Clerk Vasil read the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee recommendation resolution to the public for comments.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Mrs. Vasil. Now I will turn it over to Freeholder John Bartlett who is liaison to the Ocean County Lands and Public Trust Advisory Committee. Freeholder Bartlett."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Thank you Mr. Director. Very briefly, and let me do both of these together, because they are adjoining parcels in South Toms River along Route 9. They all together total approximately eighteen acres. They border on the Jakes Branch stream corridor of the Toms River. As I said, they are the last undeveloped site on Route 9 that's the Route 9 access to the Garden State Parkway in South Toms River. The total negotiated price for the eighteen acres, most of its wet, is \$132,000.00. And this has been recommended to the County by the Natural Lands Trust. As you know this is a dedicated tax voted on by the public to provide these monies and that's what this would come from."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you. Are there any comments from members of the Board or the public?"

Director Vicari opened the Public Hearing on the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee recommendation resolution to the public for comments.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Yes sir. Mr. Bill Gumper. If you would like to comment on number two while you are standing, it's up to you Mr. Gumper. Oh, okay, number two, wait until we get to that, we'll do one at a time. First one Item number one."

WILLIAM GUMPER, BERKELEY: "This is wetland. How wet is the land? I mean is it really wet or just muddy or what?"

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "No. By driving by it you would say it's just regular land, okay, but it is designated wetlands because its within so many feet of the corridor of the Jakes Branch which as you well know is a branch of the Toms River."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "I've thought on this. It may not be practical. It may be a sky-high dream. Is it possible to develop that property as an undeveloped piece of property to a fishing pond of some sort?"

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Not really. I don't think there's any standing water, lake-type, I think its just a small stream basically that runs through there. There are relatively close to it and you would be familiar with this if you went out Route 530, you would go by a portion of the Toms River that 's fed by the main stream. And there's a pretty big lake there and I assume there's freshwater fishing in there. I'm not exactly sure."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "I have no idea myself."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "I don't fish. If I want one I can go buy one. I can't wait there to catch a fish.....drive me crazy. I have no patience."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "Well, it was just a thought. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. Anyone else have any comments or questions on Item Number One? Seeing none I move the public portion of this resolution be closed and ask for action by the members of the Board."

P. FREEHOLDER COMMENTS

At 4:09 PM, Director Vicari received the following comments from members of the Board:

DIRECTOR VICARI: "That concludes the formal meeting of this Board. Now we have comments from members of the Board of Freeholders and then I will open up to members of the public. Just briefly to let everyone know that I've made a number of comments as far as the Super Bowl is concerned. As far as the impact on Ocean County. Unfortunately it wasn't published in any of the newspapers, but as far as we know now there were no economic benefits to Ocean County but I will hold the State of New Jersey to be responsible for making sure that somewhere along the line in the summertime the Advisory Board recommends more money come in for advertising and to help our tourist industry. They made it very clear that I would be their advocate and it is to be noted very carefully that the money that comes in from tourism not only in Ocean County and the Jersey Shore balances the entire budget for the State of New Jersey of all 21 counties. So the tourist dollar is not only important to benefit the people working but it does help the State budget.

I also want to note that Freeholder Little and myself have written a letter supporting the construction of the Keystone Pipeline. It would not only create 4000 construction jobs, but also would benefit everyone in the United States because money would not be leaving and going to help people that in many cases are enemies of the United States. We'll be helping Canada which is not only a good ally of the United States, but would also have a positive impact on the economy of the United States, creating jobs and making the United States substantially stronger. The letter was sent today by Freeholder Little and myself to the President asking him that since there's new research that came out that it would not have a negative impact on the environment, that he go publicly to not only support it, but to sign it as soon as possible.

The last item is that we have received a number of calls as far as snow goes. This Board of Freeholders, the County, does not get involved with local issues with school boards. So when schools are closed, they do that individually at the 29 different school districts and we advise them if we have any questions to call their local school superintendent. That concludes my report to the Board.

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director and I would like to just chime in a little bit about the Keystone Pipeline. To me it is absurd that we would buy oil from Middle East Countries and much of that funding may end up in the hands of terrorists who wish to do harm to the United States when we have a good friend and a neighbor and an ally in Canada. And, this oil, if the United States does not purchase it, the Canadian government is going to build a pipeline west to the Pacific Coast and that oil will be sold to China. So it is absurd that we do not utilize it. We need the energy and we are seeing during this winter actually all the severe problems that we are having with electricity supply and energy supply.

