DIRECTOR VICARI: "I'm going to refer back to number 1. Please read it by title. Then we have several members of the public that requested to speak and make a public comment which will then come to the Board. And again, this Board has always been very...in terms of every proposal that we do, for or against, whichever way it may go. So would you please read it by title please?"

Clerk Cilento read the Resolution, G-1 by title, opposing a constitutional amendment legalizing recreational cannabis use and sales and urging voters to vote "No" on the ballet question.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay. We will be voting only on this one item. Anyone in the public who would like to speak, please come forward to the microphone, state your full name and mailing address for the record. The gentleman in the front I said you would be number one. Do you want any special provisions prior to the...to aid you in the discussion?"

LEFTY GRIMES: "No. I'm good."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "We will be more than happy to do so. Thank you."

LEFTY GRIMES: "Good afternoon. My name is Lefty Grimes. I'm here to talk to you about your...whatever you're doing with the vote in November, I think it's wrong. I think you need to table this. I'm asking you to table this. What I really enjoyed was the prayer just now because I believe this room is full of Christian people, and I myself have been Christian, and I do fight for a lot of rights of people in wheelchairs – people with sick and dying – people that need cannabis. I was on opioids for 10 years. And I use cannabis now, exclusively. I don't use anything else but cannabis. And it's good to see Christian people here because I know that you have a good heart. And what you're doing by continuing this stigma of this...it's Jim Crow... let me back this up...the reason why cannabis isn't even legal is because of racism and sexism. There's a man named Harry Anslinger who took it upon himself to make cannabis illegal back in the last century with people like Hearst and Mellon. And Harry Anslinger went in front of Congress and he said things like this, he said, 'Reefer makes darkies think they're as good as white men.' That was said to Congress and this is why cannabis is illegal because of this - these racist, sexist comments here. Here's another one. 'There are over 100,000 total marijuana smokers in the U.S. Most are negroes, Hispanics, Filipinos and entertainers.' It talks about white women seeking sexual relations with Negroes. Now our government used to make it illegal for white people and black people to have sexual relations. So was the government wrong? Or were black and white people wrong? Well I would say the government was wrong.

When Rosa Parks was forced to go to the back of the bus, was the government wrong? Or was Rosa Parks wrong? Well they would say Rosa Parks was wrong but I would say the government was wrong. Harry Anslinger also said, 'Smoke a joint and you're likely to kill your brother.' In front of Congress he said things like, 'The primary reason to outlaw marijuana is its effect on the degenerate races.' This is called racism and disgusting. And that's why cannabis is illegal. And it's the stigma that we need to end. And I know Christianity has been politicized. We have liberal Christians like myself and we have conservative Christians. I don't know about the Republican Jesus. I don't think there is a Republican Jesus. I just don't think he exists. I just don't see it. He was a socialist. He lived on people's couches. He was homeless. He helped people. He helped people that were brown. He wouldn't put a wall up. He certainly wouldn't stop people from using God's medicine, because God put this medicine here for us.

If you look in Ephesians, in Genesis 19, it talks about cannabis. It talks about leaves of healing in Revelation. It talks about leaves of healing in Ephesians and Ezekiel - leaves of healing. Look it up. God put this here for us. It helps so many different conditions. So many different things. It's helped me. My friend Jeff couldn't make it here tonight because he's home throwing up from cancer. He wanted to come here and tell you this himself. I'm not half the man Jeff is. I'm not half the good speaker he is. He would come here and make you cry because he's fighting for his life. He's closer to God than anyone in here because he could die any day. And he was going to spend his night here with you to tell you you're doing the wrong thing – to table your Ordinance or whatever you're going to do – whatever this is – to table it. And I'm asking you to table it because Jeff's home puking right now. And that's what he wants you to do. And there's plenty of people that are sick right now that have cancer – so many people that have a sickness.

Oh, another thing – spend a day in a wheelchair. I'm moving towards wheelchair activism now. And I will ask you to spend one day in a wheelchair, even in this town. Spend one day in a wheelchair and you'll see what I mean about how people are suffering and we need to help people. We need to be helpful and not hurtful. And this Ordinance – whatever you're doing here is hurtful. And it's racist and sexist in its origin and we need to get past this. And at least, at least, table it. That's all I'm saying. Thank you very much. 'They shall grow not old, as we that are left grow old. Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn. At the going down of the sun and in the morning we will remember them.' Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much Lefty. Is there anyone else that would like to make a statement or comment? You can do so. And again, just one clarification I would like to make. This is for recreational marijuana. It is not for medical marijuana. This Board has supported medical marijuana. All we're talking about right now is a resolution, to clarify, it is not an Ordinance. It's a recommendation for the election coming up on November 3rd. Again, anyone else that would like to speak, just give your name and mailing address. Mr. Foster?"

