A. **STATEMENT** Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act.

Joseph H. Vicari, Freeholder Director, read the following statement of compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act:

- 2. Roll Call.

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean was called to order on October 1, 2014 at 4:00 PM, Room 119, County Administration Building, 101 Hooper Avenue, Toms River, Ocean County, New Jersey, with Freeholder Director Vicari presiding. Members Kelly, Bartlett, Lacey and Little were present at the call of the roll.

3. The Pledge of Allegiance and Prayer.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. Please be seated. Before I begin the public meeting today, I'd just like to acknowledge that we have our high school students from High School North, South and East (Toms River) And again, we encourage you, at the end of the meeting or during the meeting, to ask any questions about what we do as Freeholders or on the agenda. Again, I went to many of the schools over the last several weeks to talk our students and I would like to acknowledge them. We always have acknowledgement of our military people. I would like to acknowledge that Mr. McBride is here who works for Consumer Affairs. His son is back in Kuwait for his fourth tour of duty on a voluntary basis and we wish him well. And we have another special guest here from High School. We're going to have a future here....no? She is now in the United States Marines. A senior at High School North, Brianna McDonald, stand up for one second. Brianna signed for, Mr. Freeholder Little, a former Marine, not only six years, but she wants to stay there for 25 years and serve our country. Her dad was a Marine and we appreciate that his only daughter serving our country and we just want to not only acknowledge you, but we wish you the best from the Board of Freeholders.

We have two members on this Board who have sons in the Marine Corp, or in the service I should say. Freeholder Gerry Little, his son is an Ensign in the Navy in Pensacola. And next to him, Freeholder Jim Lacey, his son graduated the Naval Academy and he is a Commander and a pilot serving his country well. So we have two Freeholders here - their children - sons in the service, so we understand what families go through when they serve in a foreign country. So again, if there are any questions, especially with our students, we want to make this a great learning experience for them and I will probably go a little bit slow and explain things for them because when I was in the classroom, at that time, I told them to look on our Website, to look at our page to check our Public Release Statements and to ask any questions. So again, I will turn the meeting back over to Mrs. Vasil to continue the public meeting."

B. PROCLAMATION

CLERK VASIL: "Thank you Freeholder. Our first item of business today is a proclamation and this is Proclaiming October 2014 as "Women's Health Month" in Ocean County. With us we have Barbara Lehman who is the Vice Chairperson and members of the Ocean County Advisory Commission on the Status of Women if they would come forward please."

FREEHOLDER LACEY: "I would just like to say this, I believe, is probably my....I'm into my second decade now being the liaison to the Women's Commission and I know I'm redundant and I say that I'm redundant every year, but

I'll do it again because I know the best way to educate people is to constantly practice, practice, practice and repeat and repeat because it sinks in eventually.

But, I know and I see it in my own family, that the women are the primary caregivers. Until you see it firsthand, I know what the women do, I know that the Women's Commission advocate for women and they tell me what women do, but I've seen it firsthand in my family - the women - my wife in particular, my sisters taking care of my elderly parents, neighbors - they are the ones that do it. They get them to the doctor's appointment. They're the ones that make sure they have what they need. They do it. It's a woman thing and they're the caregivers and because of that they often neglect themselves. They forget to do it. They don't take time out for themselves. And they have an issue that they have to handle themselves because there's no one who is going to do it for them.

So we know that's important. When I know that it's important and this Board knows that it's important and because of that we constantly repeat it because the more we repeat it, we know people will adhere to it. It's like anything else, if you practice at it, when game day comes you're good at it. So we are aware of it. That's why we do this. This is why we have you up every year. That's why we talk about it. Because if you don't it will just melt away. You have to repeat and constantly have people understand it and constantly remind the women to take some time for yourself, not just the people you are taking care of."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I just want to add to it. I remember when I was Principal of an elementary school, the reason why many women did not go to a health screening and go for physical examinations on a routine basis was one thing they said they could not afford it. They said they needed the money for food for their children, to buy clothing for their children. So in many cases, the problem was and I've seen it firsthand, was well my children come first. No. Your health comes first. And this is what we have to realize in Ocean County.

We also have many programs on the Board of Health for females who cannot afford the proper healthcare. So there's no excuse for anyone to not get proper healthcare because what we have to offer and through the leadership of not only Freeholder Lacey, but your organization does a great job and we can say enough for you. Thank you for being involved in this organization of the Advisory Council for Women. Thank you."

FREEHOLDER LACEY: "Thank you. Do you want to say a few words?"

BARBARA LEHMAN: "On behalf of the Women's Health Committee we thank you for all you do for the women of Ocean County. It is so appreciated."

FREEHOLDER LACEY: "And we thank you for what you do."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "And we thank you for what you do."

LESLIE TERJESEN, OC HEALTH DEPARTMENT PUBLIC INFORMATION OFFICER: "Breast cancer is something that we should be aware of 365 days a year. When I got up this morning and turned on the TV and saw everyone wearing pink - well, I'm in a little bit off pink, but National Health Observances and National Health Observance Days really give us a reminder to wear pink. I'm a little bit off from your pink ribbons. But we are celebrating "Pretty in Pink Day" October 15th. Also, a women's issue is domestic violence and in researching domestic violence, "Domestic Violence Awareness Day" is also October 15th - which is to wear purple. So I'm trying to figure out to wear the pink and purple, but what we will do is we will bring pink and purple ribbons here that day for the meeting so everybody will be able to leave with a ribbon on that day. But again, we really remind women and men to be aware of breast cancer and to certainly make an appointment to get their mammogram. And as Freeholder Vicari said, the Ocean County Health Department partners with Community Medical Center through the New Jersey Education and Early Detection program, New Jersey CEED, where we do provide mammograms and we provide physicals for women who don't have insurance or Medicare or Medicaid. So we look forward to hearing from you. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Let me tell you something about domestic violence - we take this very serious and people throughout the State of New Jersey say why is it so many are reported in Ocean County? It's because we have not only a great record, but the educational programs that you have as far as making sure not only is it reported, but there's enforcement that takes place. And of all 21 counties, we are number one as far as detection and enforcement and doing something about it and it's because of the leadership of the Advisory Board. I think, if I'm not mistaken, we were the first county in the state to have a Women's Advisory Board and you do a great job. We were number one again.

Okay. If I may I would like to continue with a Public Hearing and roll call vote and we will have that in the public hearing, but the first thing is extremely important. I turn it back over to Mrs. Vasil. If anyone would like to leave after the Proclamation, if you want to you may do so. Thank you very much."

C. RESOLUTION - PUBLIC HEARING

Clerk Vasil read the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee recommendation resolution by title, which was scheduled for Public Hearing at this time.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "If I can just give a little overview before I turn it over to Freeholder Bartlett who is the liaison with this program. This one we started many years ago and we left it up to the people of Ocean County to say, 'Are you willing to tax yourselves at 1.2 cents to save money for open spaces?' And all 33 towns voted to say, 'You know something? I will pay taxes, I'll pay a little bit more, to protect land for future generations.' This is very important and one of the reasons because it helps protect our Joint Base. The Joint Base is, of course, our military base. The reason this is important - we had a major meeting on the Joint Base last week that had all of the Commanders of all three Bases at Ocean County College and the 8 Base Commanders were there. It translates into not only \$7 billion into the local economy, it's the second largest employer in the entire State of New Jersey. We have a very comprehensive program to protect the Joint Base and make sure it's not part of BRAC. Freeholder Kelly was working on this also. We have a Department of Economic Development. We buy as much land as possible around the Base so people don't complain about the infringement of the noise. We also have a very intense public awareness program which is so important to them and this is part of what we're doing today.