And secondly Mr. Director, I wanted to bring to the....many times we are asked as Freeholders about substance abuse issues and those types of things and we see a lot of the challenges that Ocean County and the entire nation is facing with heroin epidemic and the overdoses and the unfortunate deaths resulting from that. And we wanted to just report briefly that our Ocean County Health Department through this Board and with the Board of Health, they're very active in providing substance abuse treatment, substance abuse prevention programs, and its ongoing throughout the year and it is something that has been ongoing for many years. Last year our taxpayers provide substance abuse treatment to 900, almost 900 individuals here in the County including detox facilities, inpatient facilities and outpatient treatment. \$1.5 million was spent on substance abuse by our taxpayers for those who have no ability to pay on their own. So we think that's very important. It includes screening, there's income eligibility and so forth. Our Health Department is very active with the Ocean County Opiate Task Force and we've kind of led the way in working on how to dispose prescription medicines that are no longer being used. They're working with the schools and also working with the faith-based communities in providing forums for the clergy to take that information back to their communities. Last week we held a forum with our Health Department, Dan and Leslie are here and we thank them, with the faith-based community. We had 55 or 60 I would say without actual counting myself, members of the clergy and provided them with a seminar and a workshop with anti-drug information so they can take it back to their congregations. So we thank all those members of the clergy and the churches that they represent who participated. And we plan to hold more in the future. So we wanted everyone to know that we're very active in this in spite of some of the headlines you may see. Our Health Department is doing a very good job in providing substance abuse treatment and prevention. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Freeholder Little."

Q. **PUBLIC COMMENTS** - Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of **five (5)** minutes per speaker.

At 4:16 PM, Director Vicari opened the meeting to receive comments from the public as follows:

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I now open up to members of the public. Please come forward to the microphone. You have five minutes. State your full name and also your address please."

JUDY ANGONA, LANOKA HARBOR: "Good afternoon Freeholders. I come here today as a concerned Ocean County taxpayer. With my husband, Anthony, I own properties in Lanoka Harbor and Forked River and a business in Beach Haven Terrace. I've always been very proud of our fine County and it's outstanding public educational facilities for our young people and residents of all ages. In today's lackluster economy, however, I'm especially concerned that the hard-earned tax money collected from our citizens be wisely and fruitfully invested for the betterment of all. In that spirit I'd like to ask two related questions concerning particular expenditures at our public county college, Ocean County College in Toms River.

I understand from articles I've read lately that Ocean County College has entered into a contract with Pearson Educational Publishers to manage online instruction for the college. My questions are the following:

First, it's my understanding that Pearson was chosen to receive the exclusive and lucrative online instruction contract with Ocean County College without having to undergo the competitive formal bidding process that is stipulated in the New Jersey Legal Codes. Freeholders can you certify that the legally required competitive bidding process was scrupulously fulfilled in the awarding of the Pearson contract?

Secondly, I've seen differing accounts of the actual cost of the Pearson contract to the taxpayers of Ocean County. Costs ranging from several hundred thousand dollars to almost three million dollars annually beyond which Pearson will also earn an ongoing commission totalling fifty percent of student online registration fees. On behalf of the taxpayers of Ocean County I'd like to receive an accurate account of the total annual cost of that contract and an itemized list of the services the company provides the college in exchange for the payments. If you cannot offer that information today I will be happy to leave a copy of my questions and await your written response. Thank you for your time."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. We appreciate your comments. I will now turn this meeting over briefly to Freeholder John Bartlett who is the liaison to the Ocean County College who will give a response to the questions. But as you know, the Ocean County College has a Board of Trustees and just out of my own curiosity they have a public portion...did you present those questions to the college?

JUDY ANGONA: "No I have not done that."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay. So the only time you asked for any information is now before the Board of Freeholders?"

JUDY ANGONA: "Yes that's true."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Is there any reason why you didn't ask them the question?"

