CLERK CILENTO: "The next item is the Introduction of the 2021 County Budget and Accompanying Resolutions and I have a statement to read into the record.

This is the Annual Budget of the County of Ocean for the Fiscal Year 2021.

Be It Resolved that the following statements of revenue and appropriations shall constitute the County Budget for the year 2021;

The Board of Commissioners of the County of Ocean does hereby approve the following Budget for the year 2021:

DIRECTOR QUINN: "I'm going to turn it over to Commissioner Kelly, our Finance Chairman. Jack do you want to speak?"

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "Thank you Mr. Director. Last week we unveiled the 2021 County Budget at our PreBoard Meeting. Today we are formally introducing the Budget. A Public Hearing on this \$470 million budget is scheduled for our Commissioner Meeting in this room at 4:00 PM on April 7th. After today, the Budget will be available for review on the County Website and that information will be available throughout the entire year. If you would allow, I'll just review some of the highlights of the Budget.

This County continues our work as a Board to maintain fiscal stability in our County government during the most difficult of times. Certainly, 2020 came with many challenges as we navigated the effects of the coronavirus pandemic and we continue to do so today.

This budget is a collective work of all of us on this Board along with our staff. We work as a team in developing sound and disciplined financial policies that result in budgets that put the taxpayers first. I said earlier today that this is not only the 2021 Budget, this continues our economic plan to continue a stable Ocean County government. And this is only part of that plan.

The budget funds all of our core services, provides another modest decrease – for the fifth consecutive year – and that is why we continue to talk about ‘no surprises’ because we don’t go up and down with our tax rate. But instead, as our ratables have increased, our tax rate has decreased. And we do that in incremental steps.

This budget reflects a strong recovery from ratable losses stemming back to 2009. That was the previous high in our net value. In 2012, we hit our low in the last ten years. Today, our tax base exceeds 2009, not by much, but it does exceed it. So we are at an all-time high in our ratable base. And as we do that we keep our pledge to lower the County tax rate. While we say that every year, there is no better way to describe it - this is a ‘no surprise’ budget and I just talked about what that means.

Under this budget, the County property tax rate will be just over 33 cents per \$100 of equalized value. This budget totals \$470,356,000.00 and the amount to be raised by taxation is \$365,212,000.00. That’s a 1.02 percent increase, while the State law mandates that we can spend up to 2 percent. So we’re about half of what we could have spent.

As a key part of the budget, it is important that we maintain a healthy surplus. This budget includes \$38 million used from the surplus. This is money that we feel we can replace in 2021. In other words, right now we have about \$76 million of surplus available. We’re using about half of that. And in talking with Julie and others, it is felt that as we look at every year what we replaced, we’ll replace that \$38 million and have \$76 million again next year. And that is what helps us to maintain our AAA bond rating and it allows us to respond proactively when there are emergencies such as what we went through in 2020 and going all the way back to 2012 what we went through then. The AAA bond rating – the highest bond rating possible – helps the County tremendously in securing the best interest rates when we bond for capital projects.

Property values in the county have increased over the past year by just over \$2.5 billion. We continue this year to face the challenges of the coronavirus pandemic and Gerry Little is leading that effort with the Board of Health. Ocean County government took many steps starting a year ago to make certain the public and our staff were protected. Public health and safety has always been our priority. The coronavirus certainly highlights that need.

We have worked with our businesses, our municipalities, numerous county agencies – especially the Ocean County Health Department, the Ocean County Sheriff’s Department and others – in providing assistance in obtaining resources to help mitigate the far reaching effects of COVID-19.

While the financial impact of COVID-19 on the County budget and subsequently our taxpayers has been softened by supplemental federal and state funding, the delivery of services and programs and the increased needs of residents have had an effect on the way County government operates.

This year’s budget continues the county’s program of ‘pay as you go’. With a \$17.9 million appropriation, we will be paying cash for a percentage of our capital projects and purchases in 2021. A benefit of this includes not having to bond, in other words, not have to increase our debt and still being able to do those capital projects.

As you know, each budget is built with an eye toward what it means for the future. For example, this year's budget again increases our level of funding to education – the Ocean County College and the Vo-Tech schools. And we work closely with the Library who does have their own tax rate, but relies on County government to build the new libraries when it has to be. It is important our residents can access a quality and affordable education in Ocean County.

Another large investment – over \$45 million – will be used to improve our roads and bridges as well as maintaining them so they will be safe for everyone to use.

In the area of law and public safety, we will appropriate \$77.5 million to support our Prosecutor's Office, our Sheriff's Department, our Corrections Department and Juvenile Services in an ongoing effort to keep our residents and visitors safe and also to address such issues as the opioid epidemic that continues to grip our county and our country.

The budget also makes certain our most vulnerable residents are provided for as we fund Social Services, Senior Services, Veterans programs and Transportation Services. Parks and Recreation, another key area of County government, is provided the needed funds to maintain our park system and to acquire lands for future expansion.

To summarize, this budget is the result of numerous meetings with department heads, senior staff, and this Board. And it's together that we work as one in producing a budget that is fiscally responsible, that is conservative and disciplined and that meets the needs of our county government.

Now we talked about the fact that this year's budget is being introduced at \$470 million which appears to be a \$20 million increase from 2020. But that isn't quite true because the reason is \$19.5 million of that \$20 million are Federal and State Grants that are inserted into the budget so that we can do things like rental assistance which you are going to talk about, I guess, later today and other things. So it's money from outside of the county and not really just county money. So this budget really is increased by about half a million dollars of county spending.

Mr. Director, that is my little report as we introduce the budget."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you very much Commissioner. Does anyone have any comments? Gerry."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. And to Commissioner Kelly and Julie and our Administrator and all of our departments, this is a fiscally sound budget and spending plan for the future. It does, as Commissioner Kelly indicated, it provides for our core services and programs. I am particularly excited that we will have sufficient funding for our roads and bridges and veterans. And most importantly, I thank the Board, I thank Commissioner Kelly and everyone, for their support of our Health Department in their ongoing efforts to not only test the people of Ocean County which we have been required to do by the State, but also to implement a massive vaccination program which we will talk about later. So thank you Commissioner Kelly for your leadership in this area. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Commissioner Vicari."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "I was going to hold some of these remarks until the public hearing, but since we are going to do so. I've noticed an observation, I don't have any scientific data or from the State of New Jersey, the traffic on our roads throughout Ocean County and the Jersey Shore has increased substantially. I do not see any fewer cars because of COVID-19. So if you look at the economy, and again it is an observation, Ocean County is probably at the same status as last year. What I don't like, and I think that's why when I spoke to Freeholder Kelly, it's very important to have discipline and controlled spending. We only control the County Budget and the services, but our services have an impact not only on all of our residents, but also each individual municipality. Everyone knows throughout Ocean County what went up. Food is up substantially. There's no question about it as far as the cost of living. Housing has increased more in the last 90 days than the last five years. There's no question about it as far as housing. For all of us that live here, it has an impact because they are workers in the community. Not only that, but if you look at home repairs because people are home more because they are working at home, it's up to try to get someone to do any repairs in your house. And cars, the price of cars and car repairs is up substantially because they're not going out of the area. They're not going to the New York, Philadelphia areas to work. So they're buying the houses. And one things that is hurting us more than anything else, the increase of gasoline and tolls has a remarkable increase and it's taking more money out of the local economy.

