The Regular Meeting of the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean was called to order on November 5, 2014 at 4:00 PM, Room 119, County Administration Building, 101 Hooper Avenue, Toms River, Ocean County, New Jersey, with Freeholder Director Vicari presiding. Members Kelly, Bartlett, Lacey and Little were present at the call of the roll

B. PROCLAMATION

DIRECTOR VICARI: "The first item of business, Mrs. Vasil, is the proclamation please?"

CLERK VASIL: "Thank you Freeholder. With us today we have Michael Weinstein. If he would come forward? We will be proclaiming November 2014 as "Pancreatic Cancer Awareness Month" in Ocean County."

Clerk Vasil reads the proclamation.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you. And again, we are here today to make people not only aware of it, but in Ocean County we have a very aggressive program led by the liaison to the Board of Health, Freeholder Little and Dan Regenye who is here today to make sure that not only is early detection very, very important, but the type of treatment and opportunities that people have today to choose the kind of treatment that they want. So we have those options that are very, very important. And again, we would like to have a presentation by you and some comments from you."

MICHAEL WEINSTEIN, PANCREATIC CANCER ACTION NETWORK: "On behalf of the New Jersey affiliates of the Pancreatic Cancer Action Network, I'd like to thank the Board for having me here today and for this proclamation. The Pancreatic Cancer Action Network, as you heard, is the only national organization providing hope for those suffering from pancreatic cancer through their comprehensive approach.

My involvement started on November 26, 2005, to be exact, when I went into the Emergency Room with a case of diverticulitis and was told that 'oh, by the way, you also have a tumor in your pancreas'. After having a year of treatment through radiation and chemotherapy and no change in my tumor, it was determined that I had been misdiagnosed and went through all of that treatment for nothing. However, I consider myself a very lucky person because only 50% of those diagnosed with pancreatic cancer survive for 6 months. And only 26% survive for one year. So I survived that one year. I was still a lucky guy.

After another round of treatment for the tumor - cell type - I went to surgery. I had a two day surgery for a total of about 16 to 17 hours on the table broken up by a bad reaction to a blood transfusion. They thought they were going to lose me overnight. I pulled through. Spent 8 days after that in a coma, another in 40 days in the hospital. But after going through all of that, I was still a lucky guy because only 15% diagnosed actually get to surgery.

I went home cancer-free. Had a recurrence in 2012. Went back on treatment. Still I'm a very lucky because only 6% of those diagnosed survive 5 years or more. That's the lowest 5-year survival rate of any of the major cancers and the only one that's in the single digits. To this day, there is no early detection. There is limited amounts of treatment available. It's only through awareness that we're going to be able to move forward to find more research dollars, more researchers who are going to solve the problem of pancreatic cancer.

So this is why it's so important for the municipalities such as Ocean County to declare an awareness month to raise that awareness among the public so that hopefully going forward we will be able to improve these numbers for those who suffer from this insidious disease. So again, I'd like to thank you for doing this important work for us and I hope to see you again next year."

MICHAEL WEINSTEIN: "I would like to thank the Board for all wearing their purple ribbon to raise awareness. That is our color."

Q. FREEHOLDER COMMENTS

At 4:13 PM, Freeholder Director Vicari received the following comments from members of the Board:

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I just would like to make a comment to the Board. I think the most important thing is to thank the people of Ocean County who gave me a great honor last night in my re-election. As you know, it was a very difficult one. I see people - looking at the audience now - more relaxed than before and in a different spirit. But again, we know it was very difficult, but justice and truth did prevail, you know, for all of us. It was a very long and tenuous campaign. For the students that are here today, you came to some of those meetings and I'm sure you discussed in class. I know your teacher was very concerned. And that's what democracy is all about. You have the right to, of course, express not only to express their viewpoints, but there's a proper way of doing it. In our system, our legal system, truth is very important and you have to have proof of what you say and there should be a source where your information came from. I'm sure you analyzed in detail and someday we hope that you see the process and that someday you will not only run for office, but perhaps become a Freeholder or a Senator or even beyond that particular point. So we hope you take that back to your class and your teachers and that you continue to

come after this particular course. I believe it's over at the end of December some time. And I just wanted to restate I know we heard this many, many times - you know when the election is over, but anyone that runs against any Republican they usually.....even if there's no name.....they usually get about 38% of the vote. And that's a given. And my job as a Freeholder is to represent all of the people. Not only those who voted for me, but those who did not. Those who didn't think it was important. But we try to win over the people of Ocean County so they can have faith and trust in what takes place. I hope the students that are here today realize that our meetings are done very professionally. It's an open process. We try to make it as transparent as possible to have people feel relaxed to ask a question. But there's a certain responsibility people do have when they decide to run against us and that is, of course, you can't deliberately mislead the people of Ocean County. The people of Ocean County are well educated. They want to get involved and they expect and demand, in my opinion, more than any place else in the State of New Jersey, by making sure that we behave with respect, with character and trust is very important to them.

