DIRECTOR VICARI: "That concludes the Public Hearing on the Ordinances. The next section is extremely important to us. The Resolution to introduce the 2020 County Budget with accompanying Resolutions. And again, it's good news. We have many businesses here for the first time. We're talking about a blueprint to operate Ocean County for the next year. The good news is we will not cut back on services and we will drop your tax rate, again.

So, I'm going to turn this over to the liaison with finances, Freeholder Jack Kelly, who will make some comments before we do the first part of the Public Hearing. But, just to remind you that before we do anything, it's transparent, and it will be on line February 20th. And the Budget adoption will be on March 18th in this particular room.

So again, I'll turn this over to Freeholder Jack Kelly. Freeholder?"

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Thank you Mr. Director.

As you stated, today, we are making the formal introduction of the 2020 Ocean County Budget. We discussed it last Wednesday at PreBoard and today we will be doing it at our regular meeting. A Public Hearing on the Budget, as you say, is scheduled for the Freeholder meeting of March 18th. The entire Budget document will be available on the County website as of tomorrow.

This is the second Budget that I have overseen with my colleagues on the Board and our County staff. It's not an easy process so I'd like to highlight for you some of the key areas of this spending plan and how they affect all of us to live in Ocean County as taxpayers.

First and foremost, as Freeholder Director stated, the County property tax rate will again be reduced this year by half a cent, marking the fourth consecutive year that the tax rate has gone down. The property tax rate in this Budget will be 33.7 cents per hundred.

This ties in with an important pledge we made to our citizens following the Superstorm Sandy in October of 2012. We have talked many times, and you remember that that storm resulted in a staggering loss of property values totaling more than \$11 billion. But this Board, then and now, promised that when we see the ratable tax base grow we will continue to reduce the County tax rate.

This year our ratable tax base stands at \$107 billion. \$4 billion more than last year's total of \$103 billion. We anticipate that growth to continue in the future. And we truly believe that next year, for the first time since 2009, we will completely replace all of the loss from Hurricane Sandy and probably even a little more. And because of that, I can say with some confidence, that the tax rate in Ocean County will continue to go down.

This Budget also includes a very healthy surplus. While using \$36.8 million this year, we have left appropriate reserves for future Budgets. A strong surplus is key in maintaining Ocean County's AAA Bond Rating. So what does that mean? It means that the AAA Bond Rating allows us to secure historically low interest rates on our debt service. This year alone we will be saving \$2 million as a result of the AAA Bond Rating and refunding bonds. And what do I mean by refunding bonds? It's no different than refinancing a home mortgage to secure a better tax rate. A better interest rate.

This Budget funds all of our core and essential programs that we provide to the 600,000 people that continue to call Ocean County home. And Mr. Director, it continues to come with no surprises.

As the Clerk of the Board will read in just moments, the 2020 Budget totals \$450,793,747.00 and the amount to be raised by taxation is \$361,536,722.00 And like all of our Budgets, we will continue to meet the required 2% State Mandated spending cap.

This Budget is up \$18.8 million. But a large portion of that - \$12.5 million - is being used to increase our funding for what we call as 'pay as you grow' capital projects. These are capital projects that we pay cash for rather than pass funding ordinances to be paid for in the future. So that's separate from the brick and mortar capital projects that we bond for. By using this cash to pay for these improvements and projects we alleviate the need for additional bonding. And that acts as a safety measure in the Budget. Should the County see another catastrophic event or emergency, this money can be returned to the Budget to again cover annual Government operations and essential services without the need to increase the tax rate. The balance of the Budget increase covers County operating costs and related expenses.

As I said earlier, the Budget introduced today, funds all of our core services. I would like to highlight some of those areas of County Government which are accessed by large numbers of our residents. This Budget provides \$3.5 million for senior programs, over \$600,000.00 for Ocean County Veterans Services Bureau, \$7 million for Parks and Recreation, \$74.3 million for Law and Public Safety, \$25.5 million for Roads and Bridges and \$20.2 million for Social Services. It also includes increased appropriations to Ocean County College, which will this year receive \$16 million from the County. And the Ocean County Vo-Tech Schools which will receive \$19.5 million this year.

