Proclamation

WHEREAS, on March 22, 1972, President Nixon signed into law a measure that amended the Older Americans Act of 1965 to include a national public-private nutrition program for individuals 60 years and older; and

WHEREAS, for over five decades, this landmark law has supported our nation's seniors and helped to fund community-based organizations – like Meals on Wheels – and it is still the only federal program designed specifically to meet the nutritional and social needs of older adults, and

WHEREAS, Meals on Wheels of Ocean County provides nutritious meals, both home-delivered and at the Community Cafes to seniors throughout Ocean County that help them maintain their health and independence, thereby helping to prevent unnecessary falls and hospitalizations and provide necessary connections. Meals on Wheels of Ocean County has served our communities admirably for 50 years; and

WHEREAS, Meals on Wheels of Ocean County delivers daily nutrition to homebound and food insecure older adults while the drivers provide all the important wellness and safety checks to ensure our seniors remain safe, living independently where they are most comfortable, their Home, and

WHEREAS, Meals on Wheels of Ocean County offer a powerful opportunity for social connection for 2,000 seniors to help combat the negative health effects and economic consequences of loneliness and isolation; and

WHEREAS, the senior population is substantially increasing, and action is needed now to support local Meals on Wheels programs through federal, state and local funding; volunteering; donations; and raising awareness to ensure these vital services can continue to be delivered for years to come; and

WHEREAS, Meals on Wheels of Ocean County serves over 260,000 meals a year to seniors who are still threatened by or experience hunger, 62% of seniors are lonely, and it is imperative to End the Wait so that all who need services receive them; and

WHEREAS, Meals on Wheels programs from across the country are joining together for the End the Wait campaign this March and beyond to celebrate their collective success and to generate the support needed to ensure these critical programs can continue to address food insecurity and malnutrition, combat social isolation and loneliness, enable safety and independence and improve health outcomes.

ORDINANCE #2025-1

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE RECONSTRUCTION AND RESURFACING OF CERTAIN COUNTY ROADS, ALL LOCATED IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND APPROPRIATING \$6,000,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$5,700,000 IN BONDS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN TO FINANCE THE SAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING) AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The following is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the County of Ocean as general improvements, the reconstruction and resurfacing of certain County roads, all in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, in accordance with plans and specifications on file in the Ocean County Engineering Department, including all else necessary therefor and incidental thereto. SECTION 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared that the improvements or

purposes, the estimated cost of the improvements and appropriation therefor, down payment and estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes authorized are as follows:

SECTION 3. There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$6,000,000, including the sum of \$300,000 as the down payment, for the improvements or purposes described in Section 1 hereof as required by the Local Bond Law. The down payment has been made available by virtue of provision in the Capital Improvement Fund of the County of Ocean in one or more previously adopted budgets.

SECTION 4. There is hereby authorized the issuance of negotiable bonds in an aggregate principal amount of \$5,700,000 to finance part of the cost of the purposes stated in Section 1 hereof. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding the limit authorized by law, and the maturities, method of sale and other details thereof shall be determined by subsequent resolutions to be adopted in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 5. In order to temporarily finance the purposes provided for in Section 1 hereof, there is hereby authorized the issuance of bond anticipation notes of said County in an

aggregate principal amount of \$5,700,000. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the County Comptroller; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and shall be in such form as may be determined by the County Comptroller. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING) AS FOLLOWS[.]

SECTION 1. There is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the County of Ocean as general

improvements: the reconstruction and widening of Cross Street, located in the Township of Lakewood, in the

County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, in accordance with plans and specifications on file in the Ocean

County Engineering Department, including all else necessary therefor and incidental thereto.

SECTION 2 It is hereby found, determined and declared that the improvements or purposes, the

estimated cost of the improvements and appropriation therefor, down payment and estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes authorized are as follows.

