DIRECTOR VICARI: "The first item of business, Mrs. Vasil, is B, a proclamation proclaiming April 13th to the 19th as "National Library Week". Would please read it as part of the record."

CLERK VASIL: "And with us, Freeholder, we have our Ocean County Library Director, Susan Quinn, if she would come forward."

Clerk Vasil read the "National Library Week" proclamation into the record.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "The Ocean County Library has won many national awards. But, you know, we used to say it's not the library that your parents knew. Well this is not the library when I was growing up, it's totally different. We are now truly in the digital age and just over the last several months, I never thought I would have apps and I could get e-books on my phone. I had to get a different phone, Freeholder, just so you know that. Now you can get books. Communication is just like unbelievable. All 21 libraries, you just hit it and you know exactly who you are as far as the mileage, how easy it is to get. We have different contracts with neighboring counties, reciprocal agreements with Burlington County and Monmouth County, especially with the military base so they can use books. But I think the important thing is, since 2007, the print media is of course, substantially less. They make \$30,000.00 less, the new journalists today, than they were going back several years ago. And we say, how did people get information? How do they get it, through the digital age, and that's what we're in right now. And Freeholder Lacey's been working

with his department and it changes so fast. Whether it be the radio or it be anything else that takes place. There is nothing as fast today as far as the digital age and technology and the information.

Doctors Offices are using it to get information. It's just tremendous. I just want Susan Quinn to give an overview because we are at the razors edge of having this technology which is extremely important. And, in order to have an informed community, even there with our students in school, we have not only the vocational schools and the college, but we now have Kean University that offers a doctorate degree. They can use all of our services. We have wi-fi and it's just like unbelievable. We have things, sometimes when I go into the office it changes so fast it's a learning experience even for me as far as getting this information.

Many times I have to sit down and say 'what is it all about'. We copied, of course, I'll be honest with you from private industry, from corporations, from WOBM had it and we went to the Prosecutor and he has it now. The library has it. We're going to do something with Tourism and Business in the next several weeks. But it's changing tremendously. So if you just want to, Susan Quinn, give a little overview about what you're doing."

SUSAN QUINN, DIRECTOR, OCEAN COUNTY LIBRARY: "Sure. As the Freeholder was saying, it's changing so rapidly. I would like everyone to know the library is there to help you. We have excellent staff. We are tech savvy and we're willing to walk you through this new era which is a new golden age of information and I think that the power of information is something that is critical to our society. The Ocean County Library, we have almost 30,000 e-books now. We have 74 databases. We have our new library app so you can check out a book wherever you are and it's through, it's part of the "libraries on the go" project so you literally can take your Ocean County Library with you wherever you are and I think that's the power of a library. So I encourage everybody here to get a library card and to visit all the wonderful resources and programs and activities. We truly have something for everyone and we look forward to seeing you.

And I know students sometimes today, Freeholder, are so upset because back in the day they'd come into the library at five of five and they'd want that book to do their homework, but now if they have a computer with the Internet connected at home there's no getting around the fact that they can still do their homework because we provide those resources for them. So, even on the weekends."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "You know what's interesting, even now if I see something on e-books immediately and I have it for three weeks, no cost. Many times you buy your book and usually after a week or two and on C-span I got a number of books the last time and sometimes they have it and sometimes they don't. Some were just copyrighted in 2014 and within four or five days I was able to get the book from the library system. That's how fast it is, just, like it's unbelievable. So it's at the razor's edge. Usually on C-span they have the "office speaking". So I make a list of all the "office" that is free. I got two I think within three days and it was like boom, boom, virtually immediately. And again, what's out there today was not even out there two years ago. That's why it's so important to have that. Especially with our senior citizens with medical technology for different drugs and whatever. Before someone goes to the doctor, the first thing they do is they go on a Website. They check it out on the Internet and doctor's appreciate that too. They say you know something? They know all about that. They say 'how do you know about that? Well, I went on the Website and I got all of the information'. So you're actually helping your doctor. And, most doctors are very appreciative you do that because it's a partnership in working to come up with a cure and solutions."

SUSAN QUINN: "And I think too our residents are supportive and the Board of Freeholders, I think you have built over the past thirty years a library system that you can, that even our residents can be very, very proud of. We are nationally recognized and I thank you for your support. It's a wonderful resource for all of our residents."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "And we made it very clear in difficult times, even in a recession, we're not going to cut back on our library and new technology because they need it now more than ever before, the importance of it and the many things that we do are just tremendous. Again, we thank you for coming. Thank you."

SUSAN QUINN: "Thank you very much."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Any comments from members of the Board? I had to brush up on it. Let me tell you something. Susan Quinn, all the work I have to do trying to figure out what's going on in the library. I spent hours and hours trying to get the new technology. And, even as an educator, it's surprising how much easier it would have been for me when I was going to college and graduate school to get all that information. It's easier now and it helps our students. I'll tell you why, because they save time. Time is very important and you get the information. Sometimes I'm challenged by certain members that come here, even from a different county. They ask about the office and you can get all of their work and their background and biography."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Mr. Director, when I tried to read a book on e- whatever it was my wife said you pull the pages like this (demonstrates). But, I left my finger on a word too long and then I get a definition of the word. Well I already knew what the word meant, so how do you get the definition off? I don't know. That was the end of my e-books."

