A. CALL TO ORDER

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean was called to order on March 18, 2020 at 4:00 PM, Room 119, County Administration Building, 101 Hooper Avenue, Toms River, Ocean County, New Jersey, with Freeholder Director Vicari presiding. Members Little, Quinn, Haines and Kelly were present at the call of the roll.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I'd like to welcome you to the Board of Chosen Freeholders meeting for March 18, 2020 at 4 PM. I want everyone to know this room has been sanitized yesterday and today before the meeting. Joe Meyers, the Superintendent of Building and Grounds, has used all materials certified by the State of New Jersey and the Federal Government to make sure that your safety came first. We also want to make sure there is social distancing between each person in the room. If anyone feels uncomfortable, they can move to a different seat in the meeting. But we want to assure you that what we have done to this building, as we have done to virtually every building in Ocean County where the general public comes, and also to protect our employees. So it's twofold – protect our employees and also the public that comes to our meeting.

So, I would like to call the meeting to order."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. Please be seated. The first item of business is the Resolution for Public Hearing. And again, this meeting conforms to the Open Public Meetings Act according to the State of New Jersey and also with County Counsel. Jack Sahradnik has approved the process that we've been using today. I'll turn it over now to the Clerk."

CLERK CILENTO: "Yes, the first item today is the 2020 County Budget and I have a Resolution to read into the record.

Be it Resolved by the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean that the budget hereinbefore set forth is hereby adopted and shall constitute an appropriation for the purposes stated of the sums therein set forth as appropriations, and authorization of the amount of \$361,536,722.00 for the County to be raised by taxation and certification to the County Board of Taxation of the following summary of general revenues and appropriations."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay. It's been read according to the procedures by the State of New Jersey. I'm going to turn it over now to Freeholder Jack Kelly, who is the liaison to the Finances, who has been working for several months with our professional staff. And we want to thank, not only Freeholder Kelly, but all those who participated in this very detailed and important process. Freeholder Kelly?"

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Thank you Mr. Director. And it's disappointing that at this time because of the emergencies throughout the State that we have no public here today. We certainly like to have the public here so we can have a discussion with them and today that's just not going to happen. And people are doing as they should — they're staying home. But, we do have the Asbury Park Press here who always covers our budget, and I'm sure will do a good job again in covering that so that there is a discussion available to the public.

Also, the budget has been available to the public since February when this Board introduced the budget. As we know this budget is the blueprint for the fiscal year that lies ahead. It includes funds for what we will do this year including capital projects to the continuation of key services like our home delivered meals under Freeholder Vicari.

In this budget, the County property tax is reduced by half a cent. Now we've made that quite clear over the last couple months. It is the fourth consecutive year that the rate has gone down. The property tax rate in this year's budget – it will be 33.7 cents. We made that pledge in 2012 under Freeholder Bartlett after just following Superstorm Sandy. We're now looking at a new emergency that is going to cost this county some money. But we are in good shape to have monies available...any additional dollars that we need because we still have strong surpluses available. That storm resulted in a staggering loss of property values that totaled more than \$11 billion. We don't anticipate anything near that at this time, but we're ready for what the future may bring.

This year our ratable base stands at \$107 billion. And because of this we were able to lower the tax rate. I just talked about the fact that the budget includes a strong surplus. We're using \$36.8 million from surplus in this year's budget alone.

A strong surplus is key in maintaining the county's AAA Bond Rating. And the one thing that is so important about that surplus...when we have emergencies like we are currently experiencing, we kept talking about the past before, now we're in a current emergency situation. That surplus helps us to be able to weather the storm, if you will. The AAA Bond Rating has also been allowing us to secure historically low interest rates which helps us to reduce our debt service by millions of dollars. This year's debt service is down by \$2 million. And how was that possible? We refinanced our debt at a lower rate similar to what you would do with a home mortgage. And as I just said, this year alone we saved \$2 million on our debt.

The budget funds all of the core and essential programs and services that we provide to over 600,000 people that call

Ocean County home. And Freeholder, it comes with...what does it come with?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "No surprises."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "No surprises. The 2020 budget totals and they were just read by the Clerk, but up here we have the two white boards that show the amount. The 2020 Budget totals \$450,793,747.00. And the amount to be raised by taxation is \$361,536,722.00.

Like all of our budgets we are within the 2% State mandated spending cap requirements. The budget is up \$18.8 million, however, a large portion of that, \$12.5 million, is being used to increase our funding for what we call 'pay as you grow' capital projects. This is simply our projects that we're funding with cash, rather than increasing our debt. It also acts as a safety measure in the budget, should the County have another emergency situation...this money can be returned to the budget to again cover government operations and essential services.

The balance of the budget increase covers County operating costs and related expenses we just mentioned, and I'll mention it again, it covers all of our core expenses.

It provides \$3.5 million for Senior Programs, \$610,565.00 for the Ocean County Veterans Services, \$7 million for Parks and Recreation, \$74.3 million for Law and Public Safety, \$25.5 million to keep our roads and bridges safe and \$20.2 million for Social Services.

It also includes money for education - increased appropriations to the Ocean County College who will receive \$16 million this year and the Vo-Tech schools which will receive \$19.5 million.

The budget is not my budget. It is the collective work of the five Freeholders, our Administrator, our Comptroller, our Assistant Administrator and all of our Department Heads as well as their staff. It's a good budget. I'm proud of this budget and I'm proud of the job that everyone has done. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you. I'd like to thank Freeholder Kelly.

