DIRECTOR KELLY: "Commander of Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst and the 87th Air Base Wing, JB MDL, New Jersey. Colonel."

COLONEL MICHAEL D. STEFANOVIC: "Well, I appreciate it. Thank you very much. I, as part of my efforts since I recently took over the Joint Base is I wanted to come out and meet the local community. I want to make sure that we have some close ties with the local community. I will tell you that what we do on the Joint Base is not only critical to national security but in my mind none of that can be done without the help of everybody here in Ocean County, with all the residents of Ocean County, with all the members of the Commission here. And so, I will tell you, it is critical what we do and what you do together to be successful. And so, as part of our effort and as part of our outreach to all of our communities, we're going out and I'm say it, going on a listening tour a little bit but also finding out, you know, what we can do to help. But then on the same side to help bring in the community into the base. To help the community understand what we do as a military, to help the community understand what we do as a Joint Base and how it ties into not only the local area but at the national level. Because we all know that sometimes the Joint Base has a lot of walls up, right? So, a lot of people have a lot of questions, and so as part of that we want to get out and answer those questions and help people understand, hey we're here for you and we're part of you as well. The very last thing I want to say is, we receive a lot of support throughout the years, whether that is in time or whether that's in people or some simple things like "Back to School Backpacks" and we know the community supports us with that. So, we want to say thank you. Thank you for all your support across the board. And I just want to leave it out there, if there's any questions or there's anything else you would like to discuss I'm here, as an opportunity to have those discussions at this time."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Colonel, thank you. I want to tell you I've been on the Board for a long while and I can tell I'm getting very much older because the Commanders are getting very much younger." (laughter)

COLONEL MICHAEL D. STEFANOVIC: "26 years old. 26 years old. I'm going to tell you. At least that's what I tell myself." (laughter)

DIRECTOR KELLY: "I have five children younger than that, I mean older than that. So, I appreciate you being here and I hope you've been told how much this Board supports the Joint Base and anything that you need from us, if you will call us, call the Administrator or any of the Board members we'll be happy to go out there and meet with you immediately. So, we appreciate everything that the base does for, not only Ocean County, but for our country. So, thank you very much for being here today."

COLONEL MICHAEL D. STEFANOVIC: "I appreciate it and thank you very much. (applause) Thank you again. We'll excuse ourselves as a couple of things that are calling our name. So, thank you very much. If you have any questions, please reach out."

T. COMMISSIONER COMMENTS

At 4:15 PM, Director Kelly received the following comments from members of the Board:

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. We're now going to move on to commissioner comments. We'll start with Commissioner Bacchione."

COMMISSIONER BACCHIONE: "Yes, I just want to reiterate this is the 100 Year Gala on Friday (September 19, 2025). Everybody is so excited. Ocean County Library 21 branches in Ocean County and we're celebrating Friday night at the gala, which is a great achievement among all the different branches. They vary so much but it means so much to so many and I'm very happy to see that the library is something that still exists even in this age of technology. I also want to mention we had our Business Development Board Meeting the other day, lots of great ideas. We are in local summer. I know today is not the best, but I think our residents are enjoying some really nice weather. We had a lot of great activities this last weekend and this weekend. We're trying to make sure we promote that to help the businesses that did not do so well in the beginning of the summer financially. So, hopefully we can help them get their books black and not red, going into the new year. And that's all I have."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you, Jennifier. Commissioner (Arace)."

