WHEREAS, the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office is instituting every effort to prevent pill abuse and theft by having Ocean County residents purge their homes of potentially dangerous expired, unused, and unwanted prescription drugs; and

WHEREAS, everyone is encouraged to look through their medicine cabinets and properly dispose of all outdated and unused medications and bring them for disposal to Holiday City at Berkeley Club House 2, located at 631 Jamaica Blvd, Toms River, NJ 08757, on May 2, 2017, from 10 am until 12 noon; and

WHEREAS, this initiative addresses a vital public safety and health issue and intended to protect the environment and our society from improper use and distribution of prescription drugs; and

WHEREAS, medicines that are left or forgotten in our home medicine cabinets are highly susceptible to diversion, misuse and abuse. Various studies show that a majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, often from home medicine cabinets, therefor "Spring Cleaning" should be conducted on an annual basis; and

WHEREAS, flushing prescriptions drugs or other medicines down the toilet or throwing them in the trash pose potential safety and health hazards as well; and

WHEREAS, to date, the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office has already collected and destroyed a total of 22,380 pounds of various prescription/drugs between October 3, 2014 and March 1, 2017.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JOSEPH H. VICARI, DIRECTOR of the BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS of the COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, on behalf of this Board, hereby proclaim, May 2, 2017, as:

and encourage all citizens to clean out their medicine cabinets and take part in this worthy endeavor for the betterment of our community.

ORDINANCE #2017-3

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A PROJECT CONSISTING OF THE RECONSTRUCTION AND RESURFACING OF CERTAIN COUNTY ROADS, PHASE II, ALL LOCATED IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND APPROPRIATING \$3,000,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$2,850,000 IN BONDS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN TO FINANCE THE SAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING) AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The following is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the County of Ocean as a

general improvement: a project consisting of the reconstruction and resurfacing of certain county roads, phase

II, all in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, in accordance with plans and specifications on file in the

Ocean County Engineering Department, including all else necessary therefor and incidental thereto.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared that the improvements or purposes, the

estimated cost of the improvements and appropriation therefor, down payment and estimated maximum amount

of bonds or notes authorized are as follows:

A project consisting of the reconstruction and resurfacing of certain county roads, phase II, all in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey

SECTION 3. There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$3,000,000, including the sum of \$150,000 as the down payment, for the improvements or purposes described in Section 1 hereof as required by the Local Bond Law. The down payment has been made available by virtue of provision in the Capital Improvement Fund of the County of Ocean in one or more previously adopted budgets.

SECTION 4. There is hereby authorized the issuance of negotiable bonds in an aggregate principal amount of \$2,850,000 to finance part of the cost of the purposes stated in Section 1 hereof. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding the limit authorized by law, and the maturities, method of sale and other details thereof shall be determined by subsequent resolutions to be adopted in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 5. In order to temporarily finance the purposes provided for in Section 1 hereof, there is hereby authorized the issuance of bond anticipation notes of said County in an aggregate principal amount of \$2,850,000. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the County Comptroller; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond

anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and shall be in such form as may be determined by the County Comptroller. The County Comptroller shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this Ordinance, and the County Comptroller's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8.1. The County Comptroller is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The County Comptroller is directed to report in writing to the Board of Chosen Freeholders at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this Ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 6. The County reasonably expects to commence acquisition and/or construction of the improvements described in Section 1 hereof, and to advance all or a portion of the costs in respect thereof, prior to the issuance of bonds or notes hereunder. WHEREAS, the parcels of property currently identified for tax purposes as Block 99.02, Lots 1.06, 1.07 and 1.08 (formerly Block 99.02, Lots 1 and 1.01) in the Borough of Seaside Heights, County of Ocean (the "Property") are owned and administered by the Borough as part of the Seaside Heights Borough Public Beach; and

WHEREAS, through the Borough's acceptance of Green Acres funding under Green Acres Project #1526-96-080, the Property is encumbered by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection ("NJDEP") as unfunded parkland with restrictions against disposal or diversion from recreation and conservation purposes ("Green Acres restrictions"); and