JUDY ANGONA: "Well because I think this Board is the oversight agency for the Board of Trustees at the College since money comes through the County to the College. So I thought this might be a good place to start. I certainly wouldn't preclude going to the Board of Trustees with the same questions."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you. Again only part of the funding comes from this Board of Freeholders. Freeholder John Bartlett."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Mr. Director your comments were right on target with what I was going to say. The College is an independent organization. The Board of Freeholders do not run Ocean County College. We do appoint the members of the Board of Trustees or all but two of them. And so your question as to how they have operated with regard to these contracts are most properly asked of those who issue the contract, the Board of Trustees of Ocean County College. And I think you would be able to find adequate answers to your questions if you ask the appropriate people who actually gave the contract. They are independent of the Board of Freeholders and we have never sought to exercise any kind of influence over their hiring or their firing, the contracts they issue or anything else that goes on at the College with the exception of the joint ventures that we are in which happens to deal with Capital Improvements. That is buildings, roadways, parking lots and things like that. In that we have a very close connection to the College and in agreement between us. But as far as the operation goes that is purely in the hands of the Board of Trustees. That's the way that the law is written and that's the way it's respected in Ocean County."

JUDY ANGONA: "Thank you for your advice. I'll seek answers from them and should I not get any, perhaps I'll come back here."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Yes that would be most appropriate and I am sure.....I would be dumbfounded if you don't get the answers that you're seeking."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "And again, usually we don't have a dialogue going back and forth, but I realize the importance of your question. But again, direct communication is extremely important instead of going back and forth. But I want you to know that I'm very proud as an educator of not only Ocean County College but also their partnership with Kean University and I'm sure that if you go there and ask them the questions you will get an immediate response. And, as Freeholder Bartlett mentioned before, that there is a certain line of where it's not political. We don't make political decisions. We make decisions when it comes to Ocean County College that's in the best interest of the students that go there. And in the past my experience has been since I've been a Freeholder, they have been not only supportive, but people when they graduate Ocean County College.....one thing I always remember them saying that they were always proud of the degree that they received from the College. They do an outstanding job."

JUDY ANGONA: "Yes I share that. And I thank you again and I'm just interested in the economics of ..."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I understand. We don't have any complaints about what you are asking and we appreciate your concerns. Any other questions or comments from any members of the public. To my right, seeing none. To my

left, two hands that are up. First one, Minister Stephen Brigham. If you would please come forward and just give your name and address please for the record so it's part of the official minutes, I would appreciate it."

STEPHEN BRIGHAM, TENT CITY, LAKEWOOD: "I'm here on the topic of homelessness. Again, addressing the issue that's evident in our County, a need for housing for people that have no ability to afford housing themselves or to have access for whatever reason to government housing or social service housing. Today I'd like to address a situation where there's a girl in tent city or a woman, she's about the same age as myself. She's got a business degree. She went to college and got herself a business degree. She entered into a business, in a restaurant business, and something happened and the landlord....there was some type of problem with the contract or the rent. And so the girl that's in tent city with a business degree, she is bringing legal action against the landlord for foreclosing or whatever on the business.

So she was offered housing through Social Services, a hotel room in Seaside for a year which is typical for Social Services. She showed back up at tent city and she moved back into the tent that she had in tent city. And, not knowing exactly why she did that, I figured she couldn't pay the little stipend that they were asking her to pay of the hotel room. I think it was like \$43.00 a month and then Social Services would pay the rest. So I went and I went down to Seaside and I paid the hotel owner the forty-some dollars for the room thinking that was the reason that she wasn't accessing the room. Come back to the camp and asked her....I said you can go back to your room in Seaside and access your room. And she says, you know I really don't want to go back there. And I asked her, well what's the reason? You know it's winter time, it's cold out here, you're living in a tent. Surely a hotel would be much better than a tent in tent city. And a very sweet, young lady and she said, Minister Steve when I signed the contract for the room it said that I would have to pay back the monies that they were spending on that hotel room which would add up to about \$18,000 a year for that hotel room. If I do win this case against the landlord I would have to pay back that \$18,000 and it's not worth it to me to pay \$18,000. I don't know how much I'm going to get from my settlement, but it's not worth it to pay \$18,000 for a hotel room. So I started to think here's a woman with a business degree who doesn't want to pay back \$18,000 and I don't blame her. I really don't blame her myself. If she doesn't get that big of a settlement, \$18,000 would be a big chunk out of that settlement.

And so, again, thinking about the taxpayer then also, paying \$18,000 a year per homeless person per hotel room. And so you know that's adding up to quite a bit of money. I think times 8, 80 people, 80 homeless, that's about a million dollars a year for housing homeless people. So again, I think as people...the taxpayers and concerned citizens, people that want to get the best bang for their buck, I think we can do something better. More concentrated. Something that's going to have supportive services within a consolidated area that will help the homeless. Again, we're here to help everybody. We want a shelter in Ocean County that's going to be acceptable to the population in the area that it's in. To the homeless, of course, something that's going to create services for the homeless that will help them get back on their feet. We want to create a shelter that's good for everybody.