COMMISSIONER ARACE: "Thank you. I just want to take a moment and commend Brian Gabriel and Rob Contreras. Earlier in the year, the Board of Commissioners had identified a need to increase the number of EMTs in the county. Pre-COVID, there were 18,000 EMTs give or take. Post- COVID, there's a significant reduction of staffing down nearly 15,000 and generally there has been a massive EMT shortage not only around the county but amongst the state. Brian Gabriel had actually approached me with an idea to create an EMT training course that the county would provide, that if you're an EMT sponsored by a local agency whether volunteered or paid by a municipality or private organization, that the county would actually initiate a course and then cover the cost of that training. As of September 8, (2025) we started our first class of 20 EMTs. We'll have a second class of EMTs I believe... Brian, when is that? Starting in January. So, the hope that every cycle we would graduate 40 EMTs, introduce them into the EMT labor force; to help ensure that we're protecting our constituents and residents of Ocean County. So, thank you very much. I commend you for the great work. You did it very swiftly. I actually just heard that for a curriculum to have been stood up so quickly in partnership with you and OCVTS (Ocean County Vocational- Technical School) in the future, that it's very rare for a curriculum to be stood up that quickly with as little hiccups and to go as smoothly as it has gone. So, thank you very much."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Brian (Gabriel), anything to add to that?"

BRIAN GABRIEL: "Thank you to the Board for being supportive of the initiative and I can't state it enough how much it's really needed. And kudos to our staff who have worked tirelessly here for the last year to try and pull this off. So far so good, knock on wood."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "We appreciate the hard work. Anything else Commissioner (Arace)?"

COMMISSIONER ARACE: "That's it. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Commissioner (Sadeghi)."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "I don't have any comments."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "And I'll have no comments either."

U. **PUBLIC COMMENTS** - "Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of five (5) minutes per speaker."

At 4:18 PM, Director Kelly opened the meeting to receive comments from members of the public.

DIRCETOR KELLY: "We'll now move on to public comment. It's a five-minute limit. We ask that you identify yourself by name and address. Who would like to address the Board at this time?"

SEAN NELSON BOERO, 949 PAINTER LANE, MANAHAWKIN NJ: "Good afternoon. I just came here to follow up with the public comments that I made on June 18, 2025, asking you to look into the Corey Micciolo video case. The New Jersey Department of Child Permanency and Protection published their annual fatality report, and they wrote in their official report, that's online, that they responded on March 26, (2025) and found the video, the famous... the infamous treadmill video, reviewed it and then Ocean County Prosecutor's Office was notified and responded and interviewed Corey. That's according to their official report. I was scolded by one of the local new reporters for actually saying something about that. She told me that, that was an inaccurate report. So, I asked for Denis Mitchell's statement of probable cause for the murder arrest of Christopher Gregor. And apparently on April 2, (2025) within an hour or two of Corey being dead, Denis Mitchell, who is a very good detective, was speaking to Mark Waltonowski of DCPP who advised him about the video and gave him all his reports. I respectfully ask you to check with the Prosecutor Billhimer to find out about that. I knew nothing about the case. I was actually in Central Asia teaching a class, watching that case on Court TV with my class. And the way that I became involved I happened to see a TikTok video with Breanna Micciolo giving a very impassioned statement. That's the mother of Corey, talking about how she felt deceived by the Prosecutors who she had befriended over four years as she went through

that traumatic trial. So, I asked you to do something about that or at least ask Mr. Billhimer about that, on June 18 of this year. Did anything happen? Any response from the Prosecutor's Office?"

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "Commissioner, again, the same response each time. The Prosecutor answers to the Attorney General of the State of New Jersey. The Prosecutor has indicated he will not talk about any cases to this Board, as his jurisdiction is with that Attorney General. Anyone who worked for the Prosecutor's Office would know that. We cannot investigate the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office in this Board."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Okay, but we can request ... did we put a request in?"

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "Yes. The Prosecutor will not respond to those requests from the Board."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "I think that was the answer from the Prosecutor."

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "Yes."

SEAN NELSON BOERO: "Okay. So, I just have to ask the Attorney General, Matt Platkin."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Yeah."

SEAN NELSON BOERO: "I do appreciate what you say, but you are political appointees. You're all Republicans means I all voted for you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "We're not appointees. We're elected."

SEAN NELSON BOERO: "I mean elected. You're all Republicans, so I elected you. I voted for you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you."

SEAN NELSON BOERO: "I've never voted for anything other than a Republican my whole life, but you did endorse Mr. Billhimer?"

DIRECTOR KELLY: "And still do."