WHEREAS, on July 9, 2015, the Borough filed a State House Commission diversion application (New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection SHC File #1527002) requesting approval to release the Green Acres restrictions from 1.373 acres +/- of then-Block 99.02 Lots 1 and 1.01 (the "Disposal Area"), as part of an exchange of land and other consideration with the owners of Casino Pier (a private amusement pier extending off of the Borough's boardwalk) in order to preserve the historic Dr. Floyd L. Moreland Dentzel/Loof Carousel (the "Historic Carousel"), secure a vacant property that can in the future house the Carousel for the public's benefit, and allow the expansion of the Casino Pier (which was partially destroyed as a result of Superstorm Sandy); and

WHEREAS, the Borough subdivided former Block 99.02, Lots 1 and 1.01 into current Block 99.02, Lots 1.06, 1.07 and 1.08 by deed recorded March 1, 2016 in Deed Book 16329, Page 239 at the Office of the Ocean County Clerk (and by corrected Deed recorded May 12, 2016 in Deed Book 16391, Page 79); and

preservation, for public use, of the Historic Carousel and (3) the housing of the Historic Carousel on either a portion of the Replacement Lands or elsewhere on or adjacent to the Borough's public boardwalk; and

WHEREAS, the Replacement Lands consist of two parcels: (1) a 0.752-acre +/- parcel located along the public boardwalk in Seaside Heights Borough, Ocean County (Block 56, Lots 1, 3, 7 and 9), to be held by the Borough (Replacement Parcel #1) and 2) approximately 67.171 acres located adjacent to Winding River Park in Toms River Township, Ocean County (Block 409 Lot 20.02), to be held by the County (Replacement Parcel #2); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Chosen Freeholders of Ocean County has reviewed, is familiar with and has agreed to the terms and conditions of the proposed Green Acres Release and Compensation Agreement.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, as follows:

- 1. The Freeholder Director, Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders, and other County officials are authorized to take all actions necessary to implement this resolution, including but not limited to the execution of the Release and any other documents requested by the NJDEP and/or the Green Acres Program to implement the terms and conditions of the Approvals.
- 2. The County, in cooperation with the Borough (collectively, the "Local Units") agrees to comply with the terms and conditions of the Approvals, as memorialized in the Release, to the extent they apply to the County, including, but not limited to taking the following actions with respect to Replacement Parcel # 2 (Block 409 Lot 20.02 in Toms River Township, Ocean County):
 - a. The County shall impose Green Acres restrictions on Replacement Parcel #2 through a deed of restriction to be executed no later than 90 days after the recording of the Release and Compensation Agreement. The deed language imposing Green Acres restrictions on Replacement Parcel #2 is subject to Green Acres Program review and approval.
 - b. Replacement Parcel #2 shall be classified by the NJDEP as Green Acresencumbered unfunded parkland and shall be listed on any future Recreation and Open Space Inventory ("ROSI") prepared by the County in connection with Green Acres Program Planning Incentive Project Number 1500-01-047 or its next receipt of Green Acres funding for an individual acquisition or development project, whichever is sooner.
- 3. The County acknowledges that the Local Units must ensure ongoing compliance with the terms and conditions of the Approvals, and that any failure of the Local Unit(s) to comply with the Approvals (as applicable to either the Borough or the County) will require the Local Unit(s) to obtain additional NJDEP and State House Commission approvals for the noncompliance, and will render the Local Unit(s) ineligible for Green Acres funding until the noncompliance is resolved.

Freeholder Director Joseph H. Vicari opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Tarrant, Comptroller/CFO John N. Ernst, County Engineer Christine Wioland, Deputy Clerk of the Board Donna Flynn, Director, Public Information John C. Sahradnik, Jr., County Counsel

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Director Vicari stated that he was optimistic the County will receive NJ Department of Transportation (NJDOT) grants for two projects at the Ocean County Airport. The first project is crack repairs at the hangar parking lot area in the amount of \$1.2 million. The second project is for the construction of a taxi lane for future t-hangars. This project will begin next month at a cost of \$1.18 million. The Director noted that both of these projects are part of the Airport Master Plan. David McKeon, Planning Director, was in attendance and noted that these grants are a little different. The grant process is a competitive process. Mr. McKeon noted that the parking apron for airplanes was updated about ten years ago, and this project is for serious crack repairs. The funding for this project from the NJDOT would be between 90-92 percent. Mr. McKeon stated that the new taxiway project is for new