Now, any comments from members of the Board of Chosen Freeholders with the budget? I will start to my extreme right with Freeholder Gerry Little, if you have any comments."

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. This budget is fiscally responsible. It's well below the 2% budget cap. It funds all of our core programs and services. It will maintain our 625 miles of County roads and our 250 County bridges in a safe manor.

We also, as Freeholder Kelly said, and thank you Freeholder for your leadership with our budget team, and Julie, and you Mr. Director, and the entire Board. We're very proud of this budget. It also...let's remember lowers the County tax rate and that's a rare thing in today's government around the state and around the country.

So, it's something that we can all be very proud of and we thank everybody involved. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you. Freeholder Quinn?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you Mr. Director. Just as Freeholder Little said, this is definitely a fiscally responsible budget that we're putting forth. And I have to thank certainly Freeholder Kelly for his leadership on behalf of this Board working with our administration, putting these numbers together and dealing with every single department that we have.

Certainly, our Department Heads deserve a tremendous amount of credit to continue to operate our departments as fiscally responsible as they do on an annual basis. Our staff here always puts the taxpayers first and this budget is certainly another example of that. Julie Tarrant, our CFO, you do a fantastic job of watching every dollar that comes in and goes out. I thank you for your leadership and your hard work, as well as Carl, Mike and the rest of our administration.

There's no doubt about it that the budget continues to fund all the different departments throughout the County and all of the different services we provide throughout the County and so forth to our constituents. I'm very happy to see that a lot of the departments also received additional funding based on increases that we've been able to take and continue to make over the last...myself, I've only been here for two years now, but over the last number of years, especially following in John Bartlett's footsteps of being able to continue to reduce the tax rate for the taxpayers.

Director, I thank you for your leadership and the rest of the Board for all the hard work that went into this, and I'm glad that we're having the Public Hearing today and we can start moving forward. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Freeholder Quinn. Freeholder Haines?"

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "Thank you Mr. Director. I also would like to thank Freeholder Kelly for his leadership and working with Julie Tarrant, our Comptroller, and of course our staff and all the Department Heads of all the departments. It's very important that we all work together to try and give a great County budget that's going to provide all the monies that is necessary to provide the services that we need for our programs and for the people of

Ocean County, plus at the same time to be able to reduce our County tax rate. And I just want to say I'm sure John Bartlett's looking down on all of us today and is very happy to see that it was reduced, again, because that's something that he always wanted to try to do and to always make sure that we lower the County tax rate for the people of Ocean County.

And again, thank you all very much for the hard work that you've done for all the people."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Freeholder Haines. I would just like to sum up with a few things. When I became Director of the Board of Freeholders in January, the first thing that I said was certainty. But listening to the comments made by this Board of Freeholders, it is certainty, as far as the taxes going up or providing services. Even now in very difficult times, challenging times, the entire State is closing down we are still providing vital services to the residents of Ocean County. That's what's so important. We say it continuously, the County never closes down. We talk about snow storms. We talk about hurricanes. We talk about 9/11. We talk about Sandy. This is not only the most challenging, because it's never happened before in history, so it's historic. And as the Freeholders have said we keep on going to protect the health and safety of the residents of Ocean County.

We are very unique in Ocean County. One of my departments is Senior Services – 200,000 senior citizens. Not only is it unique in New Jersey but in the United States. Right now, in two towns, do you know in Berkeley Township and Manchester, we lead the entire United States as having more seniors over the age of 85 than any place else in the United States? Not just New Jersey, in the United States of America. And right now what the Freeholders have done continuously, when we needed more money for home delivered meals, we made sure we funded each and every program.

Going back several years ago when we purchased the Southern Service Center...how did we know that we were going to need the kitchen and food preparation expanded? Right now, today, as we speak, we are working out of Stafford Township Southern Service Center preparing meals. Unbelievable the number of meals that we do service to seniors. One day in the hospital, okay, we can feed a senior citizen for 365 days. That's why it's so important. Now we ask for a donation. Let me show you the sensitivity of this Board. The empathy of this Board. We ask for a donation of two dollars. You know what it costs us? Ten (dollars). And we do it with some donations but basically from the Board of Chosen Freeholders. Right now we are one of the largest counties in the State. Number two – 628 square miles. So we have trucks going back and forth, back and forth. Last year alone, last year alone, we put more miles on our trucks that they could have went around the world over 14 times – 14 times.

This year it's going to be substantially more. Why? Because we realize the importance of feeding our senior citizens. We get some from the Federal Government. Some from the State. But half the budget for Senior Services, half for food for senior citizens. So we work servicing to 200,000 seniors who we will take care of during these difficult times. And the total workforce, 16 for 200,000 people. And that's because we have the efficiencies of the department. We maintain the salaries. We work within a certain budget. And no senior will go hungry in Ocean County. No senior is going to lose a life. Because we're going to have to reach out... and even now in difficult times...employees and the department, even though the building is closed, reaching out, not only during regular times, but even when they're home. They don't put in overtime. They don't put in for the comp time. But they do it because they know it is the right thing to do.

So I just want to let the people know in Ocean County where their hard earned tax dollars go. And if you look on the website of Ocean County Meals you'll see exactly what I'm talking about.

The second thing is we have 135 buildings. And Joe Meyers is one of the few Department Heads I wanted here today because before we came into this room today we wanted to make sure that it is safe. That it's clean. And that's one of the reasons, not only are we here, but we treat this room as we do all the rooms where there is a meeting with the general public.

