A. Call to Order

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean was called to order on June 6, 2018 at 4:02 PM, Room 119, County Administration Building, 101 Hooper Avenue, Toms River, Ocean County, New Jersey, with Freeholder Director Little presiding. CLERK VASIL: "Thank you, Director. We are proclaiming June 2018 as "Tick Awareness Month" in Ocean County and we are presenting this to Horticulturist Susan Emhardt-Servidio and Rutgers Master Gardener Jerry Jellets, if they would come forward please."

Clerk Vasil reads the proclamation into the record.

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Freeholder Vicari is our liaison to the Rutgers Station here in Ocean County. So, Freeholder Vicari, on behalf of the Board, would you like to present this?"

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "You know we appreciate what you do for us and they are all volunteers. And whenever I go to one of their activities, it is amazing the cross-section of Ocean County that we have. They have not only respect for the environment, but I think it's the respect for what Ocean County has had for many, many years as far as making sure that they take care of the indigenous plants and flowers that are in Ocean County, maintaining our streams and waterways, and Barnegat Bay. But I think, most of all, it's generational. They have younger people coming in all the time into training programs and it goes on for month after month and it's teaching the next generation the importance of the environment, of farming, and what Ocean County was as far as the former conditions. Working with Rutgers University, they do a great job. And they're all volunteers which is a good thing for most of them and they do a good job.

One of the biggest problems that we have in Ocean County, of course, as we know, is the tick problem – Lyme Disease. It's very, very serious, but it's handled in the correct way, the professional way, and with the many free services that we have to identify the ticks at the Agricultural Center. Our main concern, your main concern, is prevention and then identifying them for, of course, possible medical treatment. So on behalf of the Board, Freeholder Director and myself, I give you this proclamation. You are doing not only a great job, but as a former teacher I always like teaching (inaudible)."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Ocean County has one of the highest rates of Lyme Disease and it's a very serious issue and our Health Department is very active in promoting public awareness of the health impact of Lyme Disease which is, of course, carried by ticks. We appreciate your efforts very much."

G. Honoring Joseph E. Buckelew on being named to the New Jersey Hall of Fame.

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Okay, now we have a very special presentation and in a moment we will have our Clerk of the Board read a proclamation, but just a very brief background on why we have so many special guests here today and that's important for all of us to understand.

The New Jersey State Hall of Fame was created by Public Law 2005, chapter 232. The Hall of Fame was established to recognize New Jersey residents who have made enduring contributions to our state, our nation and beyond. The first inductees were presented by former Governor Jon Corzine in 2008.

So today, our Board of Freeholders and our special guests are recognizing an Ocean County leader among this year's Hall of Fame inductees. According to Polly Miller's History of Ocean County, since 1850 until today, nearly 200 of our fellow citizens have served as Ocean County Freeholders. With this year's inductees, the first Ocean County Freeholder ever joins the ranks of distinguished New Jersey Hall of Fame members such as Albert Einstein, Thomas Edison, Bruce Springsteen, Bon Jovi, Derek Jeter, Harriet Tubman, Vince Lombardi, Walt Whitman and many others who are part of our state's rich history. Our colleague, Joe Buckelew, is now forever a part of that history. Joe has

played an important role in the lives and careers of all of us involved in the democratic process here in Ocean County. He has advised us both in our careers and in our personal lives. More importantly, Joe has always been there for all of us and we appreciate his friendship above all else. So with that, would our Clerk of the Board read the proclamation?"

Clerk Vasil reads the proclamation into the record.

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Now normally, Joe, after we read a proclamation we ask the person to come up and we say a couple of nice words and we give them a proclamation and they can go home. Not today. Unfortunately, you are going to have to put up with a few other comments from some other people in the audience and some of us up here. We are going to do some introductions in a moment as we go along, but first I'm going to ask our colleagues here on the Board of Freeholders, all of whom have been greatly touched by Joe Buckelew in their lives to say a few words. We're going to ask all of our speakers to try keep it short, you know, a couple of minutes or so because there are a lot of people who are going to want to talk.

So, with that, we will..."

CLERK VASIL: "Director, excuse me, you wanted me to remind you."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Yes, I'm glad you reminded me. One of the things we inadvertently left out of the proclamation is the fact that Joe Buckelew is not only a veteran, I believe he served in two branches of the military – the Army and the Navy. Is that correct?"

JOSEPH BUCKELEW: "That's correct."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "So that's pretty rare. Joe, thank you for your service. (applause) I don't think a lot of people know that about Joe, but it is very, very honorable that you served our nation. Thank you. And with that, we will ask our dean of the Board of Freeholders, the longest-serving Freeholder in the State of New Jersey, to say a couple words about Joe Buckelew."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "Thank you Mr. Director. If you don't mind, I prefer to do this standing up.

I wouldn't be here today if it weren't for Joe Buckelew. Thirty-nine years ago, 39 years ago, Joe as County Chairman, by the way I have made it a policy not to mention the name of political parties, but was County Chairman of which I was a member of, was part of a group that asked me to run for Freeholder. I, at the time, was the Mayor of the one- horse town and the horse was half-dead. But, in any event, Joe started what he called 'a youth movement'. That included, and following me was Joe Vicari and Damian Murray, and in a sense changed the face of this Board of Chosen Freeholders.

But beyond that, Joe has done countless good works for the people of Ocean County. Let me start there first, because all of what we see on the Garden State Parkway in Ocean County is a direct result of Joe's chairmanship of that authority a number of years ago. We wouldn't be able to move in Ocean County had it not been for Joe's foresight and his ability to get things done. I don't think there is any greater tribute to Joe than that. And most people, of course, would be relatively unaware of that. I'm a person who reads signs – close up, not far away because my glasses don't work – but anyway, the sign on this building, this building was built by Freeholder Joe Buckelew.

And in my life, in my personal life, he has been a mentor; he has been a person of whom I have the greatest personal respect. On many occasions, I've asked his advice. And always his advice at the end is 'but you do what you think is the right thing to do'. And he has always said that good government is good is good politics, not the other way around. I don't think there any greater people who have served the public in a greater way, in local government and in state government, than Joe Buckelew. And I know, Mr. Director, that I have probably gone on a little longer than I should have, but as the 'dean' of the Board as you called me a long time ago, I reserve that right. But in any event, Joe, from me and from all of the members of the Board of Chosen Freeholders, you have our deepest and undying respect. Thank you."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "And now the second half of the Buckelew 'youth movement' is Freeholder Joe Vicari."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "You know when the 'youth movement' began, the first thing that Joe Buckelew wanted to know was, is there longevity in your family, will you live a long time? He said, 'The Republican Party is not going to give us a lot of money unless we can get at least 25 or 30 years.' And Freeholder Bartlett and I made it many years. I'm 37 now and John's a little bit older than me."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR BARTLETT: "I'm not older! We're the same age."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "You're right, about the same age. But, I think the important thing is that we are here today because someone believed in us. I remember when I wanted to run for Freeholder, the first person I went to was Joe Buckelew. I went to his office and said, 'Mr. Buckelew, I want to run for Freeholder.' He looked at me and he gave me some advice. He said, 'If you want to be a good public official, you want to do the right thing, always put the people first.' And that's one thing I have always remembered. And sometimes we disagree. Sometimes we have little discussions. But we disagree in a way that is very, very professional and very businesslike.