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pavement off the taxiway to provide access to a new t-hanger facility which will house planes. Mr. McKeon stated that there is a high demand for t-hangars at the Airport. The new t-hangar facility is scheduled for construction in the spring. Mr. McKeon advised that both of these projects are consistent with the Airpark Master Plan and in agreement with the approval from the Pinelands for the development of the Airport. Director Vicari stated that the County has a waiting list for t-hangars and that the hangars will be filled as soon as the project is completed. The t-hangars are a revenue source. This will be listed for the Board agenda.

Director Vicari stated that a comprehensive blueprint for the future of County roadways in Northern Ocean County is underway. The Director also stated that municipalities will have input which is very important. Freeholder Kelly stated that on the agenda, the County will award a contract to Stantec Consulting Services for the consulting services for the Northern Ocean County Traffic Study. The Freeholder noted that the traffic study will include the northern towns in the County and look at traffic congestion in the areas focusing on County roads but the consultant will also look at municipal and State roads as well. Freeholder Kelly advised that the County met with Jackson Township today and has already met with Lakewood Township. Meetings are scheduled with Toms River Township and Brick Township next week. The Freeholder asked Mr. Ernst to provide the Board with an overview of what the study will look at and noted that the County will meet and work with them throughout the study.

Mr. Ernst stated that this study came about through the result of the Route 9 Corridor Study that North Jersey Transportation Association prepared. He noted that the County is seeing an uptick for planning applications in the northern part of the County. Stantec Consulting Services will be obtaining traffic counts primarily on County and State roads to see where the County is having issues with traffic and forecasting traffic for 2025 and 2040 as thresholds for looking at the traffic counts. Mr. Ernst stated that the meeting with municipalities will review where the municipalities see their trends for development. It is the goal of the plan to have several meetings with municipalities throughout the duration of the study to keep them in the process to address areas that they feel need to be reviewed. Mr. Ernst stated that this will be a comprehensive study to evaluate the northern part of the County to see where the County needs to make improvements.

Director Vicari stated that Ocean County has the largest road system in the State of New Jersey with several growth areas. The County will look at populations and peak seasons, noting that the County's population varies at different time of the year. The Director noted that this will be part of the study and plan. Freeholder Kelly stated that the growth patterns have increased in the last ten years and is projected to grow much more in the next ten years and the County needs to make the roads work together. The Freeholder noted that the most expansive growth right now is in Lakewood Township which will impact surrounding municipalities. Freeholder Kelly also noted that several major changes have occurred to Parkway exits in recent years and the study will address those changes. The County needs to take action and develop a plan that will work. their own plan, and the County needs to see what the growth is going to be. The Director stated that New Jersey has home rule and this will be part of the County's study.

Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda. There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the agenda for the February 2, 2017 Board meeting.

Ms. Vasil reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of February 1, 2017. There were no questions or comments.

Director Vicari asked the Board members for comments.

Freeholder Haines stated that she attended the swearing in of the President and noted that it was a very nice event.

Freeholder Little advised that all departments working the storm are prepared for the event. The Road Department is doing a yeoman's job with the preparation for the storm as well as during the storm Friday. The Freeholder thanked all the departments which included the Sheriff, Parks Department and Buildings and Grounds. Director Vicari stated that the County was very fortunate during the Friday event that no County buildings had major damages. The Director noted that the County never closes, it is a 24/7 operation.

There were no additional comments.

Director Vicari asked the Administrator for comments during Open Session. The Administrator had no comments for Open Session.

Ms. Vasil read the resolution to move to closed session.

On a motion by Freeholder Kelly, seconded by Freeholder Haines, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 4:25 PM for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was unanimously carried.

