A. **STATEMENT** Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act.

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean was called to order on October 15, 2014 at 4:00 PM, Room 119, County Administration Building, 101 Hooper Avenue, Toms River, Ocean County, New Jersey, with Freeholder Director Vicari presiding. Members Kelly, Bartlett, Lacey and Little were present at the call of the roll.

3. The Pledge of Allegiance and Prayer.

B. PRESENTATION

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. Before I start with the people's business today I'd like to welcome our students from our schools from around Ocean County. We hope that we inspire you to get involved not only in government, but perhaps someday to run for office. We try to be very professional and dignified at all times. As you can see from our process, not only is it very transparent, but again, we welcome you to speak at the public portion at the end of the meeting. Mrs. Vasil can you continue please?"

CLERK VASIL: "Thank you Freeholder. We have a special guest with us today for a presentation. This is honoring the Ocean County Vocational-Technical School's Performing Arts Academy. They were named as a 2014 "Blue Ribbon School", an Exemplary High Performing High School. With us today we have Superintendent Bill Hoey, if you would come forward.

Clerk Vasil read the Proclamation into the record.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. You know we're very proud of what we do in Ocean County. Of all 21 counties, we always say it's the best place to live, to work and to retire. We also stress, with the help of our professional staff, with finances - Freeholder Bartlett and Julie Tarrant - not only our AAA bond rating, but it's more important sometimes the opportunities that we give our people. All the people of Ocean County. Protecting our people such as senior citizens and veterans, but what makes us very proud today, the award we are going to give and I'm glad our high school students are here, is the opportunity to get an education. Life skills, lifelong educational programs and not only the best in the State of New Jersey to the award that we are going to be talking about with our Superintendent, Bill Hoey, and the President of the Board, Nina Anuario, is national awards. This is something that where we're not saying it, we're not saying it in Ocean County, but throughout the United States. If our Superintendent would just do us the honor of telling us what is going on with our school system as far as the award that we have here today."

BILL HOEY, SUPERINTENDENT, OC VOCATIONAL-TECHNICAL SCHOOLS: "The National Blue Ribbon Award is given by the Secretary of Education in Washington to schools that meet some very strict and high standards. We've been lucky to have our Marine Academy named a Blue Ribbon High School and now our

Performing Arts Academy is being named a Blue Ribbon High School. The credit for making our school of performing arts a Blue Ribbon High School goes exclusively to the Principal, Karen Homiek, who couldn't be here today unfortunately. Our Supervisor Christine Santasieri, several staff members that are here, and most importantly a few of our students who have left their rehearsal for the "55 Days" which is their fall drama coming up, to be with us today. So I'm very proud of them. The credit, as I said, goes to them - the staff, students and administrators who are receiving this kind of prestigious award and bringing it to Ocean County.

We are one of eleven schools in the State of New Jersey that was designated Blue Ribbon for this school year. It's a great accomplishment. We give tons of credit to our Freeholders. They support us, the County Vocational School District. Over sixty percent of our budget is provided by the County Freeholders. Without them, we'd have a problem. Nina?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Nina Anuario is the President of the Board (Vo-Tech)."

NINA ANUARIO: "Thank you Bill. I just want to say I ditto everything that Bill says, but especially Joe Vicari as our Freeholder liaison. Without his support to represent us through the Freeholder Board, this type of education wouldn't exist to this level in Ocean County. This is a public school. A school of choice open to all students in Ocean County. It is a free education and we teach at such a high level and standard for the arts, students that are gifted and talented in the arts. So again, thank you for your support. Without your dollars, this type of program would not be available to the residents of Ocean County and that's what sets us apart from all other counties around us. Thank you again."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "As an educator and we have educators over here and members of my family, a school and an education is more than bricks and mortar, computers and books, it's the teaching and professional staff that we have. We have the best professional staff, the best teachers, that have a passion for not only teaching, but excelling. We don't have average teachers. We have the best of the best. We want to excel and we are only above average people. And that's one thing that I really appreciate when we do the criteria for hiring is that we do not accept mediocrity. We accept the best and that's why we have the best students and we give them the best quality of education. So thank you very much."

SUPERINTENDENT HOEY: "I would like Christine to come up and introduce our students."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "The best and most important. If they want to come up they can do so. Any staff members can come up front. And the parents, the most important people, come up moms and dads. Behind every successful student we have these moms and dads and parents. Very good."

CHRISTINE SANTASIERI: "This is Robin Kelly. She's one of our math teachers. Johnny Beckenhauer, our technology teacher. Four of our students. These are four outstanding students. They're seniors. This is Brian Stringer. He's on ITS, he's on National Honor Society, he's an Eagle Scout and he's going to college for cyber security and information technology.

This is Chase Theibault. He's also a senior. He's been in ITS, he's been recognized by them. In fact, he went to our Nationals and was accepted by how many colleges?"

CHASE THEIBAULT: "Twenty-nine."

CHRISTINE SANTASIERI: "Twenty-nine colleges. He's also a member and part of WASABI which is our literary magazine. I could go on and on about all of them.

Sam Fortier, same thing. She's one of our seniors. She does a lot of our teching in show. She's involved in all the sound. She's always doing sound stuff. She's also....you're WASABI also?

SAMANTHA FORTIER: "No."

CHRISTINE SANTASIERI: "No. You're INTERACT."

SAMANTHA FORTIER: "Yes."

CHRISTINE SANTASIERI: "Okay. So she does INTERACT. So she's always giving back to the community. And I'm trying to remember what else you told me. Everything. Vocal Ensemble. Chorale. Vocal Club. So the list goes on and on.

Julie, she's actually top of her class. She's excelled in everything she does. She's probably on everything there is to be on. So once again, these are just great individuals and they're really stand-up community members and we're very proud of our students."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Very good. So besides trying to inspire high school students, the students that were here today perhaps when you see good government in action, you may want to run for office. And we hope someday you can run for Freeholder.

Okay. Continuing, and again, we thank the Vocational School for winning this national award. Continuing please."

C. PROCLAMATION

CLERK VASIL: "Thank you Freeholder. Next we have a proclamation and this is proclaiming October 15, 2014 as "Pretty in Pink Day" in Ocean County and with us we have Leslie Terjesen the Public Information Officer for the Health Department and Freeholder Director and Freeholder Little will make this presentation."

Clerk Vasil read the proclamation.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "You know we take this month out to talk about early detection. We do an excellent job under the leadership of Freeholder Gerry Little who is the liaison with the Board of Health. I remember in my days as a teacher that many times a mother would say you know something? I just can't afford to go for the cost of the test. I just can't afford to do certain treatment. So we make it as easy possible for those who cannot afford it, not only to get tests, but also to get some treatment. The educational programs are certainly important. And sometimes, I know moms out there that you don't think of yourselves. You think of yourselves second. What we're asking you to do this month is think of your own health first. And that's just as important as taking care of your family and of course, your children. Freeholder Little."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Well, there is nothing more important to all of us than the beautiful ladies in our lives whether they're our moms, our daughters, our wives, our sisters. I know very personally.....we've all been touched by women that we know who have breast cancer. My mother had breast cancer. It was removed, but unfortunately, it transferred and eventually got into her lungs and she died about seven years ago. So I am very personally supportive of this and we wish these ladies many wonderful blessings for the work that they do to try to emphasize this and make sure that all women are aware of this and get their mammograms and their testing that's necessary.

I particularly thank Leslie because she's like a cheerleader for this effort and she has done a great job for our Department of Health in public information. So she's always upbeat and always doing her best to make sure she's out there in the public and addressing these issues. So thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Any other comments?"

LESLIE TERJESEN, PUBLIC INFORMATION OFFICER, OC HEALTH DEPARTMENT: "If we had all the people that are involved in making the 11th year of Pretty in Pink a success, we wouldn't have enough room here. So I'd like to thank Dana O'Connor of the Women's Commission and Long Beach Island Health Department, Susan Quinn who is the Director of our Ocean County Library, my boss, Dan Regenye who is our Public Health Coordinator for the Ocean County Health Department, our Board Chairperson, Mr. Jack Mallon who is here, Department of Human Services of the Women's Commission who support the effort, and certainly our Freeholder liaison and all our Freeholders for making this a success. This is our 11th year. We have to send things out to remind people about Pretty in Pink. July 13th, I got my first call as to when Pretty in Pink is going to be. So people now ask when it's going to be. It's become a county-wide initiative. Our government offices, our municipal offices, our businesses, our schools, our Women's Commission, our library - we have displays in our libraries on breast cancer. I certainly thank Susan for that. But it's important today that we remember, we recognize, we support and we celebrate all the lives that have been touched by breast cancer. And I'm sure everyone in here has been touched somehow.

We certainly celebrate the successes of treatment for breast cancers. They move on. I promised at the last meeting I'd bring pink and purple ribbons recognizing Domestic Violence Awareness Month. I can't thank the Freeholders more for your stand that you have been taking on domestic violence also. So we thank you very much."

D. RESOLUTION - PUBLIC HEARING

DIRCTOR VICARI: "At this time I would like to continue with the Resolution for a Public Hearing."

Clerk Vasil read the resolution for the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee recommendation resolution by title, which was scheduled for Public Hearing at this time.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Going back some years ago, we went to the residents of Ocean County and said 'do you want to tax yourself into a dedicated fund that would be used for open spaces?" Thinking ahead for future generations. Freeholder John Bartlett, who is the liaison with Open Space, is going to give a little overview as far as where it's located. We have preserved for future generations about 60% of the land throughout Ocean County. And one preference has always been in two different areas. One is by the watershed where Barnegat Bay exists and also all the water from Ocean County, most of it comes from underground. And also for our military bases it's very important as far as making sure there's no encroachment on the bases. So I'll turn the meeting now over to Freeholder Deputy Director John Bartlett to give a little overview."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Thank you Mr. Director. This is a relatively small acquisition that's been proposed by our Natural Lands Advisory Council for the County. It is on Potters Creek in Bayville which empties on out into the Bay in this direction as you can see in the dark here...(Freeholder points to map...this is Potters Creek. The County has, in the past, purchased this parcel and now there are three parcels - everything that's in green we've purchased - there are three adjoining parcels which are building sites which after appraisals and negotiations with the owners.....and by the way, the Director always likes me to mention that this always done with a willing seller and if the price is right and it has to be less than our appraised value or at the appraised value that we do.....if we can come to a negotiated agreement then so be it. If not, then each party goes their own way. But in this instance, these are three building sites. They are slightly more than an acre a piece. As you can see they adjoin what the County already owns. This, by the way, in orange, is owned by Berkeley Township. And the negotiated price on this 3.26 acres is \$235,000.00. So that's a little more than \$70,000.00 a building site or more than an acre which I think is a pretty good deal.

Again, anything that we can do within reason to purchase properties that are helping clean the water that eventually makes its way into Barnegat Bay has been a priority with the Board of Freeholders. This again, has been recommended by the Advisory Council, the citizens group that we have appointed. A Blue Ribbon Group I might add. So I'd like to be able to hold our Public Hearing Mr. Director and move forward with this acquisition."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Freeholder. And again, it's only approved with a willing seller and if it passes the Advisory Board and of course, it's a good price. And the town has to approve it too. We don't do anything without the town. All 33 towns, wherever it may be. I want to turn it over now to Freeholder Gerry Little who does two things. He's the accountant for knowing the National Debt and also knowing how many acres we own. Freeholder Gerry Little."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Which do you want first Mr. Director?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Well we should probably start with the bad news which is the National Debt and then we'll go to the good news."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "We have that right in front of us. \$17.86 trillion and moving. \$17.86 trillion."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "So the students in the back can take that back to your classroom."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "For more optimistic and especially we kind of do this as a tradition, especially for our students that are here for the first time and visitors as well. Ocean County has 408,000 acres. That's how big Ocean County is. 408,000 acres - the second largest county in the State of New Jersey in land size. Second only to Burlington County. And, as many of you know, we have the military base, we have the Edwin B. Forsythe Refuge along the coastal areas, we have some Federally preserved lands, we have Fish & Wildlife from the State, State Parks, we have the State Natural Lands Preservation Program, we have our County Parks, we have our Natural Lands Trust Fund which we are having a Public Hearing on that, we also have Farm Easements. But of those 408,000 acres, Mr. Director, that's brings us to, and this is important for the young people, 230,087 acres are permanently preserved or as the Director said 56.4% which is very close to 60%. And that number is increasing all the time as we acquire more areas and as the State may acquire more areas. So that's important for us, for this entire Board under Freeholder Bartlett's leadership, to preserve these areas and protect them, protect the ecology, the environment, the groundwater, as the Director said, so that the quality of life of our citizens of today and you young people that are here today that are going to be the leaders of tomorrow as well as generations to come. So that's a big commitment we have for Ocean County and our future. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Freeholder Little. Any other comments from members of the Board before I open up the Public Hearing on this resolution? Seeing no other comments from members of the Board, I open up now to members of the public. If you'd like to make any comments or suggestions, please come forward to the microphone. Give your full name and address so we can make it part of the official minutes. So the Public Hearing is formally opened on this resolution. Yes sir. Please give your full name and address. And again, right now it's only on this resolution. Later on we will have it open to members of the public."

