Resolution for Public Hearing), can we go back to the Presentation?"

DEPUTY CLERK BENVENUTO: "Of course."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "I think we have someone here ... from I think ... Christie Winters is here, the Executive Director of Seeds of Service. Christie, you want to... there you are."

CHRISTIE WINTERS, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF SEEDS OF SERVICE: "We also have Cristy Wreesman-Beckles from Catholic Charities."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Sure. Good to see you."

CRISTY WREESMAN-BECKLES: "It's good to see you guys again, too."

CHRISTIE WINTERS: "So we have two Christie's here. It does get a little confusing sometimes. So, this is Cristy Wreesman-Beckles from Catholic Charities. She is the Director for Catholic Charities and I'm Christie Winters. We have the same initials too. So, it's funny when people stop in the building at SOS (Seeds of Service) and they're like, oh we're here to see Christie. And we're like, which one? So, we can't thank you guys enough for having us here today. We're excited to be here to actually talk about our different programs that we offer down at SOS and at Catholic Charities. So, I'm going to go over some of our programs that Seeds of Service offers, and we hope to reach more in the community that are in need of services. So, for SOS we've been around for about 14 years now since Hurricane Sandy. It's beautiful, our community here. Everybody got together, and Catholic Charities was with us too at that time. And we really started to help people and figured out that there needed to be a longer-term solution to find and develop other programs that were needed here in our county. So, we started embarking on an open choice pantry which is jointly run between Catholic Charities and SOS. And opened up an open choice pantry which is amazing. Families are allowed to come in. We are open five days a week from 9am until 5pm and then on Tuesdays and Thursdays we actually stay open until 7 at night, so that those who are working they have access and we do have plans to try and expand those hours in the evening so that way more individuals can get to the pantry and food resources that they need. We also have a tool lending library which is pretty cool. And it's kind of like going to Home Depot. But all of our families who are registered with us, if they need to borrow a drill or a smaller tool or something of this sort they can come into SOS and Catholic Charities and be able to borrow a tool from us to do any kind of repairs on their home.

And we have a community garden which is along the whole front walk. It's awesome. Families can actually park and get out of their cars and as stuff is growing, they're able to once they're done with their food basket, take cucumbers and strawberries and load them into their car. It's a lot of fun. We also have an indigenous garden where we teach classes to help people understand the native plants here in Ocean County and to help plant those, and so that's along the one side of the parking lot. We have a food program, a clothing program, a furniture program and a household goods program. So, any of the families that are attending the open choice pantry that you can sit down with our case workers and are able to place orders with us. So, if they need clothing for themselves or a microwave or something along those lines, they're allowed to place the order, and we help fill those orders as the items come in. We also have case management between both of our agencies. SOS specializes in case managing those that are in need of employment. And we have a Work Preparedness Program and a Work Experience Program. We help out with a lot with youth and young adults with special needs and at-risk behaviors and learning disabilities. So, we specialize in case management for that. Cristy will speak about their case management too. And we work very closely with a lot of our high schools. So, Brick Township High School, they actually bus their students for us that have special needs and at-risk behaviors and learning disabilities. They get bussed to SOS on a daily basis. And they get to choose us and get 10 credits towards graduation per semester. We also have many, many other programs. A very important one is we have ESL (English as a Second Language) at Seeds of Service and that's offered in the morning hours and in the evening hours along with...we have so many programs. I'm trying to like, go over them in the top of my head. It's just really an amazing, beautiful place. It's our dream, both of our agencies, that when people do come in, that we can have wraparound services for those who are in need of many different things, at many different stages in their lives. So, I'm going to let Cristy speak a little bit about where she's at in all of their programs."

CRISTY WREESMAN-BECKLES: "I currently started working with Catholic Charities since last year. SOS and Catholic Charities has had a vast of many years working together partnering up, making sure that our community gets what they need. With Catholic Charities we do have an immigration program. We do help our immigrants when it comes to filing any types of forms, any DACA (Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals), whatever the case may be even citizenship. That program has actually grown. We actually added two new counselors, case managers, to the immigration program. And that's something that we're trying to expand even more because of the current state that we're currently in when it comes to our government. That being said we have also had USCCB (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops), however that program actually closed down because of the ORR (Office of Refugee Resettlement) situation and all of that going on in our government currently right now. As well as we have the Fix It Program which is for our seniors. That actually ... hey if you need any assistance whether it's blowing some leaves or making just your house safer than that program can actually help our seniors. We also have NJ SAVES. NJ SAVES has started a couple of months ago where that's also for our seniors and it's just a one stop applications that they have to do. It helps you with hearing aids, prescriptions, Medicare savings program, food stamps, utility assistance, and that's something that we're also growing in advance, hopefully. Also, we are currently even looking into housing. Housing is one of our biggest issues here, not only in Ocean County, but in the world and in the United States. That being said a lot of our clients that do come, do need that assistance and I always like to say when people are coming in, they're coming in at their lowest. The only thing you can do is actually just listen to them, have a smile and just

make sure that you're writing down everything that they need. One question might lead to another question might lead to another question where you find vast of things that they need but it's up to you as the case manager to actually take it step by step. So, that being said we have partnered up into a point where we need to get the information out there. We need to get the services out there for everyone. We're currently even helping ... we have had an influx of veterans coming in. My husband is currently in the Armed Forces. He is getting medically retired. And I can literally relate to what they're going through. So, we have had also an influx of veterans coming in for different types of services and that's actually another avenue that we can actually research and see if we can get at least a case manager for veterans as well. So, it's a little bit at a time but as long as we keep our head up, I think we're able to bring those services to Ocean County and of course to the New Jersey area."

CHRISTIE WINTERS: "And both of our partnerships are excited to say that we are happy to be a part of continuing care when it comes to Ocean County because we know a lot of the towns in our whole county are struggling with this. And we are opening up a program right in our building for housing, for case management. And we will be going and applying for as many programs that we can to help facilitate the housing because it does take a village. It takes all of us to be able to try to find the solutions for it. So, we thank you guys very much for having us here today."

CRISTY WRESSMAN-BECKLE: "Thank you for having us."

CHRISTIE WINTERS: "And anybody is welcome to come and visit. And if you have guys have any questions Cristy and I are here to answer them."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Thank you very much. We had the opportunity ... Mike (Fiure) was there, and I don't remember if any of the other Commissioners were there, but the service that you provide to the community is much needed."

