## **Board Meeting Agenda**

A. Call to Order

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean was called to order on May 4, 2016 at 4:00 PM, Room 119, County Administration Building, 101 Hooper Avenue, Toms River, Ocean County, New Jersey, with Freeholder Director Kelly presiding. Members Haines, Little and Vicari were present at the call of the roll. Freeholder Bartlett was not in attendance.

#### B. Roll Call

C. **STATEMENT** Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act John P. Kelly, Freeholder Director, read the following statement of compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act:

#### E. **PRESENTATION**

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Today we have several presentations. First we're going to hear from the Executive Director of the New Jersey Association of Counties, John Donnadio. John?"

1. To the Ocean County Board of Chosen Freeholders by John G. Donnadio, Esq., NJAC Executive Director.

JOHN KING, HUNTERDON COUNTY FREEHOLDER: "Director, thank you very much. Deputy Director, Freeholders, my name is John King and I'm a Freeholder in Hunterdon County and I have the privilege of addressing you today as the 75th President of the New Jersey Association of Counties. My role today is to certainly thank you for not only being a sound member of the organization, but for helping us fight the fight as the organization that advocates for sound government. To be honest with you, County government is probably the best form of regionalized government and certainly it's the most sound in the State of New Jersey. Our organization is there to support that and to support you in your efforts in order to be able to do the things you do so well which is pay attention to what happens here at home in Ocean County.

I also want to be the first Hunterdon County Freeholder to extend the invitation that you would join us on May 18th through the 20th in Atlantic City for the New Jersey Association of Counties conference. I'm sure that it will be fruitful for everybody involved. I think you would have a great time, by the way. I'm not sure about what accommodations we can give you, but we'll see if we can work it out so that you're there at the conference."

#### DIRECTOR KELLY: "Get the President's suite if you can." (laughter)

JOHN KING: "You can have my suite if you'd like. But with that, I don't want to take too much of your time. I have the privilege of working with John Donnadio who I know you all know as well as I do and respect, hopefully, as much as I do. John has been a tireless advocate for county government in the State of New Jersey since he's come onboard in the last five or so years and it's my privilege to work with him. I'd like to introduce him now as the individual who really knows the nuts and bolts of what we try to accomplish. I think you've got three things that you want to discuss today and I'm going to leave it to him to do that. Thank you very much for letting us be here."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you Freeholder."

JOHN DONNADIO, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, NEW JERSEY ASSOCIATION OF COUNTIES: "Thank you Freeholder King. We can sneak you in with my eleven year old who's coming to the conference too. So we'll find

something for you two guys to do (addressing Roman Moyers, Poster Contest Winner, whom Director Kelly has invited to sit at the dais for a short time.)

I just want to take one second to thank Freeholder King who came here all the way from Hunterdon County. He took over as President this year and one of his initiatives was to go out and meet with all 21 County Freeholder Boards and we've hit 14 so far. So we're working our way there and we're not even half way through the year. I think it's been a terrific initiative and I think it's borne a lot both for the Freeholder Boards that we're meeting with and, of course, NJAC.

I also want to take a second to thank a number of the professionals that work for Ocean County. NJAC is an advocacy group for County government and it's our mission, our goal, to advocate for legislation, regulations, policy directives that empower county governments as the only true regional form of government in the State that operate more effectively and more efficiently while enhancing the level of service provided, but also saving valuable taxpayer dollars. And we wouldn't be able to do that if it wasn't for folks like Julie and Carl and Mike, your Finance Office and your Administrator who I call on, on a regular basis, for input on Bills so we can be strong advocates and articulate the concerns of counties as a whole. So there's a number of other folks - your County Engineer - and this just a number of folks, again, who have been just a tremendous resource for me over the years and I appreciate it a great deal.

There's three issues that I want to talk to you about today that we think are very pressing for county governments across the State. The first is Criminal Justice Reform that was set to take effect in 2014. Although we believe and some will argue with me that this is grounded in good public policy and could serve long term as a cost-containment measure for Counties as its goal is to reduce the prison population and should reduce your overall operating expenses, we are very much concerned about the immediate costs to implement and administer Bail Reform that we're projecting is going to cost county governments close to \$45-50 million with hiring new Sheriff Officers, hiring new Assistant Prosecutors, making space for the State's new Pre-Trial Services Unit, making additional improvements to your court facilities. Again, significant costs that were not anticipated either on the ballot question back in 2014 or when the enabling legislation was making its way through the Legislature back in 2014.

The way that we're addressing this is we are asking for legislative relief in terms of a Bill that would increase certain civil and court filing fees and dedicate those increases back to the county governing bodies to offset some of those initial costs to implement Bail Reform. We're also asking the State for an appropriation - \$1 million for each county because that's sounds better than asking for \$21 million.

I'm not that optimistic, to be frank with you, that we're going to see either one of those signed into law by June. And I can tell you that if that doesn't happen then our organization plans to file a complaint with an entity called the New Jersey Council of Local Mandates which reviews local mandates passed by the Legislature. And I think that there are portions of Criminal Justice Reform that are right for our organization to file complaint if, again, this relief isn't achieved by June.

So, I have a couple of other things that I want to talk about, but if you don't mind, I'll stop for a moment."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "The first question that comes to our minds is, do you consider this against the State Mandate/State Pay law that passed some years ago?"

JOHN DONNADIO: "I believe, Freeholder, that there are components of the new law that are right for filing complaint with the Council. There are certain exceptions to an unfunded mandate, one being if the law is enacted pursuant to a Constitutional Amendment. So there was a ballot question in 2014 that was approved overwhelmingly by the voters. I'm not quite sure that, you know, I think the voters completely understood what they were voting for when they voted on it because I believe the question, and I'm paraphrasing, asked, 'Do you support keeping more violent criminals behind bars?"

#### DIRECTOR KELLY: "Correct."

JOHN DONNADIO: "It didn't get into some of the specifics about the pre-trial release of the low-level type of offenders, how we're going to provide employment, education and training for those individuals when they're out instead of being in the County Jail. So I think that there are certainly elements of the law, of the enabling legislation, that we are going to pursue. We actually have our General Counsel looking at it right now and it is preparing a brief that our Board of Directors at our meeting in June will consider and we'll move forward by then because at that time we'll know, as the Legislature gets set to recess for the summer after they pass their Budget, whether or not any relief will be part of that budget process. So 'yes' to your answer – long way to get to your answer. I think there are components of it, yes, that are right for that."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Freeholder?"

DEPUTY LITTLE: "And, thank you Mr. Director, and John as we discussed previously, the ballot question did not mention that it would cost taxpayers one dime."

#### JOHN DONNADIO: "Right."

DEPUTY LITTLE: "It never explained that there was a cost attached to it."

