DIRECTOR KELLY: "Our next item of business will be the Public Hearing on the 2016 Ocean County Budget and accompanying resolutions. Two weeks ago we introduced the 2016 County Budget and have since followed the regulations and statutes to have that properly advertised in the newspapers and the like. There will be a short presentation by Freeholder Bartlett. We'll take any comments from the Board of Freeholders and then Clerk of the Board will present the accompanying resolutions."

DEPUTY CLERK WIOLAND: "Mr. Director, I need to read it first."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "We can take the comments first according to Betty. I met with her today. John can present it. The Freeholders can then do what they have to and then you can read that and then we'll have the Public Hearing. That works right? That was according to.....I met this morning with the Clerk of the Board on that. Okay."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "This is just an informal explanation and not actually a presentation, but an explanation of the 2016 County Budget that will be open for Public Hearing in just a few moments. The 2016 Ocean County Budget is Introduced Budget at \$399.9 million, a decrease of \$13 million from last year. However, it was very difficult to compare last year's Budget to this year's Budget and in fact the last couple of years' Budgets because we are still reflecting Superstorm Sandy costs and FEMA reimbursements, all of which must run through the Budget. And please remember that even at a 90% FEMA reimbursement, that we are certainly grateful for, that still leaves local taxpayers to be responsible for their ten percent which in the case of the County and our municipalities amounts to millions of tax dollars - costs that are reflected throughout the budget.

Last year was the final year of FEMA's Essential Services Grants which amounted to \$7 million which were very helpful in tiding the County and some municipalities over through the tremendous loss of ratables. Now, as we knew, 2015 was the last year that those grants were available. We made a provision during the year for how we would handle that loss in 2016 without an undue burden on the County's taxpayers. We always attempt to plan ahead because as Freeholder Vicari has reminded me year after year, there are going to be no surprises. And even though we knew we were going to lose \$7 million, we prepared for it in advance.

The County tax rate under this Budget will increase ever so slightly by 3/10 of one cent, from 35 cents per hundred dollars of equalized value in 2015 to 35.3 cents in 2016. Now what that means to a homeowner is approximately \$3.00 per year for every \$100,000.00 of equalized value. So if you have a house valued at about \$330,000.00 this

Budget would cost you an extra \$10.00 per year.

The tax base has grown somewhat this year by \$2 billion from last year. That is from \$92.5 (billion) last year to \$94.5 (billion) this year, much of which is the result of new construction. This new construction or this growth in the tax base brings into the County about \$7 million, roughly the loss in revenue from the lapse of Federal Emergency Tax Stabilization Aide. So our growth, in a sense, paid for that loss. With a 3/10 of one cent increase, again, less than 1%, brings in about – the tax increase of 3/10 – brings in about \$2 million to pay for increases in operating expenses and debt service in the Budget. It is worth noting that the County is still off 14% in its tax ratable base from our level in 2009. But it's also worth noting that our tax rate this year, 2016, of 35.3 cents is less than the rate was twelve years ago when it was 36 cents. Again, we have aimed at stability, but obviously there are slight changes from year to year.

I think of particular note and of particular interest is what we've been able to do in 2015 through the admirable work of our County Comptroller, Julie Tarrant, with regard to the County Surplus. Now this is something that's very near and dear to my heart and has been as long as I have been a public official. We began the year 2015 with a surplus balance of \$36 million. We used about \$16 (million) in the Budget, with a remaining balance of \$20 (million). We began the year 2016 with \$43.5 million in surplus and we'll use \$16.5 (million), slightly more – another half million dollars in surplus – and that money is going to be evenly split between Ocean County College which will be its first increase in about 10 years, and the County's Vocational School.

But the important thing here to note and what makes me happiest is that beginning this year with a \$43 million surplus, we have finally as a Board hit that magic number for the rating agencies who suggest that a AAA Rated County have approximately 10% of its Budget available as surplus. This guarantees as much as anything in life can guarantee anything that the County will maintain its AAA Bond Rating in 2016, a goal that we have worked diligently for for the last 10 years.

As far as highlights of the Budget – there are 8 new positions in the Budget – all in law enforcement and all required and I'm sure that Freeholder Kelly will talk about this a little later on, all required because of State requirements with bail reform – that the County be open on Saturdays for bail purposes. This will require 5 new people in the Prosecutor's Office and 3 new Sheriff's Officers to man the doors that are coming in. Now, we are able to pay for these 8 new people as a result of, again, good management of our contracts and the way we have negotiated those contracts.

If I can explain very briefly, as people retire who are at the top of their pay scales, they are replaced by people at the bottom of their pay scales. So that creates a savings for the County and it is from those savings that we are able to pay for the 8 new people that we need to bring in, in order to comply with the new State regulations. This has been beneficial not only to the overall County Budget and its taxpayers, but to current employees – all of whose contracts have been honored for every year that this County has been in existence.

Two other things I think of note – of expenses that are often times outside of our control – one is Ocean County patients in State Mental Institutions. The State gave us this year, a 33% increase in that cost which was an increase of about \$1,200,000.00. Fortunately, on the other side, we were able to offset that increase with a decrease of our contributions to the Board of Social Services of slightly more than that amount because of enhanced Federal funding due to Obamacare and the extra work that the Board of Social Services has to do to qualify people for that. However, we are still looking at a \$22.6 million total cost that has been soaring in recent years and, in a sense, in the last 5 years it has increased by more than \$5 million. The Budget has no new programs and no other employees other than the 8 that I just listed.

In summation, I think there are three points that I'd like to make. Number one, the 2016 Budget practically ensures our AAA Bond Rating which will be of inestimable value if Atlantic City, a New Jersey municipality defaults on its General Obligation Bonds and sends a shock-wave through the New Jersey Municipal Bond Market. You cannot be sitting better than we are with a AAA Bond Rating when this earthquake, in a sense, which is on the horizon, if and when it hits New Jersey, we are standing in the best place we can be as a good solid New Jersey investment when other New Jersey municipal bonds are going to be suspect because of a potential default in Atlantic City – a disaster that should not be allowed to happen. But anyway, number two, the tax rate has changed, but minimally, because we recognize as a Board that tax dollars are not ours, but yours. We have a public job to do and we will do it. But each of us personally recognizes that it's your hard-earned money that we are handling. And lastly, there are many projects and facilities that should be addressed in this County. But, the County will continue to monitor a stock of increasingly out-of-date facilities and buildings until our tax base recovers to its 2009 tax base level of approximately \$110 billion from its \$94.5 (billion) now. We are still 14% off that mark, but we recognize that many of our facilities are rapidly growing in the fact that they are obsolete and we need to be looking at changes there. But, we also need to look at our ability to pay for those as things go on. We will balance those needs and those resources.

Mr. Director, I think that's a brief explanation of the Budget. I thank you for the time to give that."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Again, we all thank you for your hard work. Just one thing I wanted to point out so there wasn't any misunderstanding, you were talking about the surplus and talking about this year it will be evenly split between (the College and Vo-Tech).....you're talking about the overage of \$500,000.00 of the original surplus."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Yes, sir."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Not the overall surplus, just the extra. Just the additional surplus will be split evenly."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "No, not the whole surplus."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "I just didn't want any misunderstanding on that because sometimes when we talk all these figures you get misunderstandings."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Thank you. And I may have inadvertently misspoken with that, but I assure you, this hand would palsy if we were doing that! I would like to say that my father said when I was a kid.....some of you may remember Indian-head nickels......and dad used to say that I squeezed the nickel so hard the Indian ended up riding the buffalo. And that's still somewhat the case! And he probably would still say that."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "I would agree with him. You were talking about the Criminal Justice Reform and we do, just so you know, have today one of our resolutions in support of an Assembly Bill that would establish a County Government Criminal Justice Reform Administration Fund. Now, there's nowhere near enough money in that fund to 100% pay for this, but it would be a help to all 21 counties. All 21 counties would be eligible to apply for these fundings and we're ready to do that once this Bill is passed and signed into law, which would help. There is a major cost and the Sheriff is here today and he can tell you the cost of the Sheriff's Department, the Prosecutor's Department and everyone to come in full compliance with this new law. So we are constantly working on how to do that and we'll continue. I will take any other informal conversation from the Board before I have Chrissy read the resolutions and then we'll open to Public Hearing. So anyone who would like to speak can."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "I would just like to say. I would like to thank the professional staff, especially Freeholder John Bartlett for doing not only a good job, but an outstanding job. This is something that's not only short-term, but long-term as far as the future of Ocean County. And proof of this is that we said no surprises. But during the Superstorm that has taken place. You have to remember that there was \$100 million the County had to borrow. We borrowed it from ourselves. We took it from ourselves. So actually we saved a substantial amount of money. But it wasn't just taking the money from ourselves internally, it's the amount of time that saved. And the reaction to that really helped put Ocean County back on its feet again. It's still recovering. We have a long way to go, but that's sound government. Look at what is taking place in national politics today with almost a \$20 trillion debt. Look what is happening in the State of New Jersey. Look what is happening in many towns throughout the State of New Jersey such as Atlantic City. That has not happened, will not happen, as long as this Board of Freeholders has anything to say about it. It's a responsible type of a Budget.

And for the students that are here today, it's not only for your future, but for your children's future. And it goes to show that the debt service is very, very important to us. But at the same time with debt service, we provide vital core services to the residents of Ocean County, in a growing County. It's the second largest county in the state with land. So all those services with roads have to be taken care of and the infrastructure. And it's probably number six right now as far as population. In the summertime, our population doubles. We take care of the needs of anyone within the borders of the County of Ocean. So again, it's a very comprehensive Budget. I spoke to your teacher before and it's online. So if you want to look at it and invite any of the Freeholders there to your classroom, we'd be more than happy to explain to you. But I think the important thing is that, in my opinion, this is as transparent as possible to let you know exactly where your money goes, the taxpayers of Ocean County. We work for you. We work for the taxpayers of Ocean County and is the blueprint of what is going to take place for the next 12 months of 2016.

Ocean County is very transparent. It's very clear. It's very direct about what we are going to hire and which direction we are going in. And in conforms with all of the standards set up for us by the State of New Jersey. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. Mr. Deputy Director."

DEPUTY LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. I would like to also as Freeholder Vicari did, thank Freeholder Bartlett for his ongoing leadership with our fiscal management of the County and all of the members of the board for their efforts in their own individual areas of responsibility as well as all of our Directors out there and all of their staffs and our Administrator for working very hard to stay each and every year with our Budget.

As was indicated, this is a stable Budget. No surprises. I call it a sliver of a tax increase, 3/10 of one cent, so less than a penny. There are two kinds of caps which Julie is always trying to impress upon us. The 1977 budget cap and the new budget cap of 2%. We must use the 1977, right? The '77 budget cap because it is less than the 2% budget cap. But if we were allowed to use the 2% budget, we could raise another \$6 million in taxation. And we are much lower than than the generally accepted or the publicized 2% budget cap. So that tiny sliver of an increase is what we need to maintain our core services for seniors and veterans and the poor and the needy as well as our infrastructure and our County road system and all the responsibilities that we have to manage this County.