C. RESOLUTION - PUBLIC HEARING

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay. Thank you very much. The next portion that we go to is Item C. It's a Resolution Public Hearing. I'm going to turn this over now. There's a Public Hearing on the 2014 Ocean County Budget and Capital Plan. Mrs. Vasil there are five different parts to it and I will leave it to you as we go through each one."

CLERK VASIL: "Thank you Freeholder. I will read the Annual Budget for the County of Ocean for the Fiscal Year 2014:

Total Appropriations: \$400,794,818.00 Less Anticipated Revenues: \$90,364,523.00 Amount to be Raised by Taxation: \$310,430,295.00

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. I would like to turn this now over to Freeholder John Bartlett who is the liaison with Finance and would like to give an overview. And again, we made it very clear when we introduced the Budget that we would make it as easy as possible for any resident to get in Ocean County as far as putting it on our website, as far as giving hard copies, putting them in library and making sure our professional staff was available to discuss any items that they felt of concern to them. Freeholder Bartlett please."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Thank you Mr. Director. This is just a brief overview of the 2014 proposed Budget on which we will hold the public hearing today. The 2014 Budget is complicated in comparison to the 2013 Budget because of the lingering negative effects of Hurricane Sandy. In 2014, this year, the net equalized valuation of the County is down again by about \$300 million to \$90.8 billion from last years \$91.1 billion. So a roughly \$300 million decrease in the equalized valuation of the county. The tax rate, therefore, will increase slightly to make up for that by 1.6 cents per \$100 of equalized value for a County tax rate proposed at this time at 34.1 cents per \$100 of equalized value. I might note Mr. Director that 20 years ago when we were here the County tax rate was 45 cents. The grand majority of the time over the last 35 years has been in the 40's. The overall operating Budget this year in the Budget is \$400.7 million up \$14.6 million from last year.

There are two items of extraordinary expenditure in the budget that I think are noteworthy and Freeholder Little is going to comment on one of those a little later. But first of all because of changes in Federal Medicare and Food Stamps programs which are administered to some degree through the County Board of Social Services and because of, again, the increased eligibility for those we have had to spend in this budget an additional nearly \$1.7 million to the Board of Social Services to help fund these programs and to provide the personnel to handle the people who are applying for them. And we've had somewhat of a backlog.

Also, this of course has been a very difficult winter and both this winter and Hurricane Sandy have put a tremendous strain on our heavy equipment. We haven't purchased much in the way of heavy equipment over the last five years, given the recession. But you can't keep running the equipment forever and not having increasing breakdowns and increasing costs of repairs on them which, of course, we handle. So this Budget proposes spending an additional \$5.6 million for equipment for the Road Department and other departments again, to start replacing vehicles that are nearing their end of their useful life. Again, our road expenditures and paving, etc. The road took a tremendous beating this year.

So I raise these two because if you take these out of the \$14 million increase, because these are extraordinary, you will find that the overall then operating County Budget is up 1.9% from last year which is below the rate of inflation and of course below the 2% State cap. As for the future, as you know the County enjoys and has worked very hard to obtain and retain its AAA Bond Rating. That has been of paramount importance to us and hopefully to our This budget, one of the things that these rating agencies all inquire about and talk to us about when we go for re-rating every year is the County's surplus position. Last year we ended the year with a surplus that is what effectively might be called money in the bank, free money in the bank, of \$34 million and we appropriated \$16.5 million of that to support the Budget. Well I'm happy to report that we replaced all of that \$16 (million) that we used in this previous year and in fact ended the year or began 2014 with a surplus figure of \$35.6 million and we are proposing to use slightly less than we did last year and use \$16 million. Now we are doing this....we are building our surplus slowly because the normal figure for surplus for a AAA rated county is about 10% of your budget. We are not quite at that point, but we are working toward it. And again, I think that's important to retain this important AAA rating. On the FEMA reimbursement level we are on track again to receive the roughly \$40 million that we are still owed by FEMA. That's money we spent during the storm to help municipalities clean up after the storm under a contractual arrangement. I understand today that that \$40 million has been released to the State of New Jersey and so it is the State that is now going through, again, all of our documentation. And so, again, the money has been appropriated by the Federal government and is in State hands and the next step of course is to get it in our hands.

The County's overall debt is very modest as all the rating agencies point out at about \$424 million. That is less than one quarter of our 2% borrowing limit. And I might also point out that some of that debt is debt that we've incurred on behalf of the College who is paying that share of that debt. Also, our debt is based on a fairly rapid payout and is

again, slightly higher than last....well one half our debt service, what you pay for interest and principle, is about 1/2% higher than last year. But that also includes payments from the College. I didn't break those out specifically. All in all there are no surprises in this Budget nor are we looking at any surprises in the future. We have things pretty much in hand. Certainly we expect the real estate market to rebuild this year. Hopefully it will bring our tax base back up next year somewhat which will relieve pressure on the tax base.