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JOHN DONNADIO: "Right. You are right. If I may, you a one hundred percent right Freeholder. One of the things that the Legislature has been submitting to our organization in meetings that we've had with them is that in 2014, the Legislature projected that Criminal Justice Reform would save county governments a significant amount of money because it would reduce our prison population. But what that fiscal note did not take into consideration was the staffing increases, was the facility improvements, was the enhancements to the security that we have to provide at the court facilities not only pursuant to Bail Reform, but to the administrative office in the courts directly in 2015 to provide an armed law enforcement officer at every ancillary court facility in the county complex. So you are correct. The ballot question was not indicative of some real property taxpayer expenses that we were going to incur."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Okay. Any other questions or comments on this?"

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "Mr. Director, if I may. I just want to commend, again, John for you coming here today. And the comments that were made by Freeholder Little, he's been saying many, many times as far as the ballot question as far as it really wasn't a true picture for the people of the State of New Jersey when they voted for it because as the Freeholder mentioned before, it didn't include the costs of what it was going to be. And to look at, I'll be honest with you, most of us when we were talking before the meeting said we voted for it not really realizing the ramifications of long-term what it was going to be. So we appreciate you coming here today.

Going back, I mentioned this to the Board several times as far as....well, first of all, most of our Budget goes to law enforcement as far as salaries. And we do the Budget through Julie Tarrant I believe it's around 60%. As time goes, even with the 2% cap, more and more is going there and we're cutting back on the other side of the street and it's been increasing. But, besides that, a different topic but the same vein that you're talking about, is with the Court system. It's taking more and more.

I went to several meetings with Mayors' Association and they said when that legislation went in with Judges which is paid for, of course, by the State of New Jersey, it was a snapshot in time as far as the court system as far as the physical square footage of the buildings. And any addition, we interpreted at that time, the Mayors' Association and many of the Freeholders, that it should be paid for by the State of New Jersey. So the existing ones when that law went into effect, not a problem. It was a snapshot in time. We maintain it, we clean it, we pay the gas, the electric and the insurance and everything else. But anything in addition to that, I think you should look at next, that should be paid for because right now, of course, there's a lot of pressure because of security and because of after 911 and what took place, and it wasn't anticipated at the time when that legislation went in. So there's two different areas that we're looking at today.

And again, you can't give us a 2% cap and then give us these mandates and expect us to have a function taking place within the County of Ocean, with a growing population and growing needs, especially when a large part of our population are senior citizens on a fixed income. And right now, if you look in the newspaper, many of our school systems are raising taxes and many of the municipalities, so it's a major hardship. And the only way to control, of course, is to do not only what you said, but also to cap what's taking place as far as the mandates unless it comes from a different source. Our problem is that the source of funding comes from the local taxpayer."

JOHN DONNADIO: "Thank you Freeholder. And you are 100% right and we'll make sure to keep you posted as to our progress. But, what I would also encourage you, if you don't mind, is to contact your Legislative delegation if you haven't done so already and meet with them specifically about Criminal Justice Reform. This is a critical issue, and again, our last course of action is to file a complaint with the Council on Local Mandates. We're hoping to get some type of legislative relief. Again, I'm not overly optimistic that that's going to happen, but what we've been doing in our meetings with Freeholders across the street is encouraging them, and your voices speak volumes, is to meet with your Legislative Delegations and let them know that these are real expenses that we are going to incur, that are going to fall on local property taxpayer dollars and that there are certainly parts of it that are unfunded in the mandate."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Freeholder Haines."

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "Hi, it's very nice to meet you. I'm the newest Freeholder. I didn't get a chance when you were here earlier today. So my question is does the New Jersey Association of Counties, when they are proposing Constitutional Amendments that possibly could cause a cost to whether it's going to be local or County? Do they attend the hearings and request that that gets put in the Bill?"

JOHN DONNADIO: "Yeah. We do. We testify very frequently in committee. I mean I can tell you and I can share with you a packet of our position statements, you know, where we constantly ask for a funding mechanism or point out that this is an unfunded mandate. Sometimes they listen, sometimes....."

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "I used to be in the Legislature. I understand."

JOHN DONNADIO: "So you understand. So, yes, we testify in committee on a regular basis. We meet with Legislators. I can tell you on Criminal Justice Reform we've had over a dozen meetings from the Governor's Office to the Senate President to the Speaker and Legislators on both sides of the aisle in trying to be proactive in securing this funding. So, I know, a long way to answer your question, but yes we're very much engaged in not only on Criminal Justice Reform but other things as well."

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "I understand. Legislative Services normally will give a cost whenever they are doing their research. I was just curious."

JOHN DONNADIO: "This is the challenge we're facing with the Legislature on Criminal Justice Reform because you are 100% correct. I worked for the Office of Legislative Services and I hate to say what I'm about to say, but ....."

#### FREEHOLDER HAINES: "Al Porroni?"

JOHN DONNADIO: "Right, under Al Porroni. And with Bail Reform, specifically, the OLS and the Administration concluded that counties would save, I think it was \$45 or \$50 million because the prison population would be reduced. And they used the new math that I....I don't know, you might be able to help me a little bit with it, I can't figure it out yet."

#### FREEHOLDER HAINES: "I can't either."

JOHN DONNADIO: "You know, where the average daily prison population in the county jails is 12,000 and that would be reduced by 12% and they multiply it by \$100 per day to house an inmate which that's probably about what it costs statewide, maybe a little less, a little more, Julie, and then multiply that by 365 days. So I'm confused by that. I mean I get it. So I think that is the estimate that they use and in the most recent meetings that we've had with Legislative leadership was that those counties weren't going to save money in the long run. I'm just not seeing it. And we're meeting and again, we meet with county officials, not only Freeholders, Administrators, Finance Officers, Counselors on a regular basis and the cost drivers for this and for any county jail are your staff.

So you're hiring 10 new Sheriff's Officers, 15 new Sheriff's Officers to implement the risk-assessment component of Criminal Justice Reform. Those costs aren't going away. When you're hiring 10-15 new Assistant Prosecutors. Those costs aren't going away. So we're trying to couch this in perhaps a cost-containment initiative as opposed to reducing your costs because we just don't see that that's going to happen particularly in years 2, 3, 4 of Criminal Justice Reform."

#### FREEHOLDER HAINES: "Okay. Thank you."

#### DIRECTOR KELLY: "Okay, John, anything else?"

JOHN DONNADIO: "I have two other quick things, I promise. Alright? And one is really good. This one is actually not bad as well. As I'm sure you've all read, it appears that in principle the Legislature and the front office may be in agreement on funding the Transportation Trust Fund with an increase in the motor fuel tax and a phase out of the Estate Taxes and some other taxes which NJAC hasn't taken a position on other than we support a stable dependable Constitutionally-dedicated Transportation Trust Fund.