And one thing I would like to add on that Freeholder Director Kelly alluded to, is this state-mandated "Bail Reform". Now, just this year alone we are going to have to hire 8 new employees. Those are the only new employees that we are planning for, the only new employees. No new programs, but because of this State mandate we are required to hire eight additional employees and Freeholder Director Kelly was alluding to a Bill that is not a law. We hope it becomes a law that would provide some funding. But if a lot of people in this room, not the young people because they were too young at the time, but in, I believe, 1999 now - quite a while ago - the people of this State all of us voted for a Constitutional Amendment that said essentially 'State Mandate, State Pay'. So here is another.....you've heard that term, those of you involved in government for so long or voters have heard that 'State Mandated, State Pay'. It passed overwhelmingly. So here we have another State Mandate however well-intentioned and it provides no funding. So that's called trickle down and it's going to cost every single County in the State without any funding. So that is, again, an example of what the Legislature does. And someone will probably and I would encourage someone

to take this to the Council of Mandates which is a counsel appointed by the Governor that you take complaints to about mandates, unfunded mandates.

In any event, it's a great budget and thank you Freeholder Bartlett for your leadership in this and your continued leadership in our fiscal management. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you Freeholder. Freeholder Haines."

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "Thank you Mr. Director. I just also want to echo sentiment of Freeholder Vicari and Freeholder Bartlett and Freeholder Little with regards to thanking Julie and her staff as well as the Department Heads for staying within their budget and recognizing what we need to do here in Ocean County to maintain a low increase in the tax rate and also to be able to provide the services for the people of Ocean County to keep Ocean County the number one county that we are. We have the best library system, the best parks system and to keep our roads the way they are. And I just want to thank Freeholder, who I refer to always when I'm out speaking as the 'finance guru' of the Freeholder Board, who is Freeholder Bartlett for the hard work that he does to put in to make sure the county tax rate stays low and that we are able to provide the services. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you Freeholder. Okay Chris."

DEPUTY CLERK WIOLAND: "BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean that the budget hereinbefore set forth is hereby adopted and shall constitute an appropriation for the purposes stated of the sums therein set forth as appropriations, and authorization of the amount of \$333,794,824.00 dollars for the county to be raised by taxation and certification to the County Board of Taxation of the following summary of general revenues and appropriations.

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Do we get a motion on that before we open the Public Hearing?"

DEPUTY CLERK WIOLAND: "No. You open the Public Hearing first."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Then the Public Hearing on the 2016 Ocean County Budget is hereby opened. Would anyone like to approach and speak to the Board about the Budget? Gary."

GARY BLACK, JACKSON: "For years the polar opposite of this Budget. I remember in Jackson Township during the early part of this century, the people who were in power, they just kept borrowing and borrowing and borrowing into oblivion and eventually coming to an 18, actually it would have been a 22 cent per \$100 tax increase. It got whittled down to 18%. And I kept saying during that time that you should be building a surplus. You should not be borrowing like this. What happens when the building stops? What is going to happen? 'Mr. you don't know what your talking about.' And we got hit with a record tax increase. That's why I say polar opposite.

This is also why I say when the few times Joe and I ever disagree, he says, 'No surprises'. I said, 'This is the surprise.' Look at our State. Look at all over. When the economy started going down, after the storm of Sandy, how many towns you saved. Who knows where we'd be today. The town I work for, you had a new administration just

took over before it got its feet wet, it got speed drowned. Again, I grew up after seeing the impact of the Storm of '62 all the way through growing up. We were working on houses. I grew up in the plumbing trade. We were still working on houses destroyed in '62 in the '70's. So this cleanup....I mean growing up as a kid it's a hell of a thing to see as a child seeing houses off their foundation and all that. I remember with my father go around on his milk route at that time and seeing the houses devastated. So it was a whole different thing. This cleanup has been miraculous and you are to thank for a lot of it.

One thing you did mention today that the mentally insane in the State has been held and it's gone down 3%. Did they let out the State's report?"

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "No, it went up 33%."

GARY BLACK: "Oh okay. So State (inaudible). Okay that's what that line was for. Again, you guys, I said this a lot of times. I've said it to a lot of the newer people coming into government, that they should watch you because you are a model of what government should be. I don't say it, I don't work for the County, I work for a municipality, but I don't get anything from that. I say it simply because I mean it. And there's no leashes on me as I think you know by now. I've been coming here for like 20 years and regularly again and I say what I want and sometimes you win, sometimes it's happy. But again, also a lot of people have been saying that the tax has been going up. Actually, not exactly true, because I remember for the first decade or so I was coming here the rate went down every year. So really, and you're nowhere near where was when it started, when I got here. So this isn't really a tax increase. This is a slight reduction and a tax cut. I mean, really, think about what it was when we started out. So we're still nowhere near where it was because of good business and because of good financing and because of keeping the surplus.

Now every year you've heard the other candidates with some other party that I once was part of, but I'm much better now, thank you, come in and go, 'There's too much surplus. You're stealing the people's money.' Where would we be now if you didn't have that? Especially after the storm. What a lot of people don't realize, that surplus is not just in the bank and you're sitting on it. It also reduces the interest we pay. We're a growth community. So we do have to use bonding for upgrades and improvements as the town grows. We kept that so we can pay as we grow because we happen to do it a little faster than that. So that surplus saves us money and a lot of people don't realize that. And because you are one of the few towns that kept the proper surplus you have saved us money. That's how and why taxes went down almost every year for over a decade and really after one of the worst economic periods in history, a storm that pretty much washed away the eastern part of our County, we're still where we are today and not even up to what we were. And that can only be done because of you and I thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you Mr. Black. Would anyone else like to be heard on the Budget? Any of our students have any questions? No questions at all. Anyone else? Okay, I will then close the Public Hearing on the Budget."

On motion made by Freeholder Bartlett, seconded by Freeholder Vicari, the 2016 Ocean County Budget and accompanying resolutions were adopted on final reading.

J. RESOLUTIONS

DEPUTY CLERK WIOLAND: "We have Resolutions, J-1 through J-27."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Before we take the vote on that, I'd like to point out Resolution number 4 which I know that Freeholder Little wants to comment on and I believe, Freeholder Vicari and a Councilwoman from Berkeley would like to also present a statement? Okay. But, not thedidn't you get signatures on a petition?"

COUNCILWOMAN JUDY NOONAN, BERKELEY TOWNSHIP: "Yes, but I'm not......."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "You're going to just talk aboutyou know. Okay. Would you like to speak first on this?"

COUNCILWOMAN NOONAN: "I would like to know exactly what is in the resolution."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "We have a copy of that."

DEPUTY CLERK WIOLAND: "Director, which item?"

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Number 4, the Comcast resolution. Do you want me to read it into the record? Would that help you?"

COUNCILWOMAN NOONAN: "Yes, it would since it has something to do with what I want to say."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Okay. I'll read it."

COUNCILWOMAN NOONAN: "I appreciate it. Thank you."

Director Kelly reads Resolution J-4 in its entirety.

DIRECTOR KELLY: "That's the resolution that we have."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "Before Mrs. Noonan comes up to the microphone, I just want to add one more thing to it that I spoke to Councilwoman Noonan about. This goes back to when the late Frank Lautenberg was a United States Senator and the issue was when I spoke to many residents in the club house, that it's the service and the cost of Comcast. That is the thing I want to talk about now in the petition.

For many years, Comcast has not been serving public interests. The lobbies have a lot of power which we spoke about before. And the residents of basically in Berkeley Township and Manchester object to the service and the cost factor of Comcast. So we will turn it over now to Mrs. Noonan."

COUNCILWOMAN NOONAN: "Well, I didn't know if you wanted me to wait to the end because of what I have to say. I appreciate and I think I really commend you at least going up on the Yankee games, but there's a lot more to this issue. Either you want me to address it now or I can wait until the end of the meeting."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "No, you can address it now before we vote on the resolution."

COUNCILWOMAN NOONAN: "Well I want the resolution and I would like to take it. As you know, we have a petition. I'll try to make it fast. We had like a thousand people in Berkeley. In Berkeley we have Comcast. My

problem is I will be in Federal Court on the 18th (April) facing Comcast because we filed a lawsuit against Comcast. Why? We have no competition here. And in my investigation, which I find very disheartening and it goes all the way up to the top to the Board of Utilities, Optima has an agreement not to allow it to come in here for the competition. And I find that is really not right because there is no competition in here. I talked to Optima directly. They have an agreement through the Board of Utilities. I think it's very unfair. Our pension, our Social Security does not go up. Comcast keeps going up and there is no competition. And it's not just the senior communities. I have another side of Bayville. People in other parts of the town. Somebody all the way out by the Delaware (wanting to know) can we get in on this lawsuit? People from Monmouth County. I find that this is a monopoly and very unfair that we cannot have competition because Optima has an agreement with Comcast not to come in here. Do you think that's fair?

I would like to know that the Freeholders will stand by us because I'm going into court with that, in Federal Court. And we'll probably lose. We want to have an agreement with Comcast who didn't even have the decency to listen to something that would have worked out for everybody. But we're little nobodies. But we have to pay them which pays the town for the franchise. But who really pays that in the end? We do.

Their service is terrible. We're going to have to pay for this increase whether you know it or not. And when you call for help, it's out of the country. I met with them. I have an attorney and I want to commend the Freeholders. I always think you do a great job. And I want to commend Freeholder Joe Vicari, who listened to me and has supported me on this. Because I think this is a very serious thing. I think that it's a monopoly and I think it's corrupt. And I really don't know what we can do, but I would like to know that you stand with your constituents on this. And I want to applaud you. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Okay, I will just agree with you on the fact that their service is terrible. I don't know how many times I'm watching a TV show that in the middle of the show it freezes. And you have to wait for it to start up and just in the middle of watching whatever you're watching, the whole picture freezes and you miss that whole segment whether it's a ball game or it's a news cast or a mystery show. Whatever it might be and that's only one of the things that is horrible about this new service."

COUNCILWOMAN NOONAN: "I had to meet with a Philadelphia attorney who didn't give two hoots about Ocean County. And we came up with a nice workable thing. We got our results today. We have to go face the court. They want to go into litigation. They know if we lose we have to pay. So I'm going up there, but what really bothers me is that I want to see the agreement for Optima not to come into Berkeley Township. They are in South Seaside Park. They're all over. The man told me directly. I got a number. I called him and he wanted to know where I got the number from. I'm not going to tell him. But he told me the truth. And I find that, to me it's like the bottom."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "I agree."

 $COUNCILWOMAN\ NOONAN:\ "It goes all the way up to the Board of Utilities.\ But\ I want to thank you for the time and thank you for the encouragement."$

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. Freeholder Little, do you want talk about this or do you want to focus in on the YES Network?"

DEPUTY LITTLE: "After Councilwoman Noonan's presentation I guess the Yankees are part of this issue, but it's a much larger issue."

