The Regular Meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the County of Ocean was called to order on June 21, 2023 at 4:00 PM, Room 119, County Administration Building, 101 Hooper Avenue, Toms River, Ocean County, New Jersey, with Director Vicari presiding. DIRECTOR VICARI: "I will now turn the meeting over to the Clerk of the Board for the first proclamation and we will have an explanation. Please read it."

CLERK GUNTHER: "Thank you Director. Yes we have one proclamation on the agenda today proclaiming the month of June 2023 as 'Dystonia Awareness Month' in Ocean County and I will read the proclamation into the record."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Again, it's extremely important and it's one of public awareness. We have a spokesperson that's going to take the proclamation also tell us and explain about Dystonia. I think it's important because of the fact that going back many years ago when she called up to come before the Board, we did not realize until weeks later that there was someone in here that a member of their family had Dystonia that was on our professional staff and one other person. So if you would like to come forward and take the proclamation, both of you, and if you want to tell us some stories like you told us the last time of how important it is to be aware of it.

You can stay down there if you want and say a few words and then we'll take a picture. Go ahead before the microphone."

MARGUERITE WEISS, TOMS RIVER: "Hi. I'm Marguerite. This is my husband, Gary. I have Dystonia. As you just heard, Dystonia is a neurological movement disorder that causes muscle spasms and contractions and in my case, resulting in abnormal posture and gait. There are about 500,000 of us here in North America who have it. It's the third most common movement disorder following Essential Tremor and Parkinson's. There are more people with Dystonia than folks with Huntingdon's, Muscular Dystrophy and Lou Gehrig's Disease combined yet it is under-recognized and under-diagnosed by the medical community.

Not many people are aware that Dystonia even exists. Most folks have never heard of it. It's not a celebrity disease but Big Bird had it. Yes, Caroll Spinney puppetmaster, the man inside Big Bird had Dystonia. He died in 2019 from complications due to Dystonia. Keith Emerson, keyboardist from the 70's band Emerson, Lake and Palmer had Musician's Dystonia. He suffered from depression and anxiety caused by Dystonia and ended his own life in 2016. And of course we all know a man who is still suffering, poster child for Parkinson's Disease, 'Marty McFly' aka Michael J. Fox has Dystonia as do more than 30% of folks with Parkinson's. The Michael J. Fox Foundation is well-known for its focus on Parkinson's. They have collaborated with the Bachmann-Strauss Dystonia Foundation to conduct research in the field of Dystonia.

The beginning of my story is much the same as many folks with Dystonia. I was undiagnosed, misdiagnosed for years. I went to chiropractors and acupuncturists and orthopedists and was told you're out of alignment. You need an adjustment. Your chi is out of sync. You have herniated discs, stenosis, arthritis, etc. But the x-rays, mri's and ct scans don't show that a patient has Dystonia. I tried meds, a cortisone block, back patches and rounds and rounds of physical therapy with doctors remarking now and again, 'Why are you walking like that?' 'Well I was hoping that you could tell me.'

After many years, I was referred to a neurologist my physical therapist suggested and I was finally diagnosed with Dystonia, however, my paperwork still stated psychogenic. So my relief was accompanied by a familiar feeling that it was all in my head. After trying many medications all with side effects, I was finally referred to another neurologist – a Dystonia specialist – and tried more drugs. Botox, sonograms...finally in 2016 after two years in a wheelchair, I was considered a candidate for a type of brain surgery called Deep Brain Stimulation or DBS. By this point we were ready and said sign us up. We were hoping for some kind of relief and improvement in my mobility for Truncal Dystonia which presented like this. (demonstrates) And I had to drag my body around. It felt like I was always pushing that bad shopping cart down the aisles of the grocery store – frustrating and tiring.

I have Truncal Dystonia but essentially Dystonia can affect any part of the body and it can affect one or more parts of the body. I feel mostly mine in my lower back and my left hand and I drag my left leg. To undergo Deep Brain Stimulation after various pre-testing, my head was shaved and the first hole was drilled about the size of a dime in March 2016 to implant the first electrode. A month later a second hole was drilled to implant the second electrode. Two weeks later, pockets were created and batteries were inserted here and here under my collar bone and the wires were pulled down under my scalp and connected. They lasted three years.

Then in 2019 I got new rechargeable batteries and these are good for ten to twelve years, but I have to charge them so every other day I use my handy dandy charger which stays in my wall plugged in and it takes about an hour on each side.

What Deep Brain Stimulation does is it interrupts the excessive electrical impulses in the brain. But DBS is not for everyone and it's not successful for everyone. Even after brain surgery I still experience symptoms albeit less severe. I still have Dystonia and I have my good days and bad days. I have difficulty writing and my handwriting is tiny and sloppy. I make frequent errors while typing on a keyboard. My speech is affected. Sometimes I slur, clench my teeth, speak too softly, struggle to find words and my rate of speech is way too fast or I run out of breath or a mixture of any or all of these. I have trouble with balance and walking any distance. My back kind of hyper extends and I twist and lean to the right. Sensory tricks like walking with my fist in the small of my back helps temporarily or I'll stop and correct my posture. I call it rebooting. That works temporarily. Sometimes I feel twitching and pulling especially here (demonstrates). I shake or quiver – this is just from nerves though. And I frequently get foot and leg cramps and it's all so tiring! Stress makes it worse. Recently when I was dealing with extra stress my role at work was changed because I was not performing my job effectively. The good news is that Dystonia is generally not life-threatening but it is life-altering.

Everyone has their own story. This is mine. Sharing it is one small way that I can bring awareness to this little known disorder in hopes for better care and a cure.

For more information you can contact the Dystonia Medical Research Foundation. Thanks for listening and as folks in the Dystonia community say, 'Never, Never give up!'"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay. You know I think we're very proud and honored that you've come today and showed the courage that you did. You overcame a great deal. It goes to show with hard work and motivation and with your family that what you have done is very, very unbelievable.