Ocean County today, as of today, has preserved 13 properties totaling 8,574 acres in partnership with the Department of Transportation on this. Now this is only for the Joint Base. Part of the purchase of \$14.8 million and the amount of the Department of Defense providing \$6.1 million. So a lot of what we do is in partnerships and many times it's a partnership with the local towns. Ocean County is in the process now, as we speak, for another 11 properties totaling 2,536 acres by the Base and these are pending. So next year - we always think ahead - in 2015, there are another 5 properties by the Base, 317 acres, that are being considered for preservation. Again, we want to make sure that we don't have any downsize as far as the missions at the military base. We want to make sure, of course, that it's not part of BRAC. We want to make sure that it continues to be vital not only to the County of Ocean and Burlington County, but with the United States in our global war against terrorism. The only nation in the world that can get a military unit any place in the world is from that Base, whether it be an aircraft carrier or it could be in Kuwait, it could be in Afghanistan, is at that Joint Base so that anyone on a fleet, if there's an emergency they have crews that are ready right now as I speak. So within hours they would not only be mobilized, but they will be on site. So again, I would like to turn it over to Freeholder John Bartlett, the liaison before we have a Public Hearing. Freeholder John Bartlett."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Thank you Mr. Director. You did an excellent overview of not only the program, but specifically how the program can help the Joint Base. The parcel in question today for the Public Hearing, this is all in Plumsted Township. This is the parcel we are now speaking about. It's 167 acres. As you can see, it has a border with the Joint Base on what would be the southern border of this property, the northern border of the Joint Base and therefore, would potentially be eligible for Department of Defense cost sharing on the purchase when and if they have the funds available. But even beyond that, our Natural Lands Trust Fund Committee has recommended to the Board for this Public Hearing that we purchase this 167 acres at the price of \$425,000.00, which I might add, is below the appraised value. We do two appraisals on the property. Never pay more than the appraised value. Only deal with a willing seller. We're not going after a piece of property that someone doesn't want to sell. You want to sell and the price is right and it fits our program, then we talk.

Now you may look at this map and say, 'Well, what's all that yellow stuff and green and orange and everything else?' It looks kind of like a checker board and it is, but all of those properties in Plumsted Township have been preserved in one way or another through the County's Farmland Preservation Program in yellow. This is where the County, through this program, buys the development rights on those farms. They remain as farms and are farmed and are private property and pay farmland taxes, but they must remain in farm production and they cannot be developed because the County, the public, owns the development rights on those. So the way that property looks today is the way it will look 100 years from now. What is in orange over here is also a deed restricted area. It is a bio-diversity park owned by a private concern. And then what you see in deep green is also land that has been previously purchased our Natural Lands Trust.

So as you see as the program develops and goes on year after year after year you get to see masses of land that are put together which the Director has always kind of remarked at. I remember when we bought our first ones, Joe said well there's a little piece here and a little piece there. After a while then all those little pieces all stick together. So this is what we've preserved in this area of Plumsted. Overall, I'm told this is around 1000 acres that has been preserved. Again, before you today is a negotiated purchase price of \$425,000.00 for 167 acres that borders the Joint

Base down here. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you. Any comments from members of the Board? And again, when we purchase land in Ocean County it's always from a willing seller. We do not condemn land. We don't use eminent domain. We negotiated in good faith and one thing that we do is we pay it immediately. We do not borrow the money and we get an excellent price. And again, we have approximately 60% of all the land in Ocean County preserved not only for future generations, but also to protect our watershed.

Director Vicari opened the Public Hearing on the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee recommendation resolution to the public for comments.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "At this time I would like to have a Public Hearing only on this one issue. Is there anyone who would like to make a comment or suggestion? Mr. Gumper and then Mr. Black.

Again, it is only on this one topic. At the end of the meeting we will have open discussions on anything you wish to speak about."

WILLIAM GUMPER, 10 WILLEMSTAD ST., HOLIDAY CITY, BERKELEY: "On this property it was mentioned that it's near a military base. Is that correct?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "That's correct sir."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "I guess this is an odd question, but I've always wanted to ask this about land that you put aside from development. Two or three questions and they will require just brief answers and let me finish the questions first. First, once it's acquired is the public allowed to wander through this land? I presume."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "You paid for it. You can walk on it."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "I see. Well that's good news."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "There are people that, if I may interrupt, when we started this thing twelve years ago, there were groups that said you should keep people off and the whole Board said if the public is going to pay for it, they're going to have a right to walk on it. It's not to be developed as a park, but there may be trails and that, but you are welcome on it any time you want."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "This then is the general position for all you lands."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Yes."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "I'm thinking of the other property you picked up - that camp ground which is so nice."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Camp Albacondo."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "Second, will people walking on this land so near a military base, will it have any effect on military security?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "No. There's a fence around the Base and before we do something like this, Mr. Gumper, what we do is we talk with the Base. It's a partnership. And also the local town. And also the business community. So people in the community, of Plumsted, are agreeable. The township governing body is agreeable. And the Commanders and the Joint Base leaders are totally in favor of doing this. They would rather have us purchase the land for open space than to have houses built there because then what happens is the noise from the aircraft and helicopters, they have a major helicopter unit that's over there that is practicing to go overseas, it's very important that there is no noise. And, it's safer and it's embraced by the entire community."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you. You can walk any place you want to Mr. Gumper on this particular piece of land. Yes sir and then Mr. Black."

SAM FOSTER, 108 TEAKWOOD DR., BRICK: "Quick question about this map that you put up. Years ago there was a another thing, is there an Air National Guard or does some military unit have a live firing range they use to practice bombing? With building bombs?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "They don't. That's Warren Grove. It's different. They do have an artillery unit, but it's always been there."

SAM FOSTER: "But that would not be affected by this?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "There's no bombing range in there."

SAM FOSTER: "Okay. I didn't want to go...."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "You might hear it."

SAM FOSTER: "I live in Brick. I hear the booming. I used to think it was thunder. It didn't bother me, but a lot of people were flipping out. I understand. You need to keep the military properly trained."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "You know it's a military base. You might get some noise."

SAM FOSTER: "Good to know before I go looking for the Pine Barren rattlesnakes or the tree frogs, I just wanted to make sure I wasn't walking there. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "When you hear that noise it's the voice of freedom. The sound of freedom they tell us. Mr. Black please."

GARY BLACK, JACKSON: "And Jim if you want to talk about redundant, I come up on almost every one of these things that I'm here for as I'm an advocate of this program. I think it's a fantastic program. First thing real quick, anybody who buys a house next to a military airport and complains about the planes - I have two words for them, no not those two - don't breed.

Anyhow, as it was pointed out, this is completely a voluntary program. Again, you see on the internet, it constantly gets smeared and gets confused with Agenda 21 stuff. This is not an Agenda 21 program. It's totally voluntary as you pointed out. You made it easier for me. You've said most of it already. But the one thing that didn't get pointed out, aside from of course the natural benefits, the cost benefit also. This property pays for itself. A lot of this property could eventually be developed. Now with residential development, you know, you hear ratable, ratable, ratable - but with ratable, ratable, ratable, comes expense, expense, expense. Number one is school costs. Actually one through a hundred is school costs. Then of course, you have police, fire and all that. And when you have a residential development, yes they pay taxes, but in the long run it's not a benefit - it actually costs more than it benefits. What the towns save money on is commercial and industrial.

So the purchase of this property pays for itself. Some people say 'oh you're taking it off the tax rolls'. Yeah, you're taking expenses off the tax rolls. You know, just look at most of the agendas, look at the roads you have to expand. The millions of dollars that roads have to expand because of the development that we've had in this area. So anything you can do to stop it saves money and makes existing properties worth more. Not just up in value due to the devaluation of the dollar that some people call inflation. It actually becomes worth more because there's less property available to build on and to buy so your property actually becomes worth more, not just the dollar devaluated.

So again, this is a win, win, win all the way around. And again, and of course for our military. This is our freedom, granted the current administration you sometimes wonder which side they're on, especially with what's going on with the BRAC right now. Aptly named though if you think about it. Anything we can do to preserve the space, this is our freedom aside from the jobs and the economic benefit that this pays or the triple base every (inaudible). This is for our freedom so everything about this is good. Nothing about this is bad. This is fantastic and again, this is one of the many times although I'm saying this more for the young people who are here today - I say constantly that this is a model of what government should be. So kids, pay attention to this. This is what local government should be. Now go to your town and see what happens. Later."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. Anyone else on this topic as far as the purchase of this particular piece of land? If there are no other comments from anyone I am clear to move to close the Public Hearing only on this resolution. That closes the public portion. Now what's the pleasure of the Board of Freeholders as far as the approval?

No additional comments were received, therefore, the Public Hearing was declared closed.

