June 1, 2022

WHEREAS, June 2022 marks the 25th Anniversary of the Senior Medicare Patrol (SMP) Program and to commemorate this event, they are creating a national week focused on Medicare fraud prevention to focus on the actions everyone can take to prevent Medicare fraud, errors and abuse; and

WHEREAS, Medicare fraud is big business for criminals and results in billions of Medicare dollars lost each year through many different services including ambulance, COVID-19, durable medical equipment, genetic testing, home health care, hospice, nursing home care, outpatient mental health, pharmacy and prescription drugs fraud as well as Medicare marketing violations and enrollment fraud; and

WHEREAS, as the number of people and communities affected by the COVID-19 pandemic grows, so do the scams associated with it; and

WHEREAS, across the nation, genetic testing company representatives are offering "free" genetic tests to Medicare beneficiaries making it possible for unscrupulous operators to steal people's medical identity and falsely bill Medicare for other services; and


WHEREAS, Medicare recipients are urged to treat their card and number like a credit card and never take advice or offers of medical services from people you don't know who call, come to your house or approach you in public; and

WHEREAS, Medicare recipients are also encouraged to read their Medicare Explanation of Benefits and look for services or equipment they didn't receive, double charges or tests your doctor didn't order and always report suspicious activities regarding their Medicare number to the Senior Medicare Patrol Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JOHN P. KELLY, DIRECTOR of the BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS of the COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, on behalf of this Board, hereby proclaim the week of June 5 - 11, 2022 as:

ORDINANCE #2022-12

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CONSTRUCTION OF A TRAFFIC SIGNAL AT DIAMOND ROAD AND RT. 526, WEST COMMODORE ROAD, LOCATED IN THE TOWNSHIP OF JACKSON, IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND APPROPRIATING \$1,500,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,425,000 IN BONDS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN TO FINANCE THE SAME.

WHEREAS on March 17, 2022 the Board of Education of the Ocean County Vocational Technical School (the "Board of Education") approved the expansion of the Jackson Center at a cost of \$10,000,000; and

WHEREAS, on March 30, 2022 the Ocean County Vocational Technical Board of School Estimate adopted a resolution which approved the funding request of \$10,000,000 for fiscal year 2022 for the expansion of the Jackson Center of the Board of Education of the Vocational Technical School located in Jackson Township; and

SECTION 3. There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$10,000,000, including the \$7,215,805

County Vocational School District grant awarded by the New Jersey Department of Education to the County by letter dated December 28, 2021, for the improvements or purposes described in Section 1 hereof as required by the Local Bond Law. No down payment is required pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:54-31.

SECTION 4. There is hereby authorized the issuance of negotiable bonds in an aggregate principal amount of \$10,000,000 to finance the costs of the purpose stated in Section 2 hereof. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and shall be in such form as may be determined by the County Comptroller. The County Comptroller shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this Ordinance, and the County Comptroller's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-8.1. The County Comptroller is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale, and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The County Comptroller is directed to report in writing to the Board of Commissioners at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this Ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

WHEREAS, the Constitution was amended in 1999 to provide eligible honorably discharged United States Armed Forces Veterans with a fixed \$250.00 property tax deduction; and

WHEREAS, the Veterans property tax deduction has not increased since 2003; and

WHEREAS, Assemblyman Ronald S. Dancer has introduced Assembly Concurrent Resolution No. 31 proposing a constitutional amendment to increase the Veterans property tax deduction; and

WHEREAS, the proposed constitutional amendment would increase the fixed annual property tax deduction for New Jersey Veterans from \$250.00 to \$1,000.00 with future deductions to be based on the annual Consumer Price Index increase, and rounded to the next highest multiple of \$1.00; and

WHEREAS, the Ocean County Board of Commissioners supports the efforts of Assemblyman Dancer and urges the New Jersey Legislature to increase the annual property tax deduction for New Jersey Veterans.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY that we hereby support Assembly Concurrent Resolution No. 31, which would increase the property tax deduction for Veterans to \$1,000.00 and base future deductions on annual Consumer Price Index increases.



Director John P. Kelly opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Director Kelly and Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the recommendation to advertise for the reconstruction and resurfacing of County Route 528 from Brick Boulevard to the Mantoloking Bridge in Brick Township to address drainage issues. Also, the recommendation to award the construction of a traffic signal at the intersection of County Route 55 (Rt. 530 Pinewald Keswick Road) and Congasia Road in Manchester Township to Earle Asphalt from Farmingdale, NJ in the amount of \$557,513.13. The recommendation to award Stormwater Management Contract 2022A in various townships to Insituform Technologies from Chesterfield, MO in the amount of \$997,542.16 was also discussed. This project will re-line approximately 4,000 feet of metal pipes with an environmentally safe fiberglass liner. Director Kelly questioned Mr. Ernst as to why a company from Missouri was chosen over a local company. Mr. Ernst said that there was roughly a million dollar cost difference between the high and low bidders, and there are

not many companies that do this type of project. There were no questions or comments and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the May 4, 2022 Board meeting.