Freeholder Director Joseph H. Vicari opened the meeting at 4:03 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Tarrant, Comptroller/CFO John N. Ernst, County Engineer Christine Wioland, Deputy Clerk of the Board Donna Flynn, Director, Public Information John C. Sahradnik, Jr., County Counsel

Director Vicari stated that many years ago Peter McLean came before the Board of Chosen Freeholders and suggested a pump out boat program and now the County is in its 20th season with the largest fieet in the State. The Director stated Ocean County helps protect Barnegat Bay through its Pump-Out Boat Program. The County works in partnership with the OCUA, Brick Township, Seaside Park and Tuckerton Seaport to keep sewage out of the National Estuary and the Director noted that 1.4 million gallons of effluent would have been discharged into the Bay without this program. Director Vicari also noted that there is no charge to use the boats. This program is through the Clean Vessel Act. The Director advised that the County now has seven boats and the program runs from Memorial Day through October each year. Director Vicari noted that Freeholder Haines introduced

legislation years ago to provide for this program to keep Barnegat Bay clean and as pristine as possible.

Freeholder Haines advised that after the storm of '92, funds were dedicated for shore protection and part of those funds included pump-out boats. The Freeholder noted that at one time, and perhaps even today, it was the number one license plate sold in New Jersey. Freeholder Haines also noted that a graduate of Toms River High School South designed the license plate. Director Vicari stated that VHF Channel 9 is the radio station for the pump-out boats. David McKeon, Planning Director, stated that the Captains are gearing up for Memorial Day and the agreements need to be in place. Freeholder Little asked if any other counties have pump-out boat programs. Mr. McKeon advised that Monmouth County has one boat through their health department. Mr. McKeon also noted that the towns hire the employees and take care of the insurance and maintenance. The pump-out boat agreements will be listed for the Board meeting of February 15, 2017.

Director Vicari stated that a press conference was held two weeks ago with the Commissioner of the NJ Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP), Bob Martin and representatives that oppose what the federal government wants to do regarding reducing quotas for flounder. Director Vicari stated that he recently met with Tom Fote, an advocate for fisherman who is very knowledgeable on the subject. The Director stated that he wrote to the US Department of Commerce opposing the rule by the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration Fisheries to reduce the commercial quotas and recreational limits for summer flounder. The Director stated that this would negatively affect businesses in Ocean County and is asking that the Board support the position of local fisherman and businesses, the New Jersey Outdoor Alliance, and the New Jersey Coast Anglers Association in opposing the reduced limits for summer flounder. Freeholders Haines stated that this will affect recreational activities and many businesses in Ocean County. The Director stated that the County supports NJDEP Commissioner Martin, recreational organizations and the fishing industry in Ocean County in opposing the quotas. A resolution will be added to the Board agenda of February 15, 2017 opposing summer flounder harvest rules.

Freeholder Bartlett reviewed with the Board members two Natural Lands Trust Fund acquisitions recommended by the NLTF Advisory Committee. The first parcel is located in Ocean Township and is 2.64 acres. The Freeholder stated that it is adjacent to the Barnegat Branch Trail and the Forsythe Refuge property. The owner has accepted \$155,000 for the property. Freeholder Bartlett noted that the Barnegat Branch Trail has been growing piece by piece. The Freeholder stated that South Toms River is working with the rail trail for an easement along the rail trail up to the Toms River bus station. When the trail is completed, it will extend from Barnegat Township up to Toms River. The Freeholder stated that this acquisition is a good piece to add to preserved land in Ocean County.

Freeholder Bartlett stated that the second parcel for acquisition is located in Little Egg Harbor Township and is 37 acres. The Freeholder stated that there is some controversy in Little Egg Harbor Township that there is too much preserved land. The Freeholder noted that this Board has a policy that we will not buy property in a municipality unless the municipality is in agreement to preserve it. Freeholder Bartlett noted that the County is

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guided by the Township governing body and noted that three members of the Township governing body in October of 2016 approved the preservation of the property which was a split vote. The Freeholder stated that the County will move forward but it will not move forward until the governing body of Little Egg Harbor Township provides confirmation of their support of the acquisition. With that noted, the Freeholder stated that the property is known as Deerfield Estates and has approval for 12 residential lots and a negotiated price of \$440,000 which is \$40,000 per lot. This proposed adjoins property already owned in the area. David McKeon, Planning Director, was in attendance and noted the location of the property on a map. The Administrator stated that the property is not in the sewer service area. Freeholder Bartlett stated that it is important to note that if homes were built on the site, the homes would have to be on septic systems. Freeholder Bartlett again noted that the County requires confirmation of the support from Little Egg Harbor for this acquisition in order to move forward.