CHRISTIE WINTERS: "Thank you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Things are becoming more difficult out there. Everything is more expensive. Housing, groceries items, everything is more expensive, and Ocean County is not what it used to be. People used to come down here because it was affordable down here. That's not the case anymore, and it has a lot of positives and negatives to it, but you provide that needed service and we really appreciate it."

CHRISTIE WINTERS: "We thank you guys very much for visiting our building, visiting all of our programs. And hopefully we can get the word out because we are here to help out as many people as we possibly can. Alright."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Well, now that you mentioned you have fresh produce..."

CHRISTIE WINTERS: "Yes."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "...we're going to absolutely show up."

CHRISTIE WINTERS: "We are known as Western Catholic Charities and our open choice pantry because we are very blessed with a lot of our partnerships. Trader Joe's gives us about two pallets a day, every day that we pick up from them. We do have a lot of people who actually seek out our pantry because of the amount of fresh produce that we do have and especially because we grow it ourselves. I think last year we did a little over 7,000 pounds of produce that we grew on our own. So, that's exciting. And please, ESL, it is a big need right now all over the place. You can come in and sign up right at the help desk. And our Work Experience Program, that one I didn't talk too much because I know there's only so much time, but our Work Experience Program is available for individuals that are looking to be able to get a certificate in something from either Case Management to Peer Recovery Specialist to CDL, CNA. And through our Work Experience Program you actually get paid. So, it's 360 hours while you're working on your certificate. Everything from data entry to property management and then we help with job placement out of that. So, if individuals, if anybody knows of anyone who is working 20 hours at Walmart, 10 hours at McDonald's, this is a great opportunity because it's very hard for people to further their education certificates and still pay their bills at the same time. So, we're in hopes with our current program that, that helps bridge that gap."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Great."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Frank, I would just like to say we have our Director of Veterans, you mentioned Veterans, Philip Zimmerman is here."

CHRISTIE WINTERS: "Oh really."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "We have the number one Veterans Department in the State of New Jersey. He does an excellent job. So, if you ever have any questions, Phil, if he'll raise his hand maybe you'll want to talk with him after. He does an amazing job for our Veterans so if there's anything that you might need just get in touch with him."

U. COMMISSIONER COMMENTS

At 4:28 PM, Deputy Director Sadeghi received the following comments from members of the Board:

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Okay. Next is Commissioner Comments. Commissioner Bacchione."

COMMISSIONER BACCHIONE: "I have no comments."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Nothing?"

COMMISSIONER BACCHIONE: "No, I'm good."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Not one?" (laughter)

COMMISSIONER BACCHIONE: "Let's see... no. Nothing comes to mind. It was a quiet week. I'll have comments next time. I promise."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Okay. Commissioner Arace."

COMMISSIONER ARACE: "No comments."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Yes, I do have a comment."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Thank you, Commissioner Haines."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "What it is ... I was invited to attend an event that was in Lakewood today at the Historical Society. They honored the Theibault family. Many of you may or may not know Craig Theibault. He served... he was Chair of our Shade Tree Commission, but, and also his family was very involved. So, Lakewood Township ... I was there along with Senator Singer, we were there, and they honored the Theibault family for all of their contributions to the people of Lakewood as well as the people of Ocean County because they served in many capacities and I always felt... because I've known the Theibault family probably most of my life because I grew up in Lakewood. And it was just really nice to be there because Craig has not been in very good health. So, it was really nice to be able to see the family and that Lakewood thought to honor them. And they named the garden which is at the Historical Society's building which is in Pine Park which is by the Lakewood Country Club. So, it was a very nice event. A little warm, which I wasn't going to complain because we haven't really had warm weather, so I was really happy about that. But it was a very, very nice event, honoring the great Theibault family. That was it."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Thank you, Commissioner Haines."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "No comment?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Yes, I do have a comment. (laughter) I had the opportunity...I was invited to take a tour of the facilities at Georgian Court College and anybody who hasn't been up there...I've lived in Ocean County for a long time, for 30 some years and never really had the opportunity to do that. And if you have time, take the time to go through that beautiful campus. The buildings are absolutely majestic. I mean they have castles and such and you go through those buildings... Sam Ellenbogen also met me there and we went through some of those buildings and just gorgeous. And I have some ideas. I have to talk to the College President about, maybe touring some of these buildings and facilities. Some of these gems I call them in Ocean County that most of the people don't take the time and don't have the time maybe to go through them. But they're right here, right around the corner from us. I say that it took us probably 40 minutes to go from Toms River to Lakewood and that's not acceptable. I know we've talked about this. I know on the Chamber of Commerce side; on the business side of the community, we've talked about Route 9 and what a disaster Route 9 is and has been. But there's a road that's been exactly the same for the most part, for 90 years. And think about the population of Ocean County. What was the population Eric, 90 years ago?" (laughter)

ERIC: "Commissioner Haines?" (laughter)

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "It was 53,000 in 1950."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Commissioner Haines indicated that she was there."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Not 90 years ago. Close, but close. It was 53,000 lived in Ocean County in 1950. So, I looked it up. That's the only reason I know."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "So we're more than 10 times. We're almost 670,000 people in Ocean County and Route 9 is exactly the same way. We're getting tired of this. It's not fair to people. It's not fair to that mother who has kids at home and they're calling her and they're waiting for her to get home. And it's not just exclusive to that one category. All of us. It's not fair. It's five miles to go from Toms River to Lakewood and yet it takes 40 minutes to get there. We have to do something about this. I asked our Administrator to start a conversation with maybe the school, the rabbinical school in Lakewood, BMG (Beth Medrash Govoha) have the Georgian Court College folks there, the

Township of Lakewood and all the surrounding communities, the senior communities and take a look at their traffic patterns and see if we can come up with some patterns where we can maybe have the County of Ocean and their resources to also step up and assist and take some of those cars off the roads and make that the flow of traffic a little easier. So, I'm looking forward to doing that, starting that conversation. But the main aspect of what I wanted to say was if you haven't had the opportunity to go through that campus, do so. They have gardens. They have buildings. They have... I mean it's magnificent."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "They have the George Jay Gould Estate."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "That's right. That was the building that we went through. And I'm going to go back and probably many times to see the facilities and the buildings that they have there. That's what I have. I'll go back to Commissioner Bacchione, anything?"

COMMISSIONER BACCHIONE: "Well when the... I challenge you to take a walk through Double Trouble State Park. That would be quite a day for you, Commissioner. Also, the college as soon as they get the ... how do I say ... I never say it right...Arbor...."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Arboretum."

