A. **STATEMENT** Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act.

Joseph H. Vicari, Freeholder Director, read the following statement of compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act:

- 2. Roll Call.

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean was called to order on September 17, 2014 at 4:01 PM, Room 119, County Administration Building, 101 Hooper Avenue, Toms River, Ocean County, New Jersey, with Freeholder Director Vicari presiding. Members Kelly, Bartlett, Lacey and Little were present at the call of the roll.

3. The Pledge of Allegiance and Prayer.

DIRECTOR VICARI: 'Please remain standing for a moment of silence. Freeholder Little and I have sent out a press release and what we want to do is call for a moment of silence to remember the nation's POWs and MIAs, Missing in Action. Please a moment of silence and comments will be made at the end of the meeting.

Moment of Silence.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. Please be seated. And again, Freeholder Little, liaison to the Veterans Administration, will make comments at the end of the meeting. It has always been the policy of this Board to honor those who have served in all the wars and that guarantee the freedom that we have today and we appreciate that and it will be acknowledged later on.

What I'm going to do instead of continuing with the meeting, Freeholder John Bartlett has a very important announcement to make which I think, in my opinion, is historic as far as the financial stability of Ocean County. Freeholder John Bartlett, the senior member of the Board, we appreciate not only his expertise and experience, but knowledge of the Budget. When the Budget was first introduced.....and we have some students from (Toms River) High School North in the back, I just want to explain what happens in the Budget process. We thank you for coming.

The Budget is really the framework of how we operate the County of Ocean for 12 months in 2014. This has been a very devastating several years since Superstorm Sandy. We lost 20% of our ratables. The eye of the storm came through Ocean County. Since 1970, the most expensive storm to ever hit the United States. Katrina first and also, of course, there was Superstorm Sandy and we remember Irene. But the most expensive, number two was Superstorm Sandy. The day this Board of Freeholders and again, most of us were not in our homes at that particular time. It was absolutely devastating. We were told by the General of the Army Corps of Engineers that there was more devastation in Ocean County than when he came back from Afghanistan. The roads were impassable. Our goal at that time was to get people back in their homes, protect lives and property at all costs. And that's what we had to deal with going back almost two years ago.

At that time we said, we have to preserve several things - financial stability of Ocean County. I presented the plan to raise property taxes, to get people jobs, but more important is to make sure everyone who lost their home, 40,000 people, to get back in their homes as soon as possible which I would be an advocate for and we're still working on

that. We also said part of the Budget process was the quality of life and safety are very, very important because that's where most people, like myself and the students who here today and everyone else, to come to Ocean County and provide opportunities. And even the students here that are in high school today, (Toms River) High School North. What kind of opportunities? Ocean County College is now a four-year program with Kean University. We have one of the best Vocational Schools in the State of New Jersey, if not in the United States. We have one of the largest library systems not only in the State, but we get national awards from the President of the United States. All those things are very, very important. At that particular time, we said we want the people to know exactly what's taking place. Seventeen of our towns had tremendous devastation. Seventeen of our towns. To clean the roads it was almost \$100 million. Fortunately, the Governor, working with different agencies helped us clean up Barnegat Bay. Sixty homes, whole homes, were in the middle of Barnegat Bay. Sixteen hundred items such as bridges, trailers, cars, all kinds of items and working with the State of New Jersey, in my opinion, did a great job. We appreciate what they did. They're trying to get Ocean County back together again. Population. Winter 580,000. Summer 1.3 million. We had to have a framework to do that. The most important thing any governing body does, in my opinion, is the County Budget, local budgets, State budgets and Federal budgets. The main thing was the quality of life and safety.

Freeholder Bartlett wants to give a report and usually we do it at Freeholder Comments, but I don't think Freeholder Bartlett can really wait that long because of the fact that this is not only historic for the State of New Jersey, but for the United States. Every time our young people, back there, put the TV on and hear what's happening nationally......Freeholder Little what is the national debt today? He has it on his desk."

#### FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "\$17.7 trillion."

DIRECTOR VICARI: Debt that you and your children and your grandchildren someday will have to pay. And what is it all based on? The Bond rating of the United States has gone substantially, even the State of New Jersey. So again, we're proud to say and I know Freeholder Bartlett, I give him a lot of credit. It is very difficult to work with this Board and provide all core services. They were different. We cut back, but we said, 'We will not fire County employees. We will not have layoffs. We will not have furloughs because the County employees do an outstanding job and also our professional staff.' But we will do things differently and to acknowledge that, the proof today, is a report. I'm going to turn the meeting over to Freeholder Bartlett. Again, this is a proud day for all of us historically. The worst storm in 500 years. Freeholder John Bartlett we're proud of your presentation, I know I had to give a little background. I did so basically because I wanted our students in the back and what we try to do is encourage you to someday to run for public office and perhaps be a Freeholder some day. Freeholder John Bartlett."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Mr. Director thank you. You've always said at every Budget time that there's going to be no surprises and that means not just for that particular year, but in the years coming after that. That has been a mantra of yours for a long, long time and we have all agreed with it. We've been here a long time and we understand Ocean County. We understand that it's to a large extent a senior county that understands that you don't spend money if you don't have it.

This County for the past couple of years, I think four years ago, received the highest Bond Rating that you can have and very few counties have it, the AAA Bond Rating. With Moody's investor service, last year and the year before, our AAA rating came with a negative outlook, meaning from them that this County had significant headwinds in front of us. What were those headwinds? The headwinds as the Director has just said were the fact that we lost almost 20% of our ratable base through the Recession and the Superstorm. Twenty percent of our taxable ratable base went away. That rings alarm bells with the rating agencies.

How did we deal with that? Well as the Director has said, we dealt with it in a number of ways. First of all, we didn't have any layoffs. We didn't have any furloughs. We honored all of our contracts, but we did that....we were able to do that because we didn't replace anyone who left. So the fiscal discipline of this entire Board was the fact that we were just not going to replace people and so that helped tremendously. And we have built up a substantial surplus and then in those critical times we started to draw on that surplus. Now the problem with that is, and by the way, as the Director said we inched the tax rate up a very small amount. Now, honest people, public bodies, politicians, the worst thing you can do, the dumbest thing you can do is raise the tax rate any at all. But we all know that it costs more to do business and if you're going to do the job right, you've got to pay for it. And if you don't pay for it, you're going to be in deep trouble in the future. Well, we paid for the things we did. We cut back on the things we did. And we handled the crisis.

During the Superstorm, as the Director said, we used the financial strength of the County to help our municipalities and we paid for the initial....we loaned the.....we wrote the checks for the initial cleanup which totalled over \$100 million. Of that, about 90% was to be returned from FEMA and 10% from the municipalities where we were doing the work. That took a little longer than we expected, but it is essentially done. Well, anyway, because we have done these things correctly Moody's Investor Service has now upgraded our Bond Rating. Given these extraordinary headwinds that we faced from a AAA, which is the highest, but with a negative outlook to now AAA with a stable outlook. In other words, we have met the crisis and we met the crisis that they saw that we would have because we as a Board, the entire Board, have looked at this in the same manner.