Over the years that you've been coming here there has always been two people that came up to me later on and complimented you because someone in their family had it. So the awareness is very important. Coming forward, research and development is very important too with the research that is taking place.

So on behalf of all of the Board of Commissioners and the people of Ocean County, we just want to not only thank

you but we appreciate what you do as far as fighting Dystonia and early detection which is extremely important to us. And you sound good. You speak excellent!”

MARGUERITE WEISS: “Oh, thank you.”

DIRECTOR VICARI: "You have no problem with your speech. So I think she deserves a nice round of applause. Thank you very much for having the courage to come. We appreciate it.”

S. COMMISSIONER COMMENTS

At 4:23 PM, Director Vicari received the following comments from members of the Board:

DIRECTOR VICARI: "This is the part of our meeting where we have comments from the Board of Commissioners and professional staff then I will open it up to members of the public. Moving to my right, Commissioner Quinn."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "I'm on your left." (laughter)

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Your right, my left. Go ahead. I was just testing him to see if he was paying attention. To my left, I stand corrected."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "I have no comments to you with business. But anyone that's looking at me like I'm a nut wearing a hat, I apologize. I told the girls over there I was just hired as the model for Polo hats. But that's really not true. But I had some minor surgery done and unfortunately I have to keep this on for two or three more weeks. But everything came out great. I'm doing great. Other than Joe not knowing where I'm sitting, things are good."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "That's right. It was the sun in my face. Continuing, Commissioner Haines to my left."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Thank you Mr. Director. The only thing I want to say is we received two letters from the Department of Environmental Protection to inform us that New Jersey DEP and the Garden State Preservation Trust Fund have approved Ocean County's application for a Green Acres Matching Grant of \$771,750.00. The funding is contingent upon the passage of a legislative appropriation which of course is the budget for the State of New Jersey. It's going to be preserving land, improving local parks and stewarding our natural resources that are critical components of our efforts to ensure air quality, close to home recreational opportunities and open space for all residents. The Green Acres staff will be in contact with us with regards to it.

And the other one was same thing from the DEP to inform us that the DEP and Garden State Preservation Trust has approved Ocean County's application for a Green Acres Matching Grant of \$1,400,000.00 and the funding is again, contingent upon the passage of the legislative appropriation which would be the state budget. So hopefully that will be done."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Commissioner. Commissioner Crea."

COMMISSIONER CREA: "Yes, thank you Mr. Director. Today the Ocean County Board of Commissioners introduced an Ordinance that ultimately will create a Homelessness Trust Fund to better help us meet the evolving needs of the Ocean County disadvantaged and homeless population. While we discussed this at length at our PreBoard Meeting last week, I just want to briefly explain how this will help our residents.

Under the Homelessness Trust Fund, Ocean County, like twelve other counties in New Jersey, will apply a fee. In Ocean County it will be \$5.00 to most recorded instruments with the Ocean County Clerk's Office for a deposit into the County's Homelessness Trust Fund. The money will stay in Ocean County to support ongoing homelessness and housing instability programs along with the Code Blue Program. We can use the funds raised with more flexibility to provide rental assistance vouchers, supportive services and prevention services. The money can also be used for the acquisition, construction or rehabilitation of housing projects or units within housing projects that supply permanent affordable housing for homeless persons or families including those at risk for homelessness.

After its formal introduction today, a Public Hearing on the matter will be held during the 4:00 PM July 6th Board Meeting prior to adopting the measure. Once adopted, we will establish a task force to oversee the fund and serve as an advisory board that will serve as an advisory board to the Board of Commissioners. The fee is expected to go into effect September 1st.

If anyone has any questions, concerns or interests, please come and join us on July 6th and express your opinions.

Thank you all very much for taking the time and thank you Mr. Director.”

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Commissioner Crea. And again, if anyone has any questions or comments or whatever the case may be, after the meeting Commissioner Crea will be more than happy to discuss them with you. Thank you very much. I appreciate it.”

COMMISSIONER CREA: "You're more than welcome. Thank you.”

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Commissioner Kelly please.”

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "Thank you Mr. Director. This morning at 11:00 AM myself and Commissioner Quinn met with the architect for the new Courthouse and facilities across the street. We did that for one last review before we bring it to the Board for your review so that we can then vote to move the project forward. I was very satisfied with this morning's review. And I won't speak for Gary Quinn.”

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "Same thing. Yes.”

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "But I am sure that he was too. And we look forward to bringing that to the entire Board very shortly.”

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Commissioner. Commissioner Quinn, any comments on that? No?”

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "No, I mean the meeting was good. It brought us up to date and gave us a timeline, gave us a cost, all the important things that we should know. And as Commissioner Kelly said during the meeting, it was nice to see that the numbers have pretty much stayed the same even though we've seen such an increase in construction over the last couple of years. We haven't seen a real spike in the estimated costs of the building which is good. So it's something that we certainly have been working on for a long time. We're being mandated, of course, by the state, to create more courtrooms for the judges over there. And once it's actually built it's going to be a much better situation overall for all the courts as well as the safety of the people coming in and out of the building. So I think it's going to be a great project.”

DIRECTOR VICARI: "What's the opening date?”

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "As of right now, Jack, what are we talking? The end of 2025?”

DIRECTOR VICARI: "The end of 2025?”

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "The end of this year we should be able to break ground and then it's about two years construction from then so January, February, March of 2025 we should be then starting to move into the facility.”

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay, if there are no other questions I'll move on. The Administrator or the professional staff any questions before I open up to members of the public?”

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "No comments.”

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay if there are no other comments, I will open up to members of the public.”