What NJAC has been advocating for is to increase the local aid allocations under the Transportation Trust Fund because under the current structure is an equitable distribution of funds. And I will tell you why, counties now and I'll focus on the counties, receive about a little over \$100 million dollars for a \$600 million a year need. We're not including some of the capital expenses to the bridges which are about \$3 billion a year statewide. And why we think that is inequitable is because counties, and counties alone, and most people don't know that counties maintain virtually every bridge in the State of New Jersey, carry an estimated 35% of the State's overall traffic yet receive only about 6% of the State's overall transportation capital program of \$1.6 billion. So we believe that, again, that's unfair for local property taxpayers to carry that statewide burden on their backs. So we have been advocating again for doubling those local lane allocations which again, we believe make a reliance on the collection of local property taxpayers.

We've had both the Senate President and the Speaker come out in support of that initiative. And again, although we haven't seen a specific proposal in writing, in concept we think we're in good shape to at least maintain the money we're getting and hopefully enhance those local lane allocations because quite frankly I was concerned with the state of the State that they were going to look to use the local lane allocations to fund certain portions of the State Budget. That doesn't look like that's going to be the case right now, but I wanted to make sure that counties and and, you know, our colleagues with the League of Municipalities have done the same as well testifying at committees, at countless public hearings. Freeholder King joined me in the past year or two and, again, is become an issue that we'll make sure to keep you posted on this.

Before I move on to my last issue, I might have two more, but I don't want to take up......there's a lot of people here, anybody have any questions?"

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "Just one comment, if I may. It is more partial to Ocean County as far as roads and bridges because we're the second largest county in the State of New Jersey and, of course, we don't have an industrial basis, it's paid for with residential taxes. And the second thing is, we have more regulations and we pay more per mile in New Jersey and even more so in Ocean County than any place else in the United States because of CAFRA, because of Pinelands (Commission rules), and because of State regulations, so all that has to be taken into consideration when you figure something out. But again, it's the cost of when you construct something in the County because of our sensitivity to the environment. I'm not complaining about it, but it does cost more and those requirements are imposed on us by the State of New Jersey."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "What is really unfair is the fact that Ocean County doesn't have mass transportation that most of the communities in the northern part of the State have use of. There is no mass transportation in the whole South Jersey (area). And that's why the gas tax always is one that we react very negatively to because it unfairly punishes the people that live here.

First off, the jobs for the most part are not here. And people have to travel to go to work. And in this economy to say we're now going to charge even more to go to work, we passed a resolution and sent it, I believe, to NJAC if I'm not wrong, and in that it said we also want a stable funding mechanism, but we don't believe the gas tax is a proper mechanism. It doesn't treat everyone fairly.

Freeholder Little I saw has his hand up."

DEPUTY LITTLE: "Yes. Thank you Mr. Director. And I thank Freeholder King and John, again, for being here. And with regard to the Transportation Trust Fund, whatever is decided to try to provide enhanced funding, I would urge NJAC as our representatives and I think the Freeholder would agree that we want the revenues dedicated for capital projects. For years and years, for decades actually, the State Legislature has skimmed the money from the Transportation Trust Fund and used it to pay for salaries, for operating expenses, in order to offset the need to provide that funding in a State Budget itself. So they have had free reign. They, if you want to look at it this way, they've stolen – legally – they've stolen tens upon tens of millions of dollars, hundreds of millions from the Transportation Trust Fund and used it for operating expenses and that's what we want to avoid.

They do it in other trust funds to, as you well know, this is not unique to the Transportation Trust Fund. It helps the State balance the Budget without increasing taxes."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Freeholder Haines, do you have anything to add?"

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "No."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "And your next item?"

JOHN DONNADIO: "Well, I think I have two quick things."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "One thing here."

JOHN DONNADIO: "One thing?"

DIRECTOR KELLY: "You lied. No, you can have two."

JOHN DONNADIO: "I'll give you one thing."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "You can have two. Go ahead."

JOHN DONNADIO: "I'll give you the somewhat, and I don't have an answer for this one, but it's something that we're concerned about and we asked all our counties to adopt a resolution accordingly. It's with respect to the pension systems. And, again, we've all read in the newspapers that the State Pension System is nearly insolvent and will be, in fact, insolvent in 2019 if some type of remedy is not initiated by that time. Our concern is that there is the local portion of the Pension System that is well-funded. It's well-funded, that's both for the Public Employee Retirement System and the Police and Fire Retirement System. It is funded at 75-76% because counties and municipalities have been good stewards of the property taxpayer dollars and meeting their obligations as employers over the past decade and longer. So we are very concerned that short of some type of tax increase, short of some type of additional employee concessions, and I'll speak faster, that the State is going to subsidize its portion of the Pension System which is paid for by a local property taxpayer dollars and we think that's inherently unfair. I don't have a solution, unfortunately, like we do have recommendations with the other things, other than reach out to your Legislators. We have a model resolution opposing that action.

So, the last thing that I have is an initiative that we're working on that came from our Finance Officers and Administrators, most of what we do is we play defense on things, but I enjoy working on initiatives that come from our county affiliate groups that allow counties to operate more effectively and efficiently. In one such bill, we are very optimistic it will get signed into law by the end of the year, will allow county governments to pay their bills electronically. Under current law, counties believe it or not, have to write a paper check to pay their bills and we think it's an antiquated method. It will be up to the discretion of the county if they want to move in that direction. They continue to pay their bills by writing a paper check if they so choose, but if they want to move towards paying their bills electronically, we believe it will streamline the bill paying process and reduce taxpayer dollars. So I promise, that's all I have."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "We thank you for coming."

JOHN DONNADIO: "Thank you for having us."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Mr. President."

FREEHOLDER JOHN KING: "Thank you very much for having the opportunity to be here. And thank you for all your patience for letting us go through this. I know you're all here to award your contest winners. Right?"

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "Thank you very much. We appreciate it and it was a great learning lesson for some of our students that are here today. We appreciate you coming."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Roman, now you can join your parents so that we can give you an award. Okay, we're going to move along to finish presentations if Chrissy, you would take the agenda."

2. To the Winners of the "My County" Poster Contest in recognition of "National County Government Month" in Ocean County.

DEPUTY CLERK WIOLAND: "The next item is a presentation to the winners of the 'My County' Poster Contest in recognition of 'National County Government Month' in Ocean County and that's being presented by Freeholder Director Kelly and our County Clerk, Scott Colabella who will come up and announce the winners."

COUNTY CLERK COLABELLA: "Good afternoon everybody. How is everybody on this beautiful sunshiny day here in Ocean County? Just very briefly, we so look forward and I know the Freeholders do to every year at this time to celebrate 'National County Government Month' which was in April. Fourth graders throughout the State and here in Ocean County learn about County government and as Freeholder Vicari noted, what a great experience it is - we've never had one of our winners actually sit up here with the five Freeholders, but it gives you a sense of what these fine lady and gentlemen do. They run our County.