Joe Buckelew, one thing I always remember about him, talking to people not in Ocean County, but learn from people outside of Ocean County. I'm from Hudson County originally and the Republican officials there would always say, 'Joe Buckelew is a gentleman. He always treats people with respect.' And that's one thing they always remember,

how they feel after they left the company of Joe Buckelew. They felt like an important person.

And Joe Buckelew has always been there. And he helped me. I always say, this morning again and again, that it's because of not only his belief in me, but because of something just as important, it's the advice he has given to me and many other people that are here today – the Board of Freeholders, the Constitutional Officers and we've always done it. And to show my respect to Joe, we have the same first name, my son is Joe! And also, my grandson is Joe! And it has nothing to do with because my grandfather was Joe! (laughter)

But the important thing is that the legacy that some people leave when they leave office. And it is the respect, the impression, and the mark that you left, for example, not only this building, but if you look at Ocean County Mall, some of the roads that were constructed and everything else. And when Joe Buckelew said, 'You know something? I'm concerned about leaving a legacy, but it's not to Joe Buckelew, it's what I believe in.' And the most important thing he has ever done – not serving just in the military, Mayor of Lakewood, or being Freeholder – there is one thing that is more important and everyone in this room knows it, it's called your family. And Joe Buckelew has some strong family values. And those family values permeate the people that he supported, the people on this Board of Freeholders. There is nothing more important than taking care of your family. Joe Buckelew was very fortunate not only making a great name for himself, but giving something back, making a contribution. And that's what great people do. Why is Joe Buckelew a great person? Because he left us something. A legacy, and he gave something back.

You know, many people that leave public office, the most important thing you have is your reputation. And Joe did something that is very important. And I believe as an educator, three of us on this Board of Freeholders are educators, is giving people opportunities. America is the greatest country in the world. Joe Buckelew started from humble beginnings. He worked himself up. And he has been a very successful businessman. And how did he do that? You do it by working with people. People believing in you, taking a risk, taking a chance and believing in the American system. So Joe Buckelew getting this award today is because he is a businessman who represents what America is all about, but respecting the values of the American system, that if you work hard, you will achieve success. You can only achieve success, not just monetarily, but with your family. Those are the two things that are very, very important to all of us. So I'm proud to say to my Joe Buckelew, but most of all to say, he is not only my friend, but a friend of my family. So Joe Buckelew, I thank you for all you've done for me and my family. Thank you."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Thank you Freeholder. Okay, we are going by seniority here, so next is Freeholder Kelly."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "I reminded Gerry Little earlier today, if we were really going by seniority, I would have spoken before him. He told me he reminds me that he is Director this year.

But, let me start by saying congratulations to you Mr. Chairman. I'm proud to serve on the same Freeholder Board that you once served on. I'm proud to serve on this Board that acknowledges the best of the best here in Ocean County. I know you're a sensitive guy, so I'm going to help with your modesty to remind you, you were second on today's agenda to ticks. (laughter) Not what I told your sons this morning – you'd be hard to have dinner with being in the Hall of Fame – and this should help both of them at the dinner table. (laughter)

Let me just tell you that there are various people from Governors to heads of foundations and boards of trustees that have been inducted into the New Jersey Hall of Fame. It is, in fact, the highest civilian honor that our state can bestow. It recognizes the role models for the next generation. Joe, you were chosen from a list of 100 nominees that was narrowed to 50, and then voted on by the public to be amongst the final 16 inductees named to the New Jersey Hall of Fame. That is quite an honor.

I have been mentored by you for nearly 40 years now and I'm telling you that you might think you remember when you first met me, but you don't, because at least when I first met you was when I was a caddy for Tip Seaman. In other words, I drove him around because I worked for Tip in his hardware store, which I am now purchasing. But, that long ago, I met you and I will tell you, that long ago, I was impressed by you. And I always listened to you even before we first met in your office and you told me that you were supporting somebody else for Freeholder. It wasn't you Mark!

I've worked with you since then on so many local and County levels and I have learned such great lessons from you. But I will tell you the greatest lesson I learned from you when we sat in your office again. You reinforced the principle that all of as elected officials should know and that is 'we are here to serve the public, not ourselves. The citizens always come first. It's not about us, it's about them. It's about serving the public interest, the public good. And I'm sure you remember those kinds of discussions because I'm positive I'm not the only guy you met with in your office and gave that same valuable lesson to. But I never forgot it. Now you got me crying...

You, sir, have taught by your example – whether your service in elected office or on so many important boards that serve the people or your success in business. You truly deserve this honor. Thank you for your dedication to Ocean County. But, most of all, thank you for your personal friendship and your personal mentoring over the years. And, again, I just want to close by congratulating you on this great honor, Mr. Hall of Famer."

JOE BUCKELEW: "Thank you Jack."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Thank you Freeholder Kelly. And our newest and brightest and most cheerful and pleasant member of the Board and I hope he tells us of her campaigning as a young girl for Joe Buckelew. Freeholder Haines."

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "Thank you Mr. Director. It certainly is my pleasure and my honor, number one, to sit up here as a Freeholder. I'm not going to get emotional with Joe.

As a Freeholder from, originally, Lakewood, New Jersey, but I have I have to say I'm probably the only person in this room that has known Joe the longest other than his children and I don't know if they were born when you ran for Township Committee."

JOE BUCKELEW: "No, they weren't."

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "But I was one of those that campaigned for Joe when he and George Buckwald ran for Township Committee in Lakewood. I don't remember the year. I just know I was young, young, beginning teens, I think I was, when he ran. I was campaigning for him wearing an outfit that my mother had, as he has said many times at many functions, that my mother made a red, white and blue outfit and a straw hat that we wore to hand out literature for Joe and George. And since that time, he has always been there for me. He's been there for all of us up on this Board. He's been here for many people in Ocean County and I'm sure not just here, but in the State of New Jersey. He is someone that has taught us that we have to be honorable, we have to be truthful, and we have to listen to the people when they come and they talk to us or they have a problem. But what we do is, we never turn anybody away, we are always there for them and we do whatever is going to be best for that person. These are things that Joe Buckelew has instilled in each and every one of us that are here and in this room, along with everything else said by my fellow Freeholders.

