Pffice of the Director roclamation June 7, 2023

WHEREAS, Governor Philip Murphy and the New Jersey State Legislature created RevolutionNJ in 2018 to plan, encourage, develop, and coordinate the commemoration of the 250th Anniversary of the founding of the United States, New Jersey's pivotal role in the American Revolution, and the contributions of its diverse peoples to the nation's past, present, and future; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Historical Commission, along with its nonprofit partner Crossroads of the American Revolution, established RevolutionNJ to advance the role that history plays in public discourse, community engagement, education, tourism, and scholarship in New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, RevolutionNJ will engage New Jerseyans in all 21 counties and 564 municipalities through its officially recognized programs, initiatives and events over the next ten years; and

WHEREAS, it is fitting and desirable that we commemorate the beginning of the nation and the role New Jersey played over the past 250 years as well as its present and future role as part of the United States, with particular focus on the individuals, ideas, and events that shaped our Country, State, and County; and

ORDINANCE #2023-17

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING RENOVATIONS TO THE OCEAN COUNTY AIRPORT, LOCATED IN BERKELEY TOWNSHIP, IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND APPROPRIATING \$4,500,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$3,500,000 IN BONDS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN TO FINANCE THE SAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL, MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING) AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. There is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the County of Ocean as general improvements, a project consisting of renovations to the Ocean County Airport, including but not limited to construction of a box hangar, taxilane and an observation/administration area, located in Berkeley Township, in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, including all else necessary therefor and incidental thereto.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared that the improvements or purposes, the estimated cost of the improvements and appropriation therefor, down payment and estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes authorized are as follows:

SECTION 3. There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$4,500,000 including the sum of \$1,000,000 as the down payment for the improvements or purposes described in Section 1 hereof as required by the Local Bond Law. The down payment has been made available by virtue of provision in the Capital Improvement Fund of the County of Ocean in one or more previously adopted budgets.

SECTION 4. There is hereby authorized the issuance of negotiable bonds in an aggregate principal amount of \$3,500,000 to finance part of the cost of the purposes stated in Section I hereof. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding the limit authorized by law, and the maturities, method of sale and other details thereof shall be determined by subsequent resolutions to be adopted in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 5. In order to temporarily finance the purposes provided for in Section 1 hereof, there is hereby authorized the issuance of bond anticipation notes of said County in an aggregate principal amount of \$3,500,000. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the County Comptroller; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and shall be in such form as may be determined by the

County Comptroller. The County Comptroller shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this Ordinance, and the County Comptroller's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-8.1. The County Comptroller is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The County Comptroller is directed to report in writing to the Board of Commissioners at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this Ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 6. The County reasonably expects to commence acquisition and/or construction of the improvements described in Section 1 hereof, and to advance all or a portion of the costs in respect thereof, prior to the issuance of bonds or notes hereunder. To the extent such costs are advanced, the County further reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance, in an aggregate amount not to exceed the amount of bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof. This bond ordinance is intended to be a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 7. Any grant monies received for the purposes described in Section 1 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

SECTION 8. The amount of the proceeds of the obligations authorized by this Ordinance which may be used for the payment of interest on such obligations, architects' fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses, and other items as provided in N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-20 shall not exceed the sum of \$2,000,000.

SECTION 9. The Capital Budget of the County of Ocean is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. In the event of any such inconsistency and amendment, the resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended Capital Budget and Capital Program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners and is available there for public inspection.

SECTION 10. It is hereby found, determined and declared as follows:

A. The improvements or purposes described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses. They are improvements or purposes the County may lawfully undertake as general improvements,

and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property benefited thereby.

B. The average period of usefulness of the improvements for which the obligations authorized by this Ordinance are to be issued is fifteen (15) years.