You heard about roads which we all drive on and the jails where bad people go. But, Freeholder Kelly has to find a place to put them and where does the money come from to pay for that? Your County Library system and on and on it goes. So it gave you a good first-hand idea of what our Freeholder Board does.

So this year we had 30 schools throughout the County that participated in this contest. So to think only 4 fourthgraders out of 30 schools, you're some pretty talented children. 81 altogether (participants) and before we give out the certificates and some good gifts, we want to thank the Lakewood BlueClaws because each winner is going to get four reserved seats to a Lakewood BlueClaws game, four weekly beach passes for a week at the Seaside Heights at one of their beaches. So we want to thank Seaside Heights for that and Dana Lancellotti for helping us.

With that, we have our Surrogate, we have our Freeholder and Freeholder do we want to start with Honorable Mention and work our way up to number one?"

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "Yes, I'd just like to read just a couple of notes to explain the 2016 Action Plan.

Today, of course, we have a Public Hearing on the County of Ocean Consortium 2016 Action Plan. This plan serves as a management tool and grant application for Federal funding on behalf of the County of Ocean and the Townships of Brick, Jackson, Toms River, and Lakewood. The Action Plan contains an individual listing of the projects recommended for funding in FY 2016 through two Federal programs: the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program and the HOME program.

The FY2016 CDBG allocation, as we stated, is \$1,069,786.00 And \$366,000.00 of the FY2016 funding is allocated for 12 municipal projects including projects for ADA improvements, curb and sidewalk improvements, and housing rehabilitation. \$186,000.00 of FY2016 funding is allocated for 13 public service activities including Foodbank, Ocean County Hunger Relief, Interfaith Hospitality Network, and Ocean, Inc.

As was stated by the Clerk, she did mention that Brick (\$273,077.00), Toms River (\$363,994.00), Lakewood (\$1,200,529.00) and Jackson (\$168,959.00) are separate entitlements because they are not within the municipalities and they going to receive their own CDBG allocation all on their own. All of the allocations were unanimously approved by the County's CDBG Steering Committee. For the eighteenth consecutive year, Ocean County has met the HUD timeliness standard for the expenditure of CDBG funds.

The FY2016 HOME allocation is \$955,431.00 and includes the First Time Homebuyers which have talked about at a previous Board Meeting, Housing Rehabilitation, Tenant Based Rental Assistance Program, and Rental Housing Production through community Housing Development organizations.

The County's Housing Advisory Committee unanimously approved these recommendations.

And, as it was said, the two Public Hearings were held by each participating municipality eligible for CDBG funding in FY2016 and two by the County, including one Pre-development Hearing. The Public Hearings were in compliance with the County's HUD Citizen Participation Plan.

This plan, as was also stated, will be submitted to the US Department of Housing and Urban Development by May 15, 2016 with a start date of July 1, 2016.

And, also just to say that, just so that everyone knows that not every year can the same municipality apply for CDBG Grants. It is every other year that they may apply. And, of course, I mentioned the four towns that are separate because of the way the recommendation comes down for determining - those towns are on their because it goes by population. Thank you very much Mr. Director."

#### V. FREEHOLDER COMMENTS

At 4:53 PM, Freeholder Director Kelly received the following comments from members of the Board:

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Okay. We'll move to Freeholder Comments. Freeholder Vicari."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "Yes, Mr. Director, if I may have several comments. Good news! I just spoke to Freeholder John Bartlett who called me up, feeling very positive and upbeat and asked me to give his best to the Board and the people that are here today. And again, he's doing very, very well with treatments.

My second comment is, of course, tomorrow I'm giving the address to Monmouth-Ocean Development Council on behalf of the Board of Freeholders. They're expecting about 400 leaders from Ocean and Monmouth Counties and it's a very, very excellent organization. They do a lot of different things for a lot of people and if anyone wants to vote on anything that's really very positive, we'll vote the 'Best Beaches in New Jersey'. And again, we would appreciate it if you would, of course, pick one or two beaches from Ocean County. We always do very, very well and we're very proud of the beaches that we have. We have 44 miles of coastline. The best sand as far as being that sugar-type sand that you can't find any place not only in the United States, but in the world. So vote and vote often for Ocean County.

Next thing is some more good news. I met today with all the (Pumpout Boats) boat captains for the kick-off meeting. Donna Flynn is going to do a press release. It's extremely complicated, but again all good news. Our goal is to make sure that when we do the press release that we continue to focus in on one thing that's very important – Barnegat Bay – to make it cleaner this year than it was last year and the year before that. It's working out very, very well. We have an additional pumpout boat. The captains were there today. We had some State Officials there today and we had a good meeting of the minds on what should we do to protect Barnegat Bay, Tice's Shoal and a few of the other areas. They do an outstanding job. They are the eyes and ears of keeping us not only safe, but pollution free.

Two other areas Mr. Director, if I may. And again, I went to Robert J. Miller Airport on Saturday. As you know I'm not only the liaison, better known as the Manager, a title imposed by the United States government in order to sign the contracts because we've received since I've been involved with the airport over \$23 million in grants from the State and Federal government. We pay nothing at all. But as you know, the airport that we have is billion dollar asset to all of us as far as doing many good things for us in Ocean County as far as working with the Forest Service – they just left last weekend to protect Ocean County – for emergencies as we have during hurricanes and storms. We work with all law enforcement agencies to keep their equipment there on State and Federal levels.

We still have the air patrol, the Black Sheep. So it's a lot of good things. And as you mentioned before, we now have the crosswinds (runway) that make it substantially safer. But the good news is quarter of a million dollars we received from the State NJDOT to upgrade the helicopter pads.

We get a lot of prominent people and you know what I'm talking about, we cannot give the names, but they land there quite often from the New York area to refuel their helicopters and take off. We have over 100 planes at the present time. We have a very aggressive program to expand the airport hangars that we're going to present next week. I have Dave McKeon that I'm working with and it's a great thing. We're making money with it. It's a great asset.

But, I just want to mention one more thing and that is, (that) it is a national, maybe more than, a national museum. Let me tell you about some of the aircraft that we have over there. We have a B-25 Mitchell Bomber, the original plane, the same type that Jimmy Doolittle used to bomb Tokyo in 1942. There's only a handful left in the world and it's at our airport. A C-54 originally used in the Berlin Aerolift in 1948. A DC-3 used to support troops on D-Day, the original plane that was used on D-Day. A P-51 Mustang WWII Flyer that has 22 confirmed enemy planes destroyed. Twelve enemy planes and we have the original plane. A PT-13 Steerman Trainer, the original plane that was used as a trainer for the Tuskagee Airmen and there is only three left in the world.