SEAN NELSON BOERO: "And very publicly endorsed a Democratic Prosecutor. That was a political decision. So, whether or not you criticize him or endorse him, that's a political decision."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "I think of it as a personal decision. I personally supported him for reappointment."

SEAN NELSON BOERO: "Okay. Yeah, tall, handsome, very articulate, good-looking guy."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "It would be a political appointment if we took a vote here. We didn't do that. Personally, and I believe other Commissioners did too, supported the reappointment of Bradley Billhimer. Number one, because we knew he was going to be reappointed anyway because the Governor is from his party. But number two, I'll tell you he has worked closely with the Board on a number of issues."

SEAN NELSON BOERO: "Okay, but one of those issues has not been the Corey Micciolo case. Right?"

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Well, the Administrator just told you the answer."

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "Director, we do not work with the Prosecutor's Office on any criminal cases. Their activities, the Prosecutor's does turn in drug, prescription drugs, things like that. We work a lot with Human Services, Senior Services, Consumer Affairs. We don't work with the Prosecutor on criminal cases."

SEAN NELSON BOERO: "Okay, I understand that. The second one that I raised that day was about Douglas Bollinger. He was a teacher at the OCVTS (Ocean County Vocational Technical School). It appeared according to OPRA (Open Public Records Act) request on Robert Shea's billing records that Toms River PD (Police Department) did an investigation into Mr. Bollinger and all the players, Homiek, Shea, the victim, Toms River PD were conferencing about that case in June and July of 2022. Closed the case, nothing happened. A month later that young victim, a 17-year-old girl, walked into Lakehurst Police Department because she couldn't sleep and was traumatized, made a report and the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office spent two years investigating that case but never went to the OCVTS and never interviewed the Toms River PD. That doesn't seem correct, but of course you're not going to discuss that. Mr. Billhimer is not going to discuss that either, but I just want it on the record.

Last one is that I repeatedly come here. I am a digital forensic guy. That's what I do. That's why I worked in this office to build this lab. The ignoring the cyber tips, that is the reports from the National Center FOR Missing and Exploited Children and the State Police that children in Ocean County are being sexually abused. They've been ignored since Mr. Billhimer has been in charge. The latest one has been the John Olson Case. He is a foster parent in Point Borough. In March, the State Police sent them a cyber tip. In May, an investigation was initiated on August 22, (2025) they rescued a 10-year-old foster girl who had been abused by Mr. Olson. 5 months. I mean she's 10 years old. She's a foster child. She already has a very tough life. Now, she has been sexually abused. Her images are out on the

internet, and I can assure you when I go to the Philippines and Kazakhstan and Kyrgyzstan her pictures are out there too. I think the police can do a lot better. I shouldn't say that. The police are fantastic. Local police are great. Detectives are great. The people in charge are not paying attention and that's tragic. That 10-year-old girl will never be able to get over that. You can look at the OPRA Machine, Ocean County. My name is Sean Nelson Boero. Their reports are on there. So, I do appreciate it. I'm heading off to my favorite place. I love the Middle East. And I love the culture and the people, and I will be heading off there for the next few months, so you won't see me. Thank you so much for all your service."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Good luck when you get there. Thank you for coming out today. Anyone else like to address the Board at this time? Yes, ma'am. Please come up and identify yourself by name and address."

ANN BARKEY, LOVELADIES, LONG BEACH ISLAND NJ: "There is a mention here of the Ocean County Southern Service Center Complex. I'm just wondering if you can say a little more about what your plans are for that complex."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Do you want to give...?" (Administrator Fiure)

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "I don't have the agenda open. Is that the rejection of the bid that you're looking at, ma'am?"

ANN BARKEY: "Yes."

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "So, as you know we're building a new library at that location. The center that's already there needed a facelift. We have to fix some leaking issues, some windows, and things of that nature. So, we're going out to bid to try to match that same style as the library so that entire campus is upgraded for the residents."

ANN BARKEY: "Very good. Thank you."

