



AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING PHASE I OF THE DESIGN AND DEVELOPMENT OF MANCHESTER PARK, LOCATED IN MANCHESTER TOWNSHIP, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND APPROPRIATING \$12,000,000 THEREFOR, AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$11,000,000 IN BONDS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN TO FINANCE THE SAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING) AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The following is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the County of Ocean as a general improvement, Phase I of the design and development of Manchester Park, located in Manchester Township, in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, including all else necessary therefor or incidental thereto.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared that the improvements or purposes, the estimated cost of the improvements and appropriation therefor, down payment and estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes authorized are as follows:

SECTION 3. There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$12,000,000, including the sum of \$1,000,000 as the down payment, for the improvements or purposes described in Section 1 hereof as required by the Local Bond Law. The down payment has been made available by virtue of provision in the Capital Improvement Fund of the County of Ocean in one or more previously adopted budgets.

SECTION 4. There is hereby authorized the issuance of negotiable bonds in an aggregate principal amount of \$11,000,000 to finance part of the cost of the purposes stated in Section 1 hereof. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding the limit authorized by law, and the maturities, method of sale and other details thereof shall be determined by subsequent resolutions to be adopted in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 5. In order to temporarily finance the purposes provided for in Section 1 hereof, there is hereby authorized the issuance of bond anticipation notes of said County in an aggregate principal amount of \$11,000,000. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the County Comptroller; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and shall be in such form as may be determined by

the County Comptroller. The County Comptroller shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this Ordinance, and the County Comptroller's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8.1. The County Comptroller is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The County Comptroller is directed to report in writing to the Board of Commissioners at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this Ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 6. The County reasonably expects to commence acquisition and/or construction of the improvements described in Section 1 hereof, and to advance all or a portion of the costs in respect thereof, prior to the issuance of bonds or notes hereunder. To the extent such costs are advanced, the County further reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance, in an aggregate amount not to exceed the amount of bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof. This bond ordinance is intended to be a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 7. Any grant monies received for the purposes described in Section 1 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

SECTION 8. The amount of the proceeds of the obligations authorized by this Ordinance which may be used for the payment of interest on such obligations, architects' fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses, and other items as provided in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 shall not exceed the sum of \$6,000,000.

SECTION 9. The Capital Budget of the County of Ocean is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. In the event of any such inconsistency and amendment, the resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended Capital Budget and Capital Program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners and is available there for public inspection.

SECTION 10. It is hereby found, determined and declared as follows:

A. The improvements or purposes described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses. They are improvements or purposes the County may lawfully undertake as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property benefitted thereby.

B. The average period of usefulness of the improvements for which the obligations authorized by this Ordinance are to be issued is fifteen (15) years.

C. The supplemental debt statement provided for in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-10 was duly filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners prior to the passage of this Ordinance on first reading, and a complete executed duplicate of such supplemental debt statement has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey, and such supplemental debt statement shows that the gross debt of the County as defined in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-43 is increased by this Ordinance by \$11,000,000 and the obligations authorized by this Ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

SECTION 11. In the event the monies set forth above for any purpose is not necessary for said purposes, then such monies shall be for the completion of any of the other purposes provided for in this Ordinance.

SECTION 12. The full faith and credit of the County of Ocean shall be pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds and notes authorized by this Ordinance, and as long as any of said bonds or notes are outstanding, an appropriation shall be included in each annual budget of the County hereafter adopted in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds or notes maturing in each year. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the County, and the County shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the County for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

of 1986, as amended, and the regulations promulgated thereunder (the "Code"), including compliance with the Code with regard to the use, expenditure, investment, timely reporting and rebate of investment earnings as may be required thereunder.

SECTION 16. This Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

SECTION 2: The capital budget of the County of Ocean is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of Local Government Services is on file with the Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

SECTION 3: After passage upon first reading of this Ordinance, the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners is hereby directed to publish the full text of the Ordinance, together with the notice set forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF PENDING ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-19, at least seven days prior to the date set for public hearing and further consideration for final passage (which date shall be at least ten days after introduction and first reading). The Clerk of the Board of Commissioners is further directed to comply with all provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-17(b) regarding postings, publications, and the provision of copies of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4: After final adoption of this Ordinance by the Board of Commissioners, the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners is hereby directed to publish the full text of this Ordinance, as finally adopted, together with the notice set forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-19.