So, again, I know there's a lot of churches out there that want the same thing. That's their wish and desire is to create a shelter that's good for everybody in the community of Ocean County. And so again, I hope that we can all work together. Concerned citizens and people of the clergy and people that are desirous to see fellow human beings, fellow Americans, fellow residents of Ocean County helped in a real and positive way."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. We appreciate your comments and again, the support of nonprofits and other religious organizations that get involved and do their fare share I think is the way it should be going. We take care of what we can. I think sometime, I believe it was in December there was representation....it was my understanding and other people here that Georgian Court University Sisters of Mercy would take on some kind of an obligation under the leadership of the Pope, of course, Pope Francis as far as the homeless. And I wouldn't be surprised if Georgian Court University takes their fair share because they have counseling services, student involvement, they have transportation and a number of different issues that would take place to move to their campus which would have not only safety and help, but the proper guidance. Next speaker please."

PAUL COWEN, TENT CITY, LAKEWOOD: "Good afternoon. I am a resident of tent city in Lakewood. I have been there for the last ten months roughly. Currently, the township is involved with relocating people into housing to which we are being granted one year's residence. The question I have is, many of these people are without financial resources otherwise and unemployment as well and I'd like to know what efforts are being made to get them back into the workforce through the township or any other program."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you. There probably will be an answer at the end. We want to listen to everyone. First of all, this is one topic. Is there anyone else so we don't have to repeat ourselves? If there's no problem I would like to hear anyone else on the homeless issue and then we will have a response. Okay. Yes sir. This way we can get the full picture of what we're talking about. Thank you very much. Your name and address please."

TOM O'MALLEY, FOUR SEASONS, LAKEWOOD: "I know probably most of you more than you know me. I'm also on the County Committee for District 31. I'm also the Past Vice President of the Lakewood Republican Club. And also I'm a retired elected official. I say that to you because I know exactly how you feel. I know the positions you find yourselves in. But of all these years and I've been doing this for fourteen years....that I've been doing tent city. And all these years....when I first started visiting the people in the so-called in the woods, there was 28. We're now up to approximately 120. And will all of the millions and millions of dollars that are spent and how well tended you are and I know you are of good heart and good character, but we're going backwards. We have to really reverse ourselves. We have to be more dedicated to finding a way that's going to relieve the situation.

Continually spending \$20 million, I believe that's your line item. I believe that was the figure provided me for temporary housing and I made I proposal that I made last year and I distributed to all of you and your Counsel as well. I met with him. I met with Congressman Chris Smith on this issue. And there is a solution to this and it's not a temporary thing or I should say it is a temporary thing, but not the solution, but there's no reason why these have to continuously live in the woods. There really isn't.

The proposal I made was this. You have vacant buildings up in the Business Park in Lakewood. And I know this is Lakewood and I have more problems with Lakewood. I met with the Rabbis up there and the proposal I made to them was well received. It was well received by the Administration as well. There's only one thing wrong. Everybody's worrying about their political future. And believe or not this is a political problem as well. People feel, well I'm not going to be re-elected if I support a homeless shelter in my town, but we have to get over that because that is not true. I can tell you that from experience. I was re-elected when I took that position. I think that we really have to rededicate ourselves. We are continually spending millions and millions of dollars on something that is not productive and really this is a waste of money in a way. It maybe temporary helping somebody for three days in a hotelthen back out on the street. These millions of dollars need to be put into a more productive manner. A more positive manner. And having a business park up in Lakewood, having buildings vacant up there for four years with no use, out of the mainstream, out of the way for transportation and everything else where special services could come in there and evaluate these people and help these people, get them on their way. There's no reason why that's not a reality. I respectfully request that you revisit that proposal that I made and if you do I can give you another copy. But we do have to do something. We just can't have people coming down here and you supporting.....and we all do I mean I'm sure all of us we put our head on our pillow at night and we think about these people sleeping in the woods. We want to do something about them. I'm tired of visiting people that living in chicken coops on dirt floors when help.....I really am. I'm getting too old for this. I'm probably the oldest one in the room here.

But anyway, what I'm trying to say is I know you're good people and I know you're dedicated, but we do have to find another vehicle, another avenue because this is not working. I thank you for listening."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much Mr. O'Malley for your comments. We appreciate it. The last speaker, Mr. Gumper please."