So what this Board has done is we said, you know something? We can only control what we can. We can't control the local, we can't control the schools, we can't control the debt service of the Federal government. What you have to look at is the budget and we want the services we have, the core services, but also long term – the impact on our children and our grandchildren – as far as what's taking place as far as trillions of dollars being borrowed. We cannot print, as other Freeholders have said, we cannot print money. But as the Freeholders have mentioned, and even Commissioner Little with the Board of Health, Senior Services – we have never been this busy in the history of Senior Services. As a former Freeholder said, Freeholder Mancini, no one in Ocean County – a senior citizen – will go hungry. Three years ago when there was a shortage and the money was not in the budget, we increased the budget by \$25,000.00. Right now in Ocean County for 2021, we have the most intense program and we put more into that than anyplace else not only in New Jersey, but in the United States of America.

I checked the numbers going back several hours ago. We have an assembly line at the Southern Service Center. The

vision of this Board three years ago when we put those improvements in are second to none anyplace in the United States of America. Every day we feed over 1,000 senior citizens who outlive their estates in many cases, who don't have the money, but they get a hot nutritional meal in Ocean County at an efficiency rate second to none in the State of New Jersey. I think that's very, very important. So not only do we take care of core services and essential services, but problems that did not exist two years ago. And we don't know what's going to happen six months from today as far as the COVID-19, but we are in a position with all five Freeholders working together in the spirit of cooperation saying, you know something? The people with a need in Ocean County come first. So as Commissioner Kelly mentioned before, it can change, we could see a lot more Federal dollars come into it. There's no question about it. We are in a position to get as much money as possible from grants and from loans as possible for not only small businesses, but also for the average middle-class man and woman that are working today. So this is a very important document that's being done. It's a living document. And as I said, I didn't want to go into detail with this but I think it's important to realize that we are totally sensitive to the needs of our residents and the increased cost of living throughout Ocean County. There's nothing more important than making sure people have food whether it be a senior citizen or a child in our schools.

I've seen poverty before I came to Ocean County when I was working up in north Jersey. I know what it's like when children come to school hungry. I've seen poor people. And this Board has stood shoulder to shoulder with one thing very important, no one goes hungry. We feed our people. We take care of our people. That's important. So again, I just want to conclude with one thing that it's very important to realize that our priorities with one thing, the sensitivity of what should be taking place. Not because we're told to do so, but because it's the right thing to do. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you Commissioner. Commissioner Haines."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Thank you Mr. Director. And I do echo the comments made by my fellow Commissioners, of course, Commissioner Kelly, Commissioner Little and of course Commissioner Vicari. It's very hard for me to remember that we are Commissioners now instead of Freeholders. But the comments made by Commissioner Vicari is so right on because there are so many needs of the people and this Board, as well as the staff, what they have done is to make sure that everything is going to be provided that is necessary for the people of Ocean County. And they can be very proud of the staff that we have that work for Ocean County because they dedicate themselves to making sure that the County is run well. They work very closely with each and every one of us to make sure that budget, especially Commissioner Kelly who is head of Finance, to make sure that we're presenting a good budget that's going to meet the needs of people in Ocean County. And I can't thank (enough) Julie and her staff as well as our County Administrator, Assistant Administrator, everyone involved, with regards to the hard work that went into working with each and every one of us to put this budget forth and to show that we reduced the tax rate by half a cent and also we were able to provide the necessary services and will continue provide the necessary services to the people of Ocean County. And especially Commissioner Kelly, I thank him very much. Thank you."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you Commissioner. And not to be repetitive, but I just want to add to my fellow Commissioners comments. This budget is truly a lean budget that, you know, there are five of us sitting up here, five very conservative people, and when the budget is prepared I know Commissioner Kelly is very insistent upon the fact that when he is dealing with whether it be our Director or our Department Heads...obviously Julie, Carl and Mike...that we really look at the fact that is it something we need. Not something we want. Is it something we need? And Jack has done a great job in holding the line.

Moving forward, I know that is going to continue. We've got a fantastic bond rating as Jack said. And I think this Board is very proud of the budget that we are presenting today. I know the taxpayers certainly should be very happy with the budget that we're presenting today because at the end of the day the one thing that we all keep in mind is the money we are spending is not our money. We're spending the taxpayers' money. It is not our checkbook. It's the taxpayers' checkbook. And that's the number one priority in moving forward each time we sit down and prepare a budget each and every year. And like Commissioner Kelly said, this is not a one year budget. This is something that is a plan for the next four or five years. And as you move forward each year it's a lot easier to do it based on the effectiveness and the conservative way that these budgets are put together. So Commissioner Kelly I thank you for your hard work in putting this together. Julie, yourself and the office...Carl, Mike, all our staff, our Department Heads, because it's not something that we sit up here and put together. Our Department Heads come to each and every one of us and each of us sits down with our departments and makes sure that we're covering what we need to continue to provide the services to the residents of Ocean County and to continue to provide quality of life to the people that have moved down here. Commissioner Vicari was spot on. There are so many people down now that have needs and there's never a situation where if we are made aware of something that we don't take and address it and do everything we can to make sure that people get what they need. So I thank each and every one of my Commissioners for their hard work and dedication. And with that, I will turn it over to MAC. Do you have another statement you need to read on this?"

T. COMMISSIONER COMMENTS

At 4:27 PM, Director Quinn received the following comments from members of the Board:

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Okay, moving on to Item T: Commissioner Comments. Commissioner Little."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. Today in New Jersey, Bergen County is number one with the most number of cases with 387. Ocean County is number three in the state. We have 295 confirmed new cases today. That brings our total number of cases to 52,608. And unfortunately we have 7 additional deaths today and our total is 1,756. As we have been seeing for the past month and a half, Lakewood, Toms River and Brick are the municipalities with the highest number of new cases.