SECTION 3. There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$11,000,000, including the sum of \$550,000 as the down payment, for the improvements or purposes described in Section 1 hereof as required by the Local Bond Law. The down payment has been made available by virtue of provision in the Capita Improvement Fund of the County of Ocean in one or more previously adopted budgets

SECTION 4. There is hereby authorized the issuance of negotiable bonds in an aggregate principal amount of \$10,450,000 to finance part of the cost of the purposes stated in Section 1 hereof Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding the limit authorized by law, and the maturities, method of sale and other details thereof shall be determined by subsequent resolutions to be adopted in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 5. In order to temporarily finance the purposes provided for in Section 1 hereof, there is hereby authorized the issuance of bond anticipation notes of said County in an aggregate principal amount of \$10,450,000. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the County Comptroller; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and shall be in such form as may be determined by the County Comptroller. The County Comptroller shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this Ordinance, and the County Comptroller's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8.1. The County Comptroller is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The County Comptroller is directed to report in writing to the Board of Commissioners at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this Ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 6. The County reasonably expects to commence acquisition and/or construction of the improvements described in Section 1 hereof, and to advance all or a portion of the costs in respect thereof, prior to the issuance of bonds or notes hereunder. To the extent such costs are advanced, the County further reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance, in an aggregate amount not to exceed the amount of bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof. This bond ordinance is intended to be a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 7. Any grant monies received for the purposes described in Section 1 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

SECTION 8. The amount of the proceeds of the obligations authorized by this Ordinance which may be used for the payment of interest on such obligations, architects' fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses, and other items as provided in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 shall not exceed the sum of \$5,500,000.

SECTION 9. The Capital Budget of the County of Ocean is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. In the event of any such inconsistency and amendment, the resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended Capital Budget and Capital Program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners and is available there for public inspection.

SECTION 10. It is hereby found, determined and declared as follows:

A. The improvements or purposes described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses. They are improvements or purposes the County may lawfully undertake as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property benefitted thereby.

B. The average period of usefulness of the improvements for which the obligations authorized by

this Ordinance are to be issued is twenty (20) years.

C. The supplemental debt statement provided for in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-10 was duly filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners prior to the passage of this Ordinance on first reading, and a complete executed duplicate of such supplemental debt statement has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey, and such supplemental debt statement shows that the gross debt of the County as defined in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-43 is increased by this Ordinance by \$10,450,000 and the obligations authorized by this Ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

SECTION 11. In the event the monies set forth above for any purpose is not necessary for said purposes, then such monies shall be for the completion of any of the other purposes provided for in this Ordinance.

SECTION 12. The full faith and credit of the County of Ocean shall be pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds and notes authorized by this Ordinance, and as long as any of said bonds or notes are outstanding, an appropriation shall be included in each annual budget of the County hereafter adopted in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds or notes maturing in each year. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the County, and the County shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the County for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

SECTION 13. After passage upon first reading of this Ordinance, the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners is hereby directed to publish the full text of the Ordinance, together with the notice set forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF PENDING ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-19, at least seven days prior to the date set for public hearing and further consideration for final passage (which date shall be at least ten days after introduction and first reading). The Clerk of the Board of Commissioners is further directed to comply with all provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-17(b) regarding postings, publications, and the provision of copies of this Ordinance.

SECTION 14. After final adoption of this Ordinance by the Board of Commissioners, the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners is hereby directed to publish the full text of this Ordinance, as finally adopted, together with the notice set forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-19.

SECTION 15. The Board of Commissioners of the County hereby covenants on behalf of the County to take any action necessary or refrain from taking such action in order to preserve the tax-exempt status of the bonds and notes authorized hereunder as is or may be required under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and the regulations promulgated thereunder (the "Code"), including compliance with the

Code with regard to the use, expenditure, investment, timely reporting and rebate of investment earnings as may be required thereunder.

SECTION 16. This Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final passage.







I. <u>PURPOSE</u>: This policy is established to set forth the responsibilities of employees, interns, volunteers, vendors, contractors, and other individuals, entities, or business who have been granted access to information of a confidential and sensitive nature, as well non-public information

This policy shall set forth the expected and required obligations of employees and other individuals granted access to *confidential or sensitive information or data and/or other non-public information,* as well as the potential penalties associated with a violation for the unauthorized disclosure of *confidential or sensitive information or data and/or other non-public information.*

II. <u>SCOPE</u>: This policy in its entirety applies to all employees of the County of Ocean, interns, volunteers, outside vendors, and contractors doing business with the County of Ocean.