T. PUBLIC COMMENTS - "Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of five (5) minutes per speaker."

At 4:29 PM, Director Vicari opened the meeting to receive comments from members of the public.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Again, please state your name and mailing address. I have to yield to a good friend of ours, Mr. O'Malley, who is the youngest guy in the office here, in the room, at 102. And we wish you a happy birthday in December. (applause) Again, I have permission to ask his age and talk to him about it. So Mr. O'Malley, since you are here today and you are an old friend of us for many, many years, please come forward to the microphone. And again, I distributed the letter that you gave in reference to your problem and we'll be more than happy to address your concerns if we can. Yes.”

THOMAS O'MALLEY, LAKEWOOD: "First thank you for your kind words. I'm not going to vote for you. (laughter) It's really difficult to be here. It really is because what I'm about to tell you is something that in my 40 years of politics I just can't understand it. But I live at Four Seasons, by the way, and recently there is an elected official from Ocean County, a State Senator, he's in the construction business. He applied for an application to build a cell tower right at the entranceway to Four Seasons. I cannot in a million years understand why anyone, forget about this elected official, would build a cell tower 100 feet or whatever it is – the distance – with 10-foot antennas on top. Why he would choose a 55+ regulated area to build this with all the real estate all over. But you have to understand certain people, the idea that is that because there is an abundance of utilities at the entranceway to our complex I assume that is one of the reasons why he wants to put it right in the parking lot. As soon as you come in we have a parking lot on the right and he wants to take half of the parking lot which is crowded now with Four Seasons cars and stuff. He wants to put it there.

And we have a board. And I know that government is very limited in what they can and cannot do because when the charter was given out to the seniors, we elected our own board and they're responsible to the residents there and that's where it ends and outside government has no jurisdiction over that. However, I cannot understand how an elected official could want to build a cell tower within the confines of the Four Seasons.

Number one, and we have a lot of people that have cancer there – I'm a survivor myself, my wife. God bless her. She just passed away last month. And there is a great percentage of people who live in these communities that have cancer whether they are being treated or in remission or whether they're cured or whatever it is and the idea that the emissions coming from this – the radiation – is and there is two sides to this...some say there is, some say there is not...but the assumption that the people take that there is interferes with the tranquility, the uncomfortableness of living near one. Homes are within, without exaggeration, I would say start about 50 feet away from this tower. I just can't imagine an elected official wanting to do this. But he's in business to make money and so forth.

But what I did was, in my 40 years in politics there are two people that really stand out all my life. People that I really adore. And believe it or not I'm not ashamed to tell you that I pray for every one of you every night. I really do. And along the way, I have been involved with many things with these two gentlemen that I'm going to tell you. Robert Singer from Lakewood is one of those people that has always been there. He is a defender of the people. He is there to help out. He always was. And the other person I have is this gentleman that I'm staring at right now, my dear friend Joseph, in all these years I've been dealing and I go back to when he was a principal of the school. And just recently I was with a group of people and a woman mentioned your name, what you did for her 23 years ago. People do remember things, Joe."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you."

THOMAS O'MALLEY: "And she's telling how cooperative you were. She had a child with special needs and how you went out of your way to make him comfortable and help him. So you see your legacy doesn't die just by one incident. And my experience with Joe all these years is the same thing. Anytime I ever called him, he was always there. He always, and all of you, and God bless all of you. I congratulate all of you. You do an excellent job with everything and I'm proud that you represent Ocean County. But my dear friend here, he stands out. He stands out in my mind for all these years for all the good things he did helping people.

But if you don't mind, I would like to take a minute or so to read a resolution that explains it better than I can. I authored it, but this will condense it to the point where you will understand it more than me standing here blabbing. And this was an email that I sent to State Senator Robert Singer and it states: This was last week by the way:

Dear Senator Singer:

It has been an honor to share with you both the concept of good government and being 'the voice of the people' you represent and serve.

Realizing that the State Senate has limitations regarding the approval where construction of Cell Towers can and cannot be built in the State of New Jersey, it is imperative that laws be passed to limit the proximity of where these Cell Towers can be placed in relation to 55+ senior developments in New Jersey.

In Ocean County, many of our seniors, as well as the general population, do not wish to have Cell Towers in close proximity to their homes. These Cell Towers present negative impacts to our citizens, especially to those seniors who are uneasy and frightened by the perception of health hazards caused by these towers. Also of concern to these seniors is the unsightly aesthetic and the devaluation of real estate. Ocean County enjoys a robust senior population. Seniors have flocked to our county in their 'retirement years' to enjoy all that Ocean County has to offer, including peace and contentment. They do not need the aforementioned concerns in their lives.

There is a move to build a Cell Tower here at the entrance area of Four Seasons. At the recent Community Board meeting on June 15, where there was overwhelming opposition to this project, I requested that any Board Member introduce a resolution to stop this madness. Not one Board Member would do so. The President of the Board has already hired an attorney to review this proposal. Can you imagine that within the board themselves, they hired an attorney to look at the proposal of putting a cell tower as soon as you drive into our community without nixing it right away and saying no, that is never going to happen, they hired an attorney to review it. Well over 300 people, it was more like close to 400 people, wanted this to end — but to no avail. No one stood up and entered a resolution.

Residents of Four Seasons, one-by-one, quoted the Master Declaration of Four Seasons — it all fell on deaf ears. We do vote these people in and outside government can't interfere in what we're doing and it's true — we voted these people in and we voted them in to do hopefully the sensible thing to protect us and the community. The Board's unwillingness to table this proposal brought much fear to residents who have serious health concerns. I am one.

Real quickly, you know this stuff about when you go to your dentist...I had serious surgery with two dental surgeons and had some part of my jaw bone removed. And every time I went there they took an x-ray and I was going to two different ones. Three of them really. And after a while I said, 'Geez, how many x-rays are you going to take of my teeth?' 'Well we need them.' Do you know I added it up, I had over a dozen x-rays taken in a short period of time. It was soon after that that they found 7 cancer lesions all over my face. I had 18 stitches on my nose. If you look at my ear, my ear is half an inch shorter than my other one. All around my mouth and cheek I had cancer. I had half of my lip opened up. Anyway, was that from the x-rays? I don't know that. But isn't it funny that I never had anything, only

around my mouth where the x-rays were taken?