COUNCILWOMAN NOONAN: "It is to those who watch. It's what they like."

DEPUTY LITTLE: "And not only this. I mean you look at, you talk about service number one, the cable system is loaded with hundreds and hundreds of channels. A lot of them are simply trash that nobody watches. They're worthless channels. On and on and now we have the YES Network and, of course, Comcast is saying, 'Well it's the most expensive regional sports network.' And I don't doubt that. It probably is. However, more people watch it than any other network so that's why it's expensive. It's supply and demand. And in, and Eric will notice, in the Asbury Park Press over the weekend they had a column that said Comcast is paying \$5.36 a month per subscriber the YES Network. So this argument is about \$5.36. And what should be done is if they want to, like all the other sports networks, put it on a la carte. I have Big-10 Network because I'm a Penn State fan. There are others. CBS has this. You buy these in a package and then if I want to pay \$5.36 or \$10, whatever the price is, then someone that doesn't want to watch the Yankees, that's fine. They don't have to pay for it. But they have a la carte programs for all. They have the technology, And I don't have one. Not one like HBO or anything of those. Not one channel except I do buy the Sports Package which is......you have to, right Freeholder Kelly?

I don't know how much we pay for it. I forget."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Too much!"

DEPUTY LITTLE: "But, you buy it, so put it on the Sports Package. Of course money is involved in it and YES Network wants the \$5.36. They have 900,000, almost a million, round it off as a million. Comcast has a million subscribers. Well they want that times \$5.36, where if you had to pay for it maybe it would be 200,000. So YES network that's where we are. But, the real losers in this are the people who are not only sports fans, but especially and we keep saying it, but especially a lot of homebound people, a lot of senior citizen citizens -it becomes a part of their life. It becomes a part of their quality of life. They watch the games. I know there is one Freeholder here on this Board who has a family member that watches every single game. It becomes part - and he is very elderly, okay - and I do too. I'm not very elderly quite yet, but I watch every game if I'm home. It's on. Freeholder Kelly

does. We don't sit there and stare at it, but it's on and we may be doing other things and reading paperwork or whatever we have. But, it becomes a part of the quality of your life.

So now we become the victims of a war between the largest cable company, I believe, in the United States and the most watched the regional sports network. And everybody's left out in the cold except the lawyers that are fighting this out all for a lot of money. And the YES network, in all fairness, they're making a lot of money off of this, but so is Comcast. And we have not had them YES Network since November. This is not just......I mean they replay Yankee games all winter and they have sports talk on there."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "They have a lot of programs."

DEPUTY LITTLE: "A lot of programs, yes. So raise your hand if your Comcast bill went down \$5.36 since November. So Comcast has been pocketing the \$5.36 for almost 6 months or 6 months and I don't know exactly dates, but it's roughly 6 months. So they have been pocketing the \$5.36 and they have not been paying the YES network, but in the meantime 900,000 subscribers have been paying for it. So, you know, it is unfair to everyone all because of corporate greed and all the interest of, and Judy's right. It's essentially a monopoly because it's too expensive to start a new system.

And the United States Congress deregulated it and, you know, those are the laws. Just like they deregulated.......a lot of us in here grew up with Bell Telephone and we had good service, but they deregulated everything. They deregulated the airlines. Everything has changed. So in any event, that's what this resolution does. At least we talk about this specific issue and you certainly do have a larger issue Councilwoman and we're certainly empathetic for you and we hope you prevail Federal Court.

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "If nothing else, this brings the public to the attention of this. As far as the antitrust law that you mentioned, competition is very good and this would not have happened. And as everyone mentioned there are numerous foreign languages and people that are paying for it. They don't even look at it or understand it or whatever the case may be. When Freeholder Little called me the other day we were talking about it and he called the service number. It was in a foreign country. You can't understand the people. And I spoke to Steve Scaturro from Consumer Affairs and we have a service call number and they should identify if it's in the United States, which we assume that it's in a foreign country, then they should identify because it is not only very difficult to understand them, but they don't understand basically what you're talking about and you spend a lot of time with that. So that's something that we're looking at with Consumer Affairs.

But I think the important thing is that with the antitrust laws, I think you'll be very, very successful with that. The local station that we had at one time, it was local news and local stations. We tried for at least a decade at one time to have a universal network so that if there is a hurricane or a storm or an accident you can notify everyone within the County of Ocean. We were very unsuccessful with doing that. Going back before Comcast was here, there was Channel 8 – Adelphia – if you remember. And when they protested because the Flyers were taken off and it was there in Manchester and they protested and you know what they did? They put it back on at the same cost. When the Yankees, at that time they had a problem and this goes way back before Comcast, they got involved and they did the same thing. But, now you are arguing and you are fighting with a corporation that can care less about what we're doing and there is no competition.

So I think what you're doing, I think it's the right thing. I think that it's very difficult. It's an uphill fight, but the people, more so in Berkeley and Manchester because not only the Yankees, but I think it's a bigger picture than that......"

COUNCILWOMAN NOONAN: "It went all the way out to the Delaware (River)."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "All the way out to the Delaware."

COUNCILWOMAN NOONAN: "I had Delran calling too. And also Monmouth County. Can we get in on this? Still the calls come in. So really I'm happy."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "So you have our support. I hope you are successful in your lawsuit. But I think the most important thing right now is public awareness not only in Ocean County, but beyond the borders of Ocean County. Thank you for bringing this to our attention. Thank you very much."

COUNCILWOMAN NOONAN: "Thank you very much."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "Thank you Mr. Director. Freeholder?"

DEPUTY LITTLE: "I wanted to add one more comment. Just we're talking about YES network which is Yankee Entertainment and Sports, but I don't want anybody to think that this is specific to the Yankees. It's on sports in general. We're in a region where a lot of folks in the southern, especially southern part of the County, are Phillies fans. Philadelphia Phillies. And Eagles fans. Then you come up here. A lot of Mets fans. A lot of Yankees fans. I just want everyone to know, our staff knows because we talk about this, but we would be taking the same type of action to defend, if you will, our constituents if this were the Mets who have their own network. If they were doing same thing with Comcast. The Phillies are on a special network on channel 36 and we would be doing the same thing because it sports become a part of people's lives - especially their quality of life. So it happens to be the Yankees there are involved in this, but I don't want to give the impression that we favor the Yankees over the Phillies or Mets because that makes a lot of people mad. So we don't do that. In any event, we would be advocating for any of the

sports teams. So thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Do be honest with you, the Phillies sports fans – I'm one of them – and the way the Philly teams are playing, we would like Comcast to pay for them!"

DEPUTY LITTLE: "Oh, Mr. Director. I have to read this Mr. Director. This is so important."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Can we just get a vote on the resolutions?"

DEPUTY LITTLE: "Yes."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "And then you can read it."

DEPUTY LITTLE: "I have to read this letter. You will laugh about this."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Okay. We'll come back to this. So do we have a motion on J-1 through J-27?"

On motion duly made by Freeholder Haines, seconded by Freeholder Bartlett, Consent Resolution, Items J-1 through J-27, were adopted on final reading.

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Freeholder?"

DEPUTY LITTLE: "I have to add this. This is about the Yankees. We have had many telephone phone calls, many emails, letters, people talking to us frequently, but this is the one that takes the cake. And this came in today.

I won't read the name, but it's a constituent. And essentially this constituent says, it's a man; he says he read in the Senior Times that the Freeholders are Rooting for Yankees and Comcast to patch up their differences."

'You make a compelling argument for restoring Yankee service. I don't know when our Freeholder Board sent this letter to BPU to mediate. I cannot prove it, but I do believe that Comcast and Verizon are in restraint of trade. It is an act of disrespect is all our Freeholders can get for their is a "Pro Forma" line of intransigence, in response to their efforts on our behalf. If the board can get a positive change in Comcast's position, I would consider voting for a Republican in the next Freeholder election. Thanks for reading this. If possible, I'd like a response to this letter.'

"He said 'I would even consider voting for a Republican in the next Freeholder election if you resolve this'! I swear – it's right there! If you guys saw this. I swear – it's right there!! (laughter)

V. FREEHOLDER COMMENTS

At 4:55 PM, Freeholder Director Kelly received the following comments from members of the Board:

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "Thank you Director. I just would like to very briefly congratulate Councilwoman

Noonan on what she is going to be doing with regards to Comcast and going into Federal Court with that. I think it's a great thing to do because too many times the bigger corporations and things such as that take advantage of the smaller people and that would be the towns, because they feel no one is going to fight back. I'm glad that you're going and doing anything that you can do. We are always here for you."

COUNCILWOMAN NOONAN: "Well, they never met me."

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "That's true."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "They're in for a treat. Freeholder Little."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. Two items. First of all, I want to thank Dan Regenye, our Director of Health, and for all of the staff at the Health Department and you, Mr. Director, because you are liaison to the Prosecutor.

Our Ocean County Prosecutor conducted a very informative and very persuasive workshop on Monday. And by the way, thanks to Freeholder Haines. She participated in that and was present with me at that forum. It was very, very informative. Our Ocean County Health Department is working in full cooperation with our Prosecutor's Office to develop all these strategies that we can possibly come up with to try to address the heroin problem and the substance abuse problem in general.

Here in Ocean County the Prosecutor has a wealth of information and knowledge about it. We have a very active Health Education Department under Leslie Terjesen, who does a great job with that. We're trying to outreach the best that we can to the kids, students. What a terrible, terrible problem we have with that. If you make that decision, it will change your life forever. So it's a very, very big, big issue. It's a monumental decision if you embark upon that course with opiate drugs. So we thank our Prosecutor. It was very, very good. He did a great job and I know it's important to our Health Department staff that is actively involved in these programs to try to help kids - from treatment to prevention, of course. To see the Prosecutor there and give them that kind of feedback and kind of information. So we thank our Health Department for taking this on.

Secondly, one of the items that we approved today were checks. Freeholder Bartlett, you'll like that. We approved checks to our municipalities here in Ocean County as their share of recycling revenues for the last half year, from July of last year until the end of 2015. Not the first 4 months of 2016, but the second half of 2015. We approved checks in aggregate of \$271,000. and change that will be returned to the municipalities for their recycling, based upon their share of the recycling materials that they provided from their municipalities. Of course, the big towns, you know Toms River, Lakewood, Brick, Stafford, Jackson, they received the largest checks. Toms River - \$46,000, almost \$47,000. Lakewood - almost \$44,000. Brick - \$34,000. Stafford - \$22,000. Jackson - nearly \$17,000.

