The New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection's Division of Sustainable Waste Management, Bureau of Solid Waste Planning and Licensing is in receipt of a request for administrative action to the Ocean County District Solid Waste Management Plan (County Plan) dated June 4, 2026. This amendment to the County Plan proposes County Plan inclusion of truck routes for trucks entering and exiting the Ocean County Landfill. This request included the following routes:

“Apart from regular or routine local collection service operations, when feasible, every solid waste vehicle utilized for transportation of solid waste shall use County Routes, New Jersey State Highways, or the Garden State Parkway to reach and traverse NJ Route 70 in order to access the Ocean County Landfill (located at 2498 Route 70, in the Township of Manchester), and shall similarly use one or more of the above designated routes to depart and return therefrom.”

Pursuant to N.J.A.C. 7:26-6.11(b)2, the inclusion of truck routes can be accomplished via administrative action. Therefore, the County Plan inclusion of truck routes at the Ocean County Landfill is hereby approved as an administrative action pursuant to N.J.A.C. 7:26-6.11.

Ocean County has received a request from the Ocean County Landfill Corp. to amend our District Solid Waste Management Plan (County Plan), to include approved truck routes to and from their facility, as a condition of their Solid Waste Facility Permit (#SWF200001) renewal process. As such, the approved truck route conditions shall be as follows:

Apart from regular or routine local collection service operations, when feasible, every solid waste vehicle utilized for transportation of solid waste shall use County Routes, New Jersey State Highways, or the Garden State Parkway to reach and traverse NJ Route 70 in order to access the Ocean County Landfill (located at 2498 Route 70, Manchester, NJ 08759), and shall similarly use one or more of the above designated routes to depart and return therefrom.

The County wishes to include the above clarifying information within its County Plan via Administrative Action, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 7:26-6:11.

Pursuant to a new condition that has been included in our recently renewed Solid Waste Facility Permit #SWF200001, NJDEP is requiring that Ocean County Landfill Corp. apply for an administrative action to be taken to amend the Ocean County Solid Waste Management Plan (OCSWMP) to establish approved truck routes to and from our solid waste facility. Condition E.8.a.i from the above referenced permit is enclosed for your reference.

In compliance with this condition, we respectfully submit the following proposed amendatory language to the OCSWMP for your review and consideration:

APPROVED TRUCK ROUTES

Apart from regular or routine local collection service operations, when feasible, every solid waste vehicle utilized for transportation of solid waste shall use County Routes, New Jersey State Highways, or the Garden State Parkway to reach and traverse NJ Route 70 in order to access the Ocean County Landfill located at 2498 Route 70, Manchester, NJ 08759, and shall similarly use one or more the above designated routes to depart and return therefrom.



Requirements Report

- h. The Permittee shall control dust by the spraying of water or an equivalent approved by the Department. [N.J.A.C. 7:26- 2A.8(b)29]

8. Vehicle Management [N.J.A.C. 7:26- 2]

- a. The Permittee shall provide to users of the facility a copy of the traffic routes identified in the Ocean County District Solid Waste Management Plan (SWMP). [N.J.A.C. 7:26- 6.12(b)]
 - i. Within 90 days of issuance of this Permit, the Permittee shall submit to Ocean County an application for an administrative action to update the SWMP to establish truck routes to the Ocean County Landfill. [N.J.A.C. 7:26- 2.10(b) 4iii, N.J.A.C. 7:26- 6.11(b)2]
- b. The Permittee shall ensure that only solid waste vehicles properly registered with the Department, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 7:26-3, unless exempt from registration pursuant to N.J.A.C. 7:26-3.3, and displaying the appropriate registration number and solid waste decal are admitted for loading and unloading of any solid waste at the facility. [N.J.A.C. 7:26- 2.11(c)1]
- c. The Permittee shall ensure that solid waste vehicles exempt from registration pursuant to N.J.A.C. 7:26-3.3, or those which must be manually unloaded, shall not be admitted to the tipping area when registered, commercial type solid waste vehicles including, but not limited to, compactor trucks, trailers, or any solid waste vehicle that tilts or uses other mechanical means to discharge its solid waste are being unloaded, or when other heavy equipment is being operated in the tipping area. [N.J.A.C. 7:26- 2.11(c)1]
- d. The Permittee shall provide a means of removing mud, solid waste or other debris from the tires of all vehicles. Vehicle tires shall be cleaned prior to the vehicle's departure from the facility's boundaries. [N.J.A.C. 7:26- 2.11(c)5]

9. Waste Load Inspection [N.J.A.C. 7:26- 2]

- a. The Permittee shall inspect each incoming waste load in accordance with the Waste Inspection Plan included as part of the approved final O and M Manual or in accordance with any other approved facility operating plan, as appropriate. Such inspections shall be performed to identify the incidence of unauthorized waste types, including, but not limited to, hazardous waste and designated recyclable materials that may be mandated to be source separated by the District Recycling Plan applicable to the point of origin of the waste load. [N.J.A.C. 7:26- 2.10(b)9vii]
- b. The Permittee shall notify the Department in accordance with the approved Waste Inspection Plan when unauthorized wastes are received at the facility. [N.J.A.C. 7:26- 2.10(b)9vii]
- c. The Permittee shall consult with each county recycling coordinator for the facility's service area on a quarterly basis to review those recyclable materials that are designated by each county to be source separated pursuant to N.J.S.A 13:1E-99.13.b(2). The waste inspection plan or other approved facility operating plan shall be updated accordingly. [N.J.A.C. 7:26- 6.12(b)]
- d. Should any designated recyclable materials be detected in a delivered waste load, the appropriate county recycling coordinator shall be notified in writing. The Permittee shall maintain a copy of each such notification at the facility. Whenever possible, the generator who failed to source separate the recyclable materials shall also be identified and reported to the county recycling coordinator. [N.J.A.C. 7:26- 6.12(b)]

10. Designated Secure Areas [N.J.A.C. 7:26- 2]

- a. The Permittee shall designate a secure area under the facility's control, located a safe distance from the tipping area, where solid waste may be unloaded from those solid waste vehicles which are either exempt from the registration requirements of N.J.A.C. 7:26-3.3 or which must be manually unloaded. Bulky items and recyclable materials may be provided for in this manner. [N.J.A.C. 7:26- 2.11(c)2]
- b. The Permittee may establish a separate secure area for the drop-off and/or transfer of asbestos and asbestos-containing waste material. The Permittee shall ensure that the container used for drop-off and/or transfer is fully enclosed and located on an impermeable surface. No person other than facility personnel or a licensed commercial asbestos removal contractor may load the asbestos or asbestos-containing material into the container used for drop-off and/or transfer. [N.J.A.C. 7:26- 2.11(c)2]
- c. The Permittee shall designate a secure area under the facility's control, located a safe distance from the active disposal area, where solid waste, including suspected hazardous waste, which the facility is not permitted to receive shall be deposited until the Permittee receives instruction from the Department as to the proper disposal of unpermitted waste. [N.J.A.C. 7:26- 2.11(c)3]