One of the first things to maintain is your fiscal stability. As the Director said to me earlier this week, you could make any one year look real good. But no one has ever wanted to do that. I mean, Joe never said, 'Hey make my year look good because I'm running.' No. You don't do that. You've never suggested that. So, you can take all the money out of the bank and make one year look like you were heroes. Of course, next year you would look like idiots. But we don't do that. One year is the next year. And we've done this the correct way, okay, here's what for instance the

Fitch Rating Service which has us as AAA, stable outlook as well said:

'The County's fiscal performance remains stable, reflecting a history of conservative budgeting, consistent moderate tax rate increases, careful expenditure management and prudent capital spending. Fitch considers the likelihood of negative rating action in the near term remote, as the county appears to have stabilized its current fund budget - that is the amount withdrawn from surplus - and is well positioned to withstand the operational and financial challenges associated with the ongoing recovery from Superstorm Sandy.'

To Moody's, which again, gave us the upgrade to AAA, stable outlook. They said:

'The AAA rating reflects the county's very large tax base, solid financial management, and modest debt burden and no short-term borrowing. The stable outlook reflects our expectation for continued financial stability following improvements to ongoing financial operations and cash reserves' - cash reserves, again, are the surplus that we have maintained.

This year we took right from the start of the Budget. Last year we used \$16.5 million from surplus. That's money in the bank to support the Budget. We replaced all of that during operations in 2013. In fact, we replaced that and about a million and a half more. And then for this year's Budget, we took less from surplus than the year before. We only took \$16 million. We wanted to signal to the rating agencies that we are serious about what we're doing. And anyway, gentlemen, my friends, it has worked. It has only worked because we are all of the same mind and outlook on this. This is a tribute to solid management, to the decisions that we've made. We could have made other decisions, but we made the ones that were the right ones. And again, we have the professionalism of our staff, especially Julie Tarrant, the County's Chief Financial Officer who understands these concerns and who is as dedicated as each one of us to having the highest bond rating, the highest fiscal management that you can possibly have. With her dedication and that of the County Administrator who was more than diligent in going after all of those FEMA dollars that were owed us and having to do the same paperwork over three and four times. Whatever it took. It was our money, but they had it and unless we did what they wanted we wouldn't get it. So Carl whatever how many times it took you to redo the paperwork, you did it. But getting that reimbursement and having the municipalities pay their share, we did the right thing. We've been reimbursed by and large and it all shows in this day. And that's why, Mr. Director, I couldn't restrain myself to the end of the meeting to do this. I am so entirely happy that we've got this absolute highest marks, with a AAA rating, stable outlook, at a very time that this State has continued to have its bond rating lowered. That has been a drawback on us and I was afraid it might be fatal this year. But in spite of the State we live in, we are doing well.

And by the way, this has little to do with what you would call our fundamentals because our average income in this County, which is very critical to the rating agencies, is only about 85% of the State average. We are not a rich county. If we weren't doing it right we would not have a AAA rating. I don't think any county with the modest incomes that we have as an average have this kind of rating. It's our management of the people's money and their trusting us to do that. This is the most experienced Freeholder Board in the State of New Jersey and my friends I think it shows in this action. So Joe, thank you for giving me the time to do this first and not waiting until then end because I'm not sure I could have. Thank you my friend."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "When Freeholder Bartlett mentioned this to me and we got the report we said, 'You know it's so important, it should not only be part of the public record and memorialized, but it's a model not only for the State of New Jersey.' But I don't think there's any place in the United States where you can have a double-digit recession, major drops in property value, 165,000 seniors - the largest percentage in the United States of America. We provide services for our seniors that no one else gives. We have over 60,000 veterans that we have the of services for because of Freeholder Little and at the same time, and our Engineer is here, Frank Scarantino, right now as I speak there's a half a billion dollars working with the Garden State Parkway taking place in Ocean County over the next several years. There's another half a billion dollars taking place with the bridge on Route 72 in Manahawkin and also Route 35. So we have a billion dollars worth of construction taking place. We have a AAA bond rating. We have the best County College and a four-year college degree that our students can get from Kean University for about \$30,000.00 - all four years, the best Vocational School - one of the best not only in New Jersey, but in the United States of America, and we're still going ahead. We're still serving the needs of the people.

I'm only a part of this. It has to do with the great leadership of the members on this Board. It has to do with experience. But there are many times that we were taken to task for too much in surplus and not spending money for certain things and we said, 'We would live within our Budget.' Our Capital Program is not just for one or two years, but if you look at what is going to happen in Ocean County for the next ten years it's very clear. It's a clear blueprint and we take full responsibility. When people put us on this Board, the main concern is one thing, what's the Budget going to be. Once we do the Budget that's the framework for our Department Heads, the people that work for us, of what we're going to do. And to make it clear you can go on our Website and you can check every County Budget from 2003 to 2014.

When I spoke to the Mayors of Ocean County we gave the blueprint again and we gave many copies to people not only in the libraries, many talking points, and you know something? Our responsibility as County Officials is to be very clear about not only the financial stability of Ocean County, but we're going to do and the people deserve it. These are still very difficult times. We know we have unemployment. We know we have people out of their homes because of Superstorm Sandy. We know people are hurting. We know senior citizens are having a difficult time living, and many live in especially Berkeley Township and Manchester, on \$950.00 a month on Social Security. We know all of that. We are very sensitive to that. This is not only core services, but it's one of not only great

compassion, but it goes to show what's going to happen next year, the year after that there will be no surprises. And again I thank Freeholder Bartlett for not only giving that presentation, but for the personal time that he's put in there day after day, month after month. That's something we do as public officials and we had to make a decision. You do politics or you govern and we decided that we'd take the chance and we would govern to the best of our ability and do the right thing and leave it up to the people. And again, I took a little bit more time because our students are in the back and we hope that someday we make an impression that you try to emulate us and run for public office and at the end if you have any questions we will be more than happy to answer any questions because it's extremely important that we let the people of our County know what's taking place. It helps me with my business development part to have people invest and reinvest and build our homes in Ocean County. It's a major plus. So again, we thank everyone. So now I will continue with the agenda today and I'll turn it back over to Mrs. Vasil. Thank you very much for listening and really if you have any questions, of course, at the public portion it's always a pleasure to hear what you have to say and your input. Mrs. Vasil please."

#### C. ORDINANCE - PUBLIC HEARING

CLERK VASIL: "The Ordinance for Public Hearing that was introduced at the last Board Meeting is 2014-25."

Clerk Vasil read Ordinance #2014-25 by title, which was scheduled for Public Hearing at this time.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "There's a Public Hearing on this. It was announced two weeks ago. And before we pass anything with spending money there must be a Public Hearing. We encourage people to give a comment. All I want to say before I turn it over to Freeholder Kelly who is the liaison who worked on this for many years. It was very, very difficult. I remember going to the Office of Emergency Management with our friends in the back from Emergency Services and the volunteer firemen who do an outstanding job not only, of course, with Superstorm Sandy, but also the fire of course, in Seaside Park. They have a concern. Their concern was not only communication. Their concern is look what can we do to make it a better program not only for the future, but any threat. And working with the Prosecutor as I mentioned at the 9-11 Ceremony and also the Sheriff, we could handle any situation that occurs in Ocean County. We're prepared for anything. Why? We have good people such as those in the back. We have an excellent professional staff. But we have to give them the tools to work with. So if Freeholder Jack Kelly who is the liaison with Law and Public Safety would just give us a little overview. For the people here for the first time, this was discussed before so it may appear that we're going quickly and whatever the case may be. We want to take a little bit of extra time to really let them know exactly how the process of government works in Ocean County. Freeholder Jack Kelly."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Thank you Mr. Director. This Ordinance spends \$22,800,000.00 and that's a lot of money and we recognize that. But what is the value of the Ordinance? This Ordinance is going to build the infrastructure not only for County government, but for all 33 municipalities in Ocean County to upgrade their ability to communicate. There is on the 500 MHz system at this time, much interference. It has even interfered with our 911 in this County. We have been working towards moving to 700 MHz for actually years. Some of the issues that were in front of us was getting approval from the United States Congress who was making decisions on who was going to be allowed to use the 700 MHz system. For some time the debate was whether it should be for the commercial or for the Emergency Management side. Those issues have been decided now and we're excited to upgrade to 700 MHz.