So it goes to show how important that airport is that we have. It's a very valuable asset to us and we value it. And again, 95% of all the improvements that we make over there is with monies from the State and Federal government – a lot of the contracts that we use. Sometimes we even pay ourselves to do the work. So it keeps on giving. It's a great investment and we will continue to do whatever is necessary. And again, we paid a lot of money for the improvements so that it meets the highest State standards and it is one of few airport expansions that were made anywhere, going back several years ago with the crosswinds (runway).

The last item, is something I have been working on with the Pinelands Commission. It's something that's been going on probably, with this Board, for 20 years to protect the Pinelands and that is the illegal dumping that's taking place. If you look on the Web Page of WOBM you will see that several towns are very concerned with this. I did a survey with it on Saturday when I was with the pilots that left, the fire-fighters that left our airport. It was Lacey, Waretown and Barnegat – now Berkeley Township – it's becoming a problem. I spoke with the Commissioner today, Alan Avery, and even when he was here that because of Facebook and the media that takes place today - the social media - we have the ATVs, the quads, the trail bikes and campers that come to Ocean County and what they do is they go through the Pinelands. In Ocean County alone, there are 150 square miles where they go, they leave debris, there's bottles, there's drinking that takes place, bonfires that take place. They leave all the debris and they scar the Pinelands. And what we want to do, our goal, is to make sure we protect it and save it for future generations.

The issue they gave today, and Carmen Amato from Berkeley (Township) is going through the same thing, if they catch anyone in there – and virtually all of them are unregistered vehicles – no insurance and many times they don't have a helmet - they will confiscate the equipment and, of course, they will have to pay a fine. And what's been happening for example, two years ago just in Berkeley Township I remember by the WOBM tower in the back, they had over 350 people that were there on all kinds vehicles and when they left a mess. And we know from past experience and I was telling Alan Avery, that this Board, going back to Reedy Creek that was mentioned last week, I'll tell you what happened with it. It took us two full summers to clean it up because what happened in Reedy Creek when it was left there it was like a giant landfill. We don't want that to happen in the Pinelands. Let me tell you what they had. They had parts of houses, plumbing supplies, debris and all kinds of junk that was there - even a bus! Numerous cars, thousands of tires, and Freeholder Lacey at that time was in charge of the Road Department and the recyclables, so we cleaned it up. And from the air it looks like the same thing could happen. Alan Avery is going to go to the Pinelands Commission which represents five different counties, I believe, in New Jersey to make sure that work with other agencies. Now it's up to the local police agencies and they're doing a great job, but I think more has to be done to make sure because we do a press release. These are not residents from Ocean County. They come from different states. They come from all over because on social media they do two things: they go on Google and they give a map of where they're going to be and where they are throughout the County of Ocean. And besides that, they all meet, they come on a Friday, they leave on a Sunday and we have to deal with it.

Going back, I spoke to the Emergency Management and some law enforcement agencies and you can't get into the woods when they call up 911 if there's an emergency because they are four and five miles into the woods. They go in there, they get people that are hurt, they pull them out and then our volunteers get injured. So it is a serious problem. And also if anyone gets hurt, you don't know who to sue. Well, is it Pinelands (Commission), is it County, is it private land, is it township land, is it park land? And usually it's to who? The County of Ocean. We always get sued as our Counselor knows. And I remember some of the lawsuits even when I was the Mayor of Toms River that we'd get sued all the time. Sometimes we settled, we'd talk to the Administrator, just to get rid of the nuisance lawsuit. But, they always sue, even if it's not our land. So we want to put ourselves in a protective posture so we'll ask the attorney to take a look at this. Alan Avery will present this next Thursday at the Pinelands (Commission). And again, I commend the local police chiefs and the Mayors of all those towns and we just want to make everyone aware that we know about it and we're working on it. And what we're going to do, basically, is to make sure we protect and we don't want a Pinelands that's going to be scarred with debris that's left over there.

When I took a look at it, I can see that when I talked to Alan Avery it's aggressively, exponentially getting worse as time goes on, but more so I think, the last two years than ever before. So we're aware of it and action will be taken on the State level working with different State agencies to see what else can be done. So not only do we stop it, but anyone who is in the Pinelands scarring up our property, degrading our property, I think it's an assault on the Pinelands that's going to stop or they're going to have to pay the price by having their vehicles confiscated. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. Freeholder Little."

DEPUTY LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. Sometime in the late 1990s the Legislature passed, maybe John will be familiar with exactly the date – John Doherty – the Legislature passed a bill and it was signed by the Governor to establish the New Jersey Mission of Honor. This is a nonprofit 501(c) organization, but it is authorized by State law. Their single mission is to go around throughout the State of New Jersey and contact funeral directors to identify the remains of any veterans who have been abandoned. Simply put, when often times it's an elderly veteran who has no spouse, no relatives and so their body is cremated and remains at the funeral home in an urn. And this organization goes around the State – some of them are elderly, live alone – all different circumstances as you can imagine. In any event, so many of these remains stay in the funeral directors inventory, if you will, for many, many years. And this organization so far has identified the remains of 470 veterans who died without anyone claiming their remains and their job is then to give them a military burial at Arneytown. They have held 23 ceremonies throughout the State where they ceremoniously, with other veterans, receive these remains, pay their respects, read their name and so forth. It's a very moving ceremony. There have been 4 in Ocean County to this date. And on behalf of the Board, I represented Ocean County and many times, John Doherty, has accompanied us.

There was one this week at the New Egypt Elks Lodge which was co-hosted by the New Egypt Elks. We want to thank them and the New Egypt American Legion Post and they identified and removed and buried the remains of 9 veterans and I'll read them very quickly. Ralph Gregor, who was from World War II, he had been abandoned. He died in 1993 and had been left at a funeral home for 22 years. George Sedlak, who served in Korea, and he died in 1999 and had been abandoned for 16 years. Anthony Stanek, World War II, died in 1995 and he had been abandoned for 21 years. George Stamp, who was World War II, and he died in 1990 and had been abandoned for 25 years. Alfred Toms, World War II, veteran - US Army, died in 1999 and he had been abandoned for 16 years. Emmett Wortman, World War II, died in 1991 and he was abandoned for 26 years – US Army Air Force at time in World War II. Harold Birkmire died in 1977, World War II veteran, and he had been abandoned – US Army John – had been abandoned for 38 years. Ralph Madea, World War II, died in 1976 and he had been abandoned – US Army John – had been abandoned for 40 years. And Vincent Natale, World War II veteran died in 1986 and he had been abandoned for 29 years.

So we thank this organization again. It is a 501(c). It is a nonprofit organization. And they go, like I said, go around the State and identify all these remains. They must be veterans. That's the only caveat. And they are given a military burial at Arneytown.

