Proclamation

WHEREAS, light pollution has scientifically established economic and environmental consequences which result in significant impacts on the ecology and human health of all communities; and

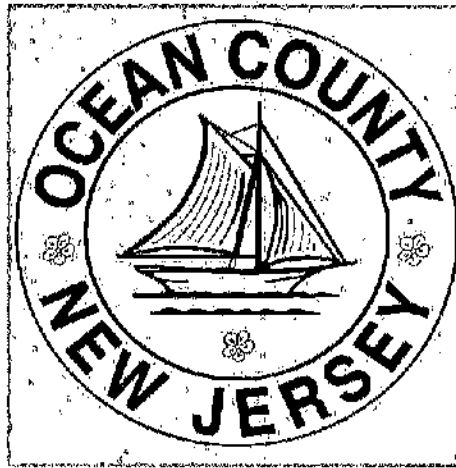

BUDGET MESSAGE

It has always been the policy of the Board of County Commissioners to provide quality services to the residents of the County while maintaining a stable tax rate for the taxpayers of the County. The 2024 County Budget has been developed with that theory in mind along with fiscal conservatism.

The formulation of the Budget was accomplished through a series of budget sessions with the assistance of the County Officials over a three month period. These sessions included budget conferences with various Departments and Agencies of the County.

With this 2024 County Budget, the Board of County Commissioners will decrease the tax rate to .282 cents per \$100 of equalized property value.

The budget totals \$565,044,510, up \$12.6 million.

The amount to be raised in taxation is \$455,897,751, up \$27,218,101.

The County will use \$37,500,000 from its surplus to support the 2024 Budget, \$1,000,000 less than it did in 2023.

With the passage of Chapter 78 of the Laws of 2011, local government units were required to institute specific formulas for the calculation of employee health benefit contribution. The formulas are based on the type of coverage, base salary and cost of coverage. The 2024 County Budget includes an appropriation for Group Insurance for Employees in the amount of \$58,638,041. This amount was derived by subtracting the estimated employee contribution to be collected of \$7,051,660 from the calculated cost of \$65,689,701.

2020 AND 2021 AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT - REVENUE REPLACEMENT CALCULATION

The American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) was signed into law by President Joe Biden on March 11, 2021. The law established the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF) program, affording state, local, and Tribal governments (recipients) with the opportunity to remediate the negative economic and public health impacts created and exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic.

The SLFRF program established seven (7) Expenditure Categories for which a recipient may allocate funds. Among these seven categories is "Revenue Replacement."

The County performed a revenue replacement calculation - as per the U.S. Department of Treasury's Final Rule - for fiscal years 2020 and 2021.

The County prepared the revenue loss documents in accordance with NJ Department of Community Affairs in order to arrive at the revenue loss figures for fiscal years 2020 and 2021.

The County's revenue loss was determined to be \$13,496,712 and \$26,491,681 in 2020 and 2021, respectively, as detailed below:

COUNTY OF OCEAN - 2024

The Ocean County Board of Commissioners, with the assistance of the County Administrator, Office of Management and Budget, County Engineer, County Planning Board and the County Comptroller, has developed this six-year Capital Improvement Program and Budget. The Capital Improvement Program was developed with the cooperation and consideration of recommendations of the various County Departments.

The County's continuing growth requires that the Board of Commissioners anticipates and plans for the increasing demands for County facilities and services. The Capital Improvement Program was prepared to guide County investment in land, facilities and equipment through 2029. The Program and Budget will be adjusted each year to reflect changing conditions including new Federal and State legislation, variations in the general economy, emerging demands of the public and modifications in the growth rate which may result in changes in revenue patterns and demand for new facilities or services. The Capital Improvement Program is realistic and attainable within the financial capabilities of the County and it provides for the future needs of Ocean County residents.

