At 4:21 PM, Freeholder Director instructed the Clerk of the Board that he wanted to go back to the presentation for the "Autism Awareness Month" proclamation.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "What I would like to do Mrs. Vasil is go back to the proclamation for "Autism Awareness Month". We have representatives here. We have the Executive Director, Dr. Suzanne Buchanan and Debbie Charette that come officially every year. We know the importance of what we have. I don't know if many, many years ago, you worked with Congressman Chris Smith. The interesting thing is 15 or 20 years ago before they realized the importance of education and research and the numbers all this week are really staggering. It is a terrible thing that 1 in 68 nationally had autism, 1 in 45 in the State of New Jersey, 1 in 25 boys, and I just found this out today from talking to people, it's a higher level for anyone that served in the military. And our goal again, is when we present this to you is not only the awareness, but of course, the research as seen on today's reports (inaudible). So again, if you would just come up. Mrs. Vasil I think you can summarize the whole thing with the proclamation."

Clerk Vasil read the proclamation which was scheduled for presentation at this time.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "The Board would like to thank you for not only coming today, but we want to show you our support as far as the importance that you do every single day. So if you would just come up and give a few words. You know with early intervention it's been proven that we help children in the early stages, if not lifelong. They can actually function in life and get a job and they can have as much as possible a normal, productive life in society. So again, do you want to say a few words and just tell us what your job is and what your're doing?"

DR. SUZANNE BUCHANAN, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF AUTISM NEW JERSEY: "Thank you for the invitation. I'm a licensed psychologist so I also know firsthand the affects of effective intervention and how we can drastically improve the quality of life for individuals with autism and their families. You mentioned in the last topic discussed regarding land acquisition about how important community support is. And I just want to echo that sentiment for the autism community because there are so many parents and extended family members who feel isolated because they feel that can't take their individual either son or daughter to the park or even out to Target or food shopping. And those are basic, everyday epiphanies that community support can make a world of difference. So we truly appreciate all of you, your support. Director Vicari thank you. D. RESOLUTION - PUBLIC HEARING

Clerk Vasil read the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee recommendation resolution by title, which was scheduled for Public Hearing at this time.

Director Vicari opened the Public Hearing on the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee recommendation resolution to the public for comments.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "This is very important to us in Ocean County. It's a major step in making sure we preserve our Joint Base. As we know, the important economic impact this would have if this was cut during the BRAC. The Board of Freeholders have fought five times and we have been very, very successful in making sure that the mission of Joint Base is not only continuing to stay there, but we want to expand the mission over there. What we have done is we're making sure we purchase land around it so there's no infringements of anyone complaining about the noise of the aircraft and in the future we hope that there will be more aircraft and helicopters in that particular area. I would like Dave McKeon just to give a brief overview of what's going to take place. Any questions, Captain Fletcher is here from the base to support our acquisition today. This is the largest purchase that we have made. I believe that we started this in 1990.....many, many years ago. It was a long time ago. Maybe '98. What we did was we went before the voters of Ocean County, we said look are you willing to tax yourself 1.2 cents and are you willing to make sure that we can buy the land cash. By buying cash, we're not bonding it, of course, and it has a great economic power to it because within a reasonable amount of time we can make sure that we buy the land and we've been very successful. Mr. McKeon if you just want to give a brief overview in relationship to where we're buying the land in two towns, Lacey and Manchester and also the closeness of the military base."

DAVID MCKEON, OC PLANNING DIRECTOR: "Thank you. Freeholder Bartlett has some specifics on it, but in general I just wanted to point out the location of this property. And this is, I know it's tough to orientate yourselves, but this is Manchester Township out in the Whiting area. This is Bamber Lake in Lacey Township. And what we're acquiring here is everything in purple that can be seen. In addition, there's about a hundred acres in red that is in close proximity to Harry Wright Lake in Manchester. The township has an interest in acquiring some of those lots for open space. They're scheduled to take action later this month to do that and if so they'll be bringing money to the table to help offset the deal.