GARY BLACK, JACKSON: "First, on the National Debt for the children, thank you. Too bad it got worse. Secondly on this, a few things always does get left out. I have always been a supporter of this program. This is a program that pays for itself. We have the ecological savings in this particular property. Of being born and raised in the general area, I know right where this is. In fact, I bought two of my first Corvairs on that road. The properties that are up now - these are properties that could be buildable. They're right in view of Barnegat Bay if it wasn't for trees and any runoff from it, the lawn fertilizers and all that, would go right in the bay. So this property immediately saves the bay. And with this and all other properties that have been purchased by this - this is a program that pays for itself because with these properties now, the taxpayers don't have to provide services. We've got schools, local services, we've got schools, we've got police, fire and we've got schools. The schools are the most expensive that's why I keep saying that.

So this pays for itself. Aside from the fact that we are getting a good agreed price on the property, it isn't a land seizure deal or anything else like any of the Agenda 21 stuff. This is, as you've pointed out, a voluntary program. A program actually approved by the taxpayers. So again, this pays for itself. The ecological benefits are as I've said time and time again, however, financial benefits are also there. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Mr. Black. I appreciate your comments and it's part of the record. Anyone else who would like to speak on this Resolution for Public Hearing? Seeing no one else with any comments, I move that the Public Hearing be closed on this resolution. Now it's time to vote. What's the pleasure of the Board?

No additional comments were received, therefore, the Public Hearing was declared closed.

On motion duly made by Freeholder Bartlett, seconded by Freeholder Kelly, the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee resolution was adopted on final reading.

Sometimes things are not put in the newspapers so we rely, of course with the digital age, of getting information across on the County website. That concludes the official part of our meeting. The business part is done."

S. FREEHOLDER COMMENTS

At 4:33 PM, Freeholder Director Vicari received the following comments from members of the Board:

DIRECTOR VICARI: "We have comments from members of the Board of Freeholders. At this time Freeholder Little is going to give a presentation. One of the main issues that we're talking about not only in the County, but in the United States, is Ebola. Very, very important. We want the residents to know not only that we are aware of it, Freeholder Little has been meeting with the State of New Jersey numerous times with law enforcement, with the head of the Board of Health, Dan Regenye. It is extremely important that we give you our plan of not only informing the public, but to give accurate information. So I want to turn this meeting right now over to Freeholder Little and several members of the Board of Health who will give an official presentation of what's taking place. Our great concern and sensitivity of what's taking place with Ebola throughout not only Ocean County and of course, the United States, to protect all of our residents. Freeholder Little.":

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. At your request, Mr. Director, we have asked our Board of Health here today to provide to the Board of Freeholders and the citizens of Ocean County an update on our County's public health preparedness in the event that someone here might be diagnosed with Ebola. I want to emphasize at this time there are no known cases of Ebola in Ocean County. But at the same time, our County Health Department is taking every feasible step to ensure the health and safety of our citizens. It is also important to emphasize that no one, even the CDC or the State or our local officials, have all of the answers. We are doing our best to prepare. During extensive calls with the Federal and State Health Officials this week, it seems clear to me that this is an evolving crisis and that the health protocols from the Center for Disease Control and the State Health Department are also evolving.

I would like to thank our Health Department Director, Dan Regenye, and his entire staff for their leadership in making sure that Ocean County and our healthcare facilities are as ready as possible to respond if there is a confirmed case here. Director Regenye, at the request of Chairman Jack Mallon - that's our Board of Health Chairman, Jack Mallon, who is with us today. Jack, we thank you for being here. And all the Board of Health members as well as myself as liaison, we have fast-tracked two task forces to develop our response plan and to do our very best to prepare and cooperate with the CDC, the State Health Department and local healthcare providers. We have a lot of planning that is in place that they have been working on for many, many days and since this crisis has evolved here in the United States. This week, Director Regenye and myself, participated in a 45-minute conversation - a telephone conference call with the CDC Director, Tom Frieden. We participated in a 20-minute personal conversation with the New Jersey Department of Health Commissioner, Mary O'Dowd. And we participated in a 1-hour conference call with Commissioner O'Dowd, State Department of Health Officials and other CDC Officials around the country.

I'd just like to briefly....we're going to call on Director Regenye in a moment, but we have with us from the Department of Health, Vicky Miragliotta, our Director of Administration and Program Development. We have Matt Csik who is our Deputy Health Officer and Assistant Public Health Coordinator. Mukesh Roy who is Director of Public Health Emergency Preparedness. He's also a Colonel in the United States Air Force. And Leslie Terjesen whom you met a moment ago who's our cheerleader for Pretty in Pink and also does a great job in disseminating the information which our Health Department is preparing. And Jen Crawford who is a Manager of our Communicable Disease Services. So with your permission Mr. Director, we'd like to call up Dan Regenye our Director of Public Health here in Ocean County. He will provide an overview of the efforts of our Board of Health and our Health Department. And if there are any questions from the Board or you, Mr. Director, or however you wish to proceed. Dan."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Mr. Regenye please."

DANIEL REGENYE, DIRECTOR OF THE OC BOARD OF HEALTH: "Thank you Freeholder Little and Freeholder Director Vicari and the entire Board for not only this opportunity to provide an update on some activities that are taking place currently, but also your ongoing support day-to-day. If there's ever an opportunity or issue that comes up and reaching out and always getting the answers and support in that capacity makes my job much easier in the day-to-day operations of the agency. And also in terms of the appointment of the Ocean County Board of Health under the leadership of Chairman Mallon. They are a very proactive Board and also, once again, very supportive in

being able to deliver what I think is probably the best public health services in the State of New Jersey and I would argue, in the country, the way we are set up.

I just finished my second decade of my public health career here in Ocean County. I started my twenty-first year. Never in a million years did I think I would be standing before this Board or any Board talking about Ebola and preparedness activities that we would be embarking on within Ocean County, State of New Jersey and the United States as well. There's a lot that's been going on. You mentioned some of the staff. This is just some of the staff that are here. We have numerous staff back at the agency. They're very highly qualified, educated and trained to be able to handle many different situations. We get many different situations on a day-to-day basis that you have to be flexible with and address. We shifted some of our planning to all-hazards perspective. You went away from specific plans on diseases and different situations to be able to make a template model plan that you can then take to have a core infrastructure and a core response to that based on good science with public health and integrating all the stakeholders whether it's a law enforcement component, a healthcare provider component, it could be a clinician of nurses and doctors, etc. The EMS community, the schools, all the different players are really what make a healthy community and all the different action steps that they can really take and move ahead with. So we've taken a lot of proactive steps over the years which I think place us in a very nice strategic position to be able to respond to many different situations. I think we have one of the best H1-N1 response and as a result of those activities I think we've had some of the best responses when it came to flu vaccine shortages and implementing mass vaccination plans for getting that vaccine out to the residents of Ocean County in a lot of the day-to-day clinics that we operate as well.

So the staff that are here are just some. We have many other highly qualified staff. We obviously couldn't bring them all out. Also our Medical Director, which I think is important for this conservation, is a well renown local Infectious Disease Physician, Dr. Guerrero, who is our Medical Director. She has been with us - I meet with her monthly on a normal standing order. We're meeting weekly at this point. We just met with her yesterday and we meet again next Tuesday. She has a very good sense of what's going on within the community as well of how many infectious diseases are related to this.

So just kind of going through a little bit of some of the action items that we've gone through. Ebola is something new to us here in the United States. This is something that is endemic - meaning it is present and you expect to see cases in endemic areas such as Western Africa. It's not unusual for them to be dealing with some of these. Obviously at the epidemic proportions they are dealing with at this point and seeing that migration to other areas of the world is something of concern and certainly it has a certain fear factor to it that people should rightfully experience with that because it is a nasty disease. We need to take all the necessary precautions for that. At this point, I think Freeholder, you hit it right on the head in terms of it's an unknown. A lot of unknowns with this. I think there's a lot of questions that we still have to get answers to. We posed a lot of questions to the State that we are still waiting for some answers. Once we have those answers we will certainly move ahead with that. But in the meantime, in the absence of those answers there's a lot of things that we can be and we are doing and we're going to be moving forward with and looking at creating some of that.

The key point, in terms of moving ahead, everything we're doing is based on what we know at this point. Being new, the literature talks about Ebola being a drop of precaution disease meaning you have to have direct contact with bodily fluids of a person infected with this. Now there is some conversation in terms of 'well, we think it might be airborne' and you should always take those necessary precautions and err on the side of caution on something like that. But it is something evolving. They are continuing to study this and trying to give the best guidance coming down from the CDC to the State to the locals throughout the country.

One thing I think is important is the structure that we have in place in terms of reportable diseases and they could fall into one of two categories, one is an immediately reportable disease which viral hemorrhagic fever and Ebola is one of those viral hemorrhagic fevers fall into. It's one of over twenty diseases that are listed by regulation New Jersey Administrative Code 8-57 that's immediately reportable to the local health department, the local health authority, and the State. We have processes and procedures in place based on what the issue is and what that disease is to put certain public health measures in place to help protect the public health in that case. In another category you have some diseases that are reported within 24 hours and in those cases there are over 50 diseases. These are diseases such pertussis and measles, hepatitis B, hepatitis C, salmonella, shigella, mumps and rabies in animals. I give these as examples because we have dealt with these, we see these day in and day out within Ocean County. Public Health is a lot of times what happens behind the scenes. We do issue warnings based on this. It's usually, typically isolated to a population at risk. We do share this information through annual reports, but through these processes and through these disease investigations and the contact tracing, we have processes in place not only internally with us, but within the healthcare community, the healthcare providers. The reportable diseases that I mentioned, as well as the other 70 plus, they are all reportable not only in healthcare institutions, laboratories that diagnose these, it could be an educational institution, and there's many daycares, day camps - it's all immediately reportable to us. We have a very good working relationship with these organizations and institutions that are out there and we participate and communicate freely with them for some of these.

In terms of looking at briefing on some additional activities - internally at the Health Department we've administered a task force split into two areas. One is on Administrative Preparedness looking at different things such as quarantine orders which we have already done in Ocean County. More specifically related to tuberculosis. These are things that we do day in and day out and we can do if we had to very easily. Also on the Clinical Disease Preparedness - looking at the disease itself and what do we need to do to contain that disease and blending the two together for the appropriate response. At the heart of that response is the communication with many different organizations that are out there. When you're looking at a disease containment, it's a joint investigation and collaboration between the

public health community, the healthcare community, and also the law enforcement community when you're looking at enforcement of an isolation or quarantine. Just for education for the general public, isolation and quarantine are not the same. Isolation happens on an infected person who has the disease. A quarantine would happen on a person who was exposed to but are asymptomatic or not showing symptoms of that. So when you hear the word isolation and quarantine they are different. They are not synonymous. So if you have a situation where a person presents at a hospital and they're symptomatic and they need a case definition, that case definition at this point needs to have travel history to an affected area or they had a direct contact with a confirmed case - there's an epidemiological link to a sick person confirmed with this diagnosis. There are processes in place. What would happen is that we would be notified immediately and honestly, it's not only the meeting that case definition, we have received phone calls in the last couple of weeks from clinicians, from physicians, from the hospitals saying 'I have patient. I just want to run this past you. They're West African. They've visited the West African area.' So we kind of brainstorm this information. This a day-to-day activity when it comes to disease identification, notification, in really trying to say what's the next step up on the public health side with this.

So when you're looking at that partnership I mentioned with the law enforcement. We have been in contact with the Prosecutor. We do have a meeting set up for next week to discuss the isolation and/or quarantine either in a healthcare environment or a community setting. So we're currently working out some of those establishments and I think we have a pretty good working example of some situations in the past that we've worked on where we issued isolation orders. And the health office or the Commissioner of Health has the authority under New Jersey Administrative Code 8-57 to issue that in a state of a public health emergency. That could be verbal at first and then it would have to be followed up by a written order. So we do have a situation where we did this about two years ago on tuberculosis and we were able to quarantine/isolate the proper people related to that. So we are currently working on ironing out some of those details and trying to translate into a community-based setting on a quarantine, if we had to do that.

In addition, we've been in constant contact with the schools. We presented at the Superintendents' Roundtable just last week. We're actually attending tonight at the school nurse program with all the school nurses. And, for the last eleven or twelve years we've actively engaged not only the schools, but also the emergency departments and also long-term care facilities in what they call influenza-like illness surveillance. Unfortunately with many diseases and many illnesses, people will present to a hospital or a healthcare provider with what they call influenza-like illness. They could have a fever. They could have possibly a rash. They could have G.I. symptoms. It could be a million different diagnoses. So I think getting the information out to the hospital or the healthcare clinician and asking those questions is so vitally important with that. But what my point is, is that we have a good baseline of twelve years worth of data showing us what we would expect to see in terms of disease activity within our community. So if we saw an increase or a spike, we can easily say something unusual is happening here and we need to look at that a little bit more closely. We work closely with those partners and also the State Health Department who look at it on a statewide basis to see if it's really an issue going on statewide or if it is just localized within our community here as well.