SECTION 5: This Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

WHEREAS, Ocean owns and operates a Juvenile Detention Center which is a high quality, licensed facility providing necessary and appropriate services and amenities; and

WHEREAS, Ocean is permitted under New Jersey Juvenile Justice Commission standards to house short-term commitment status juveniles up to but not exceeding sixty days (60); and

WHEREAS, there now exists a need to provide Detention Center placements for Monmouth County pre and/or post adjudicated juveniles to short-term commitments up to but not exceeding sixty (60) days; and

WHEREAS, Ocean has the capacity to house up to two (2) Monmouth County pre and/or post adjudicated juveniles on a constant basis and one (1) additional Monmouth County pre and/or post adjudicated juveniles on an as-needed basis; and

WHEREAS, providing for the care of Monmouth County juveniles in the Ocean County Detention Center will result in more economical operation of the Ocean County Detention Center and will result in a significant cost savings to Monmouth County through the sharing of the facility and services; and

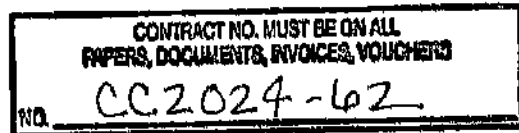

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and the Ocean County Board of Health will enter into an Agreement of Understanding; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 13:1E-9, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection has promulgated N.J.A.C. 7:26-4.10(b) setting forth allowable fees to be charged by the County Health Departments; and

WHEREAS, said fee schedule must be established and fixed by Resolution of this Board; and

WHEREAS, the Public Health Coordinator of the Ocean County Health Department recommends that said fee schedule be effective immediately.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, that pursuant to N.J.A.C. 7:26-4(b).1, the County of Ocean does hereby establish the following 2025 fee schedule for solid waste enforcement and monitoring activities by the Ocean County Health Department pursuant to N.J.S.A. 26:3A2-21 et seq.;

1. The fees to be collected from the owner/operator of any sanitary landfill facility within Ocean County are as follows:
 - a. \$0.40 per ton of solid waste accepted for disposal at said facility.
 - b. In the event solid waste is accepted for disposal in measurements other than per ton, the fee shall be assessed on the equivalents utilized pursuant to the Sanitary Landfill Closure and Contingency Funds Act, P.L. 1981, c. 306 and the Recycling Act, P.L. 1981, c. 278.
 - c. Fees shall be assessed and collected by the Ocean County Health Department each month in a manner provided for in this schedule.

- d. Except as otherwise provided for herein, the owner or operator of every landfill facility shall submit to the Ocean County Health Department on or before the 20th day of each month, a fee equal to \$0.40 per ton of solid waste accepted for disposal during the preceding month, together with a completed copy of Department Form NO. SFA-001, which is submitted for that month to the Department in accordance with the escrow account reporting requirements pursuant to the Sanitary Landfill Facility Closure and Contingency Fund Act, P.L. 1981, c.306.
2. Subject to the approval of the Department, a higher fee may be assessed in the event that the Ocean County Health Department documents the need for a greater amount in the succeeding year's program.
3. The fees and funds provided for in this Resolution shall be utilized exclusively to fund County solid waste monitoring and enforcement activities as identified in the Ocean County Health Department's work program.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Ocean County Board of Commissioners shall forward certified copies of this Resolution to the Ocean County Board of Health; Commissioner Shawn M. Director Crea opened the meeting by discussing the highlights of the Clean Communities Program for 2024. The program was created in 1986 with funding from taxes levied on the sale of litter-generating products such as food, beverage containers, alcohol, tobacco products, toiletries, cleaning agents, tires and paper products. This year, Ocean County received the largest grant in NJ, totaling \$275,876.18 which will be used to fund County cleanups, and to continue educating the public. The Department of Solid Waste works with the Corrections Department implementing the Inmate program which provides roughly 1,000 community service hours each month for cleanups on public properties such as County parks and Natural Lands properties.

Commissioner Kelly and Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included a presentation on the Traffic Signal Generator Bypass Upgrade Project. *Presentation attached.