And again, along those lines, since our last meeting we've received notification about three MIA/KIA remains that have been returned to the United States by the Defense Department POW/MIA Accounting Agency which has, as we've said many times here before, is the Federal agency which goes around the world and identifies and many times removes them, exhumes them from places they may have been buried around the world. Navy Fireman 3rd Class Kenneth Jayne of Suffolk County, New York had been missing since December 7, 1941. He was at Pearl Harbor and he was on the Oklahoma off Ford Island by Pearl Harbor. His remains were discovered and brought home and he was buried. Army Corporal George G. Simmons of Hamilton, Montana had been missing since November 19, 1942 where he was killed in combat in the Philippines and, excuse me, he was wounded in combat. He was captured by the Japanese and he died in their prison camp. And lastly, Army private John Sersha, who was at the time 21 years old from St. Louis County, Minnesota and he was missing since September 27, 1944 while fighting in the Netherlands – Army. He was assigned to Company F, 325th Glider Infantry Regiment, 82nd Airborne Division and for those of you who read World War II books and are familiar with World War II movies, this to me, and John can verify that, this sounds like the movie 'Bridge Too Far'? Or those of you who may have read the book? So it looks to me like we brought home an American from the 'Bridge Too Far'.

And lastly, at the beginning of the meeting our County Clerk of the Board offered a prayer to keep our soldiers and sailors, airmen and Marines in our prayers and we have now lost our third military person. A Navy Seal was killed in Iraq this week. The third KIA that we've had in combat since President Obama has now sent over the "advisers" back to Iraq. So we certainly remember Charles Keating, Jr., Navy Seal, killed in action. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Okay. Freeholder Haines."

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "Thank you Mr. Director, just a couple of things. One, I would just like to say last night I was at the Ocean County Library because I gave a proclamation with regards to May is 'Mental Health Month'. And while I was there, not only with the people that received different awards that they had, but they had 12 posters that were done by 12 students from different schools in the County and it represents the month of the year. And I will tell you that they had to give – there were different sayings like – I'm just trying to remember some of them, to talk about the stigma that people have with whether they're going to be bullied or to make sure that if you see someone that's alone or might be depressed or something – for these young people – and then they would do a picture pertaining to what that saying was. It was extremely impressive and after seeing what we saw here today and then see what I saw last night, you can see the young people are just – that's our future. And they're the people that are going to be working in positions such as we have or out there in the private sector, that are going to be defending our country. But, you can tell how much they really, really care and that we should be very proud of all of our young people because they are just unbelievable individuals.

And I was extremely impressed with the program last night that was put on by Jamie from Human Services, along with Tracy who is Director of Human Services. It was very, very impressive. I was very, very glad that I was able to be there.

The other thing is this coming Friday I will be attending the 79th Year Anniversary of the Hindenburg Disaster that's going to be held at Lakehurst. So it's really my pleasure to attend. I mean some people know, some people don't, but, my mother had been a young nurse at the time and she was a nurse to 2 of the survivors of the Hindenburg. And she had seen Werner Doehner who was at the 50th Anniversary. She had been invited to Lakehurst to go there. And she hadn't seen Werner in close to 50 years and he recognized her immediately. It's really something that things like this is what we need to remember. I know that day he had come and visited and he also sent the, it would be considered the German 'National Geographic' to my mother's home to talk about what transpired with these young people and what they went through at that thing. But, I will be very happy that I am able to attend the Hindenburg remembrance on Friday evening at Lakehurst.

And also I would like to thank the Planning Board for the CDBG and all the work that was done with working with everyone on that. Everyone that was involved, I'd just like to thank.

And one last thing, when I was going to be attending the Board of Social Services meeting last week, I stopped downstairs to the Veterans (Department) because I wanted to ask a question and I just want to compliment John as well. I know all around the departments have individuals like this, but the young lady that was at the desk, I listened to her. She was helping a veteran. I was extremely impressed with the patience and compassion that this young woman showed to this veteran to explain to him exactly all the things that he would need and to make sure that he did that. If he had any questions to make sure to call, to make sure they should have these forms, to make sure that you ask for the particular forms, whatever the case may be. I was very, very impressed with the time that she took with me standing there. Sometimes people like to take their time and how some of the other times they like to rush because they see someone waiting. This woman did not care that I was standing there and I was to wait until she was finished, but she was absolutely wonderful individual. I didn't get her name, but I just know that she was very, very good and I just want to compliment the woman in your department, John, as well as all the other departments here. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you Freeholder Haines. Administrator?"

COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR CARL BLOCK: "Director, I just want to mention this upcoming Monday, May 9th. The Police Unity Tour consisting of approximately 500 cyclists will stop here at the courtyard between the Prosecutor's Office and 129 Hooper Administrative Office for a short ceremony before they continue on their ride to Washington. This is to honor fallen police officers.

First of all, this is a worthwhile cause, but also the notice particularly says the route and the time the riders, 500 cyclists are due to arrive around 4:00 PM. They are expected to conclude their ceremony about 5:30 PM and then go back on the road. They are headed to Washington, DC, so they will be headed south from here. Actually they are going a little more west our through Water Street and up Lakehurst Road. So if you can imagine, there will be some traffic control restrictions, some parking restrictions on that day. Be advised that the Toms River Police and other police departments.

The Tour actually starts in the Hanover Marriott in Whippany, New Jersey in the morning. They are driving all the way down the length of the State of New Jersey, arriving here about 4:00 and leaving about 5:30 and for the ceremony here, there will be friends and relatives of the fallen who will be parked here for the ceremony. #### ORDINANCE #2016-4

#### AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING VARIOUS ENGINEERING, ROAD, BRIDGE AND DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS, AT VARIOUS LOCATIONS, ALL IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND APPROPRIATING \$2,000,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,900,000 IN BONDS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN TO FINANCE THE SAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING), AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. There is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the County of Ocean as general

improvements, various engineering, road, bridge and drainage improvements, at various locations, all in the

County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, in accordance with plans and specifications on file in the Ocean County

Engineering Department, including all else necessary therefor and incidental thereto.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared that the improvements or purposes, the

There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$3,100,000, including the sum of \$435,000 as the down payment, for the improvements or purposes described in Section 1 hereof as required by the Local Bond Law. The down payment has been made available by virtue of provision in the Capital Improvement Fund of the County of Ocean in one or more previously adopted budgets.