O. FREEHOLDER COMMENTS

At 4:32 PM, Freeholder Director Vicari received the following comments from members of the Board:

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I would just like to make a few comments of items that I did since the last meeting. I had a meeting with the Ocean County Mayors last week. I met personally with Commissioner Bob Martin. He spoke again. My main concern and our concern was Barnegat Bay to make sure that not only is it cleaned up and I thank the Governor's office for doing a great job, but again it's going to be a long process. We're making progress every single year. But again, I would like to thank his staff as far as the Commission and Cindy Rendazzo for being involved in that particular cleanup. As you know, this is one of the 28 national estuaries in the United States of America. The devastation was unbelievable. Over 60 homes were actually in the Barnegat Bay. 1,600 items were there. It's cleaned up. It was a tremendous amount of debris and they did a great job. And in talking to the boat Captains of our pump-out boat fleet, we were very lucky and fortunate that job was not only done well, there were no accidents this year. That was our main concern and the Mayors were very happy with that.

Also, another good thing, you know housing is very important to us. I was at a ceremony in Manitou Park where volunteers coming together did something very important. They had a family that couldn't afford a house and what we did in Manitou Park at 108 First Avenue and this is the fifteenth house that was constructed from the ground.....and 100 houses. They gave a family a house. They didn't give it to them. It was built with the Ocean County Vocational School with donations and Habitat for Humanity. And of all the students that work in the Vocational, everyone that works in the construction crew, 100% receive a job. And the people don't get it for nothing. Why? Because they have to put equity in there by working. They worked to clean up the grounds. They worked to put up the walls. Sweat equity. And they have to work and I'll tell you something, it gave us a good feeling. The last house I reported, the woman works for the Ocean County Library System and has two children in the school in Berkeley Township. This one had more children. I think four children. And if you look at their faces you can see how it works. It's people working together to make sure they have the proper housing and I was very impressed at what we did throughout Ocean County. It's a partnership. The local town in Berkeley, the Mayor, Carmen Amato, County of Ocean, Habitat for Humanity, the Vocational School and I would say at least twelve different organizations giving money to make sure that house is in existence. And they take care of the house and it's unbelievable as far seeing how they improved the neighborhood. They put houses in the neighborhood that blend in, that fit in. So if you see it you'll be very proud of what we do with our agencies.

And another item. We finally, since 1968, and John Bartlett and I have been working since we've been Freeholders, we have an airport. One of the few in the State of New Jersey. They did the crosswinds for 33,400 feet. Safety was our main concern. It's finally been dedicated last week. We had the State of New Jersey come down to look at how safe it is and by safety I mean now there's a Forest Service Station there. The military can use it. Law enforcement can use it. And it's the first one built, runway, in 30 years in New Jersey. And over those years, over fourteen different airports were closed down. We keep it not only for the economy of Ocean County, but for Emergency Services. And again, it goes to show that, I don't know how Dave McKeon put up with it because it was a lot of work between frogs and snakes and grasshoppers and birds and whatever the case may be. We met the strictest Federal and State requirements in the United States of America. When they said, 'Well it can't be done' and we wouldn't give up and we finally achieved that and it was a great landmark.

But I think the most important thing I did last week, I think one of the most important things I did as Director of the Board this year - as you know, as a teacher for forty years, I've always been interested in one thing, children. I'm a child advocate. They opened up on Friday at 2 o'clock. It was called Tina's House on 7 Hadley Avenue. This, in my opinion, was one of the greatest things that our Prosecutor, Joe Coronato did. He's an advocate for children. What we have is a self-contained building that was put together with existing officers of the Prosecutor's Office. The Lieutenant is Lt. Marlene Lynch. And they have one in an environmental setting where anyone where the child is abused, whether physically, mentally or in any way, it will be dealt with as far as making sure we do not only the reports, we have the Prosecutor involved. I think it's not only a State model, but a national model of what we should do to protect and be an advocate for our children. It was a great day. A proud day for us in Ocean County. And again, I thank Joe Meyers for doing the work in-house. We had the properties so what we did is we put everything together and we said we're not only going to make it good or outstanding, we're going to make this one of the models that the United States can copy all over, any place. They can just take a look at we do to be an advocate for our children. And there's nothing more important in this Board, speaking for all five of us, than the protection of those that are the most innocent, and those are our young children. So again, we thank Joe Coronato. We thank all of those. A lot of the money - there were ten different organizations that donated the money to make sure they did this. Walking through it was a great experience with some of the conference rooms and the examination rooms. And it goes to show that what we do and our priorities in Ocean County - we don't talk about it - we get it done. We like to say we're number one because if you look at that program, it was really a great program. That concludes my report. Moving to my left, Freeholder Gerry Little."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. Just to bring everybody up to date. We talked a couple of weeks ago about the beginning of our annual Flu Immunization Program with our Ocean County Health Department. We have about 90 flu clinics around the County - all areas of the County. So far we have conducted 16 clinics and we have vaccinated almost 1400 people to date. So again, for anyone who's here, I believe we have....yes they're on the front table - the list of the flu clinics, where they are and their time and place. And, for anyone who likes to use the computer, you can find that information on www.ochd.org. I always remember .org.

Also, in addition to the seasonal flu that we're all very familiar with, we know that there is also another flu that's circulating around the country - Enterovirus D-68. We'd like to reassure everyone that our Ocean County Health

Department is closely monitoring this activity of this flu. We have not, and I repeat that, we have not received any confirmation of anyone in Ocean County with the D-68 strain. There is one person from Ocean County who has been tested, but he is receiving medical care out of Ocean County at a medical facility. We do not have the results of that, but we are working with the local hospitals and healthcare, the doctors and the schools to monitor this flu activity. In New Jersey, we now have seven confirmed D-68 cases - Sussex, Essex, Passaic, Morris, Camden and Burlington Counties - have had confirmed cases. So for all parents and we all know that the young, the kids, are the most vulnerable and around the country they've had a number of kids who have been hospitalized with this and unfortunately, some fatalities. And the elderly, of course, are also vulnerable. And again, the recommendation of our Health Department, the CDC, everyone, number one - wash your hands. Wash your hands as frequently as you can and of course, cover your mouth with sneezes and coughs and so forth. So we are closely monitoring it and we will keep you up to date. Thank you Mr. Director. And we thank our Health Department for their close efforts in this."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "If there are no comments from members of the Board, I will open up to the public."

P. PUBLIC COMMENTS - Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of five (5) minutes per speaker.

At 4:41 PM, Freeholder Director Vicari received the following comments from the public:

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Please come forward; state your name and address so it's part of the public record. We have detailed minutes. We encourage anyone who has any questions about the County Budget. It was introduced several months ago. It was a top priority. Yes sir, would you like to come forward?"

LINWOOD MCWILLIAMS, 106 TROUMAKA ST., TOMS RIVER: "I'm here to say, not complaining about anything, but to say thank you. One of the reasons I want to thank you is that in Spring 2007 I had an opportunity to meet Freeholder Vicari during a groundbreaking for the House of Hope. During the time that we were together we started talking about young people. Since I was a manager of our Intergenerational Program at Caregiver Volunteers of Central Jersey, he was able to put me in contact with people at different schools so I could get my foot in the door and that's where everything just abounds from there.

I want to thank you for that. It has made that program very active and bridging that gap between our young and our old by me being able to go in and talk to them about the aging process and aging sensitivity. I got so many things I want to say and I don't know if I can do it in five minutes."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Take your time. It's your time."

LINWOOD MCWILLIAMS: "I'm also the Caregiver Volunteer's sensitivity person. I'm responsible for recruitment and training of new volunteers and I've got to tell you this. Last year we celebrated our 10,000th client and I want to thank again, Freeholder Vicari for being there at our celebration. We average anywhere around 45 to 50 to 60 client requests every month and you can imagine how much of a load that is, but the majority of the requests that they are making from us is for transportation. All of this creates a huge administrative cost, insurance and things like that. I just want to thank the Freeholders, the Ocean County Freeholders, for always stepping up to the plate to provide support for us so we can continue with the service we provide to the seniors of Ocean County.

I am also a member of the Ocean County Office of Senior Services Advisory Council. I see first-hand, every meeting we have, exactly what's been done and I know Freeholder Vicari is not doing it all by himself, but with all of you, that's given him the help to support us so we can continue to provide the services that our seniors need in this county.

One last thing, I am a military retiree. I've spent 23 years of my life in the United States Air Force and when I raised my hand in 1957 and said I want to defend this country against enemies, foreign and domestic because it's my home. I love this country. When I came back here and moved to Ocean County it dawned on me, we have another enemy that's extremely detrimental, especially to our old people, our seniors, and it is loneliness. And the only way we can eradicate that is for people like you to teach the important organizations like ours and the Ocean County Senior Services Advisory, so we can go out and make sure that we can provide these people with interaction with other people by friendly visits, music memory programs, canine therapy and all that. If you ever want to make a senior citizen happy, take them a young kid and a puppy. So again, I want to thank you very much. I just had to come here tonight and say that."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Linwood, I'd just like to thank you for your service not only in the military, but he's a volunteer. Let me tell you the story about when we met. I was the Superintendent of Schools in Berkeley Township and we said intergenerational. We want to teach our children, grades four, five and six, what it's like to be a senior citizen. So we had him come. It was a pilot program. I was the Superintendent and he was with the fifth grade."