COMMISSIONER BACCHIONE: "Arboretum. When that is completed, we'll definitely have to go for a tour because the students are going to do an amazing job redoing that and I can't wait. That'll be another gem in Ocean County. And this is just something else, Commissioner, we add to our tourism, what to do in Ocean County."

V. PUBLIC COMMENTS - "Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of five (5) minutes per speaker."

At 4:35 PM, Deputy Director Sadeghi opened the meeting to receive comments from members of the public.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGH: "Yeah exactly. Thank you. Now we'll open it to the public. If you'd like to make a comment please come up, indicate your name, your address."

SEAN NELSON BOERO, 949 PAINTER LANE, MANAHAWKIN NJ: "Good afternoon. I've been here before, and I sent emails to the Commissioners before regarding the handling of cyber tips by the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office. I was a (State) Trooper for 25 years and I worked in Ocean County for ... at the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office for 5 years. I was hired to get the lab accredited, build our digital forensic laboratory and that's what I do now. I left Ocean County Prosecutor's Office 5 years ago and now I travel around the world. I build labs and I train police officers. I've asked you all to speak to Bradley Billhimer about the handling of cyber tips. I gave you specific examples where children in Ocean County were neglected, abused, and sexually tortured for months after the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office identified the location of their abusers. In one case it was 13 months and during that 13 months Christopher Budelman from Brick, sexually assaulted a child in Ohio and sexually assaulted a child in Colorado. The Ocean County Prosecutor's Office chose not to do anything. Homeland Security forced them to go and arrest Budelman. I've asked you please talk to Mr. Billhimer and here's another one.

Last year at this time I was in Bishkek, Kyrgyzstan giving a class, but I was watching the Christopher Gregor trial. The famous trial where Corey, the young boy, the six-year boy, died. He was abused by his father. We have that horrible treadmill video and today in the Asbury Park Press there's... we'll get to that later. Apparently, according to Corey's mom, Breanna Micciolo, the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office knew about that treadmill incident a week before Corey died. She did her own Open Public Records Request and Child Protection and Permanency actually interviewed Corey and his father a week before he died. Nothing was done. That's inexcusable, which rolls into my third request. There are two requests. Ask Mr. Billhimer about the cyber tips. Ask Billhimer about Breanna. She asked in an Open Public Records Request for some kind of information about this. What happened? The Ocean County Prosecutor's Office denied her request yesterday. This is a mom. Her child is dead. The appropriate response from adults would be to get Victims Services, to get Bradley Billhimer and get Chief Carrington. Go speak to Breanna and get her all the services and answers that she needs and wants. It's... It's heartbreaking to see that in OPRA machine. And it's on the OPRA machine online you can see their denial. That's soulless. That is not a Law Enforcement Agency. That is not a public service. That is a disgrace. And the last one rolling right into the Bollinger case. Asbury Park Press did a very nice article today about children being abused by their teachers. For the last 5 years, Major Yaiser, we used to be young detectives together in the State Police, has been coming here and telling you about problems at the OCVTS. He has been ignored. Looking through Open Public Records Request, Robert Shea's billing records, it appears that Robert Shea, Ms. Homiek, the Toms River Police, were conducting an investigation into Bollinger in June and July of 2022. They never interviewed the student who was sexually abused. It's basic police work guys. Right? Fortunately, this brave young lady, a sexual assault victim walked into Lakehurst PD in August of 2022 and made a complaint. Ocean County Prosecutor's Office, two detectives, Victoria Guarino and Nicole Testa, both of them who I know. Both of them are excellent detectives, did a great job. And if you go to OPRA machine you can read their twenty-page affidavit. But during the entire course of that, they never went to the Ocean County Vocational Technical School and interviewed anybody. Mr. Bollinger was subsequently charged when it was approved by Assistant Prosecutor Kim Carr who has since resigned. Another stellar public servant, Division I Athlete, Princeton graduate, daughter of a Major in the State Police. That State Police contact keeps coming up. Mr. Bollinger plead guilty to having an inappropriate relationship with one of his students outside of the OCVTS even though there was ample evidence to charge him with having sex in a closet at the Performing Arts Academy. It's inexcusable that that was allowed to go. I'm not going to ... he's my age, having sex with a 17-year-old girl. That's

ridiculous. And he is free. So, I think this is just basic police work. Myself and Bob (Robert) Yaiser got 50-years of police experience here. We have about 1,000 indictable arrests. We've been there; we've done that. I travel around the world training the police. I tried to fix Ocean County Prosecutor's Office. I'm asking you, please, to ask Mr. Billhimer to address these three issues. Thank you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Thank you, Sean."

SEAN NELSON BOERO: "Oh, last thing. I'm so sorry. Catholic Services. So, I get to travel the world. I put on about 100,000 miles last year training police officers. I always find a Catholic Church, everywhere. So, I was in Bishkek, Kyrgyzstan and there is a Catholic Church there from some German soldiers who were banned during World War II. The other thing I get to travel around the Middle East a lot. Beautiful people, wonderful people and just a prayer for peace. Iranians awesome, wonderful people. Israelis, of course awesome, wonderful people. Lebanese, one of the greatest countries in the world. And it is not good what's happening now. Just like everywhere in the world, the people are great, the people in charge maybe are not."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Thank you, Sean."

ROBERT YAISER, 7 WARREN COURT, MANAHAWKIN, NJ: "So we're all on the same page, Commissioner Bacchione and (Commissioner Arace). I'm going to play a short clip for you guys that I presented to this Commission in February of this year. (Mr. Yaiser played an audio tape.) That was the most recent group of students and parents pleading for help throughout this school district. In that complaint multiple students advised that they had been bullied, terrified and called racial slurs for two years by the same student while the OCVTS Administration failed to address their complaints. The bullying escalated to the student threatening another student with a handgun which prompted a response from Ocean Township PD with long rifles. The PD was spectacular by the way. The mother you hear on that recording is one of numerous students and parents who were crying and begging as you heard, begging for help. Students also questioned how does this administration permitted to investigate themselves with no oversight. That was at the September 26, 2024 Board Meeting. On October 21, 2024, nearly a month later, I had reached out numerous times to the Ocean County Superintendent of Schools, Susan Naples, and advised her that the student involved in the weapon threat was still listed on the class roster and his name was being called daily for the attendance. I further informed her that the parents have continued to report that their children are terrified to come to school because nothing has changed. The same Administrators are in the same positions and there was no accountability. This is one of the many serious complaints that I've reported. This should have been, could have and should have been prevented.