So, again, they worked overtime on the weekends. They went to every place where the general public may come in to make sure we can contain...we can contain the virus that's taking place, not only in New Jersey, in the United States, but throughout the world. It's a global situation. But we will handle it because of the fact that we are committed - the members of the Board of Freeholders - and because we have an outstanding professional staff that works every single day. A lot of work is done by the entry-level salaries...people working two and three years and the salaries that they...let's face it. They work because they like working for the County. They like public service. They do an outstanding job. So again, it goes to those entry-level people, basically minimum wage sometimes, but they like working for the County and they do a great job. And we have the most dedicated people that I have ever seen since I've been on this Board of Chosen Freeholders.

So, again, I think that concludes the comments that are here today. It's all part of the minutes, the public record, to show our dedication to our employees and to all of the citizens of Ocean County. If there is anything else with the budget that has to be done...the Public Hearing is now open. Then I believe there is a Resolution afterwards."

CLERK CILENTO: "I have a little sentence..."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "A couple of sentences. Okay. The Public Hearing is now open according to law. Is there anyone from the public who has any questions or comments? Let the record reflect that we followed the procedures. But just as important it was published, copies were given in all the libraries. And we addressed most of our concerns before this meeting and this is what this Board of Chosen Freeholders has always done. We address those concerns

so residents do not have to come to the meeting if they don't want to.

So, again, any comments or questions about this budget before I close the Public Hearing on the budget for 2020? Seeing no questions or comments I move that the budget be closed.

No comments were received, therefore, the Public Hearing was declared closed.

On motion duly made by Freeholder Quinn, seconded by Freeholder Little, the 2020 Ocean County Budget with accompanying Resolutions was adopted on final reading.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "The Resolution please?"

CLERK CILENTO: "It is hereby certified that the within budget is a true copy of the budget finally adopted by the resolution of the Board of Chosen Freeholders on the 20th day of March, 2020. It is further certified that each item of revenue and appropriation is set forth in the same amount and by the same title as appeared in the 2020 approved budget and all amendments thereto, if any, which have previously been approved by the Director of Local Government Services."

Q. FREEHOLDER COMMENTS

DIRECTOR VICARI: "This is the time of our meeting I want to refer to each member of the Board to state and give an update, if they want to, on their performance of what's taking place in this very critical time. I'll start with Freeholder Little who's liaison with the Ocean County Board of Health who is working continuously, day after day, with many phone calls from the State of New Jersey monitoring what's taking place throughout Ocean County and we appreciate his hard work and dedication and his vast experience in making sure that we do, not only a good program, but a very unique situation that we have in Ocean County to make sure all of our citizens are protected. Freeholder, I'll turn it over to you."

At 4:31 PM Freeholder Director Vicari received the following comments from members of the Board:

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. First I'd like to thank every member of the Board, Freeholder Haines, Freeholder Kelly, Freeholder Quinn and you Mr. Director and especially our Administrator, our Assistant Administrator and all of their staffs. Everyone here at this table and all of our County staff have been working very hard in the last several weeks here as we all team up together, a team, we are a team. And we work together to try and address this crisis, here in Ocean County, and certainly throughout our State.

Every member of this Board and our Administrator and his staff have all been on constant phone calls with the State, Department of Health, and with our County Executive Staff, our Department Heads and all of that is being kind of at the point of this entire process. Not only our Administrator and all the hard work he's putting in, but of course our Ocean County Health Department. They have kind of been at the point of this whole effort. They have been working tirelessly all weekend – Friday, Saturday, Sunday. I've been on the phone with Dan Regenye, our Director of the Department of Health as late as 10 o'clock like Saturday night or Sunday night, I can't remember. And Dan has had countless emails and phone calls with all the towns that are making inquiries. So we all...as every department is stepping up, we certainly want to thank, especially, our Department of Health for all of their work. It's just been amazing.

We have staff posted outside – a Registered Nurse who is taking the temperature of everyone coming here from the public to make sure that we're all safe and we will continue to do that in the weeks and months ahead as long as we

have open, public meetings. We will have one of Dan's staff people here, kind of surveying everyone when they come in, if you've been traveling, do you have a temperature, they're taking that right outside. I passed, I guess. And we're happy about that.

And I think it's important to emphasize that this is a team effort. We have all been working so tremendously. Donna is sitting over there. She and her staff must have put out 50 news releases to try to keep the people up-to-date on what we're doing. Dan has the same kind of staff and has been putting out from their side and it's just been amazing. But the important thing is that at this point in time... and I think everybody is up-to-date but so far here in Ocean County we have nine confirmed positive cases at this time. And you're almost reluctant to give those numbers because they change overnight. But at the present time today, we have nine definitely positive confirmed – two in Berkeley Township, one in Jackson Township, two in Manchester Township, two in Toms River, one in Point Beach and one in Surf City. We believe several of those cases that are new may involve spouses that may also prove to be positive. That's why we say the numbers are rapidly increasing.

Right now our Ocean County Health Department is actually monitoring 48 people. So that means our Health Department is checking on them at home. They are sequestered in their own home. And 35 of those are involved with travel related and 13 had close contact with someone else who proved to be positive.

The Ocean County Health Department has received documented calls and that of course is probably many more since the statistic came out Saturday afternoon. But almost 1,250 telephone calls from concerned residents that they've handled and tried to reassure people and answer their questions - direct them through their healthcare providers and so forth. And we have actually, 19 people handling these phone calls and six more will be ready to go by tomorrow. They will be fully trained and ready to answer these calls.