So I thank them for the opportunity they have given me and to validate my time as a Freeholder for the last 33 years. We cannot be obsessed with hatred or bitterness. We're here to help people. My approach for the next 3 years is to do one thing, be very positive, be open-minded, to listen to people and serve the people of Ocean County. Not as a Republican. Not as any political party. But as someone who is really interested in making a difference. We're not perfect all the time, but we try to listen to the people. We're very analytical. When we analyze something, as you can see today, we have an open mind. We want thank you for coming to this meeting and we hope you express your opinion sometimes not only during the meeting, but even after the meeting. So again, thank you very much. And, of course, my colleagues on the Board, I know it was a very difficult time not only for me, but for all of us. Because they work so hard and this is continuing to be the best county to live and to work and to retire. We give people opportunities because of the fact that it's all five of us working together. There's not one person or two. It's all five of us with one common goal and that's to continue to make Ocean County the best place not only to live for ourselves, but for our grandchildren and their children someday. So again, I thank you again. I'll turn to my right, Freeholder John Bartlett."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Mr. Director, thank you. You know we, usually, at the meeting after the election, hold and reserve all comments about it until that time. Until it's over. I have always thought that was totally appropriate and the way it should be. So that's now over and we can congratulate you on the hard work that you did. You obviously went through a very difficult election. One that was personally insulting to you. But you held your head high through that process. You continued to run these meetings in the professional, dignified manner that they ought to have been run. We all respect that. So again, from myself and I'm sure speaking for everyone here, we regard that your election is not only a personal validation and vindication, but an affirmation of the work that this entire Board does. So again, congratulations and you have three years and two months to be sitting there. So congratulations."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. It's been a great privilege to serve with the members of the Board. Again, Freeholder Jack Kelly."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Thank you Mr. Director. I want to congratulate yourself and your family because this was certainly a family campaign. We saw that from the beginning to the end. Like today your wife, your daughter and your brother are sitting in the front seat, but your whole family was with you the whole way. You were, of course, supported by the Republican Organization and your colleagues on the Board, but to see how much your entire family pitched in was really good to see. Congratulations not only to you, but to your entire family for the hard work you did. I look forward to working with you for three more years."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Freeholder. Freeholder Gerry Little."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "We're all a little groggy today because we stayed out last night at a campaign celebration and then a lot of us went home and watched the returns from across America. For all of that, I don't think any of us were any prouder of what happened in Montana or North Carolina or all the Governorships that were switched over than right here at home in Ocean County with our Freeholder Director. We're very proud of Joe and his service. Jack works hard. John works hard. Jimmy works hard. And I work pretty hard myself. But none of us worked any harder than our Freeholder Director who has devoted his life to public service, to teaching and being a superintendent and devoting his life to kids and doing all of the things to help build a better future for our children. And I know he took this whole election very seriously and how hard it was on his family. We thank them for making sure that he made it through without falling down on us or anything. He bore up and we thank you very much and congratulate you Joe. I know the whole Board, all of us, are very proud of you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Freeholder. Freeholder Jim Lacey."

FREEHOLDER LACEY: "Joe, you know, I think Harry Truman said that if you can't stand the heat, get out of the kitchen. Am I correct, John Bartlett, on that?"

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Yes."

FREEHOLDER LACEY: "He said that. And certainly Joe, you can take the heat because I know you like to cook. Like everyone else said, you work hard and we've all been through it with personal attacks by people and particularly that individual that ran against you because he had nothing to talk about. I knew you could take it because I know the character that you are. The worst part of the whole thing is watching your family suffer and for that I'm sorry. But I want to congratulate you again. I did last night and I want to do it again publicly and I'm glad

you're here for another three years. Thank you Joe."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much Freeholder. If there are no other comments....."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Yes, I do."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "We'll give you an opportunity now to speak."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "I was staying on topic before."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "You were staying on topic. That's actually correct."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. And I wouldn't introduce this here, but it is the last meeting before Veterans Day next Tuesday. So here in Ocean County, especially for our young people, Veterans Day means a lot in Ocean County. We have more Veterans than any other county in the State. More than 68,000 men and women that served in our Armed Forces. So we encourage everyone to participate in a local Veterans Day ceremony at the VFW, American Legion, Vietnam Veterans Post, attend a parade. The big County Parade is here in Toms River. Go out and show your support on November 11th which used to be called, I believe Freeholder Bartlett can confirm this, Armistice Day. That actually involved World War I - the Armistice there and it was later changed to Veterans Day.

One of the other traditions that we do in this meeting is remember the POWs and MIAs who have been returned. We have about 83,000 MIAs, none of them are POWs any more, but we still have about 83,000 Soldiers, Sailors, Airmen and Marines who have been lost in various wars. The United States Defense Department and the VA have a whole program where we go and search for their remains, exhume them and return them here to the United States. I would like to mention that we have a number of them who have been found and recovered and are on their way home since our last meeting.

Army Staff Sgt. James Van Bendegom, 18 from Kenosha, Wisconsin and he was lost on July 12, 1967 in South Vietnam and died from his wounds in a Vietnam POW camp. He is being buried with full military honors on a date yet to be determined.

Army Cpl. Lonald Skeens of Johnson, Kentucky was lost on September 4, 1950 in South Korea. He was assigned to Company E, 2nd Battalion, 27th Infantry Regiment and he will be buried with full military honors on a date and a place yet to be determined.

Army Air Force 2nd Lt. Jimmie Collins, III who was 32. He was killed as a copilot of a B-24 Bomber that was lost over the Netherlands on June 21, 1944. Of course, that was World War II. He will be buried with full military honors on a date yet to be determined.

Pfc. Anthony La Rossa, US Army, Company L, 3rd Battalion, 38th Infantry Regiment was lost on February 13, 1951 in North Korea. He was accounted for on October 20, 2014 and will be buried with full military honors in his hometown when his remains are returned.

Capt. Richard L. Whitesides, US Air Force, was lost on March 26, 1964 in Vietnam. He was accounted for on October 24, 2014 and he will be buried in his hometown.

Sft. Michael Barra, US Army, Company C, 2nd Engineer Combat Battalion was lost on February 20, 1951 in North Korea and he will be buried in his hometown on a date yet to be determined.

It is the 50th - and all of us lived through that - the 50th Anniversary of the Armistice in Vietnam this coming year. So I'm sure we will be recognizing some of our Vietnam Veterans who really returned without the same kind of welcome that our Veterans deserve.

And lastly, I forgot to announce at our last meeting, Freeholder Bartlett is liaison to our Parks and Recreation Department and on November 11th - the 11th month, the 11th day, the 11th hour, 11/11/11 that's Armistice Day or now Veterans Day, our County golf courses will be providing a really good discount to Veterans on that day with free green fees. So I thank Freeholder Bartlett for his efforts in leading that. He gave me this to announce at the last meeting, but remember what happened at that meeting? It kind of got lost in the shuffle if you remember. So it's a memory that's past now. Right Freeholder? Thank you Mr. Director for the indulgence."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Any other comments from members of the Board of Freeholders? Administrator? Sheriff? Any comments before I close the meeting and open up to members of the public?