For the healthcare community, what we've done is we've worked with each of the providers. We've reissued all of our orders in terms of what we require for the proper notification requiring all of our 24/7 numbers to those clinicians which is three deep and then it's also the State Health Department number as well. Letters have gone out to all the hospitals questioning isolation/quarantine capability and capacity. We're going to be meeting with them also next week and discussing that. We're also having a conference call with the Infection Control practitioners as well. That's just kind of looking at more specifically on Ebola. But we have constant communication with them. They always see different situations that they contact us for.

From the HAZMAT perspective, we do have a contract with Berkeley HAZMAT. They are our contractor for different what they call CBRNE, Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear and Explosive issues. Anything of any of that nature, and Ebola would be the 'B' of CBRNE - a biological agent. They have staff that are trained, equipped and have all the proper training and PPE - Personal Protective Equipment - to be able to go into a scene if they had to. They're not clinicians. They're not doctors and nurses so they cannot provide clinical care, but they can come into a scene in the proper protective equipment and do what they have to do and provide some eyes and ears into the situation as to what's going on.

In terms of looking at moving ahead, I think there's a lot of things that we can look at. One of the things we discussed yesterday with our Medical Director is looking at some of the existing process. The TB - tuberculosis standard operating procedure that we have is probably one of the closest that we would put in place for Ebola. We're looking at modifying that and adjusting that for this situation moving ahead and finalizing that as well. We're reviewing some standard operating procedures in terms of a Health Officer Declaration for requiring a mandatory isolation or quarantine. That's something that we're going to be looking at and probably finalizing by the early part of next week with that.

Something else, and we actually learned this through our H1-N1 efforts and the after-actions from that in assessing how well we did during H1-N1 which I think we did very well, to look at the faith-based community with Ocean County. We're currently actively reaching out to them. We'll be setting up a separate meeting and a conference with them to be able to share information with them so they can be another partner in public health. We've met with them about three times a year for the last two or three years on different public health issues that have come up and it's really meant for purposes like this to be able to get information out to their congregants and the residents of Ocean County that are participating in that organization.

In term of action items moving forward, there are things that the public can do and the healthcare community and other partners as well, probably first and foremost across the board - Stay Informed. Get Information from reputable organizations. We have information on our Website. The State Website. The CDC. There could be a lot of rumor going around and so really try to clarify and confirm what you're actually hearing is true. They can certainly contact us. We will certainly be able to answer any questions. If we don't have the answer, we will certainly research that, take their information and get back to them with that information.

In addition, I also brought some copies of our annual - seasonal flu vaccination. Why that's so important and why we are encouraging residents to get their flu shot, obviously we want to protect from any illness that's going to exhibit flu-like symptoms. Getting the flu shot will certainly help and go a long way to staying healthy. Keeping your immunity level up and being healthy and sharing the good health with family, etc. Practicing proper hygiene. Covering your cough. Covering your sneezes. Washing you hands is really, always just good public health practice. It's the same with anything. The same with this. Staying home when sick, that is so important just for general public health safety in protecting the health of coworkers and it could go to children's schools if there's children going to school. For the healthcare clinicians, it's really about asking the right questions. If they don't know what the right questions are they should contact us and we can provide them guidance as to what they should be asking. What we don't want is to create an alarm unnecessarily. We want to get accurate information to the public and to the healthcare community.

We also participate in a Health Alert Network which is an arm of the CDC to the State to the Ocean County Board of Health. This is throughout the country where any information coming out, we can disseminate and push out to different groups. The healthcare providers, if they're not part of that, should join as well as any other organizations that are interested in receiving that and, obviously, reporting the diseases which is required by law. In any other parts, just keeping current in any situation that is going on at this point."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Before I turn it back over to Freeholder Little, we appreciate your input. In issues like this, we cannot deal with rumors. We can only deal with facts and always authorize where you get your facts from. It's very, very important because the lines of communication have to be that we speak with one voice. That's why this Board has decided that the Ocean County Board of Health and with your expertise is the best way of doing it not only to avoid rumors, but to give accurate information and to get true information which is very important. The last thing we need in Ocean County is to have a panic. We have 165,000 senior citizens and we don't want to alarm them, but we want them to make sure that they are fully protected and we appreciate Freeholder Little organizing this thing. I'll turn it back over to Freeholder Gerry Little."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Just very quickly, Mr. Director, in having participated in all these conference calls this week and also watching the news events in Dallas, it has become evident that.....we use the word evolving.....that the protocols are evolving. At once it was contact with bodily fluids and so forth and now there's talk about being within three feet. It's changing as we go along. One of the questions that I posed and Dan posed to our State Health Department, and we have it in writing, is who is going to be responsible for the costs, the expenses for all the activities that will need to be covered during this process. In turns out, local boards of health will be responsible for the costs of all expenses that are associated with and including the disposal of the waste, hazardous waste. Including, which Dan it was the one item I don't think you mentioned, I didn't hear it, that our next Board of Health Meeting not Freeholder Meeting, Board of Health Meeting, we will be discussing with the Board of Health's approval, going out for bid for a contract for the Sanitizing of for instance, an apartment or a house or whatever that may be. That is going to fall on the Board of Health. In one apartment, in Dallas of course, it was reported it cost over \$130,00.00 just to sanitize the inside and the outside of that. Well we don't have a company in place to sanitize that so we will be doing that at our next Board of Health Meeting.

So the point of this is to let everyone know that there are no cases at this time in Ocean County and God willing there won't be any. Okay? We all pray for that and we pray for those who are impacted now. But we're planning for that eventuality. Of course, we all have our opinions and this is not necessarily appropriate for Dan, but you know, you talk about containment - we should.....many of the countries now and the airlines are discontinuing flights and of course, that's a debate that's going to ring loud and clear across the United States. But I think our first priority is to protect the people of the United States and certainly, to provide help and comfort and medical care for those who are suffering. But I think we should close our immigration network or at least provide a quarantine for 21 days and that we should contain it where it is, not spread it around the world. But that's my opinion."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "We thank you. Any members of the Board? Freeholder Kelly?"

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "One question, from what I read or maybe saw on TV was that this is not the first outbreak of Ebola. In fact, there was one in the 1960's. How was that eradicated? How did they handle that, that it went away for some fifty years before it's back? Because, I mean, the real answer here at the end of the day isn't to stop flights so that you try to keep the Ebola where it is. So what did they do, if you know, in the 1960's that the disease went away for so many years before it is now back?"

PUBLIC HEALTH COORDINATOR DAN REGENYE: "I don't know that the disease actually went away. There was an outbreak at that time. You may have had cases in between and now it's at an epidemic and outbreak proportion once again."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "And it was in the 1960's? Am I correct?"

DAN REGENYE: "I believe they have had outbreaks. I'm not familiar with the 1960's. There could be different factors involved with that. One is the.....I guess it's the local public health system and how strong it is. I don't know the comparison between then and now. You're talking about an area that really does not have a very developed public health infrastructure for that. I know the CDC gets very involved in it. It's a lot of, I guess, in terms of a question of why does the CDC go out in international areas and look at things like this? And it's exactly for this reason. When you talk about viruses and bacteria, they don't respect any geo-political borders. You can get on a plane and be anywhere in the world in hours so that virus and that bacteria can spread to almost anywhere. So that's why I think it's so important when it comes to a public health issue such as Ebola or even anything, you need to try to contain it at that site of the outbreak and that's what I think they're looking at. I don't know the time frame in terms of when they responded to each of them. The identification was maybe reported in a little bit later this time to the CDC or they weren't aware of it? I'm not sure of some of those details.

There's a number of factors that can come in to play. I think people are a little bit more savvy and understanding how they kind of get around the system a little bit. I think the world is a little bit more easy to traverse and get around and get planes from place to another as well. So it could be more easily spread with that as well. Plus some of the others.....I don't think this is actually with Ebola....but, there's some other diseases that are out there that are vaccine preventable and we're seeing resurgence in that. We should not see a pertussis outbreak like we saw in Ocean County. I'm talking Ocean County, not anywhere third (world) country. In Ocean County we had a pertussis outbreak two years ago. We shouldn't have that in a developed country. I think it's complacency with vaccines and the effectiveness and just the whole the control of some of these diseases. If we have control measures in place, whether it's pharmaceutical or not, looking at them and really trying to contain it the best that we can. And listening to the advice of the healthcare professionals. A quarantine/isolation really has to be adhered to. There's a purpose for that and going through that."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Good. We thank you for coming. Are there any comments from members of the public or the media? Mr. Regenye is set to be here later. We realize sometimes it's very personal and you want to wait and talk about it privately. Also, they have a staff on board if you want to go by his office at the Ocean County Board of Health or visit their Website. Any other comments from members of the professional staff?"

T. **PUBLIC COMMENTS** - Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of **five (5)** minutes per speaker.

At 5:09 PM, Freeholder Director Vicari opened the meeting to receive the following comments from the public:

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I will open up to the members of the public. Please give your full name and mailing address. And I would like to open it up for the first one, for Mr. Santos. I know you were on Channel 12 and you said you would be here and we thank you for being patient with us. Mr. Santos."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "Thank you Mr. Vicari."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "It's always a pleasure to see you."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "I'm sure. Equally. A couple of questions. I'm sure you read the Asbury Park Press and Channel 12 News so that's kind of old news. I have a question regarding email from Joe Veni, a close personal friend of yours dated June 25, 2012 at 1:39 PM. It pertains to new technology and the heading is 'bug detection: electronic countermeasures'. It talks about hidden microphone detectors, bug detectors, transmitter detectors, wireless camera detectors and spy-finder, which I don't even know what that is to be honest. I know those items are used primarily to fight industrial espionage and to protect trade secrets. Why would such an inquiry be made by yourself regarding this technology? When I saw that email I just thought it was highly unusual. I had no idea what it pertained to. But then I guess come 2013 when I was approached by the FBI, it made sense. Now I know why the Freeholder was asking that question. Either you believed you were under investigation by the FBI or you knew you were under investigation and you were concerned about all of these bug related devices and whether or not your office or perhaps your home even had been somehow bugged."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Would you like an answer now or when you finish?"

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "Well yea. If you want to that's fine whatever you want."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I will let you complete and then I'll be more than happy to address your concerns."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "Well you know the truth and I know the truth. Unfortunately, we both know what the truth is. And I don't know if you recall the conversation you and I had, the phone conversation, about a year after my appointment of Superintendent. You called me around 7 o'clock at night. I remember that time because it was the start of a Zoning Board meeting and I was Chairman of the Zoning Board at that time. And you asked me to do something and I said, 'Well Freeholder I really can't. It would be illegal. It's a violation of law. It's a violation of contract and it's wrong'. We had some exchange of words and you said, 'I'm a Freeholder. I can do what I want. Do it.' And I found that somewhat shocking, to say the least, and that's when I made my position clear you just didn't care. You certainly didn't care about what the law said and I translated that into dealing with you from that point forward, you really don't care what the law says. I truly believe you feel you are above the law as did Richard Nixon and we all know what happened to Richard Nixon with that same attitude. That's number one.

Number two, Nicholas Stevens is your attorney I read in one of the minutes or transcripts I got through OPRA. I know he was.....you chose him under the Indemnification Policy for the County. I was just wondering if that's true.

I assume that it is number one and number two – who is paying for that attorney?

Now one item that you regularly told me – that Joe Veni played an important role in the County Operations, an important role in B&G and the County in general. I noticed coincidentally that Mr. Veni billed the County \$400.00 on April 22, 2014 for attending a meeting that you called. I asked for the minutes of that meeting. No minutes were provided as they said it was a workshop. That seemed to be a lot of money in this for work (inaudible) for a meeting that produced no results from Mr. Veni.

I was curious now that he's been gone several months, who is performing this important work that Mr. Veni once performed for \$150,000.00 a year. It's a lot of money, as I said, you routinely told me he played an important role. I know you met with him privately on regular occasions at the Buildings & Grounds office at 5 Mott. You met with him over here in your office on a number of occasions. So I know there is a close relationship between the two of you. And prior to him becoming a consultant for the County, he was a part-time employee. A part-time position – 2002, 2003. I was wondering again how he received that job. Was it advertised and were there solicitations? Were there interviews? Or simply a decree that the Freeholder and the liaison to the Buildings & Grounds Department that it take place.

A couple of other items. I just want to read two emails I received and I've received numerous emails from people. I was stopped on several occasions this past week when I've been back in New Jersey. One is from an employee at the County for over 30 years working in one of your departments, but I won't mention names. 'How are you holding up? I never thought I would see Vicari's bad behavior and lies catch up to him. It's so sad so many good people have to go through this. Sending prayers.' And that's somebody that worked for you for over 30 years. Another email from someone that worked on the third floor of the Administration Building for a number of years. Your floor of the Administration Building. 'Hi Bill. Long time no see. I just want to let you know that I saw the interview on app.com and I'm so proud of you for standing up for what is right.' And it goes on and on. But these people were close to you and worked for you for many years and I think it says volumes for you as an individual. In my opinion, it's certainly time for a change. You're a bully. You tried to bully me. You mislead people. You mistreat the employees. You discriminate against and harass them and it's time for a change in Ocean County. With any luck, that change will happen within the next few weeks. Thank you."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Mr. Director, before Mr. Santos sits down. I read the Asbury Park Press article also Bill and was very surprised because you say the FBI came to your house not once, but twice at 6 o'clock in the morning."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "Yes, roughly."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Okay. After you talked to the FBI you never, ever talked to County Counsel or the County Administrator to talk about this. I'm wondering why you didn't think it was important to talk to the Administration about that meeting if there was concern with contracts of the Board of Freeholders? Why did you not talk to either Mr. Sahradnik or Mr. Block?"