We've had countless emails. So hats off, to not only our Board and all of our departments, and certainly the Director who has also been on every single call with the State and been very active in expressing Ocean County's needs which maybe he's going to talk about, I don't know. But what Ocean County needs and certainly our Administrator who has...and Mike as well. They've just been fantastic.

So, if there are any questions of members of the Board or you, Mr. Director, I'm sure Dan can answer them at whatever point you might like to ask.

So, thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Freeholder Little. And again we appreciate your expertise in this area and we also want to express our thanks to the Ocean County Health Department in doing a great job and taking a leadership role in protecting all of our citizens. Freeholder Quinn?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you Director. Let me start also by thanking Freeholder Little and Dan Regenye in the back here and Brian Rumpf from the Board of Health. These three folks have been on the phone probably every day, 24 hours a day, seven days a week you're getting calls. I know Dan was courteous enough to talk to me over the weekend very late at night, as well, with some questions that I was getting. But between the three of you, Gerry you've done a fantastic job, not only handling the situation on behalf of all the residents of the County, but on behalf of the Board here, you've always done everything to do everything we need to keep us up-to-date and I really, truly appreciate that because we're all getting questions everywhere we go in the County. But like Freeholder Little said, everybody in this room has played such a major part. We don't have the public in right now, but throughout the last couple of days it's like the conference room is just an area where consistently there's calls coming in, calls going out, decisions being made, decisions that are affecting the residents throughout the County. And just as important is decisions that are affecting the staff that we have working here in the County.

We have over 1,800 people that work for the County and we're trying every day to take in and modify our policies and modify our plans moving forward so that we're protecting our staff, number one, and making sure they are going to be safe. But also making sure they have the ability to be home with their loved ones to be able to quarantine themselves if the need's there and be home with their school children.

I have to really applaud everybody on this Freeholder Board and everybody here in this room for putting time and effort that you each put into it. Rob Greitz is in the back of the room over there. Rob took over as our HR guy and I was just talking to him upstairs and he just started two months ago, I guess and I said, you kind of stepped into quicksand here in a matter of a couple of weeks but you've done a tremendous job. Not everybody is going to agree with your decisions, Rob, but you're doing what's best for the overall County staff and moving forward. I know things are going to continue to get better and better as you move into the warmer weather, hopefully. But it's certainly something that...I'm very proud to be a part of this Board. Carl, Mike, you've done a great job. You're running in and out all day long and I know the office was called earlier today and he got his phone call from his other half and it's like, 'You going to be home for dinner?' And Carl couldn't really give a straight answer. But I could have answered that question and said, 'There's no way in hell you're going to be home in time for dinner Carl.' Everyone here is putting their heart and soul into what's going on to make sure everything is done right for the residents throughout Ocean County.

The rest of the Freeholders, Jack, Ginny, we have Mr. Director... as a team we can truly accomplish a lot. And I think the last couple of days have really been a true testament to that as we move forward. We're going to get past this. We're going to do what we have to do. I wasn't around in Sandy but I know what a great job you guys did back then and I can see now living through it with each and every one of you why what happened and why the County came out whole again. Hats off to each and every one of you for what you've done.

And Donna you make us look great with yourself and Rich. Julie, the money...it's just a team effort with everyone. And as we move forward, certainly there's a lot of panic going on throughout the County but I think that will certainly get a little bit better as times goes on. We will get past this. And I was telling somebody earlier, the positive thing to this is the fact that this is happening now going into the early spring versus going into the beginning of the winter. I think we would have had a lot more on our plate.

Stay safe. Take care of your family. Make your priorities your own health. I've never washed my hands so many times in the last 10 years as I have in the last two weeks. We were talking earlier, and I'm scratching myself now and the skin is starting to come off your hands because you're washing so much.

Mac, Jack, thank you very much for everything you've done. Mr. Director, that's all the comments I have. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Freeholder Quinn. Freeholder Kelly?"

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Thank you Mr. Director. I want to add a couple of thank yous - one is the Sheriff and the Emergency Management Team and the Sheriff Officers. We see one here today, but they're all over our public buildings because we have closed the public buildings to the public and they have to greet the public with, 'You can't go in unless you have official business.' And they're doing a good job. And I was watching today and monitoring they don't only greet but they're very polite. They're not saying you can't...get out of here. They're really handling it in a very efficient manner. We have to thank the Sheriff and all of those who work for the Sheriff. We have so many people that are involved. The Ocean County Warden as Freeholder Little just called out. But there are so many. We can thank everybody. You know who we can't forget to thank? The people of Ocean County who have been so cooperative and understanding throughout this process. I never thought you would see so many people so willing to sacrifice their personal time. Can't go eat at a restaurant...and it's just one thing after another. How many people told me today that they got up 6 o'clock this morning to go to a grocery store? Now I am not a skinny guy so you know I like to eat, but I will never get up at 6 o'clock in the morning to go to the grocery store, I guarantee you. But just the way that people are handling this. I disagree with the panic. I think people are taking it very serious. But I don't really see a panic in anyone. They are taking it serious. So many times because of my stupid sense of humor, I'll say there's eight people all sick and we're closing the County, but the fact is we have to really work together, take this serious. But if only the Board of Freeholders were working together and the 650,000 people that live in Ocean County weren't working together, we would not be very successful. So, really, I think the thanks that we really have to give are to the people who call Ocean County home and their cooperative nature and their willingness to give to one another and to help their neighbors at this time. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you. Freeholder Haines?"