I have been reporting these alarming complaints and requesting an investigation for years at every level of government. Both the Ocean County Prosecutor and the New Jersey Attorney General have known about these complaints for years and done nothing to protect our citizens, specifically our children. I can show you copies of the emails and the request for help that I sent. These complaints include but are not limited to the multiple coverups of sexual assaults against children and employees, sexual misconduct, nepotism, pay to play, questionable hiring, funding and employment practices, drinking alcohol in the presence of children. The OCVTS administration and Board of Education personnel, meeting regularly, and consuming alcohol during school hours and operating school vehicles under the influence of alcohol. Based on the indisputable facts and what I've personally witnessed and what I was originally told by Law Enforcement in 2020 and 2021, this has been a statewide coverup that directly involves the Ocean County Prosecutor and the Attorney General. An OPRA request of Board Attorney Bob Shea's billing records shows that the New Jersey Department of Education, Ocean County Officials, and the New Jersey Attorney General's Office, have been collaborating for years at the taxpayers' expense on strategies to address these complaints. As I previously reported to you and to Law Enforcement during my interview that strategy appears to be lying to the public long enough for the statute of limitations to expire. I've also explained for the last four years, I was forced into this, after I was contacted by multiple Law Enforcement Agencies in 2020 and made aware of the truth. They contacted me. I never contacted anyone; they involved me in this coverup. They confirmed that the students and parents' complaints received by Ocean County Officials and the New Jersey Department of Education in 2020 were legitimate. The FBI agents who interviewed me believed that Ocean County is the most corrupt county in the State of New Jersey. Since these complaints surfaced in 2019, I have witnessed the retaliation, intimidation, and bullying of numerous students, parents, district employees, former New Jersey State Troopers and Commissioner Joseph Vicari, all for seeking the truth and trying to protect students. In addition to putting in writing a request to the then Clerk, Carl Block to review the parents' complaints received on April 15, 2020, and to take appropriate action. (Commissioner) Vicari confirmed during the June 7, 2023, Commissioners meeting that he was told former New Jersey State Troopers were banned from employment at OCVTS. These are his words at that meeting, Director Vicari, "I was told that. That's absolutely correct. The Administration said they have enough State Troopers, and State Troopers that applied for a job were told... and I spoke to them that they will not be hired by OCVTS because we already have too many State Troopers, and they will not hire anyone or consider anyone who has served as a New Jersey State Trooper." In my humble opinion bullying employees and officials to high corruption is despicable. Bullying children to high corruption is unforgivable. And people need to be held accountable. I'm requesting Commissioner Arace and Commissioner Sadeghi as liaisons to that school that you meet with me as soon as possible for more than an hour and review the evidence in these complaints. I'm also requesting that the county hire an independent counsel outside of Ocean County who's not directly involved in these complaints. We need to protect these kids. Yes?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Thank you Bob. We'll talk to Mr. Sahradnik (County Counsel) and see what we can legally and ethically do, as a Board of Commissioners. You have my commitment on that."

ROBERT YAISER: "I appreciate you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Thank you, Bob. Anyone else?"

ROSEMARY GOEBEL, 691 NORTHSTREAM DRIVE, TOMS RIVER, NJ: "Good afternoon, and thank you. We've been here since 1969. This is the place I chose to retire because it was the closest to my homeland, England. So, if I speak a little different that's why. I'm here to plead with you today, for the homeless. The situation here in Ocean County is just not tolerable. It is terrible. I work. I'm 83-years old and I work for St. Joseph's Church as an Administrative Coordinator for Social Concerns. And as part of my duties, it entails taking care of those who call or come to us for help. Either it's food or clothing or getting medical attention or finding a place where they could rest their head, take a shower just once in a great while. And the problem is getting far worse than I ever dreamed it could be. When I retired from my full-time job in 2022, in 2023, beg your pardon, and took over this position, I was a member of an organization that was also helping the homeless back then. At that point in time the numbers were much, much smaller. Today it is horrible. Last year, my church alone spent well close to \$200,000.00 on motel rooms and motel rooms are only a band aid on a wound that is gaping, and bleeding and oozing pus. People are not getting better in hotel rooms. Families cannot possibly make it in hotel rooms. Ask me, I know. When we transferred here from California, my husband was in the Navy, and we had no housing to go to at Lakehurst. I lived seven months in the Lakehurst Budget Inn. It was the worst nightmare of my life, but I fell in love with Toms River, and I said let's buy and stay here. And we did. I know what it's like to live in one room with children. And we are finding more and more families evicted around here with children. Now this wonderful gentleman spoke about child abuse and how it's happening and by whom it's happening and they're getting away with it. What do you think is happening with these children who are now homeless? They're not suffering. Sure, they are. And they're being abused by all of us who sit on our humps and do nothing about the homeless situation. Please, I beg of you, I beg of you. Let's get something going. If you can find a way to get a building, up and off the ground the churches in Toms River will find a way to provide the workers to work there, volunteers that will only be too happy to help them. Thank you. And God bless you all."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Thank you." (applause) Anyone else?"

PAM QUATSE, 1C SWALLOW STREET, MANCHESTER, NJ: "I'm here... I also wanted to speak about the homeless. As it happens, I did not know Rosemary was going to be here today. I have known Rosemary since probably 2001 when we both worked on this small...we were both participants in a small organization of church people who advocated for the homeless and for a homeless shelter. We were told adding finitum for years by the Freeholders who are now Commissioners, well if you build a shelter we will send you people. And the little group that we were part of; Rosemary and I were part of, dissolved when the Toms River Housing and Homeless Coalition was started which is a non-profit. I don't recall exactly when that was started maybe around 2018 or 2020. And the struggle continues. The Ocean County Housing and Homeless Coalition is now housed, runs their office out of the Parish House at Christ Episcopal Church, which as you may know is currently under threat of eminent domain, having our property removed by the Toms River Township Council. Excuse me. I'm a little nervous. The Toms River Housing and Homeless Coalition provides services for people who are homeless who temporarily because they got burnt out of their house, as it happened to my cousin in Brick (New Jersey) years ago during a blizzard. Or they have unexpected health issues or whatever, that put them over the edge and so they're homeless. I was homeless myself for a brief time in 1999 and my parents who lived in Lavallette put me up. Otherwise, I would've been sleeping in my car. So, you guys have power. You can stop the baloney about well you build a shelter we'll send you people. No, you have the power. You have property. You can build a shelter along the same lines as the Bergen County Housing Shelter which has been going for, I don't know... 15 years and I visited it with people from the Housing Center and it's doing a marvelous job. You can take the property that Toms River took by eminent domain, a property on ... which was a motel which had a lot of nuisance calls. I don't recall the name of the hotel but it's right on 166 not far from here. Not far from Shop Rite. So, you can take that from Toms River by eminent domain. Wouldn't that be poetic justice? (laughter) (applause) Tear the motel down and build a shelter. We need a shelter. Rosemary deals with the homeless people every day and the problem is not getting any better. It's getting much, much worse. As you can see by the homeless people who are now publicly hanging out at the Toms River Library because they have nowhere else to go. Thank you." (applause)

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Thank you."