But anyway it's people like me and I'm big enough to understand that. But we had one woman get up there to the microphone and cry where she's being treated for cancer. And whether or not the radiation exists or doesn't, there's pros and cons on both sides to that, but the perception that is there. And this board just looked at her like...she just moved there. She's only there five months. She was thinking about selling already because she can't stand the idea of living near a tower like that. And that's where we're at.

And I know that you're limited, everybody. But the purpose of why I am here today is that I know that you can't interfere with the goings on of places like Four Seasons because that's our duty – the residents there. But I can't believe that government cannot get involved and say no, wait a minute. If you know the research we did. These towers are going up around this area like pizza parlors. I mean they really are. Everybody wants to build one. And there's no definition or they don't care where. They just want it anyplace they can get to build one when they try."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "You know, Mr. O'Malley, I appreciate what you said and thank you for coming here. Senator Singer had told me you were going to come and you followed his recommendation. And again, I think the best thing that you can do is we are going to review it with County Counsel – I spoke to him before the meeting – is to go to the public hearing in Lakewood before it's done. It must go for a public hearing. And give your comments as you did today. It's controlled, as you know, by the FCC. I thought it was the Board of Public Utilities. I had it checked out before you came in. And I thank you for letting me know you were coming in yesterday. And we'll do everything possible. Right now in the Jersey Shore there's over twenty new cell towers being installed. I believe most of them by Verizon. I'm not sure. All of them, as you know, the poles when you see them up half are JCP&L, half are Verizon, so we just don't know. But we will look at it. We'll take it seriously. As you know Senator Singer has been very concerned. The public official that's involved with this is not from Ocean County. He is a public official I believe someplace in Monmouth County. I don't know where he lives, but it is not Bob Singer. I just want to clear that up so there's no misunderstanding when it's part of the record.

So again, we will review it. But again, I suggest that you go to the Lakewood, I believe it's the Board of Adjustment with the cell tower, if I'm not mistaken. But there will be a public hearing. And I thank you for those kind words. I still remember Brick Township. I put many years in education and our family has a great concern for helping those in need, especially those with disabilities. And that's why I was glad the lady came today. We set up many programs and they still realize it throughout the state, especially in the Ocean County Vocational School, with life skills for those with disabilities. And in many cases they became productive and they work for 20, 30, 40 years later on. And that was our goal. That's my goal and the Board supported that.

But again, I thank you for coming today. Your message was very well done. And I hope to see you when you are 105 to give you a nice certificate on behalf of the Board of Commissioners."

THOMAS O'MALLEY: "Well you better listen to me, see, because I'm going to get to the Good Lord before you guys and I'll tell you what, if you don't help us out you're all in trouble! (laughter) God Bless all."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "That's right. Thank you very much. You've always been a gentleman and we appreciate your comments and it will be part of the public record. Drive safely.

The next person here is a representative of Manchester, an aide to the Mayor of Manchester – confidential aide, and she always is...I worked with her when I was Superintendent in Berkeley Township, did a lot of good things. And today she has a presentation to make on behalf of not only Manchester senior citizens, but I think it applies to the 200,000 seniors that we have throughout Ocean County. Judy, just give your name and address for the record."

JUDY NOONAN, 25A STONYBROOK ROAD, WHITING: "I can almost answer this man's question about...it has a lot to do. I would like to have a little more time because what I have is something that has built up for 20 years for the seniors in the communities. And also I would like to thank Joe Vicari for the letter – you took the words out of my mouth – for the seniors. We have serious issues with seniors being threatened, intimidated with high rent. Also on these associations, the DCA is supposed to rule with the Radburn Act. They do nothing. And a lot of the management that is coming to these associations which I will refer to...I was called about this gentleman with the cell tower...a lot of the management, not all management companies, go in. They threaten. They intimidate. Seniors are being intimidated and threatened a lot, especially with high rents. They're being pushed out. I find it interesting that the Governor, well I should say the Assembly people, want to lower the taxes which is nice on seniors because what they say now is seniors want to move out of Jersey. Jersey is no place where anybody wants to live. People up north now move down here. The taxes are going to be lower. That's fine. But when you can't pay the rent and they're raising the rent \$200 and \$300 and they're threatened, where are they going to go? They feel like they want us to die and get out. They're actually advertising in New York to come to certain areas because it's cheaper. So the landlord can raise the rent to anything they want and they tell me to sign it or get out. This is not just happening, it's happening in the senior communities.

As an aide to the Mayor I represent the seniors and I get these calls and some things the town cannot get involved with, however, I really feel for a long time seniors have been pushed around. They're afraid to talk. There's no communication for a lot of things. I think it's very important being that we have over 200,000 seniors and we have a lot of vets and they have a certain amount of money. The seniors have developed this whole State of New Jersey, Ocean County, paid their bills, paid their taxes, raised their children – now it's time for us to die and move on so people can raise their rent and it's outrageous. You want to have homeless? There are going to be seniors that are

homeless because where are they going to go? There's no housing at all. I don't know how much money you have left in COVID (funds) to spend. And these people don't talk. There's no communication. We have to depend on the Manchester Times. Well, now I'm there. I'm the legislator. Well you all know me. I've got a big mouth. God gave me the strength and the mouth to speak for those who can't talk. And let me tell you there are a lot that can't talk, are afraid, are threatened – especially in the Department of Community Affairs. They make all the rules. They've been dying to get into our associations, but they're broke. So when people call and complain nothing happens.

Just like he said the association, that's management. They're the ones who intimidate and threaten. They have boards. The board is supposed to watch the business people, but they get threatened. They run everything. They hire the lawyers, the contractors, but it's their money. I get these calls – people are afraid. I have to give them the information how to complain to the state. They're worried about where their money is going in the associations. They're worrying about how to pay bills.