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "But, unfortunately, the bids came in over our budget, so we're going to go out and bid again."

ANN BARKEY: "Back to square one. Alright, thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. Anyone else like to address the Board at this time? Hello, Judy."

JUDY L. NOONAN, 25A STONYBROOK ROAD, MANCHESTER: "I also worked for the mayor in Manchester. I am a Senior Representative for most of them. I kind of don't even know where I would like to start. I'm representing, not all seniors, but a lot of people in my district are having some serious problems. You talk about the electric, and I appreciate the county for it, for JCP&L. I appreciate that. And we have two people running for Governor, but something is missed. We have some problems going on. People cannot pay their bills. We have maintenance bills that are paid to the association. There's a bill that was put out by Senator Singleton called the "Reserve Act." Maybe to some people they don't understand that. We've always had a repair and replacement bill in all the associations. What this does, this increases the maintenance fees, and it was all because of Florida and high-rise apartments. This does not appeal to Ocean County. I did my survey. There's nobody over three floors in the associations. Maybe up north. In CAI (Community Association Institute), they have pushed this, the institute. This is a fee that is pushed on to the homeowners and now people that are in the co-ops are paying from \$300 to \$400 a month. That's on top of electric, food, okay. And they're taxpayers. They're going to be coming to you soon because they're going to be homeless. They cannot pay these bills. There are people who are using the system who don't pay taxes, but Trenton is really not being told. They give us rules that the associations cannot follow. The "Radburn Act" allows underage ... Senator Singleton, again, my personal enemy in Trenton, allow you to buy houses. What's happening there? They can buy but they can't live there. Now they're renting. And you know what's happening? I can personally attest to it. They are raising the rent, pushing out the seniors. It seems like the seniors are the golden goose to push out to make money. These people are not going to be able to pay it. The auditor told me in two years the co-ops would be broke. Now, I don't know that factually, but I am getting the phone calls between the electric bill ... everybody is hitting that. And I know that's important, but when you can't pay your maintenance fee ... I got people coming in all the time. This is coming from Trenton. Nobody's paying attention to this. You're going to have to put more money in your Senior Services because their people are not going to be able to pay. So where are they going to go? Okay. And they're people who have paid their taxes for the last 20 years. Now the taxes are up. I don't know the answer. I'm here kind of pleading for them, for the voice that they don't have. I've done this in Berkeley, but we didn't have the... management companies are taking advantage. We need someone to oversee some of these management companies over there. I am proud to say I have a big mouth, and they never saw me coming. But this is a very big problem. They raise their fee; they give them a raise. Who pays that? The homeowner. Not everybody is poor and they're crying poverty. They're not looking for a handout. They're looking for a hand up. We got the highest veterans and they're living in these associations. I got people that need a lot of help. They don't know where to go, and the reason they come to me, not because it's me but we gave them a voice, thank you, when the mayor was there, gave me this seat. Now they're opening up to everything ... I have people coming, seven people at a time. I called these management companies, 'Oh, that's too bad.' \$90 increases on top of what they're already paying. Add that electric bill and I know you tried for that, but now you have... nobody is looking at the hen house. I don't know what you can do. Some people are milking their benefits and Senior Services they do a great job. I'm not here... I am, I guess, speaking for the people who can't talk. They're crying. They come to my back door. They're crying to me on the phone. How am I

going to pay this? Where am I going to go? And when I call the landlord, 'Well I can do that.' Okay. And it's like those LLC's, they're coming in, pushing, people who don't pay taxes. All these apartments on Route 70. Those people don't pay taxes. My people are paying taxes and they're not getting the benefits. They're being pushed around. But Trenton, Senator Singleton, CAI, they're not looking at their ramifications of the laws that they're passing. They don't care. Senator Singleton is into real estate anyway. But I don't know... I'm here at your mercy."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Judy, I have to ask you to wrap up, your time's up."

JUDY L. NOONAN: "Oh, well he talked, okay."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Yeah, he talked for five minutes. Now you have five minutes."