COMMISSIONER BACCHIONE: "If I can say one thing, Director ... Frank."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Yeah, yeah."

COMMISSIONER BACCHIONE: "If you notice three of us are new Board members. We have been working with the County since we got here in January for myself and Rob (Arace) on doing something about the homeless situation. We have no power over any mayor in any town. Don't get that mistaken. We do not have power over mayors. However, we do have buildings, but we also have to deal with the mayors when we decide to do that. We are working on it. It is something that keeps us up at night and we are working on a solution. So, don't think that we're sitting up here with nothing. We are working on it, and we are doing our best that we can to facilitate the needs of our community in Ocean County and those that are less fortunate. Unfortunately, because of publicity lately, it's been more made public and because they have lost places to stay, they have located it near the library. We are working with the library as well. It's been an issue on-going for years and years. So don't think we're sitting up here idle, doing nothing. But I just want to make it clear we do not have any power over any mayor or any town. Thank you."

ANONYMOUS: "Put these two women in your committee. They'll get lots done." (laughter)

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Yes, Julie."

JULIE ADAMEK, 69 CEDAR GROVE ROAD, TOMS RIVER, NJ: "This does tie into the homeless but it's going to be a little bit of a different request. As we know our congressman that covers this county, Chris Smith, had voted in favor of the quote "Big Beautiful Bill." Well, one of the issues with that "Big Beautiful Bill" is cuts to Medicaid, cuts to SNAP, etcetera. That's going to have a profound impact in this particular county and it's going to decrease the safety net. Medicaid and SNAP benefits are a safety net that keep people's heads above water. They prevent, they help to prevent people ending up homeless. They keep people healthier. I'm just going to... I come from a healthcare background and I'm going to just tell you two real life stories just to drive this home to you when people lose health insurance and, in this case, if they were to lose Medicaid. One of them was a man that came in with a gangrene in his toe. He had no health insurance, and he immediately had to be sent to the emergency room to be admitted. He was then going to have a surgical intervention and lose his foot. Just think of the cost of that one person and the long-term consequences of that, having to then be treated by prosthetics. It's a lifelong disability. It affects his ability to work and be productive. The second person was a man in his fifties who came into a clinic situation with chest pain. He had that chest pain all night long. He was uninsured and presented to this clinic. He was having a heart attack during the course of the night. He immediately got transferred to the hospital by ambulance. And he later died at that hospital that same day because of the delay in seeking care. So, these are two people that I know first-hand, what happens when people do not have health insurance. So, you magnify that across the state. You magnify this across the country. So, if people are ... the other thing about Medicaid there are a lot of people, a lot of elderly in this county and across the country and they depend on Medicaid. They get coverage in nursing homes; they get coverage in home care. So that's going to be another detrimental effect. The end result of this when healthcare systems lose reimbursement, you have hospitals that end up closing because if they're not getting reimbursed you can't just sustain yourself on providing care to a lot of uninsured people in your community. It ends up causing hospitals to go out of business."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Thank you, Julie. Anyone else?"

LYNDA FOTE, 22 CRUISER COURT, TOMS RIVER: "Hello. I am, as you probably know, since this is our third visit here, the current President of the Ocean County Chapter of The National Organization for Women. I know you've heard about Medicaid and SNAP endlessly so I will not give you any more statistics. But I will tell you what we have been doing around this issue. We go out to a lot of the community festivals. And this year our petition there says "There are no acceptable cuts to funding or staffing for Medicaid, SNAP, Social Security, veteran's benefits, healthcare or public schools. These are the petitions from the Brick Green Fair. These are the petitions from the Barnegat Pride. These are the petitions from Lacey Township Doggie Derby Day. There would be some from Toms River Pride, but we got rained out. But we will be out at a lot more community festivals over the course of this year. And when we ask people if they want to sign a petition about these issues, honestly, I never get past Medicaid and SNAP before someone is grabbing the clipboard out of my hand, wanting to sign. Everybody who signs this is concerned about this issue. So, today I'm going to ask you, not for myself, and not for all the Ocean County NOW members who are here, but for all the people who signed this petition and all those who will, at the upcoming festivals to publicly tell (Congressman) Chris Smith and (Congressman) Jeff Van Drew that the first bill they voted for, they should go back and vote no on. That the current bill that's in the Senate that may go back to the House, they should vote no on. They need to do the right thing for the citizens of Ocean County. So, I would ask you if you are willing to do that, today."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "I think we've stated our positions, and we've said it in a ... all of us together but also separately that any legislation that is bad and harmful to the residents of Ocean County we're going to oppose."

LYNDA FOTE: "Okay. And I hope you keep calling them because July 4, (2025) seems to be the deadline for passing this legislation. So, time is of the essence here to get to them. These are going to them tomorrow, the next day to make them aware of how we feel about all of this. So, I hope you will call them as frequently as we have been calling them, to make sure they know that the citizens of Ocean County, not just you, not just us, but are really worried and concerned about what's going to happen if any version of this current bill passes. Thank you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Thank you, Lynda." (applause) Anyone...sure."

BARBARA CRYSTAL, 248 BULKHEAD AVENUE, MANAHAWKIN, NJ: "Good afternoon. I'm a retired Southern Regional High School teacher. I am again speaking in support of a resolution preserving Medicaid, NJ Family Care, and CHIP and SNAP programs. And to implore you to urge your CD2 (Congressional District) and CD4 Representatives to vote against the OBBBA (The Budget Reconciliation Bill). If passed this bill will be the largest transfer of wealth from the poor to the rich in recent history and will unnecessarily add trillions to our country's debt. This bill will strip working families of \$1.5 trillion in Medicaid, SNAP and other essential programs, all to pay for \$4.5 trillion in tax breaks for the super wealthy and corporations. Cruel measures in this bill include massive cuts to Medicaid and the Affordable Care Act, that could leave 15 million people without healthcare, denial of food assistance to more than 11 million people, denial of access to reproductive health care by defunding Planned Parenthood and by banning ACA (Affordable Care Act) plans from covering abortion care. Causing sky rocketing costs of home utility bills because of cuts to Clean Energy Investments. Denying working family's children, the opportunity to attend college due to the elimination of student loan programs and slashing of Pell Grant funding. The OBBBA will disproportionately harm children, seniors, veterans, the disabled, children who have aged out of foster care, people experiencing homelessness, pregnant moms, and others who are vulnerable. Millions will suffer and

