DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay I'd just like to mention again, the biggest problem we have in the United States today is drug addiction. And the biggest problem we have, of course, is with fentanyl. It's not only because we take it, it's also where it's mixed continuously. 98% of all the fentanyl, as we know, comes from unfortunately our biggest enemy, China. It comes over the border into Mexico and the cartels of course make billions of dollars but it destroys the lives of hundreds of thousands of Americans – young, old, and all different ages. So what we want to do is just go on record as to not only denounce it, but to make sure we understand what's going on. I think more so in Ocean County because we see what's happening in Philadelphia, in the Kensington neighborhood. I think one of the most upsetting things – if anyone looks at it on TV – you see the condition of some of the people living in the streets, the homeless people, and the smell of decaying flesh.

As you can see from, and I know we have many people here that deal with it directly, the problem you have is it destroys the skin tissue and you can see on their hands, their arms and their legs there are numerous pictures of what it does. And again, the most effective way of fighting this and we all know – its educational programs, it's giving out information. And the biggest problem we have of course is the money that people make from it. But again, it destroys the lives and we all know people in our families, our friends, our relatives and friends and neighbors that have problems with addiction problems. So again, this week just keep in mind what we have to do is to prevent addiction and it is an extremely serious problem. So we will go on record to support that and our proclamation will be given out at a different date. Thank you. Moving on to number 2."

CLERK GUNTHER: "Our second proclamation today is proclaiming September 17-23, 2023 as 'Constitution Week' in Ocean County."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Commissioner Haines please."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Thank you. I do have one of my fellow DAR members. I am the Regent for the Captain Joshua Huddy Chapter of the DAR – Daughters of the American Revolution – and every year we do celebrate Constitution Week. It is something that was declared by Dwight Eisenhower and of course there is a proclamation that has to be done every single year by law. That proclamation is done by the President of the United States declaring Constitution Week.

We are going to be celebrating Constitution Week where there is going to be history day. We are working with the Ocean County Historical Society and they will be having in our buildings over there by Hadley Avenue that will be having something all day long. There will be different things that will be going on – different portrayals. I understand George Washington may be coming as well as some other people that crossed the Delaware so if anybody is there. And there are a lot of different organizations that participate. But I feel that it's important as the Regent for the Captain Joshua Huddy that we do something to recognize Constitution Week. I think that with the times that we are facing in today's world it is just as important today as it was when it was first done. That we start to remember the Constitution and hopefully nothing will ever be changed by our Constitution because the Constitution has been in place a long time and it's working very, very well even though some people want to change it. I think that this is something that I'm very happy that we are doing this.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay the public hearing is now open on this resolution, but before we have the public hearing I'll turn it over to Commissioner Haines for an overview as you can see on the overheads on both my left and my right. Commissioner Haines please."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Thank you Mr. Director. As was stated, this is called Cold Spring Brook which is in Ocean Township. And the property, as was stated, is 22.33 acres on Brookville Road in Ocean Township. It is near the Citta Boy Scout Campground and Wells Mills County Park. The site contains the Cold Spring Brook, a tributary of the Oyster Creek and also includes a vernal pond offering unique habitat for suspected threatened and endangered species.

And as was stated, the property owner accepted our negotiated offer of \$100,000.00 and of course the township has supported this acquisition by resolution as with all pieces of land that we purchase. We need to make sure that the townships do support us with a resolution. Thank you."

T. COMMISSIONER COMMENTS

At 4:13 PM, Director Vicari received the following comments from members of the Board:

DIRECTOR VICARI: "That concludes the formal part of our meeting. Now we will have comments from members of the Board of Commissioners, then I will open it up to members of the public.

I'd just like to use this time to inform the Board of Commissioners and also the public of what is taking place even though we don't have any that I know of, anyone from the news media, that are here. Do we? I don't think so. But I think it's important that it's on the public record so it's part of the minutes and of course the verbatim tapes that we do have. The first item is I know each of us is concerned with the electric grid. We had a number of power outages over the last several weeks. Most were caused in the northern part of the county from wires that were down because of Verizon. Trucks hit it – there were comments and problems. I spoke to JCP&L and again they continuously say it is Verizon. I had a zoom meeting today with representatives from Atlantic City Electric with Consumer Affairs. They assured me. We went over a 10-year program to make sure the capacity of electric will satisfy our winter and summer needs and as far as the growing capacity as far as electric vehicles and whatever is taking place.

What brought it to a head, of course, is the government issued a statement last week saying please change your thermostat and bring it up to 80 (degrees) for air conditioning. In Ocean County that is not acceptable. If it is a problem then the utility companies must do more and do better. Again, this is something that we have been working on as a Board continuously.