LINWOOD MCWILLIAMS: "Fifth and sixth grade."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Fifth and sixth grade. We said you know with the seniors for an example, we gave them eyeglasses where they couldn't see too good. We had the seniors that couldn't walk, so they put weights like on your legs and their fingers because many seniors, fifty, fifty-five, they couldn't move their fingers. So what we did was we modeled what it would be like if you were a senior, eighty, eighty-five, ninety years old and they gave my students in Berkeley a great appreciation of how to treat seniors. It was just something else. I'd say you have grandparents so you think a little bit differently. It was a great program with Linwood when we first met many, many years ago and that program that we started in Berkeley Township went throughout the County and I think throughout the State of New Jersey. It just spread because no one ever said well what about senior citizens, there are certain things they can't

do. Especially the hand power, you know, with driving a car. One of the most unusual things, we didn't think about it, is that a lot of seniors have medicine, medication, and they couldn't open up a jar. They couldn't open medicine. They couldn't reach high. There were many, many things that we did with that particular program. First it was a pilot program and we learned a great deal and we thank you for being here."

LINWOOD MCWILLIAMS: "And I want to thank you because as of last Monday, I had the pleasure of meeting with 140 high school students and I did the same program with them. A lot of the responses I get from the kids are, 'Wow! I didn't know grandma and grandpa were going through this.' So I said, 'Well go home and hug them.' Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "You know one thing I learned from Freeholder Mancini who was the former liaison, two words, independence and dignity for our seniors. We have model programs for our seniors when it comes to independence and dignity and fantastic nutritional programs. Yes sir. Your hand was up."

MIKE ROACH, 8 RIVER BEND DRIVE, TOMS RIVER: "I'm a member of the National Alliance on Mental Illness. I'm also a member of the Ocean County Mental Health Board. I'm here to provide two sets of comments. Next week is the "National Awareness Week for Mental Health". It really comes as kind of a trend from the last speaker to me to come here to thank the Freeholders and thank the County for their tremendous support for mental health for the past many years.

My son is an adult, 40 year old person who has bi-polar disorder. We are not the only organization in the County that takes advantage of the resources that the County provides. We have our monthly meetings in the County cafeteria. We have meetings; we have events, in the library. These kinds of things would not be possible without the support of the County. Every meeting we have three to five families that have come to us typically with tears in their eyes because their loved one has just experienced a psychotic break and they have no evidence and nothing in their experience that can help them figure out what to do. Our family was in that boat in 2003.

So this...the whole issue of mental health, you can look at the statistics. Approximately one in four or one in five people here in this country have issues with mental health. We know that children, approximately 20% of children have issues with mental health. It's very important. One of the things I heard both Freeholder Vicari and Freeholder Little talk about this and that's the stigma of mental health. The work that we try to do is....we're in this in conjunction with the Mental Health Board to try to eliminate that stigma and enable people to understand that this is a disease that can be treated very effectively. Very high success rates, 90% or more. But we also know that about 60% of the people who have these illnesses don't get treatment. So the work that we do in conjunction with the Mental Health Board and the support of the County is just terrific and we just want to thank you for all the effort over the many years that you have provided and we look forward to continuing to work with you. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Mike. Now I just want to add one more thing to what you said. We have a very comprehensive program in Ocean County. It deals not only in our schools with child study teams, crisis intervention is very, very important and one area that I learned a lot from when your parents get old, Alzheimer's and dementia. So we have a very comprehensive program. It's how we treat the person, but just as important, the families and the caregivers. Even in the County of Ocean, I worked with Keith Goetting and we have an Employees Assistance Program. Sometimes people in their lives have a little roadblock, a little blink and they have some problems, and what we ask them to do is, look, we are here to help you. It is very confidential. It happens, but with the proper help and counseling they can get over that. And, we appreciate you getting involved in this particular program."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Mr. Director, I would like to thank Michael for his leadership on the Mental Health Board. As the liaison to that Board, we appreciate all his work for many, many years and the Human Services Commission and many others. He has truly made a difference in the mental health community here in Ocean County. Our Mental Health Board, Mr. Director, we can remind our Board of Freeholders, each and every year they administer roughly in Federal and State and local tax dollars, roughly \$20 million for mental health services here in Ocean County to those who need help. So it's a big effort and it's a big commitment. It's a very important challenge and it's a difficult issue for our society and we thank you Mike. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "If there are no other issues, the next gentleman. The lady and the gentleman. One, two. Okay. You're first. The lady in front of you. Ladies first. We insist. Thank you. Just state your full name and address so we can get back to you please."

NICOLE POLITI, 1305 ALLAIRE RD., SPRING LAKE: "Good afternoon. Can you hear me okay?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Yes. If you're out of the County, that's okay. It's just as good. Doesn't make any difference."

NICOLE POLITI: "I'm actually an employee of the Ocean County Library System. So if you do have any response you can address it to me at 101 Washington Street."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Not a problem and as you know, we have the Director over here Susan Quinn."

NICOLE POLITI: "Oh. I didn't know that."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "You have a nice smile so you can talk as long as you want. Go ahead. It must be something good."

NICOLE POLITI: "Thank you. I am here to bring attention to a major change in the Ocean County Library's

Internet Policy, a change recommended by the Library's Director and approved by the Library Commission at the June 17th Library Commission meeting. Previous to this change in the policy, any resident or guest of the County could enter any of our excellent libraries and, without interference, peruse the beautiful buildings, browse the extensive collection and use the internet on Library computers.

On June 17, 2014, the Library Commission approved a change in policy dictating:

The Ocean County Library, from the date this Computer Use & Internet Policy is adopted, eliminates the anonymous guest pass system at Ocean County Library for computer use. The anonymous guest pass system shall be replaced with an Internet Only Card, Temporary Card and/or Guest Card process where customers of the library are required to show valid ID with current address to use library computers.

This policy change is a violation of the American Library Association's (ALA) Bill of Rights, and ALA's Freedom to Read and Freedom to View statements – all of which the Ocean County Library subscribes to in its General Policy Manual. This policy necessitates professional staff to violate the American Library Association's Code of Ethics in their enforcement of this policy.

Every year, the Ocean County Library spends several thousands of dollars on electronic databases and downloadable books, audiobooks, magazines and newspapers. Requiring a library customer to show identification to access any of these materials within the library is a violation of first amendment rights and intrudes unnecessarily on customer privacy.

Requiring identification for Internet use creates obstacles for every library customer but most especially for the young, the differently abled and the homeless, all of whom are entitled to unfettered access to Federally-funded, Statefunded, and County-funded Library resources while they are in library buildings.

Library staff has no right to ask a customer for identification when that customer pulls a book off the library shelf and sits down to read. What right does staff have to demand identification from a customer when he or she sits down to consume library funded resources via the Internet?

I hope by bringing this matter to your attention, you will find it worth your time to review the Library Commission meeting minutes from June – where this change was approved – as well as those from August and September where myself and others speak at more length about the detrimental effects this policy change will have on the residents of this County.

I have copies of the documents I reference in this speech and will hand them to your clerk."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much."

NICOLE POLITI: "Thank you for your time and attention."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "And again, we have the finest library system in the State of New Jersey, 21 branches, who have been getting awards from the White House as far as what we do. We have a Library Commission with Commissioners who do an outstanding job and we're very proud of it. Mrs. Quinn is in the back. Mrs. Quinn is in the back of the room and I don't know if she wants to answer publicly. Whatever. But you have my promise that it will be addressed at the next meeting. And again, do you work for the Library System?"

NICOLE POLITI: "I do."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "And you live in Spring Lake? You're in Monmouth County."

NICOLE POLITI: "We moved there, yes."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay. I wasn't sure if you were an Ocean County resident. So even if you live in a different county, we're willing to answer those questions. If Ms. Quinn wants to answer it now or she can wait until later on. I know she has an answer for it. But all I'm asking for, our main concern, is having identification. Okay. When we get a full report we will address that. But please before you leave give copies of that to Mrs. Quinn and we will take care of it.