There is one, which is probably appropriate to say now Mr. Director, one slight difficulty in the Budget. After we hold the Public Hearing today we will not be able to actually approve or adopt the budget for a technical reason. The Budget includes a \$9 million Essential Services Grant from the Federal Government through the CDBG Program and others which is about \$3 million less than last year. Now this money is given to storm impacted municipalities, counties, etc. to help offset the loss in the ratable base. The number we've used in the budget as a revenue, came from the State of New Jersey. So that's the number they gave us, that's the number we used as a revenue and that's in this budget. The only problem is that the Federal government has not gotten around to certifying that number to the State. So until the Federal Government will certify that particular number or whatever number that they do certify, we can't formally adopt the Budget. So we will hold the Public Hearing, Mr. Director, but then we will move on to other business because we cannot adopt it today because we do not have the certification from the State because the State doesn't have the certification from the Federal government. I regret to have to report that because this is an unfortunate way to have to operate. It may require when we get the final certification number an adjustment to the Budget and therefore an amendment to it. Not the way I like to do business. Not the way we normally do business, but you can't look at a \$9 million gift too hard, so when we get it we will smile and say thank you. I just hope we get it in a timely manner. If not, we will again, continue to operate under the temporary budget. But we're not under any strain. but again, we would have liked to have approved the budget today. Thank you for your patience Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Freeholder Bartlett. And again, I just want to make it very clear, we hope to do this at the next public meeting, but there is a possibility this could go on again and again and again until as Freeholder Bartlett mentioned before, we get approval from the State of New Jersey. Until so, we will go on now. We will have an open Public Hearing. Any comments or suggestions we will of course listen to, but we just want to make it very clear that there is no misunderstanding that this does not fall on our professional staff, it falls on agencies outside and beyond our control. Freeholder Gerry Little."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. First, as I know and the entire Board does, we appreciate Freeholder Bartlett's leadership each and every year on our budget. He really does a magnificent job with it. It is a cost-effective budget. We are very pleased that we are maintaining our services for our senior citizens, our Veterans. We are funding our County College at sufficient levels. We're increasing funding to our Vo-Tech School. We have maintained our AAA Bond Rating with a \$35,000,000.00 surplus when many other governements including our State, their credit rating has been diminished. And, Freeholder Bartlett mentioned several areas of costs in the budget and one of those our Board of Social Services and I'd like to preface this by saying that our Board of Social Services....we have...they deal with difficult problems each and every day. No one arrives at the door of the Board of Social Services with a positive issue. They're always there because their life is in....it's experiencing a challenge and they're seeking help. So they really do a very good job of trying to serve the people of our County in very difficult and strained circumstances.

The largest increase in this Budget is with our Ocean County Board of Social Services. A 7% increase in the funding....."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Excuse me. I don't know if you realize it - your whispering is traveling. Thank you very much. Okay."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. This is the largest increase in the Budget, 7.08 or seven and eight hundredths percent increase in the Board of Social Services. This year the taxpayers of Ocean County will be sending the Board of Social Services \$23,074,246.00. So almost \$23.1 million. And, this funding is required. It is a match that we must provide, a local match, in order to qualify for the Federal funding for food stamps and TANF, Medicaid and all of those various programs and in fact, Freeholder Bartlett mentioned a technicality in the Budget with one area of funding that has to be approved by the State. The Board of Social Services budget has to be approved prior to our budget and it has to be certified by the State of New Jersey or we can't adopt our budget if we do not sufficiently fund the Board of Social Services. And, if the State were to determine that the funding is inadequate to provide the proper staff for the Board of Social Services to administer the programs. And what do we derive as a community from that funding?

Well, with all of the programs and the Federal funding, the aggregate amount, I mean it's really a staggering number. The taxpayers of the United States in return for that \$23 million that we fund here locally, the Federal government and the State government returns to Ocean County about \$640 million in Food Stamps, Medicaid benefits, TANF, all the Federal programs that begin in Washington and run through Trenton and then trickle down to all of the various counties. So in 2013, \$640 million in Federal taxpayer benefits are administered by our Ocean County Board of Social Services.

Just to give you some idea, Mr. Director and members of the Board, Ocean County now has over 61,000 people on food stamps. 61,000. We have right now almost 3,800 individuals on Temporary Assistance for Needy Families. Our taxpayers are also providing General Assistance to 1,713 individuals. Medicaid - 86,000 individuals and families, many of them single women with children are on Medicaid. New Jersey Family Care and Medicaid. Since

the implementation of "Obamacare" in January which was part of the expanded Medicaid program, we now have... in the first six weeks we had 4,800 new Medicaid beneficiaries in Ocean County. In the first six weeks, 4,800. The Board of Social Services last year had 130,643, they have a counter that records every individual that walks into those offices. Almost 131,000 people walked through the offices either in Manahawkin or Lakewood or here in Toms River. And, this year we're projecting 155,000 walk-ins. And, they had almost 1.8 million telephone calls. Even Freeholder Vicari doesn't have that many. And he does receive a lot of calls.