Mr. Ernst discussed two projects recommended for award. The first is for the reconstruction and resurfacing of portions of certain County roads, Contract 2022B in various townships. The contractor is Earle Asphalt Company from Farmingdale, NJ in the amount of \$2,051,513.13. The second is for stormwater management improvements,

Contract 2023A in various townships to contractor D'Avellino Construction Inc. from Freehold, NJ in the amount of \$941,028.00. The recommendation to advertise for the reconstruction of Chambers Bridge Road in Brick Township at the Garden State Parkway was also discussed. There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the June 19, 2024 Board meeting.

The Board discussed possible alternate means to keep pedestrians safe while crossing Hooper Avenue during the Justice Complex Renovation project.

Commissioner Haines and Mr. Agliata told the Board about a 0.73-acre property the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee has recommended for acquisition near the Good Luck Point area in Berkeley Township. The property owner has accepted a negotiated offer of \$247,000.00.

Mr. Agliata also notified the Board that in 2020, the County received the Cattus Island Living Shoreline Grant in the amount of \$3 million from NJ DEP to address severe erosion to the Cattus Island shoreline. Some areas of the park lost 600 feet over the past 85 years and is expected to increase if the peninsula known as Page's Point is not restored. Six responses to the County's RFQ to provide Engineering Design Services for this project were received. Colliers Engineering & Design from Holmdel, NJ was qualified through Board action on 5/17/23 in the amount of \$699,321.00, utilizing the NJDEP grant award funding.

Ms. Gunther reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of June 19, 2024. There were no questions or comments.

Director Crea asked the Board members for comments.

Commissioner Haines mentioned that she attended the Ocean County Vocational Technical School graduation ceremonies where 254 students in Brick Township and 22 students in Waretown graduated with certifications in various trades.

Director Crea thanked Mr. Agliata for organizing the very successful Boat Flare Disposal program held on June 1, 2024.

There were no additional comments.

Ms. Gunther read the resolution to move to closed session.