The Budget is a collective work. It is not something that is put together by the Finance Director or even by just the Comptroller, but by all of the members of the Board of Freeholders, our Administrator, our Department Heads and so many people who work for Ocean County Government. And I thank all of them for their hard work.

And that concludes my report, Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I would like to thank Freeholder Kelly, who is Director of Finances, for his hard work and our professional staff. Before I continue, are there any other members...the process now is to have a roll call, members from the Board of Freeholders want to make a comment? And again, it will be published and there will be a Public Hearing discussion on March 18th. Any comments from members of the Board of Freeholders before we have the roll call?

Okay, if there are no comments from the members of the Board, again, for people here for the first time, everything on this agenda was discussed several times before, not only this month, but sometimes it goes back four, five months of things that have taken place.

Now I'll turn it over to the County Clerk."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Is this specifically on this topic?"

RONALD RYBICKI: "Yes."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay. Thank you."

RONALD RYBICKI: "To a point. It will take me two seconds. And how you are cooperating with Federal Law. I just want to tell you, from saying that last meeting at the end, I am with you and I stand with you one hundred percent on that. Thank you for that."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Thank you very much."

RONALD RYBICKI: "I just want to explain this movement. This is bringing Republicans, Democrats, Independents and Libertarians – and not only that – it's bringing different religions together for one cause which is the Second Amendment right. (Holds up map) I'm holding here these green, different shades of green, of the counties and/or townships that have gone along with this. By tonight, this whole section here is going to turn green. If come the next election, if we could get 75% of these counties and townships in that green – or light green or dark green – I'm hoping we can come together. All different political parties can come together and vote in a Governor who will defend the Constitution of the United States.

So thank you for making Ocean County number 31 on the list that was 30. So I appreciate your time."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. Anyone else who would like to speak in support of this or any questions or comments on number 20? One person. Anyone else?"

LARRY TRAINOR, 411 AMSTERDAM AVENUE, BAYVILLE: "I am in support of the resolution. I'd like to make a few comments and let you know that the Constitution is the supreme law of the land. And with the extremist protection orders that we have already on the books for dangerous and violent criminals, nobody in their right mind would want those people to be armed. However, we have these new "Red Flag" laws which are redundant and they don't allow due process. So what's happening is the Fourth Amendment is being violated as well as the Second Amendment with the new "Red Flag" laws and if we can gain ground as opposed to just stalling what is going on, that's the ultimate goal. We don't necessarily want to keep coming around. We want our rights. And this resolution is a step forward and I appreciate you putting it through.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. And again, I just want to state again that not only the Second Amendment is very important to us, but the Fourth Amendment of the United States. It goes back before the Civil War. And the importance of that is to not only protect your house as in the Second Amendment, but as far as the legal search and seizure – very, very important. So therefore, you have certain rights. Your home and your land is your castle. And the Fourth Amendment is very important to us.

So again, I just want to make it very clear, we support the entire Bill of Rights. But the question was the Second Amendment and also the Fourth Amendment and it is very important to all of us. I know several other people had any questions. Sir, do you have any questions?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I don't know if we voted."

CLERK CILENTO: "You're right. I apologize."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay. A motion has been made in the second on the Reappointments. For the record, please have a roll call."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "We did vote on that."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Did we vote?"

CLERK CILENTO: "Freeholder Kelly and Freeholder Haines."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay. As long as we voted. Okay. So it did pass. Okay, I'm sorry. So please file the resolutions from the governing bodies in the normal procedure."

CLERK CILENTO: "Well we have to do a roll call."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay, the roll call."

Roll call vote was taken on the Appointments/Reappointments.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "That concludes the formal part of our business from what I understand. Now we have comments from members of the Board before I turn it over to members of the public.

U. FREEHOLDER COMMENTS

At 4:29 PM, Freeholder Director Vicari received the following comments from members of the Board.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Moving to my right. Freeholder Quinn?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you Director. Just to be brief, I want to certainly thank all the folks in the audience here today for coming out in support of the resolution that we adopted here today. I think it was well known even though it took a little bit longer than we wanted to, to get that we're one hundred percent in support of this resolution. And certainly we're not going to do anything in the way of sitting back. If anyone is going to challenge the Second Amendment Right because...so thanks for taking the time and coming out today.