I'd just like to announce that the official County Christmas Tree Lighting will be held after the meeting on December 3rd and we would appreciate that if you come to the meeting you will give yourself a few extra minutes. And, before I conclude our part, so our students realize what's taking place. We want you to get a good job some day because Freeholder Gerry Little is going to take a look at what the National Debt is in trillions of dollars. That's real money now. Freeholder, you and me, everyone, so you know when you see this computer is operational. The Freeholder keeps accurate records and I used to get depressed when I used to hear the numbers, but your children and your children's children will still be working trying to pay off the interest alone. Freeholder."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Well, I wasn't going to bring up, but probably by the next meeting we will be at \$18 trillion in our National Debt. That's 'T' Trillion. We are now \$17.9 trillion in debt and everyone in this room - this is a US Debt Clock - for our young students here. If you've never looked at this, if you will go on the web it's usdebtclock.org - It's a nonprofit agency that monitors the debt from the US Treasury. And every one of us, according to this, owes per citizen - so that doesn't include those who are not citizens which are 20 to 30 million - \$56,097.00. usdebtclock.org So some of you students, especially, you can check that stuff out on the web. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you. That concludes the comments from members of the Board."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "

R. PUBLIC COMMENTS - Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of five (5) minutes per speaker.

At 4:28 PM, Freeholder Director Vicari opened the meeting to receive the following comments from the public:

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I would now like to open up to members of the public. Please come forward to the microphone. State your full name and mailing address. Yes sir."

SAM FOSTER, 108 TEAKWOOD DRIVE, BRICK: "I just want to say first, I was really depressed when he started talking about World War I and Vietnam because really I'm seeing how old I am. I remember when the Vietnam War ended. I was in Lake Riviera Middle School and I was still young. I'm 53 years old now. But it's like the 100th Anniversary of World War I battles. So it's been just a lot of history there. It's unfortunate that the news media hasn't reported this because it's important part of our history and our country and to Vets and the sacrifices they made.

I just want to say also that I want to congratulate you. I don't want to spend too much time because I congratulated you before the meeting. But I'm very glad you are returning here as Freeholder and I guess I should keep this for the Reorg. Meeting in January, but it's so packed in here at that time. Most of the time I can't even get in the room. So I want to say this - I'm glad you won. And I agree with what you said because you really do work very well together. All of you do. And I think that everybody.....most people that I speak to feel the same way.....we have a good group of Freeholders that really are concerned with the people in town and we really do appreciate it. We really do. I wanted to thank you for that. I know you did go through a lot during the campaign. I'm not going to brush on it, mostly because I don't want to bring up bad memories for you and everything.

I spoke in support of you before and I'm just very glad you're returning up there because you've done, all of you have done a great job for Ocean County over the years. The only thing I wanted to say and I'll make this very quick, and I mentioned this also when I spoke in the microphone before here, your opponent - I'm not going to name him by name - but he showed up here and he was disruptive by standing at the microphone and reading from the newspapers. Now that the election is over, where is he? If you want to be taken seriously as a candidate, no matter who you are or what level of government, you have to show the people that you're concerned and that your reason for running for election is to serve the public and you take an interest in that. Even though the meetings may be boring, the people that really do care..(laughter)....I'm sorry for saying that. Except for Freeholder Bartlett there! (laughter) But, seriously, if you want to show your sincerity that you're involved in politics to help the people, you need to go to political meetings like Council meetings, Freeholder meetings or an event, no matter how boring you might find that they are. Don't just show up here just before election and then stand at the microphone and read newspaper articles and things like that. You have to get involved and you have to show that you have some ideas that can improve the situation. I just wanted to say that because it's really disappointing in politics in general. A lot of people don't vote. I heard on the radio that the last election we had, had the lowest turnout of any mid-term ever. That's what I heard on TV at CNN and I was listening to the radio. I'm probably one of the few people that still watch CNN. I just wanted to comment on that.

And, like I said about the Vets, you know we have the 100 year anniversary of many World War I battles going on now. There's actually a website out there that has a day-by-day breakdown of what battles were fought. It's called 'Mental Floss'. I don't know if it's okay to publicize that because it's a humor website, but it does get very serious about battles likeI don't know how to pronounce those French names so I'm not even going to bother trying.

But congratulations on your election and all you Freeholders, I'm very glad that you're all working together and I think that our Freeholders will be able to help us as a County to work together. And, I'm glad that you're not going to be divided by having somebody who is an outsider and who does not have any, in my opinion, sincerity about the citizens in Ocean County. So thank you sir."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much, Sam. I appreciate it. Freeholder Gerry Little."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. And I apologize. I forgot one more thing that's important since the last meeting. I want to thank this Board. Jack and John and Jimmy and Joe. We were one of the first counties in the entire country to pass a resolution supporting the return of a United States Marine who was imprisoned in Mexico. Sgt. Andrew Tahmooressi. And the Board discussed this and I asked them to support it and I'm so very proud that in spite of the fact that our Commander in Chief never raised a finger to help this United States Marine.

There was testimony in the Mexican Court System that he had Post Traumatic Stress Disorder and he has been released. He has been returned to the United States. He's getting his treatment. And thank goodness and I appreciate the support of the Board when I asked them to help this Marine. One news organization. One. Can take some credit for this and that's FOX News. They are the only ones that followed this case and built the public support that over 100 members of Congress signed a letter to the President asking him to intervene. And hundreds of thousands of Americans citizens signed a petition online asking the President to intervene.

Now all that public pressure.....it was actually determined that the President of Mexico was watching FOX News which, of course, they can get, it's international, and seeing how this pressure was building and that the judge involved in the case.....so I can publicly thank FOX News for at least leading this effort and we have our Marine home. I thank the public because you've heard this speech about three or four times. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Well done. Anyone else from the public who would like to speak? Just come forward to the microphone. Yes. State your full name and mailing address for the record, please."