Both of the recommendations by the NLTF will be listed on the Board agenda of February 15, 2017.

Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the recommended award to Earle Asphalt Company in the amount of \$2,735,413.13 for the reconstruction and resurfacing of portions of County roads (Contract 2016B). There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the agenda for the February 15, 2017 Board meeting.

Director Vicari noted that the Route 166 / Route 37 project is making progress in Toms River. Mr. Ernst stated that a lot of utility work is getting done now.

Ms. Vasil reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of February 15, 2017. Ms. Vasil advised that a proclamation will be added to the agenda for Career and Technical Education Month in Ocean County. There were no questions or comments.

Director Vicari stated that if it snows the County will be prepared. Tom Curcio, Road Supervisor, was in attendance and stated that the Road Department did not brine because it is supposed to rain first and it would not be effective. Freeholder Little stated that 200 trucks are ready, 175 employees are ready. The Freeholder noted that as long as the Road Department is out plowing, Vehicle Services will be staffed and in the shop for any repairs needed.

Director Vicari asked the Board members for comments,

Freeholder Little noted that a veteran's job fair sponsored by the New Jersey Department of Labor will be held at the Toms River Elks on February 27, 2017 from 9 to 1. The Freeholder advised that Ocean County Veterans Services will be in attendance at the job fair and a press release has been done.

Freeholder Bartlett stated that the front of the Courthouse last year was decorated to honor our veterans for the 150th anniversary of the entry into the Civil War. The Freeholder noted that this year the front of the Courthouse will be decorated to commemorate the 100th anniversary of entry into World War I. Freeholder Bartlett stated that history is important and that we all owe gratitude to all our veterans past and present.

There were no additional comments.

Director Vicari asked the Administrator for comments during Open Session.

Administrator Block advised that staff is making progress with the budget, noting that a meeting has been scheduled for Friday with the departments that affected by the new cap law and that may have feedback from some of these departments.

Freeholder Bartlett stated that the County is operating under the 2 percent cap and now the State constitutional officers and Prosecutor have to stay under 2 percent independently which removes the County's ability to move funds around to those departments. ORDERED REC'D AND FILED

Freeholder Little advised that April 1, 2017 is the beginning of the annual Household Hazardous Waste Program with the first stop in Stafford Township. The Freeholder noted that this is an important program that keeps hazardous waste from our homes out of the landfill and the waste stream, advising that last year, almost 300,000 pounds was collected. Ernest Kuhlwein was in attendance and stated that the County has had this program for a number of years and advised that the program is by appointment only to regulate the amount of cars at one time to drop off materials. Freeholder Little noted that this program is second to none in the State.

Freeholder Bartlett reviewed with the Board an acquisition recommended by the Natural Lands Trust Fund (NLTF) Advisory Committee located in Manchester Township on Route 530. This property joins together with parcels the County already owns.

David McKeon, Planning Director, advised that this property fills in a gap. Mr. McKeon noted that this property was going to be developed. Director Vicari stated that the applicant is a willing seller and the County has advised the town because this takes the property off the tax rolls. Towns must agree with the acquisitions. Freeholder Bartlett noted that when the NLTF was set up years ago, the County was concerned with removing property off tax rolls and stated that the County would not acquire property without the approval of the town. This acquisition will be listed for the Board meeting of March 14, 2017.

Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda. There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the agenda for the March 14, 2017 Board meeting.