So one of your main concerns that I know is you don't want anyone to give identification. That's the main concern. Okay. Mrs. Quinn if you just take a look at that as far as the reason why. There had to be a reason as far as that goes as far as using the library. But it's the free public library system and again, they do an excellent job and the Commissioners do an excellent job and they have my support.

But again, to have a question, we have no problems with addressing that question. Did you address this before with anyone on the Commission?"

NICOLE POLITI: "Yes."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "You did. Okay. Mrs. Quinn if you want to address that we can do it later on. Yes? It's up to you. If you want to respond to it or you can do it later."

SUSAN QUINN, OCEAN COUNTY LIBRARY DIRECTOR: "No. This was brought up before the Commission meeting and I am providing them with a response and I would be happy to do so. The change in the policy to require I.D. it's not something.....it's something that is also a common practice among libraries throughout the United

States. In fact, our reciprocal library partners, the Monmouth County Library System and the Burlington Library System do require identification to use their computers as well. So it is a common practice, but I will be happy to address their concerns."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "That's fair. Okay. It's a common. It's used. We will address that. No problem with that. Anyone else who would like to speak? Yes sir. I think it was your turn."

CONRAD HOFFMAN, 945 CORSTRAUB DR., TOMS RIVER: "I've lived there since 1988 and I came here after I retired from my job and I volunteered and worked at Ocean County Veterans Service Bureau for about three years, pro bono. Then I worked for a couple of years on the payroll and I still do things for any veteran that I know that needs any help. I'm active in the VFW and I'm inactive in the American Legion, but I'm still a member. I belong to four or five other veterans' organizations and I just want to let you know this too. I'm so proud of these Freeholders because this is what they do. They look out for veterans in every way they can because I also want to thank you for the voice that you gave about the recently passed VA legislation that was really hurting our veterans where they couldn't be seen. And the other great thing is, in that bill was the TBI, traumatic brain injury and PTSD. We in New Jersey are the first to really supplement PTSD instead of just using the VA. This is great things that you do and encouraged and I want to say something like this: If you're a veteran in Ocean County you're in good agreement with you Freeholders. I thank you very much."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Conrad. And again, thanks to Freeholder Gerry Little, a veteran and it goes to the great leadership that we have with John Dorrity. He does a great job dealing with the 68,000 veterans in Ocean County. We have the most in the State of New Jersey that live in Ocean County and we're proud of what you do every single day, even now. Yes sir. One. Two."

SAM FOSTER, 108 TEAKWOOD DR., BRICK: "I just have a statement about the Library's policy. I want to point out that I am very involved with computers and I'm a proponent of many things like freedom of speech and I just want to comment about the policy of the Library. I want to point out that we live in a different world today with terrorism and so I'm not trying to criticize the woman who just spoke. She's entitled to her opinion. I respect that. I have no problem, just stating it. But we have to understand, I've seen things in my years, years ago before computers....I'm 53 years old so, believe me, I remember going to the library when there were no public access computers and I'd see people doing things in the library and I've reported it. At the Brick Library, they would be looking and going in chemistry books about how to build bombs. I remember being in Brick High School and the idiots, students there, would actually sneak into the room and they were making explosives and they even gassed the hallway one time because they mixed chemicals.

So you have to understand that there's a lot of things on the Internet that even though you're entitled to see it or search it, that doesn't mean you should necessarily do it. I think that's really what the policy is to do. I haven't heard from the Library that it's an official opinion, but I can understand why they would be concerned about trying to figure out who is logging on because I want to know it. As a citizen, I want to know who's in the Library doing searches and if they're caught doing something that's illegal, they should be stopped. If there's anonymity, I don't know if that's the proper word or not, then they can pretty much do whatever they want. I just wanted to point that out for everybody. We live in a different world. The terrorist attack was terrible. Thousands of citizens died. And we also should remember that wasn't the first time either. I remember the Oklahoma City bombing.

I would just hope that......I am supportive of the Library. I think the libraries are trying to cut a balance between people's personal freedoms, but also protecting the public. It's not just pornography that people download. You can access the Internet about bomb-making and organizations like ISIS, they have access. They have their own websites for God's sake. And these things have to be.....you have to keep this in mind, the Internet isn't just....I don't know how to put it....the word...I'm a little bit disoriented. I just want people to understand this.

As a person who has worked in data processing for 15 years, it's incredible the access for information that is out there that is good and bad. Research is fantastic, but if you're searching for something like a history project, great, but if you have ulterior motives of an illicit nature, it's a gold mine out there. It's no more kids in the library looking at chemistry books. I report them to the librarian and then they throw them out or they threaten to call the police and they get scared away. I just want to point that out.

I have no problem giving my library card. That's what I do when I go to the Library, you know, just log in with my library card number. I just wanted to point that out to everybody."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you. That's a good point. I just want to add one more thing to it. Going back about perhaps a year ago, parents were calling me up and saying that their youngsters, children not adults, were getting "X" and "R" materials off it. I know the Library Commission looked into it. I don't know if this had anything to do with that, but again, that's one of the reasons why we have a Commission. So it's not involved in politics. We want to do the best thing for all of them, first grade up to high school and college and everything else. But it has to be not only well-balanced, but we want to make sure that it's not misused as you said. Not for terrorists or for getting....."

SAM FOSTER: "Even a couple of kids who......"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "...a couple of kids. I know. It happens. And you know, youngsters get on there sometimes (inaudible)."

SAM FOSTER: "A person in Sweden can get information on a fusion reactor from information he got over the Internet. There's a famous case in America, an American man built an actual nuclear bomb. The only thing he

needed tothe only thing he couldn't get hold of was the ethyl plutonium. It's very scary. I just want to say something else here. I apologize for interrupting you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "That's okay."

SAM FOSTER: "I just want to say that the Library has been at the forefront. My mother used to work at the Toms River Library. It's been at the forefront of freedom of speech. They've been out there for things like if the FBI wanted knowledge about the books people are checking out. As a matter of fact, a very famous Republican and he was a nominee for the Supreme Court by President Reagan and I forgot his name, but they got hold of his library requests. The books and things that he got and his DVD rentals. There wasn't anything earth-shattering. But things like this you have to keep in mind, the Library's out there fighting for our personal freedoms.

Like I said, I'm involved a lot with computers and I forgot the name of the organization....I'm very bad.....it's like (inaudible) for example in which companies cannot be......if you're a member of Comcast.....I have Verizon, they cannot throttle your speed if you do something like use a rival service and things like that. But I just want to say the Library has done a wonderful job protecting our personal freedoms and I feel that if they do have this policy in place it's for our benefit and think we should give the Library the credit for that. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you. The next speaker, Mr. Gumper."

WILLIAM GUMPER, 10 WILLEMSTAD ST., HOLIDAY CITY, BERKELY TOWNSHIP: "1'll be reasonably brief. I have been in the past lobbying to try to get the... one obstacle, when one talks about the libraries are open to everyone all the time. We have one problem. They're not open on Sunday. Now I wouldn't ask for all libraries or most libraries or even more than one to be open on Sunday, but I have tried to lobby and will continue to lobby for this. I've spoken to Susan Quinn. I've spoken to the Library Commission. I've addressed Freeholder Vicari.

The Lacey Library is centrally located between the north and south of Ocean County. It's right in the middle. It's on Route 9 which is a major New Jersey roadway. Buses travel up and down that roadway seven days a week, 24 hours a day. Ocean Ride buses travel that road as well. The transportation is good and that library is a stone's throw from Route 9. It's only one floor and it wouldn't cost that much money....."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "We're looking at that now and you're a great lobbyist because the last meeting you spoke to my wife, Joyce......"

WILLIAM GUMPER: "I tried to tell her too."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Yes and I found a piece of paper in my pocket. I said, 'How did this piece of paper get there?' My wife gave me and it was your proposal. She won't serve me dinner tonight if you keep going on about this."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "There is only one county that I know of that has a library open every Sunday of the year without exception and that's the Atlantic City Public Library. I was in there. I spoke to the head librarian because I'm very dedicated to libraries.