The other thing that we knew while doing this, while the County will build the infrastructure, the municipalities are going to have to purchase new equipment. New radios and other equipment to use this infrastructure. So we worked out a unique deal with Motorola who was going to allow the County to pick whether we wanted to pay for this with an Ordinance or whether we wanted to pay Motorola over a period of years. We looked at those options and for Ocean County, because of our AAA bond rating now with a stable outlook Mr. Director of Budget, it was in our best interest to borrow the money ourselves because of our bond rating, we can get better rates than anyone else could give us. However, we were able to work with the person who won this bid to make that same offer available to municipalities, who will now have options of how to purchase their equipment. I believe if they buy it directly from Motorola it's a three-, five- or seven-year period Carl? Am I correct? The deal is three-, five- or seven years. Am I correct on that?"

COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR CARL BLOCK: "I believe there's even an up to ten years. Five-, seven- and ten-

years."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Okay. Five, seven and ten. So I get the right numbers. It will allow the municipality to pay this over five, seven or ten years and why that becomes important to municipalities is because they also have to live within cap laws and look at their own tax rates and to do all this at one time would be a big burden on a local municipality. This will give them the opportunity to, once this is put in place, to immediately come on board and use it. It will be an option of the municipality, however, whether they want to stay with the 500MHz system or the 700MHz system. What I would suggest is most will come on in different tiers at different times. So they won't all be able to come on all at once. This will, however, allow for that opportunity so that everyone can look at the 700MHz system and it will really help with the interference that we talked about, but also with the inoperability, with the upgrade to that, that will allow in joint exercises the better ability to cross-communicate. Often we have large forest fires and when we had the hurricane and all those types of issues - that ability to talk with each other is very important, but also just on a daily basis. Then what Mike Mastronardy, our Sheriff, who came to the last meeting talked about a bank robbery that happens in Little Egg Harbor and while that person in going up the Parkway they can communicate one department to the other when the last time that person has been seen. There are a lot of good reasons to go up to this new upgrade. It's expensive, but it's going to help not only police. It's going to help police, fire, EMS, Emergency Management, all the way down to our own Road Department who have to often times, in dangerous times, have to be able to communicate. That Sandy storm was one of those times when they were out there and they were part of the first responders. So this will allow everyone that ability to communicate one with the other without the interference that's been there in the past.

That is the reason for the Ordinance. It's something that's been a long time coming and if it was simply up to the Board, we would have passed this Ordinance some time ago. But there was Federal Legislation that we had to wait for to be resolved. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Freeholder Kelly and I appreciate your leadership in this. And again, it took a little bit more time but it was done the correct way and that's how we do things on this Board of Freeholders. If there are no other comments from members of the Board of Freeholders. We have several members.....and this is a Public Hearing which means anyone can come forward. Give your full name and address so it's part of the record in case we have to get back to you for mailing and giving you additional information. I received a call from the Sheriff, Mike Mastronardy. He's at a conference right now, but he does support it. It gives us excellent communication with all of our departments. If anyone would like to come forward from the Emergency Services, the Fire Services, to make any comments or to ask a question, please come forward at this particular time."

Director Vicari opened the Public Hearing on Ordinance #2014-25 to receive the following comments from the public:

BRIAN GABRIEL, 185 SUMMIT AVE., ISLAND HEIGHTS: "I am the Chief Fire Coordinator for Ocean County and I'm here to speak on behalf of the Ocean County Firemen's Association and the Ocean County Chief's Association along with our radio communications committee. As Freeholder Kelly had alluded to, he has been working on this for years. We've also been working on it for years in conjunction with the Freeholder to develop a plan. There are safety issues now because of interference and the bottom line is what is, whether it's a police officer or a fireman or an EMT, what is their life worth. And we feel very strongly that this is a positive. These gentlemen in the back, they're the ones putting their you know what's on the line every day of the week for all of you. It's going to be a great system.

The inoperability between our county and other counties will be improved tremendously. Inoperability between Fire, EMS, the Sheriff's Department and our local Police Departments can all be obtained through this new system. So we support it highly and thank you guys for your vote of confidence."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I would like to thank you for everything that you have done for us. And again, the Fire Services does not only an outstanding job, but they do one of the best jobs as far as leadership and training and we appreciate and say thank you, especially through very difficult times like we had over the last several years. Freeholder Kelly."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Brian Gabriel, also as he said, he's the head Fire Coordinator and part of the Liaison Committee at the Fire and First Aid building. H works very hard down there too to make sure that the training is in place for every officer. Sometimes we agree and sometimes we disagree on investments that have to made there, but we always work it out when it's done. Brian's been working as a volunteer with all of these guys for some period of time to make sure that is up and operating correctly so that on the scene when the emergency happens they're always there. Even when we don't have emergencies day to day they are working to train for those and thanks to all of you, Brian. We appreciate the whole effort of all the coordinators. It's really appreciated and the liaisons. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "We thank you for coming today. Anyone else from Fire Services who would like to speak? Anyone else from the public who would like to speak? Yes sir."

STEVEN PELLECHIA, 409 COSTA MESSA DRIVE, HOLIDAY CITY, BERKELEY: "Also known as, some people call it, the senior capital of New Jersey. Many of my constituents who are, of course, all seniors are kind of disappointed in Mr. Vicari, your opponent. Many of our seniors....."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay. One moment. You can speak at the end, but right now it's only on this particular

topic."

STEVEN PELLECHIA: "Oh! I'm sorry. I'll be back."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "You can say it at the end. You can be one of our speakers. There's no question about it. The way it works, only on this one particular topic, but at the end you can talk about anything you want to. The Public Hearing is only on this Ordinance related to 2014-25. On this Ordinance, and the reason we do that is because of the importance of it and to make sure that before we vote on it we need the input of what took place. We need the input, of course, of Freeholder Jack Kelly, the Fire Services and anyone else who comes here to make sure that we do the right thing. We don't have all the right answers sometimes unless we listen to you and that's why that communication with those in the field is extremely important. Before I close the Public Hearing on only this one Ordinance, are there any questions or comments or suggestions before we vote on it? Yes sir."

MIKE RITTER, NEW WORLD SYSTEMS, 3921 VANOKE DRIVE, WATERFORD, MICHIGAN: "Thank you everybody for allowing for the opportunity to speak. I am a representative of New World Systems, the current software vendor for Ocean County Sheriff's Office. I actually have a prepared statement, but through my research end and it's been brought to my attention that there is a portion of this Ordinance and a portion of the \$22 million that's going to go towards upgrading or switching of software for public safety, data management, public safety dispatching and so forth. And this is not by any means an inquisition, I'm just curious if that is in fact ......"

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "The Sheriff has very much an interest in that. Whether it's part of this Ordinance....."

ADMINISTRATOR CARL BLOCK: "The funding is in this Ordinance, but there is no action to move or change the software in this Ordinance. This is purely the money creation. There's a Motorola contract on I-2 that's actually the Motorola contract to proceed with that work. There is no contract to do any other computer work. We are awaiting the Sheriff's return from an Institute he is attending and as I told you before the meeting, you could converse with the Sheriff when he gets back. He is the elected department head that will receive the 911 in that computer system and the Freeholders will receive his final written recommendation when he returns."