PAT KLASLO, 2076 BAY BLVD., ORTLEY BEACH: "Can I just ask when the last time any of you were over in Ortley Beach, especially on Bay Blvd.?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I was there recently as a matter of fact. Every Sunday my wife and I go there and I'm very concerned with the condition of not only the roads, but I spoke to many people. As a matter of fact I'm there every Sunday at the Lady of Perpetual Help Church. I talk to people there often. And also, with the Sheriff who is in the back, we not only go there, we go street by street, as the Sheriff can tell you at the end. I'm really concerned what's taking place. As a matter of fact, I even had several conversations with the business people with the Administrator, some of the businesses to make it as easy as possible. We know it's a hardship. We know there are serious problems there. It's a State road. I'm not going to point fingers about the State road, but whenever possible, if someone does give us a concern, we immediately....I refer it over to either the Administrator or to our Engineer, Frank Scarantino. We looked into it. I know there are many, many business people that were concerned last summer as far as access and egress to their property as far as parking goes.

As a matter of fact, there was one meeting going back about six weeks ago, I spoke about at this Freeholder Meeting about the damage done to my car. My family car continuously which I pay for. Not only is it a family car, but it's my wife's car. So I refuse to take my wife's car over there. But it's a serious, serious problem and I would appreciate if you can just tell us whatever the problem is and I will support it. I know there are problems there."

PAT KLASLO: "Okay. I'm talking about Bay Boulevard which is a County road."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Yes. I was there. Yes."

PAT KLASLO: "Could you tell me what.....you've seen it. It's a mess. People are not back in. Could you tell me why you paved the street already? Why was it paved? You spent taxpayer's money to do this. I'm trying to get into my house and I spoke to someone in your office who was very helpful. It was on a Friday afternoon. I believe it was October 17th. And by the end of the day they told me that everything was straightened out. It was fine. By Tuesday I got a phone call from the gas company stating that I have to send a letter for a hardship of why the street that had just been paved had to be dug up. Now I don't think I would just sit at home and make phone calls to say dig up the street. It's going to be a patchwork quilt by the time that road is finished. Are you going to repave it all over again? And if so, then why are we wasting taxpayer money?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "And your address please?"

PAT KLASLO: "2076 Bay Boulevard. It's right on the borderline with Lavallette."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "We'll get you an answer. Freeholder Kelly."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "We do have the County Engineer, but I will tell you the reason we have paved roads was to allow for the contractors to get their equipment into the whole area. Bay Avenue was included in that and it was part of our responsibility in working with the DOT. So it does seem silly. I can see why you would ask that question. But there was a real reason for it. And I'm going to ask Frank Scarantino to give further details, but that's a general understanding of why we would go in there. It was a request of the DOT so that they could move materials in and out and be able to use them because they were in such bad shape if you remember."

PAT KLASLO: "Well you fixed it up for the summer time. The road was fine for the summer. I don't know why they did a complete paving."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "I'm not sure of that. That's what I'm going to find out. But I was answering the first question – why did we pave it in the first place?"

PAT KLASLO: "Well because it's going to look like a patchwork quilt by the time it's over with. You know people are spending hundreds of thousands of dollars on their homes and you're going to have all the streets dug up. Now it took me over two weeks in order to get the gas company to come to have it dug up so I can connect the gas because I can't move into my home without gas. So I have to write a letter for a hardship, are you kidding me?"

FREEHOLDER LACEY: "Ma'am, I'm not really sure that its finish paved. Frank is it just that? Was it finish paved?"

FRANK SCARANTINO, COUNTY ENGINEER: "There are several good reasons why we made the decision to finish pave the road. The primary reason is it's become a patchwork of quilt out there. It's crisscrossed everywhere by utility trenches. There have been uneven settlements everywhere. It was my judgment that we would not sustain a winter without having degradation. So the surface course acts as a cap, if you would, to protect the underlying pavement. It prevents water from getting in all those seams. That's what the purpose of the surface course is. It doesn't have the same structural strength as the bottom courses. It's a finished course to preserve the entire unit. We made that decision. We estimated that there were six to ten services that might have to still occur and we do not require that they submit letters for waiver."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Who asked for this? So we can stay right on that because that was my understanding in my office with you. Who told you that you needed the waiver?"

PAT KLASLO: "The gas company called me directly and said that I had to do that."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "We will make sure that we reach out to the gas company. That is a general requirement of County government after we pave the road so I guess they didn't realize that we made special provisions because of the hurricane and everything that we went through. So we'll make sure that we reach out to them so that someone else doesn't go through what you went through. Because that is not required right now for a very good reason and you just put out there that there are a number of you. You're not the only one that has to open that road to put the gas in or whatever. So we did try to make that not happen and I'm surprised to hear that it did. But Frank is right here and he will make sure tomorrow the gas company is notified that will not be required. I apologize."

ADMINISTRATOR CARL BLOCK: "If I could add something. Actually when the issue came up, we've already had a conversation with Toms River Township for Ortley Beach and have also been in touch with the gas company already when this first came up. So that actually already taken care of."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "And we thought that was already taken care of, so I apologize for that. We thought we took action so that would not happen."

ENGINEER SCARANTINO: "Yes. There's been a little bit of miscommunication between the gas company and the residents."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "As you know, over there, there are so many different entities working and so many different conversations that sometimes they have a failure to communicate."

FREEHOLDER LACEY: "So Frank, will the finish course get milled off and then rebuilt or we don't want to finish now?"

ENGINEER SCARANTINO: "No. What happens is for these services, they are going to dig a two by two hole, pit if you would, and then they jack the service to the home. So it's minimal and there is a method of infra-redding that makes that"

FREEHOLDER LACEY: "Infra-redding that melts it."

ENGINEER SCARANTINO: "That makes that fully restored. The gas company will come back in the spring and do that as part of the requirements. We don't expect it to be overwhelming or detrimental to the roadway. We were looking to get closure out there. We've done the landscaping of the medians with native species as was requested by the Ortley Beach Association. We look to restore some livable conditions out there and as I said, it really wouldn't have sustained the winter without heavy degradation with all those cracks and joints from all of the various trenches and repairs. Thank you."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Does that explain it to you?"