We recycled in a half year, 42,000 tons of you know what - aluminum cans, corrugated papers, old newspapers, etc. So 42,000 tons. But, and this is something for the students I think, the real issue is not the money we return in Recycling Grants back to the municipalities, but on the opposite end is we kept 42,000 tons away from the landfill. Now if those 42,000 tons went to the landfill, that would have cost those 33 municipalities a little over \$3 million to put it in the landfill. So they saved \$3 million by not putting those materials in the landfill and they're getting returned as well almost \$270,200 in Recycling Grants. So it's win-win. Plus, of course, we all talk about the natural resources you are using and those kinds of things, saving resources. But, it's an economic issue and that's why recycling is so important. It's more than just saving resources. That's very important. We don't want to minimize it, but it's also economical by keeping it out of the landfill. \$3 million in a half year. That's not bad. So the taxpayers saved \$3 million by not having to put those 42,000 tons in the Ocean County Landfill. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Also, those dollars fund our Recycling Program."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Yes. They do."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "This is money that is extra."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "It's extra. Yes. That we return."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "This is money that is there extra that helps to pay for their Recycling Program because it does cost a lot of money to do that. So that has been a great program for a number of years. Freeholder Bartlett."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Mr. Director, I would like to, unfortunately, inform you and the Board that I will be unavoidably absent from the next couple of meetings of the Board of Chosen Freeholders as I'm going to be undergoing some medical treatments in Philadelphia. So I will be missing a number of meetings, but I want you all to know that I will be in contact with my office every day. Electronics is great. Oh jeez. Not only that, but my wife made me move to the 21st century and get rid of my flip phone! So I have this now. So I will be able to text, I think! I'll be in contact with my office every day and my office with me and with anyone who I can by telephone or fax or whatever, but my physical presence will not be at the meetings unfortunately. So I did want to inform you of that and I'll be back as soon as I can. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you very much and you do know that this Board of Freeholders will keep you in their thoughts and prayers. We wish you the best as you go through those treatments. Freeholder Vicari."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "I would just like to echo what Director Kelly mentioned. My thoughts and prayers not only with your treatment, but Freeholder Bartlett and I have served together for probably the longest in the history of the State of New Jersey. That's how long we've been together. Over 36 or 37 years, something like that. We have an excellent relationship. But, I think there is something that should be noted and that is that Freeholder Bartlett has always had a passion to serve the people in Ocean County. He worries about his job, not only with the Budget and the Parks or whatever he does, and I know when he's getting treatment his mind will always be on the County of Ocean. But, we want Freeholder Bartlett and his family to know that just take care of your health and we wish you well. It's science and technology and medicine came a long, long way and our prayers are with you.

I just want to mention just briefly that Berkeley Township is one of our largest towns in Ocean County. We appreciate two members being here today, Judy Noonan who was former Council President, for coming here, and John Bacchione is going to speak in a few minutes. He is the Council President this year. And it's not just to make a statement, but it's to bring this to the public awareness to open up a new discussion whether it be with Comcast or with transportation or the needs of Berkeley Township.

Berkeley Township has many needs. It's not forgotten. And sometimes talking to the people on a governing body, they say, 'Well is anyone listening? Does anyone care?' We hear about it all the time. But I think it's a good thing to have this discussion that has taken place today and to encourage it through the public portion (of the meeting). And that's what County government is all about. People that come and have a forum to speak. Suggestions and, not being critical, but looking for suggestions and acting in a positive way and that's what our government is all about in Ocean County. Thank you very much Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. Today, with the Sheriff and the Assignment Judge, the Administrator, we walked through the Ocean County Courthouse in space that was previously used by the Corrections Department. That space now is not necessary as we did the new addition and moved the Correction Department out of that area plus we actually filled in an area that was empty from the floor to the ceiling - three stories.

The reason we did that was to provide extra space for the Courts and Sheriff's Department, but more importantly, was to move two courtrooms from an outer facility where we have to provide the security that is redundant because we already supply the security coming into the courthouse - to wand you and make sure that you don't have anything you shouldn't or whatever they are looking for in security. We're looking at moving those courtrooms back into the Courthouse. That will save two to three officers per shift when those are open. So it's a very important savings and makes good use of that facility. In fact, we're planning on having the Judge come to our next PreBoard to talk about the Criminal Justice Reforms and what it means to the Courts, the Prosecutor and the Sheriff to give the Board an official report from the Courts on this program so we have a full understanding of that. And then at the following PreBoard we're going to talk about space needs and what we need to look for in the future.

There's some money set up, Freeholder, that you put in the Budget for the planning. We want to talk about what we're looking at. At one time termed a 'secret plan'. So now we're going to unveil that, but we really have to wait until things are in process with the Courts and everybody that's involved before we make the full presentation to the Board. That will be coming up, not at the next PreBoard, but the PreBoard after because it's too much. Carl asked me if we should do it all at one meeting and I said no because this Board of Freeholders has a deficit in attention. They can't pay attention for that long, so I think we ought to do this in two separate meetings. (laughter)

No, really, they are both very important and while they relate to each other, they are different issues, and we really need to look at these things for the future. So they will be in the next two meetings and we'll be talking about those.

The only other one report is, after 24 years, I finally had to go to my third book of tablets. But I see that my secretary is saving you money because she didn't give me a full pack."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Good. You don't need that." (laughter)

DIRECTOR KELLY: "She must figure that I'm out of here or something because I only got a few pages in here!" (laughter)

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Mr. Director, you know you mentioned these folders that we carry. I have a thing stapled in here that is dated December 1991."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "This is 1993. They've been around for a while. Okay. Any other comments? Mr. Administrator, do you have any comments?"

CARL BLOCK, COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR: "I have no comments now. No."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "You are well-disciplined."

W. **PUBLIC COMMENTS** - Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of **five (5)** minutes per speaker.

At 5:08 PM, Freeholder Director Kelly opened the meeting to receive comments from the public as follows:

DIRECTOR KELLY: "We will now open to the public. We invite anyone who would like to speak with the Board

of Freeholders to do so. We're going to go first with the Councilman from Berkeley. We ask that everyone hold their comments to five minutes and identify yourself by name and address. Thank you for coming here today."

JOHN BACCIONE, COUNCIL PRESIDENT, BERKELEY TOWNSHIP: "In the interest of public disclosure, my name is John Bacchione. I live at 3 Albatross Point in Bayville and I am the President of the Berkeley Council for the time being.

I want to thank you Freeholders for keeping your eye on the fiscal situation in Ocean County. You guys do a great job and as a resident here since 1997, my taxes have not increased a lot. So I applaud you guys for keeping your eye on that ball.

I'm here today to talk about something that you guys and lady are familiar with and that is a transportation issue. In the past there have been discussions about a fast rail or speed rail getting people from Ocean County and Monmouth County up to, let's suggest Essex County or Newark in a matter of the time that is applicable to possibly working in Manhattan or in the northern counties like what is in Essex or Middlesex. The Council in Berkeley proposed a resolution to the Freeholders which I trust all of you have read, proposing a discussion between you the Freeholders of Ocean County and the Freeholders of Monmouth and Middlesex Counties in the interest of such a high-speed rail.

My suggestion is and I am not an architect nor an Engineer is that we start the rail for the time being in Manahawkin and run it up through to Newark, New Jersey, whereas the commuters can reach the PATH trains and get over to Manhattan. I suggest two stops – one in Toms River and one in Middletown. And what those stops will do is pick up commuters from the surrounding municipalities.

Of course, this is all in infancy stages what I'm going to suggest, but I think it's worth talking about. My suggestion would be to you, the Freeholders, to set up an exploratory committee to explore if there is any viability to what I'm suggesting today and to see if it can be done. I had a phone conversation with Lieutenant Governor Kim Guadagno about a month ago and I suggested the speed rail to her. Her first question was where are we going to get the money? Her next statement was that New Jersey just found \$25 billion to do a new tunnel under the Hudson River to Manhattan. So if the money can be found for a tunnel which gets the people from Hudson County to Manhattan in a quicker way, I think the money could be found for such a speed rail that I'm suggesting here today.

I know in the past the suggestion was, or it was probably on the Planning Board, the MOM Rail, the acronym for Monmouth, Ocean and Middlesex, and I believe it started in Manchester and it ran north-west to the Amtrak rails by the Turnpike which, again, took the commuters along, I guess, the Turnpike corridor up to I'm thinking north New Jersey."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "It would actually connect us from Miami all the way up through Boston because of the way they connect and it would connect then into Philadelphia and from Philadelphia all the way down to Miami. We support that. We have supported that for a number of years and so does Monmouth County. The sticking point there is Middlesex. They don't want the rail. We have been trying for years continue to try. I like your other plan, but I'll tell you right now I think it has virtually no chance of getting passed.

There is a great amount of support, not enough yet, but a great amount of support for that MOM line and we are still trying to do that. Jim Lacey, who for the whole 23 years he was here, was a member of the NJTPA. Now, why that is important is that's the funding mechanism. I have taken that position since Jim left in January and we have a committee meeting coming up next week, I believe. Right John?"

COUNTY ENGINEER JOHN ERNST: "Yes."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Now, I'm new on that Board. Freeholder Lacey retired this year. He would've actually been the Chairman of the North Jersey Transportation Planning Authority for north Jersey actually. That's what we are part of. You know it's not that your plan is not a good one. In fact, I would, since I live down that way, I'd love to see the rail start in Manahawkin. But I have to be honest, I don't think we'll ever get the Legislators from north Jersey to care about Ocean County. And all of this comes through the State. That's where all that money comes from. We do have support from a great many in the Legislature and from NJTPA for the MOM line. What has got to be worked out is this problem with Middlesex. But, I will tell you that problem has been there for virtually the whole time. In fact, Freeholder Mancini before he passed away was actually liaison to that, not Jim Lacey. So I was wrong when I said Jim was on it the whole time. I forgot that Jim took it over after Jim Mancini passed away and then he became the liaison there. And then Jim left and now I have it."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Mr. Director, this Board, we took the position – we'll take the train ride from anywhere. Probably the preferred route, the one that makes the most sense, is from Manchester because the rail line is there. There is a railroad bed there. It's not much a railroad bed. You can't probably go over 20 miles an hour on it, but it's there. And the right-of-way. And to go up to Red Bank, but Monmouth County is dead opposed to a rail line on the existing right-of-way going up to Red Bank. So the other possibility was one going to the mainline, the Northeast Corridor out, I think, near Jamesburg. Is that where it would end up? And then Middlesex County is dead opposed to. So here we get stuck in the middle and we say we'll take it from anywhere."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "There are two people I would suggest that you speak to. One sitting right there is John Ernst who is our County Engineer. The other is Bill Braden who has been really a part of this issue probably all the way back to Mr. Buckwald. I know at least from Mancini on up that he is very much an advocate and has gotten very much of the information and it would probably be very educational for you. I could ask John to set up a meeting

between you, himself and Bill Braden and then you could discuss it without being tied to this 5-minute timeline here, get a really good education on it and then come back here and have some comments after you talk to them about where we actually are. Because, the good news is, if we can ever get this done, you could travel from Ocean County all the way south and all the way north and it would be a good thing."

COUNCILMAN JOHN BACCHIONE: "The possibilities of collateral benefits are endless to the people who need jobs, to the people whose real estate values are stifled. Real estate values would go sky-rocketing."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "You're talking advocates. We are advocates for that. The problem that all of us have is outside of this campaign and getting the approvals necessary for funding and then the other mechanisms come into play."