He is someone who is very dear to me, as was mentioned to me, and while we've been so happy to say that he is a friend. I love Joe Buckelew as a very, very dear friend. That's all. Thank you. I'm sorry I'm being emotional, but he's just great, I can't help it."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "You did great. Very well. Now, we have with us a lot of people, which we are going to get to. First, we're going to introduce our three, actually fantastic, Constitutional Officers and we're going to ask our senior Constitutional Officer who has been with the County the longest in serving, which I'll introduce in a second, but first of all, our Ocean County Sheriff, Mike Mastronardy is here. And in a little bit, the Sheriff has a very special presentation from his department for Joe, in a few minutes. And it is not a warrant or anything like that. (laughter). Nothing like that!

And our outstanding Ocean County Clerk, Scott Colabella. And we have asked our Ocean County Surrogate to speak on behalf of all three of our Constitutional Officers. And a little history here before we unveil this plaque which is over there behind that. It looks like it came from a rich gold. It's actually 24 karat gold, Joe; see that thing on the wall over there?"

JOE BUCKELEW: "Can I take it home?"

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "You will get this one, without the gold. There is a little bit unique history in this, to the best of our knowledge; this is the only official document in the history of the County, which is signed by all five Freeholders and all three Constitutional Officers, once we unveil this. No other document has been signed by all eight that we are aware of. So just a little bit of history that we wanted to put together for Joe. So, on behalf of all the Constitutional Officers, would everyone please welcome our Ocean County Surrogate, Jeff Moran."

SURROGATE JEFF MORAN: "The boys asked me to make it quick today because they have a tee time at six o'clock. So I'll make it quick.

So John Bartlett didn't finish the story. When John Bartlett became a Freeholder, I was in the VA hospital and Patty and Peg had come up to visit me. John was supposed to be with them, but he didn't make it because a gentleman by the name of Pat Valucci had stopped by while John was cutting the grass and said to him, 'You've got come with me. Joe Buckelew wants to see you because we're going to nominate you as being a Freeholder.' Well, John and I were Councilman, I was in Beachwood and he was in Pine Beach, and the big conversation afterwards was he didn't even know who Joe Buckelew was, but he knew he was in charge. So it was shortly after that, that John and he's been a Freeholder ever since.

And on behalf of Mike and for Scottie and I, we wouldn't be here where we are standing today. When I first went into the Legislature a hundred years ago, it was Joe Buckelew and Shep Gerzberg and many, many others that coordinated together and helped my campaign. And then when, unfortunately, when Franklin had passed away, it was Andy Ciesla, Bob Singer and Len Connors that sat down with Joe Buckelew and said I think Jeff Moran would be a great candidate for that position. And it was because of your efforts and you were instrumental in making it all possible. I can't thank you enough. And boys, your father is a great guy and we admire him and thank you for being who you are. Thank you."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Surrogate. Now, we have a number of our State Legislators here and let me check my list and I hope we have everyone. We have from the 9th District, Assemblyman Brian Rumpf. And from the 10th District, Assemblyman David Wolfe. And we have asked the senior State Legislator, we have four Legislative Districts now in Ocean County, and so we have four Senators and 8 Assembly Members and the senior member of our State Legislative Delegation is Senator Bob Singer. And not only that, but Bob has been a lifetime friend of Joe and, obviously, Bob represents Lakewood and was a former Mayor and Committeemen and probably served with Joe at some point or worked for him. No? Okay, I slipped up. In any event, we would like to welcome Senator Bob Singer on behalf of the Legislature."

SENATOR ROBERT SINGER: "Thank you Freeholder and John Bartlett, Commissioner! (laughter) Inside joke! First of all, what an honor to be part of this ceremony honoring our dear friend, Joe and his lovely family, his wonderful sons and daughter-in-laws and his grandchildren – special, special people to Ocean County and all of us.

It wouldn't be fair or reasonable if I didn't have a Joe Buckelew story. So I've got to, Joe, give you a little bit of a story. I know there are a couple of stories you're going to hear today, but in 1985, Jeff Moran and I were tagged to run for the Assembly and Joe called me in and helped me get the nomination against that awful team of Russo, Doyle and Ford. I got even. I married John Russo's daughter. (laughter) But the issue really was that I was running with the late Roden Lightbody and he was the Mayor of Toms River and I was the Deputy Mayor of Lakewood. And it was Tom Keane's re-election year and Joe said, 'Can you please run? We think we have a great chance at doing it.' And he and George Buckwald convinced me to run and I got the nomination. And we had a tradition in his office, as you all remember, how good the day was, was how big the shrimp was. Right? (laughter)

So the campaign went on. It was a very difficult campaign, a very heated campaign, and the week before it was over, Joe called me in his office and I noticed there was no shrimp so I knew I was in trouble. And Joe said to me, 'They've done the polling.' And the polling had come out that John Fodor was first and Roden was second, Marlene was a close third and I was a distant fourth. And even though it was coming to an end, and Ginny knew this because she worked with me, and he said, 'Keep on working hard, but I want you to know you did the good thing, it's not over. There will be future days for you ahead and I'm proud of you.' And it meant a lot to me because Joe, as the person he is, telling me that I did a good job and he was proud of me meant a lot to me personally.

So what happened, what the deal was that we were going to win Dover and I'd come in second, he'd win Lakewood because I was Deputy Mayor and he'd come in second, so that night I was there with Shep Gerzberg, as many of us know him as a blessed memory, and we get the call in Lakewood from Roden saying it was a disaster, we got killed in Toms River. He lost Toms River. I lost Toms River. We lost Brick. I better come down to the Holiday Inn for my concession speech. So I in the car with Shep and he backs the car into another car. It was a mess coming down and I'm practicing my speech all the way down, what I'm going to say and it's emotional at the time. And we drive to the Holiday Inn and I'm intense and I'm walking in there to say my concession speech and thanking everybody. And I get up on the stage and Joe turns to me and he says, 'I don't know how we did it, but you won.' And, believe it or not, I found out from Joe Buckelew on the stage that night that I won the election. It was a day I will never forget. But it was a day, you know, that Joe Buckelew is always behind me and always there for me.