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "At the time I was asked not to discuss my conversation."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "And when did the FBI tell you, you could discuss it?"

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "They did not."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "They did not. So why did you decide three weeks before the election that this conversation that you supposedly had with the FBI was no longer important enough to keep confidential? Is it because as you state 'you hate Joe Vicari so much that politics are more important' than this investigation that you speak about?"

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "No. That's not it at all. Do I dislike Joe Vicari for his behavior, his bad behavior put in this one email? Absolutely do I think Joe Vicari has long served his usefulness on the Board? Yes I do. Would I like to see another person sitting in that seat come January 1st? Absolutely, without question."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "None of that's important. The importance to me is why you thought it's okay, after the FBI asked you not to share your conversation and never told you subsequently you can, do you know if that investigation is over?"

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "I cannot comment on that other than that I have been approached by other parties within the government, County government, that more recently than I, have spoken with those investigators."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "But you haven't had any correspondence with the FBI to say it's okay to now make this investigation public?"

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "No I have not."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Then I am very disappointed that if we are truly being investigated that you, in fact, violated that confidence and went to the Asbury Park Press and yet you didn't feel it was important to share with County Counsel, who is Counsel to the Buildings & Grounds Department that you Chaired, that you directed nor the County Administrator who you worked for. But you think it's fine to go to the Asbury Park Press and put this investigation that you were not told by the FBI you could share."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "I think it's very relevant. I made that decision independently of my conversation

with any other party."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "You have told the world that there is an investigation..."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "Yes I have."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "...by the FBI."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "Yes I have."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "But the FBI did not tell you that you could share that information."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "No they did not. I took it upon myself."

JACK SAHRADNIK, COUNTY COUNSEL: "Freeholder, I'd also say just so there's no mistake, all this time since whenever that alleged meeting took place I would tell you that we have not been contacted by anyone in any way associated with the FBI or any other State or Federal agency for any documents."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "Well I know what happened. I was woken around 6 o'clock in the morning. That's a fact. Believe it or not choose to believe if you will. I was taken back. I was caught off-guard. I certainly didn't expect a knock on my door from the FBI shortly after returning from Florida from vacation for the Memorial Day weekend. Nonetheless, that took place once, it took place twice that I had spoken with them. The third time I was not home. I was recovering from a fall that I broke some ribs in. That's all I can tell you. It's a fact. I didn't make it up. I'm not making it up. And certainly something that serious...."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "The fact is also that the FBI asked you to keep this in confidence."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Presumably."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Presumably, yes, as you just told me."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "Yes."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "And you broke that even though the FBI asked you not to make this public."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "That was more than a year ago. I made that decision independently of any consultation with anybody."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "And a couple of weeks before the election you decide it's not important. I think it's a political thing. I don't even believe anybody came to your house."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "Well that's entirely up to you."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "That's what I think. Yet you stand here telling Mr. Vicari what you believe is nothing but a political statement. And I will tell you, I don't believe what you're saying. I believe if anything happened, you called the FBI and they looked at what you said and said there's no merit here because here it is a year and a half later and they still haven't asked for one document."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "Okay. Well it's your opinion versus my opinion. I'm not going to argue with that. Freeholder, I know what happened. You think you know what happened. We'll see where it goes from here."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Mr. Director, could I be permitted to comment?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Yes. Freeholder Bartlett."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "I have always had the greatest respect for Bill Santos. When he first came to the County it was at my suggestion. He was no longer employed in Jackson Township and I knew of his great qualifications and I asked him if he'd like to come to work with us. And he did. I've always thought that was a good move, but Bill I.....sometimes we can get so wrapped up in things, campaigns or whatever, that we can sometimes lose sight of the exact truth. And that's what forces me to say what I'm going to say and perhaps there's an explanation and I hope there is. But you are quoted in the paper as saying that you were forced to retire, that you were pushed out, and I'm reading directly from the..."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "Mr. Larsen's comments and that's really not what I said."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "He misquoted you?"

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "It was a little misquote."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Were you forced out or forced to retire or did you leave on your own volition?"

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "Well first I was appointed contrary to State Statute. It was an illegal appointment. We all know that and the County Counsel knows that."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "And where did that take place?"

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "That was recommended..."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "It took place in my office didn't it? Between you and I."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "Yes. That was one of the places it took place. Yes."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "That was where it took place."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "Yes."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "And it was a discussion because I had great respect for you in saying, 'Look Bill, I think we could probably work this out.....' I think this was a year ago....'with a year appointment for you to be satisfactory. I think that would fly.' And you said yes. And you accepted the year appointment. It was at the end of that year that you decided and I have the emails in front of me. Okay? May I read these Mr. Director with your permission and with yours Bill? Okay. This is from you to Keith Goetting, dated April 25, 2013 'this email will serve as a follow-up of our conversation of Tuesday, April 23rd when I advised you of my intent not to seek reappointment to the position of Superintendent of Ocean County Department of Buildings & Grounds.' You indicated that 'you would be willing to explore other opportunities suitable to my background and skills'. So you were offered other opportunities. 'I appreciate your offer, however, under the circumstances and for purpose of retiring I will be terminating any and all relationships with Ocean County on or before June 30, 2013.'

It was your direct decision, even when offered other opportunities, to say no I wish to retire and I respect that. And then about a month after that, on May 14th, you sent me a very nice letter. And again, we've always had a very good relationship.

'Freeholder Bartlett, John: It has been a pleasure and an honor to have been given the opportunity to serve as your personal representative on the Ocean County College Board of Trustees Search Committee. It is an experience that I have truly enjoyed. You are a man of integrity, honor and have always placed the interest of Ocean County and its residents first and foremost.'

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "Yes. I remember writing that letter and that's absolutely where I stand on that."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "And then about a month after that, your final communication to the Personnel Director and to Administrator Block. 'As you are aware of our numerous conversations we have had regarding my retirement commencing June 1st, you may consider this a resignation from Superintendent, Buildings & Grounds for the purpose of retirement effective June 30, 2013.'

You told me that you had a job lined up in Florida and that you were very anxious to go to it. So in no way, shape or form, sir, were you let go by the County or forced out or as you have made it appear in some of these press releases."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "Well, the...."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "And I want to make that record very, very clear."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "With respect to the other four Board Members, I agree. I enjoyed working for the Board. With respect for Freeholder Vicari, my statements in the newspaper and the Board......"

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "But the impression you gave, sir, is that you were forced out by the Board of Freeholders."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "I was forced out by a Board Member."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "You were not forced out of County employment by a Board Member. You were not. You were offered other opportunities and I'm not sure that there was discussion of Superintendent of Public Works. You wanted to leave. You wanted to retire. I respect that. There came a time in my career where I wanted to retire."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "There's a lot more to it that you don't know."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Well this is a written draft in your hand."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "These are two or three other emails that certainly served the purpose you meant to serve today. I can bring up two or three emails sent to Carl Block, sent to Keith Goetting that will say the opposite."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Well then you sent two letters that say the opposite of each other. That doesn't sit much with my credibility."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "No I didn't say that. I did say that...."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "I like to say the same thing when I send letters."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "Well I had other prior to that talking about Mr. Vicari's behavior."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "I have one other thing. You've indicated, you have made the allegation and I appreciate your being here and appreciate the time that you give me, Mr. Director, that in some way, shape or form

the County's hiring of Mr. Veni, JMV Consulting and Inspection Service, was improper and yet you know that the process through which the County goes through in putting out Requests for Proposals. You know the process that goes through in evaluating those. You also know that numerous people applied for those, to be a contractor for the County. And that is was an even playing field in what was expected and what was offered in terms of employment."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "On the surface it appears....."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "No, that is the fact."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "No that is not the fact."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Yes it is. And finally, okay, what has not really appeared yet is the fact that this is a contract with Mr. Veni that was on an as-needed basis. When you needed him, he worked for us."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "No, when Joe Vicari needed him."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "He was also paid at an hourly rate."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "Yes."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "And very interestingly, the hourly rate that he put forward in his bid was less than all of the others. We hired the cheapest. Well, I don't want to use the word cheap, but we hired the least expensive consulting professional engineer that we could hire. Now, I don't know where one has a problem with that, again, on an as-needed basis. And lastly sir, no one gets paid in this County without a certification of a voucher. Now the reason I am bringing both of these up is because both of these areas are under my domain. Okay. Management and Budget and Purchasing organize the contract that goes forward, the Board then approves the contract and then the services are rendered. Before there is payment for those services there is a certification that has to be signed."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "Yes there is. I agree."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Let me read what this certification says. So for every hour or for every job that Mr. Veni and his company did for Buildings & Grounds under your direction as the Superintendent of Buildings & Grounds. Let me read the claimant certification on this payment document. It says 'I do solemnly declare and certify under the penalties of law that the within bill is correct in all its particulars; that the articles have been furnished or services rendered as stated therein; that no bonus has been given or received by any persons within the knowledge of this claimant in connection with the above claim; that the amount therein stated is justly due and owing; and that the amount charged is a reasonable one.' That must be signed by the claimant, Mr. Veni and countersigned by you, the Department Head and you signed them."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "That's correct."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "So obviously the man did the work that he was contracted to do didn't he?"

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "Unbeknownst to me as you now know with those multiple emails, the sexually explicit emails I brought to Mr. Block's attention, my concerns – I stopped signing the vouchers in March, I believe, or early April of 2013 because I believed them to be fraudulent."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Well I have one here that's not early April, it's 4/15/13. I didn't certainly pull all of them because I'm not going to do that."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "Well if you start looking you are not going to see my signature because I had serious concerns about the billing practice in this."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Well here's one two months before you leave that you signed."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "Well I don't know what you're looking at."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Was it that late that you said 'gee I don't think he's doing the work'?"

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "No there's multiple questions. More and more additional questions."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Well then why did you sign them?"

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "I didn't sign them."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "You did sign it. It's right here. Are you calling me a liar?"

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "No I'm not calling you a liar on that one."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Well there it is sir."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "I stopped signing those vouchers in my department."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "It would not be signed if you didn't sign it. And this is an all legal claimant notice."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "Several months I stopped signing those vouchers prior to leaving. I believe you.

If you say I signed, I'm sure I signed it."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Well, thank you."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "But I had more and more questions that arose in my mind as to what was really going on. I asked Mr. Veni questions."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Bill, I think these are very convenient questions that you're raising."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "No. No you're trying to take things out of, take the little bit that does help."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "I think you're out of context here."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "I signed most of Mr. Veni's vouchers. I'll be the first person to acknowledge that because I thought they were due and owing. Absolutely. Otherwise I wouldn't have signed them."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Okay. Then he did his job."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "Then I found out things that were unbeknownst to me."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "The question before the County is 'did the guy do the work he was paid to do'?"

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "Apparently he did not because he sent multiple emails out and multiple phone calls that I now know. Had I subsequently known then no I would not have signed those vouchers."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Well then you signed them illegally."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "I signed them not knowing all the facts at the time."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Well then you signed vouchers with that certification not knowing the facts? Not knowing the facts? That really bothers me."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "Not knowing all the facts obviously."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Well then you shouldn't have signed it. (inaudible) while you signed things that you didn't know what you were signing."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "I did not. There were certain things that came to my attention after the....."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "I'd go to jail if I did that."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: ".... no certain things came to my attention after the fact."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "I don't think so."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "You're trying to twist the facts here in....."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "I'm not twisting anything."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "Yes you are. There are certain facts that came to my attention after that time frame when some of those vouchers were signed."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "My last statement Mr. Director...."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "To the best of my knowledge when I signed them they were due and owing."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "There is a detailed list on each of these of the work done. Okay. They are itemized. There's a whole page that has...I don't know how many.....well I can't count them here...but there's a whole page of invoices itemized."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "Yes. That's a reviewed invoice."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "And that's the way the system works. You know that. And you are attested to that. That this work was done."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "Yes I would review those itemized. Now do I know if any professional is an hour or an hour and a half? No I don't sit there and look over his shoulder through the whole day. I don't have the time to do that nor does anyone else. So I make the assumption that they are in fact professionals and what they state the number of hours worked is a legitimate number of hours worked. Did I physically watch him for eight hours a day? No I did not. It's impossible."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "I understand that. But you certified in the final analysis that the work was done to your satisfaction."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "To the best of my knowledge. Yes."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Yes."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "To the best of my knowledge and that's the key."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "To the best of your knowledge as Department Head it was your job to know."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "It's your responsibility."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "That's what you were getting paid for."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "And I was doing my job and that's when this stuff started to surface."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "I don't know...."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "No, no. A lot more started to surface and the Board, if you want to bring it up, most of the Board members knew well before you terminated Mr. Veni, about his bad behavior with the emails. You knew it and you took no action until the newspapers got involved. So you want to play games, you want to play semantics, let's start it."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "There's no semantics or games. Mr. Veni sent some emails to people he shouldn't have. When you supplied some of those to the County Administrator it's my understanding that the County Administrator called in the contractor and said that's an inappropriate use. Don't do it. Don't do it anymore. When the Asbury Park Press OPRA'd all of the emails, and I read the whole package, yes there were things in there that should not have been in the County system. It's totally inappropriate and it was on the basis of that, that we did not any longer entertain Mr. Veni's services. But that is secondary to the fact of whether he was appropriately hired, which you have questioned or appropriately paid. And both of those are in my domain and both of those are correct."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "You were not in the office when Mr. Vicari was in the office constantly pushing for Joe Veni, Joe Veni, asking multiple questions about Joe Veni. First of all, back step, the process established for the bidding for the selection of contracts. It's a good process in accordance with law. I don't dispute that whatsoever and I think I said that to Mr. Block and to the newspaper. The problem I have is that was not followed by this man here, Mr. Vicari. That's the problem that I have."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "But the Director did not hire him. The Board did through Management and Budget which I oversee and paid through the Treasurer's Office which I oversee. So I take a personal interest in this concern."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "Yes."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "And we went on your word that everything was being appropriately handled. I don't know what else to say to that.....And I'm very disappointed, but I had to talk about this in this meeting because I....."