MIKE RITTER: "Very good. May I read my statement? Is that acceptable?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "You can read it or give it to us and we'll make copies. Whatever you feel is appropriate, it's your time."

MIKE RITTER: "If you don't mind I will go ahead and read it. So as a Representative of New World Systems and a former law enforcement officer myself, eleven years in the State of Michigan, four and a half in the city of Detroit, and another seven in the suburbs, I believe strongly that Ocean County would be spending unneeded taxpayer dollars by utilizing any funds to switch to another vendor. That's just my opinion. Especially when New World Systems software actually provides everything and anything that any other software vendor provides. My interest is obviously my own, we are a privately held company, but we also do have interest in public safety and in the safety of the citizens. In addition to that we also have interest in the way that taxpayer dollars are spent for the citizens of the county. With that said, I will take Freeholder Lacey's and Administrator Block's advice and discuss further with the Sheriff. We at New World have been a partner of Ocean County Sheriff's since 1997. We're under contract with Ocean County until 2016 and we are really here to......I wouldn't be here today if I didn't want to continue a lifelong partnership with Ocean County. I believe strongly that we provide the best solution and the best public safety software within the industry right now."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Mike, while the Sheriff is taking a lead on this, as you know this is also going to effect the Prosecutor's Office and other public safety. We're waiting for a report from the Sheriff who has indicated his interest in what he considers an upgrade to the system. And he's been looking at other systems that he felt would be more advantageous. We do not yet have that full report. We do have a report that the Sheriff made to all of us that he is going to be looking into that so certainly.....when you came today I thought this was more an I.T. matter and that's why I asked you to speak with Freeholder Lacey. This will be in law and public safety and I have no problem sitting down with you at some point. But this Board will rely heavily on the report given to us by the Sheriff so I would really tell you it would be in your best interest to discuss this with the Sheriff and listen to what his concerns are and why he believes an upgrade is necessary."

MIKE RITTER: "I understand. Thank you very much. Thank you Board of Freeholders for your time."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I want to thank you. I'll tell you it was an honest opinion that you had. We respect the difference of opinion and anyone who has a contract with the County of Ocean, it's competitive, it follows a certain process, and if someone can do it better and cheaper we are willing to listen. When the Sheriff gets back, you have my word that every consideration will be not only to review it, but to give you an answer. You may not like the answer, but we'll give you an answer. But it will be in the best interest of the taxpayers and those in Emergency Services. Thank you very much."

MIKE RITTER: "I appreciate that Director Vicari. We would like to actually to have the opportunity to demonstrate side by side with potential competitors or potential other vendors. We'd like to be able to show that to you side by side if that's possible."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Whatever the specifications say will be offered to everyone. So if that's a recommendation then I would like put in writing to the Administrator because when the specs are given we won't allow one person to do that without the other. So, you know, it doesn't sound like a bad idea to me. Again, I do not have a report to give to this Board at this point from the Sheriff and I'm waiting for that. I know what his concerns are. He has shared those concerns. But he is looking into this situation and those kinds of issues that you're bringing up really need to be discussed with the Administrator and the Sheriff."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much."

MIKE RITTER: "Thank you all."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Anyone else who would like to make a comment? And again, when a contract comes before us, it's made by our professional staff. The next person please give your full name and address."

TIM BURNS, 219 DOGWOOD AVE., BAYVILLE: "I'm also the Council President for Berkeley Township. I would really like to thank the Freeholder Board for letting the municipalities attach to this AAA bond rating because most of the gentlemen in the back here know that I spent weeks after Sandy with them and through the forest fires and I did see the needs with the communication. You know, if you're out to a fire or police, nobody can communicate so I think this is a well investment as is the Crosswinds Runway at the Airport. It brings the Emergency Management capabilities to Ocean County which you know we're susceptible to anything in this County. So I wanted to thank you because without that Shared Service with the AAA bond rating, the municipality would not be able to service our gentlemen in the back here who do an outstanding job day and night. So thank you and thanks to these guys in the back."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much Mr. Burns. Anyone else who would like to make a question or a comment before I close the Public portion only on this one Ordinance? If you have any other questions, at the end the meeting we'll be happy to accommodate you. Seeing no questions or comments on this particular Ordinance, I move to close the Public portion for comments. Now it's up to the Board."

No other comments were received, therefore, the Public Hearing was declared closed.

#### P. FREEHOLDER COMMENTS

At 4:49 PM, Freeholder Director Vicari received the following comments from members of the Board:

DIRECTOR VICARI: "The only comment that I will make at this particular time was mentioned by Councilman Jim Burns about the opening of the new runway we have at Robert J. Miller Airport. It's going to help Emergency Services. The Fire Services are going to move back in there. What happened when it was designed going back in the early 1960's this was about the crosswinds. Not to increase the capacity, but to make it safer. Freeholder Bartlett and I went for a long, long time and spent a tremendous amount of money. It's the only new airfield runway in over 30 years in the State of New Jersey because of the environmental restrictions and changes. What it will do, in any kind of an emergency whether it be a fire, Emergency Services, Military can use it, DEA, Federal agencies, that runway is very, very important. And in a national emergency they could even land military cargo planes there. So it's built up to Federal standards. About 90% of all of the money there, about \$12 million, is given to us by the Federal Government. We manage it. Dave McKeon does an outstanding job as far as making sure we manage it. That it is done. So again, we will have a press release when we do that and we will have not only State Officials come here, but also Federal Officials and also the Joint Base will realize the importance. We are one of the few counties in the State of New Jersey that have a county airport that really pays for itself and it's really an asset to us not only for business development, but also for the safety of the County of Ocean. That concludes my report at this time. Moving to my left, Freeholder Gerry Little."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. A couple of items. Number one, the Director called for a moment of silence at the beginning of the meeting and some folks may know, some may not, since 1979 the United States of America has recognized MIA/POW Day which is this Friday on September 19th. On that day, all Americans, we need to remember that there are many of our fallen Soldiers and Sailors and Airmen and Marines who have never come home. All of you may be familiar with the black flag that says POW/MIA. On all public buildings it is supposed to fly by law. It is supposed to fly under the American flag and it is a day that we recognize all those who have been lost. We still have, believe it or not, especially for the young people that are here, we still have 83,000 missing American Soldiers who were lost in action. 73,000 from World War II. 8,000 from Korea. 1680 from Vietnam, which many of us up here certainly recall. 120 from the Cold War era. And one from Iraq is still missing and 1 from Afghanistan, which of course the young people here, that's in your era. And so we remember...Ocean County remembers on Friday that this is POW/MIA Day.

And also Mr. Director, what has become a tradition here and again for the young people or visitors, we have a Department of the Veterans Administration in Washington which their only task is to continue to search for these missing soldiers around the world. And what we do here is when we receive notification of some of our soldiers who have been returned, we, out of respect, simply read their names. We have five more MIA's that have been recovered since our last meeting. Army Air Force 1st Lt. William Cook and Sgt. Eric M. Honeywell of the 599th Bombardment Squadron, they were lost on December 23, 1944 over Germany. Shot down. They will be buried with full military honors at a location yet to be determined. Army PFC Richard Bean, 1st Battalion 105th Infantry Regiment, lost on June 15, 1944 in Saipan, of course that was against the Japanese in the Pacific. A very, very vicious battle of Saipan. He will be buried with full military honors at a location yet to be determined. Army Sgt. Lee H. Manning of the Medical Company of the 9th Infantry Regiment, 2nd Infantry Division, lost on December 1, 1950 in North Korea and he will be buried with full military honors at a location yet to be determined. And Army PFC Arthur Richardson who was 28 when he died on January 3, 1951 in South Korea. He was from Massachusetts and he is to be buried on September 18th which is tomorrow, at Arlington National Cemetery. So we remember our Veterans.