FREEHOLDER HAINES: "Thank you Mr. Director. I just have to echo of what all of my fellow Freeholders had said because our main priority is making sure that the safety and welfare of our County residents is first and foremost.

And, again, our staff...no matter what department it is has put themselves right there to do whatever they can and they realize the importance of making sure that everything that needs to be done to protect their people. And like Freeholder Kelly said, I mean I had to run to Bed, Bath and Beyond last night when I left here to buy a coffee pot because my coffee pot broke and there was not a soul on the road. There were maybe five cars on Hooper Avenue at 5 o'clock...that is like unheard of. And like Freeholder Kelly said the people are just understanding the importance of staying home and following what the President has been saying, what our Governor has been saying to stay safe. To make sure that they're following all the rules and regulations that have been sent out. This is unusual times. This is something none of us in our lifetime have had to experience. And it's just really great to see that everyone has worked together to go and do it because as I said earlier it's the priority of the Board of Chosen Freeholders to make sure the safety and welfare of our residents is taken care of and I can't thank them enough for doing what they're doing. I mean schools are closed. A lot of parents, you know, they have to leave work and stay home with their children. Malls are closed. You have movie theatres that are closed. You will have our County Parks open if you want to walk around the parks but our Nature Centers are not open, our tennis courts aren't open, basketball courts, things such as that. Because we're trying to make things as healthy as possible for our residents. And also to provide some of the things that we can do.

One of the things I do want to say is Mary Jane Bavais is our Assistant Director of Parks and Recreation...starting this Friday, we're going to be doing a live educational program. A Facebook live educational program and our first one is going to be at Cattus Island County Park at 11 a.m. with Mike Vernacchio on camera. And it's going to be talking about the Box Turtle. They're going to be learning about the Eastern Box Turtles, their habitat, their behaviors and their conservation. These are some of the educational things that we're also looking to do because with everyone staying home with their families that are staying home, if they're not walking out and around our parks, at least we're trying to provide things to be able to entertain and plus be educational at the same time.

But, again, thank you all for everything you've done, all the Freeholders. Because we have been in many, many meetings. Many conference calls listening to the Governor every single day. Listening to his press conferences. Listen to the New Jersey Department of Health with their coming down, and every day it's been changing. It hasn't been the same and there's been more and more things that they're telling us that's changed that we have to abide by now. And then, of course the President, what he's trying to do within the United States to make sure that everyone across this country is trying to follow what they're setting down, and to please be careful and to do everything that is necessary to be safe and wipe all the surfaces down and wash their hands as much as it needs to be. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you. I'd just like to sum up with a couple of things and then I'll open it up to members of the public, our professional staff. I think the comments you heard goes to show the commitment that we have in Ocean County. But this is very unique. It is global. I think we set the standard for what we're doing in Ocean County because it's extremely unique as far as what's taking place. Again, people in Ocean County are good people - good decent people. And it goes, in difficult times, to show the kindness that people have. The compassion, in helping not only neighbor helping neighbor, to help people that you don't even know who they are sometimes.

But the first thing I did this morning I went to some of the stores in my neighborhood on Route 37, the store is Stop & Shop. I see the seniors coming in. Why should seniors come in between 6 and 7:30? Well, physically, they just don't have the capacity to go and push, going back and forth with their cart. Very difficult. They get preference. But you know something? They were watching what they were purchasing because they said, you know something? We don't want to take it from another family. And a lot of things that the senior citizens are purchasing today...I can speak from experience, it's not for themselves, it was for other people, neighbors or family members or grandchildren. They live on a meager income, some of them or they were spending money to help others and their family and people they didn't know.

And that's what I think we're so fortunate to have in Ocean County. I've been working, as you probably know...I sent a letter to the Governor several days ago asking for two testing sites. You say, well why didn't you ask for one? No, we want two. One, and Mike Fiure is working on it. We probably will have one at the Ocean County College and we're just working getting it squared away because we think the numbers will go up but we want to be in a position that we can serve everyone in the worst case scenario. And Mike Fiure's been working continuously, all continuously to try to get things in order with the Board of Health and also with our Sheriff. But the testing is very important. One of the things I found out going to different stores is that the people are complaining, saying, you know, we can't cook, we can't get the right food and everything else. And another issue. The sales tax that we complain about. I said, 'What are you talking about?' Well, we go in, and in most cases we pay with a credit card – 17, 18, 19 percent. So I sent another letter today a few hours ago to the Governor saying, 'You know, why not treat it like an Urban Enterprise Zone on any food that is prepared. It's up six times as much. So even though if they cut it half the sales tax on food, prepared food, prepared food at the restaurants, they'll still be making three times as much.

So only in these times I think if the Governor signs an executive order, until it's over with, it may take a month, it may take two months or whatever the case may be, the people are buying prepared food continuously. They're not going to restaurants. They're not going anyplace else. It is very difficult to get food sometimes in the stores but these are suggestions that we get from the general public who are extremely important to us. But it's up to the Governor. And again, it's a suggestion and that's what we're looking for now. Tell us what you need. What can we do to make your life better? What can we do to manage?

Before I came here, 10 minutes to 4, I received a call from the Major, the Joint Base, Major Wagner. He said unfortunately there's one case they detected on the Joint Base that tested positive. And what he is going to do? Well, he let me know it's not a member of the military, but it's a related person, one of their kin has tested positive but they live in Burlington County.