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "And I have no problem talking about anything because I wish...I'm going to come back. I wasn't planning on coming back, but I'm obviously going to have to come back. I'm going to pluck out those emails that will tell you the other side of the story. You obviously knew I was coming because Erik wrote this story about Bill plans on coming to the meeting so you were well prepared."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Well isn't that my job?"

WILLIAM SANTOS, JACKSON: "I left all the pages...... I left the whole case. I would have been prepared. If you want to go tit for tat all the way from day one, I'm fine with that. I have no problems with that. Prepare for the truth. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Bill. As you know we gave you sufficient time and again, this was discussed at the Editorial Board today. Everything that Mr. Bill Santos said is not just untrue. It's totally untrue. It's unfounded. It's unsupported. Unfortunately, as a disgruntled employee, he talks about two things – hatred. He hates Joe Vicari. He wants revenge. You heard what he just said. So again, I'm not going to go back and forth to dignify what you've said. It's very, very unfortunate that you feel that way Mr. Santos. You were paid very well by us. \$125,000 a year as pointed in the Editorial Board. Health Benefits. You retired with a pension of \$70,000 a year and lifetime health benefits. So I don't know why you're so upset with Joe Vicari. There's things I don't deal with. When people walk around for two years and talk about hate it's a sad thing. A sad thing. You know you turn on the TV and you see people hate all over the world and what they do. You're possessed by hate. I'm not going to debate you. All I'm going to say is that I feel sorry for you. Next person who would like to speak."

ADMINISTRATOR CARL BLOCK: "Mr. Director if I could just sum up."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay sir. You are next then. Go ahead Carl."

ADMINISTRATOR CARL BLOCK: "I'd just like to clarify because I was asked to research the issue about the bugs or whatever that you would have received had the County purchased any. So we did an exhaustive search both by vendor, by type, went through all of the purchase orders and no such device was ever purchased by the County. So I just wanted to make sure I got on the record since Mr. Santos had mentioned or insinuated that you had an interest in and the County bought them. There was no such purchase."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "And when I told the Asbury Park Press it was spam. I didn't even open it up. There was no reply to it. And I also acknowledged that I just received an email from Nigeria saying I won \$1 million. Oh, the

students have to leave now. We will sign those (agendas). In order to get credit for what's taking place. I'm sure you'll talk about this tomorrow. It will be an experience. This is a learning moment for our students as far as what takes place. And again, just remember there's no truth to what Mr. Veni has said. I mean Mr. Santos. So what Mr. Santos has said is absolutely not true. There's no basis. It was proven today before the Editorial Board. Okay I want to go to the next speaker. Or no, I have to go to Mr. Block. Mr. Block had the floor before we were interrupted for a few minutes."

ADMINISTRATOR CARL BLOCK: "Besides the issue of the purchase of the detection devices, the Board asked me to prepare a generic of how does the selection process work. I did create a flow chart, although Mr. Santos just said the process he agrees with so. So just for the edification of those who are here and may have a question.

If there is a straight bid like if Mr. Scarantino was building a road, there would be specs for the road put out. There would be a time for contractors to give a sealed bid. Those bids are opened in this room as a matter of fact and whatever the lowest number is, that's it. That's who gets the bid – the lowest qualified bidder - as long as they have other statutory, required paperwork.

There are some other services that are procured through an RFP, a Request For Proposal or an RFQ, a Request for Qualifications – they could be a commodity, they could be a service. Very quickly, the whole process was designed to keep the Freeholders out of the procurement process. Only they can award bid in the final analysis, but it starts out as a recommendation after it has been filtered through the system. The system starts at the department. That department that wants to have it, needs a service, again I will use Mr. Scarantino since he's in the front. He'll need on an as-needed basis for a structural company to test the strength or coring of a road, the strength of steel that was installed for a bridge or some testing like that. Well you don't know when you're going to need that. You don't know how long. So you go out for an RFP for a company for what is called an as-needed (basis). You establish an approved list. That starts with the department manager either responsible for purchasing the material or the services. That person, again I am using Mr. Scarantino since he's handy, he would have to petition the Consultant Review Committee, a separate committee which is myself, County Counsel and the Director of Management and Budget – now Mr. Fiure, before Mr. Patterson. They would come to the committee and ask if they could go out for proposal. At that point we're talking procedurally. What do you need? Do you need a good? No that's a bid. And give them direction where to go and how to place it.

The Department Head then goes back and puts together that RFP. What service does he need? What are they looking for? That comes back to the Consultant Review Committee to go out. Then when it comes back it's separate. It is a technical along with some other qualifications for the RFP and the price is separate for an RFQ. It's really a qualification and you need to negotiate the price after you've selected who is the best qualified person. So we'll take a typical RFP, you get nine people who respond, those are opened, they are all sealed. They are delivered to my office sealed. They go through the Department Head. The Department Head reviews the proposals, puts a committee together. You usually get three scores. Three blind scores. You score the technical merits as it's related in the RFP so that the person proposing it knows what they're going to be scored on and it is a component for their familiarity with the RFP, with the project and cost. The percentages can vary depending on what the Department Head wants.

After the technical part is done it comes back to the Consultant Review (Committee). They were given a score sheet, if you will, or a 'where are we with the ranking'. At that point, the pricing is opened. The pricing is then factored, given to the Department Head. That is factored in and then the final score - then that person is recommended. Number one is the person who gets the contract. Or you could have a list of people. Sometimes the testing or surveying or a couple things, and again using Mr. Scarantino, you might have to establish a list in case one is busy and you need something done right away, you can go to the next person on the list.

With that done in its totality, the Consultant Review Committee of County Counsel, myself and Mr. Fiure, we then recommend to the Board of Freeholders – here's who has gone through the whole process, here is the person we are recommending – because by State Law the only one that can vote and hire them is this Board. The system, again, to begin with and end with is designed to keep – I know they're all my bosses, but – you have to keep these guys out of it because it is bad policy to have anyone involved in it for this very reason. I don't know how much clearer I can do this. I did produce a little flow chart that establishes that for anyone that may want to look at it. I know it's very boring and I apologize, I'm not usually that boring. But, I do apologize. It is a process from beginning to end to try to keep and it sort of mirrors the bidding process and that's how it was designed. As far asit was before my time, I came on as Administrator in 2010. This Consultant Review Committee was about I think it's five or six or so that actually thought about starting and doing it and certainly all of the JMV went through the process. So the first proposal JMV Consulting was in 2006 and the last one was 2013. In all cases and each year there were multiple persons that applied. Nobody was disqualified. In each case, JMV came out to be the technical ranked at number one and then he was also the low cost, therefore, when you do the math if you are already the number one at the technical value and you add you're number one on the math value, number one meaning the lowest, then mathematically you have to be the one to win as the successful (bidder).

I wanted to make sure I did that. I know it's a process that the Board is aware of. I know in running government sometimes the procurement seems a little cumbersome. I apologize, but I did want to put it on the record and say that I have all the information in writing with me and I will be there to answer or put anything else on the record or answer any questions that anyone else wants to ask."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I would like to turn it over to Freeholder Little who wants to make a comment."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. That process that the Administrator was describing is designed

specifically to protect the integrity of this Board to make sure that we get the best qualified individuals to serve this Board whether it's an asphalt company or a consulting engineer or whatever the case may be at the best possible price. In fact, that process has been modeled in many areas of the County that was started right here. And it is that integrity that has been steadfast with this Board of Freeholders since the time I've been here. From the beginning, everyone insisted that this is how we do the process to make sure that we do it in the way that best protects the people of Ocean County.

And I'd like to comment just briefly, we have a lot of Directors out here in the audience today and we appreciate all of them. We do our very best to provide them with a good standard of living with positive benefits and they serve us loyally and we appreciate that. We're here to serve the people of the County and all those Directors and their staffs are here to serve as well. We work very hard to make sure that we provide them with the best possible benefits and I'm sure that if you went around and if you asked Jill Perez back there and say can you say anything bad about Freeholder Little. She can probably invent something and come up with something about how stubborn he is sometimes and how this and that.... My point is, I think it's a little bit disingenuous that somebody gets two emails and somebody comes up and reads two emails about two former employees that worked with any one of us - me or Jimmy or Joe or John or Jack for thirty years – you're going to find people that complain. Okay. Absolutely."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Gerry they all like you."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "I know. They love you too. (laughter) But you're going to find people like that. But I guarantee you could find 100 people that would complement Jack or John or Joe or Jimmy and maybe two or three that would complement me for my service. So, you know, picking and choosing what you say, I think that just creates a little bit of false impression. And Bill, you were here before I got here. I have never had any problems with you and to my recollection or knowledge you never came to me and said, you know, something is going on illegal or something is this or something that because none of us on this Board of Freeholders would permit that or condone it in any way. So it's kind of disappointing, this Board as was said before, was generous to you as we are generous to every one of our employees. If they know of anything that's wrong, anything that's illegal, anything that's being done improperly, they go to this gentleman down on the end (County Administrator) and they let all of us know and we take care of it in a proper manner. And anything that we would find that would be a criminal offense would go right across the hallway, down the hallway, across the walkway to the Prosecutor's Office. So if that's what's disturbing to this Board because we do our best to maintain the integrity. And people out there, Directors or this and that, they may have problems with me. I hope not. Our doors are open to everyone. So thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Good. Any other comments from members of the Board before I open up again to members of the public? The two individuals. One. Two. In that order as your hands were up. Yes sir. Your name and full mailing address please."

DAN TOTH, 470 MAGNOLIA AVE., BRICK: "Just seeing what's going on here....from my personal experience as a former Councilman in Brick Township who was targeted during political season with personal attacks. Vitriol hatred, personal disagreements have no place here in politics. They try to derail what we're doing. Don't let it happen to you. My wife and I.....I lived in Brick all of my life. My wife moved from Wall Township to buy a house with me in 2003. People think Monmouth County is great. She made a decision to move with me to Brick because taxes were great, school districts are good, it's a great place to be. Freeholder Little just mentioned that 60% of the County is preserved in one way or the other. The amount of recreational opportunity that is afforded to our children which is what everything we do here is about. That's what it means. Don't let anything sidetrack you. The job that you've done over the past 37 years of myself being here has been great. I've worked for the Township of Brick directly for eight years as an elected official and many times I've corresponded to probably every member up here and the response has been phenomenal. I've even reached out to Mr. Scarantino as Engineer. Immediately response. You guys are responsive, responsible. You have the integrity that is top notch and I don't know what the gripe is because I see personal attacks trying to derail what we are doing up here.

As I said, I was under attack as a Councilman. I was trying to do certain things in town to, what I believe, make things better and I was labeled everything. A crook. I was labeled and was even told that....they made up something that I was a martial arts instructor at a school in Brick Township because I was trying to help that individual build his business. They make up things all the time. None of its true half the time. So I just wanted to say keep up the great work. You are doing a phenomenal job up here and I appreciate it not only as a former Councilman, but as a resident here in Ocean County. And my family appreciates all the work that you do. So thank you very much."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Dan. Next person to speak, your name and address for the record."

JOE VENI, 454 VINE ST., BRICK: "Good evening Freeholders. I'm here to publicly ask Bill Santos to rescind his statements, his false accusations, his lies that he has told the Asbury Park Press, News 12 Walt Kane about me. Bill, don't embarrass yourself by making these untruthful statements. Bill, do the right thing, be a man and own up because in the end the truth will prevail and that's it. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Mr. Veni. Anyone else who would like to speak? There in the back and then Mr. Ryan. Yes sir. The one over there in the blue shirt and then Mr. Ryan is next."

TOM PUNTOLILLO, 1060 OVERLOOK DR., TOMS RIVER: "I have nothing to do with political stuff and especially that."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "We want the people's business."

TOM PUNTOLILLO: "This is people business."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "It's that time of the year. We apologize for some of the comments, but it always happens around this time."