You had a speaker here. A tall gentleman. Mentioning the depression many of the seniors have. The libraries are open on Sunday here, that is three of them are. As you know, Toms River Library, Stafford Library and Lakewood Library. Lakewood's open on Sunday because the Jewish patronage does not go to the library on Saturday. That's their holy day. But it would be nice for, I think I would say essential, for the Lacey Library to be open on summer Sundays only to compensate for the three libraries that are open the rest of the year on Sundays so that Ocean County could say that in Ocean County we have at least one library open every Sunday of the year without exception. And it's only for a four-hour day, from one in the afternoon until five in the evening, the same hours the other ones are open in the wintertime. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much Mr. Gumper. We get your message. We understand. Mrs. Quinn do you understand?"

SUSAN QUINN: "I do."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Lori and then Councilwoman Coleman."

LORI PEPPENELLA, SOUTHERN OCEAN COUNTY CHAMBER OF COMMERCE, 265 W. 9TH ST., SHIP BOTTOM: "I want to thank the Freeholders for all the support that they give our organization, especially in the efforts for tourism. I want to also bring to your attention that our organization is one of 80 globally accredited destination marketing organizations in the world. We received this designation through Washington, D.C., which puts Ocean County basically on the same level of service, professionalism and marketing as areas such as Orlando, Las Vegas, Philadelphia and Miami. So we wanted to let you know through, especially my experience on the Tourism Advisory Board's and Freeholder Vicari's dedication, that we are really, truly working hard to bring the independent businesses, to bring visitors and future investors into Ocean County through Southern Ocean County and all the efforts that we're doing there. So thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "We thank you for what you do. Lori is involved with the Southern Ocean County Chamber (of Commerce). Tourism, \$4.3 billion dollars a year, 70,000 people. A lot of opportunities. They said we would never get back on our feet. Ocean County is doing better now. We're back on our feet and we'll have a good 2015. We thank you for all of your input. And, it puts people to work again, to reinvest. We thank what you do for us.

Councilwoman Coleman please."

COUNCILWOMAN GAIL COLEMAN. 1001 S. CENTRAL AVE., SEASIDE PARK: "Thank you Freeholder Vicari. Good evening gentleman. I'm a small business owner. I was here for Superstorm Sandy 2012 and I agree with the young lady that tourism is coming back to Ocean County. I'd like to thank the Freeholders and Mr. Vicari. As some of you are aware, Seaside Park and the corridor of Route 35 that runs up through to Bay Head has been under enormous construction. It's been just a nightmare and is really a tough time for our borough residents to try to navigate up to their jobs perhaps, up in Point Pleasant Beach area. I just want to thank you all for trying to help us get this road construction moving quicker than it really is because if you come over and you have been over there Mr. Vicari and I've called your office probably ad nauseam for you, personally. You would come over, you know, and try to help us and we really appreciate on behalf of Summer and the Park Business Association. I'm a charter member and the past vice president.

We had a terrific August this summer. It really reminded me, oh my goodness we're back. We're back! I really felt like we were back. I talked to other business people that are in the same business as myself and we all said the same thing. And then the road construction just took the wind out of our sails with our shoulder season which is the fall. A lot of people come to Seaside Park to go to Island Beach and I depend on that foot traffic.

A lot of people don't realize what tourism in Ocean County is. It's not just the shore, although it is the major part of it, but there's tourism when people go to the farms to go pumpkin picking, apple picking. In the spring, you know, the fruits and the vegetables. That is a big impact and a lot of my customers when they leave the beach in the afternoon, they stop for lunch and then the little kids will say, 'We're going to get pumpkins. We're going to go pick apples.' And that's a very important part of tourism too. I just want to make sure that everybody understands that it's not just the beach. It's the whole Ocean County and we do a terrific job and I just want to thank you for listening to my gripes."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you. The shoulder season, for everyone, is we want to continue the season to September and October so the businesses do well. We're optimistic about, of course, Columbus Day on October 12th to get more people to come. Every dollar that's spent goes around six times. You know I've been there many times and I know the road conditions. I reported it to the Administrator. Administrator, I went up there and I said, 'You know I had damage to the car, the family car. My undercarriage was damaged twice. Front end damage."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Put more air in your tires."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I don't know. Here's the problem, it was the family car because it wasn't my car. It was my wife's car. You want to hear about problems, come home two times and say the undercarriage is ripped off the car and the front end damaged this time. So again, I paid for it myself. It was worth it to pay for it than hear it. Okay. Anyone else who would like to speak? To my right, Mr. Black and then next person in the front and anyone else? That's it? Two more speakers. Don't give me anymore trouble now."

GARY BLACK, LEWIS LANE, JACKSON: "It would be just your luck, you finally get a new car and then you break the car on the beach. And Gerry lives on the beach, so he's got an old car usually."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Rusty."

GARY BLACK: "Rusty, so that works out. Before we were talking about the safety of children and I just wanted to remind some people that one thing not only the Freeholder Board, but especially you Freeholder Vicari, have always had concern for the safety of children. In fact, it reminded me of your first political campaign when you ran for Committee in Dover Township and on Vaughn Avenue to get sidewalks on Vaughn Avenue to the East Dover School."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "You have a good memory Mr. Black."

GARY BLACK: "Oh yes. I've been doing this for a quite a bit. Although my short-term memory is a little rough. A couple of things. We have a couple of little attacks coming to Ocean County and this is coming from the particular party in north Jersey. We're here again because they let one go by them and it's driving them insane. It's the gas tax. They want to increase the gas tax and that legislation is bouncing around again because my God, they missed a tax. But, that will actually hurt us more because of tourism. The majority of our people commute from here to north Jersey to where they work so just like remember when they were slamming us with the toll hikes? It's the same thing again now with the gas tax. Ocean County should not be New Jersey's purse. The State, if anything, should be helping us.

We also have another one involving roads which is there's a bill now to give illegal aliens drivers' licenses because they're worried about illegal people going to work. I'm thinking this - when we're going to have criminal drivers' licenses because they'll say prisons are wrong because you're denying them their rights. But again, this attacks the tourism and Ocean County again because that will take jobs away from the legitimate people who live here legally for illegally paid, paid under the table, illegal workers. And these are things we have to keep a close eye on.

A couple more things going on, but since it's getting late I don't want to sound like an auctioneer."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "We want to get everyone home for dinner."

GARY BLACK: "Okay. Just a couple of things. On what was being talked about at the Library, the gentleman here also came up with some things I was thinking of as well. One thing that could be worked out.... because when

homeless people, they don't have an address and they're trying to get jobs, maybe something could be worked out for them. But yes, absolutely, there's a legal situation, a safety situation. You do have to watch out for it with the library because you've got people that go on the computers and they could be using it to access kiddie porn, harass, stalk, even set up a fly-by-night illegal campaign site that nobody pays attention to. But there is a legitimate reason and if we can work a little bit more in the balance, it might even have that. But, work on that a little more so homeless people can try to get a legitimate job no matter where they are. That's it. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. Our last speaker. Sum it up and then we'll close the public portion."

TARA CUNNINGHAM, 216 ARKANSAS AVE., TOMS RIVER: "I am Detective Tina Rambo's big sister. Her father is John Liston, sitting right next to where I was. Tina died in the line of duty on August 1, 2011 when Rachel Portnoy drove irresponsibly, crossing over the center line, killing Tina instantly. PLA students, I went to High School North. Do not text and drive. Do not. That goes for all the grown-ups in this room too.

I am also an Ashoka Fellow. That means I am a change maker. I have spent my entire adult working life to make society better - not in a touchy feely kind of way – but in a systems change kind of way. I have been awarded and recognized internationally for my work and I have just returned from the European Commission where I was an Expert Evaluator for Horizon 2020.

This is relevant for two reasons:

Firstly, Rachel Portnoy drove irresponsibly, crossed over the center line, and killed my sister. Tina didn't have to and should not have died that way. If Ms. Portnoy drove responsibly, Tina would still be here. I can't change that. But, if there was a divider, if there were rumble strips, if the road was appropriate for use, well I could change that.

In order to create change, one needs an ethical center of excellence. Somebody who is an epicenter of knowledge. The first person I thought of to call was Freeholder Vicari. Freeholder Vicari has decades of knowledge. He knows how New Jersey works. He is respected. He is an active leader and he's somebody that we trust. There are few businesses or business people who have not benefited from the Freeholder's tireless efforts.