WILLIAM GUMPER, BERKELEY: "Good afternoon Freeholders. First on the letter J - Appointments and Reappointments. Today I see a familiar name. Joseph on J-1. Joseph LaManna. Now I knew a Joseph LaManna and still know him and he isthis Joseph LaManna I don't if this is the same man. He is a retired New York City Police Sergeant who would be around my age. Does anybody know if that's the same man?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Mr. LaManna is a Supervisor of Buildings and Grounds and the grounds crew who works every day outside in the grounds. And what we have done because of his expertise in this particular area with the shade trees, we have decided to appoint him to this position which he sent in a resume and asked for that appointment. He will make a great asset as far as making a contribution. And just so you know, virtually all....I think all of them today, there is no salary. So he does that as a County Employee true because of his expertise, but there's no compensation at all. His resume is outstanding and the Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds is here today if you would like official information."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "And it's not the same man."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "No it's a different man. Same name, different man."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "Okay. Second I want to bring up again the issue I brought forth before you and I don't want a response from the Freeholders right now. At the next meeting I'll ask them for a reply. I brought up the issue of having Lacey Township Library open on Sunday afternoons, the same hours, the four hours, on a Sunday only in the summertime to compensate for the other three libraries that are open other than the summertime for four hours on Sundays. It would give.....first of all, it would bring a great step forward on upgrading the quality of life for residents of the County.

Now, I noticed in the Berkeley Times there was a little article where Freeholder Vicari mentioned tourism grants and these grants fund programs which attract visitors into the County. Now, opening up Lacey Library, and this is not a money issue because we're talking nickels and dimes here, three librarians to be shifted around from their normal duties of the libraries to open the Lacey Library. This would in a sense, would bring people from adjoining counties into Lacey Township which is in Ocean County and would add, not a tremendous amount, but would add to money, tourism money being brought in from adjoining counties. When people come into the library it would be the only library open in the summertime on Sunday afternoons. Patrons from other counties would undoubtedly bring their spouses, their family, they'd most probably have lunch in Lacey Township and some of them would have their supper in Lacey Township before they go back to their own, their own homes in other counties. So this would help tourism a bit. So that's another point that I didn't bring out when I addressed you before. At the next public meeting I will ask the Freeholders, in fact I'll ask Joe Vicari, excuse me, Director Vicari.....I don't like to use these chummy names here at meetings. This is a business meeting it should be conducted in a formal business manner. I will ask Freeholder Director Vicari to respond to it after at the next public meeting, privately, so I know where I stand in this."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Mr. Gumper."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "Now one more thing. I've seen an advertisement for software that may well greatly benefit

the libraries in Ocean County. It's called Dragon. Of all things, they have their advertisement at 2:30 - 3:00 in the morning. Whoever watches television at that time? Anyway, I would ask Freeholder Vicari as the liaison to the libraries to look into this. I'll give you their internet address. It's www.dragon.com. And I'll give you the phone number for their service department. You dial 1-800-654-1187. Now this is a software program. I couldn't get anywhere talking to their service department, but then I'm not good on computers at all. But, I'm also going to give the same information to Ms. Susan Quinn, the Director of the Library System and request her to look into it separately. It's a system of software where it's placed into a computer and using a microphone instead of the operator of the computer tapping the keyboard they speak into the microphone and it types out the text on the screen. I don't know if any of you have ever heard of this."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Yes."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "You have."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Yea, it's on earlier than 2:30 sometimes."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "Oh well. You know when I talked to this service department it sounded like I was talking to two different women that were high school students."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Mr. Gumper. We value your comments and you don't have to wait until the next meeting because the Director of the library is here today so right after the meeting, if you have a few minutes, she will talk to you about it because after you gave her the proposal the last time and she discussed it in detail and she will get you an answer on both of those issues."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "She's in the back here?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "She's waving at you."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "She snuck in on me when I wasn't looking."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Susan Quinn is waiting to answer your questions and she will be more than happy to answer them with a friendly smile as she always has."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "She always has a friendly smile. She's a lovely young lady."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Just so you know, the library.....very lovely. Since the library system is funded by the taxpayers of Ocean County, our services at all 21 branches apply to those people that are taxpayers in Ocean County, but when a visitor comes and goes into the library to look at a book. I believe in order to get the library card you must be a resident of the County of Ocean. Thank you very much."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "Thank you. And you did it within five minutes too."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay that concludes the portion of this meeting. I will conclude. Okay, you have your hand up. The last speaker right now and Mr. Gumper don't leave before Susan Quinn talks to you about it because I don't want you to wait two weeks. The last speaker please. Your name and address and you have five minutes please."