PAT KLASLO: "It explains it. I just wanted to make sure because as I said, people are spending hundreds of thousands of dollars to fix their homes that you know what? I don't want to be driving down my street and out of my property and I'm hitting all these holes and everything else and it's not continuous pavement."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "And I would understand. I will tell you that we're not perfect. We are trying to do our best to handle the situations as they come up over there. There was a lot of different work that we had to do in areas so I wanted you to get a full explanation why. Your question was very good. Is this a waste of taxpayers' money? Or should the County not do it?"

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Jack, one other thing to point out and you live there so I don't have to tell you this, but"

PAT KLASLO: "Not yet because I don't have gas."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "But in many areas we lost Bay Avenue. The road was washed away, undermined. So in order to put it back together you have to pave it. I mean....we spent considerable effort because we were over there two or three days after the storm and areas that we drove on Bay Avenue because you couldn't drive on (Route) 35, two days later didn't exist because they had actually collapsed. So we were faced with the road had literally collapsed into holes."

PAT KLASLO: "It was across the street from me."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "So what I'm trying to say is if you rebuild that, you pave it. You can't do it halfway. You either do it or you don't. And if we hadn't rebuilt the road, you still wouldn't be anywhere near putting gas in because you couldn't have gotten to your house and your contractors couldn't have got there without our road being rebuilt. So it's the chicken and the egg kind of thing."

PAT KLASLO: "But the road was rebuilt and traffic was going back and forth and now you just did a final major paving. The sad thing is from the median to my house is fine. It had to be dug up in front of my neighbor across the street's house. That's why I'm concerned because of my house, I don't want the front of his house looking disgusting."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "When we're all done. If you're not satisfied and that road is not how it ought to be, give me a call."

PAT KLASLO: "Oh, I'll call you. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. Anyone else who would like to ask a question or make a comment please come forward to the microphone. Give your full name and mailing address."

SHEILA MCALLISTER, 2410 MOORE AVENUE, POINT PLEASANT: "I'm calling regarding issues regarding Ocean Ride, specifically that impact the financial and the medical well-being of Ocean County residents. Not only Ocean County residents, but residents of New Jersey and taxpayers within the State and within the nation.

I had brain surgery. I'm a patient at Columbia University Presbyterian and I had brain surgery in September. Upon returning home, I was required to go to some cognitive therapy at Brick Hospital and then going to different therapy at Kessler. I know that Ocean Ride will not bring me into other doctors that are in Monmouth County, right on the other side of the bridge. But Ocean Ride restrictsvery, very restrictive. So the hours of operation.....

First and foremost I want to make it abundantly clear, the drivers are the most compassionate, nicest people I have ever met in the world. So whatever they're making, they're not making enough. They are trying their best to meet our needs and they understand them because they're in it with us. And I also want to make it clear that I'm not here just speaking on behalf of myself. I can speak now. Thank God. We didn't know if I was going to get to this point. But there are lots of people who can't and there are lots of people who are not going to medical doctors, who are not getting the treatment they need, not getting the medication they need because they can't get to where they need to get. Or the system is too complicated.

The hours of operation, 8:30 to 4:30. The phones, they are never answered until around 4:45. Okay? So you're getting.....if it's an emergencyafter next day, call. Never answered until 8:45. Never, ever has that happened to me. So then when you call you have to call your appointments in two weeks in advance. So now with my cognitive therapy, I had worked with them and said okay we've got to do two weeks in advance so let's work out the next month. But when you get a sinus infection which seems rather minor in comparison to the brain surgery that I just had, sinus infections really bring you down. So here I am trying to get to a sinus doctor and they're saying 'you have got to schedule this two weeks in advance'. With all due respect, you can't schedule a sinus infection. And if you could, I never would. I need to get to a doctor. 'Well we can only bring you two weeks from now'. And they're very uncompassionate. Very, very uncompassionate and rude.

Working my way up through the chain, more uncompassionate and even ruder. And I saw their salaries. I saw the salaries that we the taxpayers are paying for. And I also feel compelled to remind the taxpayers, just in case they don't know, that Ocean Ride is paid through our taxes. In addition to that, if you use Ocean Ride services, we have to pay for the ride. It's \$7.00 per ride, per way to Brick Hospital. Why are we forced to pay for this service? Because if I had that money, how much of my taxes are going towards that and perhaps I could do that with some other service that's more reliable.

The other thing is it was closed on Election Day. So how many people who were sick or old couldn't vote yesterday."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "You could vote by absentee ballot very simply."

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "Do they know that?"

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Well, as a citizen, I think it's one's responsibility. I can't tell you whether the person knows that or not. The system does make provision for that, perfectly."

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "You know what? You're redirecting to the system, but....."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "That's what we're talking about."

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "Yea. But I'm going to bring up a bigger picture. It's actually is larger than the State of New Jersey. Which I spoke directly to Chris Christie about all of these issues because even it disconnects between Ocean and Monmouth Counties. There used to be a connection between Ocean County and SCAT – Monmouth County. That stopped for some reason. Nobody knows why. I'm thinking it has to do with monetary reasons. I think it's a pretty good hint. Making it all one system. The State of New Jersey did not close and they helped people. They, thank God, got me to Kessler Institute. But there's places where they can't bring me because they'll say 'well, no, you could use Ocean Ride for that so we can't bring you there'. And then Ocean Ride wants 2 weeks in advance. So I'm caught and it's at a point where my healthcare is being inhibited."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Anything else? We'll answer the question. Are there any other questions on your list?"

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "Yes. I've got quite a few. But first I have to bring up the issues. There are multiple issues. I won't take up too much time, but I'm paying \$80 because Ocean Ride wouldn't drive me here at 4:00 even though they close at 4:30. So the lack of coordination. Misinformed, so the left hand didn't know what the right hand is doing. The drivers are telling me and some of the dispatchers are telling me 'yea, you can go to Monmouth County, but only between the hours of 10:00 and 2:00 on Thursday. So then I'm thinking okay, these doctors that I need to see, I'll try to make appointments with them on Thursdays. It's very, very hard to do. Then it winds up Kessler takes me for Tuesdays and Thursdays. I'm not giving up Kessler. Kessler's getting me back to work.