SECTION 4. There is hereby authorized the issuance of negotiable bonds in an aggregate principal amount of \$2,665,000 to finance part of the cost of the purposes stated in Section 1 hereof. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding the limit authorized by law, and the maturities, method of sale and other details thereof shall be determined by subsequent resolutions to be adopted in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 5. In order to temporarily finance the purposes provided for in Section 1 hereof, there

is hereby authorized the issuance of bond anticipation notes of said County in an aggregate principal amount of \$2,665,000. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the County Comptroller; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and shall be in such form as may be determined by the County Comptroller. The County Comptroller shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this Ordinance, and the County Comptroller's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8.1. The County Comptroller is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The County Comptroller is directed to report in writing to the Board of Chosen Freeholders at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this Ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 6. The County reasonably expects to commence acquisition and/or construction of the improvements described in Section 1 hereof, and to advance all or a portion of the costs in respect thereof, prior to the issuance of bonds or notes hereunder. To the extent such costs are advanced, the County further reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance, in an aggregate amount not to exceed the amount of bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof. This bond ordinance is intended to be a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 7. Any additional grant monies received for the purposes described in Section 1 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

SECTION 8. The amount of the proceeds of the obligations authorized by this Ordinance which may be used for the payment of interest on such obligations, architects' fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses, and other items as provided in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 shall not exceed the sum of \$650,000.

SECTION 9. The Capital Budget of the County of Ocean is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. In the event of any such inconsistency and amendment, the resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended Capital Budget and Capital Program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders and is available there for

public inspection.

SECTION 10. It is hereby found, determined and declared as follows:

A. The improvements or purposes described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses. They are improvements or purposes the County may lawfully undertake as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property benefited thereby.

B. The average period of usefulness of the improvements for which the obligations authorized by this Ordinance are to be issued is thirty (30) years.

C. The supplemental debt statement provided for in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-10 was duly filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders prior to the passage of this Ordinance on first reading, and a complete executed duplicate of such supplemental debt statement has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey, and such supplemental debt statement shows that the gross debt of the County as defined in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-43 is increased by this Ordinance by \$2,665,000 and the obligations authorized by this Ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

SECTION 11. In the event the monies set forth above for any purpose is not necessary for said purposes, then such monies shall be for the completion of any of the other purposes provided for in this Ordinance.

SECTION 12. The full faith and credit of the County of Ocean shall be pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds and notes authorized by this Ordinance, and as long as any of said bonds or notes are outstanding, an appropriation shall be included in each annual budget of the County hereafter adopted in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds or notes maturing in each year. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the County, and the County shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the County for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

#### RESOLUTION May 4, 2016

WHEREAS, the County of Ocean, an Urban County Community Development Block Grant Entitlement and the Townships of Brick, Toms River, Jackson, and Lakewood, Metropolitan City Community Development Block Grant Entitlements, formed a consortium for the purpose of receiving a formula allocation under the HOME Investment Partnership Program; and

WHEREAS, in 2015, the County prepared and the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) approved a comprehensive Consolidated Plan on behalf of the Ocean County Consortium in order to continue to receive funding from a variety of Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) programs including; the Community Development Block Grant Program (CDBG) and the HOME Investment Partnership Program; and

WHEREAS, the Ocean County Department of Planning is the designated the Lead Agency responsible for the preparation of the Consolidated Plan which includes coordination efforts with the Township of Brick, Toms River, Jackson, and Lakewood in accordance with Federal requirements; and

WHEREAS, the Ocean County Consortium 2016 Action Plan is considered the application for Federal funding assistance from HUD for the Consortium members and has been developed consistent with Federal regulations which includes a provision for a separate citizen participation element; and

WHEREAS, the Ocean County Consortium 2016 Action Plan has been the subject of several public meetings throughout the planning process and has been made available for public review during the public comment period including review by the Ocean County Community Development Block Grant Committee and the Ocean County Housing Advisory Committee (CHAC); and

WHEREAS, upon approval of the Ocean County Consortium 2016 Action Plan, the County of Ocean anticipates the allocation of 2016 Federal grant funds from the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the following programs: the Community Development Block Grant Program (CDBG), the Ocean County \$1,069,786.00 plus the Township of Jackson \$168,959.00 for which the County Administers, for a total allocation of \$1,238,745.00 and the HOME Investment Partnership Program \$955,431.00.

Freeholder Director John P. Kelly opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Present:

Freeholder Director John P. Kelly Freeholder John C. Bartlett, Jr. Freeholder Virginia E. Haines Freeholder Joseph H. Vicari Carl W. Block, County Administrator Betty Vasil, Clerk of the Board Mary Ann Cilento, Recording Secretary Michael J. Fiure, Assistant County Administrator Keith J. Goetting, Director of Human Resources Julie N. Tarrant, Comptroller/CFO John N. Ernst, County Engineer Christine Wioland, Deputy Clerk of the Board Donna Flynn, Director, Public Information John C. Sahradnik, Jr., County Counsel

Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the recommended award of the reconstruction and resurfacing of portions of County roads located in Lakewood, Manchester and Lacey Townships in the amount of \$1,191,113.13 to Earle Asphalt Company. There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the agenda for the March 16, 2016 Board meeting.

Freeholder Bartlett noted that all of the Freeholders have had a chance to look over the proposed budget. The Freeholder stated that earlier in the year, department heads Introducests that also go to the Administrator and the CFO. The department heads Adopted on: May 4, 2016 Official Resolution#: 2016000559

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have been very reasonable with what they are putting in their budget requests. The Freeholder noted that each department reviews with their Freeholders their requests, this works very well.

Freeholder Bartlett stated that the County began 2015 with a surplus amount of \$36.4 million and the County used \$16 million to support the budget in 2015 leaving a balance of \$20.4 million in surplus, noting that it is always the County's intention to replace the surplus during the year. The real goal, the Freeholder stated, is for the County to have a surplus that is 10 percent of the budget. Freeholder Bartlett advised that the County began this year with \$43,500,000 in surplus which is 10 percent of the budget which he believed guarantees the County Triple A bond rating. Freeholder Bartlett stated that the County intends to use \$16.5 million of that surplus leaving a balance of \$27 million. The Freeholder noted that the County is at the goal that it has been aiming for. The County will be using \$500,000 in surplus to split between the College and the VoTech schools, giving each \$250,000 which is the first increase in ten years, for a total of \$14.9 to the College and \$17.9 million to the VoTech.

Freeholder Bartlett noted that the 2016 Budget the State envisions hiring 8 additional new employees due to the Bail Reform Program which will require the Superior Court to be open on Saturdays requiring more staff from the Prosecutor and Sheriff. The Sheriff will require three new officers and the Prosecutor will require five new employees. The Freeholder noted, however, that the total salary expenditure will be up only <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of 1 percent which includes new hires, negotiated contracts and nonaligned employees; as people retire at the top of the scale, they are being replaced with much lower salaried employees.

Freeholder Bartlett pointed out that an increase of 33 percent is included for State mental health services. Director Kelly stated that those costs may go higher as more people are requiring more of these services.