But we have no senior housing in Manchester or Whiting. I know it sounds hard but this has been going on. I have been doing this for 20 years, listening to the complaints. I hope you all get to live as long as this gentleman or me. And I listen to Bergen County, 'Oh they're going to get a deduction in their taxes.' I'm happy for them. I'm a Bergen County girl. I know what it's like. But where do they move? Here! But people now are moving out of New Jersey. Even the seniors are moving out of New Jersey. It is the worst place to live.

The only reason I come to you is because you represent. You do a great job. I'm not here to complain to you. I'm looking for some kind of help. Something has to happen in this state. They want to give us the taxes. Why? Because they don't want us to move out of New Jersey. I wish I could move out. I came from California. I came back to New Jersey because I'm a New Jersey girl. I love seeing women strong. That's my big thing. But this is a serious thing. I have people come to me and they're crying. They call me secretly. 'Judy, what can we do? Where can we go?' These people have to get out. They're 90 years old. Where are they going to go? Tell me!

The rent! How can you do this to people? And we don't have rent control in our town. They're crying. They come to the Mayor but the town cannot interfere in private associations. We do the best we can. We have to do it on the sly. We're not allowed to do that. I don't know what you can do but I think it's unfair for people to sink. And our veterans! And we have the largest (population) in Whiting and Manchester. They are suffering. They come to us. Should we all die and just go crawl in a hole somewhere? I'm old, not stupid. And there's a lot of professionals that have retired. I plead, find a way, the funding...I don't know what you can do. It's so greedy.

First it was the Board of Realtors. They wanted to come in and buy young into the associations. Why? They're not going to live there. What's it for? Money! And I had one lady, 95, one bedroom and one bath – 'Please help me'. I think I referred her to Senior Services. God bless Senior Services. We have to have legals to fight for these people. One bedroom, one bath – she pays \$980.00. The landlord says, 'I can get \$1400.00. Pay it or get out.' Where's she going to go? I don't think it's fair. You raised your children, you paid your taxes, you come here. I realize young people have to go. I get that. But I've got to tell you, when you get our age, you look for every day to be awake.

I worked in the operating room in Hackensack Hospital and I always wondered, the guy is 90 years old coming for surgery – once you close your eyes it's forever so you want to stay living as long as you possibly can because when you're dead, it's over. So people want to retire and enjoy their lives, mind their own business. But the people that come in want to make money on our back.

I'm sorry, but thank you for listening. I think you do a great job. I want to thank you, Joe, for opening up my words, my door. I appreciate it and I want to thank you for the property, by the way, I don't want to forget about that. You've been very good to Manchester. But I'm speaking for the people who really are crying out. And I told you, God gave me a big mouth for them. Please find a way somehow. But Trenton is not helping us. Yes it's nice to get a decrease in your taxes. That's all well and good. Why? So we don't want to leave? I have to tell you, the seniors want to go. They can't afford to live here anymore. Thank you for your time."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "And I just want to thank you not only for coming today and representing not only Manchester, but it's also Berkeley, Toms River, Bricktown...they're all in the same (boat)."

JUDY NOONAN: "Oh yeah, everybody. Four Seasons calls me. That's the reason I know what this gentleman is talking about. They wanted me to come to their meeting. I said I'm not allowed to go there."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "So we hear what you're saying. And that's why next week it was scheduled going back months ago that the PreBoard next week, okay, Maria LaFace and Senior Services and the people that are here today from Senior Services realize what you're doing. And it's common all over Ocean County, more so I think in Ocean County than anyplace else in the State of New Jersey. We have 96 senior communities in Ocean County – over 200,000 seniors. Many, Many more, and we're going to talk about it next week, over 85. Here's the difference. Here's the problem. They cannot communicate because of their age. And they said they don't use the library, they don't use the parks, they don't use the rail trails – they need help right now. And that's why I wrote the letter to the Governor going back last week. That's the one that you have."

JUDY NOONAN: "I want Trenton to listen."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "And also I spoke to all of our Legislative Districts and they understand what the problem is. But the issue basically comes down to this, in the 1960's Ocean County, the Board of Freeholders at that time,

Commissioners in county government, encouraged seniors to move to Ocean County. Here's the mistake they made. When they told them to move into developments, it's not like Florida where it was self-contained with businesses and retail stores, they're isolated. Ocean County is over 10% of the State of New Jersey. We have thousands of seniors in communities like in Manchester, and I was there last week several times. What happens is, they can't drive. They don't have a driver's license, they can't get out. They live from day to day. Their Social Security may cover, may cover, their rent or housing, which it doesn't. They have food insecurity which we took care of this year on a one-year basis. So the food insecurity is taken care of. The housing is a major issue I want to talk about next week. But they were encouraged to come before I even got elected to office, any of us. But they live in Ocean County. They pay taxes. Our biggest natural resource, and I said this for many years, senior citizens. Why? They put billions and billions of dollars into the local economy. No children in school, municipal services, and now the time is coming that they're going to say you know something? We need help. And that's why the letter I gave you that is to the Governor says the same thing. But Ocean County, I would say in three years, will have to stand up and do more for all of the 200,000 seniors and the veterans.

When I went to the Department (of Senior Services) last week I was using a number up to 10,000 seniors are being challenged with this. I was told it could be up to 25,000 senior citizens that are experiencing problems with housing. It's a serious problem. The new thing says, that I just received today, says nationally it's the 'new silver tsunami' because it's not only in Ocean County, it's all over the United States of America. People are living longer. They outlive their estates. In many cases their children, and it's not a nice thing to say, took their money. They took the mom's and dad's money. They used the money. And now the seniors can't feed themselves. They can't leave their housing. And they're going to be put out. As you remember, Mike Carrick said many, many years ago where are the seniors going to live? In parks?"