I think that goes to show the relationship that we do have. Last night I got several cell phone calls from Congressman Chris Smith saying, 'What can we do?' Four days ago I got a call from, on his personal cell, from Andy Kim. Congressman said, 'What can we do? What do you need?' And one of the things that we need, talking to the professionals and medical people, were the Health Aides. They need certain supplies and all of our Congressman say, 'You know something? You're absolutely correct.' We need these supplies because we keep them out of the hospitals. That's what's important. They can stay in their house. Again, it's the best possible result that we get from our professional staff and also from the Doctor's in each and every place.

Even today, I didn't know what the rest of the Board of Freeholders were going to say, so I put on the agenda, possible Executive session. If we find out we need it, the Clerk of the Board is going to say, look, we're going into Executive session depending on the recommendation of the members of the Board of Freeholders and our Administrator and anyone else that is in here. Okay. We don't know where it's going to take us. Where the path is going to take us but we have good people giving us good advice. What do we do? We give good advice and we give the people of Ocean County the facts. We try and make it as transparent as possible. And we listen, whether it be for different prices or different things. I admit I don't have all the answers. We're going to make mistakes. We're not perfect. But if we do nothing you make no mistakes. We make a lot of different decisions every single hour, continuously, and we hope, in good conscience, that we do the right thing. We're all honest and sincere people and we want to do the right thing and we want to serve the people of Ocean County – our friends, our neighbors, our family and other people – let them know that in Ocean County the health and safety of our residents come first.

And at this time is there any member of the professional staff that has a comment or Administrator or anyone else? Please make any comments. Administrator, Carl Block, please. Again, we thank you personally for doing a good job and thank you again for working 24/7. When a call comes in, let me tell you something, the County never closes. (Inaudible) My secretary fortunately gave me 14 different concerns and phone calls. So we don't look at the time. Senior Services – people that are working without pay coming in on their own time and very few people would do that. Why? It's a necessity. We save lives. We help the quality of life. We know people live better. We try to have everyone stay calm. We don't want to overreact. We don't want people to panic. Administrator?"

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "Freeholder Director, thank you very much. I just wanted to mention so we could put it on the record that the...as we all know the Governor declared a State of Emergency, the Director did so also this

Monday and the Board has ratified that today. We have been implementing policies in the last several days and the details of what do you do during this emergency to come in conformance with the Governor's Declaration, the County's Declaration, County Counsel's opinions, advisories from the State. And a lot of it has to do with, obviously, closure and access to the building from the public to create this separation or that social distance. I can assure you that the employees are in the buildings working. We have been trying to get as much official releases to explain how they can still get the services they need – still contact the employees, whether it's by website, whether it's by email, whether it's by the old fashioned telephone. So the County is working. We are all here working, however, because of the situation, the buildings must be closed. Except for like today, the building was open to the public. So we must thank the County Board of Health for supplying a nurse screener. She was at the door. Anyone that wanted to come into the building was screened just like if you were trying to board a plane, and we allowed the public to be open and to attend the meeting in today's Public Hearing.

In the future we have talked about whether or not possibly moving the PreBoard, which is one week from today, down to this meeting room. If the Board is amenable, we'll make those recommendations. And we would have to also give some public notice to change the location and I think we would ask again the Board of Health to supply the screener because again, if anyone wants to come in from the public it would be right by the front door. We would have someone there to screen them. And again, just try to keep the containment issues alive.

I just want to make sure they were on the record and that the County continues to try to implement as much as they can offsite, online, and whatever we can to make sure that all the services that the Board of Freeholders has guaranteed the people of Ocean County continue to be running even through this crisis. And thank all the staff who have spent so much time and effort and working every day to try and secure all of the necessary equipment, through OEM or tests through Board of Health, whoever it may be. I can assure you they're working 24/7 to get it and thank you for the opportunity."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Any questions from members of the Administrative Staff, Department Heads? And again, we will be meeting sometime next week. We haven't decided when with all of the Mayors of Ocean County through telecommunications which has been working out very, very well for us.

And again, before I open it up to members of the public, the Clerk of the Board will make that adjustment as far as the location – they're moving it from upstairs to downstairs and I believe we have to advertise. We also have prepared an executive session if anyone feels it is needed for, if not we'll open it to members of the public and move on. Is there any member of the Board of Freeholders who would like us to read the executive session? Freeholder Little?"

FREEHOLDER LITTLE: "No."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Freeholder Kelly?"

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "No."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay. If there is no need for an executive session, the comments from the professional staff and the Board of Freeholders is over. We'll open it up to members of the public. Please come forward if anyone has any questions."

FREEHOLDER KELLY: "Single file."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Single file. We will follow all procedures by the State of New Jersey."

R. PUBLIC COMMENTS - "Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of five (5) minutes per speaker."

At 4:57 PM, Freeholder Director Vicari opened the meeting to receive comments from members of the public. No comments were received, therefore, the Director closed Public Comments.




OCEAN COUNTY'S 2020 BUDGET THE BUDGET DOLLAR

NARRATIVE FOR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

COUNTY OF OCEAN 2020

The Ocean County Board of Chosen Freeholders, with the assistance of the County Administrator, Office of Management and Budget, County Engineer, County Planning Board and the County Comptroller, has developed this six-year Capital Improvement Program and Budget. The Capital Improvement Program was developed with the cooperation and consideration of recommendations of the various County Departments.