Now, as the Freeholder mentioned, this small area in blue is the southern end of the Joint Base and that's what made this property also attractive to us. Number one, you can see all of this green is already preserved land. This really adds into that preserved land near the Roosevelt City area and it's an environmentally sensitive area that's been documented as an important habitat of the Pinelands. The military aspect is something that's an extra benefit to us as has been mentioned. This again is a map that's going to be hard to see, but this entire brown area here is the Joint Base that spans from Burlington County over to Lakehurst. It's 42,000 acres. A huge facility. And all of the colors surrounding that brown is preserved land in one form or another. Yellow is preserved farm land in both Burlington

and Ocean County out by New Egypt which we've done through our Farmland Preservation Program. The dark green is State Forest/Wildlife Management areas. The red properties are previous properties we've partnered with the military on in call-shares in acquiring because they serve, the properties serve our Natural Lands Program as environmentally sensitive, but also helped buffer the Base so that the Department of Defense actually put money into it. And then the Green Acre areas are also properties that we have purchased within five miles of the Base which again make it attractive.

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Excuse me, Dave, would you point out where we've been able to preserve land in the flight paths at least in the Lakehurst part of it that we're very familiar with. Because I think that's very impressive."

DAVID MCKEON: "Right. This area right here in Jackson Township is in the flight path area of the Lakehurst C-17 runway and this was a high priority for us. We concentrated there and have preserved thousands of acres in that area. We also were able to get very innovative in the gravel pit. A very large gravel pit there. The owner was not interested in selling the property, however, we worked with the Trust for Public Land to negotiate an easement where we purchased the development rights for residential development in the future. So we bought out any opportunity to build houses there in the future. He's free to come later with something that might be compatible to the Base and that's what is important again for economic development. There may be some development that doesn't mind plane noise and could actually provide services to the Base or work in cooperation with the Base. Research and development opportunities and so on. So what there is there is a 1400 acre easement that allows non-residential development, but takes away what the Base is concerned about and that is aircraft noise and houses which don't mix.

The property in question for today is actually down here again. So you can see it's at the southern end of the Base near the Fort Dix, the traditional Fort Dix Base where there is training and testing and so on and noise from time to time. And that also is an area that the Base has asked us to look at to address future encroachments."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Mr. McKeon. And again, just to restate it. It's 1,760 acres in Manchester and Lacey Townships. This is the largest acquisition that we have ever made with this program. And again, it's a major benefit. It does two things. It preserves the open space in Ocean County and we do it by two ways with not only purchasing land but also purchasing the easement. So if someone has a farm and you buy the development rights to it and they can have a farm, they own the land, they can farm it, but they cannot have residential development. And that's one of the reasons why, as Freeholder Little will tell you later on, he keeps records up of all of the land that we have there. And again, our goal is to protect the property from potential encroachment from the Joint Base Maguire/Dix/Lakehurst and the Base conducts operations near the Whiting area and we just want to make sure that when we go for the BRAC that we have a positive input from the community. The community support is very, very important. To this date, it's important also, we've acquired 23 properties within five miles of the Joint Base, over 4000 acres. Thirteen of those acquisitions were in partnership with the Defense Department. So a lot of land we work with the Defense Department. An additional 2900 acres of farmland has been preserved within five miles of it which means they can keep it as a farm, but they can't have any development there, which is fine with us because we need farms throughout the area.

