WHEREAS, the voters of Ocean County authorized the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund to provide funds for the acquisition and preservation of natural lands, open spaces and farmland; and

WHEREAS, the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee was established by the Board of Chosen Freeholders to review nominations to the program and forward recommendations for acquisition to the Board of Chosen Freeholders; and

WHEREAS, the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee has received a nomination for the property identified as Block 2401, Lots 3 and 4 in the Township of Jackson totaling approximately 9.64 acres located on Cedar Swamp Road; and

WHEREAS, the property is adjacent to the 835-acre West Turkey Swamp preserve under the Natural Lands Trust Fund Program; and

WHEREAS, one professional appraisal was prepared to confirm the fair market value of the property; and

WHEREAS, the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee has determined the property's attributes are consistent with the Ocean County Open Space Plan and Recreation Inventory; and

WHEREAS, the County of Ocean would acquire the property for a purchase price not to exceed \$35,000 of equivalent land value; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing on the proposed acquisition was conducted by the Board of Chosen Freeholders on September 4, 2019 as required by PL 1997, c24.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY as follows:

- 1. It accepts the recommendation of the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee to acquire property identified as Block 2401, Lots 3 and 4 in the Township of Jackson totaling approximately 9.64 acres located on Cedar Swamp Road.