I think that the most important thing that we've been working on this week with the press release is prescription drugs. As we know because a lot of it is made in foreign countries, especially in China, there's a major shortage of prescription drugs so therefore many people have to cut it in half. They cannot get it and it costs of certain drugs, prescription drugs, has risen substantially even though the State of New Jersey is paying more money, it is still taxpayers money and there's no reason for it. So the United States should make sure we're self-sufficient in pharmaceutical drugs. Legal pharmaceutical drugs should be made and manufactured in the United States.

Again, something that is very close to me is Harbor House. We know what happened, it changed. It's transforming from a transition house to a family transition house. And again, I was part of it when it opened up in 1988, I think it's extremely important that it is supported. It's relatively close to my neighborhood on Windsor Avenue and it helps a lot of youngsters, a lot of children, from the age of 14 to 21 that had serious problems at home or abusive situations. And again, they will continue to have my support even though at times, and everyone remembers, some of the neighbors said they didn't want it in their neighborhood but it's very, very important how we treat them at a younger age when they no place else to turn to. And it was a nonprofit but it was supported by, when I was Mayor of Toms River and also the County Board of Freeholders, now Commissioners.

We just heard, and it's very important, that the Governor of the State of New Jersey yesterday I believe gave \$100 million in Federal rescue money plan to boardwalks. Now where are most of the boardwalks? Well, we have 44 miles of coastline. A lot are in Ocean County whether it be Point Pleasant, Seaside Heights, Seaside Park, Ocean Gate, and all the way down. Unfortunately, the Mayor or Atlantic City said he wants most of the money. Well they got a fair

share of the money. To make sure that we increase our boardwalks and they're not all owned by the county, they're owned by the townships – that they are more resilient, ADA and safer, and whatever the case may be – I spoke to the administrative staff and we will post it on our website for the local towns to have access to it or mail them a letter. We haven't decided. But by Friday, action will be taken so all of our towns will be able to access part of the \$100 million by October 1st. And again, I don't know the details of it. I hope besides boardwalks that we can do the boardwalks, of course, we have in parks. And Commissioner Haines, I don't know the details of it but if it's possible we'll try to get some of that \$100 million into Ocean County. But again, we have 44 miles of coastline and we want to see some of that money come into Ocean County where we deserve it. And formally, we were never notified of it and I think it's a serious situation for all of us. We should look at it. I spoke to Assemblyman Brian Rumpf about it also and I'm going to send him copies of what we have taken. So the boardwalks again have to be done.

And you know we know the hardships of having a superstorm as we did many years ago. We had a lot of help from all of the states in the United States and that's why I sent the letter when I saw what happened in Maui, Hawaii, about the entire island being wiped out. Over 100 people lost their lives. It destroyed the entire island. So I sent the letter on behalf of the Board asking that the President and FEMA take immediate action to help all of those people there. We have one of the largest military bases, of course, Pearl Harbor to send help. As we did during COVID-19, we had the mercy ship we sent into New York harbor. We opened up the Javits Center. And as a state, Hawaii needs our help and we should do it. Fortunately, I think the letter went faster than I thought because I heard that the President is going to go to Hawaii now. Which I hope, but I hope he sees it. But the most important thing in all seriousness, they need our help. I sent out a press release yesterday also...there's a lot of fraud that takes place unfortunately. People take advantage of other people. And we want make sure with Consumer Affairs that if there are any issues as far as different charities, the money goes to where it belongs – to people that lost their homes, that lost their businesses in Maui and Hawaii. So we will take a very active part in that.

So that concludes my report to the Board and to the people of Ocean County. Turning to my right, Commissioner Kelly, do you have anything else to add to it?"

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "No comments."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Commissioner Crea."

COMMISSIONER CREA: "Yes, thank you Mr. Director. Ocean County will again be having the Boat Flare Disposal Pilot Program. The US Coast Guard requires all boats on both intercoastal and inland waters to carry a means of distress signaling suitable for night use. Regular flares are sold in packs of four and expire every four years. Our initial pilot program took place last May and successfully collected 1,300 marine flares. This one will take place on September 23, 2023 from 9:00 am to 12:00 noon at the Ocean County Fire Academy located on 200 Volunteer Way in Waretown. Pre-registration is required and flares will be accepted from Ocean County residents only. 300 appointments will be available with a maximum of 10 flares per resident. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much."

COMMISSIONER CREA: "I just wanted to point that out at the end of the season now or close to the end of the season. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "It is extremely important with our boating industry that uses the flares and also people in their cars. It's a safety issue. It should not be disposed in the regular refuse. It could start a fire."