And again, we're going to continue to be a partner with the Joint Base and we appreciate Captain Fletcher coming today. As far as the numbers, Freeholder Bartlett would like to give a little overview of the money that will be spent. Freeholder Bartlett."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Thank you Mr. Director. As you know, this is all paid for by cash in hand from our Natural Lands Trust special tax that was voted on by the public some time ago. This purchase price is \$5.7 million. As you pointed out Mr. Director, this is the largest acreage that we've ever purchased in one fell swoop. Manchester Township is at this point prepared....is in all likelihood prepared to contribute approximately half a million dollars and take over title of those properties that were outlined in red and as they receive more funds from the State they are probably going to devote those toward this as well. But again, Manchester Township has been very helpful in this whole thing. I'd also like to point out and I think this is very important, that we are buying this for \$600,000 less than our own market appraised value. So the appraisal came in at \$6,343,000 and we said to the owner that we really didn't have that much to put forward to it and he settled for a reduction and that reduction is about \$600,000 from the appraised price. So we got a good deal. It's a good piece of land. It serves a good purpose and it joins together as we've seen on these very large scale maps, tremendous acreage in Ocean County. So we're very, very pleased with it and I thank you for your presentation."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank Freeholder Bartlett. Freeholder Gerry Little keeps records of all the acreage that we buy."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. That is kind of a tradition that we discuss every time we have one of these purchases is to talk about the totals that we have which is a product, a work product, that's produced by our Planning Department. And, just for the record, Ocean County, the entire acreage, in the whole County is 408,384 acres. 408,384, and with this acquisition including the military, preserved areas, the Edwin B. Forsythe Wildlife Refuge, the State Parks, State Wildlife Refuges, the New Jersey Natural Lands Trust has some acres preserved and with our County preserved areas, this now brings us to almost 230,000 acres of the total acres 408,000 are permanently preserved. Including the Pinelands protected areas. So we are almost, again, at 60% of the County of our total acres are preserved, forever, and when you count the municipal parks and so forth, we are at 60%. So that's kind of a neat threshold and certainly points well to the future of Ocean County in preserving our quality of life and our environment here in the County for our children and certainly the citizens of today, that we enjoy our County.

And also, this brings our County Park preserved areas, our Natural Lands Trust, our Farmlands, to 24,441 acres. A long time ago we just started with our parks which were about 4,000 acres. The parks. So the Natural Lands and the Farmlands assessment is now about 20,000 acres that have been preserved since '97. I think it started in '97. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Any comments from members of the Board of Freeholders? At this time I would like to open up to members of the public. Anyone who has any questions or comments please come forward to the microphone and the first one, of course, is going to be Captain Fletcher. We thank you for coming today and you know you have our support, but it's always good to say it publicly. We put our money where our mission is. Our mission is, of course, is to protect the Base."

CAPTAIN CHRIS FLETCHER, JOINT BASE MAGUIRE/FORT DIX/LAKEHURST: "Thank you for the opportunity to speak here real quick. I am Captain Chris Fletcher. I am the Navy Deputy Commander for the Joint Base Maguire/Dix/Lakehurst and we certainly appreciate all the support from the community on this. As one of our top priorities is to be good neighbors and I think this works out as a win-win for both the community and for the Base. This will help enable our mission partners on the Base. Enabling our mission partners is a top priority because that will bring more mission partners into the Base and it will help the community flourish. So I think its definitely a win-win. Thank you very much for the community and for everybody's support."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Captain. This is the Public Hearing. If anyone else would like to make a statement or a comment please come forward and state so. If there are no other comments or questions I think we could have support from anyone that's here."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Could I make one final comment Mr. Director?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Freeholder Little."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Captain, we'd like to thank you for appearing here and Ocean County is certainly very proud of our military. And I'm very proud to tell you that Freeholder Lacey's son, I don't know if you know, is a Commander and a Navy Pilot and my son is an Ensign. A freshly minted Ensign. So we thank you for your service in the Navy. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "If there are no other questions or comments I move to close the Public Hearing on this resolution. What's the pleasure of the Board?"

No additional comments were received, therefore, the Public Hearing was declared closed.

On motion duly made by Freeholder Kelly, seconded by Freeholder Lacey, the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee recommendation resolution was adopted on final reading.

R. FREEHOLDER COMMENTS

At 4:29 PM, Freeholder Director Vicari received the following comments from members of the Board, as follows:

DIRECTOR VICARI: "This is our time for comments from members of the Board of Freeholders and then I will open up to members of the public. I just have one statement. As you know, our Department of Consumer Affairs is very active in protecting the consumer and there have been several major comments as far as the 401k's and Deferred Compensation. So I sent a survey to twelve people that I know including accountants. I said 'are you aware of the fact that over the lifetime, for those people that have 401k's and deferred compensation, that there are hidden fees'. By hidden fee I mean you pay up to 2%. It's built in and it's \$155,000.00 would pay on the total assets of it. So I have Steve Scaturro that's looking into it. And, if that fee is built in, there should be a disclosure once a year.