Usually the Director says you can leave after...most people run out that door."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I can't believe you're staying. (Laughter) I'm shocked. It never happened before. Thank you again."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "The only other comment I have with regards to the Budget...I'll save my actual comments. I made some comments at the last meeting but I just want to say briefly it's a very good Budget and it's great to see the decrease again for the taxpayers in this County.

But I just want to thank Freeholder Kelly, our staff, and all our Directors, especially Julie, sitting here in the front with Carl and Mike. A lot of work goes into this Budget every year and it's always done with the taxpayers as the first priority. And since I've joined this Board, I've been very, very happy with the outcome that we've come up with over the last two years. And moving forward it's great to see that all the programs will continue to be funded and new programs are going to be put into place.

So Jack, thank you for your hard work and to the rest of the staff. Thank you very much."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Freeholder Little?"

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. And I also would like to make a couple of brief comments. Thank you Freeholder Kelly for your leadership in the Budget, Julie, and all of our staff.

Not only is this the fourth lowest tax rate in the State of New Jersey - fourth lowest County tax rate in the State of New Jersey - this will maintain our AAA Bond Rating. And something especially for all the ladies and gentlemen who are here today...this Budget includes, roughly, \$75 million for our Roads and Bridges.

You noticed at the beginning of the meeting we did a couple of Ordinances regarding roads and bridges. And it's good that folks are here because very few people understand we have the largest County road system in the State of New Jersey – 625 miles. That's the largest County road system in the State. And we have, actually, think about it, we live on the coast, we have rivers and streams and of course the bay. We have 250 Bridges and Culverts here in Ocean County. So it is a massive expense each year. We have a great Road Department. A great Transportation Department. We have 1,600 vehicles - 1,600 vehicles that we maintain in this County Budget to operate and maintain our roads and bridges.

And as Freeholder Quinn did, I also would like to thank all of you for coming here today to support the Second Amendment. I am a strong supporter of that. The most important thing that we can do as advocates to defend our rights, our Second Amendment...all of you know we have nine Supreme Court Justices. There are four Supreme Court Justices who are solid supporters of the Second Amendment. We have four who are vigorously opposed to the

Second Amendment. And we have one Supreme Court member who is kind of the swing vote on all of those issues. And it is important that the next vacancy on the United States Supreme Court be filled by a President who will support the conservative views and the Second Amendment. That he appoints he or she, the next President, appoints a new Supreme Court Justice. There will be vacancies in the next few years. I think most of you are astute with all of that in understanding. And we need that fifth vote to maintain the Second Amendment. It's folks like you who make the difference and it will make the difference for the future of our country. So I thank you as well as the entire Board for coming out today."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Freeholder. Freeholder Kelly?"

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Thank you. I'm just wondering how many people sitting here wrote us a letter asking us to support the Second Amendment? I just want you to know that we all have those letters."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "You saved me a lot of stamps. We don't have to reply Freeholder Kelly."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Angia, you could have turned around and looked. You know who all those letters came from. We have them all. We appreciate not only you coming today, but really that you took the time to write to us and tell us of your support for this. And certainly we support you because all of us support the United States of America and our Second Amendment Rights. Thank you for coming today. We do appreciate it.

And Julie, I want to thank you for all my hard work. (Laughter) Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you. Freeholder Haines?"

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "Thank you Mr. Director. First I'd like to thank Freeholder Kelly for the work that he put in along with Julie and her staff. They did an excellent job with this Budget. It does cover everything that is most important for the people of Ocean County in this Budget. I am the liaison for Ocean County Parks which many of you may or may not know, we have the largest Park System in the State of New Jersey, which we will be building a new park in Manchester Township which is going to be done probably in the next few years. So as I said...and of course it's always necessary to make sure we have monies that are in the Budget that are going to be able to continue to operate the parks that we have - whether it's passive or recreation or just the woods that people can walk in like we have with Forked River Mountains and things such as that.

The other thing is I want to thank you for coming. Many people don't know but I've had a Firearm's ID card for probably over 30 years. I may not own a firearm right now but I do have one and I am one hundred percent behind you because this is what America stands for. This is what we're all about – our Constitution, our Bill of Rights.