TOM PUNTOLILLO: "Anyway. About a week and a half ago I called and asked you for a few minutes of your time to speak to me personally. I told you I was having problems at the Tax Office downtown. I was handed over to Carl who I believe did a good job. But my problem is this. Let me step back and tell you how I'm being handled. I want to take a few minutes of your time."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Sure. Take your time."

TOM PUNTOLILLO: "Four years ago I had a return coming from the PT Book, the blue book you sign in. Like always, they were late with their tax bill so it was late in December. I paid the bill. I was on time. So now my tax bill doesn't come in. I don't get paid. So I call up and say, 'What's the trouble?' 'Well you didn't pay your taxes before the end of the year.' I said, 'I paid my taxes and I'll show you' and I showed them. They didn't want to know nothing about it. So I went to your office, not your personal office — to the office downtown."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "The Mayor's office."

TOM PUNTOLILLO: "No."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "This office. This here office."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Senior Services."

TOM PUNTOLILLO: "And I got a fellow by the name of Mike. A nice kid. I told Mike what was going on. I said, 'Michael, look, my check was paid on the 28th. It was the holidays. They didn't open their mail. That ain't my problem. That's theirs.' So they weren't going to pay me. It wasn't the money. It was the (inaudible) Well back and forth, back and forth, I'm talking to Mike and (inaudible) and we straightened it right out. He fixed the mix-up. I don't know who he called, but he called somebody downtown and he's talking to him and his face changed and he said to me, 'You can't listen to this conversation. You've got to get out of my office.' You're talking about me. Why can't I stay in the office. Well, I get out. You know, I ain't looking for trouble. Well he comes back and says I can't help you. You can't help me? I believe I took the card. I hope you were there in 2010 Carl, whatever it was. Anyway, I said 'look do I have to go to the Attorney General to get help?' This is wrong. The next thing you know I was paid.

Now, this year comes, 2013. I got a rebate check. My bills, I have never missed a payment. I'm a taxpayer. I've been in this town 45 years. Never had no trouble with the tax collectors. I get a \$350.00 rebate so I go downtown. I just happened to run into Carl, the tax collector, and I tell him how do you take \$350.00 of mine. I said that's supposed to be a rebate to me. My taxes are up. He said no. He said you didn't have enough. I said what do you mean I don't have enough? Well its just (inaudible) enough that he, the \$350.00 used to bounce on my tax bill that he put on. I said what are you doing here? Oh no, he said that's supposed to pay your bill (inaudible) I said no, no. That's mine. It was sent to the tax collector, but I had no bill. Well, to make a long story short, my tax bill comes to \$350.00. Not \$340.00, not \$360.00, it was just that \$350.00 that it came to. So now we get talking and we're just talking now. I'm talking about the tax liens. I said to him how do these tax liens work? What do you mean? I said well I missed a payment. The only reason I'm telling you this, I'm getting up in age. I got a little younger wife than me and I don't want to see her if God help it something happens to me, she loses everything. I said to him how does this tax lien work? He said well if you miss a tax we charge you 8-15% or 18%. I don't know what the percentage is

I said now if you missed a second tax payment, so what do you do? We add it to the bill. Now, I said to him how can you charge me 18% or 15%, whatever it is, on the first bill and then add it on the second bill. You're trying to push people out of their houses. That ain't right. Well now we go back and forth and he says to me....I said to him how does this work? He said well it goes up for auction. I said okay. Just answer me, who makes the final decision who gets to bid? Who gets the money? He never answered my question. Never answered it, just beat around the bush. The next thing I know, security is behind me. He comes walking over and there ain't no argument...."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Just so everyone knows. It's not in this building. It was in Toms River Town Hall. They collect taxes. We don't collect taxes. Okay. Just so you know."

TOM PUNTOLILLO: "Correct."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Toms River Town Hall."

TOM PUNTOLILLO: "In the book I read it said if I have a problem as a senior citizen....."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Absolutely. Come to me. Whatever it is, come to me and if it's right they take the credit and if it's wrong it's my problem they did that. Anything that's wrong comes to the Director."

TOM PUNTOLILLO: "No. No."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "No I'm serious, I'm not making light of it. I'll tell you what I did."

TOM PUNTOLILLO: "He did."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "That's right. I'm responsible for it."

TOM PUNTOLILLO: "Yes I called in and nothing wrong got done. I think you did a pretty good job."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "You know we tried. We spoke to the Mayor and we told you later that even the Administrator and we spoke about it several times. But I wanted you to finish out of respect that was your time."

TOM PUNTOLILLO: "So anyway, I asked and I never got an answer. I asked them how come my taxes in four years went up almost \$500.00. No answer. Now, if the \$350.00 was given to me as a rebate on my taxes and then used as (inaudible) was accumulated....that it was supposed to be....show me. It just came out that the \$350.00 was exactly what my tax bill was."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "We'll answer that question. Mr. Block can you answer the question please? And again, even though it's not our department, we want to give you an answer. Yes sir. Mr. Block."

ADMINISTRATOR CARL BLOCK: "Certainly. Tom came and we spoke and I told him that Freeholder Vicari had personally given me the note. He was on his way. He's been very active the last few months. And I reached out and had a conversation with you several times and with Toms River. I explained that the tax collection is a municipal, by statute, a municipal function. I did talk to the Administrator, Paul Shives, who talked to the tax collector who I believe is named Carl as well."

TOM PUNTOLILLO: "I believe it's Carl. I didn't want to put you...."

ADMINISTRATOR CARL BLOCK: "The tax collector you're mad has my name! I think it's Carl DeLeo though and he did have him reach out to you. That's what he reported back to me."

TOM PUNTOLILLO: "He called me after you called me and told me they're going to call you from downtown."

ADMINISTRATOR CARL BLOCK: "I told you they are employed downtown."

TOM PUNTOLILLO: "He called me and said well come in. I said no, no. Give me the answers and I'll be in. No, no, no. I said look we ain't getting nowhere. Hold still Carl, let me finish."

ADMINISTRATOR CARL BLOCK: "You can say that Tom."

TOM PUNTOLILLO: "I was there."

ADMINISTRATOR CARL BLOCK: "That's my boss there."

TOM PUNTOLILLO: "I was there. So now I only want to know a couple of things. First, who gets the last word on who gets these bids? In other words, somebody bids on it, now who gets to decide that this guy's going to get it? Somebody has to make the decision."

ADMINISTRATOR CARL BLOCK: "And on the phone I explained this as I know as a previous Mayor. The tax sale is governed by State Statute. The tax collector holds the sale. The sale requires that there be a publication three consecutive weeks with names in the paper so there's notice to the public that it's going to happen. There is actually an open public auction that happens, held by the collector, and people bid interest. That's what they're actually bidding. If no one bids, the township receives the lien. If a third party accepts the lien or bids on it and gets it, they have to wait two years before they start an in-persona foreclosure and at any time you have the absolute right to pay the bill. And if the town gets it, it has the option of doing it within six months, but it doesn't have to. It can and that's in-rem foreclosure. But it is done in public. The outline, the process is in the State Law and has to be followed by every collector the same throughout the entire State."

TOM PUNTOLILLO: "Okay. I only got two more questions and I'll be getting out of your hair. First of all I asked who makes the final decision to who gets it? Somebody has got to say well....."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "The township. Okay. With the town.....you're in the wrong building."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "It's a bid. It's whoever bids the highest."

TOM PUNTOLILLO: "Well but somebody's got to say who is (inaudible)."

ADMINISTRATOR CARL BLOCK: "It's the tax collector."

TOM PUNTOLILLO: "The tax collector himself. He couldn't give me that answer.

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "He should have."

TOM PUNTOLILLO: "Number two. Hey look fellas, I'm not a liar. I only got a (inaudible)

DIRECTOR VICARI: "We know. It's okay Tom."

TOM PUNTOLILLO: "On the part that they charge you interest on your taxes. Now, the first one you're late, the first quarter, excuse me, they charge you so much interest. Now the second quarter of course you can't make. You

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couldn't pay the first one. They charge you not only the interest, to my belief now, they not only charge you interest on the first quarter, but they add it to the next quarter and now you're charged plus the interest. Then again...."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "It's on a per annum rate though. Whatever the payment is it's per year."

TOM PUNTOLILLO: "No."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Yes it is."

TOM PUNTOLILLO: "The way it was explained.....excuse me, I'm trying to get this straight. The way it was explained to me...."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "If it's 8%, sir, it's 8% a year not 8% a quarter."

TOM PUNTOLILLO: "Well that's not the way it was explained, but that's (inaudible) That's why I called him."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "That's why he called me and asked us why you came over here. We will explain it."

TOM PUNTOLILLO: "Now, I said to him, who made this that you could charge anything you want. It's not....."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "The State of New Jersey."

TOM PUNTOLILLO: "After your tax is sold I said to him, well now you're going to tax me again because the man you sold it to wants to be paid. How much can he charge me?"

ADMINISTRATOR CARL BLOCK: "The amount he bid."

TOM PUNTOLILLO: "No answer. I didn't get an answer. I said how much can he charge me? 30%? 40%? It looks like they're trying to steal a house from underneath people. I'm a senior. The only reason, like I said, I'm here, I'm 78 years old. My wife's a little younger. God forbid something happens to me. I could always make a living somehow. But she's got a little bit of savings. You're going to put her right out of her home."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "You know, I agree Tom and I think you should run for the Assembly next year. You can make some changes...."

TOM PUNTOLILLO: "No. No....."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Tom's going to Trenton and I'm going to sign your petition. But look, you know, there's other people and several people walked out so I know there are others who want to speak. But I just want to tell you one thing as you sit down. There was a former Freeholder by the name of Jim Mancini and what he would tell the people that came, especially the seniors, he said, 'I'm running for re-election. If you elect me...no taxes and I'm going to double your Social Security.' Okay. So that's why he said I have nothing to do with politics."

TOM PUNTOLILLO: "I have nothing to do with politics. I don't vote locally. I only vote for the Presidential election. That's all I vote and I don't always vote the same way. One time it's Republican and one time it's Democrat. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much Tom. We'll look at it. We appreciate you coming. Okay. So I said the next person who is going to speak is Mr. Ryan. A number of people left and I just want Mr. Ryan because I gave him a commitment that he would be able to speak today at the Editorial Board. He has a list of questions and the people are entitled not only to hear it, but also the news media. So if Mr. Ryan can come to the podium I would appreciate it."

TIMOTHY RYAN, 1408 ISABELLA COURT, TOMS RIVER: "I first want to thank you for allowing me to speak today Mr. Vicari and the other members of the Board. Actually what I'm going to have to say today is pretty light compared to what we've been hearing so far.

There's two things that I want to ask of the Board. Two recommendations actually that I would like to propose. One is that you pass an Ordinance or a Resolution banning any elected official from collecting a pension and a paycheck for the same job. Now I know it's legal. It's totally legal, but to me it's immoral and it doesn't pass the smell test. You would, by doing that, you would set the template for the State of New Jersey and other counties to take it up and do the same thing. You know if I was running for the State Assembly as you said or the State Senate...."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Which you did a number of times."

TIMOTHY RYAN: "I never pretend to be somebody.

TIMOTHY RYAN: "I would be retaining-??? that. So that's one question that I ask of you to do. The other one is that I would ask that you place the minutes, not the minutes, the agenda on the website at least 48 hours prior to the Board Meeting so that people can see it at least two days before if they were to decide to come. Those are pretty light-hearted things that I brought before you today. I didn't know that I was coming here today to hear depositions against Mr. Santos, but it was good theater anyway. Thank you so much."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Speaking of theater, Mr. Director, could you indulge me a minute?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I will turn the meeting back over to Freeholder Bartlett."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Mr. Ryan, Freeholder Vicari came back from the Editorial Board laughing somewhat, but I wasn't. And apparently you said there that the County's finances are not in order or something along those lines."

TIMOTHY RYAN: "I never said that."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Or something along those lines."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "You said you would do a better job because you're a businessman in the County."

TIMOTHY RYAN: "Well I think I can do a better job."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "That's your opinion. We just want to give you an answer."

TIMOTHY RYAN: "That has nothing to do.....I did not disparage Mr. Bartlett's work at all today. Not in the least."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "We're not talking about that. We didn't say that."

TIMOTHY RYAN: "Whatever."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Well listen to the answer first sir."

TIMOTHY RYAN: "No. Not once, Mr. Bartlett, did I say you don't do a good job."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "We never said that."

TIMOTHY RYAN: "Your name was not brought up."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Never mentioned it.

TIMOTHY RYAN: "I never alluded to that."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "If you would sit down and listen instead of getting excited."

TIMOTHY RYAN: "I said that as a businessman I could bring a business sense to the Board. There's nothing wrong with saying that. The message doesn't disparage anybody else's work."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Well I think that someone assumes there's no business sense that's here."

TIMOTHY RYAN: "Sir?"

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "I said then perhaps it suggests that there's no business sense here."

TIMOTHY RYAN: "I didn't say that. I said I could add to the Board a business sense as well."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Well I don't know what experience you've had....."