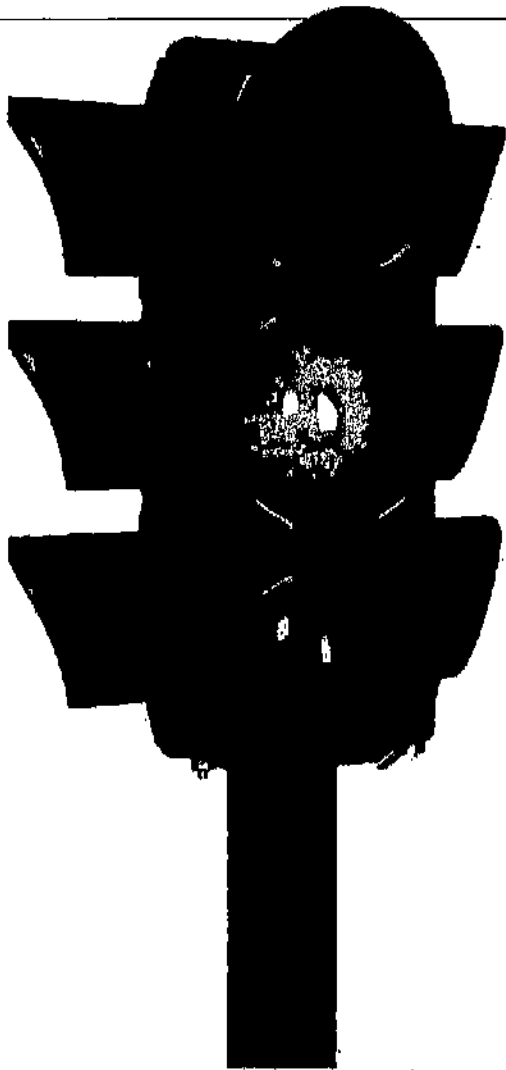

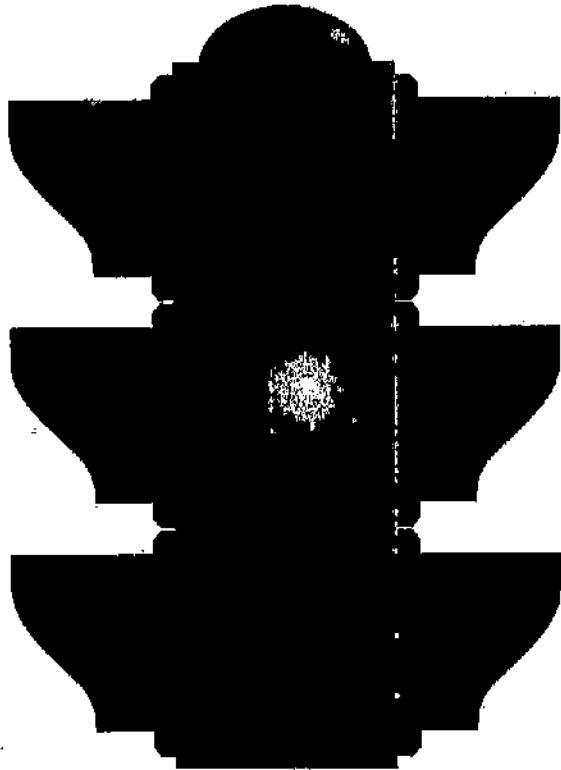

Why?

- Power outages create an extremely high demand on police departments, including the need to provide officers at signalized intersections that have lost power, which could last for days in extreme instances.
- In response, Ocean County is working with its municipalities is offering help in the form of providing traffic signal upgrades that allow for battery backup and generator hookups to be used to minimize the need for police to man signals while there is an outage.

What?



- Upgrades include work to existing County traffic signals with new battery backup systems and generator bypass switches.
- These upgrades allow for traffic signals to operate without power for approximately 8 to 10 hours on battery backup and allow for a generator to be connected through a bypass switch once the battery power has been exhausted.
- Ocean County has prioritized the traffic signals on the 500 and 600 series roadways for these upgrades.

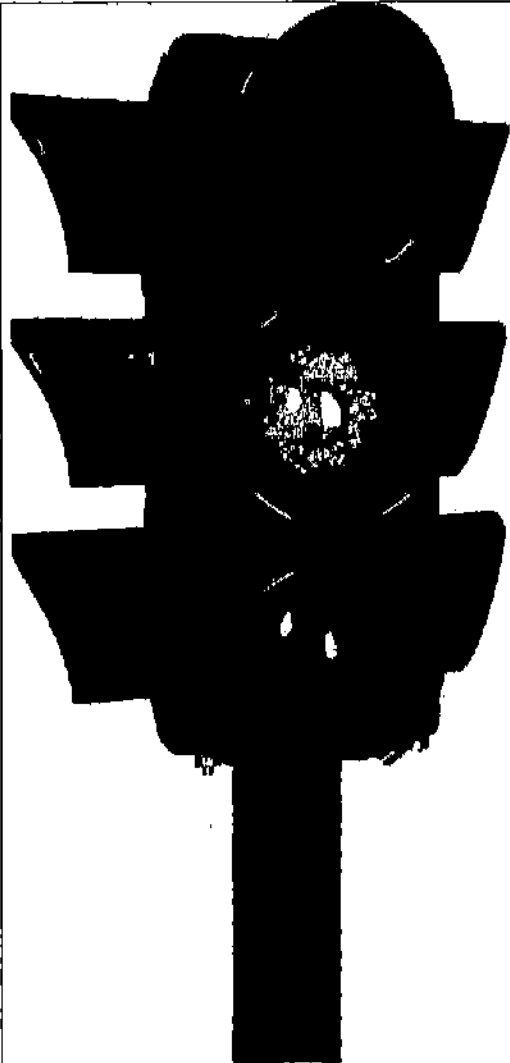
How?

- Through a shared services agreement, municipalities are responsible for the initial upgrade of these systems.
 - Work is performed by in-house County staff to minimize costs.
 - All future County signals will include a generator bypass and battery backup system at no cost to the municipalities.
- After the initial installation, the County will be responsible for the maintenance of the generator bypass system with the exception of the routine battery backup replacement that will be the responsibility of the municipality and performed by County crews.
- Upgrade costs vary from \$1,300 to \$6,300 per intersection depending upon equipment upgrades required.