Secondly, as we always do each year and we like to announce it here, our Ocean County Health Department, we operate and run the largest flu immunization program by a government agency in the State of New Jersey. We will be starting and launching flu immunization program on September 22nd. We will have 50 flu clinics throughout Ocean County, from the southern part of the County to the northern part of the County and in many of our senior citizen communities. We hold these flu clinics. We make them available. We have make-up clinics at the end of the season all the way into December. If someone misses their flu shot and are unable to get them, it is covered by Medicare and we certainly welcome the participation of our citizens. It's very important of course for infants and the elderly and pregnant women and other people of all ages who have health problems. This year there is a high-dose for senior citizens over the age of 65 which may include a couple of us up here. I'm not sure, but I think so. So we encourage our seniors to get their flu shots. The information is on the podium down there. There's a brochure which our Health Department brought along today. So anyone who wants a list of the clinics, it's here. There's also a hand sanitizer down there and all of this is provided with grant funding and we certainly welcome anyone to pick up a bottle of the hand sanitizer. Also, the entire flu clinic program is listed on our Health Department Website which I believe is ochd.org. So we thank our Health Department. They also do a great job for our County.

And lastly, Mr. Director, kind of a pleasant announcement if you will, we have a new and perhaps the only that I'm aware of, doctor among our staff. A PhD member. Tracy Maksel who is our Assistant Director of Human Services has received her PhD on August 24th, a doctor of Philosophy and Public Administration from Walden University and so if you'd all give Tracy a hand. Congratulations! Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I would like to thank Gerry Little for not only his liaison with Veterans, but also with our health services and I believe and Mr. Regenye can correct me, we have the largest County Board of Health for servicing our residents in the State of New Jersey. Is that correct?"

DAN REGENYE, PUBLIC HEALTH COORDINATOR: "Yes."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "So I say that correctly. So of all of the Board of Health's throughout the entire State of New Jersey, we have the largest. We are the largest provider and one reason of course is not only our seniors, but other residents that are in Ocean County. We have programs that are very unique to make sure that we preserve the health and safety of all of our residents from the little children, the infants, to senior citizens. Thank you. Freeholder Lacey?"

FREEHOLDER LACEY: "Thank you Mr. Director. Not only are we number one in Health Department, Veterans and some of the other facets, but we also have the most county roads. We have 1600 plus lane miles and this Board has charged myself and our Engineer, Frank Scarantino to go up to the North Jersey Transportation Planning Authority, a little known operation, however, it has many, many billions of dollars worth of budget. And one of the small programs that they have up there is the High Risk Rural Road Program. It's for the safety of roads. And this year there was about a \$12.4 million budget for that particular item and Ocean County has come back through the good work of Engineer and staff, we got 75% of it. So we're going to get \$9.3 million.

I was very competitive with 13 other counties. It's for 24 miles on County Route 539 for safety improvements and we're going to be getting that. These things pay dividends to go to it so I want to thank Frank and his staff and Jack Kelly as he's the liaison to that. I go up there and I do the vote, but it worked and it's nice to be able to get that and compete with some of the other rural counties."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "We thank you, Freeholder Lacey. And again, several months ago we spoke about the rumble strips that we received with Federal dollars. We're still working hard to get more money for our road system and especially with Route 9. We been fighting since we've been here, Freeholder Bartlett and I, for over 30 years. Unfortunately, not too much progress from the State of New Jersey or the Federal Government. But we're not going to give up on Route 9 and also with the rail systems. So again, we are making progress. We're not giving up.

But I just want to say something else, rolls around number one, today we went to Tallwoods Rehab Center/Nursing Home in Berkeley Township. We have the highest number in the entire State of New Jersey of those over 85, 90, 95, 100. And today we have 100, 103 and 104 celebrating their birthdays today. So again, we acknowledge that and we're very fortunate to have those people that have so much wisdom and knowledge located in Ocean County. They're in excellent spirits. They're very happy and they have a good message. And I went to each one and said, 'What's your success?' And they said you know something? Being happy and being with people and it's extremely important in their attitude in life. Anyone from the Board? Mr. Administrator? Anyone else? This concludes our portion for business."

Q. **PUBLIC COMMENTS** - Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of **five (5) minutes** per speaker.

At 5:01 PM, Freeholder Director Vicari received the following comments from the public:

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Now is the very important part. Members of the public who would like to make any comments, come to the microphone and give your name and you have five minutes. Yes sir? You want to be the first one? You don't want to come up? Oh! You want to leave. Okay. That's okay. Thank you for coming. Anyone on my left side because I'm going to give preference today to our students if they want to. If not they don't have to. They can talk at the next meeting. Anyone to my left that would like to ask any questions or make a comment? And again, even if you spoke before, you can come up now. Mr. Burns. Councilman from Berkeley Township. And again, you

can make a comment when it's and Ordinance and again, you can come up a second time or any time, of course, only once and give your name and address for this particular part of the meeting. Yes sir. Mr. Burns."

COUNCILMAN TIM BURNS, 219 DOGWOOD DR., BAYVILLE: "I'm not here as a Councilman at this time. Excuse the shirt. I got dressed in the dark today. I'm not trying to make a statement or anything. I know Freeholder Bartlett runs from me every time he sees me, but....."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Only if you want money!"

TIM BURNS: "You know that Berkeley Township and Berkeley Island Park is about the center of Ocean County and I know we have plans and I want to thank the Board. We opened it up. We had the National Hobie Catamaran Races there this year through your help and for the last 2 years since the storm. You've opened up the dock for crabbing which brings stimulus to the economy of Berkeley which is all we have over there. But, I don't know where we are at for planning and I'd like to know, you know, what the status is going to be and where we're going to be in the Spring with that."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Freeholder Bartlett please."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Mr. Director could you call on Mike Mangum. The Parks Director is here. I've seen preliminary plans of the park so I think Mike might be better suited.....we're very preliminary right now, but......"

TIM BURNS: "How preliminary?"

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Drawings on a piece of paper. They're not construction documents. They're just.....what do you call it? Conceptual plans."

TIM BURNS: "Mike's been very helpful with all of these other events. I can meet with him at another time and look at the documents."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "We've passed.....I don't like saying this.....we've passed the Bond Ordinance providing I think up to \$8 million for the reconstruction of Berkeley Island. I hope we don't spend that much."

TIM BURNS: "I hope you do."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "So we've set aside money for the work. The engineering design is in progress at this time. Everything that was there before.....most of it was before the kinds of activities....we'll continue into the new park. It will be dressed up. They'll be a better railing system along the armor mat. What we had there really doesn't meet current code. The boardwalk along the armor mat will be restructured. That's really gone. And we need to repair the dock. In fact, you know we had an accident out on that. It is the parks project that we really.....it is in current progress, but it is....I hate to give you a date as to when it will be done. I know that's what you want. But I would say, Mike, can you give me an outside date if you will? Mr. Director, through you, through the Chair."

TIM BURNS: "I don't want to put you to the mat here."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Well I know you're very interested in this and it was because of your interest that we partially opened for this year. We had a little incident there, but it happens."