At our testing site it's very interesting in the last about a week and a half, about maybe eleven or twelve days, we are seeing a significant decrease in the number of people that are seeking the test at the Ocean County College – at the site that this Board has established in conjunction with the Board of Health. So six days ago we had 244 people show up for tests and yesterday we had 127. It has declined every single day over the past week and a half. So perhaps that's a sign of declining people with symptoms, number one. And number two, we are very happy that the private sector – more and more of the neighborhood doctors and the urgent care centers and so forth – are conducting the tests. So that relieves some of our staff there so they can assist with the vaccinations.

And speaking of vaccinations, which of course is the hottest topic and most important topic at the time, yesterday at Toms River North they conducted 1,188 vaccinations. And at the site at Southern Regional High School, or Middle School I should say, 447 vaccinations yesterday. And if everyone remembers, we started vaccinating actually on Christmas Eve, December 24th of last year. And since that time our Ocean County Health Department has administered 51,940 vaccinations. 51,940 – I mean we have everybody supporting this program from Buildings and Grounds to the Sheriff's Office to everybody, the Road crew, everybody supporting getting this off the ground.

And we can thank Southern Regional High School for their cooperation. They have donated nurses. They have donated support staff, clerical staff. It has been a tremendous help down there.

So 51,940 vaccinations. Interestingly enough, we have now conducted 15,338 second doses. So 15,338 second doses and 36,602 first doses that will be followed up. We are still receiving at least as of this week, 3,000 doses of Moderna and 200 of those go, according to the state policy, to the Long Beach Island Health Department. Is that correct Carl?

3,000?”

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: “I believe it went up to 3,400.”

DEPUTY DIRECTOR LITTLE: "3,400, I'm sorry. 3,400 – they increased this week and 200 go to LBI. So we are continuing to progress and we thank everybody for their support of the new program.

One of the issues that we haven't touched on for a couple of meetings. We always like to identify the gender breakdown. And the last time we talked about this it was about even. Well, the gender breakdown now is 47.6% men and 51.8% female. And again, the saddest part of this is the impact on our elderly, our most vulnerable people 85 years of age and older represent 4% of the confirmed cases, but they represent almost 37% of the deaths. So the underlying conditions of the most elderly among us are significant contributors to this of course. So it's very sad, but we are continuing to work on this program. And I think everybody, especially the Director and Commissioner Haines. Both of them are very active at the sites all the time. So we thank them for their support of the program. And I thank all of you for your departments because the Board of Health could not conduct this in the way to the success that it's been without everybody's help. So thank you Director unless somebody has some additional questions.”

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you Commissioner.”

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "I would just like again to thank Commissioner Little for being not only involved with this, but fighting very hard to make sure that every resident in Ocean County that wants a vaccine gets a vaccine. I know it's a very difficult task at hand, but we have been working with the plan so when it does materialize then we have faith that eventually the State of New Jersey will hear our pleas of not only the Board of Commissioners, but also the professional staff and of course the medical industry throughout Ocean County to increase the number of vaccines in Ocean County. And it's very important today when people are concerned, some are panicking, to get accurate, objective information. And what they receive from Commissioner Little and from this Board and our professional staff is the facts of what's taking place in Ocean County and the numbers are accurate and can be verified. Thank you Mr. Director.”

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you Commissioner. Commissioner Haines.”

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Just again to thank the Health Department for the great job that they are doing. And it's good to see that when you go there the lines, that there are more people getting the second dose, there are more rows that are for second doses than first. So that's good. And of course, now we've got the other vaccine from J&J that's going to be coming in so hopefully more and more people in Ocean County at least will be able to get it once it's been established where it's going and how much is coming to us then more people will be able to get vaccinated. And thank you Commissioner Little for the great job that the Health Department is doing and all of the employees. And all of the volunteers because a lot of people don't realize the number of volunteers that are at the sites that are helping out there and it's really great that we have all these people that really care in Ocean County. Thank you.”

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you Commissioner. Commissioner Kelly.”

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "No comments.”

DIRECTOR QUINN: "And Commissioner Little I just also want to echo comments from my fellow Board members because the Board of Health, lead by yourself and Dan Regenye, and all the staff over there are doing a phenomenal job. I mean, last week you were tasked with the fact that you had to do double the amount of doses based on the snow and what we had received the week before and I know Saturday night you had reached that goal of doing 13,000 doses in the one week. And there was no doubt that you could have still done more doses than that. I mean whatever is being thrown at the Board of Health and the volunteers and team that you have up there with the hospital, RWJ Barnabas, the Sheriff's Department, all the people you put together on that team, just whatever the task is they just step up and they make sure that they do it. And I just really want to recognize you, Carl, Mike and of course Julie who is coming up with ways to pay for all this stuff, for all the work going on behind the scene. We had a meeting earlier today and just so everyone is aware, it's not just the vaccine we get this week that we're trying to make sure that we get into peoples' arms, there are plans in place for the next couple of weeks. There are plans in place for the next couple of months to make sure that we get the additional vaccines from the State of New Jersey which Commissioner Little is very confident we can get in a couple of weeks. We're going to be able to take and not miss a beat, get it out there and start getting it into peoples' arms right away. So you are doing a fantastic job and certainly extend our thanks to all the folks that are doing the work with you.

That's really all the comments I have so we are going to move on to Item U: Public Comments.”

U. **PUBLIC COMMENTS** - "Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of five (5) minutes per speaker."

At 4:38 PM, Director Quinn opened the meeting to receive comments from members of the public, as follows:

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Anyone from the public who would like to say a few words, just raise your hand and come on up to the microphone. John, come on up. Just give your name and address, John, thanks.”

JOHN BACCHIONE, 3 ALBATROSS POINT, BAYVILLE: “I spoke with Commissioner Kelly and our Engineer, John Ernst, today regarding this matter but I wanted to put it on the public record. There is an intersection exiting the

Parkway going south, Exit 77, intersection at Double Trouble Road and at that exit there was a serious car accident again in that intersection on Monday. There were three automobiles involved. The ambulances came, the police officers were there, so it was pretty serious. I don't know if there were any fatalities, but you guys will get the record on that I'm sure. It is a County road. So I'm asking you guys to think about a traffic study in that intersection and possibly make some adjustments so that the future has less and less automobile accidents there.

In addition, I noticed that the County has been doing some surveying on Bayview Avenue in Berkeley Township and it's probably because of the flooding. There is a huge flooding matter going on on that road. It isn't an evacuation route. We have a Waterways Committee established in Berkeley Township and specifically all they worry about are the waterways and flooding in Berkeley Township. There is a grant out there for evacuation routes that we have applied for in Berkeley Township and it's just a matter of asking the County for how many times in the last five years that roadway has been closed down due to flooding. So I'm sure you guys will be getting noticed on that and we appreciate your cooperation."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "I'm sorry, what road was that John?"