C. The supplemental debt statement provided for in N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-10 was duly filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners prior to the passage of this Ordinance on first reading, and a complete executed duplicate of such supplemental debt statement has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey, and such supplemental debt statement shows that the gross debt of the County as defined in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-43 is increased by this Ordinance by \$3,500,000 and the obligations authorized by this Ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

SECTION 11. In the event the monies set forth above for any purpose is not necessary for said purposes, then such monies shall be for the completion of any of the other purposes provided for in this Ordinance.

SECTION 12. The full faith and credit of the County of Ocean shall be pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds and notes authorized by this Ordinance, and as long as any of said bonds or notes are outstanding, an appropriation shall be included in each annual budget of the County hereafter adopted in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds or notes maturing in each year. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the County, and the County shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the County for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

SECTION 13. After passage upon first reading of this Ordinance, the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners is hereby directed to publish the full text of the Ordinance, together with the notice set forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF PENDING ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-19, at least seven days prior to the date set for public hearing and further consideration for final passage (which date shall be at least ten days after introduction and first reading). The Clerk of the Board of Commissioners is further directed to comply with all provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-17(b) regarding postings, publications, and the provision of copies of this Ordinance.

SECTION 14. After final adoption of this Ordinance by the Board of Commissioners, the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners is hereby directed to publish the full text of this Ordinance, as finally adopted, together with the notice set forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-19.

SECTION 15. The Board of Commissioners of the County hereby covenant on behalf of the

County to take any action necessary or refrain from taking such action in order to preserve the tax-exempt status of the bonds and notes authorized hereunder as is or may be required under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and the regulations promulgated thereunder (the "Code"), including compliance with the Code with regard to the use, expenditure, investment, timely reporting and rebate of investment earnings as may be required thereunder.

SECTION 16. This Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final passage.



Director Joseph H. Vicari opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Director Vicari and Anthony Agliata discussed the 25th Anniversary of the Pumpout Boat Program. Ocean County currently has six full-time pumpout boats keeping the waters of the Barnegat Bay and Little Egg Harbor clean. As of 2022, the program has removed 2.4 million gallons of effluent from over 112,470 recreational boats since 1998, and 146,000 gallons in 2022, completely free of charge. The \$20,000.00 operational cost per boat is shared by Ocean County and the Ocean County Utilities Authority. The \$120,000 budget covers the boat captains, fuel, maintenance, insurance, and other operational costs. The boats operate from Memorial Day to early / middle October.

Commissioner Kelly and John Ernst provided the Board with a Countywide Engineering Project Update. Improvements consist of road resurfacing, traffic signal upgrades, bridge replacements, stormwater management upgrades, and various miscellaneous projects totaling \$149,700,000.00. *The full presentation is attached.

Commissioner Kelly and Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included two recommendations to award contracts. The first is to P&A Construction, Inc. from Rahway, NJ in the amount of \$5,485,078.02 for the reconstruction of Cross Street, Route 526 from Augusta Boulevard to State Highway 9 in the Township of Lakewood. The second recommendation is to Lucas Brothers, Inc. from Morganville, NJ in the amount of \$665,665.00 for road improvements to Massachusetts Ave. (C.R. 637) and Cox Cro Road (C.R. 622) in Lakewood and Toms River Townships, No.II. There were no questions or comments and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the May 17, 2023 Board meeting.

Commissioner Haines and Mr. Agliata told the Board about the possible acquisition of Wangenstein Farm located on Drake Road in Lakewood Township. It is the desire of the current property owner to sell the farm to the County to permanently preserve it as farmland. The 11.8-acre farm includes two residences, as well as 9 acres of crop fields identified as the last remaining target farm in Lakewood Township. Preservation of this farm would ensure farm production in this fast developing section of the Township. Ocean County will acquire the development easement over the property, permanently preserving it as farmland. The owner accepted an offer of approximately \$500,000 per acre, or a lump sum of \$6,000,000.00, which is less than the appraised value submitted by two independent appraisal companies.