I want to thank you for taking the time today out of your busy day to come here and express your concerns with the Second Amendment. And thank you again.

On another note, the other night I had the pleasure of attending Intermediate South... it's a musical that the sixth through eighth graders...it's called 'Suessical Junior.' It's really such a pleasure. If anyone gets an opportunity to go to any of these plays that are put on by the students that attend the different schools throughout Ocean County because you can see that there is a lot of talent in these young people that are doing these plays in the schools. And hopefully, some of the ones that I had been witnessing the last three or four years going to these different plays, that someday maybe they will be on Broadway or on film. But I mean it was just such a pleasure to go. And it was really very cute. It was all based on Dr. Suess and it's called 'Suessical Junior.' It was really very good. It was at the Intermediate South here in Beachwood but it's with the Toms River School District. But it was such, such a great evening to see these young people getting up there and the talent that we have in the future of our young people. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you. And again, we would like to thank everyone for attending. And I just want to briefly say after listening to the other four members of the Board of Freeholders that, 'What's America all about?' It's listening to the people. And part of a Democracy is having equal representation but it's also people expressing themselves. Feeling comfortable – coming to us – freedom of speech. And many times in Government, we say, 'Is anyone listening? Does anyone care?' Well, you can answer that question on the way out today. We did two things. We passed, of course, supporting the Second Amendment, which we believe in. But we want you to see how we were to vote and we wanted you to stand up and say, 'You know something, this is the direction we want to see Ocean County going.'

The next thing on the County Budget. You turn on the T.V. sometimes you get upset. You see money being spent on the Federal Government, the State Government. They're printing money continuously. Who's going to pay for it? Our grandchildren and their children. And so we are very aware of the fact that we have a AAA Bond Rating, not just because of one day or 10 years. I've been on the Board for 39 years. It was like this since I came on the Board of Freeholders. It's your money. And we're here to manage your money. And what we want to do is to make sure the AAA Bond Rating is the highest rating you can get anyplace. We're not just saying that. It's in the United States of America. And there's two sides to the Budget - the money that comes in, again, as Freeholder Kelly mentioned before, the rate went down. And the money that's spent. We do our best to control the size of Government. In the United States we have two problems. They spend too much money and it's not fair money. And why do they spend it? Because they worry about election to election. They have lobbyists. And who runs Government? Well, in this Board of Freeholders, okay, it's not the oil companies as you know. It's not the financial districts. It's not big pharmaceutical companies. It's you. The people that are here today. And you have seen for yourselves and you can go back and take a look at the Budget. You come back to the next Public Meeting. And as liaison with Senior

Services...of the 600,000 people in Ocean County, 200,000 are senior citizens. And we made a commitment going back many years ago, that our senior citizens will not go hungry. And we have home-delivered meals. And as we get cut backs from the State and Federal Government, this Board has used taxpayer money to make sure those 200,000 people are treated the way Americans should be treated. They lived through the Depression. They served in World War II. They went through the Korean War. They pay their taxes. They're legal, American citizens. They vote in every election.

And we have said, the frail, the elderly and the vulnerable will not suffer in the greatest nation in the world. And this Budget goes to support that. And we can talk about our parks and the libraries and the schools...on the other side all of our students have the greatest opportunities you can get as Americans. A great College. A great Vocational School. The best of libraries. That's where the money goes. It's your money. And we invite you not only to come back next week but to participate in what takes place in your government.

So, again, we thank you. And many times we do something on this Board and we say, 'Is anyone listening?' You don't read it in the newspapers. It's not going to be on the radio. But you can see firsthand what is taking place. And we hope, we hope that you think that we're doing a good job. And again, that democracy does work. And I have a lot of faith in America. I have a lot of faith in the younger generation that's growing up. But we need more and more people to participate and not to give up and say, 'You know, it doesn't make any difference. What's one voice? What's one person?' It means a great deal. I've been an educator for 40 years. And one of the things that we always teach is participation. Speak out. Make a difference and make a change. And I think that's what is showing today by you coming.

So that concludes our..."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Can I add one more thing?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Freeholder Little."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Mr. Director, thank you. I see one gentleman with a Navy hat on. So we have at least one veteran here but I suspect there are many others among...that's what I was going to say. So on behalf of the Board, we appreciate very much all of your service to our nation. We have a great Veteran's Department here and this Board is tremendously supportive of our veterans here in Ocean County.