SAM FOSTER, 108 TEAKWOOD DRIVE, BRICK: "I just want to say I attended the Brick Council Meeting...I think it was last year because this was a bad year. Like I said, first of all I want to thank the Board of Freeholders for being very respectful. Also, people in the audience...because when this man and the rest of his group showed up in Brick they were treated, I think, very unfairly. They were interrupted, and even insulted, so I do thank you for that. And this has only been a good Board of Freeholders for that purpose.

I wanted to speak in support of the...I just want to refer to this (agenda) so I'm getting my facts straight. This is just a resolution opposing it, but it has no authority or anything?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "That's correct. What it comes down to Mr. Foster is that there's an election Nov 3rd. When you receive your ballot you'll see there's a question to vote yes or no on an amendment to the State Constitution."

SAM FOSTER: "Okay."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "And that's all it is. It's not to do with anything else. It's an advisory we're making to the people of Ocean County. But one of the most important things right now is to listen to the comments from members of the public. Most are not from Ocean County – it doesn't make any difference. We're here at the Public Meeting. And I think the key word is – people will be treated with respect and we will listen to what they have to say in their comments."

SAM FOSTER: "And I appreciate that. I certainly appreciate that as well. This is my real point on the issue here. And I spoke about this during the Brick Council Meeting too, like a year or two ago, whenever it was. Since this is on the ballot - you know this is not a case of a municipality or a government making bone on it. I feel it should be left up to the people at the ballot box. I understand and I respect your position on this as far as you encouraging people to vote no, but I'd just like to point out that we do have a very big problem in this country with prison from population interlock - people that are in jail or prison because of marijuana possession for recreational use. And I understand, again, your position about the medical marijuana that everybody...I've never met anybody that's opposed to it because it does help with pain. I'm a disabled person and I was told that I qualify for medical marijuana as well as...my back injuries and everything. I've mentioned this during the council meeting that I was offered...my regular painkillers didn't help so my doctor offered me an opioid. I think opioid or opioid, whatever. And I said no because I know about the addiction problems with it. And I've never had an addiction problem, but I don't want to get in that position where by you do get one like...it has been proven that a lot of people that were up there on heroin are, well I shouldn't say a lot, but people that are on prescription medication for opioids...is it opioid or opioid? I think it's opioid."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Either one."

SAM FOSTER: "Say either? Okay. Interchangeable? They get hooked on it and then they go to heroin. It's a dangerous situation (inaudible). But from the specific standpoint of it should be left...I'm not telling you to vote yes or no but I'm just saying that my position is that we should allow the voters to speak on this issue. And by legalizing medical...recreational use of marijuana it's just that it's not really a violent crime. It would lessen the burden on the prison population so that we could put threats to society and have them incarcerated so we have to spend less money on prosecutions. The courts would not be so backlogged. I know that the Ocean County Courthouse, years ago, had a propboard. They had so many backlogged cases that they had to bring in judges out of retirement to prosecute cases – criminal cases.

And so Freeholder, this would be...you know, myself, I don't use marijuana. I've never have and I don't intend to. I just...but I do know people that have used it for medical purposes and I just feel that...I respect your opinion about your position on this issue but I just want to bring that out.

I do want to say something also about the issue of having the marijuana has been suppressed, so to speak, and I know that...I know that several of our former Presidents...this is going back to the 1700's, I think it was George Washington, even grew marijuana and hemp, which I know hemp is different than marijuana. And hemp was...the growing of hemp was suppressed because it made better quality ropes for like the sailing ships. So there is a lot of...I don't want to say discrimination, but I'm looking for the word...animosity or suppression of that from that standpoint. But I (inaudible) marijuana...it should be left up to the people at the ballot box and that's just my thing.

So, and I respect your opinion, I do. And like I said, once again I want to thank all of you for being very respectful. Also, members of the audience because Brick Municipal Court...Brick Municipal Council Meeting when this man (Lefty Grimes) was there, it was a zoo. But there was almost fist fights. Police had to be called and it got very heated. So thank you again."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much Mr. Foster. Like I said before, we respect everyone's opinion, no matter what it will be. Even if it is something different than the people in this room. Anyone else that would like to

speak on recreational marijuana? Just on number one. At the end of the meeting we'll talk about opening it up. This is one topic, again. This is only on discussing recreational marijuana. Is there anyone else that would like to make a comment or a statement? Yes sir?"