And Joe, I'm so so proud of you and your family for all you have done for all us in Ocean County. It's amazing when you hear everyone saying what a great person you are, what a friend you are. I don't hear that any other place in the state. We don't hear the respect and the dedication that we have. And you know, I will tell you that George Gilmore follows in your footsteps as your protégé and has made it and carried on the same way you do. You've made us all proud. You make your family proud. You make the County proud. And, may she rest in peace, I know you made your wife proud and that's an important aspect. She was a special woman to all of us.

I would just like, I know that Dave is here and Brian Rumpf is here. This proclamation, Joe you can come up for half a second, is from all of us in the Legislature, all four Districts, all Senators and Assemblypeople. Do you guys want to come up for a second? Dave and Brian, because you are on this resolution. And just, thank you so much for everything."

JOE BUCKELEW: "Thank you."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "We have with us today some of the folks who took on the legacy that Joe Buckelew left as a former Lakewood Mayor and Lakewood Committeeman and we have with us two members of the Lakewood Township Committee. First of all, would everyone welcome Committeeman Meir Lichtenstein. And on behalf of the Township, we have asked he is very pleased to do that and a pleasure to be here, Deputy Mayor Menashe Miller, Lakewood Township."

DEPUTY MAYOR MENASHE MILLER: "Good afternoon honorable Freeholders and members of the public. What a pleasure to be here today and Director Little, thank you so much for inviting me, reaching out to my office to be here today. I am truly eternally grateful."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "You're welcome."

DEPUTY MAYOR MILLER: "What an honor it is to be here today to pay tribute to Joe Buckelew. I am like the midget riding on a giant's shoulders being the Deputy Mayor of Lakewood Township, the legacy which you left behind, which I am continuing today.

I'm here with my colleague, Mayor Lichtenstein. And by the way, his Hebrew name is Meir, when he was Mayor they called him 'Mayor Meir'! (laughter) We are here today to say thank you to you for all that you have done. Unlike Bob Singer, I don't have a story about elections or some wild story, but I was in the car with Senator Singer yesterday and he did tell me a story, which I would like to share with the public.

Joe Buckelew lived right off of Hope Road near Pine Park, near the golf course. And they were building a church across the street. And this church may not have been his religion, may not have been his church, but they were building a church and he noticed that the church did not have landscaping in front of the church. And on his own dime, had his own landscaper go over across the street and put the landscaping around that church. That tells you about the man. No politics, no fanfare, nothing, quietly took care of something that needed to get done job and took care of it.

Joe, on behalf of myself, Lakewood Township Committee, 100,000 residents of Lakewood, we say thank you to you. Thank you."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Thank you Deputy Mayor and Committeemen Lichtenstein for being here. Before I get to the next part, we're going to talk about former Freeholders that are here in a minute. But we have a couple of guests that will not be speaking, but friends of this Board and friends Joe Buckelew. We have in the back, former Ocean County Attorney, Ocean County Counsel, long-time friend, Franklin Berry. And we have our Ocean County Prosecutor, who has done a magnificent job for Ocean County, our Prosecutor, Joe Coronato.

Now, when we were putting together what we might do today, we came up with some ideas. There are five of us here who are basically, we're alive, right? By the way, I wanted to give an opportunity and Carl, I forgot, when all of our Freeholders made a quick comment at the beginning, I meant to call on our Administrator who is, of course, our former Ocean County Clerk and has been a long-time friend of Joe Buckelew. So our Administrator, Carl Block, would you like to say a couple of words please?"

ADMINISTRATOR CARL BLOCK: "I would like to say in about fifteen seconds because I was allotted time, Joe, I to repeat the thanks from myself and congratulations to you for the honor that you have received not only from a person who charged up here as a young man in the late '70's, early '80's, to run for Committee in Stafford Township. And I think (inaudible) and calm, sage advice — 'wait, your turn will come' and it did. And through the years, from being Mayor to Clerk to even Administrator, you have always been great counsel to myself and in those positions; I have observed you giving great counsel to others.

But I think your greatest attribute, of all the things you've done both in your private success, is inject into the political process, into those you have mentored, the things that I know Freeholder Bartlett mentioned before. 'Good government is good politics.' I think we stray too much these days into the politics being a game unto itself in trying to outdo each other and even worse on the national scene. When you always said, 'Keep it basic.' 'Good government is good politics.' And 'always do the right thing'. 'You can hear people's ideas, you can be lobbied by people you know or don't know, but in the end it's your vote, it's your name, you do what you think is right.' If we all listened to that, all elected officials, and I mean inclusively not just here in Ocean County. I think the country and everyone else would be better off. And I thank you for being that teacher. I guess that is the greatest attribute I think you brought was to teach us to do the right thing. Congratulations on the honor that has been bestowed upon you."

JOE BUCKELEW: "Thank you Carl."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Now, a little interesting history, as was mentioned earlier, approximately 200- it's like 197, so nearly 200 – individuals have been Freeholders since 1850 here in Ocean County. To the best of our knowledge, the five of us are still alive, right?"

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "I think so."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "And it depends on the day, right? How we feel. But we believe, to the best of our knowledge, there are eight living former Freeholders. That list, of course, includes Joe Buckelew, former Freeholder Paul Brush, former Freeholder Hazel Gluck, former Freeholder George Hoffman, former Freeholder Bob Gasser and former Freeholder Damien Murray. And we have two living Freeholders here today which we will get to in a moment

For the record, it's important, we invited all the Republicans and the Democrats to attend this meeting because we all work for the people here in Ocean County. We invited them all. And those that are with us today, we're going to introduce in a minute and ask them to say a couple words. And we asked those who could not attend if they would like to send a little message for Joe, and we have two. One from and I'll read it and read the name last."

'Dear Joe, Congratulations on your induction into the New Jersey Hall of Fame. It is a well-deserved honor for all that you have done. Your years of service are to be highly regarded. We are very honored for you and wish you to keep up the good work. I am so proud of you and offer my heartiest congratulations. Your friend, Warren Wolf.'

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "And we have, this comes from, again we'll read the name last."

'Dear Joe, When I was first elected to the Ocean County Board of Chosen Freeholders at the tender age of 31, I went to Joe Buckelew seeking his advice. Joe told me, "Kid, just do the right thing." I followed that advice in my personal life, but apparently not in my political life. Had I followed Joe's counsel, I would be sitting next to John Bartlett as the Freeholder with the second longest tenure in the State of New Jersey. Joe has been a friend, mentor and an inspiration to me and countless others over the years. While it is certainly an honor to be selected for the New Jersey Hall of Fame, Joe made the Murray Family Hall of Fame more than 35 years ago. Patty and I send our sincere best wishes to Ocean County's most deserving Freeholder. Former Freeholder Damien Murray.'