Not only do we have the most roads in the State, we have the most veterans in this State. So we appreciate all of you."

(Applause)

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Freeholder Kelly."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Freeholder Director, you talked about the fact that the Board is careful on how it spends money. I want to illustrate just how careful we are.

In 1977, the 2% cap law was put in place. Since then we have not only met that cap law every year, but we have spent \$11,426,000.00 less than we were allowed under the 2% cap. So we are very careful on how we spend your money. Not only do we support your right to have a gun, but you see we don't spend too much money because we don't want you to use those guns on us. (Laughter)

So we always do watch. This is your bank. This is just one illustration. We can do a lot. But it's here in the notes that Julie did give me what we're doing. So I want, even the Board to understand that, that's how careful we are with how we spend the money. And this year the cap banking was not utilized for this Budget. We didn't even go there where we didn't need to use anything outside that gap.

Thank you Mr. Director."

V. **PUBLIC COMMENTS** - "Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of five (5) minutes per speaker."

At 4:43 PM, Freeholder Director Vicari opened the meeting to receive comments from members of the public.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Any other comments from members of the Board of Freeholders or Professional Staff? Seeing none, I open it now to members of the public. Anyone that would like to speak please come up. Give your full name and address and you have the microphone for the next 5 minutes. And anyone else that would like to speak can do so."

JASON BUTOW, 2115 LACEY ROAD, FORKED RIVER: "Well first I want to ask a question. Lacey Road, itself, has a lot of dump truck traffic. And when I called to find out when it was due to be paved I couldn't get really a straight answer. I was just wondering if somebody could get on that because the road is falling apart."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "John, do you have a straight answer? When is Lacey Road...?"

ENGINEER ERNST: "There's sections that are being paved, yes. I can give you that information."

JASON BUTOW: "From Aspen to the Parkway."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Jason, do me a favor. Stay after the meeting. We'll give you the answer. If not, you can call me up tomorrow but you will get an answer."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "For a straight answer, there's the guy. That's our County Engineer and he'll be able to give you the exact schedule of what's going to be paved."

JASON BUTOW: "Alright. That's not what I came here for today. I figured since I'm here. Might as well drop it."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "You heard that we're spending \$75 million for roads that's why..." (Laughter)

JASON BUTOW: "I had some things that I was going to say today that obviously I'm not going to have to say. But I did want to come up here and tell you guys...I read an article from the Press, written by Erik Larsen, of the situation with the illegal immigration that you guys are... many people are fighting the State on."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Yes."

JASON BUTOW: "I read the article. And some of the comments you guys have in here...I just want to say I'm proud of you all."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you."

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "Thank you."

JASON BUTOW: "And I appreciate it. And to continue to fight. And I hope in the future we can get our local government with us to fight what's going on up there because they don't want to hear us. Ever."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "We hear what you're saying."

JASON BUTOW: "We hope that you're all with us."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "We have good news too and that is that the Federal Government has now joined with us in this all. So again, not only in New Jersey, but in three states throughout the country."

JASON BUTOW: "Yes. I read that and that's excellent. Thank you guys. I just wanted to say that."

JEFF PEREIRA, 168 WARREN GROVE ROAD, BARNEGAT: "One question while we're on the topic of roads. I might as well throw it out there. Parks – Cedar Bridge Tavern. Are you familiar with Cedar Bridge Tavern? Cedar Bridge Road is atrocious. Ever since they started the construction, the road is actually impassible at most times, especially after it rains. So it gets completely flooded. I mean it's just horrible. I wanted to know, is anybody doing anything about Cedar Bridge Road? From Warren Grove Road right to the Cedar Bridge Tavern they've done nothing."

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "I know the road that goes to Cedar Bridge Tavern...it's just a dirt road."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "John's looking it up."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "We're looking it up. I'm sorry we didn't get an answer for you but we will."

JEFF PEREIRA: "I mean it has no drainage. They messed that road up horribly."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Why don't you stay a few minutes and we'll give you an answer."

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "Mike Mangum, who's our Director of Parks is here. If you'll have a few minutes after this meeting and we'll go over that."