COMMISSIONER CREA: "That is correct. That's exactly why the fires are starting."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Commissioner Quinn."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "No comments. Thanks."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Commissioner Haines."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Thank you Mr. Director. Just two things. One, I know many of us here in the county would have remembered Wally Jamison. He was from Jackson. I think he worked in Vehicle Services. I'm not one hundred percent sure. But I want to say that he passed away. And he was also a Purple Heart recipient. And I know they just had a...last year they had a very big event for Wally when he did turn 100 years old. And I think that someone that served our country the way he did and received a Purple Heart and he was very, very active in a lot of the service organizations throughout the county and I'm sure the state. And I think if everyone could just remember his family. I know both of his daughters – Linda and June Ann. And also one of his sons happens to work for us in our Parks Department – Steve Jamison. So if you just please remember the family during this time.

The other thing is Sunday, Donna Flynn and I went down to an Eagle Scout Court of Honor and it happened to be at Cloverdale (Park). Now we are very fortunate here in Ocean County. We have many of our people that become Eagle Scouts. They are doing many, many projects at our county parks. We've had them done at Parks Administration. We've had them done at Cattus Island. And this one was one that was done at Cloverdale. It was an informational sign.

Last year I was at one. The one on Sunday was a gentleman named Jack O'Cone and he is with Troop 61 out of

Stafford. And of course, the one we had last year – Charlie Burton – he also did his project there. And he did like a birding place that you could go and see birds and it's all protected and they don't see you.

Both of these things were made so well. I said I don't care what type of weather, thing that might come through, any tornado or hurricane – nothing, NOTHING, will ever tear these buildings down. These young men did a magnificent job. And there's been many projects that have been done by our Eagle Scouts in Cloverdale as I said and there's many that are on the agenda that are going to be done in Cloverdale and I just want to thank all the scouts that have become an Eagle Scout. I happen to have had an uncle who was one of the first Eagle Scouts in Ocean County so it's very near and dear to me. And I have served on the Boy Scout board. You know thank them for going to our county parks and wanting to build, do their Eagle project in Ocean County. And it was just very, very impressive to listen to the history of these young men and what they go through from the time they are a Cub Scout or Webelo, I guess or whatever the first one is they start in to go up and now they cross over and everything. It was really a very, very nice event. It was almost two hours long so it was a very good event that Donna and I were able to attend on Sunday morning and I just wanted to say that. And we can be very proud of the Eagle Scouts that we have here in Ocean County. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much. Any other comments from members of the Board of Commissioners or the professional staff, administrative staff? If there are no other comments from members of the staff, I will now open up to members of the public."

U. **PUBLIC COMMENTS** - "Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of five (5) minutes per speaker."

At 4:24 PM, Director Vicari opened the meeting to receive comments from members of the public.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Please come forward to the microphone and give your full name and mailing address. Starting on my right, anyone who would like to speak. We have plenty of time. If not, my left. Anyone who would like to speak? Okay, your full name and mailing address. There's no one else."

ROBERT YAISER, 7 WARREN COURT, MANAHAWKIN: "Director, would it be alright if I sat down? I have a couple of important things I'd like to go over and I want to go through this paperwork."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Yes, it's your time."

ROBERT YAISER: "Anyone who knows me knows I have big mouth. I'll project."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "If you would feel more comfortable sitting down, we understand.

ROBERT YAISER: "Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Is there a microphone that we can give you?" (microphone placed on table) "Thank you."

ROBERT YAISER: "And again, appearing today before you to get an honest answer about the corruption I reported in June when I appeared here twice. I would again like to remind you that within the Ocean County Vocational School District is a Law Enforcement Academy. Upon successful completion, as their SLEO coordinator, I certify these students as Class I Police Officers in New Jersey. If it is not already evident throughout my reports I have submitted to you, the students and I take law enforcement training very seriously. These dedicated students give up their traditional high school years to attend a quasi-military academy that fosters discipline, respect and integrity. Integrity for police is mandatory, not optional. In addition to the requirements of the NJPTC's basic police officer court, the students' curriculum teaches future law enforcement officers to stand up not only to police corruption but all forms of public corruption. Throughout their textbooks I can bring in to you they show in the history of policing that dirty politics has no business in policing. These students have been recognized by the New Jersey State Police Colonel Patrick Callahan and Governor Murphy for their commitment to want to protect and serve us during these tumultuous times of anti-police sentiment and the attacks upon police. Upon their graduation, in addition to serving at various police departments, many of our graduates serve in the United States military, fire departments, EMS services and are successful college students.