So I took the easy gamble that the Freeholder would be interested in my campaign safe. I contacted him on August 1, 2012 on Tina's anniversary date. He returned the call that day. He listened empathetically, made comments and corrections to my 'plan of attack' and then he engaged Carl Block, the Administrator to get involved. He then engaged and tapped Frank Scarantino, the County Engineer to do a submittal to make Route 70 safe. More importantly, and this was so important and very important for change makers - PLA students, you'll be change makers one day hopefully – it is very important that your ethical center does use my name. Tell them I'm supporting you and that's exactly what the Freeholder did and it's exactly what I did when I talked to every Mayor, every Police Chief and the Chair of the Joint Base who gave the land, who put all of their efforts into making it safe.

So because of the great work that the Freeholder did, I've come today to Route 70 has had a major safety upgrade. There are rumble strips, reflective paint and in the worst areas it's been re-tarmacked. To my knowledge, there has not been one single fatal accident since these safety upgrades. Freeholder, thank you.

Secondly, on Friday, Tina's legacy was solidified with the naming of Tina's House, Ocean County Prosecutor's Child Advocacy Center. It's set to be not only a center of excellence for Ocean County and the State of New Jersey, but for the United States of America.

Freeholder Vicari is a huge supporter of children's rights. He does not think of the children going through the system as numbers, instead he thinks of every child like he does his grandson. His inspired leadership and his ability so well with the everybody across the Office of the Prosecutor, to every person that works underneath him, will ensure that every single child in Ocean County that has dealt with physical, emotional or sexual abuse will come out stronger and better because of it.

Finally, I just need to speak personally as an Italian American. That's always a very dangerous statement. I am a very large supporter of tourism and business development in Ocean County. I understand there's an election going on and that opponents need to take down the other guy, it's their imperative to make you look bad. However, I take huge exception that alludes that all Italians are in the Mafia. News flash – we're not. And another news flash – the hundreds of thousands of Italian Americans who come to visit and spend their money in Ocean County – they're not in the Mafia either. So I can only speak for myself, but I simply cannot think or handle supporting someone with that prejudice and ignorance to potentially run tourism and economic development in this great County. So thank you. In conclusion, I want to thank you Freeholder, personally for being such an amazing, unwavering support and for your leadership and your care for the people of Ocean County. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you. That concludes the public portion. Is there a motion to adjourn?"

Q. ADJOURNMENT

There being no additional comments received, Freeholder Director Vicari called for a motion to adjourn the meeting at 5:24 PM.

WHEREAS, the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee has determined the property's attributes are consistent with the Ocean County Open Space Plan and Recreation Inventory; and

WHEREAS, this property may be eligible for up to fifty (50) percent cost share from United States Department of Defense consistent with the agreement authorized by resolution dated May 16, 2012; and

Freeholder Director Joseph H. Vicari opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Director Vicari introduced the "Prosecutor of the Year" to give a presentation to the Board. The Director noted that the Prosecutor has been recognized for the war on drugs for his work with schools, municipalities and police. Director Vicari stated that the work the Prosecutor is doing is commendable. Mr. Coronato thanked the Board. The Prosecutor stated that he has a tremendous staff that works very hard. Mr. Coronato gave an overview of what the Prosecutor's Office is working on, noting a strong emphasis on the drug area which is an epidemic throughout the State and the Country. The Prosecutor also stated that there is an emphasis in his office also on domestic violence. Prosecutor Coronato stated that it is important to note that it is not all about arrests, it is also about education.

Prosecutor Coronato noted that his office has held parent-child forums noting that 2,000 people attended the first; 1,000 attended the second and 5,000 attended the third. The Prosecutor's Office has held several drop off locations for drugs, all located in police departments, to allow residents to dispose of old prescriptions safely. The Prosecutor also noted that the canine units have programs to go into middle and high schools. They are doing more and more searches. The office has a video that is approximately 10 to 15 long that is shown in schools. The Prosecutor noted that high school drama students were used in the video and that money seized from drug dealers pays for the videos and programs.

Prosecutor Coronato highlighted the Narcan Program, the first in the State of New Jersey, noting that as of today 54 saves have been made using Narcan. The Prosecutor's Office has been working with Freeholder Kelly and State legislators regarding additional treatment facilities. Prosecutor Coronato commented that he has been working for over a year with legislation to change heroin to be measured by dose, not weight. Prosecutor Coronato stated that in 2012 there were 53 overdose deaths and in 2013 112 deaths due to overdoes. The Prosecutor showed a News12 video featuring Narcan to the members of the Board.

Freeholder Kelly thanked the Prosecutor for his presentation.

Director Vicari provided an update on the Robert J. Miller Airpark noting improvements to the safety, not capacity, of the Airport. Ocean County has the first new runway in the past 30 years. The pilots at the Airpark are very happy with the new crosswind runway. The Director noted that sometimes trees get too high and are an obstruction, they need to be trimmed. The Director stated that the FAA has offered a grant in the amount of \$1,396,167 to remove the obstacles. The FAA will cover 90 percent of the cost of the project and the County will seek a 5 percent grant from the NJDOT. Director Vicari stated that the hangars at the Airpark and the Fixed Base Operator provide revenues to the County. David McKeon, Planning Director, was in attendance and advised that this project is strictly a safety project.

Mr. Scarantino reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the recommended advertisement for emergency repairs, Herbert Street at Bay Avenue in Mantoloking. This project addresses damages from Superstorm Sandy and is 80 percent federal dollars. There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the agenda for the July 16, 2014 Board meeting.

Ms. Vasil reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of 2014. There were no questions or comments.

Director Vicari asked the Board members for comments.

Freeholder Little stated that the County is spending from the Health Department about \$2.2 million on substance abuse treatment both in patient and out patient. The Freeholder noted that 196 are in patients, 8 males and 9 females at halfway houses. Freeholder Little noted that this is a substantial investment. Freeholder Bartlett reviewed with the Board a recommendation from the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee that he was extremely happy about. The Freeholder noted that over the past ten years the County has purchased everything that was not developable in the vicinity of Ocean County College including the other side of Hooper Avenue to protect the College from encroachments. This last piece is approximately 53 acres located along the front of the College on Hooper Avenue. Freeholder Bartlett advised that the negotiated price is \$250,000. However, a piece of Introduction acquisition is approximately 53 acres located by the Engineering Department to expand the jug handle.

The amount for the Natural Lands Trust Fund acquisition is \$215,000 and the balance of \$35,000 will be paid by the Engineering Department for the right-of-way needed for the jug handle project. The acquisition of this project protects the Silver Bay Watershed and provides protection from encroachments at the College. Freeholder Bartlett stated that as properties become available, the County purchases the properties for the protection of the Barnegat Bay and the watershed. The Freeholder noted that the money is in the bank for this purchase. This acquisition will be listed on the agenda for the Board meeting of August 6, 2014.

Freeholder Kelly noted that the County has a program with the Ocean County VoTech that is very well attended at the Ocean County Training Center. The VoTech has asked for additional classroom space. The Freeholder stated that about three years ago he came to the Board with a more aggressive plan to expand the Training Center to include a pool; however, because of the economy the project was downsized but fits within the original footprint of the larger projects. The project now consists of two rooms that can be divided into four classrooms. The estimated price is \$1,050,000 and involves the relocation of irrigation systems and the air conditioning units. Freeholder Kelly stated that what was being used by fire instructors is now being used by the VoTech for classrooms which has caused some conflict. The new classrooms will allow the County to have additional space for other needs at the facilities and will be used for in-house training for County departments. Freeholder Kelly noted that the project could start as early as August of this year if the permits are received. The project may be ready for the second half of the school year for the VoTech. Freeholder Kelly stated that the money for this project is in the budget. Director Vicari stated that training is extremely important and the Training Center offers a quality training program. Freeholder Bartlett noted the great cooperation between the County and the VoTech for these programs. Freeholder Kelly stated that the space will not be dedicated solely to the VoTech; it will be limited use and include use by fire and EMT training.

Michael Fiure, Director of Management and Budget, noted that the two new classrooms will be divided by a partition wall and will accommodate up to 120 students. The space can open up entirely for graduations as well. Administrator Block noted that the Ocean County Training Center is awaiting final approval from FEMA for a generator. Administrator Block noted that this project falls within the CAFRA permit for the Training Center. Freeholder Kelly stated that the land for the Training Center was originally donated from Waretown.

Freeholder Bartlett stated that another outstanding program is the Cuisine on the Green which is an instructional facility for the VoTech as well. Freeholder Kelly noted that Cuisine on the Green has been very successful and offers reasonably priced food.