many will die. If Congress removes just the estate tax giveaway for the wealthy that would eliminate the need to cut SNAP benefits. In Ocean County 169,000 residents are covered by Medicaid, 99,000 children are covered by Medicaid, 58,000 residents receive SNAP, and in New Jersey Medicaid covers 30% of New Jersey's births and 12 months of postpartum care for mothers and babies. Last Saturday in Washington D.C. \$45 million of our taxpayer funds were wasted on an unnecessary authoritarian, vanity driven, very poorly attended parade that damaged the streets of my hometown. Think of how many of our country's most vulnerable people could've been better served with that money. In Isaiah 58:7 we are told to feed the hungry and to house the homeless, not to pay tribute to a false idol. What happened to your unanimously voiced support of our proposed resolution to preserve Medicaid and SNAP at the end of the May 21, (2025) meeting? I left that meeting believing that you truly cared for your constituents and would advocate for the preservation of Medicaid and SNAP. Besides Commissioner Haines making the phone calls to our CD2 and CD4 Representatives you all walked back your support of our resolution. I posit that you have traded doing what you know is right in order to remain in political favor."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Thank you, Barbara."

BARBARA CRYSTAL: "May I please finish? That's not five minutes. No, that really wasn't five minutes. I just have ..."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "If you can just... please. Yes."

BARBARA CRYSTAL: "Thank you, sir, I appreciate that. Party line affiliation should not outweigh properly representing your constituents and acting for the greater good. Politically motivated in action could cause widespread harm. Martin Luther King Jr. once said, "There comes a time when one must take a position that is neither safe nor politic nor popular, but he must take it because conscience tells him it is right." Now is your time to decide whether you will do what is politically expedient or what is morally right for Ocean County, New Jersey, and our nation. I implore you to choose wisely. Thank you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Thank you."

BARBARA CRYSTAL: "Thank you, sir." (applause)

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Anyone else?"

WENDY MCCLURE, 1366 PAUL BOULEVARD, MANAHAWKIN, NJ: "I have something."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Sure."

WENDY MCCLURE: "I actually didn't plan on speaking today, but since you were talking about Georgian Court (University) and you were bringing up Double Trouble State Park, I believe that's the way you say it. Part of the budget bill, this latest version of it, is to sell off public lands and it's putting National Parks at risk and who knows what's going to happen to all of the other public lands, state owned lands, what have you. I just wanted to point out that, I don't think many people are talking about that aspect of it. And you're right these places are beautiful and wonderful and the opportunity to go to them is what's part of making this country great. So, I just wanted to make sure that everybody here knew that that is at risk as well with this horrible budget bill. Thank you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Thank you," (applause) Anyone else?"

DONALD CAMPBELL, 151 SANTA CRUZ ROAD, TUCKERTON: "I am very concerned about Medicaid cuts because I live with cerebral palsy. If you don't know what cerebral palsy is, it is a disability that gives you a really cool walk and it also affects how you write. So, Medicaid is essential for the people I work with. I also went to Law School in LA, and I am the Director of a non-profit that helps people with disabilities apply for Medicaid, apply for SNAP. And these programs are essential to keeping people with disabilities independent. Medicaid pays for people's aids. It pays for people's care attendants. It pays for people's day programs. It pays for services that keep people in the community and save taxpayer money. If the State cuts Medicaid, which ... if the Federal government cuts Medicaid which are planned in these bills, that trickles down to all these programs because our state relies on these Medicaid fundings. My center, along with twelve other centers like ours that keep people with disabilities independent, lost their line item in the State Budget. Why? Because the state's concerned about the Medicaid cuts that are coming down the pike. I know there's a lot of misinformation out there about it by the bill supporters saying this is about work requirements. Work requirements are a disaster. They cost money and their paperwork requirements for people to fill out... so what happens is people with disabilities like me end up losing their services. They also are going to increase the certifications. Oh, that sounds nice. Just fill out the paperwork. Again, the number one reason that I see people lose their Medicaid is because they have to keep filling up paperwork. They're already overwhelmed, and they're already stressed. Republicans have a long history of supporting people with disabilities. It was George H.W. Bush who signed the ADA (Americans Disability Act), George W. Bush signed the amendments to the ADA. Richard Nixon signed the 704 Act. Gerald Ford signed the IDEA (Individuals with Disabilities Education Act). Don't walk away from your principles because one guy became President. Supporting Medicaid is conservative. It's keeping people working. It's keeping people paying taxes. And we don't need big government, work requirements, paperwork requirements, that end up costing taxpayers' money and hiring more government workers to do something that they can have better effort of than finding ways to keep people on Medicaid. Medicaid saves people's lives which means its prolife and it saves people money. So, please I implore you, I know you think maybe this resolution doesn't matter but it's important for Republicans to stand up and say no, we are going to honor our legacy that George H.W. Bush

started, and we're going to honor conservative values and defend the people of Ocean County and defend people with disabilities, like me. So, thank you and I appreciate it." (applause)

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Thank you, Donald. Anyone else?"