DAN VALENTINE, 660 HUCKELEBERRY LANE, TOMS RIVER: "Good afternoon friends."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Good afternoon."

DAN VALENTINE: "I am Dan Valentine. I am running for Ocean County Freeholder and I'm 100% for ending the war on drugs. I don't even consider it something that's a matter of opinion because when we're talking about something being illegal what we're saying is that people, peaceful people, will be locked in cages for what they choose to put in their bodies. And I don't argue that...I don't argue that there are no...hey, all drugs are okay...I've never used cannabis. I've never used other drugs. However, as Americans, as free people, we should be able to decide what we put in our bodies or not put in our bodies.

With regards to people that are addicts, I get to deal with them all the time with homeless ministry and our shelter here in Toms River and working with the churches. And people need help. Locking them in cages, which is what we're talking about, which is what is happening currently, is completely unacceptable. It's an atrocity. It's not a matter of opinion. This is the current state of affairs that you, my friends, in this organization, as are the police officers, are currently locking people in cages and it doesn't have to be this way. We can legalize these things. We can decriminalize these things and get people help instead of locking people in cages – completely unacceptable.

Oh, by the way, my address is 660 Huckelberry Lane in Toms River. I'm a local resident."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Mr. Valentine."

DAN VALENTINE: "Absolutely."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "As you probably know...I don't think you know but we're neighbors. I live two blocks away."

DAN VALENTINE: "Yes."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "And I think it's a great thing that you took the initiative to run for Freeholder this year as a Libertarian."

DAN VALENTINE: "Yes."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "And if you should win in 48 days you can have my spot. So again, just as we respect those who run for office, like yourself, as a Freeholder, there are three, two other candidates that are running against me. We also respect the opinion of Lefty who has his concern with recreational marijuana. And good luck November 3rd."

DAN VALENTINE: "Thank you."

SAM FOSTER: "And you get your parking spot too."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "And you also...that's a good point Mr. Foster. You also get a parking space."

DAN VALENTINE: "That's what it's all about."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "That is a good thing. Anyone else who would like to speak about recreational marijuana? Please come forward. We would like to listen to your opinion - just give your name and address please."

JAIME VAN SCIVER, PAULSBORO: "I live in Paulsboro but I'm common in the area. I enjoy surfing and volunteering and helping adults with developmental disabilities. You keep saying recreational. It's all medical use. In our bodies, we're all familiar with our cardiovascular system, our central nervous system. We have an endocannabinoid system. It's mostly malnourished in people - the entire system not getting what it needs. When it was not illegal we would get it from livestock, eating it in the wild, milk and meat. I personally am a medical patient. I have a laundry list of diagnoses. I'm actually very sick. It helped me tremendously. If I was left with the pharmaceuticals I don't think I would be standing here today. I was very sick. I felt toxic from the medications and I couldn't live like that. Please don't urge people to vote no."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much."

JAIME VAN SCIVER: "It changed my life."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you."

JAIME VAN SCIVER: "Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "And keep in mind the definition for recreational marijuana has been made by the State Legislature and the Governor in the State of New Jersey. We do not make that. What we're doing is voting on a decision that would be made on November 3rd. If you approve supporting the change to the constitutional amendment, which is a majority, a simple majority, so it would be 51% of the vote – not just here in Ocean County but throughout the State of New Jersey. Thank you for your comments. I appreciate them.

Anyone else who would like to make a statement or comment? There's one other...okay, yes sir? Come up."

JESSE EHRNSTROM: "How are you doing today? My name is Jesse Ehrnstrom. I live at 469 South Green Street, Trailer 36 in Tuckerton. So, I'm from Ocean County."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you."

JESSE EHRNSTROM: "Yeah, I lived in Ocean County for 27 years. And last September, I think it was September, I met up with Dan...I can't remember, Regenye? from the Ocean County Health Department. And the woman...I can't remember her name – with blonde hair – a really nice lady. I also met with the Ocean County Prosecutor, Bradley Billhimer. And what's interesting is that when I bring up the idea of decriminalization and attacking the ending the war on drugs and attacking the issue as a public health issue instead of a criminal issue, they're on board. The Ocean County Health Department is ready to attack this as a public health issue instead of a criminal issue. The Prosecutor's Office is ready to attack this as a public health issue instead of a criminal issue. He's like, 'Oh, we have this empty room. We can turn in to a rehabilitation center, whatever.' So we can rehabilitate addicts and bring them back into society and realistically help our economy instead of hurting the taxpayer by institutionalizing these people and perpetuating a system that sucks the money out of our pockets and keeps them inside of a cage like Dan said.

