The County Comptroller is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The County Comptroller is directed to report in writing to the Board of Chosen Freeholders at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this Ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 6. The County reasonably expects to commence Engineering design of the improvements described in Section 1 hereof, and to advance all or a portion of the costs in respect thereof, prior to the issuance of bonds or notes hereunder. To the extent such costs are advanced, the County further reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance, in an aggregate amount not to exceed the amount of bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof. This bond ordinance is intended to be a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 7. Any grant monies received for the purposes described in Section 1 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

SECTION 8. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 6. The County reasonably expects to commence acquisition and/or construction of the improvements described in Section 1 hereof, and to advance all or a portion of the costs in respect thereof, prior to the issuance of bonds or notes hereunder. To the extent such costs are advanced, the County further reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance, in an aggregate amount not to exceed the amount of bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof. This bond ordinance is intended to be a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 7. Any grant monies received for the purposes described in Section 1 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

SECTION 8. The amount of the proceeds of the obligations authorized by this Ordinance which may be used for the payment of interest on such obligations, architects' fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses, and other items as provided in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 shall not exceed the sum of \$300,000.

SECTION 9. The Capital Budget of the County of Ocean is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. In the event of any such inconsistency and amendment, the resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended Capital Budget and Capital Program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders and is available there for public inspection.

SECTION 10. It is hereby found, determined and declared as follows:

A. The improvements or purposes described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses. They are improvements or purposes the County may lawfully undertake as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property benefitted thereby.

B. The average period of usefulness of the improvements for which the obligations authorized by this Ordinance are to be issued is thirty (30) years.

C. The supplemental debt statement provided for in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-10 was duly filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders prior to the passage of this Ordinance on first reading, and a complete executed duplicate of such supplemental debt statement has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey, and such supplemental debt statement shows that the gross debt of the County as defined in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-43 is increased by this Ordinance by \$2,375,000 and the obligations authorized by this Ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

SECTION 11. In the event the monies set forth above for any purpose is not necessary for said purposes, then such monies shall be for the completion of any of the other purposes provided for in this Ordinance.

SECTION 12. The full faith and credit of the County of Ocean shall be pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds and notes authorized by this Ordinance, and as long as any of said bonds or notes are outstanding, an appropriation shall be included in each annual budget of the County hereafter adopted in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds or notes maturing in each year. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the County, and the County shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the County for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

SECTION 13. After passage upon first reading of this Ordinance, the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders is hereby directed to publish the full text of the Ordinance, together with the notice set forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF PENDING ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-19, at least seven days prior to the date set for public hearing and further consideration for final passage (which date shall be at least ten days after introduction and first reading). The Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders is further directed to comply with all provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-17(b) regarding postings, publications, and the provision of copies of this Ordinance.

SECTION 14. After final adoption of this Ordinance by the Board of Chosen Freeholders, the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders is hereby directed to publish the full text of this Ordinance, as finally adopted, together with the notice set forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-19.

SECTION 15. The Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County hereby covenants on behalf of the County to take any action necessary or refrain from taking such action in order to preserve the tax-exempt

status of the bonds and notes authorized hereunder as is or may be required under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and the regulations promulgated thereunder (the "Code"), including compliance with the Code with regard to the use, expenditure, investment, timely reporting and rebate of investment earnings as may be required thereunder.

SECTION 16. This Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

BUDGET MESSAGE

It has always been the policy of the Board of Chosen Freeholders to provide quality services to the residents of the County while maintaining a stable tax rate for the taxpayers of the County. The 2019 County Budget has been developed with that theory in mind along with fiscal conservatism.

The formulation of the Budget was accomplished through a series of budget sessions with the assistance of the County Officials over a three month period. These sessions included budget conferences with various Departments and Agencies of the County.

With this 2019 County Budget, the Board of Chosen Freeholders will decrease the tax rate to .342 cents per \$100 of equalized property value.

The budget totals \$431,967,163 up \$15.8 million.

The amount to be raised in taxation is \$353,049,175, up \$6,558,058.

The County will use \$28,800,000 from its surplus to support the 2019 Budget, \$6,800,000 more than it did in 2018.

With the passage of Chapter 78 of the Laws of 2011, local government units were required to institute specific formulas for the calculation of employee health benefit contribution. The formulas are based on type of coverage, base salary and cost of coverage. The 2019 County Budget includes an appropriation for Group Insurance for Employees in the amount of \$43,910,717. This amount was derived by subtracting the estimated employee contribution to be collected of \$6,086,381 from the calculated cost of \$49,997,098.