JUDY L. NOONAN: "Well, I really think that this needs to be heard. It's been pushed under the rug. Thank you and I hope the county can think of something, maybe another office."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Judy is this a bill that's passed already and is law or is it...?"

JUDY L. NOONAN: "Oh yeah. Senator Singleton... here's the bill. And CAI does not help the seniors. You got to speak up. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Anyone else like to be heard at this time? Okay. Seeing none, I'll close the public comment section and ask for a motion to adjourn."

ORDINANCE #2025-37

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE RECONSTRUCTION OF PROSPECT STREET (CROSS STREET TO ROUTE 9) LOCATED IN THE TOWNSHIP OF LAKEWOOD, IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND APPROPRIATING \$6,550,000 THEREFORE AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$6,000,000 IN BONDS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN TO FINANCE THE SAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING) AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. There is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the County of Ocean as general improvements: the reconstruction of Prospect Street (Cross Street to Route 9), located in the Township of Lakewood, in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, in accordance with plans and specifications on file in the Ocean County Engineering Department, including all else necessary therefor and incidental thereto.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared that the improvements or purposes, the estimated cost of the improvements and appropriation therefor, down payment and estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes authorized are as follows:

SECTION 3. There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$6,550,000, including the sum of \$550,000 as the down payment, for the improvements or purposes described in Section 1 hereof as required by the Local Bond Law. The down payment has been made available by virtue of provision in the Capital Improvement Fund of the County of Ocean in one or more previously adopted budgets.

SECTION 4. There is hereby authorized the issuance of negotiable bonds in an aggregate principal amount of \$6,000,000 to finance part of the cost of the purposes stated in Section 1 hereof. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding the limit authorized by law, and the maturities, method of sale and other details thereof shall be determined by subsequent resolutions to be adopted in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 5. In order to temporarily finance the purposes provided for in Section 1 hereof, there is hereby authorized the issuance of bond anticipation notes of said County in an aggregate principal amount of \$6,000,000. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the County Comptroller; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and shall be in such form as may be

determined by the County Comptroller. The County Comptroller shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this Ordinance, and the County Comptroller's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8.1. The County Comptroller is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The County Comptroller is directed to report in writing to the Board of Commissioners at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this Ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 6. The County reasonably expects to commence acquisition and/or construction of the improvements described in Section 1 hereof, and to advance all or a portion of the costs in respect thereof, prior to the issuance of bonds or notes hereunder. To the extent such costs are advanced, the County further reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance, in an aggregate amount not to exceed the amount of bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof. This bond ordinance is intended to be a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 7. Any grant monies received for the purposes described in Section 1 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

SECTION 8. The amount of the proceeds of the obligations authorized by this Ordinance which may be used for the payment of interest on such obligations, architects' fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses, and other items as provided in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 shall not exceed the sum of \$850,000.

SECTION 9. The Capital Budget of the County of Ocean is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. In the event of any such inconsistency and amendment, the resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended Capital Budget and Capital Program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners and is available there for public inspection.

SECTION 10. It is hereby found, determined and declared as follows:

A. The improvements or purposes described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses. They are improvements or purposes the County may lawfully undertake as general improvements,

and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property benefitted thereby.

B. The average period of usefulness of the improvements for which the obligations authorized

by this Ordinance are to be issued is fifteen (15) years.

C. The supplemental debt statement provided for in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-10 was duly filed in the

Office of the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners prior to the passage of this Ordinance on first reading, and

a complete executed duplicate of such supplemental debt statement has been filed in the office of the Director

of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New

Jersey, and such supplemental debt statement shows that the gross debt of the County as defined in N.J.S.A.

40A:2-43 is increased by this Ordinance by \$6,000,000 and the obligations authorized by this Ordinance will

be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

SECTION 11. In the event the monies set forth above for any purpose is not necessary for said

purposes, then such monies shall be for the completion of any of the other purposes provided for in this

Ordinance.