So what I really don't understand is if they're on board with ending the war on drugs, the only people standing in the way is the government. And you say this isn't anything, it's just a resolution. Yes, that's true. But you know how much influence your voice has in Ocean County especially. You've been in that seat for 39 years? What's Ocean County doing? The drug epidemic gets worse. Every single year there's more and more overdoses – more and more overdose deaths. There's 88,000 people a year die from alcoholism. You're not standing up against alcohol. You're opening liquor stores on every block in every town in Ocean County. You don't care about the people. You care about creating an anti-competitive market. You don't want recreational cannabis because you don't want average working class people to be able to rise up – start their own business and enter a market. Ocean County jobs are not really profitable jobs. I got lucky with Lidl. And there's not a lot of places that promote from within in Ocean County. And I know that you understand this at this point. You've lived in Ocean County for a long time. I've been here my whole life. Stop obstructing progress by creating literal obstructions with the government when we need...you can see it in Portugal...they decriminalize drugs – turned it into a public health issue. What happened? Addiction dropped – plummeted. AIDS plummeted because people weren't sharing needles anymore. This is more than just drugs. We don't vote to legalize...yes we vote to legalize cannabis. It's on your ballot. I got my ballot. I already got it in my mailbox, and that's fine. That's how excited I am to start this progress on ending the war on drugs. I was just standing at that corner over there with my sign, says support, home grow, patient, cannabis, home grow. She's right. It's all medical.

Let me tell you a story. I don't tell many people this story because it's very personal to me. When I was 17 years old I was on Zoloft, right? The path that you're supposed to take when you feel depressed and you go to your doctor and they prescribe you this medicine that's supposed to save you from this depression, right? I was on Zoloft. Where did I end up on Zoloft but on top of a building. Zoloft increased my suicidal tendencies. What got me off of that building was my friend offering to smoke cannabis with me. Cannabis, literally, has saved my life. That was 10 years ago. If I killed myself 10 years ago, I would be dead. And I wouldn't have been able to afford medicinal cannabis 10 years ago. So I don't know if you realize this, you probably don't because I don't think you're cannabis patients – probably not. But it's like \$480.00 for an ounce of cannabis and you probably don't smoke cannabis. An ounce is not a lot of cannabis. But it's not covered by insurance. You have to pay with cash. This system is messed up and you guys are part of that system. So do your part to fix the broken parts of this system. I don't know. Because Ocean County is asleep, they keep electing you jokers in anyway."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. Anyone else that would like to speak on recreational marijuana? Yes, sir? Just state your name and mailing address."

PETER CURATOLO, LACEY TOWNSHIP NJ: "I greet you today, Freeholders, first off as a citizen, and also as an elected official. I have a 15 year background in public health. I'm also the liaison to our Lacey Township Police Department.

I would like to say that I did not plan on speaking here today. I'd like to support your resolution 100%. Being intimately familiar with Law Enforcement Officials in our town, I can tell you without a reservation or hesitation, they are against it. I can tell you that there is a situation now...when you look at different jurisdictions that have it, in particular in California and in Colorado...there was a Lieutenant, Joe Shellhammer, who came out here to talk to a lot of our elected officials and a lot of our County Stakeholders. He had a forum at Ocean County College. He opened his comments by saying, 'You don't want to be us.' He went on for about 17 minutes on each slide – 17, 18, 20 minutes. He talked about property values plummeting. He talked about business per square foot values plummeting. I can tell you that I love our County. I love my town. I don't want to see it a destination for pot tourism.

Again, I didn't plan on speaking here today. An easy way to win a debate isn't to whittle it down to the singularity,

while I was on this, and so marijuana helped me here or to bring in other social issues with it. Recreational marijuana is something that our County doesn't need. We embrace our tourism. We embrace our business – our industry. It has been here for us for a great many years and under your leadership.

Again, I didn't plan on speaking here today. It's very difficult to make the argument for it but often times you hear it get minimized, 'Well, it's not as addictive as caffeine. Well, it won't raise your heart rate at the same way when you walk up a flight of steps.' People that are pro-recreational marijuana have to tell me why, and convince me and Police Chiefs why it's good public policy for public safety and public health, rather than something that they want.

I support your resolution. I support you. I like Ocean County without recreational marijuana. I like Lacey Township without recreational marijuana. And I thank you for what you've done here today."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much Mr. Curatolo. Anyone else before I close the public portion on this one topic? Yes, one more person and then it's your turn."