TIM BURNS: "It happens."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "It happens. But it's first on our priority. The only job we have going on."

TIM BURNS: "Because Berkeley has really suffered, you know, with the Route 35 project along with Bayview Avenue that's a County road now. But you know it's been a disaster all summer long and we don't want to go into the Spring with this type of environment. So I appreciate everything you guys are doing there. I know it's a big project. It's not going to happen over night.

And just for a quick comment here. I know up in Monmouth County some of the shore communities like Avon and Bradley Beach, they don't have their independent libraries and they're old libraries and they're only about a half a mile apart. They all have their own Directors. Now they're putting bonds out for \$1.5 million for handicap accessibility. I said, 'Why don't you guys go to Ocean County and see how we do it. We have the best library system, I think, in the nation. And I appreciate everything you do for Berkeley Township. That library is used 24/7, but to have a cup of coffee here in this one.....but what you guys have done with the library system, you know, since the Jim Hyres days, has really been a compliment and it's a model for the State and the Country. So I want to thank you for that. Take a ride up there and see just how they waste the money. The Governor's talking about shared services. They'll probably get credits for sharing a Library Director or something. But God bless the County and the Freeholders and everything you do. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Mr. Burns. And Mr. Burns is to be commended. He lost his house in Berkeley Township. He rebuilt it according to the standards as an example.

And our students are leaving us. Sorry to see you go guys. We will sign it (agenda). That's okay. We hope you learned something. We hope it wasn't boring and next time you can stay. Anyone else who would like to make a comment? Mr. Black please."

GARY BLACK, JACKSON: "One thing. Once (inaudible) complained. I forgot my eye drops with me today and I hope one of these budgets you can put covers on these lights. They drive me insane. One thing I'm glad and want to congratulate you and as well as the people of Ocean County for voting you in. And another aspect, you also, one thing you always say is no surprises in the budget and then you keep coming up with surprises. However, they're good ones. The County got slammed with the storm. Many towns didn't even have money to pick up the garbage. You came in, had the money up front, eventually got it back from FEMA which I won't give the other words that people put to those letters. I'll just say Every Municipality Again, I won't use the first one. You were able to do all that. You had the loss in ratables and yet our rating goes up.

Every election I listen to. It's like a constant like a drone. That's the best way to put it. As they keep saying well there's too much in surplus. There's too much in surplus. They're robbing the money. We've got to give these back. They didn't cut the tax rate. Whine, whine, whine, whine, whine. You hear it every....it's a drone. It's like a TV you can't shut off. And I've come up, you've come up, we've all said this that this money saves us money. We're a growth county still. With that, we have to improve roads, widen roads, multiple expenses. With that there's bonding. With having the surplus which gives us the best now bond rating in the country, that saves us money when we have to bond for new things that we need to deal with and go out and get because of the growth. And everybody thinks growth ratables, ratables, ratables, ratables. I'm the one person that says expense, expense, expense. Well John I know you do to. And the rest of you guys. That's why I back another model we have is the Natural Lands Trust which has saved countless dollars. I'm not even going to try to come up with that number.

But I come up here time and time again and say that you are the model of what local government should be. I'm glad to see the town I work for. People here they can watch and learn. I wish my town would come here and watch and learn. Again, I thank you for the work you've done. You've saved both the town I live and the town I work for butts after the storm. You do good for the taxpayers. I'm glad the kids come here because if they learn how government works, here's where you should go. You do a great job and I get nothing out of this. There are some people that say oh, he gets a job or (inaudible). I don't get squat. I'm here because I want to be. I have no leash. If anything, I'm a lightning rod. So for me to come up here, I'm saying this for only one reason, I want to and the fact that you're doing what you do. And again, thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Mr. Black. You know some of our students had to leave and it's unfortunate because ......is there anyone here that publicizes? The Asbury Park Press. There's WOBM. We thank you the Patch, Dan E, for being here. If they want to analyze this tomorrow and they had to go to different activities (students) so if our Public Information Officer could do me a favor and include some of the things that we did today to make sure it gets out to the news media, it would be appreciated. They probably had some major cutbacks because as we know it's not their fault, but if we could get that information out I think it would be a benefit to the residents of Ocean County. Anyone else who would like to make a comment? Yes sir."

SAM FOSTER, 108 DOGWOOD DR., BRICK: "I wanted to pay a compliment to the Freeholders once again, specifically Mr. Block because I just started a new job. It's only part-time, once a month, but I was doing some legal research for an estate search at the Toms River Courthouse Surrogate's Office. Mr. Block, I saw you walking around there. I didn't want to distract you from, you know, your duties and everything, but very wonderful people.

First of all, about the library system over there. It is a fantastic library system. I said this when Freeholder Bartlett was in charge a few weeks ago when I was here. You, unfortunately, were unavailable (Director Vicari). I am so proud of the County government that we have. All of you. I want to state this because you know politicians get criticized all the time and I've said this in the past, but it's true. And Mr. Block, the people in your office.....I forgot the woman's name and I promised to compliment her during the Freeholders Meeting so I'm trying to be held to my word here. I forgot her name. She's a young woman. She sits with her back to the window. I don't know if you know who I'm talking about."

# COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR CARL BLOCK: "Christine."

SAM FOSTER: "You might know who I'm talking about because I bothered her a lot my first time here because I was nervous. I hadn't done it before. But this time I got smart. I just printed all the .....you know because there's only two computers there to use and do the estate research information. So I just printed out everything and took it home and worked on it from home rather than bother her all the time. But she was wonderful. The people there were very nice. The woman that has the office .....I don't know her name either, but she was like the boss there. As you go into the Surrogate's.....to the left, the office there. That woman's name. I'm sorry. I'm usually good with names."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "Is it my office?"

SAM FOSTER: "Well there was a woman sitting there. I hope it wasn't your office."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "In our suite there's only two female employees. One is Christine. She is directly when you come in, she sits by the window. To the left is the Administrative Assistant who is sitting in the back of the room. Marianne Cilento. Commonly known as MAC."

SAM FOSTER: "I'm not sure. But I just want to compliment both of them because in your office they are very polite. I know I bother them too much. So I just want to .....I promised I was going to compliment you the next time I came into a Freeholder Meeting. And I try to keep my word on the issue. I do that all the time at the library because I'm a real pest at the Brick Library and that's why I always compliment your support of the system.

We have wonderful county government. We really do and I'm really proud of all this. I just want to tell you that. And Mr. Block, once again, the prior department that you were in charge of, I forgot what it was."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "I was the County Clerk."

SAM FOSTER: "Yes because I remember I complimented you after my mother's death. You office was extremely helpful to me because I couldn't find a will of my mother's and I was going crazy, literally, trying to find it. Turns out is was on the table right next to her bed and I literally picked up the will, I don't know, a dozen times. I was so out of it after death. It shook me so bad. So I had to probate it through the Surrogate's Court. So Mr. Block, you've done a wonderful job with both of these departments that you've run. I just want to compliment on it because it's very important that we do compliment our politicians because I can understand how frustrating it must be for all of you to get criticism all the time. And not be acknowledged for your work. Because it gives the public, you know, the wrong idea if all they see in the newspapers is a bunch of criticism, but not acknowledge the wonderful work you have done. Mr. Block, you really do run wonderful departments. You really do and I want to compliment you."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "Well, I'd love to take credit, but if it was a probated will that went through the Surrogate's Office, the Surrogate is The Honorable Jeff Moran. So I wouldn't want to steal any of his compliments because you've given me more than my allotment for the year."