The accompanying forms which comprise the Capital Budget and six-year Capital Improvement Program have been completed in accord with regulations adopted by the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey pursuant to powers authorized by NJSA 52:27BB-10, NJSA 40A:4-43 to 45. The Capital Budget forms list all projects scheduled for startup for the 2024 Budget year and the source of funding for each project. A summary of Anticipated Funding Sources and Amounts is also included. Please note that this summary shows funding needed for new capital projects. It does not include previous appropriations for projects to be continued in 2024. For this reason, the funding summary differs slightly from the total cost shown for the Capital Program.

The total cost of all Capital Improvement Projects over the six-year period is \$318,731,956. Many of the projects will be funded under State and Federal Grant Programs or through the annual Budget on a "pay-as-you-go" basis. The larger projects will be funded by short-term borrowing. Bonds will be issued at the most advantageous times to secure low interest rates.

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a County shall limit any increase in the tax levy to 2.5% unless authorized by resolution to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's tax levy, subject to certain exceptions; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a County may, when authorized by resolution, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual tax levy and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its tax levy in either of the next two succeeding years; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the County of Ocean finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2024 tax levy by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final tax levy, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners hereby determines that a 3.5% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$2,462,698 in excess of the increase in the final tax levy otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the County of Ocean hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to the final tax levy in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Ocean, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2024 budget year, the final tax levy of the County of Ocean shall, in accordance with this resolution and N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$2,462,698, and that the CY 2024 County budget for the County of Ocean be approved and adopted in accordance with this resolution; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to the final tax levy in either of the next two succeeding years; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this resolution as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this resolution upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with the Director within 5 days of adoption.

RESOLUTION

April 3, 2024

WHEREAS, the Ocean County Board of Commissioners has repeatedly voiced strong opposition to increases in the state gasoline tax; and

WHEREAS, New Jersey is again poised to increase the gas tax to 50 cents - the 4th highest state gasoline tax in the nation; and

WHEREAS, this latest increase will burden Ocean County's nearly 100,000 daily commuters and more than 200,000 senior citizens with an additional financial hardship; and

WHEREAS, this increase comes on the heels of the state already hiking the tolls on the Garden State Parkway and NJ Turnpike and increasing NJ Transit fares by 15 percent; and

WHEREAS, Ocean County residents already pay a disproportionate amount of these toll and gasoline increases due to limited access to public transportation, forcing residents to rely on their personal vehicles; and

WHEREAS, Ocean County's commuters tend to travel a longer distance on the Parkway to reach their jobs than drivers in many other parts of the state; and

WHEREAS, the increase could also deter visitors from travelling to Ocean County, negatively impacting our \$7 billion tourism industry; and

WHEREAS, while the increase in the gas tax is expected to fund the state's Transportation Trust Fund, the Board of Commissioners have expressed their collective frustration that money collected from Ocean County residents often goes to urban areas of the state with only limited funding returning to our communities; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners has repeatedly called on the state to improve Route 9, which remains a two-lane road and very little changed in over a century; and

WHEREAS, Ocean County maintains more than 600 miles of County roads and more than 250 bridges and culverts - one of the largest road networks in the state - making it imperative that the state provide its fair share of funding to Ocean County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS, OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY continues to strongly oppose another increase to the gasoline tax and urges the State of New Jersey to explore all options to sufficiently fund the Transportation Trust Fund through existing sources of revenue without placing an additional burden on the taxpayers of Ocean County and the State of New Jersey.

For those County employees not represented by a majority representative, for the time period of July 1, 2024, or as soon as necessary approval from the State of New Jersey, Division of Pensions and Benefits can be obtained, through December 31, 2024, the following changes to health insurance shall occur:
 - A. The baseline health/prescription plan for employees shall be the 20/35 plan.