MOBILE CATCH BASIN AND HIGH VELOCITY COMBINATION SEWER CLEANER

The system described herein consists of one new mobile sewer and catch basin cleaning machine. The system shall be capable of simultaneous high-pressure sewer line cleaning/flushing and air/vac pick up of all liquids and solids from sewers and catch basins. This simultaneous operation will provide for maximum water pressure and vacuum at an engine speed not to exceed recommended RPM allowing for an adequate reserve horsepower from the engine. Controls for all functions shall be operable at the front operator's station.

DEBRIS STORAGE TANK

The debris tank volume shall be 10 cubic yards (2020 gallons) and 9 cubic yards minimum usable capacity. Each bidder shall submit a dimensional drawing certifying minimum usable capacity with bid documents.

The cylindrical (round) debris tank shall be constructed from A/36 1/4" steel to withstand a vacuum of not less than 360 column inches of water. The tank bulk heads shall be 3/8" bubble type. The use of square, oblong or oval tanks, which require heavy steel plates and additional welding, will not be acceptable.

The entire debris tank shall be hinged at the rear and designed for hydraulic dumping at 45 degrees. The use of hydraulic pistons, hoses and/or internal baffles inside the debris tank will not be accepted.

A full diameter, height/width, top hinged rear door shall hydraulically open and close to a 90-degree angle to eliminate dragging the door through the discharged debris. This shall be accomplished by means of a power open, power close hydraulic cylinder. For ease of maintenance, cleaning and dumping, partial doors, flat steel doors will be considered unacceptable.

The door shall seal by a heavy-duty rubber seal attached to the debris tank shell, seals attached to the door will not be accepted due to maintenance considerations.

The door shall seal by means of four individual hydraulic cylinder locks, which shall eliminate the need for any system require unlatching at the rear of the unit. This shall provide for maximum safety to operating personnel. The use of high maintenance mechanical linkage systems, operated from one hydraulic cylinder, that require manual adjustment or systems mounted inside the debris tank will be deemed unacceptable.

Two 5 in. tempered glass liquid level sight eyes shall be installed on the rear door to indicate liquid level. High maintenance, mechanical body load indicators with float devices are unacceptable.

An automatic stainless steel ball and rubber socket check valve system will be installed inside the debris tank to prevent over-filling. When debris tank is full, the ball check valve shall automatically stop the flow of air to the exhauster, therefore, protecting it from water intake.

This system shall also include a digital scale system showing front & rear axle weights at all times to allow operator to know when unit is over GVWR of vehicle.

WATER PUMP SYSTEM

The system shall include a heavy-duty tri-plex water pump. The pump shall be capable of operating flow from 0-80 GPM and from pressures from 0-2500 PSI without changing nozzles. This pneumatic valve shall allow for water and air pressure to be reciprocally proportional. The airflow shall be switched ON or OFF by means of a 3/2-way solenoid valve whereas air pressure and in turn the water pressure shall be adjustable by means of an air regulator. An inlet strainer shall be provided which shall allow for easy cleaning without the use of special tools and may be cleaned while water tanks are full.

The pump shall be mounted above the chassis frame and forward of the debris tank to avoid damage from rough roads and off road travel.

The truck chassis engine shall drive the water pump via a heavy duty split shaft power take off, and a variable speed "Kevlar" reinforced Poly Chain. Engagement/disengagement can be accomplished either from inside the cab or at the operator's station via dual clutch PTO. The use of low cost transfer cases, high maintenance hydraulic drives, auxiliary engines or standard cogged drive belts will not be acceptable

Pump engagement/disengagement shall be by means of a toggle switch on front of truck at operator's station.

An air valve for purging the water from the pump system for storage shall be provided. Pull valves located on water pump shall also be supplied to drain trapped water within the pump.

A single three-way water flow control valve shall be provided and operated by a manual lever at the operator's station.

AIR VAC SYSTEM

The system shall include a positive displacement rotary lobe type exhauster. This system shall be capable of a minimum 217 inches of negative water pressure at 3600 CFM. Air conveyance systems are not acceptable.

Lubrication for the positive displacement exhauster shall be by means of self contained splash system with sight eyes provided to check oil level.

The rating of the vacuum system at sea level will be a minimum of 217 column inches of water at maximum RPM.