I also teach at OCC and many of my colleagues there believe there is a discernable difference about the ALPS graduates. They believe they are advanced academically and respectful. In my opinion, these students that want to dedicate their lives to help others are heroes. They deserve our gratitude and admiration. They certainly don't deserve to be bullied or mistreated to cover up the District's impropriety.

Can I get an update on the questions I've asked as far as where we're at? Last time I was here I was told in writing I would be submitted the Prosecutor's determination that there's no wrongdoing of anything I've submitted."

JACK SAHRADNIK, COUNTY COUNSEL: "It's my recommendation to the Board that you not comment on this matter. It involves personnel and student matters of another public body – the Vocational-Technical School District – and they are private and confidential. This Board does not have jurisdiction over them."

ROBERT YAISER: "Okay. I can give you documentation where the union refutes that and says it's not private and confidential. The public has a right to know. We're talking about corruption. These kids came before you and said they were bullied and mistreated. That's private and confidential?"

JACK SAHRADNIK, COUNTY COUNSEL: "It deals with student matters of a vocational-technical school district and should be addressed to them not this Board."

ROBERT YAISER: "Okay. I've done that for three years. No answer. I can show you report after report, there is no oversight of that school district. What is the budget for the Vocational School?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I'll turn this over now to the Administrator, Mike Fiure, who did a review of all of the records and he can give you the information as far as the budget. So I think Mike Fiure, if you don't mind."

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "I can meet with Mr. Yaiser after. I don't have the budget numbers regarding Vo-Tech now. I can certainly meet with you and give you the budget numbers. But under Counsel's advice, we did review all the paperwork that Mr. Yaiser had sent to this Board. All of the agencies that he has provided that information to and their responses back to Mr. Yaiser that was provided to Counsel and Counsel has recommended at this time that we don't engage in a conversation regarding this matter because of the sensitive topics of the Vo-Tech students.

But Mr. Yaiser, I can tell you, has provided us, this Board, the Prosecutor's Office by himself and all the other entities including the State Department of Education, his union and several other entities and he has received a response back that he has provided to us from all of those entities."

ROBERT YAISER: "And what exactly was that response that you received?"

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "No, Mr. Yaiser you received the response and you provided it to us."

ROBERT YAISER: "Okay, well as you've noticed, the corollary in all of those responses is no answer. No one has put one thing on paper of what happened here. So I'll go over and I'll read this to you.

This is not something that happened years ago. This is going on and this is from our last back-to-school night this year. This is why I asked Commissioner Haines to address the graduation. Remember the last time I was here I asked you to address the students, their concerns, at this year's graduation?"

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "You addressed the concerns. You addressed the students. Yes."

ROBERT YAISER: "I'm talking about addressing the students' complaints about them being bullied and about them reporting corruption within the Ocean County Vocational School."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "I said to you and this is all I'm going to say to County Counsel is that I spoke with the Prosecutor's Office and the Sheriff and they both said that there was no reason to do any type of investigation. That's exactly what you had asked me to do and that's exactly what I did and that's how they reported it to me. Now I have been advised by our County Counsel we are not supposed to discuss this anymore."

ROBERT YAISER: "Well, okay, I'm not being disrespectful. I'm here. This is why I think the public has a right to know. I was told the exact opposite. So someone here is lying. As you've seen in my reports, as you know, I'm a retired New Jersey State Trooper. I know exactly what the penalty for perjury is."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "I know exactly what you are."

ROBERT YAISER: "I'm willing to testify under oath, answer any questions you have."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "I don't have any questions."

ROBERT YAISER: "Look, what I'm telling you is the students are telling the truth. There is no accountability at the school district. How do you not see this on paper? So I'll go through. This is what I reported this year. This is at our last back-to-school night.

'Good morning Tom. I want to keep you updated. Last night, several parents from the senior class asked me questions and expressed their concerns regarding the believed impropriety and corruption at this law enforcement academy. I did not initiate this conversation or solicit anyone's opinion on the matter. The conversation was witnessed by Mr. McAndrew the gym teacher who happened to be in the gym classroom. I explained to the parents that I reported the students' complaints to the proper authorities and requested an investigation.'

The only investigation up to this point after three years is by the people who are accused investigating themselves and telling the public 'nothing to see here', it's nobody's business. Is everyone okay with that? It's in all the reports. They haven't answered one question. So I'm going to go through this and then hopefully we can figure this. You might be getting false information is what I'm telling you because I'm willing to testify someone's lying. I was told the opposite when multiple police agencies investigated this is 2020. And then several months (later) contacted me again and said it was an issue when the Board President's son, Jimmy Anuario, was forced to resign. So let me go through.

'As noted, in the NJ Union Grievance Chair Andrew Dennison's report, according to the Board..."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Excuse me. For the record, okay, I was informed it is more than five minutes. But if you're willing to state publicly that you see corruption."