FRANK OGRODOWSKI, JACKSON: "Hey, there. So, I'm going to be frank with you. I am quite disappointed that there's still no resolution about Medicaid on the agenda. I am up here now for a third time. The first two times I spoke about my little sister who has a disability and who relies heavily on Medicaid. This time I'm going to talk a little bit about the logic behind this bill. So, let's look at some quick facts here. First of all, the so called "Big Beautiful Bill" is very clear. It will cut Medicaid funding, \$880 billion over the next decade. There's no maybe about it. It's in there. There are many issues with this. But, just one is a fact, that those backing this bill claim that it is meant to cut fraud and waste. Now I know that just like I do, you all have experienced working with a budget. And I think we can all agree that this is not how you cut waste. If you want to cut waste, you cut a portion of the fraction of the budget to target that waste. Right? Precisely. Surgically. Cutting billions of dollars from the program at large doesn't do that. So, here's the thing, even if does cut out the waste, and kick people who are taking advantage of the system off the program, it's also going to be kicking a lot of people off who do need the program. It's not actually solving the problem. It's just creating a bigger problem. So, here's what we need. We need a resolution on the agenda, and we need to get it through. You need to use your voices. Okay. You need to do whatever you can to protect Medicaid. Being that you are in a position of power and have a platform, you have a duty to society at large to use that power and voice for good. Even if you denied that, you cannot deny that you have a duty to your constituents as the County Commissioners, your constituents in the county. So, let's please get a resolution going because you can say at these meetings that you support this, but putting it down in writing and putting your names on it, makes a huge difference. Thank you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Thank you, Frank. (applause) So that everybody is clear this is not something that the Board of Commissioners are trying to avoid. This is something that we want to do in a thoughtful, measured manner. Anybody can just vote on resolutions and set them up and then, basically say, okay we did our work. We wanted to ... and this is a little bit of a moving target, this is a bill that was passed by the House. It's still going through the Senate. It's still being discussed. We'd like to kind of have the final version or the likely version of the bill. See it, dive into it. We've done a lot of research. The fact that we don't talk about it up here doesn't mean that it's not on the radar as Commissioner Bacchione indicated. The homeless issue is with us. It's going to get worse. We've talked about it. And again, it's not a simple thing. The moment that we talk about putting that facility behind your neighborhood, you're going to show up here and say we don't want it in ... that's the fact of it. So, we're trying to again in a logical, measured manner, look at it, look at the facilities, see what's available, what resources are available to the county, to the non-profits that we work with. And it's on a daily basis we're discussing this and trying to come up with a solution. So, the fact that you don't hear about it it's not being advertised doesn't mean that we're not talking about it up here. Yes, ma'am."

COMMISSIONER BACCHIONE: "I also have been in contact with Congressman Smith and (Congressman) Van Drew and had discussions, but some of the petitions you had signed deal with things that come from the state. And the state ... the ... Governor Murphy has put us in for taking away money from our schools, that has been a huge issue and a lot of this is coming from what's happening within the State of New Jersey for several years now. Eight years Governor Murphy has been here. So, a lot of that is what we are looking into, that is not the "Big Beautiful Bill" but it's a matter of getting a new Governor in November."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Thank you. Okay."

ANONYMOUS: "What does that have to do with anything?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Alright. Let's move on."

RACHEL PEACE, COUNTY RESIDENT: "I'm a Brick Memorial Theater and Choir Alumni."

(Ms. Peace begins to play the background music to her song.)

Ms. Peace sings the following lyrics to her song "Where is your heart?":

Oh, oh la di dadada I don't believe your promise you'll keep. When you walk it back stalling high and I don't expect too much from the GOP but for God's sake, could you try. I know that we disagree on politics and party, but we all agreed what's right. Where is your heart? cause I don't really feel you. Where is your heart? At first, I found it in my mind to believe you. Now it's gotten hard to stand for unity in Ocean County that's all we're asking for. Oh, oh. This budget's so cold, community is reaching out for your hand, and I've always dreamed I'd live in a country where the tax that pays (inaudible) to help all those who are in need. Where is your heart? cause I don't really feel you. Where is your heart? Keep your words so we can believe you. Is it so hard to give us one need people all over parties all we're asking for. It seems so much is up to them, seems so much is up to them, up to our congressman but each and every one of you were elected to lead, in this room it's just you and me. I know that you really care. The question here is do you dare to fight powers who seek to divide. Please find your heart, I am here to beseech you. Please find your heart, show me that we can believe you. I know it's hard to prove you care and save healthcare, that's all we're asking for. Oh. Oh. Please find your heart.

"I have come here up. I have reasoned with you. I have given you data. I have taken my time to do deep research. I

have spoken to the Director at every Pre-Board Meeting, not just these Board meetings and we had a heated confrontation last week. I said to him I understand the data points are moving. I understand the bill is not locked in place. Since we are speaking about healthcare, can we not take the approach that an ounce of prevention is worth more than a dose of cure. Rather than trying to calculate how the county will be able to administer not just programs but make up for the millions in cuts to hospitals, which you don't have the budget for, staff nursing homes over 70 which you cannot do. We could simply have a very, very simple resolution. The people of Ocean County, the 150-plus Medicaid recipients, the 90,000-plus children who are on Medicaid, the 50,000-plus who are on SNAP. A BOND ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CAPITAL RENEWAL AND REPLACEMENT FACILITIES FY 2025 PROJECT AT OCEAN COUNTY COLLEGE LOCATED IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND APPROPRIATING THE AGGREGATE AMOUNT OF \$3,215,745, THEREFOR, INCLUDING SUPPORT FROM THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,607,872.50 PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER 12 P.L. 1971 AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN TO FINANCE THE SAME.

WHEREAS, on June 27, 2024 the Ocean County College Board of Trustees adopted a resolution approving various facility improvements at the Ocean County College (the "College") for fiscal year 2025, and

WHEREAS, on May 7, 2025 the Ocean County College Board of School Estimate approved the funding request of \$3,215,745 for fiscal year 2025 for the College facility improvements consisting of the renovation of existing buildings on the main campus to accommodate new educational programs to be offered by Ocean County College that require laboratories: Dental Hygiene, Radiography, and Veterinary Assistant; and

WHEREAS, the Ocean County Board of Commissioners, acting pursuant to the procedures to be used by Community Colleges of the State of New Jersey and to the Resolution of the Ocean County College Board of School Estimate, wishes to adopt a bond ordinance appropriating sums of money and authorizing the issuance of bonds for the above mentioned project.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING) AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That the improvements described in Section 2 of this Bond Ordinance are hereby authorized to be undertaken by the County of Ocean, New Jersey as general improvements. For the said improvements or purposes stated in Section 2, there is hereby appropriated the sum of money therein stated as the appropriation made for said improvements or purposes such sums amounting in the aggregate to \$3,215,745 and including State Support of Capital Projects for County Colleges (Chapter 12, P.L. 1971, as amended) in the amount of \$1,607,872.50 anticipated to be received from the State of New Jersey for the purposes described in Section 2 thereof.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared that the improvements or purposes, appropriation, and the amount of bonds or notes authorized and amount anticipated to be received as State Support of Capital Projects for County Colleges (Chapter 12, P.L. 1971, as amended) are as follows:

SECTION 3. That the sum of \$3,215,745 be and the same is hereby appropriated for the purposes stated in this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. There is hereby authorized the issuance of negotiable bonds in an aggregate principal amount of \$3,215,745 to finance the costs of the purposes stated in Section 2 hereof. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding the limit authorized by law, and the maturities, method of sale and other details thereof shall be determined by subsequent resolutions to be adopted in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 5. That in order to temporarily finance the purposes provided for in Section 2 hereof, there is hereby authorized the issuance of bond anticipation notes of said County in an aggregate principal amount of \$3,215,745. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the County Comptroller; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and shall be in such form as may be determined by the County Comptroller. The County Comptroller shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this Ordinance, and the County Comptroller's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-8.1. The County Comptroller is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale, and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The County Comptroller is directed to report in writing to the Board of Commissioners at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this Ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 6. The County reasonably expects to commence acquisition and/or construction of the improvements described in Section 2 hereof, and to advance all or a portion of the costs in respect thereof, prior to the issuance of bonds or notes hereunder. To the extent such costs are advanced, the County further reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this

bond ordinance, in an aggregate amount not to exceed the amount of bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof. This bond ordinance is intended to be a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 7. Any grant monies received for the purposes described in Section 2 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

SECTION 8. The amount of the proceeds of the obligations authorized by this Ordinance which may be used for the payment of interest on such obligations, architects' fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses, and other items as provided in N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-20 shall not exceed the sum of \$1,000,000.

SECTION 9. The Capital Budget of the County of Ocean is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. In the event of any such inconsistency and amendment, the resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended Capital Budget and Capital Program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners and is available there for public inspection.

SECTION 10. It is hereby found, determined and declared as follows:

A. The improvements or purposes described in Section 2 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses. They are improvements or purposes the County may lawfully undertake as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property benefited thereby.

B. The average period of usefulness of the improvements for which the obligations authorized by this Ordinance are to be issued is twenty (20) years.

C. The supplemental debt statement provided for in N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-10 was duly filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners prior to the passage of this Ordinance on first reading, and a complete executed duplicate of such supplemental debt statement has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey, and that such supplemental debt statement shows that the gross debt of the County as defined in N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-43 is increased by this Ordinance by \$3,215,745 and that the obligations authorized by this Ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

SECTION 11. In the event the monies set forth above for the purposes are not necessary for said purposes, then such monies shall be for the completion of any of the other purposes provided for in this Ordinance.

SECTION 12. The full faith and credit of the County of Ocean shall be pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds and notes authorized by this Ordinance, and as long as any of said bonds or notes are outstanding, an appropriation shall be included in each annual budget of the County hereafter adopted in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds or notes maturing in each year. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the County, and the County shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the County for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

After passage upon first reading of this Ordinance, the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners is hereby directed to publish the full text of the Ordinance, together with the notice set forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF PENDING ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-19, at least seven days prior to the date set for public hearing and further consideration for final passage (which date shall be at least ten days after introduction and first reading). The Clerk of the Board of Commissioners is further directed to comply with all provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-17(b) regarding postings, publications, and the provision of copies of this Ordinance.

SECTION 14. After final adoption of this Ordinance by the Board of Commissioners, the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners is hereby directed to publish the full text of this Ordinance, as finally adopted, together with the notice set forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-19.

WHEREAS, Monmouth has already entered into a Memorandum of Agreement with Middlesex County whereby Middlesex County has agreed to house Monmouth County juveniles in Middlesex County Youth Center; and

WHEREAS, there may be a need for Monmouth juveniles to be periodically detained in a facility other than the Middlesex County facility due to either a lack of space at Middlesex County facility or for other appropriate reason; and

WHEREAS, Ocean owns and operates a Juvenile Detention Center which is a high quality, licensed facility providing necessary and appropriate services and amenities; and

WHEREAS, Ocean is permitted under New Jersey Juvenile Justice Commission standards to house short-term commitment status juveniles up to but not exceeding sixty days (60); and

WHEREAS, there now exists a need to provide Detention Center placements for Monmouth County pre and/or post adjudicated juveniles to short-term commitments up to but not exceeding sixty (60) days; and

WHEREAS, Ocean has the capacity to house up to two (2) Monmouth County pre and/or post adjudicated juveniles on a constant basis and one (1) additional Monmouth County pre and/or post adjudicated juveniles on an as-needed basis; and

WHEREAS, providing for the care of Monmouth County juveniles in the Ocean County Detention Center will result in more economical operation of the Ocean County Detention Center and will result in a significant cost savings to Monmouth County through the sharing of the facility and services; and


WHEREAS, the staff, support groups and volunteers currently working with Monmouth County juveniles will have access to the Ocean facility; and

Director John P. Kelly opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Director Kelly and Mr. Jehnke reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the recommendation to award the Stormwater Management Improvements Contract 2024A in Various Townships to Earle Asphalt Company from Farmingdale, NJ in the amount of \$1,746,913.13. These improvements will take place in Beachwood, Brick Township, Jackson, South Toms River and Toms River. There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the May 21, 2025 Board meeting.

Commissioner Sadeghi and Mr. Agliata discussed the 2025 Boat Flare Disposal Program. On June 18, August 20, or October 22 residents can safely dispose of their expired boat flares by dropping them off at the Ocean County Training Center in Waretown, where they will be safely burned. Over 3,200 expired flares have been properly disposed of to date.

Mr. Agliata provided a recycling revenue update. Seventy-four thousand tons of recyclables have been collected from over 650,000 residents and 10 million tourists saving towns over \$6.2 million in landfill tipping fees. Also, 908 tons of special waste such as televisions and electronic devices were recycled. There are now 100 collection igloos

around the county. The total profit was \$1,960,737.08, which is shared with Atlantic Coast Recycling. The County's share was \$980,368.54. Of this total, \$490,184.27 was split with the municipalities.

Ms. Gunther reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of May 21, 2025. There were no questions or comments.

Director Kelly asked the Board members for comments.

Commissioner Bacchione mentioned that she has received many emails from residents commending the County Connection on their excellent service.

Commissioner Haines was proud to announce that NJ DAR (Daughters of the American Revolution) awarded scholarships to four high school students in Ocean County. One from Lakewood, two from Toms River North and one from Toms River South.

Mayor Mancini from Long Beach Township asked the County to support their efforts to urge the State to complete the road project on Route 72 before June 30, 2025. Mr. Jehnke will provide the letter to the State.

There were no additional comments.

Mr. Fiure mentioned that Ms. LaFace will be providing a resolution opposing President Trump's plan to modify the Older Americans Act, eliminating several critical aging programs.

Ms. Gunther read the resolution to move to closed session.

On a motion by Commissioner Haines, seconded by Commissioner Arace, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 4:27pm for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was unanimously carried.

The meeting returned to Open Session at 4:52pm. There being no further business, on a motion by Commissioner Bacchione, seconded by Commissioner Arace, the meeting adjourned at 4:52pm.