The truck chassis engine shall drive the positive displacement exhauster via a heavy duty split shaft power take off, and a variable speed "Kevlar" reinforced Poly Chain. Engagement/Disengagement can be accomplished either from inside the cab or at the operator's station. The use of low cost transfer cases, high maintenance hydraulic drives or auxiliary engines will not be acceptable.

Blower engagement and disengagement shall be by means of a toggle switch on front of truck at operator's station.

A single stage, stainless steel micro-strainer in a centrifugal separator will be incorporated between the exhauster and the debris tank. It shall be mounted to shall allow the settling of contamination out of the main airflow.

Vacuum unloader valves will be built into the vacuum system to maintain high negative pressure.

SUCTION INTAKE BOOM

Debris loading into the tank will be through 8" telescopic tube in a tube style boom. At no point in transition from flexible hose to telescopic tubing will there be any type of steel "wear" elbow due to excessive maintenance concerns.

The boom shall rotate a minimum of 180 degrees by a gear drive.

A boom coverage diagram shall be supplied with the bid.

Rotation, extension, lift and air vac valve shall be controlled by a 6-way control joystick at front operator station and by a wireless remote from any location around the machine.

The boom shall extend to at minimum of 14 ft. past front bumper and rise to a minimum height of 20 ft.

Boom shall be top loading to insure that when filling, debris tank liquids are by design transferred toward the rear discharge door. This tank intake system shall allow for maximum storage of debris starting at front of debris tank and filling to the rear discharge door -creating best possible center of gravity between the chassis front and rear axles for maximum control and stability while in transit.

The boom shall be capable of lifting 1000 lbs.

The boom inlet shall include a water inducing "wet ring". This system shall allow for vacuuming of less moist material while introducing water at the point of debris tank entry. Controls for this system shall be located at passenger side control panel.


INTERNAL BOOM VALVE

An internal boom valve shall be supplied. The valve shall pneumatically be operated for greater speed and located outside the debris tank.

By closing the internal boom valve, the operator will completely stop all airflow through the vacuum tube allowing the user to build an instantaneous 217 in. of water volume vacuum within the debris tank.

By quickly opening the valve, an updraft will loosen compacted solids that would normally require removal by mechanical means.

DEBRIS TANK FLUSH OUT SYSTEM

A system of nozzles shall be installed in the debris tank. These nozzles will completely flush out the debris, and scour the top, sides, bottom, and the inside of the debris tank and rear door.

There shall be a minimum of four (4) high-pressure nozzle heads. Each nozzle shall have a sufficient number of orifices to clean the entire tank.

Two (2) nozzles shall be suspended from the top of the debris tank by flexible, heavy duty, wire reinforced rubber hose to prevent damage normally associated with steel pipe within a debris tank to assist in the removal of compacted debris. Two (2) additional nozzles shall be mounted at the front debris tank wall at the bottom to scour the floor of debris tank and assist with cleaning of rear door screen.

Flush-out system shall also include hydraulic vibrating package to assist in removal of debris from tank during dump process.

POWER-PUMP OFF SYSTEM

A high volume centrifugal pump installed outside the debris tank will be supplied to allow liquid to be discharged while retaining solids. The system shall be operable while simultaneously jetting and vacuuming debris. System shall be rated for 300 GPM minimum and be plumbed to discharge from passenger side of unit.

HOSE REEL ASSEMBLY

The hose reel shall be mounted on the front of the truck chassis. It shall rotate hydraulically a minimum of 270 degrees. The reel shall hydraulically telescope a minimum of 20" from its docked location. The hose reel shall also include a hydraulic powered locking mechanism for safe transport.

The hose reel shall be mounted to assure adequate ground clearance.

The reel capacity shall be a minimum of 800 feet of 1" I.D. sewer hose.

The hose reel control panel shall rotate with reel. The control panel shall incorporate the following: hose reel position, pay-out/retrieve, speed control, water on/off, boom suction on/off and engine throttle.

Sewer hose payout and retrieve shall be accomplished by two means: (1) push button at operator's panel, and (2) wireless remote control.