COUNCILMAN JOHN BACCHIONE: "Freeholder Director, like a mirror image, you get back what you send out. So not only do the people from the southern counties go north, but the people from the northern counties could come south to enjoy our amenities here, like the seashore and whatnot. In the words of Freeholder Vicari earlier, he said tourism in the summer population, doubles. Can you imagine if we had a speed rail?"

DIRECTOR KELLY: "I'm sure that we've made every one of these arguments and it still hasn't been. And your five minutes are really exceeded. I just want to say I really want you to start with this other meeting only because you'll get a really good understanding of the history of this for long-term and then we can look at and change what we've done before. But to go forward, I thing you've got to start going backwards. Do you understand what I'm saying?"

COUNCILMAN BACCHIONE: "I understand."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "I think Freeholder Vicari has something that he wants to say."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "You know, if you look at the history of what took place, Ocean County has been shortchanged not only with school funding as you know on the Board of Education, municipal funding. There's over 30 towns that haven't been reassessed as you've probably seen in the last week in north Jersey. 32 towns, I believe, 40 years no reassessment. You know, on a governing body, you both know, that it's done periodically and you pay more taxes. And they are still many years behind. But, I think the key issue is where does the money go in the State of New Jersey for the last 25 years?

When I was first elected"

COUNCILMAN BACCHIONE: "In a tunnel on the Hudson river."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "George Buckwald was the one who really took the leadership role. He went to all of the meetings and it was the Blue Comet (passenger train). I learned a lot from Freeholder Buckwald at the time that it was going to put us into the grid of Amtrak and everywhere else in the United States and it was in place. At that time the cost was around \$225 million, now it's probably about \$1 billion. But, you said several days ago that the Acela in New York City was \$4 billion for five railroads and it leaks continuously. Freeholder John Bartlett and I spoke about that. The money goes to north Jersey.

How many times did you call me up and say, 'What about CAFRA and the Pinelands in Berkeley Township?' How many times did you call me about Route 9 and we say, 'Well, there's nothing we can do'. Part of the problem is that we don't have the clout they have in north Jersey. Look what they do to the casinos. Look at all the money. The bridges and all that you mentioned - \$25 billion worth of different improvements besides that. So what's happening is the voice of Ocean County is not being heard. That's why I think it's very important that you not only do the resolution, you come here today and you make it loud and clear.

Going back in the '70's I think, the spur of the New Jersey Turnpike was going to go to downtown Toms River and on each side there was going to be a right-of-way to build commercial property for jobs. So if you want jobs, what do you do? Most people travel to north Jersey. We send our students to school for fine educations and where are the jobs? Not in Ocean County like they should be. So we've been trying to work on that which is very important. So I think it's a step in the right direction. I think more discussion is necessary. So we appreciate you coming today.

But, we're on your side. We're doing everything possible."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Stay there for one more second because Freeholder Haines wants to talk."

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "I just want to let you know that Freeholder Kelly is correct. The Transportation Board happens to be one of my committees and I met with Mr. Braden this week and he had brought up our maps and we had a very long discussion with regards to the, I'll call it the MOM rail line. So I would suggest getting in touch with Mr. Braden and he would definitely be able to give you the history of everything. Show you where they're at, what they would like to do, where it's going to go and what the best routes would be. But, he would definitely be able to give you a lot of information with regards to that."

COUNCILMAN BACCHIONE: "Well, thank you for your comments and thank you for the opportunity to present this to you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "We appreciate you coming. Anyone else like to address the Board at this time? Yes ma'am."

PAT KLASLO, 2076 BAY BLVD., ORTLEY BEACH: "I'm not sure exactly who I should be speaking with, but I want to find out some more information about the land swap with Seaside Heights with the parking lot and the carousel versus the oceanfront property that's going to be swapped with respect to having to pledge open space against it."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "I can answer, I think, some of your general questions. We were approached by Seaside Heights who wishes to preserve the hundred year old merry-go-round of which there are very few original merry-go-rounds left because they're worth far more broken up and sold – selling the horses individually as art. That's one of the few ones and Seaside Heights would desperately like to save that historical piece.

Unfortunately, when we set up our Natural Lands Trust question on the ballot, and I take full responsibility for this about 12 to 15 years ago.....maybe it's longer than that now, we did not include historic preservation which we could have, but we didn't. So we couldn't help financially support the saving of that carousel. But, we were approached by Seaside Heights with a very interesting concept. If we could designate land that the county owns for preservation purposes, they could use that with the State of New Jersey. I may not have the details exactly right. But, they could use that with the State of New Jersey and allow Seaside Heights to enter into an agreement to swap land with the owners of the carousel and move the carousel to land, again, would be donated by the owners' carousel in return for, I understand, some oceanfront acreage that the Borough owns.

The County's only part of this would be that we would take land that we bought for the purpose of preserving, okay, to preserve it. It is wetlands. It is in the north branch, I believe, of the Toms River. The reason that we bought it was to use it for mitigation purposes so we could say, 'Okay, we can take this property that we own in fee-simple and then put an easement declaration on it and it would be preserved in that condition in perpetuity'. That the County's involvement. And the reason for the involvement is, in my opinion, if we could help save that carousel, that would be an asset to everyone in Ocean County.

Now, I may be prejudiced to carousels, okay, but I worked on the boardwalk when I was a young man – which I can barely remember - but, when I worked on the boardwalk, I always rode one of those carousels and that's the kind of the general statement. If there's specifics you have, I'm sure we can get the answers for you."

PAT KLASLO: "Okay, I understand what they're doing and things like that. My question has to do with land that you're pledging against for Seaside Heights. The 60 acres by Winding River Park. Is that dedicated strictly to Seaside Heights?"

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "It's not dedicated to Seaside Heights at all."

PAT KLASLO: "But, you're basically pledging it, aren't you?"

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "No. We are not giving it to Seaside Heights. All we are doing is putting a conservation easement on the property for the State of New Jersey. So it is land we bought for that purpose in the first place, that is not for preservation purposes with County funds - for mitigation, for instance - sometimes if you're expanding a County road and you have to move into some wetlands, you have to replace that. And so we bought land and bank it, in a sense, for the mitigation purposes and this is some land that we can use."

PAT KLASLO: "Okay, because my question is on the land that you bought, are taxes paid or no taxes?"

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "There are no taxes paid because it's public ownership."

PAT KLASLO: "I can understand using it for mitigation if you're building roads and stuff, but isn't this for, basically, a private profit?"

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Well absolutely not, because the carousel will be owned by whom?"

PAT KLASLO: "I'm assuming Seaside Heights."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Well, is that a profit-making organization? No, it's a public municipality. This is to help the municipality do something in that, in my opinion, in the public interest and in the public good. A historic preservation.

We could have made historic preservation and many counties did in their Natural Lands Trust question that they put on the ballot. I think that we should have, but it's my mistake that we didn't."

PAT KLASLO: "The only reason I'm concerned is because as a taxpayer in Toms River, and I rebuilt my house and my taxes went up significantly, I just want to...."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "This has absolutely no relation to that at all."

PAT KLASLO: "Well, I just wanted to make sure that Seaside Heights was not getting something for nothing and it's impacting myself."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "No, it will not impact you at all because the land does not pay taxes now. The County owns it. The County is not spending one dime more than it has so it has absolutely no financial effect on anyone. And again, it's an effort to try to help save this, but it's not costing the County taxpayers or the Board of Freeholders."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "And no individual will be profiting."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "And no individual will be profiting. I think that's very important."

PAT KLASLO: "Okay, I just wanted to ask that."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "It's really a continuation of a program that we have. We have Farmland Preservation, we have Open Space Preservation. We have different programs and it's meant to preserve this style of life that we grew up with and not develop every square inch of this County. So that's really what the idea is here."

PAT KLASLO: "My concern is that if you have other small towns that don't, because the reason that you're pledging is because Seaside Heights has no open space. Now if you have other smaller towns that have no open space and you keep pledging and pledging it and all the sudden Toms River will have something......"

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Wait. What does another small town......what issue is there?"

PAT KLASLO: "I'm just saying if other towns, if they were to do some type of preservation....."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Of what?"

PAT KLASLO: "Whatever within their town."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Of what?" They don't have a carousel. What are you talking about? You need to use concrete terms."

PAT KLASLO: "I don't have a concrete."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Then it's a very speculative question."

PAT KLASLO: "Exactly."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Okay. I can answer one."

PAT KLASLO: "What's going to happen then when we run out of space? Are we going to be buying more space from Toms River?"

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Not just Toms River. Right now we have programs probably in all 33 municipalities is what I would suggest. I might be wrong, maybe, I live in Eagleswood which is a very small town and I can't think of anything off-hand that the County has in Eagleswood that is Open Space. But we have Open Space of our own because it's owned by CAFRA, it's owned by the DEP. The Forsythe Refuge is down there. So there is a lot of Open Space. I can't think of a particular County project, but really all through the County we have it. This is not something limited to Seaside Heights or Toms River or any of those. It's really a continuation of a County program that we are actually quite proud of our program because we are trying to look at the entire County and make sure the entire County is saved. We have a lot of different programs, for instance, up in Jackson Township because that's along the Metedeconk River. We want to make sure that we keep the clean water supply.

So you know there's a lot of different things that we look at different days and they are not all exact, but they are all meant to kind of do the same thing. I think this program falls within that."

PAT KLASLO: "I just wanted clarification. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you very much. Anyone else like to address the at this time? Gary."

GARY BLACK, JACKSON: "I'm going to try to squeeze this into five minutes. First thing and primarily, other than the fact that your signs are switched."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Oh yeah. See I'm good looking today."

GARY BLACK: "First off, my thoughts and prayers go out to you. That is the primary, number one, most important. I hope it's nothing major, serious. I know you don't like talking about your personal issues. I'm not going to do that, but otherwise, my prayers are with you and I hope for the best. I hope it's not that serious. It sends chills up my spine, but again, I hope it's nothing serious because it sounds......:

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "I'm sure you when it's all over, they told me you'll walk out of here a healthy young man. I said, 'Well, I may walk out of here healthy, but I won't walk out of here young."

GARY BLACK: "Well, if that happens, can you get me a present please? Of the few things, the one thing today is the 'Sexual Awareness Recognition Month'. As you know, for years I've been up here and I've been a rabid attacker of anything to do with attacking women and children. I've been an advocate against rape. I have been very annoyed with what some of our laws turn into. How the liberal courts have turned (inaudible) on to a lesser protection bill, of the fact that somebody can get probation for raping a baby. It frightens me. And in the years that I've been doing this I've learned that when it really comes down to it, the average public really doesn't give a rats ass. That's, you know, and you know why it's a close issue to me too. So understand why I get a little riled up about it. But, again, I'm glad we have some recognition. Hopefully someday we'll do something about it. We'll either change the party in Trenton for one thing as far as barring sexual predators from living near schools, churches, bus stops and other things like

that. As you know, the Committee whittled it down from 2000 feet and brought it to five hundred feet and then it would never get posted. Some towns try to do individual protections, but that got thrown out by the State's 'Surreal' Court as I call them. And so it's strictly a State issue and the prevailing party in the Legislature said pretty much the issue is dead and we don't care. They are on their side. So for that I hope there's a little bit more than recognition. I hope to see some change. There should have been more outrage in the State from that, but again, I think for the most part people don't care. Hopefully someday people will change that perspective.

