ORDINANCE #2019-12

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$1,000,000 FROM THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND FOR THE ACQUISITION OF TITLE, RIGHTS-OF-WAY AND/OR EASEMENTS OF CERTAIN PARCELS OF LAND (OR PARTS THEREOF) FOR ROAD AND/OR BRIDGE IMPROVEMENTS ALONG COUNTY ROADS, ALL IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY

WHEREAS, the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Ocean recognizes the need for the acquisition of title, rights-of-way and/or easements of certain parcels of land (or parts thereof) for road and/or bridge improvements along County roads, all in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, in accordance with plans and specifications on file in the Ocean County Engineering Department, including all else necessary therefor and incidental thereto; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the County that funds be available for this purpose.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS

of the COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL

MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING), as follows:

 - E. The appropriation of \$6,800,000 provided for in Section 2 hereof, when added to the amount of

the County's bonds or notes for County College purposes outstanding or authorized but not issued at the date of such appropriation, will not exceed one-half of one percent of the equalized valuation basis of the County as shown on the County Annual Debt Statement last filed prior to said date pursuant to the Local Bond Law.

SECTION 11. In the event the monies set forth above for the purposes are not necessary for said purposes, then such monies shall be for the completion of any of the other purposes provided for in this Ordinance.

SECTION 12. The full faith and credit of the County of Ocean shall be pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds and notes authorized by this Ordinance, and as long as any of said bonds or notes are outstanding, an appropriation shall be included in each annual budget of the County hereafter adopted in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds or notes maturing in each year. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the County, and the County shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the County for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

The Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders is further directed to comply with all provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-17(b) regarding postings, publications, and the provision of copies of this Ordinance.

After final adoption of this Ordinance by the Board of Chosen Freeholders, the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders is hereby directed to publish the full text of this Ordinance, as finally adopted, together with the notice set forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-19.

The Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County hereby covenants on behalf of the County to take any action necessary or refrain from taking such action in order to preserve the tax-exempt status of the bonds and notes authorized hereunder as is or may be required under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and the regulations promulgated thereunder (the "Code"), including compliance with the Code with regard to the use, expenditure, investment, timely reporting and rebate of investment earnings as may be required thereunder.

It is part of an overall outreach within the Good Luck Point area to mitigate flooding from the Barnegat Bay. This property is not part of the 12 properties previously approved for acquisition as part of the Hazard Mitigation Program, Good Luck Point Acquisition and Demolition project in this area. The landowner accepted a negotiated offer of \$65,000. The second property recommended for acquisition is a 0.21-acre property in Berkeley Township with frontage on Sloop Creek Road and is completely comprised of wetlands, adjacent to 700 acres of existing Natural Lands property. The current Lifetime Homes landowner accepted a negotiated offer of \$9,200.