SECTION 12. The full faith and credit of the County of Ocean shall be pledged to the payment

of the principal of and interest on the bonds and notes authorized by this Ordinance, and as long as any of

said bonds or notes are outstanding, an appropriation shall be included in each annual budget of the County

hereafter adopted in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds or notes maturing

in each year. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the County, and the County shall be

obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the County for the payment of the

obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

SECTION 13. After passage upon first reading of this Ordinance, the Clerk of the Board of

Commissioners is hereby directed to publish the full text of the Ordinance, together with the notice set forth

below entitled: "NOTICE OF PENDING ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and

corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-19, at least seven days prior to the

date set for public hearing and further consideration for final passage (which date shall be at least ten days

after introduction and first reading). The Clerk of the Board of Commissioners is further directed to comply

with all provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-17(b) regarding postings, publications, and the provision of copies of

this Ordinance.

SECTION 14. After final adoption of this Ordinance by the Board of Commissioners, the Clerk

of the Board of Commissioners is hereby directed to publish the full text of this Ordinance, as finally

adopted, together with the notice set forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE"

(with appropriate completions, insertions and corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under

N.J.S.A. 40A:2-19.

SECTION 15. The Board of Commissioners of the County hereby covenants on behalf of the

County to take any action necessary or refrain from taking such action in order to preserve the tax-exempt status of the bonds and notes authorized hereunder as is or may be required under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and the regulations promulgated thereunder (the "Code"), including compliance with the Code with regard to the use, expenditure, investment, timely reporting and rebate of investment earnings as may be required thereunder.

SECTION 16. This Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

WHEREAS, the County of Ocean ("County") provides health/prescription coverage to eligible full-time employees through the New Jersey State Health Benefits Plan ("SHBP"); and

WHEREAS, the health/prescription benefits provided to employees are codified in County Policies, collective negotiations agreements with majority representatives, and past practice; and

WHEREAS, the County and the various unions previously agreed to establishing 20/35 as the baseline health/prescription plan and the creation of a health reimbursement account to assist employees with payments of co-pays and out of pocket costs associated with the 20/35 baseline health/prescription plan; and

WHEREAS, the State made a change to the 20/35 plan which the County and the various unions agreed to establish as the baseline plan; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners is of the opinion the continued use of 20/35 as the health/prescription plan, coupled with the establishment and continued use of a Health Reimbursement Account would be of financial benefit to not only the County, but the employees of the County who obtain health/prescription coverage as an employee of the County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE OCEAN COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, ON THIS 17th DAY OF **SEPTEMBER 2025, AS FOLLOWS:**

- 1. The Sidebar Agreements reached with various majority representatives and attached to this Resolution are hereby approved.
- 2. For those County employees not represented by a majority representative, for the time period of January 1, 2026, or as soon as necessary approval from the State of New Jersey, Division of Pensions and Benefits can be obtained, through December 31, 2026, the following shall occur:
 - The baseline health/prescription plan for employees shall be the 20/35 plan. A.

- Employees will contribute towards the cost of their health/prescription B. coverage based upon the SHBP announced rate for the 20/35 health/prescription plan in accordance with the Chapter 78 contribution rates.
- The County will fund up to \$16,240 into an HRA account for each employee C. enrolled in 20/35 baseline plan, regardless of the employee's level of coverage (single, member/spouse, parent/child, or family).
- In the event the HRA is discontinued, an employee shall have the ability to D. enroll in the SHBP plan which the employee was eligible to be enrolled on June 30, 2024, provided such SHBP plan exists, and subject to any required contributions in accordance with the Chapter 78 rates. If the SHBP plan which the employee was eligible to be enrolled on June 30, 2024, does not exist at the time of the discontinuation of the HRA, the employee will be eligible for any other SHBP plan so in existence, subject to contributions based upon the Chapter 78 rates.
- Should the State of New Jersey, Division of Pensions and Benefits prohibit the 3. County's utilization of a Health Reimbursement Account as set forth above, the County shall either rescind this Resolution or seek to make changes to obtain approval from the State of New Jersey, Division of Pensions and Benefits.