PAT CROSIER, TOMS RIVER: "I'm here representing the organization Friends of Cattus Island which was incorporated last June. We are curious about the Cooper Environmental Center and hoping that you might have a status report on when it might be rebuilt, repaired, ready for occupying students and public visitors to the park."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "This has been a grave disappointment to all of us. Cattus Island is one of the gems of the Ocean County Parks System. As you know, the building was substantially damaged with the hurricane by flooding. Even though it's on pilings and it sits up, we still got water in the building. The building as you probably know has been gutted inside. There is still mold issues in it. We have and perhaps Mr. Fiure can add to this, but we have been researching if that's the right word, various grants that are available to us to restore the building or to rebuild the building. That's both Sandy grants through the Sandy Relief Program and others and that's what is taking so much time. We have felt, the Board of Freeholders, that we will grab every dime we can of other monies. We have this problem both at Cattus Island and at Berkeley Island County Park down below. Both of them are out of commission.

But, we have received substantial grants for both of them. What they are right now I can't tell you because I don't remember. But that has been the hold up. It's not as if we are ignoring it or forgotten about it. We want it open again. I'll tell you, if you would be so kind as to leave your name and address with the Clerk of the Board I'll make sure that we get direct information to you as to what the timeliness is on where we're at and where we're going and what those time frames may be. We certainly appreciate your interest in this."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "We appreciate you coming today. I know it's an important issue. I live relatively close to that area and a lot of people have the same concerns."

PAT CROISIER: "A lot of people are concerned and we have a meeting tomorrow night and I just wanted to let them know."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay, thank you very much. That concludes the public portion. There was a question as far as the homeless goes and Freeholder Little who is liaison with that department would like to make a comment. But I think it's very important to let everyone know that this is a very important issue for us as a priority. We have ignored the problem. We have done everything possible in my opinion, from myself, to not only listen to the people, but to make some constructive suggestions on what should be done. Also to offer opportunities for them to get a job, to get skilled training, to get counseling, and to climb up that ladder so they're not in that particular situation. And again, we have said this many, many times but again for those who were not at some of our meetings, we have copies of some of the reports we have given in the past. Freeholder Little would like to give a brief presentation. Freeholder."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. To try to answer some of the specific questions. Mr. Brigham brought up \$18,000 or whatever the number was, the Board of Social Services operates under the laws of the State of New Jersey and Federal and State funding has many requirements. Those requirements are set by the State and the Federal government not by this Board of Freeholders and not by the Board of Social Services. We must operate under those laws or we could be charged with various crimes and the funding would be withdrawn. We have a very active fraud unit and a very active recovery unit. Is that fair to say Linda? And whatever those policies are, they apply to everyone, not just this individual that you referred to specifically. But the same would apply for anyone. These are taxpayers dollars. Not our dollars, they are the taxpayers dollars. They do come with strings attached by the United States of America and the State of New Jersey. Whether we like those strings or not, they come with strings.

The issue of workforce development. We have many programs for job training, worker training, literacy training, all these kinds of things through PIC and WIB and many others. They're not restrictive to homeless or anyone else. They're provided for everyone on an equal basis for those who are qualified. So they are available and very active and we have hundreds of people who go through those programs and participate and complete them successfully. So those programs are available.

And, Mr. O'Malley I want to thank you for your presentation. We are aware of your proposal. We have, you know, the Lakewood Industrial Park is not under our jurisdiction as you well know. On the issue of homeless shelters, it's important to.....I see members of the clergy here and we appreciate that. In New Jersey and in most states, New Jersey is no different than the other states...in New Jersey and most states, homeless shelters are predominantly owned and operated and run by nonprofit faith-based organizations not government. In New Jersey there is only one shelter in Bergen County. They spent \$12.5 million for 90 beds. Our Board of Social Services and the taxpayers of this County are sheltering roughly 4,000 people or more every night. They are not all in motels. Roughly 350 maybe. Okay, out of those. The rest of them are in apartments and houses and boarding homes and large scale living arrangements. Okay. Only a small number, ten percent or less, are actually in motels or hotels. We have 37. And most people, in spite of what you said Mr. Brigham, would prefer going there. They have a private room. They have cable TV, air conditioning, heat, a private bathroom, clean towels, clean sheets every day. They have kitchenettes and a heating pad at the expense of taxpayers.