HUGH GIORDANO, 57 ARGYLE AVENUE, GLOUCESTER TOWNSHIP: "I'm here today to represent the United Food and Commercial Workers Union - UFCW Local 152. I am also here because we have supported the legalization of adult use. And although this resolution is not legally binding to anything, it does send a message. I agree with that sentiment. It sends a message that it's anti-jobs. This bill, if we're going to be factual, is already written. This bill is ready to go. It's just here waiting for the people to support it. The bill is going to create thousands of good paying living wage jobs with healthcare, vacation and retirement. The type of living wage jobs that New Jersey has been begging for, for years. And now specifically with COVID, it's even worse. This has also been labeled essential in other states, which means these people were still working during the pandemic, which means that these working class people had jobs, and they weren't on the system, as many people would say, which is not the system because those folks pay into it.

The other thing that's important to know here is social economic justice. That's a big issue we have in this country. And whether we like it or not, adult use arrest working class people who can't afford an attorney, unless they're in a union because they get those good union benefits. But outside of that, they're in jail, they're sitting there, and they don't get the same justice as other people who have the money and the funds to do so.

We are proud to be part of the NJ CAN 2020 – coalition to legalize cannabis. And we believe also that this is going to help our membership on a health and safety level. Many of our members are working people that work in factories and warehouses as well and do physical labor and go on opioids. Three out of five people that get addicted are through the medical realm – they get prescribed it. And the other two could come from God knows where.

Our members also will protect the consumers through adult use legislation. This makes sure that the drug dealer is not out there peddling stuff. Because the real gateway is the drug dealers because when you're 15 you're buying cannabis. When you're 18 and you got a job you're going to hard stuff and it gives you a little taste. That's the gateway. That's the real gateway. You don't see our members giving out, because we also represent alcohol, giving out Budweiser and Miller Lite to kids in parking lots. Why? Because it's controlled. It's regulated. Cannabis is here, I'm telling you it is, as a labor union guy, I deal with it all the time within our membership. It's a real issue.

But sending this message on this resolution is telling folks that you're anti-job, you're anti-working class, and it does have an impact on voters. You, as officials, have every right outside of this to have your own personal beliefs and say that you shouldn't vote for it because I personally don't do it, on your personal Facebook and on your twitter. But I believe this resolution is bullying, conservative republicans who may want to vote for adult use and I have a problem with that. Civil liberties and freedom – that's what it's about. Even as a union guy I believe in that too.

So I hope that you will table this. And on your own personal time, do what you like, but I think this sends the wrong message. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. Anyone else who would like to make any comments or statements? If there is no one else who would like to make any comments or statements I move the Public Hearing only on this one resolution be closed. Public comments are closed. And again, those people who spoke, we appreciate your opinion, your personal beliefs. That's what good government is all about is listening to everyone before we make a vote. And no decision has been made at this time, it's up to the members of the Board of Freeholders. It is only for recreational marijuana to make it straight. We appreciate the people who spoke. We have a candidate running for Freeholder in 48 days. Mr. Valentine, thank you for expressing your views as a Libertarian. We have someone who's a public official from Lacey Township, we appreciate your comments. And those people, not only that live in Ocean County, but many people that live in other parts of the State of New Jersey. That's what America is all about – it's listening, but you have to be treated respectively. There were no time limits on what you said. We let you speak as long as you wanted to. You followed proper procedure. Now it's the decision of the five members of this governing body to make a decision. And again, it's only for the ballot question. It's an advisory for November 3rd. This is put on, of course, by State Legislature and by the Governor of the State of New Jersey. And eventually, of course, there's a lot more to do as far as the regulation.

So if there's no other comments from members of the Board of Chosen Freeholders, I'd like them to consider what was said, and to either table it or make a motion for the approval of this resolution. Pleasure of the Board?"

On motion duly made by Freeholder Kelly, seconded by Freeholder Haines, Resolution G-1, opposing a constitutional

amendment to legalize recreational cannabis use and sales and urging voters to vote "No" on the ballot question was adopted on final reading.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Freeholder Kelly has made a motion for approval, seconded by Freeholder Haines. Any further discussions by members of the Board of Chosen Freeholders for the approval of this resolution? Seeing none, I call for a roll call vote."

Roll call vote was taken

DIRECTOR VICARI: "This resolution passes unanimously. And again, we thank all of those who came with their comments whether it was for or against, whatever the case may be. That's how America works. That's the process. And it was done in the manner that I think everyone can be proud of that attended this meeting today. Thank you very much. If you'd like to stay for the rest of the meeting it's up to you. We will continue with the rest of the business portion of the Freeholder meeting. Thank you."