So it is a tremendous effort and it is the largest increase in this budget and it is required by the State and Federal government. And, certainly, it does provide a substantial amount of Federal and State tax dollars to the needy and the poor here in Ocean County. So I thank you Mr. Director and again, I thank Freeholder Bartlett and the members of the Board for their efforts in developing this Budget. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I would just like to thank and again, I do this continuously, Freeholder Gerry Little for really getting involved and making sure that we not only show compassion, but we actually do more, in my opinion, than any other county in the State of New Jersey to make sure the money is spent the correct way. It goes to the right people. And, it has to be remembered that of the entire United States hit by Hurricane Sandy, seventeen states, we suffered the most devastating impact as far as loss of ratables and people that have homes are still not in those homes and we try to do everything possible within our means. Now, is it perfect? I'll be the first one to tell you no. I think we do an excellent program. We try to do our best, but with the means and the resources that we have we made it very clear that now we're going to have to do less with less. But you know something? We try to have that safety net. We try to help people. The numbers that were just given to you are accurate numbers by Freeholder Little. He works on it personally. And, if you look at the entire State of New Jersey I just want to include one more item in there, we have over 160,000 senior citizens. More of the needy. They need our services. Over 65, 75, 80, the highest percentage in the United States of America. We've got the highest number of Veterans that need the services more and more. And what we have tried to do more and more with our tax base, within our tax base, is try to address those concerns as the Freeholders have mentioned before and at the same time offer opportunities - Vocational School, College, Kean University, Workforce Investment Board - because unemployment is high. We try to give those opportunities with the Tourism Advisory Board, trying to grow the economy, trying to get people the most important thing and that is to earn a paycheck. Any other Freeholders who would like to make a comment before I open up to the members of the public? Freeholder Lacey, Administrator, Freeholder Kelly?"

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Director, just looking at those Social Service numbers. I was just saying to Freeholder Bartlett, when you look at that you have to understand that the money spent for Social Services in this County is over \$200 million more than the entire County Budget. You're talking about \$660 million plus for Social Services, meeting the needs of many people in this County. Our total County Budget is \$400 million. That total is \$663 million. It's an amazing amount of money invested every day in the people of this County. I just want to congratulate the Board of Social Services under your leadership Freeholder for the work it does for so many needy people."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "You know as Freeholder Kelly mentioned before, what's very important is that you know, look at the pain and suffering we would have. We're talking about pain and suffering on the most vulnerable, the elderly and the young children and the disabled. And that's why it's extremely important to put things in perspective as far as getting those numbers and to let you know exactly what's taking place for the year 2014. We've done our job. But you know something? As Freeholder Bartlett mentioned before, we are still waiting for approval from the State of New Jersey. We need better working with different agencies and different levels of government."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "I'd like to elaborate on one issue that Freeholder Kelly, thank you, just reminded me. There are three factors in this and it's something everybody needs to understand. First of all, we had the great Recession. '08, '09', 10'. We still haven't really.....I know, you could call it a Depression, that we really have not recovered from. And secondly, we of course, had Hurricane Sandy which hurt our businesses, hurt many folks. Okay. But, it's also important to understand that the United States Congress and the President of the United States made many more people eligible for these programs. They increased, expanded the eligibility, the number of people who are eligible. They raised instead of limiting it "x", they raised the income. They took away the assets test in some of these programs. And of course, then you have the issue of the Medicaid expansion. So it's a combination of everything. Some of the folks that are receiving these benefits today would not be eligible had Congress not changed the guidelines. We also have to remember that Congress is only paying about 56% of that \$640 million and they're borrowing the rest. The rest they are borrowing on the National Debt. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I just want to add one more time. I know you heard it before that at the height of the market ratable base today, today it's down \$18 billion. \$18 billion. And we still have to give more services, not a complaint, but the taxpayers have to realize where it's going at the present time. And a special thanks has to go to those agencies that administer this money, the Board of Social Services. They do a fantastic job. The Board of Health and some of the needs that take place. And they don't have, I'll be honest with you, the number of people that they should have working and they are working harder now than ever before. We thank our professional staff because a lot of times with the hiring freeze, we have not replaced a lot of people throughout the County who make sure that we can put this Budget together. That concludes our report from members of the Board of Freeholders. I will open up to members of the public to ask any questions on this current budget for 2014. This is the opportunity that you have to ask any questions or make any suggestions.

First I would like to give the opportunity to anyone....there's a primary fight. Anyone that's running for any public office on a County level. Would you come forward? From any party, political, Democrat or Republican. Anyone from the Democratic Party that would like to make a comment? I wanted to give them the first opportunity to speak

as long as they wanted to. Since there's no candidate running for this June 3rd or November, I will open up to any member of the public to make any comments or suggestions or statements they may have. Mr. Gumper your hand was the first one up. (Mr. Gumper declines) Mr. Black. Anyone who wants to speak? Mr. Black if you would like to speak first. Just state for the record and the only reason I'm asking for it - we know your name - it's so it's part of the public record, it memorialized. So if anyone wants to look at the minutes they can see everything that was said at this particular meeting."