We would welcome any certified homeless shelter program or otherwise in the County. We have no problems with that at all and support it and encourage it and matter of fact, we had meetings last week. We don't talk about it, but we had meetings with a group that's planning a homeless shelter and we're cooperating fully with that. We encourage it. Many of the homeless shelters in the state are operated by Salvation Army. That's number one. What is that? A christian faith-based organization. Salvation Army. They get donations and as a matter of fact, you the taxpayers of Ocean County are funding our Salvation Army on Route 37, providing them with funds. We are also funding, you, all of us, are funding the House of Hope. We gave them the down payment to build the House of Hope which is a homeless shelter program. We are providing funding for Salvation Army, Providence House a homeless shelter for battered women, Harbor House, Contact of Ocean County, Dottie's House, Valentine's House, Interfaith Hospitality Network which is a homeless shelter network of about 12 or 13, Jill, churches that take the homeless in. FoodBank of Ocean County and Monmouth. Our Code Blue Shelter Program with Salvation Army, Church of King of Kings, Long Beach Island Community Center, Stafford Interfaith Health, House of Hope, Vetwork which provides homeless shelter for homeless veterans, Homes for All, Ocean Hunger Relief, OCEAN, Inc., Lakewood Community Services. We provide counseling, substance abuse, HIV testing, tuberculosis testing. I have a list here so long of the things that we provide. Roughly \$60 million of County taxpayers money goes to provide everything from tuberculosis testing to food to shelter for those of our needy citizens here in the County. We are....the \$20 million you referred to is our matching funds for the State and Federal funding. That \$20 million does not, it is....you can paint it however you want, that doesn't go to pay for motels, all of that or anywhere near all of that.

Matter of fact, last year we provided back rent to keep people from being homeless. The 344 families or they would have been kicked out in the street. We provided the security deposits for 85. By the way, of those 344 families, that included 168 children. We provided the security deposits for 85 families including 36 children. We pay the utilities for 172 families to keep them in their homes and not on the street. These are 'shush' funds. And we are providing 2,401 families with direct shelter with 164 children through part of this funding. So, you know, we appreciate especially the clergy and Mr. O'Malley being here today because it's important that they understand there are many different aspects of this. Alcohol and drug abuse, mental health services, we have the largest WIC program in the State of New Jersey right in Lakewood that is providing food for women and infant children. We do rental assistance, general assistance, you name it. Child dental care in Lakewood. We're the only county in the state providing dental health chairs and we are serving how many thousands of dental? (inaudible) For kids, it's amazing. It's amazing the money and the effort and the resources we are applying to help the needy and the poor. But it's important because we see this similar issue come up time and time again that counties and governments in New Jersey do not generally

provide a county-run, county-authorized, county-staffed homeless shelter. We would have County......homeless shelters are operated predominantly by faith-based. Number one is Salvation Army. Catholic Charities is another big one. And I think the members of the clergy are aware of this in the State. And it's the same with all other states. There are exceptions. There is one as I said in Bergen County for 90 beds and it is used, it's very successful, but it's very, very expensive of course.

There are, if you look on the internet right now, there are 55 tent cities across the United States. Some have as many as 2000 individuals living in their tent cities. This is not unique. It's unfortunate. It is something none of us or all of us would like to help with and we are doing our tremendous best to try to deal with it. It's also a matter that's under litigation. And as you know, Mr. Brigham, Lakewood Township is involved in a settlement agreement with you and your attorneys involved in this and I'm not going to comment any more on that. So we do our best and we will continue to do that and provide services for the people of Ocean County and the finest in the State or is second to none anywhere. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much Freeholder Little. We appreciate your report. It was very comprehensive. I think you answered many of the questions that were brought before this Board and I would like to entertain a motion to adjourn."

R. ADJOURNMENT

There being no additional comments received, therefore, Freeholder Director Vicari called for a motion to adjourn the meeting at 4:55 PM.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the sunset provision contained in P.L. 2010, c. 105 the 2% cap on interest arbitration awards is set to expire on April 1, 2014; and

WHEREAS, this law empowers county governments throughout the State to effectively control public safety employment salaries and personnel costs by capping interest arbitration awards at 2% for base salaries, which includes step increments and longevity pay; and

WHEREAS, county governments dedicate a substantial portion of their overall annual operating budgets for employee salaries, wages, health benefits and other personnel costs; and

WHEREAS, county governments face a restrictive 2% property tax cap levy where counties must prepare two comprehensive cap calculations and use the more restrictive one; and

WHEREAS, failure to extend the 2% cap on interest arbitration awards will force county governments to further reduce or even eliminate essential services, critical personnel and long-overdue infrastructure improvements projects; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of county governments and property taxpayers throughout the State struggling to make ends meet to permanently extend the 2% cap on interest arbitration awards.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS of the COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY hereby strongly urges Governor Chris Christie and the New Jersey State Legislature to enact legislation that will permanently extend the 2% cap on interest arbitration awards before April 1, 2014.