Q. FREEHOLDER COMMENTS

At 4:38 PM, Freeholder Director Vicari received the following comments from members of the Board:

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Our weekly report on the COVID...we are spiking here in Ocean County. We, at one point, we were up as low as four new cases per day. We had six, four, seven...unfortunately we are reporting 121 new cases today. That brings us to a total of 11,897 cases. We did have 14 towns that had at least one case. Unfortunately, Lakewood has 71 of the 121. Long-term care facilities...we are continuing to maintain between 10 and 11 and 12 nursing homes that have a case. And again, for members of the public who may be new here, we were up to 50 at one point that had at least one case. So we only had 12 today that had at least one case.

Today we performed 106 tests at the Ocean County testing site which is run in partnership with the Health Department and the Board of Freeholders, this Board. And we have completed 8,949 tests at the College. And again, of interest, we see, it remains, those unfortunately the elderly, 85 and older who are experiencing the severe impact of COVID – they represent 37% of all the deaths, but only 8% of the cases. So that gives you an idea of how serious it's hitting the elderly. Hospitalizations are way down. Ventilator use is way down. I had a report today of one major hospital here in the County that has no one on a ventilator. So the seriousness, for the most part, seems to be ebbing a little bit. So perhaps, though, there's been a change in the virus. Hospitalizations are way down so that's a good thing.

And Freeholder Haines is always interested in the gender gap, so to speak. And normally, nationwide, it's more men that seem to become infected but not here in Ocean County. And we kind of feel that that's probably because the elderly...more ladies live longer. And so females represent 52% of the cases and males 47 - so 5% gap there. And I believe that's my report. Nothing else. We are concerned about the spike and that is serious. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Freeholder Little. Moving to my extreme left, Freeholder Haines?"

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "Thank you Mr. Director. I just want to give my condolences to Gerry and his wife and the family on the loss of his sister-in-law. I know it's been a very long time that she was suffering. Well now she's at peace and I just want to send my prayers to you and your family."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you Freeholder."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Freeholder Kelly?"

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Just agreeing with the rest of the Board Gerry, we send our condolences, not only to yourself, but to your wife and to your family."

JIMMY BLAVAT: "Secondly, coming down to like money is really important coming here and also to thank Freeholder Vicari - this pet rescue thing that you've been helping us with. This rate increase from JCP&L - it's a big help. You're helping the seniors with the pantry for food, for the pantry.

But I'd like to thank, in part, because of my limited income and my fellow ratepayers in Berkeley Township, I'd like to thank Freeholder Director Vicari, and my Mayor, Carmen Amato, for being the officials that testified in opposition to JCP&L's rate increases of 9%. So I'd like to thank you from all of us and I guess the rest of everybody in Ocean

County for fighting for us."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you."

JIMMY BLAVAT: "Thank you so much."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "What Mr. Blavat is talking about is that there was a Public Hearing via across the Zoom which we did in the Administrator's office with our Professional Staff. And I represented the County of Ocean with the resolutions that we sent and it was advertised. But the only one who spoke against the rate increase, besides myself, was Mayor Amato, who did an outstanding job. And I basically restated what we said before, is that JCP&L should have the responsibility, the same as the other utility companies, Public Service Electric & Gas, Atlantic City Electric and ConEdison to make reimbursements for food and medicine which they refused of course. When I spoke to JCP&L, which they refused even to listen to or reconsider so I thought I could (inaudible) the Board of Utilities. And also I had suggested that perhaps when the franchise comes up that they should not renew it unless they become more responsive and improve the power grid. As you know, our Administrative Staff is very concerned with some of the comments from other people outside Ocean County that actually support it – the rate increase. And said that maybe it should be legislation to give them more money. You know it's obvious that it was scripted. They knew what they would say - they read it. And there had to be some kind of a personal relationship. I don't know exactly what happened. But it's part of the public record and I want to request that I do have a copy of it. I think it should be investigated by the Attorney General. I mean, it looks like there was conspiracy, in my opinion. And again, it's only my opinion. Of course those who listen to the testimony...the corporate autocracy we've been talking about many, many times before where corporations have too much power – where they influence public officials – both Democrats and Republicans - where there are Political Action Committees, the lobbyists. They have too much of an influence on what's taking place. And they should be looking at what's good for the people – what they represent and what they

So again, I was very disappointed in the process. But again, Mayor Amato stood up, I stood up, and several other people. But a large majority of those, in my opinion, I never heard of anything like that in all of my years as a public official where people would come from all over the State of New Jersey, and actually, not only give their name and address, but give representation to support the rate increase without any improvement to the utilities. So thank you Mr. Blavat. I appreciate those comments. Anyone else? Mr. Foster? I think I saw your name."

SAM FOSTER, 108 TEAKWOOD DRIVE, BRICK: "First I want to give Freeholder Little my condolences to you for your loss."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you."