SAM FOSTER: "I just wanted you to know. But I do remember I complimented you because you had something to do at the time. I met you once after my mother's death and you helped me out with some information. You referred me to someone in your department. You were with the Clerk's Office. I forgot what it was though."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "You were searching for your property."

SAM FOSTER: "Something like that. I was named by the Surrogate Court to be the Executor and I found the will. By that time (inaudible). Anyway, I just want to compliment all of you. You do a wonderful job. And our lottery system is fantastic. It really is. And I really do mean this too because I'm so tired of people criticizing our politicians and giving a distorted view of their work. I said this to Mr. Bartlett when....I mean Freeholder Bartlett, I apologize. You're so nice. You never get mad."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "You guys hear that? I never get mad!"

SAM FOSTER: "You're well known in Ocean County for that. But seriously though, the last time that Mr. Bartlett was in charge of the meeting I said it. And Mr. Vicari's here now, so I'll compliment all of you. You are very proud of our county government and all of you Freeholders have done a wonderful job. I already heard it from the other man who just spoke. You know, our tax issue. We get a lot of value for our dollars. We have the road (inaudible) You know I always stand up here to compliment on the road work. And I feel that I could come to these meetings and I know that people can come here and if we have a concern it's going to be listened to, taken seriously by you, and addressed. And if you can't address it, you'll get somebody to address it properly like when Mr. Vicari referred to a person in the room when the people are speaking. So I just want to compliment all of you and Mr. Block, like I said, you have a greatly run office. But don't worry, when they see me next time, don't worry they're not going to have to worry about hiding from me if I ask a question because I'm just going to print it out. So it was a little bit frustrating, but it was my first day on the job so to speak, so I was pretty much thrown out there and had to sink or swim. So I do apologize, but they're very ......I'm trying to think of the word......they're very forgiving of me. I think you know what I mean. Mr. Vicari it's good to see you back up again."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Sam, you are always welcome to come here and say those compliments. You know, I'll be honest, on a Wednesday it's a very difficult day. It's a busy day, but you made it a little bit easier for us. And again, I mentioned the first time, we appreciate those words, but it goes to the people that work for us, that we hired, and especially in our library system and whatever - we have excellent people. That's why we hire people like that. They have an excellent resume. And that's why we rehire them because they meet our expectations."

SAM FOSTER: "And I think it's a wonderful reflection on all you Freeholders that you've hired such competent people that are polite and respectful the way they were with me in that room. Because I do admit I really shouldn't have asked all the questions that I did."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "That's okay."

SAM FOSTER: "But I like to compliment politicians. I would not say this about the Brick Township Council. That's different."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "That's not for here, Sam. Only the County."

SAM FOSTER: "I know. I shouldn't aggravate them any more than I already have. They were in Shoprite now and I was teasing them saying I was going to go there and ask them where my taxes go, but I better not. I don't want to

get my party any more mad at me than they already are. Thank you very much."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. Anyone else who would like to speak, ask a question or a comment? Okay. Mr. Gumper then Mr. Jablonski. We'll go in that order. At one of the meetings, Mr. Gumper was here. An hour later I walk into another meeting in Berkeley Township, a town meeting with 250 people, and I see Mr. Gumper twice in the same day. So I don't know where I'm going to go tonight. I may see you again Mr. Gumper."

WILLIAM GUMPER, 10 WILLEMSTAD ST., BERKELEY: "That was my twin."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "That was your twin?"

WILLIAM GUMPER: "There's three people in town that look just like me."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "That's right. He's a leader in his community. So we thank you for coming to the meeting."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "I'm lobbying hard to try to get a farmer's market going in Berkeley Township next summer. That's of course my township. Because there are four, perhaps five towns close by including Toms River Township that are doing well in these farmers' markets. They present not only a place for people to go to buy fruits and vegetables and even frozen foods and even have hot food and hot beverages. But they also bring in money to that township. Toms River is doing very well with theirs. And, as I say, there are another four townships doing it and some of the townships even have musicians playing music. It becomes then an entertainment event which people need to lift their morale. So I'm trying hard to get this for my township next summer.

Second, there's something that's always bothered me. There is usually a plea for blood donations every year and the Red Cross always says we have a shortage of blood. There would be no shortage of blood if the IRS would give a tax deduction for one donation per year which would amount to on average \$100 deduction which means \$20 saved in a person's income tax that's due each year. Now the IRS does not give this as a deduction because actually the IRS says that blood is a renewable resource. But what the IRS does not say is that it takes approximately a hundred or more dollars in food to renew that resource. So blood donations should be a deductible on the income tax forms for State and Federal Income Taxes. There would be no shortages of blood if that were the case.

Now thirdly, I notice we have a different issue. Thirdly, we have during the morning from Monday to Friday and during the late afternoon hours we have heavy motor vehicle congestion on many of our roads. Now this is just a suggestion and it may not be practical, but I ask the Freeholders not to respond to it, but to think about it among themselves. Would it pay, would it lessen motor vehicle congestion during the morning rush hour and the late afternoon rush hour where everybody is rushing to work at the same time. Driving to work and rushing home from work at the same time during the afternoons. Would it pay for Ocean County employees to be given, not all of them, but some, the option....now I love choices and option is a choice......since the employees can't be given a raise in pay because of the financial situation, would it pay to give them the option in some cases to be able to travel to their job an hour later or an hour sooner and be able to go home an hour later or an hour earlier? Would it pay? Would it be practical? I don't know if it is, but it's worth thinking about.

And I have a plan which I'll bring forth to the Freeholders on how to save a lot of money in the 21 libraries when they show motion pictures. I won't bring that out now because I've only got five minutes and I want to do it in four and a half minutes. So I'll say thank you for listening to me."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Mr. Gumper. Anyone else who would like to ask a question or make a comment? Mr. Jablonski is next and then we'll go to the last speaker over here. Mr. Jablonski's involved with many, many organizations and especially the Historic Society of Ocean County, Navy Lakehurst. We are very proud of the job you did when you had the Prisoners of War come to Ocean County. It was a great day for all of us. And again, it was very important. I'll tell you, a memory I will always remember for the rest of my life. Meeting those who served many years in prison camps in Vietnam. One served for six years. And they totally not only loyal to America, but they respected the American Uniform. And one thing I remember also and I will never forget it when they said, 'Our cause was just' after serving many, many years in the prison camps. I appreciate what you've done and also at the Joint Base."

CARL JABLONSKI, 240 SPRAY AVE., BEACHWOOD: "I've been a resident of Ocean County since 1970. I've been a member of the Navy Lakehurst Historical Society since 1990, having served the last eighteen years as its President. I am honored to speak before Freeholder Director Vicari, Deputy Director Bartlett and Freeholder Little. Your support of the Navy Lakehurst Historical Society whose mission is to educate the public about the rich history of Joint Base Maguire/Dix/Lakehurst and the future missions as well as the past and present has been outstanding. You have instituted a program whereby our schools in Ocean County now come and visit our museum. We have home with a wealth of history that they did not know existed. Your support of our veterans groups and the projects we undertake with each and every of those groups has been outstanding. We did receive some letters this year from some of the men you mentioned that we honored last year. That group has since been disbanded because of age and illness. And they remember the event painstakingly clear from last year. Without your support, we could not have done what we did.

