopefully that's enough to bring it back down (insurance). But I just think it's a disgrace that we have to take that avenue just to try get ourselves home.

Another thing that I really, really appreciate and you know I was an advocate for the park-n-ride in southern Ocean County and I just haven't had the time to come up and thank you for what you're doing for the citizens down there. I mean transportation is almost nil. I did another loss for Sandy, it was over 3,000 signatures I had on a petition showing the need and the want for it. But I did want to just come up and say it really, really is appreciated. I know we advocated it for years and I think it's going to be a well-used facility and thank you from the citizens of southern Ocean County. We do appreciate it."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. We appreciate it. Mr. Black please."

GARY BLACK, JACKSON: "One, I still hate these lights. They're really bothering me today for some reason. Two things. I want to clarify for those lamenting about the (inaudible) of the park, it was the idea of (inaudible) it's just annoying that it took this long just to get the permit process through for something as really non-environmentally impacting as a park. When I referenced what other things might be is we have a housing shortage in Ocean County. We have a job shortage. Some of these regulations are putting everything in a stranglehold. Look how long it took to build a park. The least environmental impact thing on the planet and yet that took this long just to get the design, the engineering and all this it's the State and I know it's not your end. I've been at PreBoard's where you guys were getting just as aggravated as I am. That should have been done a long time ago. The planning should have been done, but the regulations were just murder.

Secondly, on what they want to do with the beaches, is this another game where they're trying to come up with an autonomous body to run it?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I think it's the same author that's involved in the one or two, but similar to it. Every year there's another attack on Ocean County. So this is not another authority. What it's basically saying is that the local towns should be removed from taking care of, governing, having input and managing the numerous oceanfront pieces of property we have throughout the County bordering on the Atlantic Ocean. So again, it's something else by the Assembly and the Senate which we will oppose continuously, of course, with our neighboring counties."

GARY BLACK: "Maybe you ought to take a look at the people who are writing these laws and maybe take a look at their own neighborhoods."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "They have no ocean. It's in north Jersey. It's a north Jersey Assemblyman. They don't have any ocean. He's a Senator."

GARY BLACK: "Yea, well tell him to look outside his door at what a grease job they're doing. At least in Ocean County you can walk on the beach safely. I bet you can't do that in north Jersey now can you? The water is safe to go in if you're near water down here. Up there, I bet you can't say that up there. They've done a lousy job. We're doing so much better. We don't need an autonomous body to do what we're already doing. They want us to set up another autonomous body to take care of road drainage that we already do here. Maybe this guy ought to look around his own neighborhood and deal with his own problems because where he's from is a mess. Don't screw up down here like you did up there. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Mr. Black. Anyone else who would like to have the microphone? Mr. Gumper please. Anyone else. Our last speaker will be Mr. Gumper."

WILLIAM GUMPER, HOLIDAY CITY, BERKELEY TOWNSHIP: "Good afternoon Freeholders. Holiday City which is in bankruptcy right now as a community. Yes. It's in receivership. It has been since about a year and a half. On page one, the resolution B-Introduction: Authorizing an Amendment to the 2014 Ocean County Budget sounded rather complicated and I couldn't catch it all. I wouldn't even try to because I think very slowly, things go by me if they're talked about fast. My mind works slow and I think slow. But I have one question. This amendment which you put for introduction, I presume you're going to vote for it and of course, you know voters here have opinion. I have no vote because I don't know much about it. In fact, I don't know anything about it. The resolution...."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Yes. We will explain that. Freeholder Bartlett will. It means we will get \$9 million."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "Could I just ask? The bottom line is, will this be good for Ocean County or bad for Ocean County and if so, what is the bottom line of this? Will it be good for us or bad for us and why?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "We will explain. Freeholder Bartlett."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "In laymen's terms."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "It will be really good because it means money coming into our County. Freeholder John Bartlett."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "It's a good thing I was a teacher because let's see if I can remember how to explain something. That's an excellent question and I did not cover that before and that was my mistake. The Budget amendment, sir, is for \$35.6 million and that is a Federal Grant that comes to Ocean County. We have to put it in our Budget as an item of revenue."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "Which is good."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Which is good. Well. Hold on. And then it goes out as an item of expense, okay, for a special program, the Sandy Homeowners Rental Assistance Program is the biggest part of it. So it's grant money that comes in for a special purpose, goes out for a special purpose, but it has to run through our Budget. It makes our Budget look bigger which does not make the Director very happy."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "Yes. I understand. But the bottom line is it's good for the County."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "It's good for the County."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "And it's good for the residents in the County."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Yes."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "Okay, and I'll be talking with Freeholder Director Vicari about something on a private matter after the meeting. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you. Anyone else who would like to make a comment? Seeing no comments from any members of the public, I move that the public portion be closed. Is there a motion to adjourn?"



There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$5,300,000, including the sum of \$270,000 as the down payment, for the improvements or purposes described in Section 1 hereof as required by the Local Bond Law. The down payment has been made available by virtue of provision in the Capital Improvement Fund of the County of Ocean in one or more previously adopted budgets.

SECTION 4. There is hereby authorized the issuance of negotiable bonds in an aggregate principal amount of \$5,030,000 to finance part of the cost of the purposes stated in Section 1 hereof. 