JOHN BACCHIONE: "It's Bayview Avenue. It runs right along the Bay. It's a lot of marshland on either side of it so I'm sure the water table is very high there. You know, once the tide comes up that roadway gets so that it is not even passable at times."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "No problem. I know Commissioner Kelly wants to just comment on that."

JOHN BACCHIONE: "Yes, sure."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "On both of those issues, the second one first. We will be able to provide that information. On the first issue about the traffic study, I've already talked to the Engineer this afternoon in my office about our conversation earlier and we're going to look into doing that also."

JOHN BACCHIONE: "Thank you. Thank you for my time. I appreciate it."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thanks John. Anyone else?"

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "If I can just respond to the question you had on the Garden State Parkway Exit 77. When that was in the process of being constructed, just so you know, I opposed the toll on that. I thought it was very unfair. And after they did it, it was not cost effective. Not the exit, but the toll booth there. There were several articles saying they were losing money because of the construction of the toll plaza and maintaining it at that time. But just so you know, I thought it was unfair for at that time it was the Garden State Parkway Authority to institute the tolls. Not that the exit, Exit 77, should have been done because it was the only access for the senior citizens in that area.

And Bayview Avenue, as you know, when I was Superintendent many times when the students would go to school they couldn't get home because the road was flooded and they could not use the buses. They could not get through it. So in your grant if you want to include that, not only for an emergency route, but the students could not get home to their families because of the flooding in that area because the road is below sea level. Thank you."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you Commissioner. Jim."

JIM BYRNES, 219 DOGWOOD DRIVE, BAYVILLE: "First of all I want to thank the Commissioner, Freeholders, for the great lean budget and thank Commissioner Kelly. I see the Veterans Services got a pretty good bump this year. It's needed and thank you guys. No other county has the services like Ocean County. I was at the John Bartlett Park today having lunch and I didn't want to leave.

But in order to get a building permit in Ocean County you need to go through Ocean County Soil Conservation. If you disturb 5,000 feet or more, you pay \$700.00. If you disturb under 5,000 feet, you pay \$150.00. I've had residents go there that have 40' x 80' lots that are only 3,200 square feet and they're hitting them for \$700.00. I go in with them and I asked, 'How can they disturb 5,000 feet?' 'Well, sometimes they go out on the road. Sometimes they go on the neighbors' (property).' This is not Ocean County and Ocean County is taking the rap because people come to me and say, 'Ocean County is killing us with the soils.' I don't see if there's a reason why the county cannot do this or the municipalities. In Berkeley, we pay \$450.00 for a grading review. Why couldn't it be added into that and have our Engineer sign it off or tell you when to put silt fence? You know, Commissioner Quinn, what you go through there, but the County is getting a bad rap there. It's Ocean County Soil Conservation."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Unfortunately, Jim, you know and I know it has nothing to do with county government. It's not any part of our Engineering."

JIM BYRNES: "Yea, but it goes to the perception."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "It's the perception of them taking that name years ago when they started that office really does attach to the County and makes it really look bad for the County. Because I had looked into that years ago when I was in Lacey because we had the same situation and we were told that Ocean County Soil Conservation is a state agency, but the state agency – you can't get out of the deal unless you had gotten out of it years ago. When you signed on to it the first time, you were stuck in there, really, in perpetuity. And the fees that they collect are really what they operate

their budget on an annual basis. And I agree with you that \$700.00 is just an additional fee that is being put on there. And \$700.00 is really not the end of the game because if you have the inspections done and the inspections don't pass, you're talking about \$1,500.00 each time they come back out. And I know after (Superstorm) Sandy there was a push to try to get rid of a lot of those fees and there was no success in doing that. So I totally agree with you, I mean, I really don't know what at this level the Board could do other than to send a letter to the state or something asking for some assistance."

JIM BYRNES: "Is their budget OPRA-able through the state?"

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Oh sure. Yes, it's a hundred percent. You know, Senator Connors had done a lot of background work on it years ago and he's somebody you should really talk to. I think Freeholder Little knows."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR LITTLE: "We received complaints like that all the time. They are state employees. It's just called the Ocean County Soil Conservation District."

JIM BYRNES: "Right. Maybe we need to change the name. State of New Jersey, Ocean County Soil Conservation.

Alright, the VA, I noticed in the paper today they've hired a Veterans Experience Officer in Washington and what he is going to do is go around the country and ask veterans how their experience was. And his point is the same as the President's, they want to take care of the Native Americans, the African Americans, the LGBT...I think I'm missing a letter there...but, you know, what happened to all the veterans? Next time you go to Washington, touch that wall and see if you get a color on your hand. Everybody bled red. So they need to knock that off. Alright? So there's a phone number and I'm going to pass that number around to anyone that I can and we're going to call him.

Back to the clinic, we're not getting any movement on that for the last 3 years. When you leave here, you look at the Foodtown shopping center on the Parkway with exits, with restaurants, and it's empty. What a great VA clinic that would be! And there are investors that would buy this for the VA. So when MacArthur was there, it was fine in Toms River. When Kim got in, it was better in Bricktown. And now Kim wants to bring Howell into it. We don't need that.

This paper I put in front of you, this is the Veterans Urgent Care card. It's a secret. Nobody knows about it. I pass it around. You have to maneuver on the Internet to get it and what this card does is if you've been treated in a VA facility in the last 24 months, you take this card and the directions are right on here to the Urgent Care and you get a prescription – you take this side to the pharmacy. And I know in Bayville there are 4 pharmacies and all the Urgent Cares are in it. So if the County could print some of these, do it one side, for John (Veterans Services) I pass them out to the seniors all around the county."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Sure. Gerry can you give John Dorrity these?"

JIM BYRNES: "And I ask that the County, this county, needs an advisory council – get some of these younger vets in there, you know?"

And just to touch on what Commissioner Vicari said, gas prices have gone up ten cents a week. They were teetering at \$2.00 and now they're teetering at \$3.00! Do you know what that is going to do to our boating industry in Ocean County and our tourism? It's going to kill it. Last year we had a banner year because of COVID, everybody was out on vacation in Ocean County. It's going to be \$6.00 on the water, a gallon, and it's going to kill us. The boating industry will be done again.

And the other thing for the tolls to echo the Commissioner, a veteran's got to pay \$4.00 in tolls to go from Berkeley to Bricktown. You pay \$.95 to get on in Berkeley, you ride 166, you pay another \$.95. Then you go to Brick, come back and do the same thing. It's \$4.00 in tolls plus gas. So that's a little crazy.

