In 2025, over 115,000 residents visited our recycling centers, where nearly 80,000 tons of material from our 33 municipalities were processed. These efforts benefit more than 650,000 residents and help save millions of taxpayer dollars.

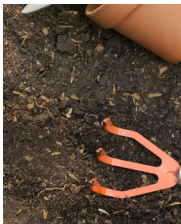


Brush Less than 4 inch diameter

(bamboo, or anything with roots).**

Finished Leaf Compost

A great choice for planted flower, shrub, and vegetable beds. Compost adds organic matter back to the soil faster than mulch. Ideal to use during Spring.



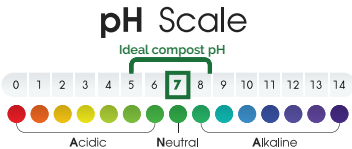
Single Ground Mulch

Excellent for walkways or garden beds. Great for weed suppression and moisture retention.

Double Ground Mulch

A finer mulch perfect for garden beds.

What to do with

Home Medical Devices (Electronic)

Electronics or home-use medical machines like CPAP, nebulizers, and similar, can be recycled at our Special Waste Drop-Off (see page 3).

Tubing, masks, and other non-electronic parts should be placed in the trash.

Medication Expired or Unused

Check the *DEAtakeback.com* site for collection events and drop-off locations.