We also thank you for opening up your libraries to us. We now go to the Ocean County Library. We do free speaking engagements and we are doing one tonight at the Stafford Library, in fact, at 7 pm. We also want to thank you for coming out and supporting the men and women who serve on our bases and their families. The different

programs you have instituted. And we thank you for working with us as we look forward to 2017 to avoid a BRAC Commission which could affect Joint Base Maguire/Dix/Lakehurst. Thank you for your support. We couldn't have done it without you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Mr. Jablonski. And we just want to let the public know that the Joint Base is vital to the State of New Jersey and to Ocean County. Freeholder Kelly and I have been working on that. Joint Base Maguire/Dix/Lakehurst is second largest employer in the State of New Jersey and we are totally committed not only to have a commitment to keep the base, but to increase the missions. And that's what is very important. There are 45,000 people on our base every single day. The jobs are high-paying jobs. They're essential to national security and for political reasons we want to make sure that base stays not only in our counties, Ocean and Burlington Counties, but it also is increased as far as the missions because it's the right thing to do. There's a long history. And, I almost forgot to mention, so I'm glad you mentioned it, working with Dana Lancellotti, we have a Business Department now to foster that. On Tuesday, September 23rd from six to eight at the Ocean County College we will have the business community working with the military to discuss what we can do to increase money coming into Ocean County. Right now the impact on our local economy is \$7 billion. Just in Ocean County. So it's vital. It's part of what we've been going through. It's part of what we need. Especially for our students as far as getting jobs for the future. But we can speak in one voice that we will do whatever is necessary to preserve that base. Thank you Mr. Jablonski for coming today and to this meeting. Next Mr. Pellechia. Anyone else after the last speaker? I see no other speakers."

STEVEN PELLECHIA, 409 COSTA MESA DR., BERKELEY: "Holiday City, the senior capitol of New Jersey and I want you all really, if you would just stand up and take a bow, the senior citizens of this county would love to applaud you. You guys are unbelievable. But on the same...."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "We don't do that. I'll tell you why. Because it's an honor to serve the residents of Ocean County. The greatest honor we have ever had in our lives is to be not only elected, but to be re-elected and serve in very difficult and challenging times. I appreciate that compliment. There's no more better honorable, noble service than serving in elected office."

STEVEN PELLECHIA: "Well obviously you have to be doing a good job to be re-elected so many times. And you're going to get re-elected every time you run. There is no person that can fill your shoes. You have shoes that are so large, basketball players would love to put them on. But seriously, we also have the other side of the coin. We have many senior citizens that are of Italian descent who are quite disappointed Mr. Vicari's opponent, who unlike you, I and all of my constituents have not heard one word of what he is going to do if elected. What we did hear is and I hate to say it because I'm Italian, leave the \$25,000 and take the cannolis? This is not right and I'm sure....I want to believe and I've been telling many of the senior citizens that I speak to that are of Italian descent, I want to believe that this was not done with malice. I really want to believe that it was a joke. But if it was a joke it's not a very good one. So I'm asking that maybe you can persuade Mr. Vicari's opponent to retract or make a statement of how it was meant because we Italians are totally insulted. You cannot take a statement from a fictitious movie. Of course you all know the movie was "The Godfather" and it was 'leave the donut and take the cannolis'. That was an insult to honest, working Italians who witnessed that movie and did not like it. So I ask that.....I implore your opponent to set the record straight and retract that statement. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Since there are no other comments or questions. Again, this is not a political forum for me or for my opponent. Our job is to do the people's business. That's what we were elected for. Unfortunately, sometimes during political season things happen that should not happen and that's an unfortunate situation so I will not address any more on that particular issue. It's up to the voters. Seeing no other comments, I close the public portion. Is there a motion to adjourn?"

#### **ORDINANCE #2014-25**

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE UPGRADE OF THE PUBLIC SAFETY COMMUNICATIONS NETWORK TO P25 700MHZ AND THE PURCHASE OF SOFTWARE AND HARDWARE TO CONVERT THE CURRENT OPERATING SYSTEMS OF LAW ENFORCEMENT, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO DESIGN, UPGRADE OF SIX COMMUNICATION TOWER SITES, CONSTRUCTION OF FIVE ADDITIONAL REMOTE COMMUNICATION TOWERS AND EQUIPMENT PURCHASES, AT VARIOUS LOCATIONS, ALL IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND APPROPRIATING \$22,800,000 THEREFOR, AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$21,700,000 IN BONDS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN TO FINANCE THE SAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING) AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The following is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the County of Ocean as general improvements: upgrade of the Public Safety Communications Network to P25 700MHz and the purchase of Software and Hardware to convert the current operating systems of law enforcement, including but not limited to Design, Upgrade of Six Communication Tower Sites, Construction of Five Additional Remote Communication Towers and Equipment Purchases, at various locations, all in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, including, but not limited to, construction, design and permitting and all else necessary therefor or incidental thereto.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared that the improvements or purposes, the estimated cost of the improvements and appropriation therefor, down payment and estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes authorized are as follows:

SECTION 3. There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$22,800,000, including the sum of

\$1,100,000 as the down payment, for the improvements or purposes described in Section 1 hereof as required

by the Local Bond Law. The down payment has been made available by virtue of provision in the Capital

Improvement Fund of the County of Ocean in one or more previously adopted budgets.

SECTION 4. There is hereby authorized the issuance of negotiable bonds in an aggregate

principal amount of \$21,700,000 to finance part of the cost of the purposes stated in Section 1 hereof. Said

bonds shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding the limit authorized by law, and the maturities, method of sale

and other details thereof shall be determined by subsequent resolutions to be adopted in the manner provided

by law.

SECTION 5. In order to temporarily finance the purposes provided for in Section 1 hereof, there

is hereby authorized the issuance of bond anticipation notes of said County in an aggregate principal amount of

\$21,700,000. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined

by the County Comptroller; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond

anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and shall be in such form as may be determined by the

County Comptroller. The County Comptroller shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued

pursuant to this Ordinance, and the County Comptroller's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence

as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the

provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8.1. The County Comptroller is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes

from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of

payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The County

Comptroller is directed to report in writing to the Board of Chosen Freeholders at the meeting next succeeding

the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this Ordinance is made. Such report must include

the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and

the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 6. The County reasonably expects to commence acquisition and/or construction of the

improvements described in Section 1 hereof, and to advance all or a portion of the costs in respect thereof,

prior to the issuance of bonds or notes hereunder. To the extent such costs are advanced, the County further

reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this

bond ordinance, in an aggregate amount not to exceed the amount of bonds or notes authorized in Section 2

hereof. This bond ordinance is intended to be a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation

Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 7. Any grant monies received for the purposes described in Section 1 hereof, shall be

applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the obligations issued

pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be

reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

SECTION 8. The amount of the proceeds of the obligations authorized by this Ordinance which

may be used for the payment of interest on such obligations, architects' fees, accounting, engineering and

inspection costs, legal expenses, and other items as provided in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 shall not exceed the sum of

\$1,100,717.

SECTION 9. The Capital Budget of the County of Ocean is hereby amended to conform with the

provisions of this Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. In the event of any such

inconsistency and amendment, the resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full

detail of the amended Capital Budget and Capital Program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local

Government Services is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders and is available there for

public inspection.

SECTION 10. It is hereby found, determined and declared as follows:

A. The improvements or purposes described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance are not current

expenses. They are improvements or purposes the County may lawfully undertake as general improvements,

and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property benefitted thereby.

B. The average period of usefulness of the improvements for which the obligations authorized by

this Ordinance are to be issued is 13.19 years.

C. The supplemental debt statement provided for in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-10 was duly filed in the
