Freeholder Director Joseph Vicari opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Fiure, Assistant County Administrator John Ernst, County Engineer Julie N. Tarrant, Comptroller/CFO John C. Sahradnik, Jr., County Counsel

This Pre-Board Meeting was held in Room 119 to abide by social distancing guidelines set forth by Governor Murphy. There were a maximum of 25 participants in the room at a time. A nurse interviewed and took temperatures of all in attendance. Carl Block stated that the Pre Board meeting was open to the public following guidelines for room capacity.

Freeholder Little notified the Board that there were 221 new COVID-19 cases on September 30, bringing the total to 13,665 positive cases in Ocean County. Patients aged 85 years and over account for 85% of the deaths. There were 2,022 patients, 14%, who needed hospitalization. The main underlying issues that patients affected by COVID-19 previously have are cardiovascular disease, diabetes, and lung disease. 9,620 tests have been administered at the Ocean County College testing site to date.

Members of the Board of Chosen Freeholders November 12, 2020 Summary of the Pre-Board meeting of September 30, 2020 Page 2

Freeholder Director Vicari stated that the County was given CARES funding from the Federal government in the amount of \$106 million. \$10 million of it has been allocated to help small businesses who have suffered a loss during the pandemic. The EDA, on behalf of the County, has received 2,196 applications thus far, and have approved 948 of those applications. The County did not pay a company to review them.

Mr. Agliata and Freeholder Haines discussed the Natural Lands Trust Fund's recommendation to acquire West Turkey Swamp Inholding II. This is a 0.24-acre property in Jackson adjacent to over 850 acres of preserved open space. The owner has accepted our offer of \$5,500.00. A second recommendation to acquire a 5.21-acre property in Jackson will also be on the Board agenda. This property contains two parcels located off Bennetts Mills Road. These parcels are adjacent to Township open space, and the NJDEP Butterfly Bogs Wildlife Management Area. The owner has accepted our offer of \$160,000.

Mr. Block informed the Board of two Election Grants that the Election Board and the County Clerk may apply for to aid in the costs of the election due to COVID-19.

Freeholder Director Vicari said the mail in election process was very tedious and difficult for staff to accomplish. There were over 424,000 ballots mailed.

Freeholder Quinn said that there was over \$800,000 spent on mailings and payroll costs for the Primary election and \$1 million spent on mailing ballots for the General election, some of it will not be recovered.

Freeholder Vicari mentioned that there has been a large amount of residents that have called in expressing their disappointment in voting by mail only.

Mr. Block said that employees from various departments throughout the county have been called upon to help the County Clerk and Election Board process the large amount of ballots that were mailed, received, and processed.

Freeholder Kelly said the County has been upfront in notifying our residents of the vote by mail process set forth by the Governor, but the state has not. Many residents are not aware of this process.

Freeholder Quinn said the County has done Press Releases to notify residents, but seniors especially are confused. There will be 17 drop boxes throughout the County, and each day a democrat and a republican will be present when collecting the ballots from each one. Each box is under video surveillance by the Sheriff's Department 24 hours a day.

Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the construction of a traffic signal at James Street (CR 32) in Lakewood near the Railroad Crossing. There were no questions or comments and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the October 7, 2020 Board meeting.

Mr. Ernst also notified the Board of a public interest study between Toms River, Ocean County, and the Federal Highway Administration on the downtown Toms River waterfront area. Toms River received a \$5.2 million dollar build grant. The first phase will consist of the study which will shed light on the future of the retail businesses and surrounding area. The results of the study will be available in early 2021, and possible construction will take place from 2023-2025. Toms River will keep the County apprised of all updates.

Ms. Cilento reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of October 7, 2020. There were no questions or comments.

Freeholder Director Vicari asked the Board members for comments.

Freeholder Haines said that many residents are angry that they will need to vote by mail, and are confused about the process. There will be 100 polling sites available in Ocean County for handicapped residents only, or to vote provisionally.

There were no additional comments.

Ms. Cilento read the resolution to move to closed session.

On a motion by Freeholder Kelly, seconded by Freeholder Little, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 4:36pm for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was unanimously carried.

Freeholder Director Joseph Vicari opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

This Pre-Board Meeting was held in Room 119 to abide by social distancing quidelines set forth by Governor Murphy. There were a maximum of 25 participants in the room at a time. A nurse interviewed and took temperatures of all in attendance. Administrator Carl Block stated that the Pre Board meeting was open to the public following guidelines for room capacity.