Mr. Scarantino reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included Reconstruction and Resurfacing of Route 528 from East of Whitesville Road to East of Siena Drive in Jackson Township. Freeholder Kelly noted that this is the last phase of safety improvements for Route 528. The Freeholder Introduced State of the Property 2014 are ago there were many accidents in Jackson Township and noted Adopted on:

that these improvements make the roads safer but the County can not make safe drivers, only safe roads. There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the agenda for the August 6, 2014 Board meeting.

Freeholder Kelly stated that one of the worst beaches in the State is Beachwood Beach. Frank Scarantino noted that he has been working with the NJDEP and Beachwood Borough on analyzing why flow ends up on the Beachwood Beach. The County Engineer noted that two outfalls are being removed and replaced with another to take the water directly out to the Bay. The Engineer noted that the pipe will be a 64" pipe.

Ms. Vasil reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of August 6, 2014. There were no questions or comments.

Director Vicari noted that the Toms River Little League won 7-6 over Ocean City and they are now on their way to the MidAtlantic Tournament. The Director wished them well.

Director Vicari asked the Board members for comments.

Freeholder Bartlett noted that last week Senator Smith and the Senate Environmental Committee held a public hearing in Toms River. One of the bills discussed would have allowed the Board of Chosen Freeholders to take over the beaches in the County. Freeholder Bartlett stated that no one in Ocean County asked to take over the beaches and the County does not want to do this. The Freeholder advised that Senator Smith stated that this was only permissive not mandatory. The other bill discussed was stormwater systems and sewer systems to combine both Freeholder Bartlett attended the meeting and noted that he took the opportunity to show the Committee what Ocean County has done for the Bay. The Freeholder provided a map of all preserved land in Ocean County and he noted that Senator Smith said that the map was the most impressive map he had ever viewed. Freeholder Bartlett advised that he told the Committee that Ocean County has invested, in County funds, since inception of the Natural Lands Trust Fund Program approximately \$83 million of local dollars matched by about \$70 million in other funds in preserving land. The Freeholder noted that Senator Smith was very impressed with his comments. Freeholder Bartlett advised that he invited the Senator to Ocean County to show him what Ocean County does; noting that the County is very proud of what is has accomplished working within its limited financial ability. The Freeholder also advised that Committee of the work Ocean County does on storm drain cleanouts. Freeholder Bartlett stated that the closed inlets to the ocean, if opened, would clean out the Bay.

Freeholder Lacey noted some of the activities the County has done over the years to help keep the Bay clean including land preservation, cleaning the stormwater october 1, 2014

drains and pump out boats during the summer, noting that all work towards to cleaning of the Bay.

Freeholder Little noted that on May 7, 2014 a public hearing was held on Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding for homeless services. The Freeholder noted that there were some objections regarding the plan. Freeholder Little stated he was pleased to announce that the County received HUD approval for the 2014 Action Plan as submitted. The approval noted that all activities were eligible and conformed to federal regulations. Freeholder Director Joseph H. Vicari opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Freeholder Lacey reviewed with the Board the Revenue Sharing Program for the first six months of 2014. The Freeholder noted that \$441,000 will be returned to towns, some towns will get almost \$80,000. The Freeholder stated that aluminum was \$1,336 per ton from January through June of this year which is up \$250 per ton. Freeholder Lacey noted that almost 37,000 tones of material was recycled during the fist six months and the tipping fee savings was \$2.6 million. The Freeholder was pleased to report once again that the County has not missed paying a dividend to municipalities since the start of the Revenue

Freeholder Bartlett stated that the 58 acre site in Toms River known as the Camp Albocondo site has been around for sometime. The Freeholder stated that Toms River Township has now approached the County to be a partner on this acquisition; the Township stated that they wanted to purchase the property from The Trust for Public Land (TPL) which is a national organization. The TPL purchased the property in the amount of \$4.1 million in hopes of selling the land to a public entity. Freeholder Bartlett advised that the NJDEP Green Acres Program certified the value for the property at \$5,900,000 in 2011 which was \$1.8 million more than what the TPL purchased the property for last year. Freeholder Bartlett advised that Toms River Township has asked the County to partner with them for a cost of \$1.9 million to the County. Freeholder Bartlett stated that this is the missing link of the entire corridor in this area, noting the property surrounds property already owned by both Toms River Township and Ocean County and is an important acquisition. Freeholder Bartlett advised that the County will take the parcel and run a dividing line within it separating the site for Toms River Township and County owned land. An appraisal was done on the part the County would acquire which was higher than \$1.9 million. Freeholder Bartlett stated that the County has worked marvelously in the past with the TPL on many other environmental acquisitions in the County. The Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee has recommended the acquisition of this 58 acre parcel. The Freeholder stated that this acquisition will help preserve water resources in northern Toms River which eventually flow into Barnegat Bay. The Freeholder provided a map depicting the location of the site as well as other preserved lands in the area.

Director Vicari stated that he wanted to make it clear that the Trust for Public Land is the owner of this site. The Director introduced Kathy Haake from the TPL. Ms. Haake stated that the TPL appreciates the support Ocean County has provided over the years. Ms. Haake noted that the preservation of this parcel is a link in the contiguous protection of the Toms River which is important to the water quality of the Barnegat Bay. Ms. Haake confirmed that the TPL is the owner of this parcel and has been for about a year and a half. Freeholder Bartlett noted that the TPL does not buy and hold lands; they attempt to bring together public agencies to purchase the property for the public's use. This acquisition will be listed for the Board agenda of August 20, 2014.

Mr. Scarantino reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda. There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the agenda for the August 20, 2014 Board meeting.

Ms. Vasil reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of August 20, 2014. There were no questions or comments.

Director Vicari asked the Board members for comments.

Freeholder Bartlett requested that the 2014 bond sale be added to the Board agenda. The Freeholder noted that Julie Tarrant, Comptroller, CFO, has put together recommendations for the 2014 bond sale and would like to recommend general Adopina provements bonds for \$40 million of bond issue. higher than normal because of the cost sharing improvements on the Garden State Parkway Interchange 88 project, stating that he is very happy with the work being done on the Parkway. Freeholder Bartlett stated that the County is an integral part of the improvements; bridges go over County roads, exits go onto County roads and engineering needs to be done to accommodate the Parkway widening. The Freeholder noted that in this bond sale the County would fund about \$14 million in capital improvements related to the Garden State Parkway improvements which puts the bonds higher than normal. Freeholder Kelly noted that the \$14 million is for County roads off the Parkway, improvements that are necessary to accommodate the Parkway improvements. Freeholder Kelly stated that the interchange improvements by the Parkway would not work without the County making improvements to its roadways. Director Vicari noted that the State has made over \$1 billion in improvements in Ocean County over the last four years. Freeholder Lacey stated that Ocean County has 1.600 lane miles of roadway and battles for the dollars Ocean County gets, noting that it is a lot of give and take for State dollars between counties. Freeholder Bartlett stated that the bond sale includes nearly \$3 million in stormwater management and funds to reconstruct Freeholder Bartlett noted that there was a very odd accident at Berkeley Island Park. Berkeley Island Park over the weekend. Ocean County is in the process of rebuilding the park. The bonds will be the longest length of 18 years. The bond sale competitive bids will be electronically delivered to the County on September 23, 2014. Freeholder Bartlett stated that the surplus is in great shape, the County received almost all the FEMA reimbursements; most of the municipalities have repaid what they owed to the County; and the liquidity of the County is great. The Freeholder noted that he was pleased that the County had the money, without borrowing, for the storm while maintaining its Triple A bond rating.

Freeholder Kelly stated that this Board authorized him to work with the Detention Center to look at a new program for drug and alcohol use by youth. The Freeholder noted that he met with Walt Hopson to discuss what puts kids in the detention center in the first place. They discussed alternatives to the detention center and how to make the County's detention center more effective. Freeholder Kelly stated that discussions included whether alcohol and drug addiction is caused by depression or does alcohol and drug addition cause depression. The Freeholder noted that he is looking to fund this with dollars this Board has already appropriated, stating that before the County replaces officers at the detention center, the County is looking at how to make the overall program more affective. Freeholder Kelly noted that depression is not an economic factor, as seen in the recent death of Robin Williams who fought depression throughout his lifetime, money was not a factor in his The Freeholder stated that the County is looking to put together the best program that Ocean County can afford to put in place. Freeholder Kelly stated that this Board has shown it doesn't always take more dollars; it takes a reprioritization of dollars to be used more effectively. Director Vicari stated is has been proven that outreach programs and intervention programs work.

There were no additional comments.