III. DEFINITIONS

- A. "<u>OCIT</u>": As used in this Policy and attached Agreement, "OCIT" means the Ocean County Information Technology department.
- B. <u>Confidential or Sensitive Information or Data</u>: As used in this Policy and attached Agreement, confidential or sensitive information or data shall include, but is not limited to: passwords, emails, law enforcement data, Social Security numbers, legally protected information, financial reports, security parameters and configurations, payroll information, personnel records, employee medical records, system logs and network traffic data, or similar type information or data. This information or data is subject to County policies, Federal and State laws and regulations, and special handling requirements.

C. <u>Non-public information:</u> As used in this Policy and attached Agreement, non-public information is information obtained in the course of performing which the public would not have access

IV. POLICY

- A. Employees, interns, volunteers, vendors, and/or contractors may be granted access to confidential or sensitive information or data and/or non-public information only in circumstances required for the employee, interns, volunteer, vendor, and/or contractor to have such access in order to perform and fulfill the responsibility of the job, assignment, agreement, or contract of the employee, intern, volunteer, vendor, and/or contractor, and/or contractors.
- B. Any individual or entity that has been granted, given, or otherwise comes into possession or knowledge of confidential or sensitive information or data and/or non-public information, is obligated to keep such data and information confidential, and shall not disclose to any unauthorized person, business, or entity.
- C. Any individual or entity that has been granted, given, or otherwise comes into possession or knowledge of confidential or sensitive information or data and/or non-public information shall not disclose such confidential or sensitive information or data and/or con-public information to any person, entity, department, or agency, unless the person, entity, department, or agency to whom the disclosure is made was authorized to have or be granted such access by the County, or otherwise required by law.
- D. Any employee assigned a County computer user login ID shall be required to develop a password and adhere to safeguards instituted by the County to ensure confidentiality of non-public data and/or other confidential or sensitive information or data.
- E. Anyone granted or given access to confidential or sensitive information or data and/or non-public data shall be required to execute an agreement acknowledging the person's obligations to keep confidential and not disclose such confidential or sensitive information or data and/or non-public information. Further anyone granted access to confidential or sensitive information or data and/or non-public information shall acknowledge the prohibition of disclosing such access to confidential or sensitive information or data and non-public information.
- F. The Agreement to be executed by individuals granted access to confidential or sensitive information or data and/or non-public information is attached hereto as Attachment A.

V. <u>PENALTIES</u>:

- A. Any employee of the County who disclosures confidential or sensitive information or data and/or non-public information, or other violation of this Policy and/or the attached Agreement shall be subject to disciplinary action, including possible termination.
- B. Any outside vendor that disclosures confidential or sensitive information or data and/or non-public information, or otherwise violates of this Policy and/or the attached Agreement shall be subject to the cancellation of any contract, agreement, or program with the County.

VI. DISSEMINATION

The County shall distribute this policy or a summarized notice of it, to all of its employees, including part-time and seasonal employees, as well as all contractors and vendors with access to *confidential or sensitive information or data and/or other non-public information*. This policy shall be provided to all new employees upon start of employment, and to all as well as all contractors and vendors who are provided access to *confidential or sensitive information or data and/or other non-public information upon entrance of a contract for the providing of services*. Further, this policy shall be posted on the County's online Employee Portal.

Ocean County Confidentiality, Non-Disclosure and Security Agreement

RESPONSIBILITIES

CONFIDENTIALITY

- A. Every person who has been given access to a County of Ocean (OC) information system or who has access to or knowledge of confidential or sensitive information or data, is obligated to keep such data confidential. Accordingly, every County of Ocean employee, student, volunteer, contractor, business associate, or guest who either has or will be given access to printed or online confidential data is required to read and acknowledge his or her understanding of this agreement before being granted access.
 - I will only access confidential or sensitive data for legitimate business purposes as permitted by the County and will not use confidential or sensitive data for personal use. I understand that confidential or sensitive data includes but is not limited to databases and records containing Social Security numbers, financial data, non-published telephone numbers, personnel records, law enforcement data, medical history, and insurance coverage information.
 - 2. I will not leave confidential or sensitive data in view of others who do not have a legitimate business reason to view the data and I will only share confidential data with persons having authorized access.
 - I will not discuss confidential or sensitive information or data in public places and will not copy or remove confidential or sensitive data from my work site without OC Administrator, Assistant Administrator, Chief Financial Officer (CFO), or Director of Employee Relations.