GARY BLACK, JACKSON: "Again, with all the things we've faced here in Ocean County and what I've seen all over in the State and the Federal level, municipal level. I said something along the lines of this last year. You guys say no surprises, but if you look at what's happening on the Federal level, you have a....they're not meeting what they're supposed to do, they're not doing what they're supposed to do and they do something you can't do, they print money. They don't bother, they just roll it off the assembly line, you know? You don't have that ability. Local municipalities are crying, they're screaming, especially north Jersey, trying to stay within this 2% cap. They're trying to say it's impossible. We can't do it. Places are still going trying to go above the cap with special elections. You had a lot of increased needs this year. Again, we're still doing the cleanup from the storm Sandy. And you keep saying no surprises, but if you look at what you have to do compared to what other places have to do and what you're doing with it, yeah that's one hell of a surprise. I wish more governments and all these people that do try to put down....a few years ago we had people trying to say well we ought to just get rid of County government. Well, where would we be now? Year after year after year after year after year. I've been coming to these Board Meetings for quite some time. You hear the same thing at election time "boy look at the surplus! They're stealing our money or there's a secret fund nobody knows about". Well that surplus saves us money because it is a growth community. Even with this disaster we've had, it's still a growth community. And having this money there, we can borrow the money we need at a better rate. So this money saves us money.

After the Superstorm, except for the towns that really took some minor damage or towns that are about the size of your average neighborhood, if you didn't have the capital to keep these towns afloat and do the cleanup where would we be today? What condition would our County be in? Would our ratables be....you said they're going down now with what we got hit. Imagine if we'd still be cleaning up now. If it wasn't for you guys it would have happened certainly. Both the town I live in and the town I work for, there's no way in hell they could have paid for it if it weren't for you guys.

I can use the unofficial acronym for FEMA. I'll just end with the two words municipalities, again, over municipalities again. I'll just put it that way. The F's the easy one. You were able to hold us up when they didn't. Look what's happening on the State level. FEMA actually decided after the beating we took, they figure Newark's a better place for it to go. You guys were able to hold it together. Have we seen a tax increase? It's more of an adjustment than an increase. But yes, to some it is an increase. But if you didn't do what you were doing for years prior to this, where would we be today? You know what? We can't even fathom it. And I thank you guys for it. This isn't just your typical good.....you went beyond....I've always said you are what government is suppose to do. Well you went well beyond it. You and everybody who runs for office should come here and go to school and learn how to do it because again, if you just did what was the minimum, if you did what other people said they would do if they got it in, we can't even come to grips of where we'd be today. So with that, thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much Mr. Black. Anyone else who would like to make a comment on the 2014 Budget? Mr. Gumper please."

WILLIAM GUMPER, BERKELEY TOWNSHIP: "Is this public comment?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "At the end. This is only on the Budget. At the end of the meeting we will have public comment on anything. Not only on the agenda, but anything else related to County business. Again, this is for the 2014 Budget. This is the end of the Public Hearing. Are there any comments or suggestions? There's no time limit. You can speak as long as you want to. However, even if we were paying ten times the amount, it saves money. This is buildable property. With all buildable property comes services, road improvements. Look at the next....all you have to do is look at the next page of how much the Natural Lands Trust has saved. And, how much more would we be doing if we weren't buying these properties to preserve this buildable property. So in the long run this is a program that pays. Also it's totally voluntary. It's not like what California does where it's not going on at a Bundy Ranch where the Federal government or somebody comes in and seizes people's properties, seizes their stuff and goes marching in like jack-footed thugs. No this is where people come up and voluntarily offer their property up and if an agreement can be agreed on, fine. If not, everybody goes their own way. All is happy. All is done. And, with this property, it's not something you will be wrestled to the ground or thrown to the ground if you dare set foot on. Yeah, we can walk on it. We can hike on it. It basically turns into a passive recreation park.

So all around this is an excellent program. I speak up every time there is. I try to take away some of the misconceptions and the outright lies that are about it. This isn't big government. This is not Agenda 21. You were actually one of the first government's in this area to actually speak up against Agenda 21. This is voluntary. This is Ocean County doing for Ocean County. Anybody don't like it, go up north. That's it."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much Mr. Black. Anyone else who would like to make a comment? Seeing none I close the...... Mr. Gumper."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "Are we still on the Budget?"

R. FREEHOLDER COMMENTS

At 4:58 PM, Freeholder Director Vicari received the following comments from the Board:

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Now it's time for members of the Board of Freeholders and then I will open it up to the members of the public."

I just want to acknowledge one more time that on April 14th on Monday at 6:00 PM in this room, we had a meeting of the Ocean County Tourism Advisory Board. We made some changes with it. We doubled the size. We meet more often. Our key concern is to make sure we help to jump-start the economy for the summertime. We've prepared for it. We're asking our business people that lost virtually everything during the Superstorm to take a chance in Ocean County. Take the risk to spend their money to open up their businesses.

We have reports from across Ocean County, from Point Pleasant Beach all the way down to Seaside Heights, Seaside Park and Long Beach Island and we are very optimistic as far as what's taking place. And, we are committed to whatever is necessary to do to help the businesses. No matter what has to be done as far as working with banks, getting them loans and getting money, of course, from State and Federal agencies. So again, we have really outstanding people working there. They volunteer their time. And, we have representation of not only the Joint

Bases, but from the amusement industry, from restaurants to hotels and all industry throughout Ocean County. We want to at least.... our goal is to make \$4.3 billion a year with our tourist dollars, to put 65,000 people to work. Again, we're working very aggressively. The last meeting was very successful. We will meet again on Monday, May 12th at 6:00 PM to continue our program.