And today the school aid funding came out and as usual Ocean County got the crumbs. They say that we got quite a bit, but I haven't had a chance to look at the rest of the state but you know where that's going. So I want to thank you guys for what you do. I know it's not easy, especially when you get old guys like me coming in to every other meeting. Thank you."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Jimmy, thanks for what you do because I know you're always out there fighting every day for the vets. You're doing a great job. Don't give up on it and we're going to keep fighting with you."

JIM BYRNES: "I'll do it 'til I die...another 20 years."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Any other comments? Okay, seeing none, I am going to ask for a motion to adjourn."

V. ADJOURNMENT

There being no additional comments received, Director Quinn called for a motion to adjourn the meeting at 4:49 PM.





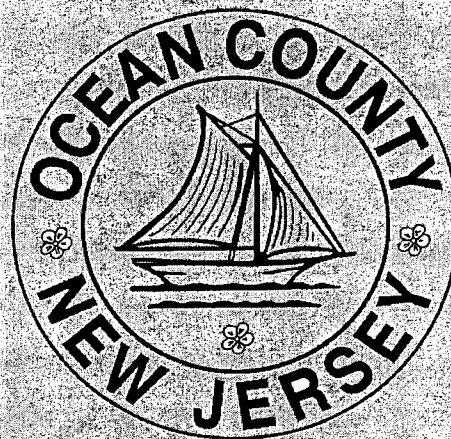

BUDGET MESSAGE

It has always been the policy of the Board of County Commissioners to provide quality services to the residents of the County while maintaining a stable tax rate for the taxpayers of the County. The 2021 County Budget has been developed with that theory in mind along with fiscal conservatism.

The formulation of the Budget was accomplished through a series of budget sessions with the assistance of the County Officials over a three month period. These sessions included budget conferences with various Departments and Agencies of the County.

With this 2021 County Budget, the Board of County Commissioners will decrease the tax rate to .332 cents per \$100 of equalized property value.

The budget totals \$470,356,177, up \$19.6 million.

The amount to be raised in taxation is \$365,212,639, up \$3,675,917.

The County will use \$38,000,000 from its surplus to support the 2021 Budget, \$1,200,000 more than it did in 2020.

With the passage of Chapter 78 of the Laws of 2021, local government units were required to institute specific formulas for the calculation of employee health benefit contribution. The formulas are based on the type of coverage, base salary and cost of coverage. The 2021 County Budget includes and appropriation for Group Insurance for Employees in the amount of \$42,287,928. This amount was derived by subtracting the estimated employee contribution to be collected of \$6,051,854 from the calculated cost of \$48,339,782.

COUNTY OF OCEAN - 2021

The Ocean County Board of Commissioners, with the assistance of the County Administrator, Office of Management and Budget, County Engineer, County Planning Board and the County Comptroller, has developed this six-year Capital Improvement Program and Budget. The Capital Improvement Program was developed with the cooperation and consideration of recommendations of the various County Departments.

The County's continuing growth requires that the Board of Commissioners anticipates and plans for the increasing demands for County facilities and services. The Capital Improvement Program was prepared to guide County investment in land, facilities and equipment through 2026. The Program and Budget will be adjusted each year to reflect changing conditions including new Federal and State legislation, variations in the general economy, emerging demands of the public and modifications in the growth rate which may result in changes in revenue patterns and demand for new facilities or services. The Capital Improvement Program is realistic and attainable within the financial capabilities of the County and it provides for the future needs of Ocean County residents.

The accompanying forms which comprise the Capital Budget and six-year Capital Improvement Program have been completed in accord with regulations adopted by the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey pursuant to powers authorized by NJSA 52:27BB-10, NJSA 40A:4-43 to 45. The Capital Budget forms list all projects scheduled for startup for the 2021 Budget year and the source of funding for each project. A summary of Anticipated Funding Sources and Amounts is also included. Please note that this summary shows funding needed for new capital projects. It does not include previous appropriations for projects to be continued in 2021. For this reason, the funding summary differs slightly from the total cost shown for the Capital Program.

The total cost of all Capital Improvement Projects over the six-year period is \$270,451,255. Many of the projects will be funded under State and Federal Grant Programs or through the annual Budget on a "pay-as-you-go" basis. The larger projects will be funded by short-term borrowing. Bonds will be issued at the most advantageous times to secure low interest rates.

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a County shall limit any increase in the tax levy to 2.5% unless authorized by resolution to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's tax levy, subject to certain exceptions; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a County may, when authorized by resolution, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual tax levy and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its tax levy in either of the next two succeeding years; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the County of Ocean hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to the final tax levy in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Ocean, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2021 budget year, any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to the final tax levy in either of the next two succeeding years, and that the CY 2021 County budget for the County of Ocean be approved and adopted in accordance with this resolution; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this resolution as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this resolution be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of adoption.

WHEREAS, P.L. 2015, c.249 requires a county entity to submit a budget request to the county governing body that is comprised of two parts: the amount to be raised by property taxation, and the amount to be funded wholly through federal or State funds, fees raised by the county entity, or other sources; and

WHEREAS, notwithstanding the budget request submitted by the County Sheriff's Department, the Board of Commissioners of the County of Ocean finds it advisable and necessary for purposes of health, safety and welfare to authorize the County Sheriff's Department to increase its appropriations beyond the maximum permitted by the budget request cap set forth in P.L. 2015, c.249; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the County of Ocean hereby determines that a 8.5% increase beyond the maximum increase permitted by the budget request cap set forth in P.L. 2015, c.249, which amounts to \$1,800,000 in excess of the increase in the portion of the budget request funded by property taxation otherwise permitted P.L. 2015, c.249, is advisable and necessary be incorporated into the base from which the County Sheriff's Department budget request increases in CY 2021 and subsequent years are to measured; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the County of Ocean has determined that a 8.5% increase beyond the maximum increase permitted by the budget request cap set forth in P.L. 2015, c.249 shall not cause the County of Ocean to exceed the levy caps set forth in 1977 and 2010 levy cap laws (N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.4 and N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.45 respectively).

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Ocean, a majority of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2021 budget year, the final appropriations of the County Sheriff's Department shall, in accordance with this resolution, be increased by 8.5% beyond the maximum increase permitted by the budget request cap set forth in P.L. 2015, c.249, amounting to \$1,800,000 in excess of the increase in the portion of the budget request funded by property taxation otherwise permitted P.L. 2015, c.249, and that said increase shall be presented as part of the county budget submission to be approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this resolution shall be submitted to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services alongside all other documents required to be submitted with the introduced county budget.