NON-DISCLOSURE AGREEMENT

- B. As an employee, contractor or consultant of the County of Ocean, and related to my job responsibilities or assigned tasks, I may have access to, come in contact with, or reference confidential or sensitive information or data. Examples of this information and data include, but are not limited to: passwords, emails, law enforcement data, Social Security numbers, legally protected information, financial reports, security parameters and configurations, payroll information and personnel records, system logs and network traffic data, etc. This information or data is subject to County policies as well as regulatory and special handling requirements.
 - 1. I accept responsibility for appropriate handling and management of information and data whether I come into contact with such information through my authorized access or in error.
 - 2. I will maintain the confidentiality of this information and if uncertain about the appropriateness of who this information may be shared with in the course of my authorized access, I will discuss any questions I have with my supervisor, or the OCIT Network Security office. I understand that even the most innocuous file can contain confidential information.

Ocean County Confidentiality, Non-Disclosure and Security Agreement

3. In all instances as described above, I acknowledge my personal obligation to protect, through execution of reasonable steps, the confidentiality, integrity and privacy of this data in accordance with OC and OCIT policies, regulatory requirements or other special handling requirements, and prevent unauthorized access, modification, destruction or disclosure of sensitive or confidential data. In the absence of stated guidance or without a clear indication of sensitivity, I will treat and handle all data as if it were sensitive.

C. C. Acknowledgement

- 1. I have read and understand the statements presented in the above "Responsibilities" section regarding my permitted and potential/inadvertent access to confidential or sensitive information or data.
- 2. I agree with these stated responsibilities.
- 3. I understand that misuse of confidential or sensitive information or data, whether intentional or due to neglect on my part, is a breach of policy and grounds for corrective action which may include my dismissal, the termination of access to OC resources, or the termination of a contractual agreement and may subject me to possible civil and/or criminal legal action.

COMPUTER ACCESS (SECURITY) AGREEMENT

- D. During the course of my work or activities at the County of Ocean, I may be assigned a computer user login ID and instructed to develop personal passwords. In order to maintain the confidentiality of non-public data, I agree to the following:
 - I will adhere to the County of Ocean's Electronic Device and System Acceptable Use Policy, and the IT Password Policy #0001, and to any additional specific policies that I may be asked to follow.
 - 2. I will obtain authorization from OC management and OCIT prior to gaining access to those specific computer functions necessary to perform my responsibilities.
 - 3. I will not share my computer user login IDs and passwords with anyone, at any time, for any reason, except in cases necessary to facilitate computer maintenance and repairs.
 - 4. I will not leave a terminal, personal computer or computer workstation without locking or ending any application that either contains or can be used to access confidential or sensitive information or data.
 - 5. I will not disclose any budget, financial, personnel, payroll or procurement information except to the extent necessary to carry out the responsibilities of my employment or as otherwise required by the law.
 - 6. I will contact the OCIT immediately if I discover that my computer user login ID or password has been compromised, if I suspect that a County digital asset has been misused, or if I suspect that someone has obtained unauthorized access to confidential or sensitive information or data on any County information system.