Freeholder Little shared the latest coronavirus statistics for Ocean County. There were 275 new cases on October 14, 2020 bringing the total to 15,578 positive cases, and 988 deaths. Lakewood has the highest total with 179 new cases. There are 10 long term care facilities affected at this time. 143 tests were performed at the Ocean County College testing site, bringing the total tests performed to date to just over 10,000.

Cathy Ernst told the Board that the Finance Department is working with the State of NJ regarding the NJEDA small business grants. So far 70,000 applications have been received. There is \$10 million dollars allocated to help small businesses, with \$30,000 allocated to each business for Phase 3. The RDA has received 440,000 applications.

Mr. Block stated that if we come to an agreement, this will be put on the Board agenda for the October 21, 2020 Board meeting. We are unsure of the total amount at this time. The first round of applications had 2400 responses. \$70 million will be given from the State. Many of our local businesses only operate 12 weeks during the summer months, so to further help these businesses, CARES funding may also cover rents and leases as well. Steve Steiner of the Surflight Theater in Long Beach Island said we may lose 30% of our local restaurants due to the pandemic. This program is a grant, not a loan and would be paid directly to the landlord.

Freeholder Quinn questioned whether this grant would cover mortgages as well, or just leases. Mr. Block will look into the details and advise.

Freeholder Director Vicari told the Board that of the 91 senior communities in the County, most of the senior clubhouses have been closed. This is normally where our Senior Services Department would meet with residents to assign services available to them. Mobile tents have been set up in these communities, to aid residents during the pandemic. Maria LaFace discussed the difficulties her department has faced during COVID-19. A mobile unit is the best way to remain present in these communities at this time. A pilot visit of the new MASH Unit, (which stands for Mobile Assistance for Seniors at Home) in Leisure Village proved to be very successful and well received. Our Consumer Affairs department will also be present to make seniors aware of current scams in the area. Food, prescriptions, and help with utility services will all be available on the mobile unit.

Freeholder Director Vicari was outraged by the Social Security Administration's decision to raise the cost of living adjustment only 1.3% during these economically challenging times. Along with Congressman Chris Smith, the Freeholder would like the increase to be at 3%. MaryAnn Cilento read a letter from Congressman Chris Smith in support of the increase.

Freeholder Little is in support of both the MASH Unit, and the bill to increase the COLA.

Freeholder Quinn is in support of both topics as well, and thanked Maria LaFace for the efforts of her department to keep seniors both safe and informed during the pandemic.

Freeholder Haines is in support as well, and thanked Cathy Ernst for the information on the grant information, and is excited to see businesses receive the help they need.

Freeholder Kelly is in agreement with both topics as well.

There are new webinars on the County website residents may register to learn about recycling, and environmental safety topics. Freeholder Quinn thanked Tony Agliata for all of the good work that the Planning and Solid Waste departments do for Ocean County.

Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the permission to advertise for Underground Storage Tank Removal in Jackson, and an Underground Storage Tank Removal and Upgrade in Lakewood, where it will be replaced with an above ground model at the Lakewood Garage. A nurse interviewed and took temperatures of all in attendance. Carl Block stated that the Pre Board meeting was open to the public following guidelines for room capacity.

Freeholder Little shared the latest coronavirus statistics for Ocean County. Despite spikes in the recent weeks, there were only 33 cases reported. The County has not reported 33 or less cases since June 22, 2020. There have been 16,642 positive cases thus far, and 1,001 deaths. Ten long term care facilities have at least one case with a total of 3,023 positive cases, and 527 deaths to date. Men represented 49.8% of those affected, and 49.6 are women. Residents over 85 years of age represent 6% of all cases.

While 2,677 of those required hospitalization. Heart disease remains the underlying condition.

Freeholder Director Vicari said that less than 1% are in long term care facilities in the United States, but 41% of those cases passed away from it.

Freeholder Director Vicari, who has been the chairman since the 1990 Census, and Mr. Agliata discussed the Census Wrap Up which ended on October 16, 2020. Ocean County residents surpassed the response rate with 66.5% responding this year, as opposed to 63.5% in 2010. Census data should start to be published in late 2021 through 2022. The Pumpout Boat program ended its 23rd successful season. It was a record year for new and used boat sales due to the pandemic, which brought many more boats to our waters. Over 2 million gallons of ethanol was pumped from boats this season. Six full time boats were in use in our waters made possible with grants from our Board of Chosen Freeholders. The Ocean County Utilities Authority partners with the County in this program.