So if you have a 401k or deferred compensation and you write a letter and I called up and tried to get a straight answer from them. They told me it was too complicated to explain. They told me with the computers and all they can't. Now here's what happens, it's on the assets. So even if you have the money in that fund, year after year, when you retire it's 2%, 1-1/2% to 2%. \$155,000.00 on the average one. And, something else they say, that gives you 28% less when you retire because of the compounding effect of that. The feature story was in Kipling Magazine. And again, in the weekly magazine, I made copies of it and I gave it to accountants. I gave it to different people. What I'm saying is that if you have to pay the fee, why is it a hidden fee? It should be full disclosure. So I challenge anyone. If you have a 401k, deferred compensation, call them up and say what did you pay last year 2013 and you try to get an answer because I've been trying for six weeks and I can't get an answer from anyone. And again, that's the reason why you need Consumer Protection sometimes because what happened was this was implemented in the 1970's. The lobbyists were so strong in Washington they intentionally, what they did was, they make sure they have the golden egg in there and then they get that money. So even when it goes down, no matter what happens to it, they get from 1.5% to 2% and they call it a hidden fee and they say you don't pay for it. But the answer is yes, you do pay for it because it's part of what's built into the portfolio. If you ask them a question they'll send you a stack of papers like that you just can't believe, but technically they're right. I'm not saying it's illegal, but you have a right to have full disclosure on the money that you worked real hard for. Our County workers....I was talking to somebody that was retiring and I'm saying a lot are going to have a difficult time when they retire if they live in New Jersey and that would help them a substantial amount and they should be full open disclosure of that fee. So Mr. Scaturro you know your job and he did a lot of work coming back and forth. I'm amazed sometimes at some of the answers that you do get. So again, that's a challenge to try to get the right answer."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. Captain, one of the other traditions we do here occasionally when I receive notice of this, Ocean County has....we're very proud that Ocean County has more veterans living here

in our County than anywhere else in the State. Around 60,000 or so. In any event, so one of the things we do is when I receive a notice from the Defense Department about the identification of the remains of soldiers and sailors and airmen and Marines that we've lost in previous wars and they're return, we always note it for our record. Just so that we acknowledge it.

The Defense Department announced this week that three Marines that were killed in Korea have been identified and returned. Marine Corp Cpl. William F. Day, Company H, 3rd Battalion, 11th Regiment, 1st Marine Division, was killed on December 2, 1950 in North Korea. He was accounted, his remains were accounted for and identified on March 6th and he will be buried with full military honors on April 5th this week in Kentucky.

Army Pfc. Arthur Richardson, Company A, 1st Battalion, 19th Infantry Regiment, 24th Infantry Division, was killed on January 1, 1951 in South Korea. His remains were identified on March 21st this year and he will be buried at a site yet to be determined.

Marine Corps Cpl. William S. Blasdel, Company H, 3rd Battalion, 11th Regiment, 1st Marine Division was lost on October 28, 1953 in North Korea. His remains were identified on March 10th and he will buried with full military honors at the National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific later on this spring.

And one other piece of information of note we've heard this week especially on some of the more liberal cable networks about a Senate hearing and Senate report that's going to be issued on some of the enhanced interrogation that allegedly occurred during Iraq and Afghanistan wars. But, this week, here's a fellow that didn't complain too much. He was shot down over North Vietnam. He spent seven and a half years in the Hanoi Hilton. Seven and a half years. And he told the Los Angeles Times in 1979, 'they, meaning the North Vietnamese, beat you with fists and fan belts. They warmed you up and threatened you with death. Then they really got serious and gave you something called the "rope trick". The use of ropes to cut off circulation in your limbs. They left you with no feeling in your fingertips and intense muscle spasms. Some of the most severe torture came in 196 in which the North Vietnamese filmed him for a what was supposed to be a propaganda film and it was somehow released and it was shown on television here in the United States. And, he blinked by Morse code, it's kind of a forgotten technique now, but the more short long and all that stuff, but he blinked his eyes on film and he blinked out T-O-R-T-U-R-E, torture, which of course when the American intelligence community had a chance to review that film they understood he was sending a message that he was being tortured. In any event, he received the Navy Cross which is the second highest Navy decoration for blinking his eyes and blinking the word torture so that he could tell the United States and the world that he was being tortured in North Vietnam. And, of course, the Hanoi Hilton was where, more famously I should say, John McCain was held. The same torture chamber. In any event, that was in 1974 when the tape was released. He was promoted to Rear Admiral and retired from the Navy in 1977 and then he ran for office and became the first Republican United States Senator from the state of Alabama since the reconstruction after the Civil War. The first Republican. And, his name was Jeremiah Denton and he died this week in Virginia at the age of 89. So we remember Senator Denton and Admiral Denton for his service. Thank you Mr. Director.'