Freeholder Bartlett reviewed the overall budget which will be introduced at \$399.9 million which is a decrease of \$13 million from last year. The Freeholder noted that it is very difficult to compare one budget to another because the budget was affected by Superstorm Sandy and costs from that inflated the budget with FEMA money coming in and going out. The Freeholder stated that the FEMA reimbursements were at 90 percent reimbursement which still left 10 percent County responsibility. Freeholder Bartlett noted that the County had real costs in the neighborhood of \$10 million.

Freeholder Bartlett advised that this budget will have a County tax rate increase of 3/10 of 1 percent to 35.3 cents per \$100 of equalized property value. The Freeholder stated that the tax base has grown by about \$2 billion from approximately \$92.5 billion to \$94.5 billion this year most of which is from new construction; that \$2 billion increase will help offset the loss of federal funds. Freeholder Bartlett noted that the County is still off 14 percent from its tax ratable base in 2009.

Freeholder Bartlett stated that the County budget does not have any surprises, the County has been as careful as it can be while still doing what is right, noting that the tax rate Adopted on: May 4, 2016 Official Resolution#: 2016000559

itself at 35.3 is still about the same as 12 years ago, while at the same time reaching the standard of 10 percent that the rating agencies require to help guarantee the County's Triple A rating which is extremely important when the County borrows money.

Freeholder Vicari commended Freeholder Bartlett for an outstanding job on the budget, noting that Ocean County always provides core services for a growing county. Freeholder Vicari stated that the County is down 168 employees while adjusting for law enforcement and doing more with less. Freeholder Vicari stated that with Ocean County College / Kean University and the Ocean County VoTech, our residents have opportunities for a great education. The Freeholder noted that last year the County provided an additional \$250,000 for the meals on wheels program because additional money was needed. Freeholder Vicari stated that most of our seniors over 82 are on support services, which is keeping them out of nursing homes. The Freeholder stated that the County maintains a remarkable Triple A bond rating, a budget for a growing economy, preserving core services. Freeholder Vicari stated that it is a different world today in 2016 and he commended County employees for doing an excellent job. The Freeholder stated that the slight increase in the budget is really a flat budget and he thanked Freeholder Bartlett and the professional staff for their hard work.

Freeholder Haines thanked Freeholder Bartlett for his work on the budget, noting that Ocean County is a fiscally conservative county and thanked the department heads and their staff for staying within the budget each year. The County maintains a surplus for future emergencies showing fiscal responsibility. Freeholder Haines noted the County's Triple A bond rating and the excellent job by the County to accomplish this. The Freeholder stated that Ocean County is the premier County in the State with the Tripe A bond rating.

Freeholder Bartlett stated the County's makes it work and is proud of the fact that we have made it work without laying any employees off and no furloughs; and the County made it work with a 20 percent loss of the ratable base from Superstorm Sandy. Freeholder Vicari stated that a lot of compromises took place and everyone worked with them.

Director Kelly stated that the budget is fiscally conservative but the County continues to invest in Ocean County; noting an increase in funding in this year's budget which will be split between the VoTech and Ocean County College is an investment in our children. Director Kelly also noted that Ocean County does not let the needy go without; the County is providing \$23 million to the Board of Social Services which is a large investment. The Director stated that a program is being worked on to assist people coming out of the jail. Director Kelly stated Ocean County invests in people over and over more than other levels of government.

Freeholder Haines stated that Ocean County is lucky to have Dr. Larson at Ocean County College, noting that Dr. Larson has done a lot of programs that reach out across the County, providing the average person, if they want to stay in Ocean County, the opportunity of going to Ocean County College and then on to Kean University.

Freeholder Vicari stated that Ocean County markets in 6 states and Canada for tourism. The Freeholder stated that in 2015 Ocean County generated \$4.6 billion in tourism dollars, which is 10 percent of tourism dollars spent in New Jersey. The Freeholder noted that this is up from 2014 which was \$4.3 billion. Dana Lancellotti, Division Director, was in attendance and noted that Ocean County is number 3 in the State for tourism dollars. The Freeholder stated that Dana Lancellotti is here to update the Board on her efforts. Ms. Lancellotti provided a copy of the 2016 edition of the Explore Ocean County Magazine to the Board members and advised that the County's pays about \$5,000 to participate in this magazine noted that the County has creative control over the types of stories that are covered. Ms. Lancellotti stated that the magazine is distributed at travel shows in Boston, DC, Pennsylvania and the New York Times, as well as up and down the Parkway and Turnpike as well as at the Joint Base. Ms. Lancellotti also noted that bases in other states request the magazine.

Ms. Lancellotti reviewed with the Board and demonstrated how to navigate the County's website. The website includes Cultural and Heritage events as well as tourism. Freeholder Vicari stated how easy it is to navigate the County's website from your smart phone. Ms. Lancellotti stated that there were approximately 186,000 visitors to the County's website in 2015. Of that amount, Ms. Lancellotti, noted that 600 visits were from Canadians last week.

The County is currently updating its Facebook page advised Ms. Lancellotti and she noted that the County has 1,300 followers. The new Facebook page will launch in the next two weeks.

Freeholder Haines noted that one of her new departments includes the First-Time Homebuyer Program, advising that this grant program has been in existence since 1994 and this year the County will be hitting the 500 mark. The Freeholder stated that working with financial institutions, a total of \$4,197,540 has been distributed through the First-Time Homebuyer Program in Ocean County since 1994. Freeholder Haines stated that this is an unbelievable program that educates applicants in budgeting and the criteria they have to meet to obtain a loan. Anthony Agliata, Assistant Planning Director, was in attendance and advised that OCEAN, Inc. will administer the program again this year and noted that 497 families have been helped to purchase a home since the inception of the program. Mr. Agliata stated that this year, the County will help approximately 16 applicants go through the program.

Ms. Vasil reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of March 16, 2016. Ms. Vasil noted that a construction project management contract for site development will be added to the agenda. There were no questions or comments.

Director Kelly asked the Board members for comments.

Freeholder Vicari noted that the Forest Fire Service will be returning to the Robert J. Miller Airpark which is major news that they are there in the event there is a forest fire in Introdecean Count May 4, 2016 Adopted on: May 4, 2016 Official Resolution#: 2016000559

Freeholder Vicari stated that it is Women's Veterans Month and veterans may be at the Board meeting.

There were no additional comments.

Ms. Vasil read the resolution to move to closed session.

Director Kelly advised that at the conclusion of the Closed Session, the Board will return to Open Session to close the meeting, noting that no action will be taken when the meeting returns to Open Session.

On a motion by Freeholder Haines, seconded by Freeholder Vicari, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 4:56 PM for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was unanimously carried.

The meeting returned to Open Session at 5:30 PM. There being no further business, on a motion by Freeholder Vicari, seconded by Freeholder Bartlett, the meeting adjourned at 5:30 PM.