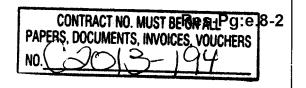

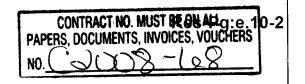

WHEREAS, the National Weather Service has issued a Winter Storm Advisory, predicting that a severe winter storm, including snow, sleet and freezing rain will hit Ocean County today; and

WHEREAS, in recognition of the recent storm, Governor Christie has declared a State of Emergency, noting that this storm and the impending snow and ice storm is expected to result in dangerous and icy road conditions throughout the State; and

WHEREAS, if the County's contract vendors cannot deliver the quantities of deicing salt need by the County to properly treat its roadways and public areas and meet its public safety needs as a result of the impending winter storm, an emergency affecting the public health, safety and welfare of the residents of Ocean County exists, within the meaning of N.J.S.A. 40A:11-6 of the Local Public Contracts Law, requiring the immediate delivery of goods and services, namely deicing salt; and

WHEREAS, upon certification by the Ocean County Road Supervisor that such an emergency exists, the County's Purchasing Agent, in conjunction with the County Road Supervisor, shall be authorized and directed to award an emergency contract to a contractor for the purchase and delivery of deicing salt to the County in such amount as is needed by the County to properly treat its roadways and public areas as a result of the impending winter storm.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE OCEAN COUNTY **BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, as follows:**

Freeholder Director John P. Kelly opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Mr. Scarantino reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda. There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the agenda for the December 18, 2013 Board meeting.

Ms. Vasil reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of December 18, 2013. There were no questions or comments.

Director Kelly noted that at the last Board meeting, a group was in attendance providing comments about Common Core State Standards. The Freeholder noted that there are three Freeholders that were former educators. The Director asked Freeholder Vicari to review the information submitted by the group and make a recommendation on whether this Board should consider adopting a resolution.

Director Kelly reviewed the population at the Juvenile Detention Center noting that the State of New Jersey has changed their philosophy from detention to rehabilitation focusing on drug addiction. The County is looking into this. The Director noted that in the past the population at the facility had been between 35 and 40 juveniles and the County is licensed for 30. The County put an addition on the Center to accommodate this which included classrooms and a library space to meet, at that time, the County's responsibilities to the Courts. Freeholder Kelly stated that at times, the County has had as few as four juveniles at a time, but averages about 15 juveniles, much under what the County can handle at the facility. Director Kelly stated that juveniles are placed in one of three categories (detention, shelter or RAISE Program) assigned by the Judges.

Director Kelly stated that he has put together a committee which includes Judges, the County Prosecutor, the County Administrator and others including members of the public to look at the facility to use existing dollars to refocus what we are doing. The Director noted that juveniles at the shelter are now going to be contracted out for services with Middlesex County for under \$300,000 a year. This will save the County about a half a million dollars. Director Kelly stated that the County is going to use this money at the detention center. The Director stated that the Committee has been told not to go over the budget the County already has. Programs would include expanding the drug court to expand rehabilitation programs and assistance on release with jobs, services and housing, and working with nonprofits to help with drug addiction for both the Juvenile Detention and the jail to help make them more productive members of society.

Freeholder Bartlett congratulated Director Kelly for trying to move this into a positive direction and complemented him on trying to do this within the existing funds the County currently expends. Freeholder Vicari stated that good kids make mistakes and the expanded programs will help rehabilitate them. The Freeholder noted that the Ocean County VoTech is part of those programs, to help the juveniles get out and be able to get a job; the County wants to be as proactive as possible. 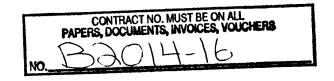

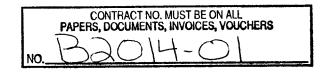

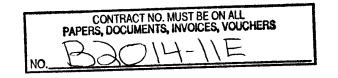