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Alright, and with that, we are so very happy to have two former Freeholders with us today and we'll go backwards in terms of how long they've been retired, if you will. So we will start with his Honor, Judge Mark Troncone, former Ocean County Freeholder."

JUDGE MARK TRUNCONE: "Thank you, Mr. Director. Thank you Freeholders. Ginny, John, Joe, my former colleagues, Jack. I want to thank you for the gracious invitation to a member of the loyal opposition. Well, I should say, a former member of the loyal opposition, because as you know, once you become a Superior Court Judge you become a political unit. (laughter) So I don't have opinions about anything anymore. But I do have an opinion about

Joe Buckelew.

I want to tell a story that I don't know if many people know about. But, in 1989, I was elected with Paul Brush and I think I was the youngest Freeholder. I was told that. A year younger than Damian. And I was also three years later the youngest ex-Freeholder. (laughter) Thanks to Jack and to Jim.

But anyway, we celebrated that night as you can imagine. And I woke up the next morning a little bleary-eyed and I went into my law office and I walked in the door and who was sitting in my waiting room? Joe Buckelew. I don't know if you remember this, Joe.

Well, you could have knocked me over with a feather. I couldn't believe it. So I invited him into my office and he said, 'Congratulations. You won fair and square. But now politics are over. We have to serve the people.' And he said, 'Anything I can do for you, all you have to do is pick up the phone and I'll be happy to help.' And I think that goes to show the graciousness of this man, the wisdom of this man, and certainly the honor that was bestowed upon you by the Hall of Fame was well deserved. Joe, congratulations!"

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "And don't any of you elected officials or family or anyone or the Rabbi, anyone, all of our kind of our political family here – both sides – don't leave. Don't bail out on us. At the end of this, we're going to have a big group picture up front and we're going to hang that next to what we're going to unveil in a minute. It will have everyone's name on it so that a hundred years from now they say, 'Who was that old bald guy there?' Right? And at least we'll have our names on it, okay? So please, we want everybody stay. Brian back there and all our elected officials, Franklin, and so forth and everybody who is part of this program. And with that, we would like to introduce a very special friend and our very near colleague. He's been gone a couple years and did a great job and is a great friend, our former Freeholder Jim Lacey. Freeholder."

FORMER FREEHOLDER JAMES F. LACEY: "Thank you Mr. Director. I appreciate it. Joe, and I don't want to put my back to the Board – it's a different perspective from out here, I will tell you. After twenty-four years, it's odd. Joe, congratulations to you and to your family.

I know that New Jersey Hall of Fame, it was for business, it was for philanthropy, but as I listen to everyone here today and because of my 36 years of first coming to office, and I did know whom you were 36 years ago, that it's the same thing being said. And I keep finding in my mind that it was your advice. It was always appropriate, measured and good, and I know that we all listened to it. I listened to it. And I know a lot of other people did that we don't even know who they are and that's great. I often say to your family, 'Emulate your father because if more people did that, we would be having a better world to live in today.' I can only say thank you Joe and congratulations to you. It's been great knowing you and it was a great run that I had. And I don't mean to get personal about it, but it's what you have to do because it was just personal with you with the way you do things and it meant a lot to me. And I know it did to them. And when they say it, I kept thinking 'yes, exactly'. Because I was here and I know. I know how they feel and we would talk amongst ourselves over the years.

And Ginny's doing a great job. They are just a great bunch of people to work with and the courthouse is always important. And there's nothing like County politics. It's just something about it. I do miss it. I miss the people. But I don't miss the reporting. But, congratulations again to you Joe."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Freeholder, it's great to have you back. We invited also the Chairman of the Democratic Organization in Ocean County, Wyatt Earp. He sends his regards. He is out of state. I believe in Harrisburg. Is that right Mr. Chairman?"

CHAIRMAN, OCGOP, GEORGE GILMORE: "That's right."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "And with that, we would like to introduce the individual who kind of inherited your leadership and has done a fantastic job filling your shoes, Joe. And a great friend of yours and someone I know you spent a lot of time and effort in preparing our County Chairman George Gilmore. Chairman."

CHAIRMAN, OCGOP, GEORGE GILMORE: "Mr. Freeholder Director, Freeholders. It's kind of tough getting up towards the end because everything you want to say about Joe has already been said. But there are a few things I'd like to say.

Number one, it is rare that an individual is respected not only by the people in his own party, but the people from the opposite party. You can go anywhere in this state, and you believe me I have to as County Chair, and you bring up Joe Buckelew's name, no matter what party the person is, there is a smile on their face and they tell you a story about what a great individual he is. When you listen all the comments made by our Freeholders and other individuals about how he touched their life, about how he formed the basis for their understanding of what you're supposed to do in politics, it's a tribute Joe. You've always said, 'Do the right thing. That good government is good politics.' Unfortunately, that isn't the case across this nation. Both political parties should take note of you and the standards that you set for this organization.

I know I wouldn't be standing here today if it wasn't for you. You took me under your wing. You taught me everything you could to make me be in a position that I could continue the tradition you set. You've created the greatest public organization in the State of New Jersey, bar none, and it's because of the way you did it. You tried to find good people that had the right intent, the right purpose to serve in government and that ends up being good government, which means good politics.

But, I do have one story to talk about because no matter what you do, you always do it for the benefit of the people you represent. Back in the early 1990's...every 10 years we have to redraw the Legislative Districts of this state. Five Republicans are appointed. Five Democrats are appointed. If they can't reach an agreement within thirty-day on the Districts, then an eleventh member is appointed by the Supreme Court. Of course, the 10 members have never reached agreement on the Districts so you always have the eleventh member. And when you get that eleventh member, all the sudden they want to put you away from the crap. And there is a place called Scanticon (Hotel) in Princeton and the entire delegation had to go there with the eleventh member. And then you negotiate back and forth. You're drawing maps. You're trying to negotiate. You try to put your political party in the best position. Republicans are doing it, Democrats are doing it. The eleventh member is there to prod both sides and try to get them to a point that they can reach agreement if possible, but that also never happens.

Well, one day Joe Buckelew was walking down the hallway as we're in a break, Senator John Lynch who was the Chair of the Democratic Caucus calls us. He says, 'Joe, come on over here. Come on in the room. I want to show you something.' He has this big map on the wall. North of the Raritan River – Democrat Districts. South of the river says just this phrase, 'Buckelew Country'! (laughter) So Joe could draw those Districts any way he wanted to as long as he voted with the Democrats. But true to his word and true to his obligations, he said, 'No I can't do that. We're here to do a purpose. We're here to draw Districts that are fair to both political parties.' And he refused and that's a tribute to him because he easily could have said sure I'll vote for your north Jersey Districts and I'll take out my pen and I'll draw the Districts I want. That wasn't the case.