Another thing and it's going to be one hell of a jump. Going back to the recycling, the biggest savings issue actually got missed. Not only do we save the amount of trash going into the landfill which initially saves us a substantial amount of money in a short period of time, but there is also long term. Even though the DEP or Department of Excessive Prosecution as I call them have given the okay to raise the height of the dump so we can dump our garbage there, the day will come when we're going to run out of space there. And when that happens we're going to have to ship out of State and that cost will be at least triple, and that's even a wild guess, of what it is today. Yes, some states actually want the garbage. They've got the room. They've got plenty of places to put it, but the cost just to ship out there and as far as more and more – hell, our own State wants to cut her own throat with raising fuel taxes for the next fund for fixing roads and bridges that won't go to fix roads or bridges. It will just get stolen for something else like the last trust fund did. But that is also a substantial part, is the long-term costs of eventually shipping which will be a reality and probably within our lifetime. The more the area develops, the more it will grow, the more the garbage grow and the more it will run out of room. I'm there every day because I do drive a garbage truck. It's not that I'm bored and go to visit. Yes I do see it raise rather quickly. I do see how fast cells fill out more than when I first started."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Anything else?"

GARY BLACK: "I was going to do a couple of things about the Budget again, but not now. This will cover it. Frankly, when I start talking about sexual violence I get upset."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "I understand."

GARY BLACK: "Unfortunately, you can't though. I hope that day never happens for you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Anyone else like to address the Board at this time? Freeholder Little, you wanted to talk about something?"

DEPUTY LITTLE: "The Health Department on Monday is working on an issue with this. May I? With your permission, Mr. Director, maybe Leslie Terjesen could inform the public as well as Gary Black?"

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Sure. Absolutely."

DEPUTY LITTLE: "Or Dan? Whoever is running it. I'm not sure."

LESLIE TERJESEN, PUBLIC INFORMATION OFFICER, OC HEALTH DEPARTMENT: "It's the Ocean Health part of Long Beach Island Health Department is working with the Ocean County Advisory Commission on the Status of Women and with our trustee library book for April. On April 18th we will be having a program in the Mancini Room at the library called 'Sexual Assault Prevention is Possible' which is this year's theme for 'Sexual Assault Awareness Month'. Freeholder Haines will be there. Hopefully, Freeholder Little will be there. We have Rory Wells from the Prosecutor's (Office) will be speaking and also a Student Assistance Counselor from Toms

It's not just about types of behaviors and saying no, it's also about resources. It's for 14 years old and up. We want kids to know that they're not alone. Dan and I did a program for many years in all our schools wanting kids to know that there's always someone they can turn to. And, we want parents to know that there is someone they can turn to also.

So we're going to have many resources. We have that whole hallway – the Library's been wonderful in advertising this, but it's going to be on the, again, April 18th from 6 to 8 pm. So we're looking forward to it and we're actually looking at it sort of as a kickoff, Freeholder Haines, for years to come, during 'Sexual Assault Awareness Month' to focus on the different aspects of it. So I'm glad you brought it up. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Okay. Anyone else like to address the Board at this time? Any of our students like to come up and say hello to us? Yea, come on up. See you're saying you might come up. Come on up. Come on, come on. We'll be nice to you!

Okay, we thank you for being here. We hope today was somewhat educational for you. Anyone else like to address the Board? If not, I'll adjourn....yes ma'am."

JENAYA JENKINS, 2628 SPRUCE DRIVE, MANCHESTER: "I am a student, but probably much more mature than you were expecting. I'm here because I'm a student. I'm in the Master Program for Clinical Management in Nursing and I have a question as part of my assignment. My question to you all is what is the process of becoming a Board member on your Freeholder Committee?"

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Sure. Well, the process begins with you, the candidate. And what you need to do if you're going to run for Freeholder and I'll talk about that one since we're Freeholders. You need to get 100 signatures to become a candidate. You can choose whether you want to run as a Republican, a Democrat or an Independent. If

you're going to run as a Party member, I would suggest you find out who that President is, or Chairman, and talk to that person at first so that you can get some support from the organization. But, that's not mandatory because you can run against the organization. I've had candidates run against me in the Primary and were not part of our organization. So, you know, there's a process for that.

But, it's really a very simple process that you simply get a petition that you can pick up at the County Clerk's office. You fill that out. It's pretty simple how to do it – it has all the instructions right on there. Once you do that, though, make sure that you get somebody that understands campaign finance laws because even if you raise no money, there is a form you have to fill out for that. And you can get help with that if you become a candidate. It is too late to put a petition in for this year's election. You had to do that by..... to be on the Primary, however, as an Independent that's another process and I don't know the deadlines on that."

JENAYA JENKINS: "And one more question, collectively, what is all of your backgrounds? Anyone can answer this. Is your background in politics or wasn't it something other than that? Like, you're sitting at this seat and I'm not clear......"

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "Well, three of us are teachers by profession. Freeholder Little, Freeholder Bartlett and myself, a Superintendent. Were at one time. We're retired now. But I just want to add something to it. The reason I got involved in politics, I was in charge of Student Council in Brick Township where I was a teacher. I was a History and English teacher, and my students challenged me saying, 'Why didn't I get involved.' I ran for Council in Toms River and soon as I knew I won. I became Mayor of Toms River five terms. And that gentleman that spoke before, the Council President, John Bacchione. When I was Superintendent in Berkeley he came in to complain. His complaint was with the busing and he had all kinds of complaints. I said, 'You know something? Why don't you run Mr. Bacchione for School Board.' So he ran for the office and the next thing I knew, a couple of months later he ran for School Board and he was my boss!

And after he was on the Board of Education for a while he decided to run for Town Council. But the strange thing is he wasn't the only one. David Ytreboe was a teacher in Toms River North High School. I went in there one time. I was talking to his students. So the next think I knew, he decided to run for Council or Board of Education. I don't remember whether it was as a Councilman or the School Board. So the strange thing is, I told the students to run for office and then it wasn't the students, it was the teacher that decided to run. The point I'm making is that we want people to get involved, especially younger people. We spend a lot of time, especially with the younger people that are here today, but anyone that wants to get involved. And you know, you look at the Board of Freeholders and the 33 towns, but your locals run for Board of Education, they can run for Council, so there's a lot of opportunities for you to really get involved. I suggest what you do is come to a meeting like this, listen to what's going on, go to your local towns, go to some civic organizations, and what we're looking for in government is other people, younger people to get involved that could a different perspective as in today. Thank you."

JENAYA JENKINS: "And last question, I have one more."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "What about the rest? I think maybe....."

JENAYA JENKINS: "Oh, I'm sorry. I don't want to leave anybody out."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "In all the time I have been here, no one has ever asked that question before. For every one of us here, we've all spent, individually, some time on a local governing body – a town governing body. I come from Pine Beach. I grew up there. And, when I was 27, I was elected to the Town Council. There were six Councilmen and one Mayor. I very much enjoyed it. I always wanted to have a career in politics and I've been very fortunate to have been able to do that.

Then the opportunity came along to run for Mayor and I ran for Mayor and won. And then out of the blue, an opportunity came to run for Freeholder. And it really did come out of the blue, and the Chairman at that time said they were looking for some younger candidates and he called it a youth movement. Well, it was back in the days."

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "That's how Freeholder Bartlett and I both got here. We were the youth movement."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "So I think number one, it takes a thick skin. It takes.....you know, you think you can make everyone happy and you certainly can't. Okay. And at one point in time you will probably make everyone a little unhappy. We just don't do it all at the same time. But, I think it perhaps becomes a part of your being, a part of your blood, a part of what you want to do. It's an opportunity I personally believe to give back. If you think of your life as I do, there have been many people, many, many people when I was a kid when I was in school or whatever who gave of themselves. I'm not a sports advocate as my friends, but Boy Scouts and Sunday School and all those other kinds of things.

And there are people that you can never repay and the only way that you can repay them is by, in a sense, trying to repay the future. Now that doesn't mean everyone everyone will agree with you because they won't and you can't expect that. But, you ought to want to expect to be able to do the best you can under the circumstances which may not be the best, but it's the best under the circumstances. And I think each one of us who have served in public office for many, many years, in our own minds are happy with what we've been able to accomplish. But it ends some day and you can't.....you win elections, you lose elections, but you've been out there. As a hero of mine, Richard Nixon, use to say, 'You are in the arena and you're in the fight'. And we've all been there and we've all enjoyed it over the years."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "I have one more Freeholder who wants to talk to you about this."

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "Yes. I am the second woman that's been on the Freeholder Board since 1850. I started out as a young person just politically because my family was very involved politically and I handed out literature and things like that when I grew up in Lakewood. They were very involved within the community so I learned from them and to become involved a lot of the nonprofit type of organizations. And I've done that my entire life. I still do that.

But, I first ran for office and I ran for the Legislature. And I was in the New Jersey Legislature for my second term and I was appointed by Governor Whitman to go and run the State Lottery which I was there for eight years. Prior to that I was the appointed to be Clerk of the Assembly, which I was by Speaker Hardwick. Prior to that I ran a Legislative Office for then Assemblyman Bob Singer when he represented Toms River. And then he went on to become a Senator. I was on the Township Committee in Toms River briefly and then I was asked when Jim Lacey retired and the opportunity arose for me to be a Freeholder and I will be running in November. I was elected by County Committee.

But my point is I became very involved as I said, still am in the community. Many, many, many boards that I still sit on and that's what I did. And I just became involved politically. I am in one particular party, but I think it's just getting involved in and just being known and then just getting out there helping, then you find your own little niche of things that you want to do. And I always learned that, to me, to be a person that's running for office as long as you care and compassion and you can listen to someone and you're going to do the best that you possibly can for someone, anyone can run for office and anyone can be successful. You just have to put your heart into it and not promise anything, but always just say that you're going to do the best you can. And do it. Don't just say it and don't do anything, but do it. But, anyone can run for office.

And I do hope someday that you will consider to run for office because it's really very, very satisfying working for the people and doing what you possibly can to help those and to be involved. So I hope you do something."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Freeholder Little."

DEPUTY LITTLE: "I echo that. Are you at the Kean/Ocean Masters Program?"

JENAYA JENKINS: "Yes, I am."

DEPUTY LITTLE: "Well, just by coincidence, at our Board of Health meeting we had another young woman at that meeting in the same program this week, So we certainly encourage you and you can talk to our Health Department folks in the back and we'd certainly welcome you at one of those meetings and you'll find that interesting as well since that's the field that you're into."

JENAYA JENKINS: "So just one last question. With that being said, yes, I am a nurse. I've been a nurse for 16 years here in Ocean and Monmouth Counties and I'm furthering my education. And, I do teach nursing as well. My question to you all......I live in Manchester and it's my understanding that you don't have many people in nursing or in healthcare in certain areas to sit at the table with you all. What is your standpoint on that? Do you have a viewpoint on that?"