March 3, 2021

WHEREAS, The Office of the Attorney General of the State of New Jersey has issued Formal Opinion No. 23-1977 that requires officers engaged in police related activities for private persons or entities during their off duty hours make arrangements with the employing agency for payment of wages associated with this outside employment; and

WHEREAS, Local Finance Notice CFO 2000-14 permits for receipt of fees collected from private persons or entities for the payment of wages and operating costs for law enforcement officers to provide for off-duty or outside employment services; and

WHEREAS, permission is required of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services for approval as a dedication by rider of revenues received by a County when the revenue is not subject to reasonably accurate estimates in advance; and

WHEREAS, it has become necessary to establish a Trust Fund dedicated to the payment of wages and operating costs for outside employment of Off-Duty Officers; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-39 provides the dedicated revenues anticipated from the Outside Employment of Off-Duty Officers are hereby anticipated as revenue and hereby appropriated for the purpose to which said revenue is dedicated by statute or other legal requirement; and

WHEREAS, the Ocean County Board of Chosen Freeholders previously adopted a Resolution on May 20, 2015, which established the necessary Rules and Regulations for the Outside Employment of Off-Duty Sheriff's Officers, and sought permission from the Director of the Division of Local Government Services to pay expenditures related to Outside Employee of Off-Duty Sheriff's Officers; and

WHEREAS, permission has previously been granted from the Director of the Division of Local Government Services to pay expenditures related to Outside Employee of Off-Duty Sheriff's Officers; and

WHEREAS, the previously adopted Rules and Regulations for the Outside Employment of Off-Duty Sheriff's Officers must be amended to reflect an increase in the rate.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE OCEAN COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS, STATE OF NEW JERSEY ON THIS 17TH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 2021, AS FOLLOWS:

2. The Director of the Board of Commissioners is hereby authorized to execute a Memorandum of Agreement with Sheriff's PBA Locals 379 and 379A which reflects the amended Rules and Regulations for the Outside Employment of Off-Duty Sheriff's Officers.
3. The Board of Commissioners does hereby request permission of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services to pay expenditures related to the Outside Employment of Off-Duty Officers in accordance with the Revised Rules and Regulations for the Outside Employment of Off-Duty Sheriff's Officers as reflected in Exhibit A.
4. A copy of this Resolution shall be made available to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, County Auditor, Chief Financial Officer, County Counsel, the Employee Relations Department, the Office of the Sheriff, and any applicable majority representative.

EXHIBIT A.
COUNTY OF OCEAN

Rules and Regulations for the Outside Employment of Off-Duty Sheriff Officers

1. **Extra-duty employment of Sheriff's officers**

- A. To accommodate those persons and entities requiring the services of off-duty Sheriff's officers and to authorize their off-duty employment, the County hereby establishes this policy and procedures.
- B. Sheriff's Officers deemed eligible by the Sheriff to do so shall be permitted to accept law-enforcement-related employment from nongovernmental employers and school districts only during their off –duty hours and at such times as will not interfere with the efficient performance of regularly scheduled or emergency duty for the County.
- C. Persons or entities wishing to employ off-duty Sheriff's Officers must make their request through the Sheriff. The Sheriff may grant such request when, in his/her opinion, such employment will not be inconsistent with the efficient functioning and good reputation of the Sheriff's Office and would not unreasonably endanger or threaten the safety of the officer(s) who will be working the assignment(s).

2. **Requests for Services**

- A. Any person or entity seeking to employ off-duty Sheriff's officers shall first obtain the approval of the Sheriff or his/her designee. The Sheriff or his/her designee is authorized to execute an agreement with the applicant for services needed, which agreement shall set forth the specific nature of the services to be performed, the location, dates and hours of service, payment arrangements mandated herein, number of officers needed, insurance coverage and/or any other provisions required by law or regulation of the State of New Jersey. The applicant must first file a request for services with the Sheriff's Outside Employment Unit ("OEU"). The applicant must include in the request for services evidence that the Chief Law Enforcement Officer of the local municipality is unable or unwilling to provide off-duty officers.
- B. Any Sheriff's officer, when so employed by any person or entity, shall be treated as an employee of that person or entity. Any and all wages earned for outside employment shall not be applied toward the pension benefits of Sheriff's officers so employed, nor shall hours worked for outside employment be considered in any way compensable as overtime under the Fair Labor Standards Act or compensable in any other manner that requires the County to pay the officers by County funds through its payroll system. All Sheriff's officers shall be subject to the policies, procedures, directives,

rules and regulations of the Sheriff, the Ocean County Prosecutor's office and the Attorney General's Office of the State of New Jersey.

3. **Billing/payment schedule/escrow accounts**

Billing periods. Billing and payment practices for persons or entities contracting for the provision of security services by off-duty Sheriff's officers shall be conducted in accordance with local finance laws and regulations promulgated by the Local Finance Board.

- A. The County has established an escrow account dedicated to the payment of off-duty Sheriff's Officers for outside employment by private contractors. Any prospective contractor must apply to the Sheriff, requesting off-duty police services. The written application shall include the following information:
- i. The dates that off-duty police vehicle(s) will be needed.
 - ii. An estimate of the number of hours the contractor anticipates using the off-duty police officer(s) and, if appropriate, police vehicles.
 - iii. A check to cover the cost of the off-duty police services and use of any County vehicles based on the estimated number of hours shall be submitted before the start of off-duty employment in accordance with state and Division of Local Government services regulations.
- B. Prospective contractors who continuously request off-duty police service, or anticipate a need for periodic or long-term off-duty police services, may request to deposit monies with the County on an ongoing basis to be depleted as such work is performed. Funds on deposit shall not earn interest.
- C. If the contractor's needs exceed the estimated sum in the escrow account, the Sheriff, or his designee, shall immediately notify the contractor that the funds in the escrow account are insufficient to pay for continued off-duty police services. The contractor shall then either replenish the escrow account with a check sufficient to pay for continued services or the Sheriff shall immediately terminate provision of the off-duty police services to the contractor.
- D. If the contractor's estimated costs exceed the actual costs incurred, then the County shall, upon proper notice to the County Chief Financial Officer, refund the remainder of the escrow account.

- E. No sheriff's Officer shall accept any payment in any form from any person or entity other than the County, and unless that payment has been formally and permanently documented by the Chief Financial Officer of the County. No person or entity shall give or channel any form of payment or gratuity to any Sheriff's Officer in connection with the services of off-duty officers, but shall use the escrow account described in subsection A.

4. **Rates of compensation; administrative fees; payment for services**

Rates of compensation for contracting the services of off-duty Sheriff's officers shall be as follows:

- A. **Rate** - The rate of compensation for the contracting the services of off-duty Sheriff Offices shall be set, effective March 1, 2021, at a rate of \$75.00 per hour for each officer, of which \$15.00 per each hour shall be an administrative fee retained by the County.