ROBERT YAISER: "Absolutely."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "A felony. And if you are a whistleblower, legally, it's going to be turned over, the tapes, to the Prosecutor's Office with two officers of the court, then I cannot stop you because as far as the whistleblowing law is concerned I will not stop your First Amendment Rights unless the Board votes against you speaking. But as of right now, if you want to make the statement, I cannot in my opinion – looking at the whistleblowing law – and if you claim that you're willing to testify under oath and risk going to prison for five years, I cannot stand in the way of that."

ROBERT YAISER: "Absolutely."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "So are you willing to go to prison for five years if there's a lie?"

ROBERT YAISER: "I certainly am. I would ask Mr. Fiure and Mrs. Haines, would they be willing to testify today under oath?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Are you willing to say this under oath?"

ROBERT YAISER: "Absolutely."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "In front of the Attorney General and the court?"

ROBERT YAISER: "Absolutely. In front of the FBI which I have reported it to."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "And you reported it to the FBI?"

ROBERT YAISER: "Yes sir."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "The Attorney General?"

ROBERT YAISER: "Yes sir."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "In good conscience as Director of the Board I cannot stop this unless the attorney tells me to stop it."

ROBERT YAISER: "Director, I have been respectful both times I'm here. And you can ask anyone who has witnessed this. Commissioner Haines rolling her eyes, making faces, sidebar conversations. I have been respectful throughout this whole process. I'm mandated by Board policy to report these students' legitimate complaints so I'd like to go through these."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "So the legal opinion, Mr. Sahradnik?"

JACK SAHRADNIK, COUNTY COUNSEL: "Mr. Yaiser has the right to speak for a period of five minutes. You don't have an obligation to respond to any questions that he asks."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay, we're not going to respond. Can I stop him from speaking?"

Jack Sahradnik, County Counsel shakes his head no.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay, if I cannot stop you from speaking legally, I will not respond to you. I don't think any member of the Board will or the professional staff. But if you conclude this in a short period of time I would appreciate it."

ROBERT YAISER: "Okay, I'll try and be brief. The reason I requested verification from Mr. Fiure and Mrs. Haines assertions that there was no wrongdoing is because I was told the complete opposite. So I don't know what they were told. And I will read to you what I have.

On the tape, before I get to that, one of the many disturbing comments on the tape I forwarded to you by retired Brick Township Police Officer Lieutenant Waldhelm is he states on the tape that I provided to you that he and James Anuario only got their job because of Anuario's mother being the Board President. And the only reason Yaiser got the job is because he knows Joe Vicari. So not only did they slander me, they take a shot at Director Vicari. He also stated that Anuario hates Yaiser. Yaiser hates him. He doesn't like me and I don't like him. Like everything else in the matter this is a complete dishonest statement.

People at that district...I get along great with everyone. Director, you were the liaison when I started in 2015. That program is exceptional. We have exceptional graduates from that program. For the five years that Anuario and I worked together I thought he did a fabulous job. I'd like to state for the record, there is no animus. I like James

Anuario. I like Ed Waldhelm. I like Nina Anuario. I don't dislike anybody involved in this matter. Unfortunately for some people involved here, law enforcement is taught we don't enforce the law on who we like. We follow the rule of law and nobody is above it. Those kids did exactly what I taught them to – to stand up for what they believe is right.

I believe the public has the right to know of my credentials so I'll let you know. I graduated from Seton Hall with honors with a Bachelor's Degree in Criminal Justice. Additionally, I earned three graduate degrees and a Doctorate in Education. I had decades of formal teaching experience when I was hired as an instructor here, both full-time as a State Police Law Enforcement Instructor and five colleges and universities before I started here at OCVTS. I have developed curriculum for both Pennsylvania State University and Seton Hall University. In 2021, I was named Co-Adjunct Professor of the Year at Seton Hall University. Based on my credentials I believe I'm qualified to teach at the Vocational School. So to slander me and say the only reason I got my job is because of Director Vicari is disgraceful in my opinion.

Beginning, Director Vicari you were at the 2019/2020 graduation. At that graduation, James Anuario was provided a plaque thanking him for his service. It was public knowledge he had moved to Florida. So months later when the students began to complain that their grades were failing as a result of him not being in class, I deem that as a legitimate complaint. According to the New Jersey First Act it says you're not allowed to live out of state, specifically in Florida, and be a full-time teacher here. But according to Mr. Fiure and Mrs. Haines they said that the Prosecutor said that there is no wrongdoing in that?