- B. Employees will contribute towards the cost of their health/prescription coverage based upon the SHBP announced rate for the 20/35 health/prescription plan in accordance with the Chapter 78 contribution rates.
 - C. The County will fund up to \$15,120 into an HRA account for each employee enrolled in 20/35 baseline plan, regardless of the employee's level of coverage (single, member/spouse, parent/child, or family.)
 - D. In the event the HRA is discontinued, an employee shall have the ability to enroll in the SHBP plan which the employee was eligible to be enrolled on June 30, 2024, provided such SHBP plan exists, and subject to any required contributions in accordance with the Chapter 78 rates. If the SHBP plan which the employee was eligible to be enrolled on June 30, 2024, does not exist at the time of the discontinuation of the HRA, the employee will be eligible for any other SHBP plan so in existence, subject to contributions based upon the Chapter 78 rates.
3. Should the State of New Jersey, Division of Pensions and Benefits prohibit the County's utilization of a Health Reimbursement Account as set forth above, the County shall either rescind this Resolution or seek to make changes to obtain approval from the State of New Jersey, Division of Pensions and Benefits.
4. Certified copies of this Resolution shall be made available to the County Administrator, County Auditor, Chief Financial Officer, County Counsel, Employee Relations, any applicable majority representative, and any other person requesting it.

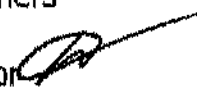

Director Barbara Jo Crea opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Commissioner Haines and Mr. Agliata provided the Board with a recap of the Natural Lands Trust Fund Acquisitions for 2023. There were 24 properties approved totaling 427.78-acres, and 38 properties closed with \$29,647,700.00 in funds allocated. Breton Woods, the Florence T. Allen Extension II (Blackbeard's Cave), and Fleming (Cedar Creek Campground) were some of the most noteworthy acquisitions from 2023. There are 29,822.46-acres preserved, representing 60% of Ocean County.

The Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee has recommended the acquisition of a 0.17-acre property located on Radio Road in Little Egg Harbor Township adjacent to and providing access to a 31-acre Natural Lands property known as Osborn Island North. The property owner accepted a negotiated offer of \$70,000.00. The NLTFAC has also recommended the acceptance of a 50-acre donation property from Berkeley Township located off Route 9 Atlantic City Boulevard in Berkeley. This property is adjacent to the 745-acre NLT property known as New Jersey Pulverizing.

Mr. Fiure and Commissioner Sadeghi have been discussing setting up a committee to review and update some of the County policies. This is routinely done as necessary. Some are required by law, others based on need. The Committee would be comprised of members from Administration, Risk Management, Finance, Information Technology, as

well as representatives from our sister agencies as well. This topic will be discussed at the April 10, 2024 PreBoard meeting.

Commissioner Kelly and Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the recommendation to advertise for the Construction of the Barnegat Branch Trail Phase IX, No. II, Admiral Avenue to South Main Street and Herflicker Boulevard in Beachwood and South Toms River. Mr. Ernst also discussed the recommendation to award the reconstruction of Manchester Avenue (CR 10) and Western Boulevard (CR 85)/Haines Street signalized intersection in Lacey Township to South State Inc. from Bridgeton, NJ in the amount of \$797,000.00. The Engineering Department has been meeting with mayors of each municipality to identify project requests such as assistance with flooding, and other various issues. There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the March 20, 2024 Board meeting.

Ms. Gunther reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of March 20, 2024. There were no questions or comments.

Director Crea asked the Board members for comments.

Commissioner Kelly stated that Route 9 improvements were discussed at the NJTPA meeting he attended on March 11, 2024. Commissioner Kelly had a productive meeting with the Commissioner of DOT. They are trying to work through Right of Way issues with buildings set too close to the traffic lanes. The Commissioner and NJTPA will be applying for federal funding, are moving toward constructing a plan to begin the reconstruction, while considering a plan to reroute traffic during various phases of construction.

There were no additional comments.

Mr. Fiure notified the Board that he will be adding two resolutions opposing State funding cuts for Ocean County College and large school districts. Ocean County College may lose \$1.2 million while large public school districts may lose even more.

Ms. Gunther read the resolution to move to closed session.

On a motion by Commissioner Kelly, seconded by Commissioner Quinn, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 4:37pm for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was unanimously carried.

The meeting returned to Open Session at 4:58pm. There being no further business, on a motion by Commissioner Haines, seconded by Commissioner Kelly, the meeting adjourned at 4:58pm.