I spoke with V.P. and he said there's no way. We don't do any rides to Monmouth County. We don't do that. Whoever told you that is 100% wrong. I called back then the people who issue the rides and said I need confirmation here. Am I going to get there or not? While I'm calling, I'm getting another phone call in from them, it's the V.P......"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Next question."

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "You're not going to rush me."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I'm not rushing you, but you said you paid \$80 to come here, I just don't want you paying any more money for a ride."

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "I know, but you're not going to rush me."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I'm not rushing you."

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "Okay. So now I'm going to get that point through. The V.P. had to call me and say, 'I apologize. I was 100% misinformed. There are rides. You can have services and there is coordination, just on Thursdays, between 10:00 and 2:00.'

So again, taxpayers of Ocean County are paying for this. And we would have to pay additional if we actually took the ride. All right? And the question will come at the end and I won't be rushed until I get through to the end. I'm going to get my \$80 worth okay?

One person even had the audacity of telling me to change doctors. And I said....I'm not going to disclose to everybody here. I'm very ill and the people that you're treating, most of them are ill. They're not just old. In order to get the service, it took me a long time because I had to have the award of permanent disability. I said 'no, I don't have that award. I'm going back to work.' I have awards on my wall. I'm trying to get back to work so I can earn more of awards. My doctor and yes, the Governor, had to intervene to make sure that I got this service because I don't have the award.

I was called stupid. I said, 'Well okay, what's your name? Now I need to talk to your superior and what's your name?' He told me his name and he says 'and just in case you're stupid, I will spell it for you.' That's me. Imagine what a poor older person is going through.

Now, my question to you is, on behalf of the residents of Ocean County, residents of the State of New Jersey – because we've got to get to other doctors outside of this County – and yea....I go to Columbia. So to get to Columbia its trains, planes and automobiles. How do I get there? And how much are my tax dollars are being are being allocated towards this service and do I have to pay for taxes? How can I get them pulled? That's my question. I don't want to pay them. I want the money back so I can get services that actually meet my needs. But then again, I am here to speak on behalf of people who are suffering, but can't come here and talk. So they just suffer along and they get sicker. That's my question to you. How much of our tax dollars are being allocated towards Ocean Ride? Towards those executive level position people who don't even know what services are offered? Towards an organization that only says they are 8:30 to 4:30, but you can't get a ride past 2:30? And they don't answer the phone until 8:45 am and they need 2 weeks in advance."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you."

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "No. I want the answer to the question."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I will give you the answer when you complete it. I don't want to interrupt. I want to be polite. Are you finished?"

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "Yes."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Sit down and we'll give you the answer."

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "I don't need to sit down. I can look you right in the eye."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Well you don't understand the procedures, but we'll do the best that we can to explain it. The Freeholder that's in charge of that department is Freeholder Gerry Little. He has a Department Head that's here today that will explain to you. If it's not clear enough, after the meeting we will be more than happy to spend as much time as possible. I'll turn it now over to Freeholder Gerry Little."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Well, first of all, Ms. McAllister, we certainly appreciate that you're trying to get back

to work. We regret your health problems. Actually you are a role model to try to get back to work and get your life back in order.

I will tell you this, the predominant amount of funding for Ocean Ride comes from the Casino Revenue Fund. The programs from Ocean Ride, according to State law, are funded through the Casino Revenue. A lot of this information, I believe, you can find on our website. Have you ever looked at our website?"

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "Yes I did thoroughly."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "It's funded by the Casino Revenue Fund. In the last few years, we've lost over \$2 million from the Casino Revenue Fund because as you may or probably are aware, what was a booming casino industry....."

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "I'm aware of that."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Well you wanted an explanation, so I'm trying to offer it to you.

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "Yea I know, but....."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "So please don't interrupt me."

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "Okay. Yea, but when you talk about salaries of the people who know what's going on and the people who don't....."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "If I may....."

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "How much does this cost?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay, listen, the Freeholder would like to explain......"

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Julie is the Budget, she'll tell you the money."

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "How much does this cost? And that Administrator that didn't know the answer, how much does he get paid?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Just listen to the Freeholder."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Julie? Tell her, whatever. You have the Budget."

JULIE TARRANT, COMPTROLLER: "What program we are talking about? Ocean Ride?"

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Ocean Ride."

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "Ocean Ride. NJACCESS, Governor Christie was more than happy with me and we are working on trying to get these all – there's 21 counties in the state – there's no reason why they all can't be in NJACCESS. I'm working with him already on that."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Well that's up to the Governor. We're not going to get into that."

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "Well I want to know how much is getting taken out of my tax dollars. And how much of an allocation of money."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Is that a proper question? I mean....."

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "Yes it absolutely is. It's my money."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "It's my money too. Right? And I don't use it. My father who is 95 years old and has to go to the doctor quite a lot, I take him. He doesn't make use of the public things and he pays taxes on his house too. So everyone in this room, ma'am, pays taxes and sometimes we like the services that are rendered and sometimes we don't, but we don't get to pick and choose what we pay for. Some people are able to make use of those services and some people aren't. Some people choose to and some people choose not to. It's not quite as simple as you say."

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "Some people cannot afford. Your father can afford to get....."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "You don't know what my father at 95 can afford or not."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "It's State funding...."

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "What allocation of our taxes goes towards Ocean Ride services? How much is the allocation? And then when you go into Ocean Ride, how are the salaries allocated? We've got some high riders there that don't even know that we go to Monmouth County on Thursdays. That's pretty bad. They make nice salaries."

COMPTROLLER TARRANT: "There are salaries that are funded by County taxes for Ocean Ride, mainly drivers."

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "No. I'm not talking collectively. Because collectively you might say six drivers, but the

one person that couldn't answer the question correctly makes more. He makes just as much as six drivers put together."

COMPTROLLER TARRANT: "I don't think it's all broken down....."

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "I do. And I've spoken with Christie and I've spoken with Legislators about it because this is unethical."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "In any event, to go back to the story."

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "Okay. We're ending this. It's okay it's unethical and we don't care if doesn't provide your services or anybody else."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "I'm going to get to those questions miss. It is funded by the Casino Revenue Fund – the overwhelming amount which Julie......I wish you would subtract the two."