Okay, because the NJEA union representative, Wendy Sistarenik, said absolutely not, that he was not allowed to live out of state. So the kids complaint was legitimate.

I asked all three administrators at the Ocean County Vocational School if certified teachers were allowed to live out of state. All three answered 'I don't know'. Now, is that acceptable? Either incompetence or complicit? Is anybody okay with that as an answer to these students? I'm sure...no comment.

The next complaint was the fact that the kids questioned how was Anuario hired when his mother is the Board President. I have a letter dated from the Board of Education that said they're not in compliance and yet their attorneys put on paper they've received no communication from the Department of Education. So how do we explain that? Someone is obviously lying. How do we get to figure out who that is? Anybody? Okay.

I'd like to read for you, in October of 2020 I was contacted again by the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office. They informed me there was some confusion of who was handling, they called it an investigation, into Anuario being hired and a criminal history at Jackson Police Department.

A student came in and I will leave the student's name out but it's in my report as you have all seen. The student came into my classroom in tears and said he was afraid to attend Anuario's class because his mother had a heated phone conversation with Anuario the night before. The student advised me that his mother called and questioned why students were being asked by Lieutenant Waldhelm and others to prepare sketches for Anuario's inexplicable retirement. They had a surprise party in lieu of what the Prosecutor's Office told me – he was given an ultimatum to leave immediately or be either indicted or charged criminally. I don't know how they worded it.

Anuario maintained to the student's mother that he never lived in Florida. He was not retiring and he had no idea where these rumors were coming from. The student advised me that his mother was irate over the contradictions and believed that her son was telling the truth. I reported it to Principal John Biscardi. He responded and memorialized the incident in the district's reporting system. His account of it, knowing that I had told the Principal, he admitted he had read an article on google about Anuario being forced to resign on indictments of perjury charges. He knew the truth and yet he put into the system and described the student's mother as bizarre and untruthful. This is what goes on in this school district.

We have great teachers in the Ocean County Vocational School District. There is a handful of administrators and your Board of Ed that needs to be looked at. If we're not going to answer any questions here I'm not going to waste my time showing the truth that no one wants to answer.

Until this, I've asked the FBI to again look at this. Mr. Fiure's statement that at the federal level...you told me the Prosecutor had said there was no wrongdoing. Correct? So why can't we get that in writing? If we're telling the truth, where is that?"

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "Mr. Yaiser, and I know you like to leave out information..."

ROBERT YAISER: "Please tell us! Tell us all what information am I leaving out?"

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "I sent you an email on July 17th regarding the Ocean County Prosecutor. This was a verbal conversation that I had with the Prosecutor. And that for any official response you request must go through the Prosecutor's Office. They have their own OPRA custodian. And also the packet of information that you had sent to us was replete with emails where you have already copied the Prosecutor on there. So if there is any criminal activity, this Board does not investigate criminal activity. If we had any evidence of criminal activity that would be done by local law enforcement. So for that question you need to go to the County Prosecutor as I emailed you."

ROBERT YAISER: "That's what I'm explaining to here in front of everybody, the public. I did go to the Prosecutor.

They changed their story and now refuse to answer anything. So does the public have the right to know?

I also asked you were those, the transcripts you sent me, were they altered?"

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "Absolutely not."

ROBERT YAISER: "Then why didn't you answer the question?"

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "Again, Mr. Yaiser, and I apologize I have to find it on my phone, but I believe on that same email you had asked for the transcripts of, I believe it was June 17th and ..."

ROBERT YAISER: "And June 14th and I'm going to ask for the transcripts today."

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "And the second meeting had not yet been adopted so I do not have those transcripts. However, I stated that 'I have a zip drive with the digital recordings of the meeting for you. Please contact my office for a time to pick up or I can have it mailed to you.' You did not respond back to that email. But I am glad that you are here today because if you wait until the end of the meeting, I have them upstairs and I can provide them to you."

ROBERT YAISER: "You have a copy of the audio? Of the tape?"

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "Yes. I have the zip drive of those audios."

ROBERT YAISER: "I did not get that email if you had sent that. And they were not redacted?"

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "Our audios are not redacted Mr. Yaiser."

ROBERT YAISER: "Okay. Then the transcripts match up to the tape."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Mr. Yaiser, so you said you are willing to make a statement that if we send the transcript and the verbatim audio to federal agencies, if you do lie under perjury there is a five-year prison term. Are you aware of that?"

ROBERT YAISER: "Absolutely."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "That's why I'm allowing you to speak, knowing that. Because whatever you say today, I'm going to direct our administrative staff to send it to the Federal Bureau of Investigation..."

ROBERT YAISER: "Please."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "...Attorney General, the Prosecutor's Office and the State Department of Education. So whatever you say today you have to realize that under oath you are responsible for serving a five-year prison term."