Again, I would like to offer if any other Freeholder would like to speak."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Just Mr. Director to thank Julie Tarrant again for all the hard work she does in keeping me sane and alleviating some of my worries here, there and everywhere because she is a master at putting together a budget. She understands where we'll all coming from and fortunately we're all from roughly the same spot, so it makes her job a bit easier. But, the problems that I had anticipated with this not being able to approve the Budget today gave me some sleeplessness last night Julie alleviated this morning. So, I want to thank you Julie. I will sleep better tonight than I did last night. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Freeholder."

FREEHOLDER LACEY: "I just want to say Mr. Director that today will be the last day of snow. (laughter) So we are going to start saving on our budget right now."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "You said that last weekend and I put away my snow shovel until 7:30 this morning when I had to use my ice scraper. I called up Freeholder Little and he told me he had ice also over there on the island."

FREEHOLDER LACEY: "Well today was the last day."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Freeholder Gerry Little I hope you put away your snow shovel."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "As long as you're Director it will be out front waiting to go."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Through Mother's Day. I know."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "You made it til April 16th. I can't believe it. Unbelievable with snow. And, I'll join Freeholder Bartlett also in thanking our staff for their budget. Julie. And Mario is here from the Board of Social Services and he's Julie's counterpart over there. We thank Mario for his efforts. He works very closely with Julie and back and forth as they deal with this ongoing question of how much funding do the County taxpayers have to provide. And, so we thank them both. Thank you.

And I would like to mention one thing. All of you are certainly aware of the Purple Heart which is awarded to our troops. Anyone who sheds blood from injuries due to combat. The Purple Heart has been awarded since the Civil War through the first World War, second World War, Korean and so forth and the War of Terror today and all of that. And there is a National Purple Heart Hall of Honor. It is part of the Veterans History Program sponsored by the Library of Congress and it is located on the banks of the Hudson River in New Windsor, New York, up in New York State.

Since the Purple Heart's inception over 2 million Purple Hearts have been awarded. Well, the National Purple Heart Hall of Honor wants to inscribe all their names on a wall in Windsor for people to visit and to read. So far, they only have 193,000 out of those 2 million individuals. They only have the names of 193,000. So the VFW, the national VFW program and other Veterans organizations, they have started a nationwide effort to try to encourage individuals or survivors or family members or so forth, loved ones, of individuals who have earned and received the Purple Heart to notify the Hall of Honor so they can add their names to the wall, which is a pretty neat thing. In order to do this all you have to do is contact Susan, the Internet, right? Modern communication. www.thepurpleheart.com There's a registration process there and documentation and so forth I guess that has to be submitted. But this is a very legitimate organization. It is a nationwide effort which is being undertaken by the VFW. So we would certainly encourage.....we know here in Ocean County we certainly don't know the actual number, but we have 60,000 Veterans and certainly a number of them have received the Purple Heart. We would encourage all those and certainly hope that the media can get this message out for anyone or their families, maybe they passed away, fathers or brothers or sisters or aunts. We now, of course, have women who have received the Purple Heart and have done so I think in several of the wars, but particularly in the War on Terror. So we would encourage them to visit this Website and have their name memorialized and their family member memorialized on this wall forever as we as a nation celebrate those who have certainly paid a difficult and serious price for serving our country. Thank you Mr. Director."

S. **PUBLIC COMMENTS** - Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of **five (5) minutes** per speaker.

At 5:06 PM, Freeholder Director Vicari opened the meeting to receive comments from the public, as follows:

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Anyone who would like to speak from members of the public, come forward to the microphone. State your full name and your mailing address. Mr. Gumper I believe you would like to come forward."

WILLIAM GUMPER, BERKELEY TOWNSHIP: "Yesterday I met with the Library Commission and of course our Director of Libraries, Miss Susan Quinn, was there as well and I gave each them a copy of two documents I have on a plan that I hope it isn't pie in the sky, but it's a plan to allow all of the libraries, all 21 libraries in Ocean County to show motion picture films legally without being in conflict with the copyright laws of the nation which carry a very high penalty for violation of, which goes up to \$250,000.00 fine and/or up to five years in a Federal penitentiary. That's certainly a very harsh thing for showing a film. But the point is, the Library system can save a considerable amount of money to be used for other items, possibly library items or possibly given back to the Freeholders to use on something else.

If this plan works out, I'm going to submit these two documents which took me a lot of trouble to find. I'll submit it to the Clerk of the Board. I'll ask the Clerk of the Board to make a copy for all five of the Freeholders and the Administrator and in this case, the Counsel, the lawyer for the Board of Freeholders, Mr. Sahradnik. I should say Counselor Sahradnik. So I'd like them to look it over. I hope it works out. There are seven points that are required for a film to be not in conflict with the copyright laws and it's listed here on the seven of them. I think I can come out with a way these seven conditions can be met and without going to a lot of trouble. They're rather simple. So I'm going to submit that now and hopefully, hopefully it might work out. If it doesn't, it's just an idea that we don't have time for today. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much and we will review that with Ms. Quinn the Library Director."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "She has a copy already."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "She has a copy of it. If you would like to make a comment. Yes. Ms. Quinn, Director of the Library would like to address your concerns."