JEFF PEREIRA: "That's fine. My next question is back to the Second Amendment."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Yes."

JEFF PEREIRA: "I believe truly that the most important thing for all of us as United States Citizens is to be able to have the right to carry. That is the ultimate, not just for me, I mean I can pretty much handle my own, but I have a daughter. I have a wife. Things in this state are getting very bad. I mean I've lived here my entire life – 45 years. We're seeing crimes that we've really never...I never grew up with before. Sooner or later...I mean I need to be able to arm my daughter. I need to be able to arm my wife. And we all need to be able to arm ourselves because let's face it, we can all protect ourselves in our houses. It's when we step out the door that we can't protect ourselves. And I can't be with my daughter or my wife 24/7. So you know, they both know how to use firearms very well. The thing is and I don't know how to do this on a County level, but we need to figure out a way so that we as legal gun owners can actually carry.

I've been to other States. I've carried concealed. I've carried open. It's not a problem. And I just don't understand why we can't do it here when I walk out of my property."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Because we're in a Liberal Northeast."

JEFF PEREIRA: "That's right."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "And something the State of New Jersey, the Governor and that they control both, as you know, that party controls both houses of the State Legislature."

JEFF PEREIRA: "Right."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "So we have done the best that we can do and so we appreciate you letting us know your feelings."

JEFF PEREIRA: "Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. Anyone else? Usually I say tell us things you like and you don't like about this. I want to say, tell us the things you like. And things you don't like, talk to..."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "John Ernst."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "John Ernst. (Laughter) He got two out of two so far. So Mr. Ernst you're here for a long night. Anyone else before I close the public portion? If you have any questions I'll be here after the meeting.

And again, if there are no other questions from the members of the public I move the public portion to close and a motion to adjourn."

ORDINANCE #2020-1

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$3,000,000 FROM THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF STORMWATER MANAGEMENT FACILITIES AT VARIOUS LOCATIONS, ALL IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY

WHEREAS, the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean recognizes the need for the construction of stormwater management facilities at various locations, all in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the County that funds be available for this purpose.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS of the COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING), as follows:

SECTION 1: \$3,000,000 is hereby appropriated from the Capital Improvement Fund for the cost of construction of stormwater management facilities at various locations, all in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey; and, which sum shall also cover fees and contingencies.

SECTION 2: The capital budget of the County of Ocean is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program, as approved by the Director of Local Government Services, is on file with the Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

SECTION 3: After passage upon first reading of this ordinance, the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders is hereby directed to publish the full text of the ordinance, together with the notice set forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF PENDING ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-19, at least seven days prior to the date set for public hearing and further consideration for final passage (which date shall be at least ten days after introduction and first reading). The Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders is further directed to comply with all provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-17(b) regarding postings, publications, and the provision of copies of this ordinance.

SECTION 4: After final adoption of this ordinance by the Board of Chosen Freeholders, the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders is hereby directed to publish the full text of this ordinance, as finally adopted, together with the notice set forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-19.

SECTION 5: This ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

ORDINANCE #2020-2

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING VARIOUS ENGINEERING, ROAD, AND BRIDGE IMPROVEMENTS, AT VARIOUS LOCATIONS, ALL IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND APPROPRIATING \$3,500,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$3,325,000 IN BONDS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN TO FINANCE THE SAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING), AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. There is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the County of Ocean as general improvements, various engineering, road, and bridge improvements, at various locations, all in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, in accordance with plans and specifications on file in the Ocean County Engineering Department, including all else necessary therefor and incidental thereto.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared that the improvements or purposes, the estimated cost of the improvements and appropriation therefor, down payment and estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes authorized are as follows:

SECTION 3. There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$3,500,000, including the sum of \$175,000 as the down payment, for the improvements or purposes described in Section 1 hereof as required by the Local Bond Law. The down payment has been made available by virtue of provision in the Capital Improvement Fund of the County of Ocean in one or more previously adopted budgets.