Director Vicari mentioned that he would like Lakewood to be notified of the purchase. Commissioner Haines, Mr. Agliata, and Mr. Villinger assured the Director that although it was not required, Lakewood had been notified in writing of the pending purchase.

Ms. Gunther reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of May 17, 2023. There were no questions or comments.

Director Vicari asked the Board members for comments.

There were no additional comments.

Ms. Gunther read the resolution to move to closed session.

On a motion by Commissioner Crea, seconded by Commissioner Haines, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 5:15pm for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was unanimously carried.

WHEREAS, on March 18, 2020, the Ocean County Board of Chosen Freeholders adopted the tenants of a March 16, 2020 Emergency Proclamation declared by the Freeholder Director and Ocean County Sheriff in response to the novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak as a Public Health Emergency of International Concern and the March 9, 2020 Governor of the State of New Jersey Executive Orders declaring the concurrent invocation of both a State of Emergency pursuant N.J.S.A. App. A.:9-33 et seq. and a Public Health Emergency as Contemplated by N.J.S.A. 26: 13-1, et seq. which invoked the authority and power contemplated by N.J.S.A. 26: 13-3, the Emergency Health Powers Act; and

WHEREAS, in an effort to minimize the spread of the virus, Ocean County contracted with the Visiting Nurses Association of Central Jersey ("VNA") to conduct COVID-19 testing at various times throughout the year and organize, administer and report the results of the COVID-19 tests; and

WHEREAS, Purchase Order No. 20200003486 was issued on May 28, 2020 in the amount of \$48,324.00 to conduct 14 days of nasopharyngeal and serological testing; and

WHEREAS, on December 2, 2020, the County ratified the issuance of Purchase Order No. 20200003486 and authorized the issuance of Purchase Order No. 2020A0003486 in the amount of \$121,777.00 to provide all necessary staff and testing materials for up to 1,125 COVID-19 tests; and

WHEREAS, on January 20, 2021, the County authorized the issuance of Purchase Order No. 2020B0003486 in the amount of \$44,189.00 to provide all necessary staff and testing materials for up to 500 COVID-19 tests; and

WHEREAS, on September I4, 2021, the County authorized the issuance of Purchase Order No. 20210006298 in the amount of \$25,000.00 to conduct up to 13 days of vaccinations including all necessary staff and materials; and

WHEREAS, on November 17, 2021, the County authorized a no cost time extension through December 31, 2021 for Purchase Order No. 20210006298 to conduct vaccinations including all necessary staff and materials; and

WHEREAS, Purchase Order No. 20210006298, originally issued under the U.S. Treasury CARES funds which expired on September 30, 2022, now requires a modification to the accounting line; and

WHEREAS, due to the unprecedented demand for testing and vaccinations, the VNA performed services above and beyond those anticipated for the periods of September 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the VNA has provided detailed invoices for said services, in the amount of \$56,160.00; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined and certified in writing that the value of the services exceeded \$17,500.00; and

WHEREAS, Visiting Nurses Association of Central Jersey has completed and submitted a Political Contribution Disclosure Form pursuant to N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.26 and Business Entity Disclosure Certification pursuant to N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.26 which certifies that the entity has not made any reportable contributions to a political or candidate committee in the previous one (1) year, and that the contract will prohibit the entity from making any reportable contributions through the term of the contract; and

WHEREAS, the services provided were necessary to ensure the health and safety of our residents and employees; and

WHEREAS, funds are now available in Account No. 9999-210-015-0166 for the costs of these additional services.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The County Purchasing Agent is hereby authorized to issue Purchase Order No. 2021A006298 to the Visiting Nurses Association of Central Jersey in the amount of \$56,160.00 with funds for said purchase order available in Account No. 9999-210-015-0166.
- 2. Certified copies of this Resolution shall be made available to the County Auditor, County Counsel, Department of Finance, Purchasing Department and the Visiting Nurses Association of Central Jersey.