SUSAN QUINN, OCEAN COUNTY LIBRARY DIRECTOR: "Yes. Mr. Gumper. The Ocean County Library, we abide by all copyright. Copyright is actually administered out of the Library of Congress which many people don't know. It's out of that office. We do have public performance licenses, so everything, if we show a movie in the library we are within copyright. We are upholding that standard. There is something called 'fair use' for educational purposes, for instructional purposes and the information that Mr. Gumper has provided is from the American Library Association which is the national body for American libraries. And it's of course, very nice information and you know, thank you Mr. Gumper for being so knowledgeable about this as a member of the public. I think that's a wonderful thing. But we will look into that and we look into the cost. But we do abide by copyright at the Ocean County Library. Thank you."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "Naturally. And thank you Director Quinn."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you. I hope that meets your satisfaction. Anyone else who would like to speak, ask a question or make a comment? Mr. Black, sir."

GARY BLACK, JACKSON: "I know I've talked to a couple of you. A few things I've been floating on this, but just kind of a side note. The Health Department's been going around, they've been holding presentations for things. In Ocean County we've had a high number of deaths due to heroin and drug abuse, primarily we seem to be hitting it on heroin which I don't think is a good slogan. But, it's happening. But, for people who have to take medications to be more cautious with them. Always count them. Always watch them if you have them. I have what's called a Class 3. Lock them up. And when you go buy them make sure you count them. Make sure there isn't somebody behind the counter who isn't grabbing them too. I've had that happen to me twice already. So a little reminder. I know I brought it up at one of the meetings. They seemed to like it, but maybe some type of "count your meds" type of slogan type thing."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. Well noted because a member of my family had a prescription and they got home and noticed there was a different count. They went back the next day and they realized that they did make a mistake. And we will have a program with Senior Services as far as the medicine chest with senior citizens because they have a tremendous amount of drugs there. Many times their grandchildren when they go to their house they lose things such as percocet, oxycotin and percocet. So we will continue that program Mr. Black. Thank you. Any other comments from members of the public before I close the public portion of this meeting? Seeing no other comments from members of the public, I move to close the public portion of the Board of Freeholders."

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING) AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. There is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the County of Ocean as general improvements, a project consisting of the reconstruction and resurfacing of various roads, all in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, in accordance with plans and specifications on file in the Ocean County Engineering Department, including all else necessary therefor and incidental thereto.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared that the improvements or purposes, the estimated cost of the improvements and appropriation therefor, down payment and estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes authorized are as follows:

payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The County

Comptroller is directed to report in writing to the Board of Chosen Freeholders at the meeting next succeeding

the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this Ordinance is made. Such report must include

the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and

the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 6. The County reasonably expects to commence acquisition and/or construction of the

improvements described in Section 1 hereof, and to advance all or a portion of the costs in respect thereof,

prior to the issuance of bonds or notes hereunder. To the extent such costs are advanced, the County further

reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this

bond ordinance, in an aggregate amount not to exceed the amount of bonds or notes authorized in Section 2

hereof. This bond ordinance is intended to be a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation

Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 7. Any grant monies received for the purposes described in Section 1 hereof, shall be

applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the obligations issued

Freeholder Director Joseph H. Vicari opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Ernest, Assistant Comptroller Christine Wioland, Deputy Clerk of the Board Donna Flynn, Director, Public Information John C. Sahradnik, Jr., County Counsel

Freeholder Lacey reviewed with the Board the Recycling Revenue Sharing Program for the period of July through December 31, 2013. The Freeholder advised that approximately 41,000 tons was recycled during this period; municipalities will receive a total of about a half a million dollars and save approximately \$2.9 million in tipping fees. Freeholder Lacey stated that corrugated material was up at \$29.00 a ton for this period while newspaper and aluminum was down. Freeholder Vicari noted that this program works, the County has never missed paying a dividend to its municipalities. Ocean County was the first to have this program and has won awards The Freeholder also noted that the biggest savings is that the for our program.

material is not going into the landfill with a cost avoidance of almost \$3 million in tipping fees. This is a very successful program.

Director Vicari stated that the Department of Consumer Affairs serves the entire County, noting that over the past two years the Department has expanded what they do. The Director stated that with Superstorm Sandy, the Department is working with contractors to make sure they do not take advantage of our residents. Last year, the Department helped return \$1 million for consumers in Ocean County. Director Vicari introduced Ed McBride, Consumer Affairs Department, who lost his home during the storm and knows the problems consumers are facing while they are trying to get back home.

Mr. McBride noted that the Department of Consumer Affairs is very busy with less employees than the in the past, stating that employees attended weights and measures training with the Attorney General's Office. Mr. McBride stated that staff checks gas tanks at gas stations, scales, and many things that affect consumers; noting that the biggest item has been Superstorm Sandy recently, stating that residents are suffering. Mr. McBride noted that the Department is not trying to hurt businesses, but it has to make sure that consumers are getting what they pay for; many contractors that have come from out-of-state to do storm repairs have made a lot of money but have left the State without completing the work. Mr. McBride advised that a scam taking place now is the one ring phone scam. Customers who call the number back are directed to an adult entertainment site where you are charged \$19.95.

Director Vicari stated that when you call Consumer Affairs you reach a person; the staff helps our residents and a good effort is put forth.

Mr. Scarantino reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda. There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the agenda for the March 5, 2014 Board meeting.