SAM FOSTER: "I know I had lost several family members over the years. It's always difficult for me. Both my grandparents and my mother and a couple of my aunts so I understand what you're going through. Unless you lose a loved one you don't really know – you cannot really understand it deeply but I just want you to know how I felt."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you."

SAM FOSTER: "I also want to thank you also for the COVID-19 updates. That's very good. I did have a question on...maybe not a question but actually this. On the subject of indoor dining, because we have that spike, I wanted to know...maybe the Health Department...the Health Department is here tonight, right? Or no?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "No."

SAM FOSTER: "No? Oh okay. They're usually..."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "But if you have any questions maybe we can help you out or we'll get back to you."

SAM FOSTER: "Because I've been eating out now, as you can tell but no more of my home-cooked meals that I end up throwing out. But a question about the indoor dining... and my point is... does anybody know or is anybody familiar with anything that could be done like an air-scrubbing system? I used to be a Computer Operator and we had worked in the mainframe in the data center and had these air filtration devices built in the ceiling. And what they'll do is they would suck up the dust and you'd hear the zapping every once in a while. Now is there any kind of an air filtration system that is fine enough, to filter or anything else that would filter out the COVID-19 virus or any other virus?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "You know I don't have the expertise."

SAM FOSTER: "I don't know if it's expensive or not but I just had a question about that because if that could happen...that's why I'm asking...maybe you could check into it. I would imagine someone's thought of this already because...I remember my first job was back in 1989 as a Computer Operator. I heard a zapping going on. It was the filtration system sucking up the dust. So I don't know if it will be expensive or something that could be looked into or something along those lines. Because you know I was in...not to plug...I was in Shop-Rite and I bought this little thing that's an ultraviolet light device that's supposed to kill germs and I'm of course against COVID-19, not to hype things up or anything. But something like that or something that could suck the air through it."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "It's something to look at and when I talk to somebody at the Administrator I'll let them know. The ultraviolet light they do sell I have one in my home also. I know what you're talking about. I don't know if it's being used in an institutional basis but I know they do make those. Ours is small. You can get that online but it does kill the virus."

SAM FOSTER: "I got one for like 20 bucks. It's just a little thing like..."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Whatever. It should also be very good."

SAM FOSTER: "Yeah, but if they don't have a device like that what I do is just filter the air through so that it passes through the light and like it sterilizes it or whatever. If they don't...if they could patent that maybe someone will. It's something to check into."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I may race you to the patent office."

SAM FOSTER: "I would imagine someone would have the idea to do that though because it seems like a, you know, a pretty simple thing to do. But I don't know how expensive it would be."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "True. Thank you Mr. Foster. Anyone else who would like to speak before I end the public portion? If there are no other questions or comments, it's 4:50 (PM), I close the public portion. Thank you for attending. Pleasure of the board to close the meeting?"

WHEREAS, New Jersey voters, in this 2020 General Election, will be asked to approve or disapprove an amendment to the State Constitution that legalizes the recreational use of cannabis and cannabis-related products, including marijuana, for persons 21-years-of-age and older; and

WHEREAS, this constitutional amendment will not limit the amount of tetrahydrocannabinol (or THC, the chemical in cannabis that induces the "high") that can be present in these recreational cannabis products and could have 99% THC content; and

WHEREAS, it is a well-established medical fact that the habitual use of cannabis products with high THC content can have detrimental mental health effects. Young adults whose brains are still developing are susceptible to severe psychosis, such as schizophrenia; and

WHEREAS, this constitutional amendment also does not limit the types of cannabis products that can be sold and consumed; and can be sold in candy-form, such as gummies and chocolates, which are attractive to young children, and as oils used in vaping devices; and

WHEREAS, THC consumed via cannabis edibles can take hours to be absorbed into the human system and provide the sought-after "high," so it is very common for these consumers to overdose on these edibles thereby inducing hallucinations, paranoia, or severe nausea; and

WHEREAS, this constitutional amendment provides municipalities that have previously banned cannabis stores can be forced to allow pot stores within their borders; and

WHEREAS, a bill to accomplish the same ends could not even gain enough support in the NJ Legislature to be voted on; and

WHEREAS, according to the NJ Legislature's non-partisan professional staff, the constitutionally-imposed tax on cannabis products will raise only \$126 million in State revenue or just 0.031% of Governor Murphy's \$40 billion-plus proposed FY'21 budget; and

WHEREAS, this paltry new revenue is not likely to cover the lost revenues from the local businesses adversely affected by legalized recreational cannabis combined with the new costs from the added regulatory bureaucracy and from the negative health consequences of legalized cannabis, costing New Jersey taxpayers money; and

WHEREAS, this meager amount of revenue cannot make up for the costly potential impact and loss of life associated with individuals operating motor vehicles under the influence of marijuana; and

WHEREAS, the preceding facts clearly demonstrate that it is utterly inappropriate and dangerous to use the Constitution of the State of New Jersey as the means to legalize the recreational use of marijuana.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean oppose the constitutional amendment legalizing recreational cannabis use and sales and, accordingly, urges voters to vote "No" on the ballot question.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this resolution be sent to the municipal governing bodies of this County, the Boards of Education responsible for educating students of the County, and local media outlets.



