WHEREAS, on September 17, 1787, the U.S. Constitution was signed by 39 delegates to the Constitutional Convention in Philadelphia's Independence Hall including four men from New Jersey - William Livingston, David Brearly, William Paterson and the youngest delegate to sign, Jonathan Dayton; and

WHEREAS, with this document, the Nation's Forefathers established a government that derives its power from the consent of the American people, forming a remarkably resilient structure that balances necessary authority with inherent freedoms, national unity with inalienable rights, and Federal interests with State powers; and

WHEREAS, in setting this foundation, the Founders also recognized the potential for necessary change by including a constitutional amendment process which has proven to be a vitally important mechanism for achieving equality and fairness for all citizens; and

WHEREAS, the law establishing the present holiday was created in 2004 with the passage of an amendment by Senator Robert Byrd renaming the holiday known as "Citizenship Day" as "CONSTITUTION DAY" and mandates that all publicly funded educational institutions and federal agencies provide educational programming on the history of the American Constitution on that day; and

WHEREAS, CONSTITUTION WEEK, an American observance to commemorate the adoption of the United States Constitution, was officially enacted on August 2, 1956 by President Dwight D. Eisenhower from a congressional resolution petition by the Daughters of the American Revolution and will be celebrated this year during the week of September 17-23, 2019.

REFUNDING BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE REFUNDING OF ALL OR A PORTION OF VARIOUS SERIES OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS, APPROPRIATING AN AMOUNT **EXCEED** \$66,600,000 THEREFOR NOT TO AUTHORIZING THE **ISSUANCE** OF GENERAL OBLIGATION REFUNDING BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN FOR FINANCING THE COST THEREOF

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 et seq., the County of Ocean, New Jersey (the "County") has heretofore issued, inter alia, (i) \$45,300,000 aggregate principal amount of General Improvement Bonds, Series 2009 (the "Series 2009 Bonds"), (ii) \$30,800,000 aggregate principal amount of General Improvement Bonds, Series 2010 (the "Series 2010 Bonds"), (iii) \$39,005,000 aggregate principal amount of General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2010 (the "Series 2010 Refunding Bonds") and (iv) \$15,000,000 aggregate principal amount of General Improvement Bonds (Ocean County College – Gateway Building Project), Series 2010 (the "Series 2010 Gateway Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Chosen Freeholders has determined that it is in the best interest of the County to refund all or a portion of the Series 2009 Bonds, the Series 2010 Bonds, the Series 2010 Refunding Bonds and the Series 2010 Gateway Bonds;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The County is hereby authorized to (i) refund all or a portion of (A) the taxable maturities of the Series 2009 Bonds maturing on August 1 of the years 2020, 2027 and 2029 (such bonds constituting Build America Bonds (Direct Pay)), (B) the taxable maturities of the Series 2010 Bonds maturing on August 1 of the years 2020 through 2030, inclusive (such bonds constituting Build America Bonds (Direct Pay)), (C) the Series 2010 Refunding Bonds

maturing on August 1 of the years 2020 through 2023, inclusive, and (D) the Series 2010 Gateway Bonds maturing on December 1 of the years 2020 through 2024, inclusive, and 2026 through 2030, inclusive (collectively, the "Refunded Bonds"); and (ii) provide for the payment of the costs of issuance (including printing, advertising, accounting, financial and legal services, and further including bond insurance premium (if any) and underwriting compensation).

Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the purpose described in Section 1 hereof, negotiable general obligation refunding bonds (the "Refunding Bonds") are hereby authorized to be issued, in one or more series and on a tax-exempt and/or taxable basis, in the principal amount not to exceed \$66,600,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law.

Section 3. An aggregate amount not exceeding \$400,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-51(b) has been included in the aggregate principal amount of Refunding Bonds authorized herein.

Section 4. The purposes for which the Refunding Bonds are to be issued are (i) to refund the Bonds to be Refunded so as to effect an interest cost savings for the County and (ii) to provide for the payment of the costs of issuing the Refunding Bonds (including printing, advertising, accounting, financial and legal services, and further including bond insurance premium (if any) and underwriting compensation).

Section 5. Certain of the Refunded Bonds may be called for redemption prior to maturity, as provided by subsequent resolution of the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County. If provided by subsequent resolution of the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County, all or a portion of the proceeds from the sale of the Refunding Bonds shall be deposited in one or more sinking funds in trust to provide for the payment and retirement of the Refunded Bonds. Any moneys in any such sinking fund may be invested as provided in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-60, and

any moneys in excess of the amounts required for such purpose may be used for any lawful purpose of the County.

Section 6. Further provisions as to the terms of sale, deposit, securing, regulation, investment, reinvestment, disposition or application of the proceeds of the refunding bonds, and any matters in connection therewith, shall be determined by resolution of the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County adopted prior to the issuance of the Refunding Bonds.