Joe, it is truly an honor, and I mean it, an honor to be your friend. You've meant so much to me, to this organization, but more importantly to the people of Ocean County and to the people in the State of New Jersey, which you served in various capacities. So thank you very much. And we did have a little picture here drawn of you with the State of New Jersey with 'North Jersey' up top and 'Buckelew Country' below." (laughter)

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Is that yours Sheriff? No. It's separate. Okay, with that, thank you Mr. Chairman, very wonderful remarks. We would like to recognize quickly Joe Buckelew's family who are here. His son, Kevin Buckelew and wife, Barbara. And Joe's son Brian Buckelew, his wife Lori and their son Jake. Joe, how is your grandson so tall?"

JOSEPH BUCKELEW: "I fed him vitamins." (laughter)

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "And also a very special guest and we appreciate all her help in coordinating this with the Buckelew family, Carol Mack, who is a business partner with Joe a long time at Connor, Strong and Buckelew. Carol.

Okay now with that, we would like to invite if he can hold up and say a few words, our guest of honor, our great friend and mentor, former Freeholder Joe Buckelew. Joe."

JOSEPH BUCKELEW: "Thank you very much, Freeholders particularly, for this wonderful tribute to me. I don't know whether I'm going to be able to get through it or not. Jack started me, but it's been tough all the way along, tears are in my eyes. So many memories have come back to me over the years with what you're talking about. I want to tell you, my time being involved as a Freeholder was a great time in my life. I enjoyed every bit of it. I think we did a lot of good things here. They didn't point out the things that they've accomplished over the years — the first county college in the State of New Jersey was built here and it's a beautiful tribute, the things we've done with the environment and the amount of property that has been set aside. John Bartlett has been spearheading that. Jim Mancini did a great job with our libraries. One thing after another. I could go on for an hour and a half of what this Board has done and accomplished for the people of Ocean County.

But I just want to say that starting it off with each one of these guys...Jack, you didn't have it exactly right. I didn't tell you I had another guy."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "It was close enough."

JOSEPH BUCKELEW: "I said the process. You came along pretty well and you were behind the eight-ball and I told you what you had to do and you went out and did it and you fooled us all and you became a great Freeholder."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Nobody would have laughed if I said that."

JOSEPH BUCKELEW: "And Joe Vicari, and I know you have to be careful what you say anymore, but I refer to him as the 'Italian Stallion'. You've always been a great go-getter and a hard-working guy. And, of course, you know the Director started out working with the Legislators, with Len Connors and Chris and Jeff. You got some local experience as well, but you got great experience in that office and you came out and he is the most articulate guy you could find. He can express himself. He's a great historian. He's a great American. His son serves in the military.

And, incidentally, when you talked about me that you missed when I was in the service. My brother left home during World War II at 17 years old and he was through several battles. And the last one he was at Bastogne and he was wounded twice and he got a Bronze Star. We didn't see him for four years. I went in the Army. I was a Military Policeman. I was stationed in Virginia and then in Maryland and I worked nine days straight and got three days off and I'd drive home. I had my car. And every time I came in the house he said, 'Here comes the "Turnpike Warrior"! (laughter) He was the warrior in the family! But, I did serve.

And John Bartlett, I can still remember the night I was at the Captain's Inn when you and Peg were there and we were discussing things. And Ben Mabie was involved a little bit, as you recall and he had certain conditions. We followed those conditions, but all you can say about John Bartlett is that it has been just an outstanding addition to this Board. He's done a great job for the people of Ocean County and he's a great person besides.

And this young lady over here, she did work and I was in 1800's I think you said. (laughter) No. Your birthday is... she's about two or three years younger than I am. No! A lot younger than I am... But, she did campaign for me and it was a lot of fun and we were elected there and I became the Mayor of Lakewood. It was back in the '60's. '67 when I was the Mayor. I got elected in '63 and I think I was Director of the Board in 1975. All those things and these memories that you brought up, I appreciate it. And you mentioned, you know, Franklin Berry, he swore me in and I had the picture in my office of him holding the Bible.

And some of the things you talked about, what I tried to convey to everybody that I was involved with, both locally and on the state level and on the Freeholder Board, is that you get up every day and you try to help somebody. I don't care who it is. There are five Freeholders right now and we have close to 600,000 people living in Ocean County. You can do things that those other people can't do. And when they come to you for assistance, I don't care what it is whether it's a streetlight or a pothole or getting their child in the school or getting a job, whatever the case may be, Democrat or Republican. We know we've always said that. Or Independent, it doesn't make any difference who it is. When you get elected, the day after you get elected you start to represent all the people. And if you get up every day and think about trying to help people, you'll stay in office as long as you want.

I appreciate this great honor. I appreciate the fact that I was elected to the Hall of Fame. But today was a special day and I really appreciate everything you've done. Thank you very much everyone."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Now, our Sheriff has a very special presentation to Joe Buckelew. Mr. Sheriff."

SHERIFF MICHAEL MASTRONARDY: "Thank you Director. Well, it's a pleasure to see you here again and I know, over the years, I as (Toms River) Chief of Police would have to come and get counsel from him and he's been very beneficial. As Sheriff, thank God, I haven't had to do so much because I'm working very good with the Freeholders here. How's that? So I took your advice. (laughter)

But anyhow, to me you're a saint and I think they said it with trust and respect and really, the key word is 'statesman'. And certainly, for you and your family, I know that you always look out to take care of the young people, the people that are coming up. And our Chairman now says the same thing. That we have to start developing people.

And we are fortunate in this county with the Vo-Tech School and we have some talented people going to that. Today, I am going to bring up Daimon Santa Maria. This is a product of our school Vo-Tech School who has been hired by Sheriff Polhemus and continues in our employment at the Sheriff's Office. He's our composite drawer. So usually, he draws people that suspects, but today we have a drawing for you. Today, he would like to make a presentation and I think that you can take solace in the fact that he came up through the Vo-Tech School, if you'll join us please. He came up through the Vo-Tech School and he does an excellent job."

DAIMON SANTA MARIA: "It's nice to meet you Mr. Buckelew."

JOSEPH BUCKELEW: "Thank you and you as well. I'm taking up drawing myself." (laughter)

DAIMON SANTA MARIA: "Okay. I'll send you a picture of my face."