Commissioner Sadeghi began the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance and Prayer.

Commissioner Sadeghi and Mr. Jehnke reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the recommendation to advertise for the reconstruction of Prospect Street (C.R. 628) from Cross Street to Route 9 in the Township of Lakewood. The recommendation to award a contract to Earle Asphalt Company from Farmingdale, NJ in the amount of \$3,485,313.13 for the construction of the roundabout at New Central Avenue (C.R. 31) and North Hope Chapel Road (C.R. 639) in Jackson Township was also discussed. There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the August 20, 2025 Board meeting.

Ms. Tarrant discussed the importance of Refunding Bonds to receive a lower interest rate, saving the County money. Refunds from the 2015A Refunding Bond Introduced Priature September 17, 2025 in the amount of \$17,285,000 at a 5% coupon. Interest savings official Resource that the proximate years are estimated at \$519,000.00. The sale of the 2025 Refunding

Bonds will coincide with three additional Bond sales. \$45,250,000 in General Improvement Bonds, \$1,607,000 in College Capital Improvement Bonds, and \$33,450,000 in Vocational Technical School Bonds.

Commissioner Sadeghi, Commissioner Arace and Mr. Agliata discussed a recommendation from the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee to acquire a .50 acre property in the Township of Stafford located on Mallard Road. The property owner accepted a negotiated offer of \$25,000.00. The parcels in this area are acquired as buffers to assist with drainage issues located on Gaff Road and to prevent further development in the area.

Mr. Agliata notified the Board of the new Mill Creek Trail Project. A one-mile multi use trail which will span from the existing Pine Beach municipal path to Mill Creek Road and Browning Avenue in Berkeley Township. The ten-foot-wide path will include a prefabricated pedestrian bridge over the Mill Creek in the Florence T. Allen Conservation Area and will connect to Mill Creek County Park with a pedestrian signal crossing Chelsea Avenue. Capela Construction, Inc. of Medford, NJ is recommended for the construction award in the amount of \$1,543,830.00. Ocean County was awarded funding through the NJDOT Local Bikeway Program for construction of this project totaling \$1,330,000.00. The remaining \$213,830.00 will be covered by the Natural Lands Trust Fund. Once construction is complete, the Planning Department will explore routes to connect the Mill Creek Trail to the Barnegat Branch Trail. The Planning Department is working on a conceptual design for passive recreation at the over 800-acre NJ Pulverizing site.

Ms. Gunther reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of August 20, 2025 . There were no questions or comments.

Commissioner Sadeghi asked the Board members for comments.

Commissioner Arace recently visited the Southern Resource Center, commending Meals on Wheels for the important work they do, not only for providing food to seniors in our community, but for offering a friendly observation for seniors in need.

There were no additional comments.

Mr. Fiure notified the Board that he spoke to Director Kelly, who authorized a shared service agreement between Juvenile Detention, Gloucester and Salem Counties to accept one juvenile from each County as many counties have closed their Juvenile Detention facilities. The Board agreed to add these resolutions.

Beach Haven has requested a resolution in support of delaying the operation of the battery energy storage station away from a residential area, as lithium batteries can cause fires. The Board agreed.

Corrections crews clean every weekday, Introduced Completing 1,560 cleanup locations or projects each day. Dog waste stations, water official Respections are also part of the

program. The Art and Sustainability Igloo Program transformed four recycling igloos, thanks to the creativity of students and volunteers across the County. This year, Ocean County received \$273,579.97 from the NJ Clean Communities Program, while all 33 municipalities together received a total of \$1,861,938.61. The funding is generated from a tax collected from 15 categories of businesses that produce litter-generating products.

Commissioner Sadeghi commended Mr. Agliata, and the Planning Department for their hard work on these programs.

Mr. Greitz developed the County of Ocean Service Animal Policy after receiving inquiries from various employees wishing to bring their service animal to work. The dog or mini horse must be certified and able to perform a specific task that aids the handler.