TIMOTHY RYAN: "You know, I'm not running against you. I'm not going to debate you. I would be glad to....."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Okay, but you are running against the integrity of this Board and that concerns me and I'm going to just read something to you."

TIMOTHY RYAN: "Well I didn't know this was going to turn into a political debate."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "No it isn't."

TIMOTHY RYAN: "As I said, I did not take your name in vain at all today. I didn't take none of yours."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "I didn't say that either."

TIMOTHY RYAN: "Well you're trying to say that I did. That I brought it up that the County's not.....you're not doing a proper job with the Budget....never said that. I said and I have it right here.....all I said was this. 'That the County tax rate has increased by 25.4% since 2010 from a .272 to a 3.41. That's over 6% a year and triple the cost of living actually. The County Budget is approximately \$436 million. Last year it was \$418 million. That's up \$18 million. That was the extent of the conversation."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Well, of course, then I think as you now understand, the County Budget was up because we had a huge influx of FEMA money that must run through our Budget so it artificially inflates it. But I also would like to point out to you that the County tax rate today is less than it was when I arrived here 35 years ago.

And "

TIMOTHY RYAN: "How much have you collected in that time."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Let me have your attention."

TIMOTHY RYAN: "I didn't know this was going to turn into a debate. If you want a debate.....if the Republican Party wants to debate me, fine, I will meet with you......any party. If you, you, you, you or you want to debate with me any night, I'll be glad to do it. I didn't come here today to do that. All I came here today for was to ask for two suggestions that I placed as a gentleman before the Board and that's it."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "I'm not suggesting you're not a gentleman. But I am suggesting the County's finances.....

TIMOTHY RYAN: "Well I'm done."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "are well.....

TIMOTHY RYAN: "Thank you."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "run...."

TIMOTHY RYAN: "Thank you for your time Mr. Vicari."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "I am going to continue whether he is listening or not."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Mr. Ryan."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "This County's finances are well run. Thirty years ago we had an A-1 rating. That then moved to a AA-3 to then a AA-2 and then a AA-1 and two or three years ago, we hit the jackpot at AAA. Now some people may say 'well that doesn't mean anything'. I did a little bit of research before this meeting because my buddy got me a little upset here.

You know in New York State, the State of New York how many counties have a AAA bond rating? Three, in the entire State of New York. Ocean County which has a per capita income that is about 85% of the State level. We're not a rich county. But because of the financial management of this Board and the dedication that we have put toward that, we have achieved the best rating possible. The State of Pennsylvania which has far more counties than New Jersey, there are only four. Far more wealthy than we are, these places have incomes that are far superior to the State average and the national average. We don't.

And I just want to end with this one – no one has ever accused me of not using money wisely. My father used to say, he's still alive and 95, that I squeezed a nickel so hard the Indian ended up riding on the buffalo. And there was some truth to that. So I'm very happy with finances of this County. We lost \$20 billion worth of ratables, okay, in Superstorm Sandy and the Recession and we came through that with our AAA bond rating. When Superstorm Sandy hit, we bailed out municipalities. We wrote checks for \$100 million and we paid that in cash. We had to borrow from every trust fund that we ever heard of, but we did it. The rating agencies said 'how could you possibly do that?' Well, we found the money. Julie Tarrant did it. And, by the way, you know what? It's all paid back. \$100 million to bail out municipalities to clean up the debris from Sandy. We were criticized. So no one – no one – under any circumstances whatsoever can claim that this County is not financially well managed. One may say you spend your money in the wrong places. One may say you should spend more on this or less on this or this, that or the other thing, but you can't say the overall management has anything but the highest regard in the financial markets of this country. And we, as a Board, all take responsibility for that and take great pride and pleasure in that. Mr. Vicari, thank you for allowing me that. I couldn't help it."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "The next question you have, I want to get the answer to his question from Mrs. Vasil. As far as the question that was directed at you that was also mentioned several times before."

CLERK VASIL: "Sure, no problem Director. On the issue of placing the agenda online 24 or 48 hours ahead. The agenda is actually a working document up until....we try to complete by about 2:00 PM the day of the meeting. However, there is a Board workshop meeting, PreBoard Meeting, that has agendas and whatever is discussed at that just gets added to this agenda. So there would be.....you know, like I said, it's online at 2 o'clock the day of the meeting with all the accompanying resolutions right there for the public to view. So that is available. If you come to my office ahead of time, I could probably give you a preliminary agenda, but to put a preliminary agenda out on the internet and then have it change radically between the time it's posted and the time of the meeting wouldn't be fair to the public either."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay. Moving along. There are a number of other people with their hands up. Just so you know, most of what we do, of course, is with the Budget and unfortunately Mr. Ryan could not make those Budget meetings and it's very informative. Afterwards if you want more information, Mrs. Tarrant would be more than happy to give you information. Anyone else who would like to speak? One, two, three, four, five. Yes. Carol? No the lady. Well, you're halfway up, you might as well come up and then we'll have Carol Benson."

SEBATE RUSSO, 436 PENNSYLVANIA AVE., PINE BEACH: "Thank you Joe. I want to go home. I wasn't going to speak, but anyway..... I'm a friendly neighbor of Mr. Bartlett. I watch him rake his lawn every day. Mow his grass."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "It's the cleanest lawn in town."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "We will try to look into it. Mr. Block will give you a call tomorrow and give a detailed report. Just give us your telephone number. Okay?"

SEBATE RUSSO: "Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. Sorry you had to wait so long. Mrs. Benson please."

CAROL BENSON, 32 CAMELOT DRIVE, TOMS RIVER: "Just the issue about the agenda, I have that conflict with the township also not putting the agendas for any of the Boards. The Board of Adjustment, the Planning Board or their agenda — why it cannot be done on a Friday before the week starts. To put it on the day of a meeting.....why bother? That's my point and which is a problem I have with the Council and now listening to it here, you're the same thing. So I think it's a waste of time to put an agenda on the computer the day of the meeting."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Well there is an agenda prepared, Mr. Director, I'm sorry....."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Yes Freeholder Bartlett, that's okay."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "I hear what you're saying. We do produce an agenda for the work meeting and I believe goes on...."

CLERK VASIL: "That does not, but we could certainly put that on Freeholder."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "However, what has actually transpired at these meetings.....often times that agenda is a work in progress and something may be added to it."

CAROL BENSON: "That's fine. I don't have a problem with that."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "It may be at the last minute and then someone would say 'wait a minute, you published this agenda and now you've gone and put these things on after the fact."

CAROL BENSON: "Well you could put the date that the additions were put on."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "Well that's an interesting idea. I mean..."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "We discussed that before the meeting..."

FREEHOLDER BARTLETT: "....that's more of a technical problem with this.....because we want to be open and transparent. You can't be hiding anything anyway so why try."

CAROL BENSON: "That's right. What I came here for is Mule Road and Route 37. Now, Hospital Drive and Route 37 you cannot turn right on red. I don't know whether it's ever happened to you, but on Mule Road you can turn right on red. Well the jughandle.....these people think when the light turns green that they can turn right. But they can't turn right and I don't understand why they can be permitted to turn because I was coming off the jughandle going east and as I go I want to go into a building on the right-hand lane. This person turns right out in front of me. It happened to me not once, but maybe two, three times and I said the next time I go to the Board meeting I going to mention this. There should be a no turn on right off Mule Road onto Route 37."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Frank is making notes on this. I just want you to know the County Engineer is looking into that."

CAROL BENSON: "Okay. If you can't turn right off of Hospital Drive onto 37, the same situation should be on Mule Road."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Thank you."

CAROL BENSON: "That's the other thing I came here for. But this issue with Freeholder Vicari stinks of politics. I am not a political person. I changed my party to Independent because whenever I disagreed with the party that I was attached to, the other party would get mad at me. When I would agree with the other party, the other party would get mad at me. So I decided I am going to be an Independent and, you know, and just go with my feelings and I have been in the company with Freeholder Vicari back when he was a Committeeperson in town with Tom Rankin. There has never been a time that I talked to Freeholder Vicari that he ever lost his temper, never raised his voice. You could spar with him in his decisions. And, he is the only person, political or whatever, that if I called his office and

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leave a note with his secretary either he calls me back.....and if I leave the house, he's probably already calling me back.....or he directs the person who I have the concern about and that person would call me. So I think this whole situation is just political because of the election and I would vote for Mr. Vicari. So thank you for listening."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much Mrs. Benson. I talk to you all the time and I appreciate those kind words."

CAROL BENSON: "You're welcome."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Several other people had their hands raised. Mr. Black is first and then the person behind him to the left."

GARY BLACK, JACKSON: "There's a lot to be said for what's happened here today. We saw a political campaign collapse as we've seen so many before. Part of being a boss is sometimes what you do is unpopular. My boss, and it figures there are people that know him here, and I'm going to say two things about him. One, at times he can be a pain in the ass. However, there's been times when I needed help and he's the first one there to help me. And I'm sure which one is going to get back to him.

I was going to come up here to attack some of what was going on, but I think the fact that it just fell to pieces here today kind of sums it up. Whenever you're dealing with.....and I was always curious when the FBI was brought up because any accusations probably had nothing to do with a Federal law being violated and if a Federal law's not being violated, the FBI is not going to get involved in this. It's not what they enforce. And if you do announce an investigation and you're not supposed to, we'd have an immediate sighting of the FBI because that person would be put in handcuffs for obstruction. So I really doubt there's an FBI investigation going on. I think that was made more than clear when the facts got brought out completely and you were completely decimated here in front of us. I can understand why Mr. Ryan is upset because his campaign just went to crap.

Secondly, but there are some things being done with some of the people who are vying against you that's been said down the road and by that party, it's the idea is they want to create another form of government. Another layer of government with its own engineers, its own tax rate, where people are taxed on their pervious soil. For anybody in the room that doesn't know what that means, that's like your house, your driveway, anything that water can't go through. You are going to pay a separate property tax. That's only for Ocean County. And that's what the Democrats in Trenton want to do to us. They keep changing the wording and this pops up almost every year for the past few years. Fortunately, the Governor keeps voting it down. But this is just some of the things they want to do to us. And have a layer that has its own branch of people, its own (inaudible), its own engineers, its own legal attorneys.....sorry guys....on top of what we already have, when we're way ahead of the State on road drainage. Look at the condition of Route 37. Look at the mess that Route 9 is. And look at our County roads. We can do it. We've been doing it. Hell, the State ought shut up and start watching us.

Again, when I come up here and say.....and I don't get anything for this. You guys hook me up on personal levels and stuff like that, but I don't do anything. I don't get any money back from anything. I've never actually agreed with the way the County government has to buy things through the same expensive bureaucracy that actually to keep it looking clean and prevent from false accusations, you actually have to pay through the nose for stuff which is insane. Frankly, I'm one to say bring back the crap it was cheaper.

You're the model of what County government, any local government, should be. I've told anybody that's recently got elected from any campaigns in the town that I work for, come here and watch you guys. Joe and you guys will show you how it's done. And I say that because I mean it. I learned a lot of that because I used to be part of the other party. I'm much better now, thank you. And I did opposition research into to find out who you were and found I'm saying wait a minute I'm on the wrong side here. And I came over quick. It was almost 20 years, but I don't think it's that long. Is it? You remember. But I'm glad I did and you guys are what it's supposed to be. You know, the only thing that's ever been said against you has been crap. They say 'oh well, let's get rid of the surplus. Give that back to the people'. Well what would have happened to the storm? What would our bonding rate be? What would happen if an emergency happened and you had to take out an emergency loan and you had to double tax next year? They forget about that. That was one from the past campaign. The reason that they throw sneers and you get some of this insane crap is look at the State when they ran it and look at here. Look at Jackson Township when they ran it and look at now. This is why they can't come out with anything else other than that. They don't have it. They can't do it and they've proved it time and time again. And you can do it and you prove it time and time again. And that's just it in a nutshell. I've already voted for you. I mailed it in. I love those things now. And it's for a good reason. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. Next person? Each one will have an opportunity. Just state your full name and mailing address please."

WAYNE MAURO, 552 WELLS MILLS ROAD, WARETOWN: "I had no idea you guys had this much fun at County meetings. I've lived here 35 years. I've never been to one. I'm a longtime pilot and recently the County instituted some improvements at the airport. It meant enough to me to get the benefit of those things to come here and talk about it a little bit. I don't know if people in the audience really fully understand what has recently happened at Ocean County Airport, but we've got one of the only new runways in the State of New Jersey. I heard in 40 years there hadn't been a new runway put in in the State of New Jersey.

I've been flying my airplane out of Ocean County Airport, Miller Field, since the 70's and while it's always been a wonderful facility and well managed and well taken care of – I know that from first-hand experience – it's recently

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gotten a makeover and improvement that there isn't an amount of money that you can place on the value of the safety that the new runway imparts to the people who use it. So I want to tell you all personally that I appreciate that very much and it's a wonderful addition to the community.

I think that the economic benefits that will flow out of that kind of thoughtful, carefully engineered expenditure in terms of the business activity that will be generated – I fly in my own business fairly frequently. I've been to Columbus, Ohio in the last month. I've been to Massachusetts four or five times in the last month. I've been to North Carolina. And the ability to have that facility locally here isthere's really....I can't even tell you how valuable that is to this business community overall. I just want to let you all know that as a user of that facility that the efforts and the value that you placed on that by doing all the work because I know it was many, many years in the making to get those improvements in, and it's just one of those things that people don't talk about, but it has an incalculable value and I personally appreciate it.

