WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey proposes a \$20 million cut to 18 county colleges throughout New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, Ocean County College could see a \$1,211,866 reduction in state aid for the 2024-2025 school year; and

WHEREAS, such a substantial cut would severely hamper OCC's ability to serve its student body effectively and provide accessible education and vital support services to all students; and

WHEREAS, such a reduction in aid could lead to higher tuition costs and place a greater financial burden on students; and

WHEREAS, the college could be forced to cut some vital programs and student support services, leaving students with fewer resources and opportunities to thrive; and

WHEREAS, job losses among faculty and staff could occur, leading to larger class sizes, decreased student-faculty interaction, and diminished academic support; and

WHEREAS, funding for Ocean County College, the first community college to open in the state of New Jersey is derived from student tuition, an appropriation from the Ocean County Board of Commissioners and the state of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners is expected to appropriate more than \$18 million to Ocean County College in 2024; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY strongly urges Governor Murphy and the state Legislature reconsider the proposed reductions to the state's vital community colleges and move toward providing the full 20 percent of the funding as continued support and investment in higher education are crucial.

WHEREAS, these cuts will negatively impact both the education of our students and the amount of local money taxpayers will be asked to pay for schools in the coming year; and

WHEREAS, these 17 impacted school districts may be forced to cut important educational and extracurricular programs due to a lack of funds; and

WHEREAS, the State has created an atmosphere of volatility and unpredictability for the school districts, students and taxpayers of Ocean County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY strongly urges Governor Murphy and the state Legislature and the Department of Education to revise the school funding formula and provide fair and balanced funding to all New Jersey School Districts.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Ocean County Board of Commissioners to assist the Local Governmental Unit in the repair and maintenance of its streets and property, road overlay, in addition to providing certain materials and supplies in connection therewith; and

WHEREAS, the Local Governmental Unit desires to enter into an Agreement with the County for such services;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual terms and conditions and covenant herein contained, the parties agree as follows:

If requested by the Local Governmental Unit, the County, at the discretion of the County Road Supervisor, except for items F, G, and H, which shall be at the discretion of the County Engineer, and item I which shall be at the discretion of the Vehicle Services Director will assist the Local Governmental Unit in the following ways:

- A. Mowing of plant growth along local governmental units roads or property;
- B. Plowing snow on local governmental units roads or property;
- C. Purchase of materials or supplies for the maintenance of local governmental unit roads or property;
- D. Road overlay (List of Schedule "C" Major Projects Request must be completed);
- E. Curbs and Sidewalks on local governmental unit roads;
- F. Repair of traffic signals;
- G. Traffic signs or pavement marking;
- H. Vehicle Maintenance Services.

2. This Agreement shall take effect upon execution by the parties and shall remain in full force and effect through December 31, 2024. The total amount of the Local Governmental Unit purchases of goods The total amount of the Local Governmental Unit purchases of good and services under this agreement shall not exceed the sum of sixty thousand dollars and no cents (\$60,000.00) during the term of this agreement. The Local Governmental Unit certified that sufficient funds are available in its current budget to cover the cost of the agreement.

3. This Agreement will be administered on behalf of Ocean County by the Ocean County Board of Commissioners or their Designee and by <u>Diane B. Ambrosio, RMC CMC, Business Administrator or Daniel Kehoe, CMPW Superintendent of Public</u> on behalf of the Local Governmental Unit.

That Mayor and Clerk are hereby authorized to execute a Schedule "C" agreement with the County of Ocean in accordance with the provisions of the law to include \$60,000.00 for the Road Department (Grading of Roads, etc.).

4. Materials or supplies, if available, will be issued to the Local Governmental Unit from the County yard or warehouse. Except during emergencies, all purchase requests for materials and supplies shall be in writing.

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5. Each County Department shall invoice the Local Governmental Unit for materials and supplies delivered and services rendered. Monies due shall be paid by the Local Governmental Unit to the County within thirty (30) days after the Local Governmental Unit's receipt of said invoices.

6. The applicable rates and charges for equipment and labor are set forth in the List of Labor and Equipment Costs, which is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

- A. The Local Governmental Unit may request the County to provide for the disposition of sweeping materials from the Local Governmental Unit site. All costs associated with the disposition of these materials, including, but not limited to, all costs incurred in the inspection, testing, classification, screening and ultimate disposition of the sweepings, shall be the responsibility of the Local Governmental Unit and shall be included in the County's next invoice for payment by the Local Governmental Unit.
- B. When requested by the Local Governmental Unit to sweep municipal roads or properties, the materials collected will be disposed of at a designated municipal site. If the Local Governmental Unit is unable to provide a site, the County will store the municipal sweepings at the nearest County garage and the Local Governmental Unit will be responsible for all costs incurred as described in paragraph A.

7. The Local Governmental Unit hereby covenants and agrees to save harmless the County, its agents, officials and employees from any and all suits, damages, claims or other causes of action, including reasonable attorneys' fees, which may result from performance of this Agreement by the County.