JOSEPH BUCKELEW: "Thank you very much."

DAIMON SANTA MARIA: "You're very welcome."

JOSEPH BUCKELEW: "Thank you Sheriff."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Joe, that doesn't say 'dead or alive' so you're okay."

JOSEPH BUCKELEW: "It's got a number on it though." (laughter)

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Joe, one more. If I could get all the Freeholders over here by this plaque. This golden, 24-karat gold...we want to unveil this.

As we said, this is the only document in the history of the County signed by all the current Freeholders and the Constitutional Officers. Could we also have our Constitutional Officers up here too?

This will remain hanging here in perpetuity. Here we go."

JOSEPH BUCKELEW: "Beautiful! Thank you very much."

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Now, if we could have the whole group that we've invited and the family. We want to get a big group picture. We're going to put it here in perpetuity."

A picture is taken of Mr. Joseph Buckelew and the whole group of dignitaries before most of the crowd departs.

DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Okay, we will now restart this meeting and we have our full business agenda to go. Again,

we will now start with our regular agenda. Clerk of the Board?"

CLERK VASIL: "Thank you Freeholder."

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE REPLACEMENT OF ZEBB'S BRIDGE STRUCTURE NO. 1505-007, ON PINEWALD KESWICK ROAD (C.R. 530), LOCATED IN THE TOWNSHIP OF BERKELEY, IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND APPROPRIATING \$1,500,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,425,000 IN BONDS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN TO FINANCE THE SAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING) AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. There is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the County of Ocean as general improvements, the replacement of Zebb's Bridge Structure No. 1505-007, on Pinewald Keswick Road (C.R. 530), located in the Township of Berkeley, in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, in accordance with plans and specifications on file in the Ocean County Engineering Department, including all else necessary therefor and incidental thereto.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared that the improvements or purposes, the estimated cost of the improvements and appropriation therefor, down payment, and estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes authorized are as follows:

SECTION 3. There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$1,500,000, including the sum of \$75,000 as the down payment, for the improvements or purposes described in Section 1 hereof as required by the Local Bond Law. The down payment has been made available by virtue of provision in the Capital Improvement Fund of the County of Ocean in one or more previously adopted budgets.

SECTION 4. There is hereby authorized the issuance of negotiable bonds in an aggregate principal amount of \$1,425,000 to finance part of the cost of the purposes stated in Section 1 hereof. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding the limit authorized by law, and the maturities, method of sale and other details thereof shall be determined by subsequent resolutions to be adopted in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 5. In order to temporarily finance the purposes provided for in Section 1 hereof, there is hereby authorized the issuance of bond anticipation notes of said County in an aggregate principal amount of

\$1,425,000. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by June 6, 2018

the County Comptroller; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond

anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and shall be in such form as may be determined by the

County Comptroller. The County Comptroller shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued

pursuant to this Ordinance, and the County Comptroller's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence

as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the

provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8.1. The County Comptroller is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes

from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of

payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The County

Comptroller is directed to report in writing to the Board of Chosen Freeholders at the meeting next succeeding

the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this Ordinance is made. Such report must include

the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and

the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 6. The County reasonably expects to commence acquisition and/or construction of the

improvements described in Section 1 hereof, and to advance all or a portion of the costs in respect thereof,

prior to the issuance of bonds or notes hereunder. To the extent such costs are advanced, the County further

reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this

bond ordinance, in an aggregate amount not to exceed the amount of bonds or notes authorized in Section 2

hereof. This bond ordinance is intended to be a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation

Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 7. Any additional grant monies received for the purposes described in Section 1 hereof,

shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the obligations

issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be

reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

SECTION 8. The amount of the proceeds of the obligations authorized by this Ordinance which

may be used for the payment of interest on such obligations, architects' fees, accounting, engineering and

inspection costs, legal expenses, and other items as provided in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 shall not exceed the sum of

\$250,000.

SECTION 9. The Capital Budget of the County of Ocean is hereby amended to conform with the

provisions of this Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. In the event of any such

inconsistency and amendment, the resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full

detail of the amended Capital Budget and Capital Program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local

Government Services is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders and is available there for

public inspection.

SECTION 10. It is hereby found, determined and declared as follows:

Res-Pq:h.1-4

A. The improvements or purposes described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance are not current

expenses. They are improvements or purposes the County may lawfully undertake as general improvements,

and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property benefited thereby.

B. The average period of usefulness of the improvements for which the obligations authorized by

this Ordinance are to be issued is thirty (30) years.

C. The supplemental debt statement provided for in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-10 was duly filed in the

Office of the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders prior to the passage of this Ordinance on first reading,

and a complete executed duplicate of such supplemental debt statement has been filed in the office of the

Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of

New Jersey, and such supplemental debt statement shows that the gross debt of the County as defined in

N.J.S.A. 40A:2-43 is increased by this Ordinance by \$1,425,000 and the obligations authorized by this

Ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

SECTION 11. In the event the monies set forth above for any purpose is not necessary for said

purposes, then such monies shall be for the completion of any of the other purposes provided for in this

obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the County for the payment of the

obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ACQUISITION OF TITLE, RIGHTS-OF-WAY AND/OR EASEMENTS OF CERTAIN PARCELS OF LAND (OR PARTS THEREOF) FOR ROAD AND/OR BRIDGE IMPROVEMENTS ALONG COUNTY ROADS, ALL IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING \$2,000,000 **THEREFOR** AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,900,000 IN BONDS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN TO FINANCE THE SAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING) AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The following are hereby authorized to be undertaken by the County of Ocean as general improvements: the acquisition of title, rights-of-way and/or easements of certain parcels of land (or parts thereof) for road and/or bridge improvements along County roads, all in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, in accordance with plans and specifications on file in the Ocean County Engineering Department, including all else necessary therefor and incidental thereto.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared that the improvements or purposes, the estimated cost of the improvements and appropriation therefor, down payment and estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes authorized are as follows:

the County Comptroller; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond

anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and shall be in such form as may be determined by the

County Comptroller. The County Comptroller shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued

pursuant to this Ordinance, and the County Comptroller's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence

as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ACQUISITION OF THE MANCHESTER PARK SITE, PERMITTING, DESIGN AND DEVELOPMENT, LOCATED IN MANCHESTER TOWNSHIP, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND APPROPRIATING \$5,000,000 THEREFOR, AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$4,750,000 IN BONDS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN TO FINANCE THE SAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING) AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The following is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the County of Ocean as general improvements, a project consisting of the acquisition of the Manchester Park site, permitting, design and development, located in Manchester Township, in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, including all else necessary therefor or incidental thereto.