B. **Minimum assignments**

1. **Four-hour minimum.** All assignments shall have a four-hour minimum per Officer contracted. Sheriff's officers are entitled to the four-hour minimum if the assignment is cancelled upon their arrival at the job site, without prior notice. Sheriff's officers who begin an assignment that is cancelled before its completion shall be entitled the four-hour minimum or actual worked, whichever is longer.
2. **Two and one-half for Non-profit & schools.** All assignments for non-profits and/or schools shall have a two and one-half (2.5) hour minimum per Officer contracted. Sheriff's officers are entitled to the two and one-half minimum if the assignment is cancelled upon their arrival at the job site, without prior notice. Sheriff's officers who begin an assignment that is cancelled before its completion shall be entitled the two and one-half minimum or actual worked, whichever is longer.

5. **Contractor obligation and limitations**

Persons or entities contracting for off-duty law enforcement services are placed on notice that the Ocean County Sheriff is the primary employer of Sheriff's Officers and, in contracting for such services, expressly agree to the following conditions:

- A. **Police-related work.** Sheriff's officers providing law enforcement services shall not be required to perform non-police-related tasks. Police-related tasks. Police-related tasks typically involved crowd/traffic control and site security.

- B. Uniforms. Unless specifically authorized by the Sheriff, Sheriff's Officers shall be in uniform. Requests from persons or entities for Officers to work in a plain clothes' capacity shall be made in writing to the Sheriff, who in his/her sole discretion may approve or deny such a request for any or no reason.
- C. Cancellations. Persons or entities that have contracted for off-duty Sheriff's officers and wish to cancel must provide a minimum of two hours' notice or be subject to the four-hour minimum for each officer contracted.
- D. State of emergency. The Sheriff or his/her designee shall, at all times, have the authority to order any Sheriff's officer engaged in off-duty assignments to respond to an emergency situation. The Sheriff or his/her designee shall also have the right to order any off-duty assignment terminated whenever said assignment creates an unacceptable risk to the health, safety or welfare of the off-duty Officer and/or the citizens of Ocean County.

6. Insurance requirements

- A. Persons or entities contracting for off-duty law enforcement services are responsible for providing all insurance coverage as required by law. Each applicant shall provide the Ocean County Sheriff with appropriate certificates of insurance naming the County of Ocean and the Sheriff's officers as additionally insured and evidencing that the Sheriff's Officer and Ocean County are covered by general liability coverage of at least \$1,000,000 for each occurrence with respect to the services to be provided.
- B. The certificate of insurance or the policy shall contain the following language: "The Insurer shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the County of Ocean and Ocean County Sheriff, their employees, agents, servants, officials and administrators from and against any and all claims, or actions at law, whether for personal injury, property damage or liability including any costs of defense incurred by the County of Ocean and/or Ocean County Sheriff which arise from any acts or omissions of the insured, their employees, agents, servants, officials or administrators arising out of or related to the use of off-duty Ocean County Sheriff's officers"

7. Indemnification

- A. The person or entity contracting for off-duty law enforcement services and the applicable insurer shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the County of Ocean and Ocean County Sheriff, their employees, agents, servants, officials and administrators from and against any and all claims, or actions at law, whether for personal injury, property damage or liability including any costs of defense incurred by the County of Ocean and/or Ocean County Sheriff which arise from any acts or omissions of the insured, their

employees, agents, servants, officials or administrators arising out of or related to the use of off-duty Ocean County Sheriff's officers.

- B. This indemnification and hold harmless agreement shall apply in all instances, whether the County of Ocean and/or Ocean Sheriff are plaintiffs, defendants, direct parties to the initial action or claim or are subsequently made parties to the action by third-party in-pleading or are made parties to a collateral action arising, in whole or in part, from any of the issues from the original cause of action or claim.

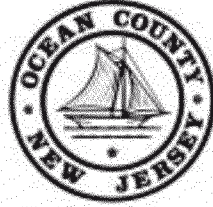

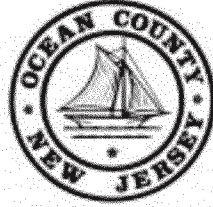

Commissioner Director Gary Quinn opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

This Pre-Board Meeting was held in Room 119 to abide by social distancing guidelines set forth by Governor Murphy. There were a maximum of 25 participants in the room at a time. A nurse interviewed and took temperatures of all in attendance. Carl Block stated that the Pre Board meeting was open to the public following guidelines for room capacity.

Commissioner Deputy Director Little shared the latest coronavirus statistics for Ocean County, which included 652 new cases, totaling 37,904 positive cases to date. There have been 1,410 deaths in Ocean County due to COVID-19. There are 45 long term care facilities with at least one case. Since the onset of COVID-19, the County has had 4,378 cases in long term care facilities, which represents 11.5% of the total cases. 621 deaths have occurred as well, representing 44% of all deaths. The testing site at Ocean County College had performed 346 tests the previous day, bringing the total to

22,073 tests so far. To begin administering the vaccine for COVID -19, the Health Department will be in coordination with many agencies to expedite the process of vaccinating all who are qualified to receive it. Commissioner Little expressed his thanks to Dan Regenye, the Public Health Coordinator, for working to keep the department running smoothly throughout the pandemic. Southern Regional High School will be added as a part time vaccination site. The Governor will be announcing that all residents 65 and up, and age 16-64 with compromising health conditions, will be eligible for the vaccine. Commissioner Little believes this will be a major task because there are over 200,000 residents over 65 in Ocean County. The County will need assistance to accommodate all of the vaccination requests. We will need additional vaccine, and more nurses to administer them. Commissioner Little believes it is essential that the Governor allocate the vaccine to doctor's offices, urgent care centers, and all outlets able to administer shots in an effort to alleviate the massive amounts of people flocking to the County vaccination site.

Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the recommendation to award the reconstruction and resurfacing of Shorrock Street from Rt. 70 to Beaverson Blvd. in Brick and Lakewood Townships to Earle Asphalt in the amount of \$1,870,313.13. This award is contingent upon NJDOT approval. Mr. Ernst also discussed the recommendation to award the underground storage tank removal and upgrade in Lakewood Township to Aurora Environmental, Inc. from Union Beach, NJ in the amount of \$297,311.60. The Toms River Business Improvement District requested the use of Washington Street again this year from Robbins St. to Main St. for Downtown Night Out from May 1, 2021 to October 29, 2021. The Board agreed. There were no questions or comments and all items will be listed on the Board agenda for the January 20, 2021 Board meeting.

Ms. Cilento reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of January 20, 2021. There were no questions or comments.

Commissioner Director Quinn asked the Board members for comments.

Commissioner Vicari mentioned that real estate prices in Ocean County are rising for sales and rentals as well. The health care industry, boating and fishing, office supplies, takeout food services, auto repair shops, and supermarkets are all doing very well during the pandemic. Hotels, caterers, restaurants, bars and dry cleaners are all suffering greatly. The Vocational School has shown increased enrollment.