COMPTROLLER TARRANT: "\$1.5 million comes from the Casino Revenue Fund."

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "We know the Casino Revenue is going down. Find another way to get revenue. Work with Christie. He wants to have a talk. Nobody's happy to talk."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Well he hasn't sent us a check. We would be happy to do that if the Governor would send us a check."

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "He wants to have a meeting with all the Freeholders to talk about this."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Well that's very good. As soon as he walks through that door with a check and we'll do whatever he wants."

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "He doesn't have to pay for it. You merge it. Every county pays their own allocation."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "We're already paying. You're saying it's not enough."

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "Make it one unit."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Well that's not the way it is at this time."

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "How big is your pocket? Take this person out of here..."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "As a result of the funding cuts that have come down in the last four or five years because of the downturn of the casino industry, our Ocean Ride system has indeed made many, many cuts. We have frozen all programs. We have frozen the number of drivers. We have limited services and we have imposed a fare rate and we're trying to save the system rather than eliminate it altogether."

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "Which any businessman would say no. Find another way to fund it. Because right now every one of your solutions to that problem could be fixed."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "No. We didn't say they were solutions."

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "And it's at the mercy of us. Every one of your solutions."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "We do not have enough funding to provide transportation to everyone....."

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "Well find it from somewhere else and don't rely on Atlantic City. Atlantic City isn't going to happen."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "That's a question for....."

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "No that's a question for the people running the County."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "That's right. We are funding all of our programs whether it's the Sheriff's Department.....

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "You don't cut the services, you find ways to fund them in other ways."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Well we are not going to expand the taxes. We are not going to expand the programs or services. I'm just trying to be honest with you and forthright."

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "So you're going to keep charging us, but you're going to limit what is available."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "That is correct."

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "Okay. Excellent. Excellent. Thank you very much and I'm very glad that.....so you're going to keep charging us."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "We have a fare in place that was"

SHEILA MCALLISTER: "So you've added fares. So you're going to keep this at its funding the same. Okay. Keep charging us. Keep relying on Atlantic City which is going on...1.."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "That's by law."

Our residents can navigate recycling in Ocean County with the directory. Ernest Kuhlwein, Director of Introduced Waste Management was in attendance and advised that the Recycling Director will

also be posted on the Solid Waste Management website. Freeholder Vicari stated that in most cases people are willing to do more recycling. This is a great service for our County residents.

Freeholder Kelly noted that there is no agenda for the Engineering Department for the upcoming Board meeting.

Administrator Block advised the Board that Senior Services was listed for an update on its programs on today's agenda; however, the Director of Senior Services had a family emergency and requested to be removed from the agenda and added to the next PreBoard agenda.

Ms. Vasil reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of September 7, 2014. Freeholder Vicari advised that he has received a lot of positive comments regarding the ordinance for the upgrade of the radio system. Freeholder Kelly stated that this is a very important project for Ocean County. The County will be upgraded from 500 MHz to 700 MHz which will reduce the HDTV interference for emergency responders so they can communicate with each other better. Director Vicari stated that everyone will benefit from this and he commended Freeholder Kelly for his work on behalf of emergency responders. The Director also stated that the upgrade will greatly help municipalities and the County communicate with each other in emergencies. This ordinance builds the infrastructure to permit municipalities to upgrade their systems.

There were no questions or comments.

Director Vicari noted that he met with the Joint Base Commander last week, the Commander changes every two years. The Commander was very impressed with the relationship with Ocean County. The Freeholder advised that he will be attending a meeting with the Base at Ocean County College on September 17, 2014. The County continues to be vigilant regarding the Joint Base.

Director Vicari stated that he was a speaker at a Weights and Measures and Consumer Affairs seminar in Atlantic City. Consumer Affairs works everyday protecting consumers and businesses. The Director noted that it is very different in Atlantic City, there is not a lot of vehicle traffic; it is a sad day when casinos are closing down more and more. Freeholder Kelly stated there no more bus trips are to Atlantic City; other States have their own casinos. Hotels are not being maintained as they used to. Freeholder Kelly also noted that Atlantic County is trying to figure out how to make it viable again, how to attract a new wave of tourism to Atlantic City. Atlantic City was a casino meca. Freeholder Little stated that 40 out of 50 states have gambling now. Atlantic City is facing serious implications with job losses some of which will fall over into Ocean County. Freeholder Little noted that the Casino Revenue Tax (CRT) is used Introduce for senior and edisabled programs. The County has been losing funding for the last 5 to

6 years because the CRT has been going down. These are huge consequences due to the closing of the casinos.

Director Vicari asked the Board members for comments.

Freeholder Little thanked the Director for representing this Board at the VFW in Berkeley Township at a picnic for veterans in nursing homes.

Freeholder Little advised that the Board of Health is keeping a watchful eye for the virus known as Enterovirus D-68 (EV-D68). Thousands of cases have arisen across the Country; common sense is to wash your hands and avoid touching your eyes and mouth. The Freeholder noted that this is striking children the most. Freeholder Kelly noted that this is not new; however, there is no resistance built up since the last outbreak. Freeholder Little stated there is no vaccine for the respiratory virus.

Freeholder Little discussed Item No. 2 on the agenda, Special Initiative and Transportation Program budget amendment in the amount of \$71,630. This is federal funding the County has received since 2002. The County in partnership with St. Francis provides the funding for used cars for public assistance to single moms entering the workforce to provide a way to get to work. The Freeholder noted that 80 families will benefit from this program. Freeholder Little thanked St. Francis for their work on this program.

Freeholder Lacey stated that he represents the Board on the New Jersey Transportation Planning Authority (NJTPA). The NJTPA included thirteen other counties. The Freeholder noted that the County is always trying to improve its 247 bridges and culverts. Freeholder Lacey noted that the County will receive a grant in the amount of \$9.3 million for safety upgrades to Route 539 from the NJTPA. The Freeholder noted that Ocean County will receive the largest grant from the State. The total amount of grant funding the NJTPA awarded was \$12.4 million.