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Freeholder Little."

S. **PUBLIC COMMENTS** - Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of **five (5) minutes** per speaker.

At 4:38 PM, Freeholder Director Vicari opened the meeting to receive comments from the public, as follows:

WILLIAM GUMPER, HOLIDAY CITY, BERKELEY: "On Traffic Safety Improvements, I believe it's Group I, Item 3 authorizing a revision of Speed Limits along C.R. 55. As I travel that road a number of times I'd like to get a little more accurate information on it. Now it is, where is it now? A revision of the speed limits along that road. Are the speed limits going to be upgraded to a higher or lowered to a lower speed? And if so, what speed?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Freeholder Kelly."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "They will be lowered to a lower speed. It's part of a series of steps we're taking on that road. We had some concerns that came to us through a resident of Berkeley Township. I put together a phone teleconference between myself, the Mayor, the Chief of Police and the Traffic Safety Law Enforcement Officer in Berkeley Township and there are a series of steps we're taking. There have been a number of accidents in that area. The Police Chief herself has taken some steps to increase vigilance in the area with some monitoring of those violating the speed limit. But this is just an action that we took at the request of residents, the Mayor and the Police Department in Berkeley Township."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "I agree with that. That's the right thing to do. What would the speed limit be when it's downgraded. From what to what.""

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Frank, what was the speed limit? 40?"

FRANK SCARANTINO, COUNTY ENGINEER: "It's dropping to 40."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Dropping to 40 miles per hour."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "From what? 45?"

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "45 I believe. But, I think the bigger issue there than the speed limit was the speeders. In other words, people going much higher than the 45 mile per hour speed limit and that's what we talked to the Police Chief about and she has indicated that there will be increased vigilance on the part of the Police Department to monitor the traffic in that area."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "I'm very pleased with that and I certainly agree with that 100%. There's a tremendous amount of traffic on that road at certain times of the day. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. Anyone else who would like to make a comment or ask a question? Seeing none, I move that the public hearing be closed. What's the pleasure of the Board?"

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING) AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. - WHEREAS, the voters of Ocean County authorized the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund to provide funds for the acquisition and preservation of natural lands, open spaces and farmland; and
- WHEREAS, the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee was established by the Board of Chosen Freeholders to review nominations to the program and forward recommendations for acquisition to the Board of Chosen Freeholders; and
- WHEREAS, the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee has received a nomination for the property identified in Addendum A, with numerous blocks and lots subject to a final determination by survey and title search, totaling approximately 1,760 acres in Lacey and Manchester Townships; and
- WHEREAS, the property is adjacent to a large number of public lands including State-owned Brendan T. Byrne Forest, Double Trouble State Park and Greenwood Forest/ Pasadena Wildlife Management Area, Township properties, Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund properties and various non-profit conservation properties; and
- WHEREAS, the property contains environmentally sensitive lands and portions of the Davenport and Irish Branches of the Toms River as well as tributaries of the Cedar Creek; and
- WHEREAS, a portion of the property identified as Block 4010, Lot 2 totaling 566 acres in Lacey Township would satisfy the mitigation requirement of the preservation of 485 acres of uplands imposed by the Pinelands Commission for the construction of the crosswind runway at the Ocean County Airport; and





 - Zone 4. **45 MPH** between the New Jersey Garden State Parkway and Lester Lane

Except for 30 MPH when passing through the Berkeley Township Regional High School and the Central Regional Middle School zones during recess when the presence of children is clearly visible from the roadway, or while children are going to or leaving school, during opening or closing hours

Zone 5. 40 MPH between Lester Lane and U.S. Route 9

Except for 30 MPH when flashing signs are operating when passing through the Clara B. Worth School zone, during recess when the presence of children is clearly visible from the roadway, or while children are going to or leaving school, during opening or closing hours