SECTION 4. There is hereby authorized the issuance of negotiable bonds in an aggregate principal amount of \$3,325,000 to finance part of the cost of the purposes stated in Section 1 hereof. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding the limit authorized by law, and the maturities, method of sale and other details thereof shall be determined by subsequent resolutions to be adopted in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 5. In order to temporarily finance the purposes provided for in Section 1 hereof, there is hereby authorized the issuance of bond anticipation notes of said County in an aggregate principal amount of \$3,325,000. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the County Comptroller; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and shall be in such form as may be determined by the

County Comptroller. The County Comptroller shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued

pursuant to this Ordinance, and the County Comptroller's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence

as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the

provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8.1. The County Comptroller is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes

from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of

payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The County

Comptroller is directed to report in writing to the Board of Chosen Freeholders at the meeting next succeeding

the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this Ordinance is made. Such report must include

the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and

the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 6. The County reasonably expects to commence acquisition and/or construction of the

improvements described in Section 1 hereof, and to advance all or a portion of the costs in respect thereof,

prior to the issuance of bonds or notes hereunder. To the extent such costs are advanced, the County further

reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this

bond ordinance, in an aggregate amount not to exceed the amount of bonds or notes authorized in Section 2

hereof. This bond ordinance is intended to be a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation

Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 7. Any grant monies received for the purposes described in Section 1 hereof, shall be

applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the obligations issued

pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be

reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

SECTION 8. The amount of the proceeds of the obligations authorized by this Ordinance which

may be used for the payment of interest on such obligations, architects' fees, accounting, engineering and

SECTION 9. The Capital Budget of the County of Ocean is hereby amended to conform with the

public inspection.

SECTION 10. It is hereby found, determined and declared as follows:

A. The improvements or purposes described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance are not current

SECTION 8. The amount of the proceeds of the obligations authorized by this Ordinance which

may be used for the payment of interest on such obligations, architects' fees, accounting, engineering and

inspection costs, legal expenses, and other items as provided in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 shall not exceed the sum of

\$1,500,000.

SECTION 9. The Capital Budget of the County of Ocean is hereby amended to conform with the

provisions of this Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. In the event of any such

inconsistency and amendment, the resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full

detail of the amended Capital Budget and Capital Program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local

Government Services is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders and is available there for

public inspection.

SECTION 10. It is hereby found, determined and declared as follows:

A. The improvements or purposes described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance are not current

expenses. They are improvements or purposes the County may lawfully undertake as general improvements,

and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property benefited thereby.

B. The average period of usefulness of the improvements for which the obligations authorized by

this Ordinance are to be issued is ten (10) years.

C. The supplemental debt statement provided for in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-10 was duly filed in the

Office of the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders prior to the passage of this Ordinance on first reading,

and a complete executed duplicate of such supplemental debt statement has been filed in the office of the

Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of

New Jersey, and such supplemental debt statement shows that the gross debt of the County as defined in

N.J.S.A. 40A:2-43 is increased by this Ordinance by \$1,425,000 and the obligations authorized by this

Ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

SECTION 11. In the event the monies set forth above for any purpose is not necessary for said

purposes, then such monies shall be for the completion of any of the other purposes provided for in this

Ordinance.

SECTION 12. The full faith and credit of the County of Ocean shall be pledged to the payment of

the principal of and interest on the bonds and notes authorized by this Ordinance, and as long as any of said

bonds or notes are outstanding, an appropriation shall be included in each annual budget of the County

hereafter adopted in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds or notes maturing

in each year. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the County, and the County shall be

obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the County for the payment of the

obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

SECTION 13. After passage upon first reading of this Ordinance, the Clerk of the Board of

Chosen Freeholders is hereby directed to publish the full text of the Ordinance, together with the notice set

forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF PENDING ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and

corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-19, at least seven days prior to the

date set for public hearing and further consideration for final passage (which date shall be at least ten days after

introduction and first reading). The Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders is further directed to comply

with all provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-17(b) regarding postings, publications, and the provision of copies of this

Ordinance.

SECTION 14. After final adoption of this Ordinance by the Board of Chosen Freeholders, the

Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders is hereby directed to publish the full text of this Ordinance, as finally

adopted, together with the notice set forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE"

(with appropriate completions, insertions and corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under

N.J.S.A. 40A:2-19.