ROBERT YAISER: "Absolutely. That's why I'm willing to answer any question any of you have of me. And notice no one is answering my questions."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "In all my years I have never heard that statement before that's why I'm not going to cut you off of your First Amendment Rights because you are saying there is a felony that was taking place. And not only was there a felony, but you are also willing to say that you are part of the whistleblowing and I'm not going to be part of anything where there is an obstruction of justice or give information. As you know, the nation is divided right now. I'm not going to partake of that. If any members of the Board of Commissioners disagree they can do so, but that's my opinion at this particular time. Any comments from members of the Board?"

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "Commissioner, just for the record, Mr. Yaiser is not under oath testifying today."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "No, no. I didn't say he was under oath. I know he's not. But what he's saying is that when we give this transcript to the Federal Bureau of Investigation you're willing to go there if you're subpoenaed."

ROBERT YAISER: "Absolutely. Go there again."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "And before a Grand Jury."

ROBERT YAISER: "Absolutely."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "And I am not going to obstruct that. So if any members of the Board or if the attorney wants to stop this discussion, they can do so, but I am not going to stop it. I will partake in any discussions. Again, I don't have first-hand information but you're making a very serious...I mean very serious charges."

ROBERT YAISER: "Absolutely."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "And you're willing to stand by that?"

ROBERT YAISER: "100%."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "So as a retired New Jersey State Trooper in a command position, as a teacher in many educational institutions as a Doctor of Education you're willing to put your career and life on the line and serve in federal prison because of this."

ROBERT YAISER: "Absolutely."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I will not stand in the way of any comments you make."

ROBERT YAISER: "I would further like to...Mrs. Andrews had the courage to appear before this Board. Her daughter did a 25-minute Powerpoint presentation specifically on corruption in the Jackson Police Department involving James Anuario. She was subsequently retaliated against by people close to Anuario within that school district. She is not the only student. I'd like to read you...I sent you a couple, but I think the public has a right to know. This is another paper done by a student that wasn't even in my class and he states:

'Corruption is defined as acts involving the misuse of authority by a police officer in a manner designed to produce personal gain for themselves. Corruption throughout an agency potentially destroys any and all trust between communities and law enforcement. In addition, the officer themselves have major problems pertaining to their integrity after they become corrupt. Once a sworn officer of the law does something corrupt, they have a permanent scar on their credibility. Abusing your power can lead to many issues and once it happens it sticks to you.

An example of this comes from November/December of 2007. Officer James Anuario, a former law enforcement instructor at the Academy of Law and Public Safety, used his power to make an unlawful arrest without proper information from a necessary informant for a warrant before retiring. Despite being told that the department does not do things that way by Detective Howard Bogan, a colleague of his, he still lied about the situation on his police report leading to even more problems throughout the department before he was forced to retire. When he was hired as a Law Enforcement Instructor here at ALPS, the situation was soon found out and uncovered by previous students.

Now, personally, I don't know how somebody with this incident can still be hired as a law enforcement instructor, but that is none of my business. The true concern revolves around the credibility of the instructor himself and how one small incident, referring to the abuse of power, can stick with someone forever even fifteen years ago. Corruption can take many forms but all lead to one effect – damaging the integrity of the main infrastructure of the subject in which corruption occurs from. This can be an agency, a school, a workplace, or even extracurricular activities. When things do not go fairly, leading people to abusing their power and their position, problems ensue. An example of this honor guard, student/teacher relationships, throughout any activity involving school can lead to integrity issues, unnecessary changes and unfair privileges for certain people.

Now OCVTS has had a purported incident back in 2018/2019 regarding an alleged student/teacher relationship that was failed to be addressed by the Principal Karen Homiek at the time of the incident, when the incident happened. Now, thankfully, none of the incidents of the effects of this alleged student/teacher relationship however there was no information of this incident as it was not fully addressed.'

These are coming from high school students. Also the last time I was here on June 6th, Director Vicari, you pointed out that you were informed former New Jersey State Troopers were not being considered for employment. Did the Prosecutor or anyone look into that?

Okay. I believe in addition to looking at your Assistant Business Administrator – he applied in 2020, was interviewed and did not receive it. Not only did I think Mr. Collins was excellent in his role and a subject matter expert in Homeland Security. I had the privilege of working with him at Farleigh Dickinson University. I thought he was an excellent instructor. Multiple troopers that had resumes...one was a Dean of a college, and none of them were looked at. Can anybody explain that? It certainly seems like it bolsters the assertion you heard, Director, that New Jersey State Troopers were not being considered. So can we look into that and show the public the resumes and let them make their own opinion?