Freeholder Haines and Anthony Agliata discussed the Open Space Acquisitions. The first is a 9.68-acre parcel on Whitesville Road adjacent to 35 acres of Natural Lands Trust Fund property. The owner accepted an offer of \$750,000 and will demolish an existing structure on the property prior to acquisition. The County has accepted a 0.92-acre donation on West Turkey Swamp Road in Jackson adjacent to 23 acres of NLTF property.

Freeholder Kelly and Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the recommendation to advertise for the demolition of residential properties at 2 Maple St. in Jackson, 7 Freehold Rd. in Jackson and 108 N. Green Street in Tuckerton Borough. There were no questions or comments and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the November 4, 2020 Board meeting.

Freeholder Director Vicari would like a copy of the BPU minutes from their meeting held on September 10, 2020. The cost for the County to acquire these is \$300.00. The Freeholder had requested JCP&L reimburse residents \$250.00 for food and medicines lost during a previous extended power outage, but their Vice President refused to consider it.

Freeholder Little shared the latest coronavirus statistics for Ocean County. There has been a significant steady spike in cases recently. The daily total was 163, with a total of 17,783 positive cases. There were 3 new deaths, totaling 1,014. Ocean County ranks 11th in the State. The governor has imposed new restrictions. There are 3,065 cases in 11 long term care facilities, with 527 deaths. There have not been any deaths in patients

under 18. 11,416 tests have been performed at the Ocean County College testing facility to date.

The PEER building renovation, which will repoint the brick building at 129 Hooper Avenue will take 6-8 months. Building occupants will be notified of the closures when the contractor has the schedule. The Bid was awarded on September 2, 2020.

This Pre-Board Meeting was held in Room 119 to abide by social distancing guidelines set forth by Governor Murphy. There were a maximum of 25 participants in the room at a time. A nurse interviewed and took temperatures of all in attendance. Carl Block stated that the Pre-Board meeting was open to the public following guidelines for room capacity.

Freeholder Little gave an update on the COVID-19 daily statistics in Ocean County for November 24, 2020. There were 216 new cases, bringing the total to 20,506. There have been 1,036 deaths in the County thus far. So far, approximately 12,528 tests have been performed at the Ocean County College testing center. Every day now the Ocean

County College testing center reaches maximum capacity for the day. Within the next week or so, the hours at the testing center will increase to 5 days a week. However, you will still need an appointment which can be made on-line. Discussions have been had regarding the possibility of hiring more medical persons to perform testing.

Freeholder Little stated the entire state is experiencing a spike in cases. Some of the reasons for this is the heightened awareness of the virus, more testing available than in the spring and contact tracing efforts. Freeholder Little then explained how the symptoms of COVID-19 can be so similar to many other illnesses especially flu.

Freeholder Little continued his COVID-19 update by advising the Board of the vaccines which could become available as soon as the third week of December. The Board of Chosen Freeholders and the Board of Health plan to be prepared for the delivery and implementation of the vaccine. Each vaccine comes with its own set of challenges. One requires to be -100 degrees Fahrenheit which requires dry ice, gloves up to the elbows, 70 lb. containers with 50 lb. dry ice to be changed every 5 days. The Board of Health is ready for this process. The Board of Chosen Freeholders and the Board of Health also have adequate health personnel ready for the vaccine process. The vaccines will be performed in three tiers. First responders and medical personnel, for instance, will be in the first tier. Freeholder Little then stated we certainly want to be prepared and we are. He then thanked Dan Regenye and the Board of Health staff for doing a great job.

Freeholder Little finished by stating gathering for Thanksgiving is our Constitutional Right to Assemble; however, we must use common sense, wear our masks, wash our hands and stay safe. This is a blessed time in our nation. He then wished everyone in the room Happy Thanksgiving.

Freeholder Director Vicari thanked Freeholder Little for doing an excellent job with the Coronavirus Update. The Director stated he expects there to be much competition over the next six months regarding vaccines. There is a growing concern of an increase in cases with the holidays approaching. The Director then asked the Board for any comments, seeing none, Director Vicari asked Freeholder Kelly and County Engineer, John Ernst for the Engineering Report.