There were no additional comments.

Ms. Vasil read the resolution to move to closed session.

Freeholder Director Joseph H. Vicari opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Freeholder Director Vicari opened the meeting by introducing Jackie Rohan, Director of Senior Services, who will be providing a presentation on the status of the senior citizen programs in Ocean County. The Director discussed the preparedness of our seniors for the possible cut backs during the scheduled upcoming sequester. The office of Senior Services will be ready to assist the community in many different ways. The Southern Service Center was a valuable resource for the southern end of the County during and after Superstorm Sandy with the offices of FEMA, DRC, and SHRAP,

all mof whom assisted many residents. The Veteran's Office, as well as the Surrogate and Passport Offices have become a model for the State of New Jersey.

Ms. Rohan stated that although she has only been the Director of Senior Services for four months, she has been employed in the department for fourteen years which has given her much experience in dealing with situations that face the elderly throughout the County of Ocean. Unfortunately, hospital visits are a common occurrence amongst the elderly. Ocean County Senior Services has 42 contracts consisting of Home Support in order to keep the client residing in their own home for as long as possible, Community Support and Mobile Screenings aiming at prevention of illness and injury. Nutrition Support services for the elderly are also a very important factor of the program. Seventy one percent of the clients are considered high risk in terms of their nutritional needs. Ninety seven percent are at a moderate to high risk for poor nutrition. The County has provided over 140,000 meals from January through Meal delivery workers also assess seniors well being, and may August, 2014. subsequently, refer their case to other offices for additional services that they may benefit from. There are also congregate meal sites, such as the one located at the Southern Service Center on Route 9 in Manahawkin. These sites provide social settings for the elderly as well as good nutrition for a minimal cost of approximately two dollars per meal.

Ms. Rohan stated that services for the elderly and support for their caregivers can be provided from a variety of offices throughout the County. The office at 1027 Hooper Avenue in Toms River is the primary access site. There are also other satellite offices located throughout the County such as the Northern Resource and Southern Resource Centers as well as the County Connection in the Ocean County Mall which provides bussing from area sites. The Southern Service Center employs the staff of St. Francis church. They alone have administered 7,000 units of help. Ms. Rohan also mentioned that the Passport Office located in the Southern Service Center produces the most Passports in the County. In addition, the Veteran's Service office located at 1027 Hooper Avenue provides the sixty eight thousand military veterans in Ocean County access to State and Federal programs.

Director Vicari provided a comprehensive review of Ms. Rohan's presentation. The Director noted that the kitchen at the Southern Service Center belongs to the County of Ocean. The County will need to purchase a generator in the near future in case of power outages. The Nutrition Program along with programs provided by the Board of Health are key components to ensure the elderly may remain living in their own homes for as long as possible. The Director stated that the County will subsidize the two dollar cost of senior meals if need be; we have a responsibility to care for the senior citizens of Ocean County.

Freeholder Bartlett reviewed a Natural Lands acquisition recommended by the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee consisting of 167 acres in Plumsted Township. The cost for the property is listed at \$425,000.00. The Freeholder stated that this is a very fair price, and it will be purchased through the Natural Lands Trust

Fund. Freeholder Bartlett presented a map which depicted one thousand acres that will be preserved as Farmland and Open Space, which borders the Joint Base and Fort Dix, making it eligible for Department of Defense Encroachment Funds in the future.

Freeholder Bartlett also reviewed the purchase of a property in Lacey Township on Route 9. This property consists of over an acre of land to be used for parking and Trail Head for the Barnegat Bay Rail Trail. County funds will be used to acquire this property for \$135,000.00. Freeholder Lacey suggests that rest rooms also be installed if possible. Freeholder Bartlett mentioned that many fish and wildlife enthusiasts may not be in favor of this expansion, but he will continue to convince them of the benefits of enhancing the Rail Trail facility. Mike Mangum, Director of Parks and Recreation, commented on the positive points of the Rail Trail expansion, stating the goal is to eventually extend it north to Toms River.

Freeholder Kelly stated that rumble strips are being installed in the center of County roads in an effort to prevent head on collisions. The estimated cost of the project was \$1.1 million but the actual cost came in at \$392,000. Many companies have recently purchased the equipment needed to install these strips, which helped keep the cost low. Frank Scarantino stated that the County is still repairing the Right of Entry on Herbert Street on the Mantoloking Bridge. The project will take from two weeks to forty five days and is eighty five percent funded, with a cost of \$310,013.13 by Earle Construction.

Mr. Scarantino provided the Board with a presentation entitled "Clean Water Barnegat Bay, Berkeley Shores". The County installed an underground treatment device on Veeder Lane in Berkeley Shores to pre-clean water. The project took 22 days to complete. There will be 5 locations for stormwater drains in FY 2015. One is in South Toms River, three located in Beachwood, and one in Pine Beach, all along the Toms River. The Engineering Department will be going out to bid for this project in November and awarding the contract in January. Ocean County has 8500 catch basins which are cleaned and inspected regularly.

Mr. Scarantino reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda. There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the agenda for the October 1, 2014 Board meeting.

Freeholder Director Vicari will be attending the crosswinds runway dedication at Miller Airpark on Thursday, where both State and federal officials will be present. The project, which is the first of its kind to be constructed in 30 years in the State of New Jersey, has finally come to fruition through much hard work and dedication. Director Vicari also commented on the Bond Sale that took place on 9/23/14. He stated that the County has an excellent AAA Bond rating.

Freeholder is very pleased with the outcome of the sale, and stated that we do not require Bond Insurance because of our excellent AAA rating. Freeholder also mentioned that the County has received 100 percent of its municipal reimbursements in the amount of \$9,332,596.50 from The Shared Service Agreements set up for FEMA has also reimbursed \$86,563,321.09 for a total of Superstorm Sandy. \$95,895,917.59, and is withholding \$458,000.00 until the OIG audit is complete; which should be by the end of November 2014. Freeholder Bartlett stated that he felt we did the right thing in offering our services to the municipalities under the emergency circumstances of the storm.