Commissioner Haines and Mr. Agliata spoke about the Forked River Mountain Coalition, which is a nonprofit organization that works to conserve, maintain, protect and restore the natural, cultural, and historical resources of the 20,000 acre Forked River Mountain Area. In 2019, The County acquired the largest property in the Forked River Mountain Area. For the last 25 years the County and the Coalition have been working together to keep the area clean. On April 23, 2022 with the help of many local organizations and businesses, a cleanup of the area yielded 13.82 tons of trash, and 1.88 tons of concrete, 50 tires, and a small amount of household hazardous waste. The Ocean County Landfill, which is a private company in Manchester and Brick Wall Corporation in Lacey accepted all of the debris at no charge. Commissioner Haines thanked all of the participants who volunteered their time.

Commissioner Crea mentioned that starting May 4, 2022 shoppers will need to provide their own shopping bags, due to the new plastic bag ban in New Jersey. In addition, NJ stores and food service businesses will no longer provide Styrofoam food and beverage containers, and plastic straws will only be provided upon request.

Ms. Gunther reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of May 4, 2022. There were no questions or comments.

Director Kelly asked the Board members for comments.

Commissioner Vicari noted the beauty of the shore area towns that have rebuilt since Hurricane Sandy in 2012. The homes that were rebuilt are sturdier and have special storm upgrades. The Commissioner said the Jersey Shore is thriving, and he commends Ocean County Government for working with contractors during the Superstorm rescues and subsequent cleanup.

Commissioner Haines was moved by the traveling Cultural and Heritage Holocaust Museum event at the Toms River Branch of the Ocean County Library. The Commissioners attended an event where they were greeted by Michael Cohen, the Regional Director of the Simon Wiesenthal Center, which is a global human rights organization, Esther Feder-Lesell, who is a Holocaust survivor, and her daughter Rita Feder. Rita recently uncovered her father's Holocaust documents that chronicled each concentration camp he was imprisoned at. These documents have been included in the exhibit. The exhibit will move to Ocean County College in the next week.

Commissioner Haines attended the Ocean County Police Academy graduation ceremony honoring 75 new police officers from SLEO II Class 50 and 51, which was held at Georgian Court University on April 27, 2022. The Commissioner notified the Board she will be attending the Victims' Rights Walk held by the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office at Winding River Park on Saturday, April 30, 2022.

Commissioner Vicari also recognized the importance of the Holocaust Exhibit, which he attended with his wife. The Commissioner also recently visited the Joint Base, where he said 56,000 jobs have been created.

Commissioner Haines also attended an event honoring Veterans at the Joint Base. The Commissioner discussed the importance of having the joint base in Ocean County, and their involvement in the situation in the Ukraine.

There were no additional comments.

Mr. Block notified the Board that a crane is scheduled to be in place at the new Board of Social Services construction site on Hooper Avenue beginning Thursday, May 5, 2022 and will begin offloading steel. Erection of the steel frame should begin the following week.

Ms. Gunther read the resolution to move to closed session.

On a motion by Commissioner Vicari, seconded by Commissioner Haines, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 4:36pm for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was unanimously carried.

The meeting returned to Open Session at 5:04pm. There being no further business, on a motion by Commissioner Crea, seconded by Commissioner Vicari, the meeting adjourned at 5:04pm.

Director Kelly and Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department Agenda which included the recommendation to award Stormwater Management Contract 2021B to Earle Asphalt Company from Farmingdale, NJ in the amount of \$963,613.13. The company will address drainage issues in six locations throughout Brick Township, Toms River, Point Pleasant Beach, Point Pleasant Borough, and Long Beach Township. The bids received ranged in price from \$963,613.13 to \$1.3 million. Mr. Ernst discussed six miscellaneous items that are reflected in the attached Engineering Department Agenda. There were no questions or comments and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the May 18, 2022 Board meeting.

Commissioner Haines and Michael Mangum updated the Board on various Parks Department projects occurring throughout the County over the next five years. A complete project list is attached.

Mr. Mangum said there are drainage issues that need to be addressed at the A. Paul King Park causing contaminants to flow into the lake warranting beach closures. Director Kelly asked Mr. Mangum to contact the State to see if they would cover the cost of the drainage repair since the water is flowing into the park from State Route 72. Mr. Mangum will contact the State.

Commissioner Haines and Mr. Agliata discussed a property that the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee has recommended for Open Space acquisition. It consists of various private inholdings in the 74-acre Mill Creek Headwaters project area totaling 4.93-acres in Berkeley Township. The property owners have accepted offers totaling \$335,200.00.

Ms. Gunther reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of May 18, 2022. There were no questions or comments.

Director Kelly asked the Board members for comments.

Commissioner Vicari notified the Board that the Toms River Business Improvement District applied for the "Main Street America" designation for Toms River Township. If approved, it would offer priority for federal funding in the event of flooding or a natural disaster.

Commissioners Haines, Vicari, Crea, and Quinn attended the Ocean County Bar Association's Law Day Ceremony held at the Court House on May 11, 2022. The Information Technology Department received the "Citizenship Award" for their excellent work behind the scenes, keeping offices functional during COVID. Commissioner Haines also noted that the annual high school mock trial was won this year by Ocean County's M.A.T.E.S. Academy.

Commissioner Haines would like to add a resolution to the agenda in support of legislation for a parent's right to decide the age at which children are taught controversial issues.

Commissioner Vicari commented on the popularity of the Marine Academy of Technology and Environmental Science (MATES) as well as the Ocean County Performing Arts Academy, which have promoted highly qualified students to top Universities.

Director Kelly told the Board that eight interviews have been conducted for the Assistant Administrator position. The final decision will be discussed in an Executive Session meeting soon.