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Well, several of us including myself, have served on hospital boards and have certainly listened to and heard from nurses. I was on the Board at SOCH – Southern Ocean Hospital. So there is that experience. I think Ginny, you served on Toms River? Isn't that the Board you were on at the hospital?"

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "I serve on the Ocean County College Foundation Board. I'm Chairman."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "I don't know if anybody else served on those boards or not, but there are different experiences that put each of us in contact. Freeholder Vicari, for instance, is our liaison to the Vo-Tech School which has a nursing program."

JENAYA JENKINS: "Yes, I'm in it."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "So that he is in contact there. So there are different reasons that each of us are in contact. So that's how......I mean your question was how do we contact nurses. We have different experiences that bring us in contact."

JENAYA JENKINS: "Okay. The reason why I asked that is because, again, in Ocean County, especially Manchester, we have a significantly high population of senior citizens. We have multiple hospitals throughout that I have been in and with changes in healthcare and you have this education that you have to keep up with, hence Kean/Ocean, and with the implementation of all the new programs. I strongly believe that it would benefit the Freeholders or boards like this to have somebody that has more nursing experience to not just talk to somebody, but maybe even a liaison of some sort that makes it more real when making decisions that have to do with nursing - the programs, the education – or even the community as far as the programs that we provide and education, even safety awareness. All of that goes right back into nursing. So it's just something to think about. Thank you very much."

DEPUTY LITTLE: "And, Mr. Director, that's why we rely on our Health Department to handle those issues and to guide us on any issues that involve health is essentially what we're saying. That's why we have a whole Health Department. And those two, the young lady and the young gentleman back there and maybe not so young in the middle, whatever you call it. That's why they're there. They are professionals......"

JENAYA JENKINS: "Which one?"

DEPUTY LITTLE: "He's going grey back there. The graying guy."

JENAYA JENKINS: "I'm familiar that we have the Ocean County Health Department and they handle the usual......

DEPUTY LITTLE: "They handle the nursing issues and so forth and then advise us. The other thing is Freeholder Haines was a staff person and ran a Legislative Office and so did I at one time for twenty something years for a Senator and two Assemblymen. And many of the issues that involve nurses, nursing, the profession, involve the State Legislature because the State licenses, the State administers all the educational requirements that you're talking, all those kinds of things. So that is kind of where we became familiar with nurses. I mean, they haveGinny's mom was a nurse. And Jackie Rohan, I believe, is a nurse, who is Director of our Senior Services Department.

But, what I'm saying is it's the right church and maybe the wrong pew, if you will, or the other way around. The State Legislature, they are the ones that your Manchester is represented by a State Senator and two Assemblypersons and they are the ones that are going to deal with nursing profession, professional issues. And I became very familiar with nursing because my Assemblyman at that time, Jeff Moran who is now our Surrogate, was the Chairman of the Regulated Professions Committee that dealt with every single law involving nursing. It had to go through that Committee. So I had to read a lot of that and get information and back and forth and so forth to him as Chairman of that Committee for a long time, for a lot of years. So that's where, you know, our issues would involve hiring nurses or things like that as opposed to the credentials that you need, the training that you need, the number of hours, etc. Even salaries or anything like that, those are all set by the State. And the nursing, as you probably know, the nurses have a very active union statewide and they do a lot of work in terms of contacting the Legislators and developing 'public policy' involving nursing and they're very effective. The members of the State Legislature, at least in my experience, pay a lot of attention to the nurses because not only are they vital to all of us at one time in our life we will come in contact with nurses one way or the other.

And so that's one thing. But they're also very effective in presenting your arguments, if you will, presenting their points of view, presenting their needs in terms of all of these issues involving their profession. Just as teachers are. They have a very effective lobbying group, if you will."

JENAYA JENKINS: "Yes, I'm familiar with that."

DEPUTY LITTLE: "Yes. They're very good."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "It may be interesting to point out that the nursing program that you're in at Ocean County College and at Kean, this Board of Freeholders provided most of the money to build the nursing facility at Ocean and we bought the land to allow Kean their presence in the building. We paid for a quarter of that building as well."

JENAYA JENKINS: "The Gateway Building?"

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "The Gateway Building. So the nursing program has been very, very important at Ocean County College and Dr. Larson, the President of the College.....I'm the liaison to the College.....has promoted that to us and our funding has been important to the development of the nursing profession because there are jobs out there. It is a profession that's needed and it needs good people and I think we're looking at one."

JENAYA JENKINS: "Absolutely!"

FREEHOLDER VICARI: "I want to give you some perspective. You're talking about nursing. Going back 30 years ago, people would come here and say, 'We can't become a certified nurse. We can't get certified for being a teacher and a nurse. And we can't get a Masters.' So the Board sent me to the State Board and Freeholder Bartlett was here at the time, George Buckwald was here, and I went to the State Board of Education.

And my wife went to school and you know where she graduated from? Newark Medical Center with a Nursing Degree and she was a Registered Nurse. And she could not go to school because when I went there, they offered the school, but they said, 'Look, it's Ocean County. People won't come there.' Not one teacher would come here. They were not allowed. For 10 years no one taught nursing in Ocean County – unless you went up to Jersey City. At that time, we said, 'Well, we have to do something about it.' And they said they wouldn't give us the program. So we complained and complained.

So Freeholder Bartlett and I made sure made sure we had excellent programs come in. The Vocational School – LPN – great programs and in Ocean County College. But we couldn't get a teacher and that was the problem. So when my wife went back to become a school she had to travel, and we had two young children at the time, to Jersey City to go to school because she wanted the Masters (Degree). She had to go there.

And then we had a teacher who volunteered and he got paid for it, of course, and the first teacher to teach to become a registered nurse and for a Masters was my father. For 13 years he was the only one that would give those courses. And every course, everyone who was certified to become a nurse, probably in the County - I know the one at the Toms River school system went through a course where my father was the Professor. That's hard to believe. I bet you never knew that. And he was the only one and he did that for maybe 12 or 13 years until he got up there in years. But, anyone who specializes in not only nursing, but even the people on the Board of Health, and that was his expertise at the time."



FIVE-YEAR PLAN

April 6, 2016 April 6, 2016 The office of the Ocean County Clerk, as a Constitutional Office, is responsible for the receipt, recording, filing, indexing, storage, and making available to the public various land title records and other public documents. The Office also performs matters related to elections and voting.

As a County Constitutional Officer, I am charged under the provisions to develop, prepare, and submit a five-year plan for the use of the Document Trust Fund monies to the County Board of Chosen Freeholders.

The plan is for five years and is to cover the use of the funds, and the interest, for new capital expenditures for the modernization and improvement of the functioning of the Constitutional Office.

These fees are surcharges mandated by the Legislature, paid for the processing, filing or recording of various documents in the office. The revenues are to expended solely for improving and modernizing the recording and other functions of this Office. These surcharges collected are in addition to the increased fees and revenues paid to the County under the above law.

For the year 2016, it is anticipated that the total surcharge fees collected will be \$ 275,000.

Thereafter it is anticipated that the fee will be as follows:

2017	\$300,000
2018	\$325,000
2019	\$350,000
2020	\$375,000

It is thus projected that over the five year period of expenditure, the collected fees for the trust fund with interest will be \$1,625,000.

I have reviewed these collections and projections with the County Finance Officer, who has concurred in these amounts and projections.

After conducting reviews, assessments, inspections and comparisons of concepts and alternatives, the monies will be applied to enhance and upgrade our existing Digital Records Imaging and Recording systems. Over the course of the next five years I intend to apply the monies to continue to modernize our recording services to include (but not limited to) the following specific enhancements:

- 1. Purchase additional hardware and software to allow our office to expand and mobilize the system utilized to provide Identification Cards to Veterans under the Veterans ID Card Act to Federal Veterans facilities like the one located in Brick Township.
- 2. Advancing to Level III of our e-Record System and portal through the installation of computer modules, hardware and software.
- 3. Purchase additional software to upgrade and modernize our computerized system for processing payments for title searcher copier accounts.
- 4. Purchasing software/hardware that enable our office to scan, process and electronically deposit checks.
- 5. Implementing software to establish a Property Alert Service which will automatically notify subscribers via email whenever a document is recorded in our office affecting their property.
- 6. Continue to fund our back scanning program which enables our office to provide on-screen digital images on a computer of prior records of recorded documents to match the indexed records on our land records computer system.
- 7. Purchase additional hardware and software to allow our office to expand the system utilized to provide Passport photos to our Lakewood office at the Northern Resource Center and at the County Connection at the Ocean County Mall.

2016 FIVE YEAR PLAN OF THE

OCEAN COUNTY SURROGATE'S COURT

The Office of the Ocean County Surrogate is an Elected position for a five-year term and is responsible first to the citizens of the County, the Ocean County Board of Chosen Freeholders, and to the Superior Court of New Jersey. The Surrogate's Court has the responsibility of probating Wills, qualifying Executors, appointing Administrators for those estates without Wills, qualifying Guardians of incapacitated persons and Minors, and operating the Surrogate's Intermingled Trust fund for Minors and Incapacitated Persons. This fund as of the end of 2015 was \$24,525,415.49 which consists of a primary account, secondary account, tertiary account and CD's, all of which is under the supervision of the Superior Court. The Surrogate is Judge of the Surrogate's Court and is also the Deputy Clerk to the Superior Court. The County is responsible for the funding of the Surrogate's budget for salaries and other expenses. All fees generated in the office are retained by the County. We currently have 17 employees which include Surrogate, Deputy Surrogate, Special Deputy Surrogate, Staff Attorney, Confidential Secretary, 4 Senior Probate Clerks Typists, Principle Account Clerk Typing, 1 Paralegal Specialists, 1 Clerk 3, 1 Keyboarding Clerk 3, 2 Keyboarding Clerk 2, and 2 Keyboarding Clerk 1.

The funds generated in this office are returned to the County on a monthly basis and are part of the anticipated revenue each year in the County budget.

<u>2015</u> The total expense budget for the Ocean County Surrogate's Court was \$995,698.00 and approximate expenditures were \$992,198.00. The revenue budget for the Ocean County Surrogate's Court was \$925,000.00 and the approximate revenue was \$1,082,676.44

2014 The total expense budget for the Ocean County Surrogate's Court was \$952,322.00 and expenditures were \$947,322.00. The revenue budget for the Ocean County was \$925,000.00 and the revenue was \$1,030,857.57

Other expenses average approximately \$42,746.00 per year. These expenses represent the cost for supplies, maintenance service contracts and other various expenses to operate the office.

