OTHER CONDITIONS

- 1. Material and supplies will be billed at the County's bid price or State Contract price, whichever applies.
- 2. A fee of \$32.00 per ton will be billed for each ton of asphalt installed to defray labor and equipment costs. Materials (asphalt plus oil adjustment in addition to the profiler machine & fuel adjustment-if needed) to be billed at County costs.
- 3. During a Schedule "C" paving project, it is up to the municipality to coordinate a proper traffic control plan with your public works. If this is not an option, traffic control services will be supplied by the County at the current Schedule C labor rates. However, if you choose to use your police department it is up to your municipality to set aside monies and facilitate this plan.
- 4. A hauling fee of \$3.00 per cubic yard based upon the size of the truck will be billed for each load of material hauled for the Local Governmental Unit, other than asphalt. (For example, the charge per load for a 6 cubic yard truck would be \$18.00, a 12 cubic yard truck \$36.00 and so forth). The Local Governmental Unit is responsible for the disposal costs. *The cost of the operator and truck will be additional, billed hour for hour as per the attached rate schedule in addition to the material cost.*
- 5. A fee of \$5.00 per cubic yard for each cubic yard of material hauled and installed (other than asphalt) will be billed for each load of material hauled and installed. The cost of the operator and equipment will be additional, billed hour for hour as per the attached rate schedule in addition to the material cost.
- 6. A fee of \$110.00 per cubic yard of material screened will be billed to defray labor and equipment costs. *The cost of disposal at the Landfill and testing of material, if necessary, will be additional.*
- 7. A line Striping fee of \$.25 per foot of striping will be billed to defray labor and equipment costs. If required, costs for layout will be additional. Stripping services are provided in conjunction with a County overlay of a local road only.
- 8. A fee of \$30.00 per vehicle will be billed for the use of the County's Wash Pad service and a fee of \$35.00 per vehicle will be billed for the use of the County's Truck Wash service.
- 9. As per the Ocean County Vehicle Services Director, the labor rate is \$59.00 per an hour.
- 10. The price of fuel is derived from the Friday, Oil Price Information Service "Oil Price Daily" plus the vendor's mark up as laid out in the County's gasoline and diesel fuel bid. This will be the price charged from Saturday through the next Friday. This type of agreement will solely be executed through Vehicle Services.
- 11. In regards to any bulkhead projects we ask that you coordinate with our Engineering Department prior to submission of your plans. This will reduce the possibility of having issues with material availability.

Director Gary Quinn opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Commissioner Little shared the latest coronavirus statistics for Ocean County. There were 200 new cases, which is slightly higher than the past week. Although seven people passed away overnight, there are no documented cases of a minor passing away from the virus. The total of COVID-19 related deaths has now reached 2,152. Lakewood, Brick, and Jackson had the most cases. Of the 186 breakthrough cases, (people who were vaccinated, but still contracted COVID-19) only 5 were hospitalized, and 3 of the 5 had pre-existing conditions. One month ago 20% of all new positives were breakthrough cases, now only 14% of new cases have been previously vaccinated. Ocean County has vaccinated 113,100 residents. The County will have many sites available throughout the fall season to get both the COVID-19 vaccine as well as the flu shot.

Commissioner Haines shared the new election and early voting public service announcement that she and County Clerk Scott Colabella appeared in. It explains the process of early voting with new voting machines and e-poll books, and answers many questions voters may have regarding the new voting process mandated by the State. Commissioner Kelly asked that we verify that none of the early voting sites conflict with any of the vaccination sites that the Health Department has reserved. Mr. Fiure will discuss with Dan Regenye.

Commissioner Kelly asked Carl Block to explain the process for keeping the voting machines secure during early voting. Mr. Block said that a Sheriff's Officer will remain on duty to guard the machines after the polls close from 8pm to 9am during the 9 days of early voting. Then on 10/31/21 after the polls close at 6pm, each machine will be transferred to the warehouse in Lakewood where they will remain secure until the polls close on Election Day when the votes will be counted.

Commissioner Haines stated that voters will still only be able to vote one time. The new machines are part of the State SVRS system, and will register an early vote, prohibiting a voter to vote again on Election Day. If a voter goes to the wrong polling place, an election worker can look up the correct one and print directions to the site.

Commissioner Vicari told the Board that two times per year in May and September all County monuments will be cleaned and maintained. The grounds in a 14x12 area around the World War I monument outside the Administration Building will be revitalized over the next few weeks.

Commissioner Vicari also told the Board that 120 Hooper Avenue will be getting a new sign, matching the one outside the Administration Building.

Director Quinn and Mr. Agliata told the Board about the new 2022 Recycling Guide, which has important information for residents regarding the new expanded recycling guidelines for Ocean County. Director Quinn commended Mr. Agliata and the Planning Department for their efforts in expanding the recycling program, which will begin to generate revenue for the County. Director Quinn also mentioned that the plastic bag ban will go into effect in May 2022.

Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the recommendation to award the construction of a traffic signal at West County Line Road and Teaberry Court in Lakewood to JC Contracting, Inc. from Rahway, NJ in the amount of \$267,521.60. Mr. Ernst also recommended awarding the reconstruction of the South Hope Chapel Road and Ridgeway Blvd. signalized intersection in Manchester Township to JC Contracting as well, in the amount of \$269,291.74. Mr. Ernst also mentioned that the County has drafted a resolution in support of Berkeley Township's request to NJDOT to pave the Route 9 corridor as soon as possible. There were no questions or comments and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the October 20, 2021 Board meeting.

Commissioner Vicari mentioned he had spoken with Congressman Chris Smith regarding the Social Security Cost of Living Increase from 1.3% in 2021 to 5.9% in 2022. Commissioner Vicari sent a resolution to all municipalities in support of the increase.

There were no additional comments.

Ms. Gunther read the resolution to move to closed session.

On a motion by Commissioner Little, seconded by Commissioner Haines, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 4:44pm for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was unanimously carried.

The meeting returned to Open Session at 5:24pm. There being no further business, on a motion by Commissioner Haines, seconded by Commissioner Kelly, the meeting adjourned at 5:24pm.