Freeholder Kelly requested County Engineer, John Ernst give the Engineering Report. Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included Contract 2019C for Reconstruction and Resurfacing of Portions of Certain County Roads and several miscellaneous items. Freeholder Kelly thanked Mr. Ernst. There were no questions or comments and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the December 2, 2020 Board Meeting.

Director Vicari and Tony Agliata, Planning Director updated the Board on the Cattus Island Living Shoreline Restoration Project (see attached). Ocean County was awarded a \$3 million grant for this project back in August, 2020. Cattus Island included critical salt marsh and is the largest breakwater in the northern portion of Barnegat Bay. Mr. Agliata showed the Board a map of the shoreline. The Director continued explaining the shorelines have experienced significant erosion and this erosion is likely to increase over time, especially if the northeast peninsula, known as "Page's Point" is not stabilized. A shared services agreement will be executed with our project partner, Stevens Institute of Technology. Stevens will provide environmental consulting services estimated at \$132,000 which will be paid out of the grant. This project will be completed in phases over a 4-year grant period. Mr. Agliata added that Stevens specializes in the field of marine engineering and hydrodynamics and are uniquely qualified to evaluate and determine mitigation of the marine conditions contributing to the erosion process. Director Vicari stated this project hopes to protect and stabilize the area and is a major improvement to the County's property. The Board agreed.

Ms. Cilento reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of December 2, 2020. There were no questions or comments.

Director Vicari asked for comments from the Board.

Freeholder Haines stated there is a very large tree on Washington Street in front of the Courthouse which is past the point of being saved. The Forrester recommended it be removed for safety reasons. This tree will be removed in the near future and will be replaced. Freeholder Haines then wished everyone a happy and healthy Thanksgiving.

Freeholder Little wished everyone a blessed and safe Thanksgiving. Director Vicari thanked the Board for their comments and also wished everyone a happy and healthy holiday.

Freeholder Jack Kelly mentioned the importance of the resolution regarding the land acquisition. A brief discussion ensued.

There were no additional comments.

Freeholder Director Joseph Vicari opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

This Pre-Board Meeting was held in Room 119 to abide by social distancing guidelines set forth by Governor Murphy. There were a maximum of 25 participants in the room at a time. A nurse interviewed and took temperatures of all in attendance.

Michael Fiure stated that the Pre-Board meeting was open to the public following guidelines for room capacity.

Freeholder Director Vicari assured all in attendance that room 119 is deeply sanitized on a regular basis. One of the Board's main concerns is to prevent COVID-19 and keep everyone safe.

Freeholder Haines and Tony Agliata, Planning Director, reviewed the Open Space Plan. Freeholder Haines stated that the Board has been talking about the plan for a while and has had some concerns about wording. The wording with regards to buying lands with ownership with other government agencies has been removed from the plan. The plan has been updated to the 2011 Master Plan. The New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection requires an update of the Plan. Freeholder Haines stated that since 2011 Ocean County has received approximately \$13 million. Freeholder Haines reviewed the concerns of the Board and explained all concerns have been addressed and changed accordingly. Mr. Agliata stated that anyone from the public who has questions will receive a copy of the modifications (changes only). The Planning Board had passed the Plan in November and again on December 2, 2020. The Planning Board will not be purchasing any properties from a government entity. The last time the plan was introduced was in 1998 and it was updated in 2011. Freeholder Haines stated that the Department of Environmental Protection required the County update this plan. Freeholder Director Vicari asked about the Manchester Park and Mike Fiure, Assistant Administrator responded. With no further questions from the Board, Freeholder Director Vicari stated the Open Space Plan will be placed on the December 16 Board Agenda.

Freeholder Kelly was introduced by Director Vicari and asked for the Justice Complex Addition update. Freeholder Kelly stated several ZOOM meetings explaining this project have been held. The review process for the Justice Complex Addition began with seven architectural firms. After the initial review process, the County reduced that number to three architectural firms. These three firms were interviewed for a second time. All are very capable. Michael Fiure, Assistant Administrator stated the Board authorized the Open and Fair process and as Freeholder Kelly stated seven qualified responses were received. Some of the responses were outside our budget. The three final firms were given a second interview with a question and answer format. The firms were all highly qualified but the County is recommending Clarke Caton Hintz (CCH). CCH is experienced with courthouse design within New Jersey. Therefore, I am requesting Clarke Caton Hintz be placed on the Board agenda for December 16, 2020. Freeholder Kelly explained, by building an addition, the County will be saving money. These savings

will be seen by letting go of leases outside the courthouse property and by reducing the amount of locations the security department secures to name a few. Freeholder Director Vicari asked about the amount of the project especially since the courts belong to the state. The Director also stated he doesn't believe each Judge requires their own courtroom and courtrooms should be shared. Freeholder Director Vicari also stated he would like to see the use of escalators within any new structures of the County, as well as, improved lighting and windows. With no further questions, the Board agreed with the recommendation of Clarke Caton Hintz for the Justice Complex addition. This item will be placed on the Board agenda of December 16, 2020.