SECTION 15. The Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County hereby covenants on behalf of the County to take any action necessary or refrain from taking such action in order to preserve the tax-exempt status of the bonds and notes authorized hereunder as is or may be required under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and the regulations promulgated thereunder (the "Code"), including compliance with the Code with regard to the use, expenditure, investment, timely reporting and rebate of investment earnings as may be required thereunder.

SECTION 16. This Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final passage.





NARRATIVE FOR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

COUNTY OF OCEAN 2020

The Ocean County Board of Chosen Freeholders, with the assistance of the County Administrator, Office of Management and Budget, County Engineer, County Planning Board and the County Comptroller, has developed this six-year Capital improvement Program and Budget. The Capital improvement Program was developed with the cooperation and consideration of recommendations of the various County Departments.

The County's continuing growth requires that the Board of Chosen Freeholders anticipates and plans for the increasing demands for County facilities and services. The Capital Improvement Program was prepared to guide County investment in land, facilities and equipment through 2025. The Program and Budget will be adjusted each year to reflect changing conditions including new Federal and State legislation, variations in the general economy, emerging demands of the public and modifications in the growth rate which may result in changes in revenue patterns and demand for new facilities or services. The Capital Improvement Program is realistic and attainable within the financial capabilities of the County and it provides for the future needs of Ocean County residents.

The accompanying forms which comprise the Capital Budget and six-year Capital Improvement Program have been completed in accord with regulations adopted by the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey pursuant to powers authorized by NJSA 52:27BB-10, NJSA 40A:4-43 to 45. The Capital Budget forms list all projects scheduled for startup for the 2020 Budget year and the source of funding for each project. A summary of Anticipated Funding Sources and Amounts is also included. Please note that this summary shows funding needed for new capital projects. It does not include previous appropriations for projects to be continued in 2020. For this reason, the funding summary differs slightly from the total cost shown for the Capital Program.

The total cost of all Capital Improvement Projects over the six-year period is \$374,292,128. Many of the projects will be funded under State and Federal Grant Programs or through the annual Budget on a "pay-as-you-go" basis. The larger projects will be funded by short-term borrowing. Bonds will be issued at the most advantageous times to secure low interest rates,

Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the recommendation to award Earle Asphalt \$1,925,013.13 to resurface various road surfaces throughout the County with a high friction surface treatment. This award is contingent upon NJ DOT approval. There is also a recommendation to award \$768,413.13 to Earle Asphalt for Stormwater Management Contract 2019A to rectify drainage issues in various towns in the County. The Engineering Department will also be applying for the NJTPA "Local Safety and High Risk Rural Roads Program" for improvements to the signalized intersection of Hooper Avenue and Church Road / Kettle Creek Road in Toms River. There were no questions or comments and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the January 15, 2020 Board meeting.

Ms. Cilento reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board Meeting of January 15, 2020. There were no questions or comments.

Freeholder Director Vicari asked the Board members for comments.

Freeholder Kelly mentioned to the Board that he has been having 2020 Budget meetings and plans to discuss the 2020 County Budget at the February 12, 2020 Pre Board Meeting.

Freeholder Director Vicari notified the Board that the new building for the Performing Arts Academy at OCC opened Monday, January 6, 2020. He thanked Dr. Jon Larsen for his assistance with the \$43 million dollar project, which moved the Performing Arts Academy from its site at the Naval Base to the grounds at Ocean County College. The state of the art classrooms will be shared by the students of OCC after dismissal of the Performing Arts Academy. The Freeholder Director paid tribute to the late Freeholder Bartlett for spearheading the project which was completed on time and under budget.

Mr. Block notified the Board that there is \$140 million dollars in State Bond money available for Library construction. The County can apply for multiple projects. The application which will need to be completed by the Library, Engineering and Finance Departments is due by March 9, 2020. We are working closely with the Library Commission Staff and Director Susan Quinn to prepare the application.

Anthony Agliata will be preparing a preliminary study of Block 608, Lot 19.01, which is the Hooper-Caudina Redevelopment Plan Area.

Freeholder Kelly told the Board that the Fire Marshal's Department has undergone some operational improvements. A new Standard Operations Procedures Manual comprised with input from Dan Mulligan the County Fire Marshal, and Freeholder Kelly has been issued.