If I can take one more minute and talk about something else related to it."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Yes."

WAYNE MAURO: "I'm a part-time pilot for the Forest Fire Service as well as flying for myself. In the last year, the Forest Fire Service which is a Division of Parks and Natural Resources which is a Division of the DEP has flown over 120 missions over the waterways of New Jersey – Barnegat Bay, Raritan Bay, Sandy Hook, the coastal ocean beaches all the way to Cape May and up to Salem County and the Delaware Bay. I personally flew 25 or 30 of those missions – six days a week from Memorial Day until Labor Day and several days a week before that and after that. The Forest Fire Service provides an aerial platform for the DEP to do environmental monitoring and water quality assessments of all the waterways in New Jersey. I got the opportunity to fly with DEP scientists and Rutgers engineers that work jointly to provide daily monitoring of the quality of the Bay. The information that we collect from these flights through the instrumentation – we have laser equipment, laser computerized equipment that actually shoots down into the water through the bottom of the airplane and as we're travelling up the Bay up to Sandy Hook and Raritan Bay and back down along the ocean – it collects data on a number of critical elements that the scientists and the engineers use to determine the water quality and to keep tabs on what's going on. I know that it's been, and again, this is the first time I've ever been to a County meeting, but in looking in the papers over this last year and in previous years, water quality is a huge, important element to this County. For me personally, I take great satisfaction in being involved in some small part in being able to make sure our water is maintained and safe and as clean as possible.

The important thing that I've gotten from being involved in that and working with these folks is that on a daily basis, this information is uploaded for every tract that we fly and is analyzed for a number of different components. That information is available through the DEP and through Rutgers Environmental studies websites that shows through the course of the year, daily, not only what the water quality is in any particular area, but whether it's improved in an area or whether it's not as clean as it might have been. One of things that I've learned being involved in that is that, generally speaking, the efforts that the State and the County have employed over the last thirty years has made the water the cleanest it's been in fifty years. And, while we've had some setbacks with Sandy and some things involved with that, it's really comforting to know that we are paying attention as a community and as a State and as a County to the water quality to the level that we are.

I just wanted to thank you all for....."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Before you sit down, Wayne, I just want to thank you for adding to it. Every year, we invite the Fire Service here to give a report, but generally what we focus on is the forest fires and the season and what's being done. We don't really focus on some of these other services. So what you did was just add a lot to a report that we received several months ago from the Fire Service. We do work very closely with them. I happen to serve as Director of Law & Public Safety so I work very closely with Fire Service. The Sheriff is right here and through Emergency Management works very closely with the Fire Service. Freeholder Vicari, with Miller Airport, has become very much a proponent and made improvements, as you said, to that airport. One of the reasons being that it is something that serves Ocean County very well to have the Fire Service come in and out. So we really do appreciate you coming here.

Now I have one question for you. Now that you see how much fun we have, are you going to start coming on a regular basis to these meetings?"

WAYNE MAURO: "Well it took me 25 years to get here so hopefully it won't be that long again. I just want to say that I came here as an individual and not as a representative of the Forest Fire Service."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "I understand."

WAYNE MAURO: "I don't have any authority anyway."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "No. I do understand. I'm just saying that you did add a lot to what we.....I really don't usually hold that discussion with them because I'm focused really at that point. When you do it in the spring and we're really focused on that it's the time when the County is most at risk, countywide, so we try to focus on that."

WAYNE MAURO: "One of my jobs during April and May, which is peak forest fire season as most of you know, is I'm the bus driver for the State Forest Fire Warden. So wherever he needs to go, I'm his platform and I drive him wherever he needs to go."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Take you airplane. Drive him in your airplane."

WAYNE MAURO: "Well that's what we fly in. When we had the fire here in Berkeley Township in April, a lot of people here didn't realize that there were eight other active fires that we responded to and were working on them all across the State from Gloucester County all the way up to the Delaware Water Gap. On one particular day during that, I flew on eight fires in one day. Thank you very much for thinking about that airport. We appreciate it very much and it's great for the County."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. I just want to add to that. This Board, under the leadership of Freeholder Kelly, approved several meetings ago \$23 million for better communication so that local fire departments plus the police, plus the Sheriff's department and everyone in the office of Emergency Management can communicate whether it be a forest fire or storm or any other natural disasters. Okay. It's getting late. Any other person who would like to speak? You are more than welcome to speak. The last speaker. Yes."

WILLIAM GUMPER, 10 WILLEMSTAD STREET, BERKELEY: "Good Evening Freeholders. I've been coming to the Freeholder meetings, these public meetings, for about ten, twelve years. I also attend the PreBoard Meetings which are very informal meetings where you see the Freeholders as personalities. It's not a formal meeting at all. The public is invited, but they are not....they can sit in the room on the third floor of this building.....I watch the Freeholders perform, but we are not allowed to talk at all, to say one word. That's a very good meeting.

I'm highly supportive of the Freeholders and over the years that I've been watching them perform and I have a lot of respect and confidence in their judgments and their moralities. Any one of the five Freeholders that runs for election that are up there now, I will vote for. No question about it. I also note something that has not been brought out clearly tonight, that the accusation against the Freeholder didn't start until about two months ago which is we're in election time now. It's very suspicious. It looks like election rhetoric. And I also note, in fact I can't note that but I would ask, did the accuser make these accusations before he retired and collected his first pension check to secure his pension or was it after?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Mr. Block, can you answer that question please?"

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "Well certainly while he was employed here Mr. Santos did not participate publicly in the back and forth and meetings so there were no public accusations because he was not a participant. He was a County employee."

WILLIAM GUMPER: "I see. Well then he made the accusation after he collected his first pension check and secured his pension. That, in itself, is also suspicious. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. That concludes the public portion if no one else would have any questions or comments. I move to close the public portion. Is there a motion to adjourn?"

There being no additional comments received, Freeholder Director Vicari called for a motion to adjourn the meeting at 6:40 PM.



RESOLUTION October 15, 2014

WHEREAS, the voters of Ocean County authorized the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund to provide funds for the acquisition and preservation of natural lands, open spaces and farmland; and

WHEREAS, the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee was established by the Board of Chosen Freeholders to review nominations to the program and forward recommendations for acquisition to the Board of Chosen Freeholders; and

WHEREAS, the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee has received a nomination for the property identified as Block 1307, Lot 1.01, Block 1315, Lot 1.01, and Block 1319, Lot 1.01 totaling approximately 3.26 acres located on Eugene Furey Blvd in Berkeley Township; and

WHEREAS, acquisition of the property would provide additional road frontage to the surrounding Potters Creek NLTF property, which consists of approximately 118 acres; and

WHEREAS, an appraisal has been completed to establish the fair market value of the property; and

WHEREAS, the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee has determined the property's attributes are consistent with the Ocean County Open Space Plan and Recreation Inventory; and

WHEREAS, the County of Ocean would acquire the property for an amount not to exceed \$235,000 of equivalent land value of the property; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing on the proposed acquisition was conducted by the Board of Chosen Freeholders on October 15, 2014 as required by PL 1997, c24.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY as follows:

- 1. It accepts the recommendation of the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee to participate in the acquisition of Block 1307, Lot 1.01, Block 1315, Lot 1.01, and Block 1319, Lot 1.01 in the Township of Berkeley.
- 2. It authorizes the expenditure not to exceed \$235,000 in acquisition funds from the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund, Account Number 225-155-0151.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT

- 1. The proper officers of the Board are authorized and directed to sign all necessary documents in order to effectuate these purchases. Freeholder Director Joseph H. Vicari opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Freeholder Kelly advised that the County has been working on the conversion to 700 MHz for a long time to upgrade the County's radio system. The Freeholder noted that there has been more and more interference than ever on the radios for emergency services. The County is going from 500 to 700 MHz and is ready to go with Motorola with a completion time of 12 to 18 months with updated hardware and software. The Freeholder noted that this will upgrade Sheriff communications and hardware, including the CIU lab equipment and a new 911 phone switch for better operation of the system at an estimated cost of \$22 million. Motorolariant advised that the total of \$22,800,000 includes the bonding costs.

Freeholder Kelly provided a PowerPoint for the Board members regarding Law Enforcement and Public Safety Upgrades, a copy of which is attached. Administrator Block noted that the County has been working on this project since 2010, stating that the purpose is to improve the overall quality of radio communications. The Administrator stated that this was put altogether in one budget which includes the conversion to 700 MHz, a new tower at Chestnut The County will be on 700 MHz when the Street and three new additional towers. infrastructure is able to handle this for all of the towns. The Administrator advised that the County negotiated with Motorola to add the option for township's to take advantage of a lease with Motorola if they want to convert to 700 MHz. Motorola will offer financing to townships for 5, 7 and 10 years at a competitive interest rate. Freeholder Kelly stated that we are trying to make this as easy as possible for our towns. Administrator Block noted that townships can do whatever they want to do, however, if they don't upgrade, they will continue to experience interference at 500 MHz. Freeholder Kelly stated that the County will be able to communicate with both the 700 MHz and 500 MHz systems and noted that it has taken some time to get to this point.

Sheriff Mastronardy was in attendance and stated that the problem with interference came about because the FCC was sharing frequencies with commercial and public entities, which has become a safety issue. The Sheriff noted that the conversion will not happen all at once, its will take place over 18 months. Sheriff Mastronardy stated that this conversion is a safety factor; emergency personnel can't hear others and become very frustrated in an emergency. The Sheriff stated that this project is costly; but it will protect emergency personnel in the future. The Sheriff thanked the Board of Chosen Freeholders on behalf of firefighters and police.

Administrator Block stated that this project includes, radios, software, and towers, all of which need to be upgraded. The Administrator noted that updating equipment at the CIU Lab also is an issue that is being addressed as well. This will include evidence tracking software. When 911 moved to the new building, the phone switch had a few useful years; because of the new 911 system, the switch now needs to be upgraded and moved to the new building. The Administrator noted that the 700 MHz system has been reserved for public use which will eliminate interference and also advised that five additional towers need to be built. Freeholder Kelly stated that the County has built 10 towers throughout the last 10 years and this is a continuation of those upgrades. Administrator Block noted that the acquisitions and permitting are not included in the Motorola contract and the County will need additional Pinelands Commission approval to amend some of the permits.

Administrator Block stated that the current systems for warrants, evidence, etc. can not share information and "talk" to each other. Spillman will provide software to info-share all of the evidence through an evidence tracking system. Freeholder Kelly stated that staff has visited Monmouth County who already has the Spillman system installed. Sheriff Mastronardy stated that Ocean County will be able to share information with Monmouth County with the new system. Freeholder Kelly noted that it is advantageous to share law enforcement information between the two counties. Administrator Block stated that municipalities can switch over to Spillman at a discounted price. The Administrator stated Introduted that the engages of the part of the database with the Spillman system; 33 towns will

be able to use the information and be able to communicate better with each other. The Administrator stated that this will be helpful with drug arrests. A GIS person will be needed to run the program and to keep maps current.

The Administrator stated that the new systems will provide more detailed reports; the mass spectrometer will be more accurate and tests done by the Medical Examiner's office can be done in-house through the County's lab. Freeholder Kelly stated that this protects the evidence by doing the testing in-house.

Sheriff Mastronardy discussed the turn around time for lab results and stated that he met regarding this earlier in the year with Captain Bauman. The Sheriff noted that Captain Bauman had a couple of hundred cases in January of this year and that has been reduced to 30 this week. Administrator Block advised that with the new systems, it will populate all databases and integrate information into the LIMS laboratory management system on a network that can be accessed by both the Sheriff and Prosecutors offices. Administrator Block noted that the equipment to be purchased for CIU will be spread out over two years.

Freeholder Kelly stated that the County is ready to move to this better system that will make public safety better and our police, fire, and EMS safer. Freeholder Bartlett stated that the County got the useful life out of the past equipment. Freeholder Kelly noted that the best way to pay for this new equipment and radio system is to bond it ourselves, it is better for our budget. Smaller municipalities who do not have a Triple A bond rating may want to take advantage of the Motorola financing. Freeholder Bartlett stated that this will be financed next year.

Freeholder Lacey noted that radios were necessary during Superstorm Sandy and it is extremely important to maintain our radio system, radios were our form of communication during the storm. Administrator Block stated that all the County's departments that use radios will be included.

Mr. Scarantino reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the recommended award for the Improvements to the Garden State Parkway Interchange 91 in Brick Township. The Engineer noted that these improvements will make access to the Parkway much simpler. Travelers will only have to go through one signal as opposed to the three they now have to go through. The total cost for this project is \$21,319,770 which will be in State aid. Freeholder Kelly stated that in Brick Township, two Administrators have gone through this process with the State and County which will now go forward. The Freeholder noted that construction on the project will start in October, 2014 and take approximately two and a half years to complete. There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the agenda for the September 3, 2014 Board meeting.

Ms. Vasil reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of 2014. There were no questions or comments.