SERVICES PROVIDED UNDER NEW JERSEY STATUTES

The Surrogate is empowered and directed to Provide by the New Jersey State Constitution, and New Jersey Statutes the following services for the citizens of Ocean County. The Surrogate shall record: (2B:14-6)

- Orders and Judgments of the Superior Court, Chancery Division, Probate Part;
- Fiduciary Bonds required by law;
- Accounts of fiduciaries, disclaimers, revocations, renunciations and requests;
- Wills proved before the Surrogate or the Superior Court, together with proofs;
- Letters Testamentary, of administration, of Guardianship or Trusteeship issued by the Surrogate and relevant documents;
- Receipts and releases given to fiduciaries; and
- Other documents, which the Surrogate is required by, law to record.

Acknowledgment, proof (2B:14-7)

Receipts and releases shall be acknowledged or Proved prior to recording. The acknowledgment or proof shall be recorded with the receipt or discharge by the Surrogate of:

- The County which is issuing the relevant letters;
- The County where the seller of real estate resides; or
- The County where the Trust-related property is located.

Recording (2B:14-8)

The Surrogate shall determine the means of recording instruments and the County shall furnish equipment and supplies for recording.

Filing (2B:14-9)

On the first Monday in February, May, August and November, annually, the Surrogate shall file with the Clerk of the Superior Court indexes of all Wills proved before the Surrogate or the Superior Court and a report of all letters of administration granted in the previous three months.

OBJECTIVES

The objective of the Ocean County Surrogate's Court is to carry out the statutory functions in accordance with the Title 3B of the New Jersey Statutes. Our office promotes quality service, assistance, and compassion for clients who require services at a most difficult time in their lives. We will continue to maintain the professional relationships that we have with the attorneys and all who appear in this office.

We distribute pamphlets to the public, both through our office and the County Connection at the Ocean County Mall. Since January of 2004 to the present the Surrogate has visited 310 various Senior Organizations and has handed out 75,400 books "A Planning Guide to the Probate Process' and "Personal Record books". The planning guidebook helps the general public understand the probate process as well as the importance of having a Will. The "Personal Record" book is for the purpose of listing all assets, the whereabouts of important papers, etc. This helps the heirs to locate important documents at the time of death.

On occasion, when a person is disabled and unable to come to the Surrogate's Court, paperwork is prepared in advance and the Deputy Surrogate goes to the person's home to have them qualify.

The Ocean County Surrogate's Court has 2 Satellite offices, which are open to the public: Manahawkin is open every Friday, and Whiting is open every Thursday, by appointments. One is located at the C.A.R.E.S Building in Whiting, and the other is located at the Ocean County Southern Service Center. It is our goal, upon completion of Phase II of our computerization, to have a 3rd satellite office at the Ocean County Connection for the purpose of probating Wills of those citizens unable to come to our main downtown office. On April 1, 2004 the Board of Chosen Freeholders authorized the Surrogate's Office to increase its hours from 8:30-4:30 to 8-5. To date the additional hour per day has had a slight reflection on services provided to our clients.

OFFICE MODERNIZATION FUND

Since 1988, the Surrogates, under the Law, received a \$2.00 rebate for certain procedures we file in our office. This has generated approximately \$70,000.00 to \$81,000.00 per year for this office. We have used these funds for Office Furniture,

Software Upgrades and purchasing additional licenses for our Imaging System. The Surrogate has been charged, under the provisions of the Laws of 2001, Chapter 371, to prepare and submit to the Ocean County Board of Chosen Freeholders, a "five year" capital plan for the use and expenditure of the check off fee revenues, which includes the interest generated thereon.

These fees are surcharges mandated by the Legislature to be paid for the processing of various documents in this office, the revenues of which are to be expended solely for **IMPROVING**, **RECORDING AND MODERNIZING** the functions of this office. These surcharges (\$2.00 per transaction anticipated 1% increase per year) are in addition to the normal revenues generated by this office.

These funds have allowed us to pay back to the County all of the cost for our total computerization and integration of all systems, which was accomplished through Specialty Systems. To date we have reimbursed the County of Ocean \$262,250.00 which represents all payments for our half of Phase II. This has enabled us to better serve the persons that use this office and keep the high performance of professionalism on a level that the community has experienced and deserved. The benefits to be derived from these expenditures and the "five year plan" will comply with and satisfy the statutory mandate for the use and commitment of these funds.

These funds have also allowed our office to begin funding a project to convert our current 86 Novell InForms forms into InfoPath 2010 client based forms. The Surrogate's current 86 Novell Informs forms will become obsolete and this project allows for modernizing and converting the current forms for the future services provided from our office. This project has an anticipated completion date of March of 2016.

Under Object Class 6900 in our 2015 County Budget we are requesting \$56,000.00, which is anticipated to be used to pay for Furniture and the Technical Support for maintaining and enhancing our Imaging/Docketing/Accounting/Minors Program along with computer equipment.

Also, we are requesting that \$100,000.00, which is anticipated to be used for the purchase of a new network switch that will increase the speed and capacity of our network. The new switch will enhance the efficiency of our network.

Attached is an outline for the projected plan. In developing this plan, we considered the needs for the future of this office as well as providing the best services with professional high standards.

We are satisfied that this plan will enhance our services, improve our documents recording systems, and in general, serve the public with the highest of standards. This has been our continuous goal and we are determined to meet these standards now and in the future.

Ocean County Sheriff Department Five Year Plan 2016 through 2020

Under the provisions of P.L.2001, C.370 (C.2B: 14-3 et al., the Ocean County Sheriff is to prepare and submit to the Ocean County Board of Chosen Freeholders a "five year" capital plan for the use and expenditure of the "check off fee" revenues, which includes the interest generated thereon.

These fees are surcharges mandated by the Legislature to be paid for the processing of various documents in the Sheriff's office, the revenues of which are to be expended solely for improving recording and modernizing the functions of this office. These surcharges are in addition to the normal revenues generated by this office.

Annually, this office has collected receipts and disbursed this money to the Treasury of the County. The history of the Sheriff's Departments collected check off fees for the past five years is as follows:

We have reviewed these collections with Julie Tarrant, the County Finance Officer and Comptroller who has concurred with this amount. Together with Julie Tarrant a projection for the current through the fifth year of this cycle has been developed. It is anticipated the following additional revenues will be received in the Sheriff's Department Trust account each year. Collections in 2015 were well over the budget forecasted last year. This is due to the moratorium on foreclosures being lifted and a high volume of these held over foreclosures have been coming in all year. Projected collections for 2016 should be approximately the same as 2015 or slightly lower and should level off in the following years.



BACKGROUNDThe Cedar Bridge Tavern is located on Old Cedar Bridge Road on a 4-¾ acre parcel of land just east of the Oswego River. The property is located

within the Pineland region of New Jersey. The Tavern faces north onto a

narrow dirt road, set back approximately 35 feet.

The Cedar Bridge Tavern was built circa 1816 on land purchased by John Monroe in 1745. The Tavern originally consisted of a bar room on the main floor with two rooms at the rear; a single staircase led to four bedrooms on the second floor. It is assumed that an out kitchen was part of the original construction. In 1836, an addition was built on the east end of the main block adding a kitchen and sitting room on the ground floor and additional rooms on the second floor. Originally used as a tavern on stagecoach lines, its last known license was issued in 1867. After this, the Cedar Bridge Tavern became primarily a residential building, housing alternately owners and tenants on nearby farms. Between 1816 and 1964, few alterations to the interior were made with the exception of the removal of a partition dividing the two rear rooms on the first floor of the main block.

Cedar Bridge Tavern was acquired by Rudolph Koenig in 1969 and he owned the property until the 21st century. During this time, significant

alterations were made to the exterior and interior of the tavern building. On the exterior, full-width front and back porches were constructed, all the exterior siding was replaced, several doors and window openings were removed on the east elevation, and new windows and doors installed. On the interior, the kitchen and sitting room in the 1836 addition were combined into one large kitchen and a bathroom, while on the second floor several partitions were added to create a bathroom, jacuzzi, closet, and sauna room. Koenig sold the Cedar Bridge Tavern and its 5-acre lot to Ocean County in 2007. Ocean County became full stewards of the property and building in 2012 upon Mr. Koenig's death.

PROJECT OBJECTIVE:

The project includes the restoration and adaptive use of the historic building, known as "Cedar Bridge Tavern," located in Barnegat Township. The Tavern is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Work will include restoration and rehabilitation of the exterior and interior with a gross floor area of 4,300 square feet. The general contractor should be familiar with the Secretary of Interior's Standards for the Treatment of Historic Properties. Work will include: extensive site improvements, repairs to traditional framing, masonry restoration, traditional cedar shakes and metal roof systems, doors, windows, and hardware restoration, repair of interior historic finishes, including plaster, wood floors, and painting. All the HVAC, plumbing and electrical systems will be replaced and sensitively installed minimizing damage to historic fabric. This is an important historic building with many historic finishes to be restored, which will require the expertise of contractors with a proven, verifiable record in relevant HISTORIC PRESERVATION WORK and coordination of similar trades.

SCOPE OF WORK:

Work is to be conducted to respect and conform to the Secretary of Interior's <u>Standards for the Treatment of Historic Properties</u> (Revised 1995). The project will include:

02 Site Work

- Complete any additional archaeology necessary to allow for the installation of the lean-to addition and site work, as determined to be necessary. Funds for this work will be from an Allowance.

The Freeholder noted that this parcel is approved for a 168 townhouse development. Freeholder Bartlett stated that the County has been looking at this parcel for some time; however, the asking price was too high. The original asking price for this parcel was \$12 million. The owner has now accepted an offer of \$5,450,000 which is \$100,000 lower than the lowest appraisal and includes the donation of a 3 acre lot at the end of Livingston Drive. developable market for homes. David McKeon, Planning Director was in attendance and stated that the County is pursuing available grants which may include \$1 million from the Trust for Public Land. Freeholder Bartlett advised that this will not go forward until the Little Egg Harbor Township governing body approves the acquisition. The Freeholder noted that once this Board acts on a recommendation from the NLTF, it goes to the municipality for their approval. This will be listed for the Board meeting of February 17, 2016 for acquisition.

Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda. There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the agenda for the February 17, 2016 Board meeting.

Ms. Vasil reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of February 17, 2016. There were no questions or comments.

Director Kelly asked the Board members for comments.

There were no comments from the Board members.

Administrator Block advised that Community Disaster Loans that were related to Superstorm Sandy can now be requested to be turned into loan forgiveness grants. A workshop will be held on April 14 to explain the criteria and the process. The Administrator advised that Julie Tarrant and Michael Fiure will be attending the meeting to represent the County. Freeholder Bartlett noted that FEMA still owes the County money which includes damages to County property such as Cattus and Berkeley Island Parks of approximately \$5 million. The Freeholder noted that these are damages that the County suffered that are FEMA reimbursable and stated it can take up to ten years for FEMA to settle all the claims from a disaster. The Administrator stated that Ms. Tarrant has been working very hard with all the paperwork associated with these reimbursements.

There were no additional comments.

Ms. Vasil read the resolution to move to closed session.

Director Kelly noted that at the conclusion of the Closed Session meeting, the Board will return to Open Session to close the meeting, stating that no formal action will be taken when the meeting returns to Open Session.
