

This is to certify that Michael Bishop enlisted August 24, 1862 and was Mustered into the United States service near Freehold, New Jersey As a private to serve nine months in Capt. Albert S. Clokes' "Company at 29th Regiment New Jersey Vol. Infantry" under the command of Colonel Edwin S. Applegate and William R. Taylor. Proceeded to Wahsington, D. C. upon arrival went into Carry's on East Capitol Hill, D. C. but soon after crossed into Virginia assigned to a Divisional Brigade, Casey's Division, Defense of Washington. Remained in this Vicinity employer in various duties until November 30th 1862. Ordered To Acquir Creek, Virginia and was assigned for Provost duty guarding The railroad and other duties. In January 1863 marched to the front Joined the main army and assigned to 3rd N. Brigade 1st Division, 1st Corps Army of the Potomac, participated in battles of Fredricksburg December 13th 1862 where he was wounded by a shell in the head. Also battle of Chancellorsville May 1863, returned to Freehold, New Jersey And was HONORABLY DISCHARGED June 30th 1863, by reason of Expiration of Term of service.