The County's continuing growth requires that the Board of Chosen Freeholders anticipates and plans for the Increasing demands for County facilities and services. The Capital Improvement Program was prepared to guide County investment in land, facilities and equipment through 2025. The Program and Budget will be adjusted each year to reflect changing conditions including new Federal and State legislation, variations in the general economy, emerging demands of the public and modifications in the growth rate which may result in changes in revenue patterns and demand for new facilities or services. The Capital Improvement Program is realistic and attainable within the financial capabilities of the County and it provides for the future needs of Ocean County residents.

The accompanying forms which comprise the Capital Budget and six-year Capital Improvement Program have been completed in accord with regulations adopted by the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey pursuant to powers authorized by NJSA 52:27BB-10, NJSA 40A:4-43 to 45. The Capital Budget forms list all projects scheduled for startup for the 2020 Budget year and the source of funding for each project. A summary of Anticipated Funding Sources and Amounts is also included. Please note that this summary shows funding needed for new capital projects. It does not include previous appropriations for projects to be continued in 2020. For this reason, the funding summary differs slightly from the total cost shown for the Capital Program.

The total cost of all Capital improvement Projects over the six-year period is \$374,292,128. Many of the projects will be funded under State and Federal Grant Programs or through the annual Budget on a "pay-as-you-go" basis. The larger projects will be funded by short-term borrowing, Bonds will be issued at the most advantageous times to secure low interest rates.



WHEREAS, on January 30, 2020, the World Health Organization designated the novel coronavirus, COVID-19, outbreak as a Public Health Emergency of International Concern:

WHEREAS, on January 31, 2020, the United States Health and Human Services Secretary declared a public health emergency for the entire United States to aid the nation's healthcare community in responding to the Coronavirus (COVID-19); and

WHEREAS, the spread of COVID-19 within New Jersey constitutes an imminent public health hazard that threatens and presently endangers the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of one or more municipalities or counties of the State; and

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, the Governor of the State of New Jersey declared the concurrent invocation of both a State of Emergency pursuant N.J.S.A. App. A.:9-33 et seq. and a Public Health Emergency as Contemplated by N.J.S.A. 26:13-1, et seq. which invoked the authority and power contemplated by N.I.S.A. 26:13-3, the Emergency Health Powers Act, and remains in effect; and

WHEREAS, March 10, 2020, the State of New Jersey recorded its first death attributed to COVID-19, and accordingly the County will implement more aggressive mitigation measures in conjunction with the current containment efforts to combat COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order No. 103 of the Governor directs the activation of County and Municipal emergency operation plans, in order to fully and adequately protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the State of New Jersey from any actual or potential threat or danger that may exist from the possible exposure to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the County of Ocean is working with federal, state and local officials and authorities on a daily basis on prevention and mitigation activities that include providing critical information to the public about COVID-19 to provide facts and avoid unnecessary fear, training emergency responders and health professionals about the disease and investigating suspected, presumptive and confirmed cases; and

WHEREAS, the Center for Disease Control (CDC) has determined that COVID-19 generally presents a low risk to children but seniors, particularly those with underlying chronic medical conditions are at high risk of serious illness from the disease; and

WHEREAS, one of Ocean County's priorities as part of the County's preparedness and response planning is to get critical services to those areas where the most vulnerable populations are located and provide vital resources for the support and care of vulnerable populations prior to, during and following an emergency; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the powers vested by (Chapter 251 of the laws of 1942 as amended and supplemented, N.J.S.A. App.A:9-30 et seq.; N.J.S.A. 40:48-1 (6); N.J.S.A. 2C:33-1 et seq.; whichever law or laws apply, a local emergency is declared to exist within the boundaries of the COUNTY OF OCEAN; and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid laws authorize the promulgation of such orders, rules and regulations as are necessary to meet the various problems which are occurring due to such emergency; and

WHEREAS, by reason of the conditions currently existing in the County of Ocean affecting the health, safety and welfare of the people of the County of Ocean;

NOW THEREFORE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH the aforesaid laws, it is promulgated and declared that the following regulations be in addition to all other laws of the State of New Jersey and the COUNTY OF OCEAN.

The above recitals are incorporated herein as if more fully set forth at length.

- 1. A health emergency hereby exists within the County of Ocean regarding the Coronavirus (COVID-19).
- 2. All necessary County agencies are authorized to take appropriate action to assist municipal governments in containing, preparing for, responding to, and recovering from this COVID-19 outbreak.
- 3. All County Departments and agencies immediately shall implement any and all infectious disease guidelines and protocols and use all personal protective equipment in connection therewith.
- 4. All County Departments and agencies shall provide all necessary assistance to federal, state and local authorities to protect the health, welfare, and safety of the citizens of Ocean County during this COVID-19 outbreak, and shall prioritize the most vulnerable county residents served and develop the appropriate contingency plans to avoid any disruption of services. With a special focus on senior centers and Meals-on-Wheels recipients.
- 5. All County employees shall follow all local, County, State and Federal health recommendations, in addition to Centers for Disease Control recommendations including but not limited to Handwashing, Sanitizing and Basic Infection Control Procedures.
- 6. There is an immediate ban on all County business related international travel or domestic travel to any states that have reported COVID-19 cases. Similar travel restrictions are strongly recommended to all county businesses.
- 7. Ocean County residents who are seniors, particularly those with underlying health conditions, are strongly encouraged to avoid large crowds and large gatherings while COVID- 19 remains a threat.
- 8. All County buildings are hereby closed to the public effective March 16, 2020 at 11:59 p.m. for all non-essential County business. The County further reserves the right to close all public access to any County building to protect the health,

welfare, and safety of the citizens of Ocean County during this COVID-19 outbreak.