This Pre-Board Meeting was held in Room 119 to abide by social distancing guidelines set forth by Governor Murphy. There were 10 participants in the room at a time. A nurse interviewed and took temperatures of all in attendance. Carl Block stated that the Pre Board meeting was open to the public following guidelines for room capacity.

Freeholder Director Vicari opened the meeting by calling upon Freeholder Little to give a Coronavirus update. Freeholder Little gave the stats as of June 24, 2020. There were 27 new cases and 9,453 cases in Ocean County thus far. 52.2% of those infected are females, and 47.2% are males. 32% of all cases are age 65 and over which accounts for 85% of all deaths. There were 9 new deaths, totaling 866 in the County. There were 54 COVID-19 tests performed on 6/24/20, and 5,135 total at the OCC testing site.

Official Resolution Free moder Director Vicari spoke about a tax rebate for senior citizens which would affect 70,000 of the County's seniors. He said that many seniors are having difficulties

dealing with the changes that have taken place during the pandemic. The home delivered meals are extremely important at this time. New Jersey has removed two vital programs for the Ocean County state budget. The Freeholder Director feels these two budget items need to be made permanent. The County will be sending letters to the State of New Jersey asking for relief for seniors and veterans as well. Ocean County will be the first in the State to come forth and fight for these programs to be reinstated.

Freeholder Haines stated that the municipalities can "stop the clock" and hold off on balancing their budgets until September.

Mr. Block told the Board that the proper wording for the resolution regarding the senior tax break will need to be finalized before the Board meeting on July 1, 2020.

Freeholder Haines and Mr. Agliata reported on two Open Space acquisitions that have been recommended by the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee. There is a 2.75-acre property in Ocean Township which borders 57 acres of preserved NLTF property located off Lighthouse Drive. The landowner accepted a negotiated offer of \$7,000.00. The NLTF has also reviewed the acquisition of 167.52 acres consisting of multiple tracts off North Bay Avenue and Church Road adjacent to over 460 acres of Natural Lands property near Ocean County College in Toms River. These are owned by the Township, but contain environmentally sensitive areas that could be potentially sold and developed privately. The Township accepted the County's offer of \$1,880,000.

Freeholder Quinn provided an update on the 2020 Household Shredding Program which will run from July 11, 2020 through October 24, 2020 at various locations throughout the County.

Mr. Ernst and Freeholder Kelly reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the reconstruction and resurfacing contract 2019D that spans 7 miles of County roadways in Berkeley, Toms River, Manchester and Plumsted. A memo was issued requesting the rescinding of the award of the reconstruction and resurfacing of River Avenue from West End Avenue to Central Avenue in the Borough of Island Heights to Seacoast Construction dated June 17, 2020 due to a clerical error, and requesting the award be granted to Earle Asphalt instead. A new professional service contract was awarded to Greenman-Pedersen, Inc. for professional engineering services for a local preliminary engineering study for the Garden State Parkway Exit 83 southbound exit not to exceed \$999,998.34. This is reimbursable contingent on NJDOT approval. There were no questions or comments and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the July 1, 2020 Board meeting.

Ms. Cilento reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of July 1, 2020. There were no questions or comments.

Freeholder Director Vicari asked the Board members for comments.

Freeholder Haines discussed a Zoom meeting that she participated in regarding Ocean County College. Jon Larsen, the President of Ocean County College, said that the school is ranked the number 1 County College in the State. He mentioned a 14% increase in summer enrollment, while 2 North Jersey County Colleges are failing. Ocean County College received funding that will enable students to stay enrolled during difficult times.

Freeholder Director Vicari said the Ocean County Mall will be opening soon with social distancing modifications in place. The Freeholder reported that the County has been working with small businesses to assist them in getting grants and loans to help them stay afloat during the pandemic.

There were no additional comments.

Ms. Cilento read the resolution to move to closed session.

On a motion by Freeholder Quinn, seconded by Freeholder Little, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 4:41pm for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was unanimously carried.