Ms. Wioland reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of March 5, 2014. Freeholder Bartlett questioned if Item 4 on the agenda was going to be pulled from the meeting? Administrator Block stated that this is the resolution establishing the amount to be raised by taxation for the Ocean County Library and that this item will be removed from this Board agenda.

Administrator Block reviewed with the Board County's losses from Superstorm Sandy. Great American Insurance is working with Risk Management. The total is just under \$1.6 million. The Administrator advised that the statement of loss with Great American will give the County the ability to file for FEMA dollars after insurance is settled. Freeholder Vicari questioned the status of Cattus Island Park. Mr. Goetting advised that there was no flood insurance in place at Cattus Island Park.

There, were no questions or comments.

Director Vicari asked the Board members for comments.

Director Vicari stated that he received calls from the barrier island towns regarding their concerns about traffic this past Saturday for the Polar Plunge. This was featured on news channels. The Director noted that the weather was great and many, many people came out for the plunge, traffic was 14 miles long and the roads were a mess. Director Vicari stated that the State is working on 12 ½ miles of road that he felt that should have been done in stages. The Director noted that there are pot holes, resulting is damages to vehicles; gas line issues; and difficulties for fire services and EMS. Emergency vehicles could not get through for emergencies. Director Vicari stated that this can not happen for the St. Patrick's Day Parade, there must be someone onsite to make decisions during the day. Director Vicari stated that the State needs to be more sensitive to the residents. The Director stated that a plan needs to be in place before the St. Patrick's Day Parade. The Director noted that the County is not directly involved in the parade; however, if no decision is made by Tuesday, next week, the Director felt that a resolution from this Board would be appropriate expressing that a plan of action needs to be in place before the St. Patrick's Day Parade takes place.

Freeholder Kelly stated that Route 35 is a large scale project and that traffic and traveling the barrier island may get worse before it gets better. The Freeholder advised that the County does not have jurisdiction for this project, noting that the County has, however, been working with the engineer and the NJDOT. The County has not seen this scale of a project. Work includes replacing everything and building a new road surface with a 50 year life span. Freeholder Kelly stated that this project is going to take a long, long time. People want the work to stop at Memorial Day for the summer. Freeholder Kelly noted that during this winter not a lot of work could done due to snow storms. The County is doing its best to work with the NJDOT and the mayors of the towns involved. This is a lot of road that has to be replaced and the only road on the island. Freeholder Kelly stated that a lot of money is being spent on the road and in the end the County will have a road designed for today and for decades to come. The Freeholder also noted that it is appropriate that the Director is on top of this issue. This Board may consider a resolution at a future date. Director Vicari stated that there was a breakdown in communications and that did not have to happen.

Director Vicari stated that there will be a networking program tomorrow at the Bishop Library regarding the Joint Base. Major departments from the Base will be in attendance as well as business leaders. The next networking program will be held at the Blue Claws Stadium in Lakewood. The Director noted that more programs will be held.

Director Vicari stated that the library will be redoing their website to include more app's. The Director noted that those 55 and older use the printed page for April 16, 2014

information; however, we need to reach out to the 26-40 year olds through computer app's. Students from the VoTech will be designing some programs relating to tourism and the Barnegat Bay. This should be completed sometime in May.

Freeholder Bartlett reviewed with the Board members some problems at Cattus Island Park and the devastation faced from Superstorm Sandy. The Cooper Environmental Center was built with the outside deck and a portion of the building built on pilings. The floor of the building is a poured concrete floor and the Freeholder stated questions have been raised on whether the building can be raised. Freeholder Bartlett stated that at this time there is no public access to the building. Sheetrock and insulation has been removed. Freeholder Bartlett noted that the building does not meet current ADA standards as well as the bathrooms and if the building were to be rebuilt, ADA requirements have to be addressed and a wetlands permit would be needed to accomplish this. The Freeholder noted that it is not as if the County is not fixing the building since the storm, the building can't be done to meet current building codes and FEMA requirements. This site is in the wetlands and this is just one of the items being investigated. Freeholder Bartlett advised that the County has recently issued a contract for an architectural review and the County will continue to formulate a plan to address these problems.

Freeholder Bartlett advised that a group has been formed, Friends of Cattus Island Park, and they are soliciting donations to help the Park. The Freeholder noted that this group is not sanctioned by the Board of Chosen Freeholders or the Ocean County Parks Department. Freeholder Bartlett stated that they are good hearted people but they have been to-date counterproductive to the task at hand. The group has not called to speak to the County about the Park. Freeholder Bartlett stated that there are ongoing issues as to what the eventual result will be to restore the Park.

Freeholder Bartlett advised that he has discussed with County Counsel Sahradnik the possibility of the County registering the name of Cattus Island Park so that other people can not use it. Mr. Sahradnik has advised that there are some difficulties because it is a geographic location as opposed to a legal name or trademark. Freeholder Bartlett advised that County Counsel is looking into seeing what can be done to make sure that there is no unauthorized use of the County name, pictures or logos.

There were no additional comments.

Ms. Vasil read the resolution to move to closed session.

On a motion by Freeholder Kelly, seconded by Freeholder Lacey, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 4:55 PM for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was upanimously carried