WHEREAS, the Ocean County Board of Commissioners is desirous of having the New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) relocate the Delaware and Raritan River railroad runaround away from the County Road Cross Street in the Township of Lakewood; and

WHEREAS, the County Engineer is confident that the runaround relocation would substantially enhance vehicular safety and traffic flow at this location by eliminating the need for the roadway to close for railroad crossing; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) and the Delaware and Raritan River Railroad LLC have initiated the Delaware and Raritan River Lakewood Runaround Relocation construction project with Tracks Unlimited LLC to relocate the Cross Street runaround away from Cross Street in the Township of Lakewood; and

Director John P. Kelly opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Michael J. Fiure, County Administrator Christine Allen, Recording Secretary Michelle I. Gunther, Clerk of the Board John C. Sahradnik, Jr., County Counsel

Commissioner Kelly and Mr. Jehnke reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the recommendation to advertise for the reconstruction and resurfacing of Long Beach Boulevard in Beach Haven from end to end. The long-term plan is to replace Long Beach Boulevard fully. Mr. Jehnke will bring the full schedule to the next PreBoard meeting. Speed limits will be lowered on County Roads #10 and #12 in Little Egg Harbor. Mr. Jehnke mentioned that the paving project on Cross Street in Lakewood was not finished before winter, so a portion still needs to be completed. The County is working on a project on Prospect / Cross Street / Route 9 to address drainage, shoulder, and sidewalk improvements. Dozens of intersections in Lakewood and Jackson will be getting new traffic signals to improve safety and address resident complaints. Sheriff Mastronardy thanked Mr. Jehnke and the Engineering Department for their help during recent power outages. There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the February 5, 2025 Board meeting.

Mr. Agliata told the Board about a recommendation by the Ocean County Agricultural Development Board and the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee to acquire an 18.92-acre development easement on the Cameron Farm located on Long Swamp Road in Plumsted Township. 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State preserved open space as well as the Joint Base. The landowner has accepted an easement value of \$375,000.00. A public hearing will be held at the February 5, 2025 Board meeting.

Mr. Agliata also discussed the 2025 residential document shredding program which will take place at various locations throughout the County over 12 dates between April and October. Over 90 tons of paper were collected and shredded last year. *flyer attached

Ms. Gunther reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of February 5, 2025. There were no questions or comments.

Director Kelly asked the Board members for comments.

There were no additional comments.

Mr. Collins met with Ernest Bock and Sons, the Construction Managers for the Justice Complex Annex project and provided an update on the progress of the building. The foundation, footings, slabs, elevator shafts, stairwells, and rigid inclusion are complete. JCP&L needs to relocate wire. They will be setting the steel in 30-40 days. The elevator design is complete, and a 300-ton crane will be on site shortly. A projected completion date of late 2026 has been provided.

Mr. Fiure discussed an Executive Order from the White House indicating all existing windmill projects must pause immediately. Director Kelly advised Mr. Fiure to notify Long Beach Island that we will be suspending funding for the existing windfarm lawsuit at this time. A supporting Resolution will be added to the agenda. The Board will send a letter thanking Mr. Trump for this Executive Order.

Sheriff Mastronardy spoke with the State Police Colonel regarding the increase in drones in our area recently and discussed ways to mitigate them.

Commissioner Bacchione would like to add a resolution encouraging the State to fund the education of undocumented children. All agreed.

Commissioner Arace has met with Ocean County Vocational Technical School regarding a new program for EMS, EMT, and Fire Training during Junior and Senior years of high school. There is a great need for EMT's, and this would help with municipal demand. A program will be developed with the help of Brian Gabriel and discussed at the next PreBoard meeting on February 26, 2025. The Commissioners agreed with the plan.

Commissioner Bacchione visited the County Connection and was met with a welleducated staff, and felt the satellite office in the Ocean County Mall is very beneficial to residents. River branch of the OC Library that made staff feel unsafe and requested a Sheriff's Officer be present in the library at all times.

Commissioner Sadeghi said that the Jon Bon Jovi Soul Kitchen will be opening for a three-month period in the Ocean County Library.

Director Kelly discussed a letter he received from the Eagleswood Cemetery requesting the County purchase an adjacent property. The cemetery is running out of space and needs the area to expand. There may be grants available to them. Tim Hart will follow up with the cemetery owners.

Director Kelly discussed rehiring Warden Valenti upon his retirement.

Ms. Gunther read the resolution to move to closed session.

On a motion by Commissioner Haines, seconded by Commissioner Bacchione, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 4:52pm for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was unanimously carried.

The meeting returned to Open Session at 5:55pm. There being no further business, on a motion by Commissioner Arace, seconded by Commissioner Bacchione, the meeting adjourned at 5:55pm.