JUDY NOONAN: "Yeah. I have one other thing. I think a big problem that I'm bringing and I'm proud of in Manchester, we're videoing our Council meetings because one of the biggest issues I hear and I am the legislator for the Manchester Coordinating Council, that's all the associations, and I believe in giving information out whether it's right, good or bad. And one of the biggest complaints is 'We don't know what's going on!' So I am working on it with the Mayor to have video of our Council meetings because people don't want to come out at night. And it's too bad you can't video your meetings here. People want the information. That's why I get a lot of phone calls. It's misinformation sometimes. It's not correct. Even who to vote for...what's really going on. I think communication...and I've always felt that way my whole life and even being a Councilwoman...information is very important. They don't know where to go and sometimes it's an easy place to send them. But you must get the message out to the people. And with my Mayor we're working on streamlining it and having visuals like we did in Berkeley. We filmed our Council meetings so people could hear what you're doing and what you're going on and what you're paying for. And the highest thing is the school budget, you know. But I think I feel like we're just out there...'Oh they're just cranky old people. You know, they're in the way.' And that's what we face sometimes. Yeah, but one time we're all going to be there and I hope you live that long as I say about this gentleman here. And look how he is. Sharp as a tack! Am I right sir?"

THOMAS O'MALLEY: "I don't know about that." (laughter)

JUDY NOONAN: "So I want to thank you for allowing me because I am very frustrated. I'm hearing these people and I have to deal with them every day now. I have to meet them secretly from the associations. Management is sometimes very bad. And there's one company that pushes them and pushes the bills in Trenton. It's nice to have them, but they take over and they actually threaten and do not listen to their people – very important. I want to thank you for giving me the time and the opportunity. Thank you very much."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "And you know we realized...before you sit down...we all realize one thing, we're temporarily able-bodied. That's what I was told when I first got elected by Jim Mancini who was in charge of the disabled. But here's the problem we have going back in the middle of COVID, just so you know, I wanted to do...it was suggested that we do one or two newsletters to our seniors in the 96 communities and the local newspapers took us to task saying it was our local newspaper. No it wasn't. According to what I was told by the advisory board, if we sent out one or two newspapers people would have been not in nursing homes, not in emergency rooms and many of them passed away. And you can add to it if you want to, if we sent it with COVID money that we received from the federal government which was not used for that one mailing or two, or the ARPA money. So what we mentioned was to let them know about programs with the Ocean County Board of Health, the Board of and the Director is here now of Senior Services – a two-page pamphlet, and I think if you could add to that people died because they didn't get the information. And you want to know what really bothers me? We had money to give people for food and they didn't know about it and you know what happened? The money went back to the federal government. And they would have been able to have food on their table. But because that was not sent they did not know about it. And we were talking about that for years. They lost money for at least one or two years – SNAP money, Social Security money and everything else. Ocean County is ten percent of the State of New Jersey. We just can't get the information out."

JUDY NOONAN: "Well I've made it my business being that I'm in the position that I am now and I think I work very well with Human Services. I make sure everything you put out, everything that she sends..."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I thank you. Yes you do."

JUDY NOONAN: "I make sure every community gets it and puts it in their newsletter."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I know. I want to turn this over. Was it correct? If I left anything out, I wasn't prepared."

MARIA LAFACE, DIRECTOR OF SENIOR SERVICES: "I just want to say it is very good that we use social media and we get the information out that way, but the key is getting it in the paper, getting some form of newsletter out to them. We missed an opportunity to get them on SNAP benefits. We missed an opportunity to get them a variety of pandemic benefits because they didn't know. And we don't go out and seek them, they have to come seek us. And they didn't have the information they needed. We could have prevented illnesses. We probably could have prevented hospitalizations and nursing homes. So I agree we should be giving out more in the form of these paper newsletters."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I checked with our staff today about the MASH unit – the first in the state going back several years ago – where we can go into the communities and because of COVID we can't. It's not completed. It's two years behind in service. And again, we will save lives without even county money. We can use state and federal monies. But there is no local TV channel like we had years ago, channel 8. They did away with it. The radio station is changed substantially. It's not their fault. The news media – we just have fortunately some local newspapers, but the main newspaper will not carry it and will not print it. We turn in many press releases and it's not printed, even now today. Thank you, we have one newspaper reporter here. But sometimes they do not show up for many, many months so they don't know what's taking place. And again, it's the size of and you know it to, we have the Berkeley Times fortunately. We have the Manchester Times. But it's very difficult.

When we do a mailing we do it in a special font so it's a little bit bigger so that they can read it because of their eyesight and also we make it so they know it's important. But that program with the food is a serious problem. We know about it. I know your employees, your staff workers, have been very frustrated when they see people suffering in silence in their home hungry and they can't go to a food bank, they can't get food in, and it's very, very difficult but the money was there. The money was there and it's a terrible thing.

Before I move on to the next thing, anything else on this topic? And again, we will be talking about it next week at the PreBoard Meeting. Anyone else? Major Yaiser, I believe you wanted to speak. Anyone else after that? Okay, Major Yaiser."

ROBERT YAISER, 7 WARREN COURT, MANAHAWKIN: "I appeared two weeks ago looking for answers as far as the reports of corruption at the Ocean County Vocational School District, specifically the Academy of Law and Public Safety. Director, do we have any updates?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Well, last week I was very concerned and that's why you got tremendous support from Commissioner Kelly who is part of the program. And Commissioner Crea stayed for at least an hour afterwards. I stayed for a long time not only talking to you, but to the students and to the mother that was here. And when I hear words in all my years here of corruption, whistleblowing, the first thing I thought I said, 'Look, I know there's an active investigation.' At least two. That's not a secret. Okay. And I went and I referred to County Counsel, to the administrative staff, to look at it. I have six months left. I'm not going to go before a Grand Jury. I have never been before a Grand Jury and never been questioned. This actually not only worries me for two reasons. Not only what I've heard from you, but I have seen people in the audience – professional staff and whatever – with tears in their eyes crying when those parents and also that lady told the story about the way she was being treated. I don't remember ever feeling that. When I went home that night, it took several days for me to say you know something? There is a major problem. But because of the ongoing investigation that's taking place, I can't get involved. I didn't make any phone calls. I didn't call anyone else up. So I trust Jack Sahradnik as County Counsel, our professional staff, to look into it and to do the right thing.