Commissioner Director Quinn said that the real estate market is booming. Many people with second homes in Ocean County have moved here permanently. Schools on Long Beach Island have increased enrollment. In certain areas of the County, small businesses are struggling. Some bars and restaurants will not survive another season. CARES Act grant recipients are entitled to a \$30,000 grant to provide assistance with their commercial rent. A new grant for residential rental assistance is expected to be announced in the near future to help renters who have fallen behind, which is also negatively affecting landlords.

Commissioner Little said that Long Beach Island is seeing an influx of new residents from Northern NJ, NY, and PA.

Commissioner Director Quinn commended Commissioner Little and the Ocean County Health Department on doing an excellent job with testing and vaccines during the pandemic. The Director mentioned that if possible, we should tip wait staff, bartenders, barbers, and hair stylists a bit more, since their income has continued to be heavily impacted by the pandemic.

Commissioner Haines also thanked Commissioner Little and the Ocean County Health Department for doing an amazing job with the COVID-19 commitment, pushing to administer as many vaccines as possible at our facility, while requesting the vaccine to be given at doctor's offices to alleviate the masses at our facility.

There were no additional comments.

Ms. Cilento read the resolution to move to closed session.

On a motion by Commissioner Kelly, seconded by Commissioner Vicari, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 4:47pm for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was unanimously carried.

The meeting returned to Open Session at 5:26pm. There being no further business, on a motion by Commissioner Haines, seconded by Commissioner Little, the meeting adjourned at 5:27pm.

Commissioner Director Gary Quinn opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

This Pre-Board Meeting was held in Room 119 to abide by social distancing guidelines set forth by Governor Murphy. There were a maximum of 25 participants in the room at a time. A nurse interviewed and took temperatures of all in attendance. Carl Block stated that the Pre Board meeting was open to the public following guidelines for room capacity.

Commissioner Little shared the latest coronavirus statistics. Ocean County was in sixth place with 331 new cases; 43,263 in total. There were 9 new deaths, bringing the death toll to 1,541. Lakewood, Brick and Toms River continue to be the most highly affected areas. There are 47 long term care facilities with at least one case, bringing the total to 4,672, reflecting 10.7% of all affected cases, 657 deaths, reflecting 46.2% of the total deaths in Ocean County. The Commissioner mentioned that the number of residents seeking Covid-19 tests has leveled off recently. The total number of tests that have been performed at Ocean County College is 24,021. The hours of operation at the testing center will be modified to Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 9am – 3pm in February.

13,540 vaccines have been performed so far. Second doses have already begun to be administered.

Commissioner Director Quinn and Tony Agliata discussed the 2020 Recycling Program results. There were 83,418 tons of recyclables received in Ocean County; 11% more than 2019. 94 tons of documents were shredded. Each resident recycled almost 280 pounds of materials, which is an increase of 10.2% from 2019. 2,600 reusable shopping bags were distributed to residents. 286,000 households utilized our recycling programs.

Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the recommendation to award the Construction of Traffic Signal Contract 2020A in Lacey Township to S&G Paving Construction, Inc., from Jamesburg, NJ in the amount of \$666,102.51. Mr. Ernst also discussed the recommendation to advertise for the construction of traffic signal upgrades 2021A in Beachwood, Brick, Jackson and Stafford Township. At the Lanes Mill Rd and Garden State Parkway Exit 91 entrance ramp, the traffic signal pole has been hit many times. The signal will be set further back. The signal at Rt. 527/528 has also been hit, and will be relocated further back as well. Mr. Ernst also recommended Stormwater Management Contract 2020C in Jackson, Lacey and Berkeley Townships. There were no questions or comments and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the February 3, 2021 Board meeting.

Ms. Cilento reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of February 3, 2021. There were no questions or comments.

Commissioner Director Quinn asked the Board members for comments.

Commissioner Kelly discussed the growth in Ocean County's net valuation, stating the County has fully recovered from the financial devastation from Superstorm Sandy. We have stayed inside the 2% cap for the State of NJ, and Ocean County is in good financial standing.

There were no additional comments.

Ms. Cilento read the resolution to move to closed session.

On a motion by Commissioner Kelly, seconded by Commissioner Little, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 4:21pm for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was unanimously carried.

A nurse interviewed and took temperatures of all in attendance. Carl Block stated that the Pre Board meeting was open to the public following guidelines for room capacity.

Commissioner Little shared the latest Coronavirus statistics for Ocean County. On this day, the County ranked 7th in NJ with 268 new positive cases, and 47,765 cases in total. There have been 1,625 deaths in Ocean County due to the Coronavirus. The three towns with the highest rates of new cases are Lakewood with 67, bringing their total to 11,275, Toms River with 46, totaling 7,837, and Jackson with 30 new cases, totaling 4,919 since March 2020. There were 46 long term care facilities affected, totaling 677 cases. Ocean County College administered 276 tests, with 26,074 to date. The

vaccination site at Southern Regional High School performed 348 vaccines, and the site at Toms River North gave out 1,310 shots on February 9, 2021, with a total of 22,710 vaccines thus far. The Health Department has been flooded with calls from residents hoping to get scheduled for the COVID-19 vaccine. The County received 2,900 doses this week, and the Long Beach Island Health Department received 100.

Commissioner Kelly asked Commissioner Little how many vaccines are allocated to other facilities such as Ocean Health Initiatives, and Chem Ed. Mr. Block said all others received approximately 3,000 more. Commissioner Little said that CVS Pharmacy was supposed to begin administering the vaccine over the last few days, but the start date was pushed back. They have a Federal contract, and receive their vaccine directly from the Federal Government.

Administrator Block told the Board that approximately 67,000 vaccines have been administered in Ocean County in total. In the first few weeks, 40% of those vaccines were given to residents from outside of the County.

Commissioner Little said that all residents in long term care facilities have been vaccinated by the Federal government directly.

Commissioner Quinn said that second doses are separate from these counts. The 2,900 we receive are all first doses.

Commissioner Quinn and Mr. Agliata told the Board about the new 2021 Planning Department Data Book which was compiled by Mr. Agliata and the Planning Department. It contains useful information such as maps of County complexes, population trends derived from the 2020 Census, building permits and approved development applications, maps and lists of Ocean County Natural Lands properties, Parklands, Pinelands and CAFRA properties, and county, municipal, and business contacts. The book is available to view on the Planning Board's website.

Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda, which included the permission to advertise for the reconstruction and resurfacing of portions of certain county roads Contract 2020B, and for the permission to advertise for the construction of concrete sloping curb islands at two locations in Lacey Township.