Section 7. All other matters relating to the Refunding Bonds shall be performed or determined by subsequent resolution of the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County, or the performance or determination thereof shall be delegated by resolution of the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County to the Chief Financial Officer of the County.

Section 8. The full faith and credit of the County are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this refunding bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the County, and the County shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the County for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 9. A certified copy of this refunding bond ordinance as adopted on first reading has been filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey prior to final adoption, together with a complete statement in the form prescribed by the Director and signed by the chief financial officer of the County as to the indebtedness to be financed by the issuance of the Refunding Bonds authorized herein.

Section 10. This refunding bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law, provided that,

except for refunding bonds issued in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:2-51(c), this refunding bond ordinance shall not be effective as to any refunding bonds unless the consent of the Local Finance Board has been endorsed upon a certified copy of this refunding bond ordinance as finally adopted.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Indemnity and Trust Agreement and such other documents signifying membership in the Fund as are required by the Fund's by-laws shall become effective only upon the approval by the Fund, the passage by the Ocean County Board of Chosen Freeholders of a Resolution Accepting Assessment and approval by the New Jersey Department of Banking and Insurance and Department of Community Affairs as may be required by all applicable law.

RESOLUTION September 18, 2019

WHEREAS, in the early 1950's racial segregation in public schools was the norm across America; and

WHEREAS, all schools in a given district were supposed to be equal, but most black schools were far inferior to their white counterparts; and

WHEREAS, in Topeka, Kansas, a black third grader named Linda Brown had to walk one mile through a railroad switch yard to get to her black elementary school, even though a white elementary school was only seven blocks from her home; and

WHEREAS, Linda's Father, Oliver Brown tried to enroll her in the white elementary school, but was refused; and

WHEREAS, the NAACP filed suit in the U.S. District Court arguing that segregated schools sent the message to black children that they were inferior to whites; therefore, the schools were inherently unequal; and

WHEREAS, the judges agreed, but due to an 1896 precedent case "Plessy vs. Ferguson" that condoned "separate but equal facilities", they ruled with the Board of Education; and

WHEREAS, the NAACP appealed to the U.S. Supreme Court and combined with other cases in South Carolina, Virginia, and Delaware that all challenged segregation; and

WHEREAS, on May 17, 1954, Chief Justice Earl Warren read the unanimous decision of the Court overturning "Plessy vs. Ferguson" and ruled in favor of the plaintiffs, thereby requiring desegregation of schools across America; and

WHEREAS, this groundbreaking case provided the legal foundation of the civil rights movement of the 1960's.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS of the COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY that the decision, Brown vs. Board of Education of Topeka, May 17, 1954, by the United States Supreme Court is hereby commemorated and applauded on its 65th Anniversary.

Anthony Agliata spoke about two Open Space Acquisitions. The first is a 0.50-acre property in Berkeley Township. The property is adjacent to 6 acres of existing Natural Lands Trust Fund Property with a portion of Jeffries Creek running through it. The asking price was \$75,000, and the accepted negotiated price for the property is \$12,000.00. The Ocean County Agriculture Development Board has recommended the acquisition of the 9.77-acre Fleischer Farm located in Toms River. The appraised value of the property was \$1,200,000, the landowner accepted a negotiated price of \$1,025,850. Toms River has supported this acquisition by resolution.

Deputy Director Kelly notified the Board of the 2019 Bond Sale. \$38,800,000 in Bonds is for projects such as the Western garage facilities, road and bridge reconstruction Members of the Board of Chosen Freeholders August 19, 2019 Summary of the Pre-Board meeting of August 14, 2019 Page 2

Resource Building, and the Chestnut Street Facility. Also, the State Chapter 12 project for OCC where the County and State of NJ are equally sharing in the \$7,800,000 cost for the new student center. Julie Tarrant said the Bond Sale will be held on September 5, 2019. The rating agencies Moody's and Fitch have been provided with the necessary information and documentation to rate the County. Ratings are anticipated to be received by August 20, 2019, and the County is expected to retain it's AAA Bond rating. Results of the sale shall be supplied to the Board once the sale is complete.

Information Technology Director John Vollmann and Frank DeMarzo, Law Enforcement Division Director presented the Board with a Power Point Presentation on the status of various IT projects throughout the County. **Presentation Attached**

Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda. There were no questions or comments and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the August 21, 2019 Board meeting.

Ms. Cilento reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of August 21, 2019. There were no questions or comments.

Freeholder Director Haines asked the Board members for comments.

There were no additional comments.

Mr. Block notified the Board of the status of the Ocean County Board of Social Services project. The contract for site design was awarded to French and Parello, who is doing preliminary testing now. Four Architectural firms submitted proposals for the 125,000 square foot building. Three firms were interviewed on August 6th and 7th, 2019. Carl Block, Mike Fiure, Freeholder Director Haines, and Freeholder Quinn rated the firms and made recommendations to award the bid to Mott Mac Donald upon Board approval. Freeholder Vicari expressed his concerns for the project, but has agreed to the recommendation. Freeholder Haines mentioned that three very competent firms made presentations, but Hatch Mott McDonald was most impressive.