And you mentioned many names. I mean the Sheriff, the Prosecutor, federal agencies, Department of Justice. I mean you mentioned a lot. And it's not just an accusation of one person, or an allegation. There were several people that said that. And it's been going on for several years, so again, I cannot get involved in an active investigation so I'm going to turn it over to County Counsel. I don't know what else to say. I know that the commitment was that you would get a copy of the tape last week."

ROBERT YAISER: "Correct."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "And I just left it at that. I did not have any discussions with anyone whether from the Vocational School, members of the public, or even members of the news media. They were not here last week. So therefore your voice was not heard, but it's part of the official minutes. And the only thing I can do is turn it over either to the Administrator or to County Counsel."

ROBERT YAISER: "I reported originally in April of 2022. Has there been any investigation since then?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "County Counsel or the Administrator?"

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Mike will talk. He has information."

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "Thank you Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Now, we had a meeting today. No one said anything about it so I don't know. Mike Fiure."

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "Thank you Director. As we know, at the last public meeting the Commissioners had tasked administration and County Counsel to look into the matter. We had spoken after the meeting. We are waiting

for information that Ms. Andrews had. Mr. Yaiser provided that to me yesterday around 1:30. I did respond to Mr. Yaiser this morning around 9:15 that based on the fact that we just received that information we didn't have a chance to review that. That once we had a review of that we would be able to provide an update to this Board.

Also, I let Mr. Yaiser know that as soon as the minutes were adopted officially by this Board which I believe pursuant to our schedule will be at our next public Board Meeting. We can release the transcripts of the last meeting. I did not hear back from Mr. Yaiser until right now.

Also the information that Mr. Yaiser is referring to from the past, I believe you had provided that to this Board on multiple occasions. We'll provide an update to the Commissioners on that also. But all those matters it seems have been reviewed by both the Vo-Tech School, by the County Prosecutor's Office, by the State of New Jersey, and by the Sheriff's Department and there was no further action taken on those. But we'll provide an official report back to this Board now that Ms. Andrews, through Mr. Yaiser, has provided that additional information to us."

ROBERT YAISER: "I'm sorry. You're saying this was investigated?"

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "I don't know what you mean, sir, by investigation. There are proper procedures that you would follow through the Vo-Tech Board or through the County Prosecutor's Office. I can't speak to the level of investigation by those entities. Those are separate and distinct from our Board."

ROBERT YAISER: "I was told it was a secret. No one was to know."

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "I don't know who told you that, sir. I couldn't comment to that allegation."

ROBERT YAISER: "Could we get a copy of whatever has been investigated to this point?"

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "I believe, sir, that you've already been provided with that but once we provide this information to the commission it will be the same information that I believe came to you through the Vo-Tech School, through the third-party attorney and through the State of New Jersey."

ROBERT YAISER: "Well, in those investigations they investigate themselves and then don't provide any answers to anything. So no questions from the students or parents have ever been answered."

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "I can only let you know, Mr. Yaiser, that we are going to provide that report back to this commission. But those items have been provided to us multiple times. They've been forwarded to those entities and the responses from those entities have been looked into and that they have found no wrongdoing at that time."

ROBERT YAISER: "I'm sorry. Say that again?"

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "They have found there is no wrongdoing at that time."

ROBERT YAISER: "Who found no wrongdoing?"

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "Sir, the same information that we have and I apologize to the commission. I don't want to get into a debate with you because my job is to provide that information."

ROBERT YAISER: "It's a simple question. Who said there was no wrongdoing?"

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "Sir, the Prosecutor's Office has declined to take any action."

ROBERT YAISER: "So that means there is no wrongdoing?"

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "Commissioners, I do apologize. I don't want to engage a member of the public in a debate. We'll provide our report back to this commission. We will review it with each Commissioner. I don't know how else to respond to Mr. Yaiser's requests right now."

ROBERT YAISER: "I'm just looking, Director, for a copy of that because I was given nothing. I was told it was a secret and no one was to know."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I was told you have a copy of the tapes. Do you have a copy of last week's tapes?"

ROBERT YAISER: "No."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "That won't be adopted until our next public meeting."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "No, no, the tapes are different. The procedure has always been, unless it's changed. Not the minutes. He's asking for a copy of the tapes which is verbatim."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Which tapes?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "The tape that he spoke with last meeting."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "I never received it and I asked for it."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Yeah. I asked for it too. So I don't know when it's going to be. So when you receive it, we will receive it."

ROBERT YAISER: "Okay."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Again, I have no discussions with anyone because of the nature when you mention things as far as an ongoing investigation is a serious problem. And that's why I have County Counsel to make sure we follow the proper procedure. So before the meeting ends I will refer it over to Jack Sahradiuk. Are we following the proper procedures as far as whistleblowing?"

JACK SAHRADNIK, COUNTY COUNSEL: "At this point in time, I mean I've been working with the County Administrator to go through the materials that have been submitted and we will certainly make known to you what our findings are."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay. Does that satisfy your questions?"

ROBERT YAISER: "Fair enough. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Very good. Thank you very much. Again, we try to have an open transparent policy. Anyone else from the public who would like to ask a question or make a statement? If not, I close the public portion. Is there a motion to adjourn?"

There being no additional comments received, Director Vicari called for a motion to adjourn the meeting at 5:06 PM.