- 9. To combat COVID-19, the County shall be permitted whenever necessary to procure the necessary goods or services, which are not available under contracts currently in existence with the County, without complying with the New Jersey Public Contracts Law (N.J.S.A. 40A:11-6 et. seq.), including but not limited to the following:
 - a. to award emergency contracts, including but not limited to emergency contracts or leases for relocation and support of County operations for professional services for purchases of commodities, services, and technology;
 - b. to purchase food, supplies, services, and equipment;
 - c. to procure any supplies or equipment required to ensure adequate sanitization, cleaning or sterilization of any facility or location.
- 10. All County agencies shall take all reasonable measures to protect the health and safety of such vulnerable and at-risk populations, including safe treatment, transfer and discharge practices, and to comply with the Emergency Medical Treatment and Active Labor Act (42 U.S.C. section 1395dd) and any associated regulations.
- 11. This Order shall take effect immediately and shall remain in effect until such time as it is determined by me that an emergency no longer exists.

This declaration will remain in effect until further notice.

WHEREAS, the financial future of these school districts is bleak without action and we are now seeing the shockwaves of these devastating funding cuts; and

WHEREAS, these funding cuts will have a lasting negative impact as property taxes will be forced higher in order to preserve the quality of education in our local schools: and

WHEREAS, it is only fair that increased transparency be provided to school districts so they may determine that the State school aid formula has been calculated correctly and in accordance with the law for all school districts in the State; and

WHEREAS, Senator James Holzapfel and Assemblymen Gregory McGuckin and John Catalano have introduced Assembly Bill 452 which will require the Department of Education to provide, to any school district that requests the information, the data for all school districts used to calculate State school aid, including the data necessary to calculate and reconcile all school districts' adequacy budgets, equalization aid, and local shares, and the details of any adjustments made when the calculated local share exceeds the adequacy budget for every such district in the State, and the software program algorithms used by the department to calculate State school aid, regardless of whether or not the department considers the software program to be proprietary; and

WHEREAS, under the bill's provisions, the department would also be required to provide a reconciliation, broken down by district, that demonstrates that total local share plus total equalization aid equals the total of all adequacy budgets statewide in accordance with sections 10 and 11 of the "School Funding Reform Act of 2008".

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS of the COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY hereby strongly supports Assembly Bill 452 and urges its passage by the full House and Senate.

Freeholder Director Joseph Vicari opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Freeholder Kelly discussed the immigration lawsuit Ocean County filed against the State of NJ. The only NJ Counties that are participating in the lawsuit which the Board of Chosen Freeholders supports are Ocean and Cape May counties. The National Sheriff's Association is in support of the Federal Immigration Authorities' statement of interest joining the National government in the lawsuit in US District Court. Mr. Sahradnik is pleased that the Federal government is joining in the lawsuit. Freeholder Little said that if the State would like the immigration laws changed, they can follow the process to change a law through the legislative process.

Mr. Agliata told the Board that the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee has recommended the acquisition of the 24-acre Holgate Marsh property located in Long Beach Township. The landowner accepted the Township's offer of \$3,000,000, and the Township is requesting a partnership of up to \$1,500,000. A 156.07-acre property in Lacey Township, adjacent to the Forked River Mountain has also been recommended for acquisition by the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee. This property would be managed as part of the Forked River Mountains preserve, and could serve as the gateway to the area. The landowner accepted a negotiated offer of \$375,000.

Freeholder Director Vicari discussed the importance of the upcoming 2020 Census. Some of the difficulties include counting all of the senior residents. Some reside in Ocean County, some are wintering in other states. The County received \$116,000 to help count citizens in hard to count areas, and to help cover some of the marketing costs.

Maria La Face, Director of Senior Services, notified the Board that she received a letter from the State indicating the JACC (Jersey Assistance for Community Caregiving) funding that had been previously rescinded will be reinstated, with an additional \$400,000 in funding to be able for seniors in Ocean County. Ms. LaFace was invited by the State Assembly to attend a preliminary meeting to coordinate a new state committee for the aging.

Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the permission to advertise for the reconstruction and resurfacing of Brick Boulevard and Hooper Avenue in Brick and Toms River to address drainage issues, and the reconstruction and resurfacing of River Avenue in Island Heights to address tidal flooding issues. Mr. Ernst recommended the award of Stormwater Management Contract 2019B in various townships to Mathis Construction in Little Egg Harbor in the amount of \$237,320.09. Another recommended award for the construction of the traffic signal at the intersection of Prospect Street and Massachusetts Avenue in Lakewood would go to Assuncao Brothers, Inc. from Edison, NJ in the amount of \$1,332,675.62. There were no questions or comments and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the February 5, 2020 Board meeting.

Ms. Cilento reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of February 5, 2020. There were no questions or comments.

Freeholder Director Vicari asked the Board members for comments.

Freeholder Little told the Board that our Health Department is working closely with State and Federal authorities, as well as the CDC regarding the spread of Coronavirus. There have been no confirmed cases in New Jersey at this time. Dan Regenye, the Director of the Health Department, will be attending a meeting on Friday, January 31, lntroduced on to obtain the most current information available on the virus.