Lastly, I submitted to you a report entitled 'Teachers Who Value Integrity' which I just received an additional twelve counts. Now, a lot of these go back decades way before I was hired in this district but everyone I talked to within the school district says it's truthful. So if the Board of Education, which I sent to Commissioner Haines 14 months ago, the complaints are directly about the Board of Education and their attorneys. There is, I think Mrs. Andrews put in her report and asked specifically if Bob Shea and Associates represented James Anuario when he got a pension after being forced to resign and if they knew that, was that reported to the Board of Education when they hired him? Because according to the letter I have from the Department of Education by Dr. Jamar Purnsley it says they are in violation as far as the hiring of him and they were told they had to correct it."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Mr. Yaiser, are you almost finished?"

ROBERT YAISER: "Yeah."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "What I would like to do is if you have a copy of that to make it easier for us and also to make sure there is no misunderstanding with the..."

ROBERT YAISER: "Director, they've had these copies for 14 months. You have all the reports I'm going through."

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "Director, we do have a copy of that and it's not accurate how Mr. Yaiser is..."

ROBERT YAISER: "What part of Dr. Purnsley's report is not accurate?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Wait, let's just get closure. They're saying, Mr. Yaiser, your comments and your statements are not accurate. So again, it will be forwarded to the proper authorities."

ROBERT YAISER: "Well, if they're not, can we rectify that? Can you address what part...?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "First, let's analyze it. They will send it to the proper federal agencies. And just give us an opportunity tomorrow to let us know what's done and we hope by the end of tomorrow's business day they will forward it to the proper places. Because you are insistent that criminal activities have taken place, it will be looked at. And as a whistleblower you have rights and I believe you are happy that your First Amendment Rights were upheld and you had an opportunity to speak. If there is nothing else, anything new, as far as the Administrator had said we would like to conclude this."

ROBERT YAISER: "Well I'm going to forward you, and again, I've never asked anybody. I've never said send me your information. I think in the last three years, people know in this district we have great teachers and they're fed up. A lot of people are resigning from that school district. Someone needs to look at this."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay, thank you. Does that conclude your report?"

ROBERT YAISER: "If no one is going to answer, why not?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "If that concludes your report it will be part of the public record and of course there is a verbatim tape that will be made of that. Anyone else from members of the public that would like to ask a question or make a statement? If not, I would like to entertain a motion to close the public portion."

COMMISSIONER CREA: "Joe, before we adjourn can I just do something please Mr. Director?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Yes."

COMMISSIONER CREA: "I see Mr. Braden. Mr. Braden you're here in the audience. I'd like to take a moment. I didn't realize you were going to be here this evening and I want to take a moment. Mr. Braden participated in our Transportation Advisory Board and I had prepared this for you and members of your board. And as you are here this evening, I'd like to present it to you personally if you don't mind. So if you would give me a moment to just read it and then I would like to give this to you.

'The Ocean County Board of Commissioners acknowledges Bill Braden for your years of service to Ocean County. Your work through the years has helped improve transportation efforts across the county for residents and visitors alike. The assistance you have provided is appreciated. Your contributions were helpful in bringing about some beneficial changes and to raise awareness of transportation issues. We thank you for your work on the Ocean County Transportation Advisory Board.' Signed by myself on behalf of all of the Ocean County Commissioners.

Thank you very much for the time over the years. I know there's been many, many years that you've put in along with your other board members. Thank you very, very much for the time that you did this. I will be sending this to other members of your board. Thank you. (applause)

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Do you want to say something? Just give your full name and mailing address. We know who you are, but this way it is part of the minutes, if you don't mind please sir."

BILL BRADEN, 12 GRAND AVENUE, TOMS RIVER: "You will be recognizing the other members of the board also?"

COMMISSIONER CREA: "I have it upstairs. They will be getting it also. I didn't realize you were going to be here tonight."

BILL BRADEN: "Alright. I've been here since there were more chickens than people. (laughter) Thank you. It was with great regret that the members of the board decided to resign. We tried to keep what we were doing with the resolution that established this board, that's what we tried to work within. And it became evident that that was going to change and we weren't allowed to do what we were supposed to do so we all decided that as much as we love the county and devoted all our time, a lot of time, plus money of our own driving to hearings in Trenton and whatever and New Jersey Transit hearings. And it was very reluctant. We didn't want to do it, but it came to the point. I'm sorry to say that. So anyhow, if there's any way we can get back to where we were, we're willing to try again."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thanks Bill."

COMMISSIONER CREA: "Thank you so much."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Bill. (applause) If there are no other comments is there a motion to adjourn?"