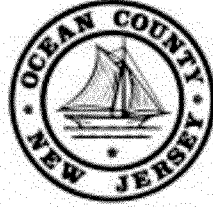

ORDINANCE #2023-18

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$1,600,000 FROM THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND FOR THE COST OF VARIOUS CAPITAL RENOVATIONS, IMPROVEMENTS AND UPGRADES AT VARIOUS HEALTH DEPARTMENT FACILITIES, ALL IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY.

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the County of Ocean recognizes the need for various capital renovations, improvements and upgrades at various Health Department facilities, all in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the County that funds be available for this purpose.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS of the COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING), as follows:

SECTION 1: \$1,600,000 is hereby appropriated from the Capital Improvement Fund for the cost of various capital renovations, improvements and upgrades at various Health Department facilities, all in the County of Ocean, including all else necessary therefor and incidental thereto, which sum shall also cover fees and contingencies.

SECTION 2: The capital budget of the County of Ocean is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of Local Government Services is on file with the Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

SECTION 3: After passage upon first reading of this Ordinance, the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners is hereby directed to publish the full text of the Ordinance, together with the notice set forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF PENDING ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-19, at least seven days prior to the date set for public hearing and further consideration for final passage (which date shall be at least ten days after introduction and first reading). The Clerk of the Board of Commissioners is further directed to comply with all provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-17(b) regarding postings, publications, and the provision of copies of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4: After final adoption of this Ordinance by the Board of Commissioners, the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners is hereby directed to publish the full text of this Ordinance, as finally adopted, together with the notice set forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-19.

SECTION 5: This Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof

after final passage.

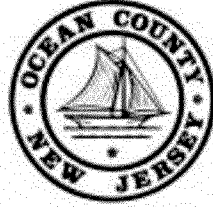

SUBJECT: Authorizing the Establishment of The Ocean County Homelessness Trust Fund and Authorizing the Creation of The Ocean County Homelessness Trust Fund Task Force

WHEREAS, over 65,000 people in Ocean County are living in poverty, including families with children, and over nineteen percent (19%) of households are experiencing housing insecurity factors with homelessness impacting over four hundred (400) individuals; and

WHEREAS, homelessness will worsen the mental and physical health of these children and adults and it will undermine their treatment, education and employment prospects; and

WHEREAS, homelessness places additional strain on the schools that struggle to keep homeless children enrolled and learning and the hospitals and emergency rooms that must care for homeless people, some of whose illnesses would never have occurred if they had permanent housing; and

WHEREAS, the path out of homelessness relies on programs funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD's) Homeless Assistance Grants and state funds; and

WHEREAS, Ocean County has developed a Ten Year Plan to End Homelessness; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 52:27D-287a, et seq. permits each County in New Jersey to establish a County Homelessness Trust Fund to be utilized to address the needs of homeless persons within the County; and

WHEREAS, said law, at N.J.S.A. 22A:4-17, et seq. provides for the imposition of a \$5.00 surcharge, (of which \$3.00 shall be designated for the Homelessness Trust Fund and \$2.00 shall be designated for Code Blue Efforts), for each document recorded in the Ocean County Clerk's Office, which surcharge shall be used exclusively for the Trust Fund; and

WHEREAS, said law further provides for the creation of a County Homelessness Task Force to, inter alia, advise the County on the use of the monies from the Trust Fund and directs that the Task Force consist of the following:

- two (2) representatives of the County one of whom shall be a member of the Board of Commissioners;
- one (1) representative from each of the three (3) municipalities with the highest homeless populations and all CDBG Entitlement Communities;
- one (1) representative from the organization responsible for developing, implementing, or both, the local plan to end homelessness;
- three (3) representatives of local private or non-profit organizations with experience in assisting the homeless or providing low-income housing; and
- at least three (3) homeless or formerly homeless people.

WHEREAS, the Ocean County Homelessness Trust Fund would leverage this scarce funding and assist in implementing Ocean County's Ten-Year Plan to End Homelessness; and

WHEREAS, the Ocean County Homelessness Trust Fund, supplemented by dedicated staff, volunteers and resources from the private sector and local, state and federal governments

would help thousands of families and individuals in Ocean County move into permanent housing and thus provide a healthier, more stable living environment; and

WHEREAS, programs which focus on ending homelessness are in the best interest of the County of Ocean, because the programs can reduce public costs to hospitals, emergency rooms, law enforcement, public schools and foster care systems.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that this Board of Commissioners of the County of Ocean does hereby establish the Ocean County Homelessness Trust Fund pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:27D-287a, et seq.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that commencing September 1, 2023, the Ocean County Clerk's Office shall be authorized to assess a \$5.00 surcharge on all documents presented to that office for recording, of which \$3.00 shall be designated for the Homelessness Trust Fund and \$2.00 shall be designated for Code Blue Efforts.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that the funds generated by this surcharge shall be deposited in said Trust Fund and used for:

- a. the acquisition, construction, or rehabilitation of housing projects or units within housing projects that supply permanent affordable housing for homeless persons or families, including those at risk of homelessness;
- b. rental assistance vouchers, including tenant and project based subsidies for affordable housing projects or units within housing projects that provide permanent affordable housing for homeless persons or families, including those at risk of homelessness;
- c. supportive services as may be required by homeless individuals or families in order to obtain, maintain (or both) permanent affordable housing;
- d. prevention services for at risk homeless individuals or families so that they can obtain, maintain (or both) permanent affordable housing; and
- e. no more than five percent (5%) of the fund may be used annually by the County for administrative costs related to the administration of the fund.

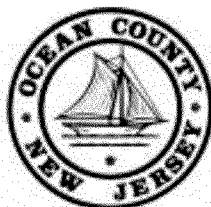

WHEREAS, the term of the agreement shall be for three (3) months beginning June 1, 2023 and ending September 30, 2023.

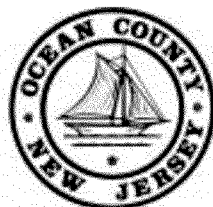