SECTION 3. There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$5,000,000, including the sum of \$250,000 as the down payment, for the improvements or purposes described in Section 1 hereof as required by the Local Bond Law. The down payment has been made available by virtue of provision in the Capital Improvement Fund of the County of Ocean in one or more previously adopted budgets.

SECTION 4. There is hereby authorized the issuance of negotiable bonds in an aggregate principal amount of \$4,750,000 to finance part of the cost of the purposes stated in Section 1 hereof. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding the limit authorized by law, and the maturities, method of sale and other details thereof shall be determined by subsequent resolutions to be adopted in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 5. In order to temporarily finance the purposes provided for in Section 1 hereof, there is hereby authorized the issuance of bond anticipation notes of said County in an aggregate principal amount of \$4,750,000. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the County Comptroller; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond anticipation notes shall be an interest at such rate or rates and shall be in such form as may be determined by the

County Comptroller. The County Comptroller shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued

pursuant to this Ordinance, and the County Comptroller's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence

as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the

provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8.1. The County Comptroller is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes

from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of

payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The County

Comptroller is directed to report in writing to the Board of Chosen Freeholders at the meeting next succeeding

the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this Ordinance is made. Such report must include

the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and

SECTION 6. The County reasonably expects to commence acquisition and/or construction of the

reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this

bond ordinance, in an aggregate amount not to exceed the amount of bonds or notes authorized in Section 2

hereof. This bond ordinance is intended to be a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation

Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 7. Any grant monies received for the purposes described in Section 1 hereof, shall be

applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the obligations issued

pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be

reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

SECTION 8. The amount of the proceeds of the obligations authorized by this Ordinance which

A. The improvements or purposes described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance are not current

B. The average period of usefulness of the improvements for which the obligations authorized by

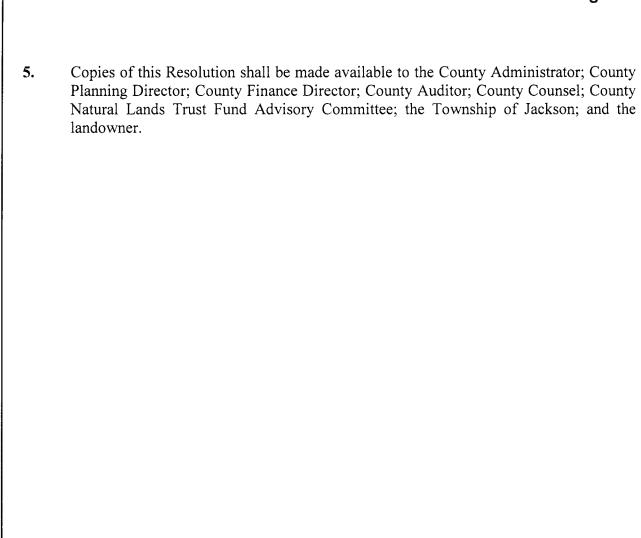

- The fees to be collected from the owner/operator of any sanitary 1 Landfill facility within Ocean County are as follows:
 - a. \$0.40 per ton of solid waste accepted for disposal at said facility.
 - b. In the event that any solid waste is measured, upon acceptance for disposal by other than per ton, the fee shall be assessed on the equivalents utilized pursuant to the Sanitary Landfill Closure and Contingency Funds Act, P.L. 1981, c. 306 and the Recycling Act, P.L. 1981, c. 278.
 - c. Fees shall be assessed and collected by the Ocean County Health Department each month in a manner provided for in this schedule.

- d. Except as otherwise provided for herein, the owner or operator of every landfill facility shall submit to the Ocean County Health Department on or before the 20th day of each month, a fee equal to \$0.40 per ton of solid waste accepted for disposal during the preceding month, together with a completed copy of Department Form NO. SFA-001, which is submitted for that month to the Department in accordance with the escrow account reporting requirements pursuant to the Sanitary Landfill Facility Closure and Contingency Fund Act, P.L. 1981, c.306.
- Subject to the approval of the Department, a higher fee may be 2. assessed in the event that the Ocean County Health Department documents the need for a greater amount in the succeeding year's program.
- 3. The fees and funds provided for in this Resolution shall be utilized exclusively to fund County solid waste monitoring and enforcement activities as identified in the Ocean County Health Department's work program.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Ocean County Board of Chosen Freeholders shall forward certified copies of this Resolution to the Ocean County Board of Health; Acting Commissioner Catherine R. ORDINANCE NO. 2018-06

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS, OCEAN COUNTY, NEW JERSEY AMENDING CHAPTER 19 ENTITLED "STREETS & SIDEWALKS" AS IT PERTAINS TO THE COMMERCIAL USE OF PUBLIC STREET ENDS

THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 19 of the Borough Code of the Borough of Harvey Cedars entitled "Streets and Sidewalks" is hereby amended and supplemented so as to add a new Section 19-2 entitled "Commercial Use of Public Street Ends", which shall read as follows:

19-2 COMMERCIAL USE OF PUBLIC STREET ENDS.

19-2.1 Definition. As used in this section "street end" shall mean the end of any road, highway, public way, public alley, easement or other right of way that is directly adjacent to bay waters.

19-2.2 Permitted Use. From October 15th through May 14th commercial businesses shall be permitted to use any public street end for loading and unloading materials under the following conditions:

- 1. Loading and unloading shall be between 9:00AM to 5:00PM
- 2. No loading or unloading on weekends and holidays
- 3. Idling of vehicles and equipment are prohibited
- 4. Mooring to public property is prohibited
- No overnight dockage

19-2.3 Prohibited Use. From May 15th through October 14th commercial businesses are prohibited from using any public street end for loading and unloading purposes.

19-2.4 Exceptions. In emergency situations, the Chief of Police or his designee may grant approval to use a street end during prohibited times. In the case of any other non-emergency, the matter shall be referred to the Governing Body who may allow temporary use for any civic purpose with concurrence of the police department concerning any possible safety issues. Allowed road openings shall be exempt from this provision.

19-2.5 Violations. Any person, corporation or business entity that violates or fails to comply with this section or any of the rules and regulations promulgated hereunder shall, upon conviction thereof, be punishable by a minimum fine of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for the first offense. Each day for which a violation of this section occurs after the first offense shall be considered a separate offense. Any subsequent offense conviction shall be punishable by a minimum fine of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00).

Section 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby

Section 3. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and publication as required by law and upon the approval of the County of Ocean as it applies to any effected Ocean County street end in the Borough.