Ms. Cilento read the resolution to move to closed session.

On a motion by Freeholder Kelly, seconded by Freeholder Vicari, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 4:41pm for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was unanimously carried.

Completed Projects

Spillman – A dispatch application that was requested by the Sheriff to replace the existing New World System for 911 center. Spillman system went live in June of 2016. In July of 2019 the yearly upgrade was completed. Over the last couple of months several agencies have been added. Currently 11 law enforcement agencies 3 of which are 911 Dispatch Centers, 3 Fire Departments and 3 First Aid Departments have been added to the system.

Board of Social Services (BOSS) – Ocean County IT Department has recently assisted BOSS by implementing new circuits, switches, servers, connection to the State and migrating to Office365 email. This was needed since the State is no longer providing this service to BOSS. OCIT staff are providing BOSS IT staff with required training to support their own infrastructure. OCIT will be assisting with building the network in their new building at 1027 Hooper Ave

Black Creek – This system is the proprietary security system used to operate the jail. A recent upgrade of the system is now complete and Corrections is on the most current version. This upgrade replaced an older version that was approaching end of life and running on older technology.

Upgrading VM Servers – This project is to upgrade Ocean County servers. Several of the existing servers were outdated and running on unsupported versions of software. The vendor and Network team have completed the upgrade to the new VM's (virtual machines/servers).



Projects In Progress

Windows 10 Upgrade – all Ocean County PCs are in the process of being upgraded to Windows 10. Microsoft has set January 14, 2020 as the end date of support for Windows 7.

Bluestone – A comprehensive system that was chosen by and purchased by Surrogates Office to include data sharing, content management, data and file captures, workflows, document management and archiving. This system is used by several counties in the State and provides an interface to the State archiving system. Installation of the system is in progress and the vendor is currently working on form conversion. Go-live to be based on form completion.

Records Inventory Management System (RIMs) – A new Archives system that was chosen by the Finance Office has been implemented and provides an interface to Artemis (NJ State Records Retention and Disposition Management System) for records destruction approvals. The system is now in production and used by all departments. As the system is being used we are identifying and implementing additional use cases. We are currently working on incorporating large documents for Engineering and Planning.

Kronos & Telestaff – Upgrades of existing time and scheduling systems are in progress and it is being moved to the Cloud with a tentative go-live in early December. This will bring Ocean County up to the most current version. Ocean County is currently operating on a version that is behind 4 versions.



Projects In Progress (Continued)

Phone System Upgrade – Avaya has announced several components of the existing phone system will be end of life in 2019 this includes the base and the handsets. Due to this announcement we are currently in the process of upgrading the phone system. While implementing this upgrade we are also completing cutover to the newer circuits which was a project started several years ago but not completed.

DAVINCI- is a project that has been completed and involved a review of all circuits. Is a project that has been completed and involved a review of all circuits in the entire county system. Several circuits were replaced with newer, faster, cheaper and mostly fiber circuits resulting in a cost saving for the county.

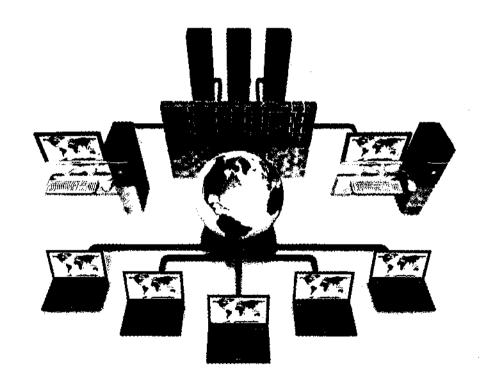
In Progress Projects Con't

SharePoint – Microsoft SharePoint will provide a new platform for migrating the remaining Ocean County in-house applications from the older Lotus notes system. Microsoft will be leading the build of the environment and implementing a new Ocean County Intranet portal for County employees. With the move to Outlook email from Lotus server we need to migrate the Lotus application to SharePoint.

Manchester Complex – This is a long term project and end goal is to relocate all backup and disaster recovery systems to the data center with current industry standards to assist the County in meeting their Continuity of Operations Plan (COOP). Currently Ocean County IT Department has implemented circuits, switches and phone equipment to connect the Manchester Complex to the network. With these connections in place several of the staff for the Road Department have been relocated to their new offices in the new garage.

Data Backup & Storage – This project is to provide the County with a single backup system and provide additional data storage. The system which is currently in process of being installed is the Dell EMC Avamar. The system provides fast, efficient data backup and recovery through a complete software and hardware solution.