Freeholder Director Vicari stated the County is moving ahead with the mobile office which will be paid for by a grant. Freeholder Director Vicari said he spoke with Freeholder Kelly about the possibility of building a mobile office for the County Connection, both of which would be interchangeable. He said he strongly feels this is the future. It is planned and designed and hopes to be in use by March 2021 and shared by various departments. Freeholder Director Vicari thanked both Freeholder Kelly and Mike Fiure for putting together a plan. Mike Fiure stated having mobile offices will allow the County to bring services to the residents of Ocean County. There has been much interest in this venture. Freeholder Director Vicari stated the mobile services unit will be for the use of all departments not just Senior Services. It is all about sharing services. Maria LaFace, Director of Senior Services, stated several County services will be included in the mobile office unit which has gone through the County's Request for Proposal process and was completed in December 2020.

Freeholder Vicari then stated there are several contracts for Senior Services on the Board agenda for December 16, 2020. All contracts and services are the same as last year with some modifications. Maria LaFace stated the need for additional meals has increased due to the Coronavirus pandemic. Ms. LaFace gave current and projected statistics, costs and percentages. She also advised the Board of her concerns once the CARES funding is exhausted. Ms. LaFace concluded and thanked the Board. Freeholder Vicari thanked Ms. LaFace and informed the Board that Senior Services has an accountant working full time to look for various grant opportunities. As you know, we probably have the largest group of seniors in the state and they should not live in fear of not being fed. With no further comments or questions, the Board agreed.

Freeholder Little gave the Coronavirus Update. He stated there is a spike in positive cases for Ocean County. Ocean County has been approximately 200 cases per day the last few weeks and in one day the County increased by 250 new cases for a total

of 24,790 today. There has also been a spike in mortality with 1,115 deaths which is an increase of 13 overnight. Middlesex County is number one in the state today with 463 positive cases and Ocean County is ninth in the state today with 250 cases. There is no report on long term care facilities today. Ocean County's testing site is continuing to see an increasing demand from the public for tests. It is operating five days and Saturdays. The site is booked into next week already. Appointments are required. Freeholder Director Vicari asked for any comments or questions. There were none. Freeholder Director Vicari spoke of the deaths within Ocean County. Whatever happens going forward, we must make sure we are accountable for our actions. Safety must continue to be our number one priority.

Freeholder Kelly introduced John Ernst, County Engineer, to review the Engineering Agenda. Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the construction of traffic signal contract 2020A, Township of Lacey. This is the intersection of Railroad Avenue and Lacey Road. It will create a crosswalk across Lacey Road and will allow for a safe crossing for the Rail Trail. There are several other safety improvement projects and the annual on-call for bridge and road design services resolutions. Freeholder Quinn stated the construction of a traffic signal will assist the County and is a final piece of the puzzle for the residents who use the Rail Trail. He thanked the Board. There were no questions or comments and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the December 16, 2020 Board meeting.

Freeholder Director Vicari stated the last Board meeting of the year 2020 will be next Wednesday, December 16, 2020.

Ms. Cilento reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of December 16, 2020. There were no questions or comments.

Freeholder Director Vicari asked the Board members for comments.

Freeholder Haines mentioned this Saturday, December 12, 2020 is the second anniversary we lost Freeholder John C. Bartlett, Jr. and asked for a prayer for his family.

Freeholder Little thanked the Freeholders, Carl Block, Mike Fiure and staff for all their hard work.

Freeholder Director Vicari stated Donna Flynn, Public Information Director will prepare a letter alerting all to the change from the title of Freeholder to Commissioner.

Due to the Coronavirus, the Reorganization meeting will be limited in the amount of attendees allowed within the Board Room.

There were no additional comments.

Ms. Cilento read the resolution to move to closed session.

On a motion by Freeholder Kelly, seconded by Freeholder Haines, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 4:54 PM for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was unanimously carried.