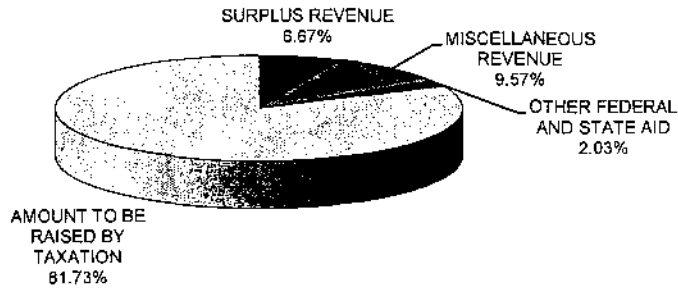

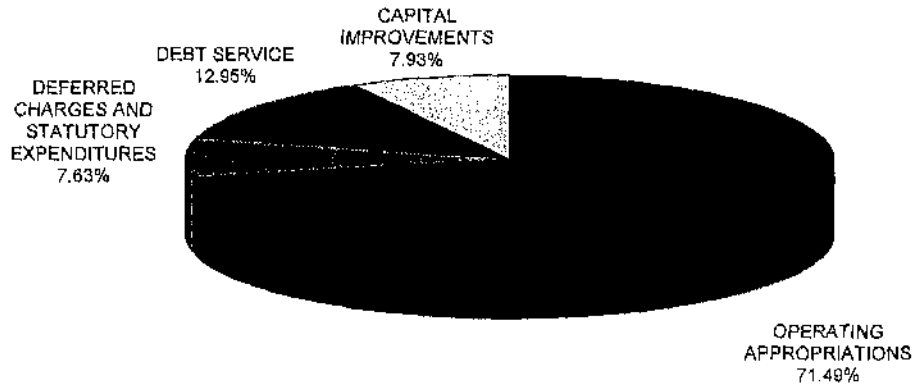

NARRATIVE FOR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

COUNTY OF OCEAN 2019

The Ocean County Board of Chosen Freeholders, with the assistance of the County Administrator, Office of Management and Budget, County Engineer, County Planning Board and the County Comptroller, has developed this six-year Capital Improvement Program and Budget. The Capital Improvement Program was developed with the cooperation and consideration of recommendations of the various County Departments.

The County's continuing growth requires that the Board of Chosen Freeholders anticipates and plans for the increasing demands for County facilities and services. The Capital Improvement Program was prepared to guide County investment in land, facilities and equipment through 2024. The Program and Budget will be adjusted each year to reflect changing conditions including new Federal and State legislation, variations in the general economy, emerging demands of the public and modifications in the growth rate which may result in changes in revenue patterns and demand for new facilities or services. The Capital Improvement Program is realistic and attainable within the financial capabilities of the County and it provides for the future needs of Ocean County residents.

The accompanying forms which comprise the Capital Budget and six-year Capital Improvement Program have been completed in accord with regulations adopted by the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey pursuant to powers authorized by NJSA 52:27BB-10, NJSA 40A:4-43 to 45. The Capital Budget forms list all projects scheduled for startup for the 2019 Budget year and the source of funding for each project. A summary of Anticipated Funding Sources and Amounts is also included. Please note that this summary shows funding needed for new capital projects. It does not include previous appropriations for projects to be continued in 2019. For this reason, the funding summary differs slightly from the total cost shown for the Capital Program.

The total cost of all Capital Improvement Projects over the six-year period is \$311,672,467. Many of the projects will be funded under State and Federal Grant Programs or through the annual Budget on a "pay-as-you-go" basis. The larger projects will be funded by short-term borrowing. Bonds will be issued at the most advantageous times to secure low interest rates.

WHEREAS, the creators and administrators of "Rise Up Ocean County", as well as those individuals posting anti-Semitic comments on the site, have incited ill will and bad feeling among Ocean County municipalities in their effort to discredit the Jewish population and have created a derisive and hateful atmosphere as is evidenced by comments posted on the site; and

Freeholder Director Haines opened the meeting by introducing Freeholder Vicari, the liaison to the department of Senior Services. Freeholder Vicari said that the job of the Freeholder Board is to serve the community, especially the large number of senior citizens that reside here. Freeholder Vicari and Maria LaFace, the director of Senior Services, discussed some of the many programs available to aging residents in Ocean County. Meals on Wheels is essential to many seniors in our area. Ocean County delivers 1100 meals per day. A nominal \$2.00 donation is requested for each meal, but many seniors receive the meal at no cost to them. The Senior Services department has over 37 contracts with various vendors. The goal of the services is for the senior to maintain healthy independence for as long as possible. The County has services to help residents with bill paying, home maintenance issues, transportation to doctor visits, medication

monitoring, and assistance in heating the delivered meals as well. For some residents, the human contact they receive from our service providers may be the only lifeline they have to the community. When home visits are performed, the qualified visitor may ascertain that the senior requires additional help, and can assist them in applying for those services.

Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda, which included the Recommendation for Award for Zebb's Bridge (Structure No. 1505-007) Pinewald-Keswick Road (C.R. 530) Over the Davenport Branch of the Toms River in Berkeley Township. The Contractor is Marbro, Inc. from West End, NJ in the amount of \$1,331,117.00. The project should take nine months to complete, and will be done in stages. This award is contingent upon NJDOT approval. There were no questions or comments and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the January 16, 2019 Board meeting.

Ms. Cilento reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of January 16, 2019. There were no questions or comments.

Freeholder Director Haines opened the meeting by introducing Tony Agliata, David Mckeon, and Tom Quirk of the NJ Coastal Coalition. The NJ Coastal Coalition is a 501c 3 non-profit organization, incorporated in the State of New Jersey. The Coalition is made up of representatives from coastal communities that meet monthly to discuss common municipal flooding issues. Formed in response to Super Storm Sandy, the Coalition began meeting in January 2013. The meetings are conducted in a non-political manner and include elected officials, county and municipal staff, as well as Architects, Engineers, NJ DEP, the Army Corps of Engineers, and college representatives. The goal of the Coalition is to work together to find solutions to flood mitigation issues, and anticipate the next area that may be affected. Mr. Quirk would like Ocean County to join the Coalition first, and then he will approach the municipalities individually. Dave McKeon, the former Ocean

County Planning Department Director has been attending their meetings, and believes the coalition is doing very important work. Mr. Quirk mentioned that the outreach for flooding issues also needs to reach the northern and western areas of the state where the shore community homeowners may reside in the off season. Freeholder Director Haines is in support of the County joining the Coalition and working together through education to mitigate the flooding issues. Freeholder Kelly believes that the flooding issues since Hurricane Sandy are significantly worse County wide, and is in support of joining the Coalition as well. Freeholder Vicari also supports the Coalition since severe flooding issues affect so many residents in our area. Freeholder Quinn stated that residents are looking for help with street flooding and other various issues. The knowledge gained from joining the Coalition could prove to be very helpful to them. Mr. Quirk asked the Board to pass a Resolution for Ocean County to join the Coalition. Freeholder Director Haines invited Mr. Quirk to attend the Southern NJ Freeholders Association Meeting to introduce him to other County officials who may also benefit from the joining the Coalition. Freeholder Quinn motioned to adopt the Resolution at the next Board meeting on February 6, 2019.

Freeholder Director Haines and Anthony Agliata discussed two NLTF recommended acquisitions. The first property consists of 4.70 acres of Bayfront property in Ocean Gate Borough. The unique oversized lot includes a beach, lagoon and bulk heading which provide public access to the water. There are several structures on the property, which are in disrepair. Administrator Carl Block mentioned that they will be demolished upon closing and the land used for Open Space. The landowner accepted an offer of \$1.6 million dollars. Ocean Gate has already supported the acquisition by resolution and if acquired would be the first NLTF property located in the Borough.

The second recommendation for acquisition is for 5.68 acres of multiple scattered lots, which are adjacent to the 1700-acre NLTF Structural Management Tract in the Roosevelt City section of Manchester Township purchased in 2014. Acquisition would allow for the vacation of unimproved paper streets, enabling the NLTF property to grow by 100 acres if vacated. The landowner accepted a negotiated offer of \$40,000.00.

The last item Freeholder Director Haines and Anthony Agliata presented to the Board was a Hazard Mitigation Grant for the Acquisition and Demolition of 19 properties in and around Good Luck Point in Berkeley Township. FEMA approved the application, and is providing a federal cost share of \$4,189,062.00, which is approximately 75% of the total cost. An additional grant was received from NJDEP Green Acres in the amount of \$923,805.00, which is approximately 17%. Ocean County NLTF funds equaling \$416,994.00, will cover the last 8%. NJDEP certified the values for these properties, and 10 of the 19 homeowners have accepted to date. The total accepted offer for these initial 10 properties is \$2,437,500, which averages \$243,750 per lot. Most of these properties are Hurricane Sandy impacted lots with demolished homes. Berkeley Township is supportive of this acquisition and has already demolished some of the homes at their own cost.

Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda, which included the Recommendation for Advertisement for the Reconstruction and Resurfacing of Certain County Roads Contract 2019A. There are 5 roads totaling 4.46 miles, located in Barnegat, 2 in Brick Township, and 2 in Toms River. In addition, Mr. Ernst spoke about the Recommendation for Award for the Construction of the Union Transportation Trail in Plumsted Township from Monmouth Road to New Egypt High School linking the northern end of the Barnegat Branch Rail Trail with Monmouth County's Union Transportation Trail. The contractor is Kline Construction Company from Galloway Township, and the award amount is \$407,235.00. This award is contingent upon NJDOT approval. There were no questions or comments and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the February 6, 2019 Board meeting.

Ms. Cilento reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of February 6, 2019. There were no questions or comments.
